Cancer Clinic in Vancouver is visited by island members

 "Yes, this is all free," the doctor assured us. "If you are a bona fide cancer patient, every bit of the treatment is free."

Ten members of Trincomali Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, were being given a tour of the A. Maxwell Evans Cancer Clinic in Vancouver, last Thursday, April 22. Now we gazed in wonder around the Prosthesis Room, where patients are fitted with and trained to use, amazingly lifelike artificial limbs or features.

We recalled the gleaming, immaculate machine shop where these were made to order; and also the other great life-giving machines we had been shown, from cobalt units to surgical instruments.

So much of this, as well as patient comforts like the bedside TV's, and the large research library for the medical staff, had been donated and kept up by the Order of the Eastern Star in British Columbia and the Yukon.

We had been welcomed, too, in the room given over to the use of the Eastern Star volunteer workers making free cancer dressings, and had noticed the parcels of dressings sent in by out-of-town chapters.

MAKE DRESSINGS

Our own chapter on Salt Spring meets every second and fourth Thursday in the Nurses' Residence of the Lady Minto Hospital. They make dressings, which go free, first to any patient on the Island, and then over to the clinic.

The main project of the Order of the Eastern Star in British Columbia and the Yukon, is the Cancer Control Agency, and most of the funds raised by our various projects go toward equipment and research in this area. Now we were being given the opportunity to see where our money and efforts are going.

Next, we walked a block over to the Canadian Cancer Society's Vancouver Lodge, where for a very nominal daily cost, out-of-town patients receiving treatment at the Clinic may find accommodation and three meals a day plus many other homelike features. Spouses or escorts may also stay, for a slightly higher cost; but mothers of child patients stay at the low patient rates.

SHOWED AROUND

After a delightful luncheon of

sandwiches and cake, tea or coffee, the smiling, friendly volunteers in the daffodil smocks showed us around the Lodge. It is a charming, relaxing residence, which we may all fervently hope we shall never need; but we will, nonetheless, be thankful it is there if we ever do need it.

The whole tour was an education to us all, I think. We agreed that it is at once disturbing to see how terrible is the need, and encouraging to learn how great are the resources.

"Daffodil Month" will very soon be gone. But the need will not. The fight against cancer needs our help just as much in May — or June, or January — as in April. Any month is a good month to give whatever you can to this very worthy cause.

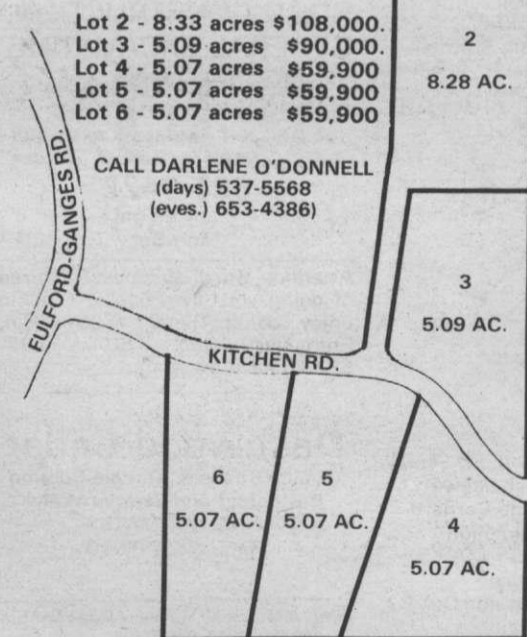

Canada's contribution

Testing ground for nuclear weapons

What do we call someone who says one thing and does another?

In 1978 Prime Minister Trudeau appeared before the United Nations Special session on Disarmament. In a dramatic speech he outlined a four-point strategy of suffocation which would deprive the nuclear arms race "of the oxygen on which it feeds".

Trudeau called for a comprehensive test ban on nuclear weapons, a moratorium on flight testing, of delivery vehicles for nuclear weapons, an agreement to stop producing fissionable material for nuclear weapons, and an agreement to limit and then cut spending on new nuclear weapons.

Since 1978, Trudeau has done nothing to implement his proposals. Last month the public discovered that the Canadian government had reached agreement in principle giving the United States military permission to test their new Cruise missile system in Northern Alberta.

TWO-FACED

Trudeau and the Liberal government are two-faced in this matter. They show one face when they speak in public, at the United Nations and quite another when they speak privately with the American military.

Members of Parliament who sit on the External Affairs and National Defence Committee had special reason to feel angry and betrayed by the governments' duplicity.

During February and March, they had held many hearings in preparation of the UN's second session on disarmament this summer. As Pauline Jewett said,

"The committee had heard nothing from the minister of external affairs or the minister of national defense about one of the most serious threatening and destabilizing developments of recent years."

She pointed out that cruise missiles, which would be launched from the air, were clearly intercontinental strategic delivery missiles intended to carry a nuclear payload. They are intended for a first strike and will be tested in northern Canada under geographic and climatic conditions similar to those in the Soviet Union.

CONTRIBUTING

At the very time when we should be trying to ease international tensions, we contribute to them. Russia and the United States are both paranoid about each others' intention and capability to strike the first pre-emptive blow. In dealing with paranoids, it is important to stay calm and to keep them calm. Canada should follow a role in which it tries to bring these two super powers together in a measure of understanding.

By allowing cruise missile tests in Northern Alberta, we invite a paranoid reaction on the part of

the Soviet Union. Since their provincial government wasn't consulted, Albertans could be pardoned if they too became a little paranoid about government actions.

MINORITY REPORT

Six members of the Committee on External Affairs and National Defence, three New Democrats, two Conservatives, and one Liberal, have issued a minority report on disarmament which states very clearly that Canada "should deny the United States permission to test the new Cruise Missile system in Canada."

In addition to restating support for Trudeau's four-point "strategy of suffocation," the report says, "Canada should press all nations to pledge never to be the first to use nuclear weapons." It calls on Canada to devote a 1/10 of 1% of its defence budget to disarmament education, information, and research activities and it urges support for a UN sponsored world referendum on disarmament.

Already there are now 27 Canadian municipalities, (including three in Cowichan, Malahat and the Islands) representing two and a half million Canadians, that will hold local referenda on general disarmament.

It is clear that people are increasingly demanding a voice on disarmament as an issue that involves their survival.

I would be happy to mail copies of the *Minority Report* to any of you who wish them. It is well worth reading and acting upon.

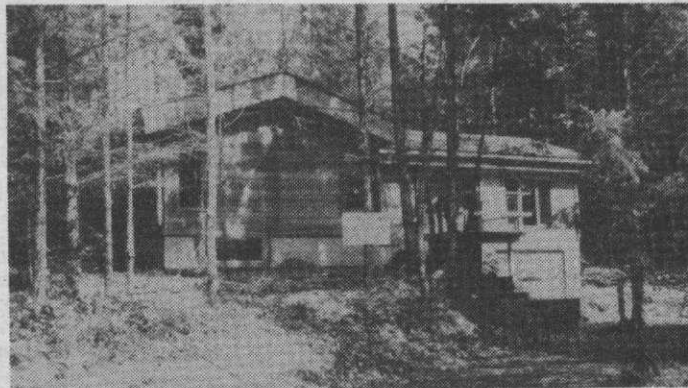
A light-fingered gardener shopped at Foxglove Farms store on Lower Ganges Road recently but RCMP know exactly what the person took.

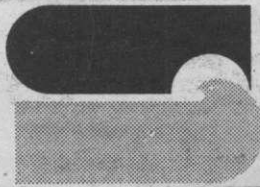

Nature Notes

From the mighty eagle to the hummingbird

BY KEN CAMPBELL

Sal' Spring is a gee-whiz place. There is so much natural wonder and variety, so much beauty and mystery and the great danger of the lack of time to enjoy it all.

Eagle watching can be enjoyed the year around. Bald eagles soar on dark wings with a span of almost seven feet, or greater than two metres. The head, neck and tail of adults is snow-white and contrasts sharply with the brown-black of the body and wings. Immatures do not have white heads and tails, and the body and wings are blotched with pale feathering.

The bald eagle can be identified in flight by the flat attitude of its wings. It has been compared to a plank of dark wood.

TURKEY VULTURE

Sharing the sky is another dark soaring bird. The turkey vulture is only slightly smaller than the eagle, with a wingspread of six feet. In flight it holds its wings in a shallow

"V" with the tips slightly above the body. Even at great distance it is possible to distinguish between an eagle and a vulture by this difference in wing attitude.

The third dark bird which soars is the common raven which has a four-foot wingspread. The all-black raven can be identified by its wedge-shaped tail, and by its voice.

Two buteo hawks, the red-tailed and the rough-legged have a soaring wingspread of about four feet. Their plumage is patterned and identification is possible by their voice, as well.

AND VERY SMALL

At the other extreme are the tiny hummingbirds. The most common is the rufous hummingbird. The male has a rufous back and brilliant red iridescent feathers on its throat. The female has a green back and a pale breast with dark fleckings on the throat. The male hummers are sparkling jewels of ferocious aggression. Three and a half inches of dynamite, their

spring courting displays make our garden a lively place.

Hummingbirds and eagles — can any island ask for more? And yet there is more! Today I found a Calypso bulbosa orchid in wonderful bloom on the mossy floor of a stand of young Douglas fir. Any wild flower is a delight, but the first Calypso is a special treat.

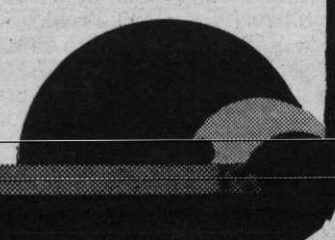

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From Pacific island to the Falklands

Jack Abbott left his mark on Salt Spring

Jack Abbott is living in the Falklands and at last report was planning to remain there.

Abbott is the former Salt Spring Islander who went to live in the southern hemisphere nine years ago and still makes his home there.

The Falkland islander has long roots in Salt Spring Island. He has close links with other parts and has moved around the world extensively. Last year he was looking back to the early days on the Pacific coast and suggested that he might return, if conditions down south should deteriorate.

The Abbott family left a mark on Salt Spring Island.

Two brothers, Fred and Cecil Abbott were happy to come to the island shortly before the turn of the century. Later Jack Abbott explained that their father had offered them the trip with the proceeds from a capital of £30,000 if they remained right here.

Fred was engaged by Fred Walter to carry out chores around his Ganges Harbour farm. The job was pleasant and lasted until Walter was married and the young Englishman was one of those who organized a charivari, or a rowdy musical ordeal during the wedding night.

The marriage endured but the young Englishman didn't. He was fired.

Fred Abbott was undismayed. He packed and went off to Regina where he enlisted in the Royal North West Mounted Police as a constable.

TO EUROPE

Shortly afterwards he married a Californian and moved to Europe. Later they moved to New Zealand and Australia. Jack Abbott, the eldest child and now a Falkland Islander, was born in Switzerland.

After the First World War the family returned to England, briefly, before returning to the west coast and Salt Spring Island. In 1922 they bought 1,089 acres on the island. They paid \$7,000 for it and more than half a century later it is known as Maracaibo, the Nose Point development.

When he was on the island last year, Jack Abbott commended the manner in which the development had been handled and suggested the only regret he experienced was that it hadn't been his project.

They came here, in 1922, as a fair-sized family, with Fred Abbott and his wife, four children and a maid. They needed a fair-sized house and the log home was erected at Long Harbour.

The design called for a house, 42 ft. by 42 ft., one half serving as a boathouse. It was constructed of 12-inch logs and built on a foundation of three 42-foot cedar logs, five feet in diameter, set in trenches.

LITTLE CHANGED

The interior was finished in oak panelling and is very little changed today.

For years Jack Abbott trapped along the harbour and on Trincomali Channel. He was a crony of Bill Evans, whose name is probably best remembered for his sheep-dog breeding and training. Even in those days before the second war Bill Evans was known as an unofficial veterinarian.

Abbott, Evans and W.A. McAfee went hunting together almost as a ritual.

Long Harbour, as it was then known, was sold in the 30's to a Mrs. Baldwin from California for something like \$50,000. By this time Jack Abbott had met a girl from the Falkland Islands. He explained that he was driving to Vesuvius and offered a girl a ride. She told him she was from the southern islands and three years later they were married.

During the hard times Abbott built himself a house in Ganges, on Rainbow Road. Jack Girard and his family are living there today.

They were hard times, Jack Abbott wrote in a Vancouver Island newspaper, but he survived by trapping and cutting cascara trees. The dried bark sold for seven cents a pound, he recalls.

LUCKY STORM

A violent storm in 1935 brought him luck. His crony Bill Evans was roads foreman at this time and was faced with the monumental task of clearing trees brought down by the storm. With a crew of 20 men, Jack Abbott found himself the only one able to "take the pinch out" of the

fallen trees. And he didn't have a chain saw to do the job. Every tree had to be cut with a seven-foot bucking saw.

He did the tough ones and the rest of the crew cleaned up those on the ground.

Another man working on the storm damage was Gavin Mouat. After the job was well under way Mouat told him he had a lot of trees down and that the only way to save the lumber was to get them cleaned up right away. He offered Abbott a full partnership in the

project if he would help.

"Gavin was a remarkable chap," he was to say of him later, "as straight as a die and a joy to work with."

They logged with horses and bucking saws and they sold their booms for \$7 a thousand board feet.

JOINED THE ARMY

On September 4, 1939, he enlisted in the Canadian Army. He joined up with Mac Mouat, Vernon Drake and Ray Morris

Twenty Years Ago

Services to dedicate the "Helen Spencer Room" at St. Mark's Church were conducted by Archdeacon G.H. Holmes. Included in the ceremony was the dedication of the transept doors in honour of the Reverend E.F. Wilson, first resident vicar of the Salt Spring parish from 1894 to 1909. The room would be used by the Sunday school classes.

Driftwood noted that daylight saving time would commence on the weekend.

The Salt Spring Liberal Association would be holding a re-organization meeting to be followed by a talk by the Liberal candidate for the federal riding of Nanaimo, Cowichan and the Islands, Jack Saywell of Cowichan Lake.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Red Cross fund-raising drive at the north end of Salt Spring Island raised \$1,226.

Queen Victoria presided over a tea and sale of works at St. George's Church Hall in Ganges. The event, sponsored by the Social Credit Women's Auxiliary, raised \$55. The queen was Clara McCaul and the afternoon was complete with an historical fashion show.

St. Mark's Church on Salt Spring Island would be 75 years old and parishioners were planning a septuagintaquinquennial celebration.

The seagull caught a crab but the snappy crustacean wouldn't fit down the bird's gullet. Efforts by the gull to dislodge the crab proved futile until another seagull came along and the pair engaged in a tug-of-war to free the one bird's throat. Pop went the crab and the two birds flew away leaving the nipper behind.

The navy visited Pender Island for a Centennial Celebration. HMCS St. Croix anchored in Hope Bay and residents of the island visited the ship.

The Galiano Golf and Country Club held the first tournament of the season with participants enjoying the good weather to hit a few balls around.

Workmen began the task of blasting a road on the first ridge of Spanish Hills on North Galiano. When the road, graded and paved, reached completion it would be known as Devina Drive after long-time resident of the island, Devina Baines.

Centennial Memo: In the 1870's, the steamboat passenger fare from New Westminster to Yale was \$7. On the downstream journey, which required less fuel, the fare was \$5.

Ten Years Ago

MacMillan Bloedel presented plans for a 3,000-lot subdivision on

North Galiano to the Capital Regional District Board. The logging company planned to develop 1,000 acres of land which it held on the island.

Salt Spring sailors from the school took a first, fifth, seventh and ninth in small boat races at the Shawnigan Lake school regatta.

Bishop Remi de Roo of Victoria was to visit Salt Spring Island for the weekend. He would celebrate mass at the Church of Our Lady of Grace in Ganges, as well as attending to other functions.

Vandals struck St. Mary's Anglican Church in Fulford and destroyed much of the inside of the building. RCMP investigated the incident. It was the first case of wanton destruction of a church on Salt Spring Island.

The Gulf Islands School Board received a letter from regional health officer J.L.M. Whitbread concerning the need for a sewage disposal system. Trustees decided they could not understand the instructions and asked the staff to ask for clarification.

The Burgoyne Bay United Church sold everything at their tea and bake sale within one-half hour and collected \$60.

The Capital Regional District board would support planning in the islands initiated by islanders provided such plans met the general pattern of the regional planning policy.

Two fishing boats were untied and set adrift from the wharf at Whaler Bay on Galiano. The owner was able to catch the boats before they foundered.

Five Years Ago

The Gulf Islands School Board set a record 39.018 mill rate to raise the \$2.4 million required for the budget. Included in the mill rate

was eight mills to cover school costs in other B.C. communities. The rate was based on total assessment in the islands of \$61.1 million and represented an increase of almost five mills over the previous year.

The regional health inspector ran 27 dye tests on septic systems in Ganges and 13 proved positive. The offending properties would be receiving notice of the failure to percolate and would have a set time limit in which to correct the problems.

Salt Spring Parks and Recreation Commission decided to do away with the Saturday Farmers' Market in front of Centennial Park in Ganges. That the attraction was obstructing the view of the grass and harbour was the reason for closing the market.

The hospital mill rate for the Gulf Island stood at 1.14 mills down almost three-quarters of a mill from the rate one year previously.

The Salvation Army would be sending out letters of appeal for its Red Shield Appeal during the month of May to residents of the Gulf Islands. The church organization was seeking \$160,000 for services for people in need and the Salt Spring Lions Club would be conducting the campaign for funds on behalf of the Army.

The officers of the B.C. Ferry Corporation, working without a contract for almost two years, were in the process of conducting a strike vote among members of the union.

The playing fields of Saturna School were nearing completion. The contractor had the fill and the top soil and the controversial field was in the process of being constructed.

and they managed to stick together, "more or less" for the whole duration. Although he has visited the island subsequently, his departure to the theatre of war was to be the end of his association with the island.

At the end of the war he took his family to England and started on the renovation of an old farm at Frensham. The renovations turned out to be a 15-year job. And it finished up "a place to be proud of".

In 1973 his wife died, a victim of leukemia and he emigrated to the Falkland Islands.

And, according to the last reports from the other hemisphere, that is where he yet plans to stay.

School sign is still slow sign

Ganges RCMP want drivers to realize that the sign with the blue and white schoolhouse means slow down.

The police have received complaints recently about drivers speeding on Rainbow Road past the Salt Spring Elementary School grounds. The road is posted with the school zone signs and the speed limit is 20 km per hour.

The speed limit will be enforced by radar checks at that location and others near schools on the island.

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Supreme Court denies plea for new hearing

The Sewer Alternatives Committee lost another round in its challenge to the proposed Ganges sewer in the British Columbia Supreme Court.

SAC and Yvette Valcourt had challenged the validity of the letters patent defining the sewer area last year and petitioned the court to overturn the legislative action granting the letters patent.

Mr. Justice Legg at that time dismissed the petition.

Recently, the SAC lawyer, Bob Price of Victoria, appealed to the justice for permission to amend the petition in order to have it heard again.

Capital Regional District lawyer Don Farquhar, also of Victoria,

argued that the petition had been decided and that the court had no jurisdiction to rehear the case.

Mr. Justice Legg agreed with the CRD position and refused the appeal. In the process, the judge awarded court costs to the CRD.

The awarding of costs in a case involving disputes between a citizen and a governing body is unusual. The judge's ruling was not available at press time.
