Orkin sets pace in Salt Spring musical

With Shaw at his best and a series of tunes that won't lie down, how could Salt Spring Players accomplish anything but the best? And with Andy Orkin in the lead role of *My Fair Lady*, the presentation, still playing, was a delight.

Musicals have been on the Salt Spring mind ever since the Anglican church and the Players ganged up three years ago to produce *Jesus Christ, Superstar*. This year's offering of the Shaw-Pascall-Lerner-Loewe masterpiece follows *Fiddler on the Roof*.

The classic tale of an English linguistics teacher who teaches elocution to a Cockney flower girl for a bet was the original, pre-first war play as G.B. Shaw wrote it. And it became the movie as Gabriel Pascall adapted it.

After his death, for Shaw would have no interference with his work, it was adapted to the fantastically successful musical, retaining plot and pattern and most of the dialogue.

In the musical setting Salt Spring Island audiences are seeing it.

The continuity and the command of the whole performance rests with Orkin. He plays the part with skill and conviction. New to the island stage, he shows himself a valuable asset.

SOFTLY SINGING

The problem with musicals is that there are more actors than singers in most small communities. And while an aspirant to the boards quickly learns to direct his voice, the vocalist cannot readily and quickly adapt to a large hall. Even with a soft-playing small five-piece orchestra, there were times when the singing was drowned out.

The same effect was, of course, not noticeable in the case of choruses.

The musical lasted for three and a half hours. It is a very warm commendation of the company that attention rarely flagged and the pace was constant and fast.

As Prof. Henry Higgins, Orkin could not be faulted. He carried the role with a flair. He followed the now-traditional pattern of speaking to music as well as singing his part.

My Fair Lady, Eliza Doolittle, was Arlene Dashwood, whose Cockney vowels were as convincing as her finished tones. She was an excellent and a whining flower girl and she went through the transition very convincingly. She took her audience from Hackney to Mayfair as if they were in a carriage.

BEERY HUMOUR

The dustman, Alfred P. Doolittle, was played by John Beardsell with all the fervour and beery good humour that Shaw found in his Cockneys.

Completing the team of ribald humour were Reg Taylor and Alan Wyatt.

At the other side of the scale was a stiff, upright Hugh Cummings in the role of Col. Pickering, half sycophant and half cautionary. Playing the parallel role of housekeeper was Pat Desbottes as Mrs. Pearce, the second stabilizing influence in a farcical setting.

Freddy Eynsford-Hill was played to perfection by John Bailey, who appeared as ineffectual as the author had made him. His mother was Dorothy Cummings.

The Cockneys were the supporters of the Doolittle trio. They hung around the fire and sold flowers to theatregoers or just hung around. There was Bryan Smith who appeared as the Selsey man, the angry man and as Charles, the chauffeur. There were Lou Conlisk, Margaret Howell, Angela Taylor and Marilyn Taylor. And there was Alf Howell, the barman.

DOUBLING UP

The players doubled up to complete the cast. Alf Howell was also the embassy footman; Angela Taylor re-appeared as Mrs. Higgins' maid when she wasn't a flower girl, and Reg Taylor was a police officer. Alan Wyatt ranged from a Cockney drunk to a sober Lord Boxington, while Lilian

Graham was below stairs as Henry Higgins' maid and went up a flight of stairs to be Lady Boxington.

Charlie Beale played Soltan Karpathy. Sheila Stacey was stately as the Queen of Transylvania and Robin Wood was her consort. Denis Peacock was an excellent Themistocles Stephanos and the suffragettes, added for effect, were Kelly Knutsen and Bea Nord-Leth.

The choruses included players and choristers.

The outstanding feature of the presentation was the orchestra. Musical director was Jean Knight, who appeared, with her violin, with Kathy Ramsey, flute; Paul Jagger, first clarinet; Joan Stacey, second clarinet; Irene Stacey, piano and Bill Smith, percussion.

Choreography was by Alice Friedman.

PRODUCER AND DIRECTOR

Producer was Charlie Beale and the play was directed by Marilyn Taylor, assisted by Dorothy Cummings. Stage manager was Reg Taylor, with his crew, Sid Filkow, as assistant; Sam Evans, Art Beaddie, Robin Wood, Denis Peacock, Ernie Rubright and Amy Newman.

The very effective back-to-back sets were skilfully designed and elegantly handled between scenes. They were the design of Reg Taylor, with Hugh Cummings,

The economic situation in B.C.; anti-nuclear action; farmland; diplomatic relations with South America and the constitution were considered. Mr. Manly seems concerned, responsive and direct; not rabidly partisan to his own party and more concerned with general human welfare.

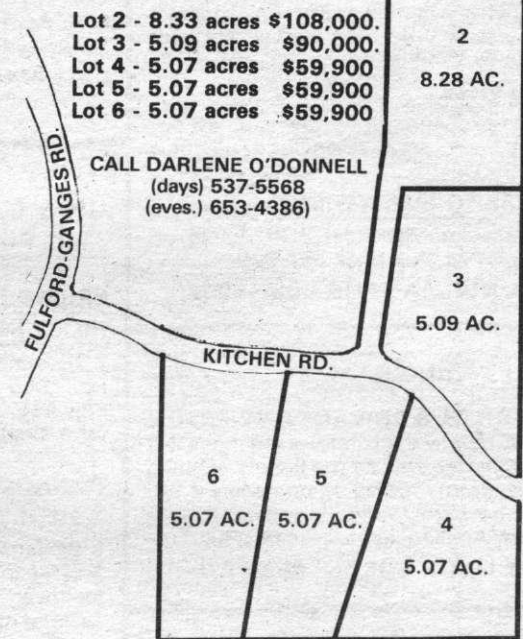

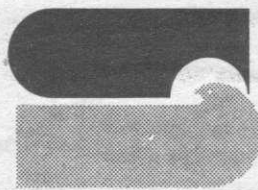

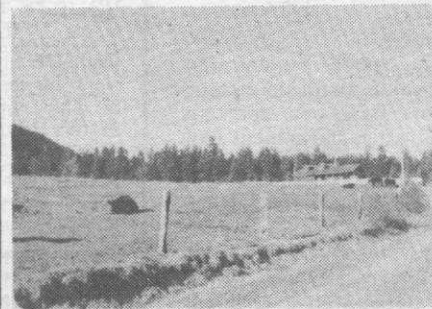

New school site chosen

The site chosen for the proposed Fulford school was one of four looked at but the only one with the required zoning, it was stated at last week's Gulf Islands School Board meeting.

School Board chairman Strick Aust, in an answer to criticism levelled at the board about the site, said the property which the board had wanted was located in the agricultural land reserve. Discussions with the Islands Trust revealed that the land could not be removed from that classification.

The property purchased, at the corner of Stewart and Beaver Point Roads, cost the board \$98,500 for five acres. The ground slopes down a hill towards the road and a creek cuts across one corner of it.

A restrictive covenant has been applied to the property because of the creek and when the school is built, a fence will have to be put up to keep children away from the water. The process will mean a loss of about 1.5 acres from the usable land. The board feels the remainder of the land will be sufficient for school and play area purposes. The minimum size for a school lot as set by the ministry of education is three acres.

Soil moving by permit

Soil may no longer be moved on Salt Spring Island without a permit.

On Wednesday afternoon last week the Capital Regional Board gave initial readings to two bylaws. They are amendments to the Soil Removal Bylaw and the Deposit of Soil Prohibition Bylaw. The amendments will bring Salt Spring Island into the scope of these bylaws.

She had discussed the matter with people connected with hauling soil on Salt Spring Island, reported Director Yvette Valcourt.

"Soil removal will be controlled, rather than all kinds of garbage being thrown to fill in an area," she explained.

ON-SITE SERVICES

The school will be serviced by a deep, drilled well and sewage will be disposed of on-site by ground disposal. The lot is currently wooded and the trees will be cut except for a series of trees around

the perimeter near the roads.

While the government has imposed a freeze on capital spending and money promised for projects from 1981 has not yet reached the school board, the plans for the Fulford school are proceeding.

Aust said the board is confident of funding because the money to buy, develop and plan the site has been approved by the ministry.

Illiterate thieves leave papers

Driftwood staff members will not be required to take a pay cut as a result of a theft last week, but the money will be missed.

Thieves removed the vending box from the *Queen of Sidney* Saturday night. Copies of the paper were left aboard, however, leading to speculation that the culprits are illiterate.

The box was discovered Sunday on a beach at Pender Island. While the thieves may not have realized the value of the paper, they did realize the value of the coins in the box, which were removed after the lock was broken.

Ganges RCMP are investigating the theft.

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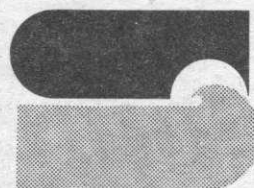

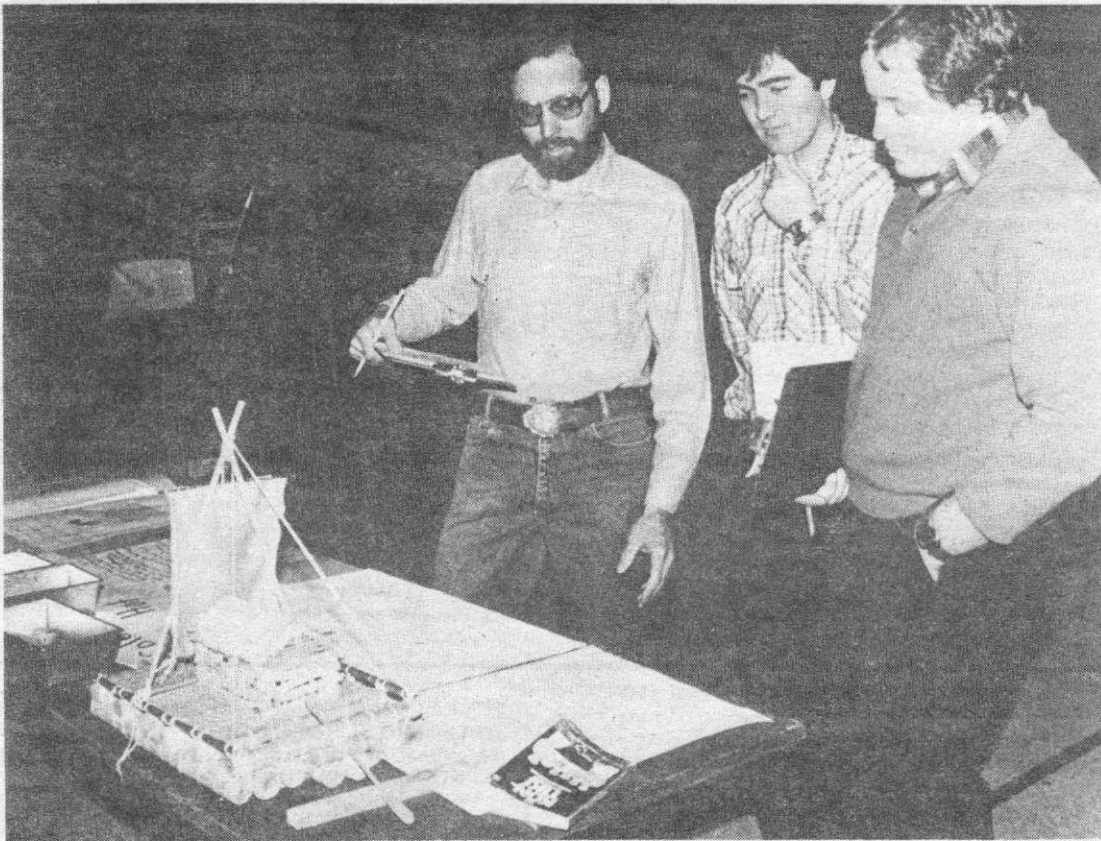

Guide to Argentina's aircraft carrier is among his mementos

Did you ever wonder how to get around aboard the Argentinian aircraft carrier, *Independia*?

John Watson, of Ganges, settled the matter this week. He produced a ship's guide to the big flatdeck. On the gallery deck, forward of the hangar are the Chief Petty Officers' Mess, naval and the Petty Officers' Mess, air. At the other end of the same deck is the captain's quarters. Down one deck, on the hangar deck, are the naval petty officers' mess and the air maintenance mess. One deck down, again, is the main deck with ward room, messes and stores.

This is all shown in the guide.

Watson was commanding officer of the Royal Canadian Sea Cadets Squadron, *Warrior*, attached to *HMCS Nonsuch*, in Edmonton at the end of the second world war. The squadron was sponsored by the Navy League of Canada and many of its graduate cadets left to serve in the Royal Canadian Navy.

It was the name *Warrior* that was significant.

ON LOAN

HMS Warrior was a Royal Navy aircraft carrier commissioned in 1944, to serve out the final year of the war. In 1946 it was on loan to the Royal Canadian Navy. And in 1946 the commanding officer of the ship presented a crest to the cadet squadron bearing the

same name. Lieutenant Watson accepted the award on behalf of his squadron. He was also presented with the ship's guide, a printed form showing a map of *HMS Warrior*.

In 1948 *Warrior* went back to Britain. Its name was changed to *HMS Brave* and it was sold to Argentina in 1959. At the present time it is sailing off the Falkland Islands. The memento has become significant for the fact of the Falklands fighting.

Architect planning

Parking policy for school complex

Parking is a problem at the Ganges schools complex and architect Hank Schubart has been given the go-ahead to separate pedestrians and automobiles.

The Gulf Islands School Board had asked Schubart to study the situation and report to the trustees on ways to improve the parking problem. He explained the broad outline of his proposals to the board last week.

The island architect describes the current situation as being on the point of hazardous and he requested the trustees to determine the extent to which the board would take a firm hand to allow him to complete the task.

The prime consideration, he told the board, was the safety and welfare of the children.

The board passed a series of resolutions which Schubart had indicated would be necessary to begin the project. Essentially, the plan calls for parking at two designated areas on the perimeter of the complex and only emergency and service vehicles, as well as handicapped individuals, allowed access to the site.

LONG-TERM PLAN

To accomplish that objective, the board agreed to a long-term plan regardless of current budget restrictions. The changes to the traffic and parking problems will be phased in over a number of years as money is available in the capital budget to pay for the improvements.

The board also agreed to limit the growth of the complex to an addition of two classrooms for the high school, which will be needed in the future. The student population will be held in check as well.

The current parking lots will be closed and access to the site controlled by two gates. Parking spaces will be created by utilizing a strip of the playground near Rainbow Road and improving the area at the corner of Kanaka and Church Roads.

The playfield would be somewhat smaller but with the proposed moving of Kanaka Road, the field would become one continuous playground. Kanaka Road would be moved westerly to the side of the baseball fields.

The gates would be located on the current access road from Rainbow as well as on Kanaka Road near Church Road.

The plan could create 120 spaces for parking, compared to the current 90 inside the complex. The soccer pitch on the play field would not suffer too much but would be reduced to a standard size of 50 by 110 yards.

ACQUIRE PROPERTY

Schubart also urged the board to consider the purchase of properties in the area as they come on the market to allow for construction of the needed new school board office as well as other planned developments in the complex.

The proposed parking scheme would mean that people using the site, both in the day for school purposes and in the evenings and weekends for community functions, would have to walk a short way to reach the buildings.

The high school would have access from the proposed Church Road lot which would eliminate a long climb up the hill from the Rainbow Road area. Access to the elementary school would be from the parking spaces on the edge of the playfield.

"It's not possible to provide parking on site at the most convenient positions near the schools," said Schubart. The limited space available, plus the terrain of the complex, suggests perimeter parking as the best solution, he said.

Board awaits legislation

The Gulf Islands School Board may have a 1982 budget forced on it by the ministry of education.

Board chairman Strick Aust said the board has received letters from the ministry urging the trustees to submit a revised budget, reflecting the cuts imposed upon it by the provincial restraint program.

"We had made a decision to protest the restraint program in its entirety," said Aust. "The only way to do that was to refuse to submit our revised budget."

The local trustees had been told by the ministry of education to cut \$230,000 from the budget for 1982, in line with the tight-money policy of the government.

The board made the cuts, which meant eliminating up to nine jobs in the district. The revised budget sits in the school board office waiting for the legislation which legalizes the budgetary restraint.

DEMAND REPLY

In a letter dated March 29, the minister of education Brian Smith wrote, "I would hope that the Board of School trustees will conform with the requirements of section 243 of the School Act and submit the information as requested by March 31."

When the board did not act, another letter came from the assistant deputy minister of education dated April 19.

"If we do not receive further information from you before Friday, April 23, it will be necessary for us to finalize your budget based on our recalculation of your 1982 budget (sections A-J) as previously sent to you."

Aust told the meeting of the school board that the trustees had revised the budget in order to avoid even more drastic cuts at a later date.

"We had to cut with care," said Aust, "in order to ensure that we would be allowed spending on some items next year."

NONE BY FALL

The aides who were to have lost their positions on April 30 were a case in point he said. If the positions were to be eliminated at the end of May, eight aides would have had to be fired. If the cuts were made for the end of June, 10 aides would have had to go. By September the district would have no aides at all, said Aust.

When questioned by a resident who was at the board meeting to protest the cuts, Aust said the protest by parents had gained nothing, but the actions by the

board had the effect of reducing the required cuts in budget from \$280,000 to \$230,000.

When the legislation legalizing the restraint program passes the legislature in Victoria, the school board will hold a special meeting to approve the revised budget.

Foul play not suspected

Ganges RCMP and the coroner's office are still investigating the death of a man on Salt Spring Island April 22 or 23.

The body of a 22-year-old man was discovered chained to a motorcycle in 20 feet of water off the dock at Musgrave's Landing.

The man was not a Salt Spring Island resident.

Foul play is not suspected, police told *Driftwood* Tuesday.

New rules cost area money

The ministry of education said the rules would be changed and the Gulf Islands School District found itself short of money while the changes were being made in the pattern of paying out funds.

The local school board approved a motion last week to borrow up to \$300,000 to cover expenses made so far this year. The money must be repaid with interest.

In the past the board has been allotted its operating expenses in a series of payments from the ministry but this year with the changes in allocation as well as the budget restraints, the board has been operating on amounts equal to spending from last year.
