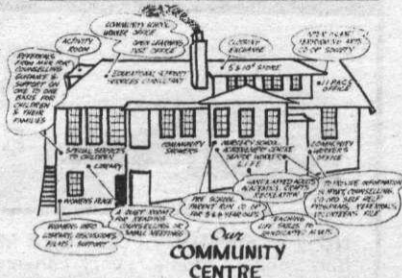

GALIANO NEWS

Regional plan well received at public meeting

A fine Saturday morning in late spring is not the best time to hold an important public meeting, and the topic of regional planning is not one that arouses intense emotion or partisan passion. It is not, therefore, surprising that the Galiano Island Trust Committee meeting on Saturday morning was not well attended.

The meeting was called to give residents an opportunity to discuss with the Trust Committee the draft of the regional plan for the Trust area. There was an excellent audio-visual presentation prepared by Trust spokesman Tom Ovanin with slides and commentary illustrating the philosophy and intent of the plan.

The plan, which proposes a policy for the future development consonant with the preservation of the unique Gulf Island environment, rightly emphasizes protection.

The plan received almost unanimous approval and praise from speakers, several of whom had had considerable experience in the planning process: Woody Coward and George Griffiths with their work on the Galiano community plan and Mimi Wishart and Ken Pattison from their experience with the Advisory Planning Commission.

It soon transpired that the real issue at this time is whether the Islands Trust and island populations will retain any right to plan their own future under the Land Use Act which has already received first reading in the B.C. legislature.

Under this new law not only the final word but the whole process of planning will come under the control of civil servants in Victoria.

The chairman of the Trust, John Rich, and Pender's Gordon Wallace gave impassioned pleas for Gulf Islanders to write protesting the proposed Land Use Act to the minister responsible, with copies sent to our MLA, Hugh Curtis, and to the Islands Trust at 848 Courtney.

Garden Club

Club members turned out in strength last Wednesday at the North Community Hall to welcome Mrs. Pat Pierrt on a return visit to the Garden Club. President Aini Haksi reported on the success of the May 1st Plant Sale which raised \$413.

One hundred dollars have been given to the Community Club in appreciation for the use of the hall.

Mrs. Pierrt, perhaps because she had brought her own clock, managed to pack a great deal of information into her talk. After

introductory remarks about companion planting she concentrated the rest of her talk on her speciality, geraniums.

In addition to its use as a bedding plant she suggested three other ways of displaying the ever-popular geranium. The plant might be kept in its pot, placed in the rockery so that the branches and flowers trail over the rocks. Another possibility would be to train the plant as a tree by cutting off all lower shoots and produce a globe of foliage and flowers at the top of a single stem.

More elaborate would be to create an umbrella effect by suspending two circles of wire over the plants and entwining two or three geranium plants to cover the wire, producing a green and red parasol.

Mrs. Pierrt donated 12 plants to the club. She recommended a visit to the Salt Spring Flower Show to be held at Fulford in early August.

The idea of a harvest sale of surplus vegetables and winter plants was approved and will likely be held in the North Community Hall towards the end of September.

Three events of interest are slated for the long weekend. The school is holding its annual Spring Fair beginning at 11 am on Saturday on the school grounds off Studies Bay Road.

There will be booths, refreshments, games and competitions. The children and organizers would appreciate your support and donations of plants, baking and white elephants.

On Saturday in the South Community Hall the long-awaited debut of the Galiano group Nasty Habits will occur. Dancing will

follow the concert.

The group includes Paul Hawbolt, Jane Edwards, Ian Hooley, Bob Gilson, Anami Nath and Craig Miller. Tickets are pre-sold at local stores.

On both Saturday and Sunday Earthen Things Gallery will have a display of the works of painter Dorothy Lupton, potter Richard Hawbolt and spinner-weaver Kathleen Partington. Hours of the show are 11 am until 4 pm each day.

On Thursday, May 20, there is to be a meeting to discuss the proposal to set up a small reference library and museum. The meeting will be held at the Holloway residence on Burrill Road and is to begin at 8:30 pm. If you are interested please attend and notify the Holloways in advance.

Restoration under way

Mahon Hall project running short of funds as volunteer labour assured

After an overly long and tedious winter our island is once again donning her multicoloured mantle of spring. The whole island is post card beautiful. Gardens are starting to put forth the first tentative shoots, hopefully heralding a bountiful harvest of a variety of vegetables and flowers. The fish are starting to bite, boats are coming out of moth balls and even one of the venerable structures of our community is starting to take on a fresh, new look.

Mahon Hall is sporting a brand new spring bonnet albeit composed of basic black, duroid shingles. The new roof is all but completed and hopefully the old gal will shortly be rivaling the flowers of the fields with a sparkling coat of new paint.

But unlike the flora of the island, Mahon Hall's rejuvenation is not an annual event nor does it have the assist of the miracles of Mother Nature. Unfortunately its rebirth is somewhat more prosaic, but none the less exciting.

MONEY IS BLOOD

In lieu of Mother Nature's helping hand the Mahon Hall Restoration Committee needs money, the lifeblood of any community project.

To date, and as it has been previously announced, a total of \$21,675.00 has been donated for the restoration work on the hall. All of these funds have already been spent or committed for specific projects such as the construction of the new roof, installation of a new electrical switch panel, the up coming exterior paint job, the modification of the hall entrance from the parking lot area which will include a ramp to facilitate handicapped patrons and the loading and unloading of heavy equipment for use in the hall, as well as the installing of a hot water tank.

Of this total the Community Arts Council has donated an initial

\$15,000 and has recently agreed to give an additional \$2,000 to help cover existing commitments.

The Sea Capers group gave \$3,000, specifically, to help defray the cost of installation of the modified entrance from the parking lot. The balance has come from the various guilds which use the hall regularly, as well as from individual citizens.

PRIORITY LIST

MHRC chairman Hugh Cummings and his committee members established a priority list for the restoration work. The new roof, the installation of the new electrical panel, the exterior paint work and the modification of the parking lot entrance way were given top priority as most urgent and because it was obviously necessary to contract to have this work done by professionals.

Work still to be done, the great proportion of which can be accomplished by volunteer labour, includes the installing of panic hardware on both of the main entrance and exit doorways, required by fire regulations; the installation of the hot water tank and the necessary electrical and plumbing work to accommodate it, new flooring in the board room, a special electrical circuit for the kiln used by the Potters Guild, the installing of a sink in the board room, redecorating the bathroom facilities, additional cupboards in the kitchen, some interior painting and, hopefully, the location of some additional storage space.

ESTIMATE

While the committee is hesitant to put a firm cost figure on the balance of the work to be done it is estimated that between \$6,000 and \$7,000 will be required.

To this end some plans are already being formulated to assist in raising the money. The Mahon Hall committee of the Parks and Recreation Commission has recommended to the commission that there be an increase in the fees by the occasional users of the hall. This would not mean an increase in

the existing fees for regular users. In addition the CAC will donate the funds to be raised by a raffle during the annual Aircraft exhibition and sale to the restoration fund.

"However if the balance of the work is to be completed the funds for the material required will have to come from the general public" MHRC chairman Hugh Cummings stated. He pointed out that if it were not for the many hours that he and the members of his committee have already given to the job and are prepared to give to get the work completed, the costs would be a great deal higher.

77 YEARS OLD

"It really is not a great deal of money when you consider it is going to refurbish a building which in its 77 years of existence has been and will continue to be in the foreseeable future the focal point for much of the artistic and cultural activities of the community," Mr. Cummings said.

He pointed out that arrangements are being made to have all donations tax deductible and said that donations can be made to the Mahon Hall Restoration committee, to P.O. Box 1304, Ganges or can be handed to committee treasurer John Crofton at his office, at Miller and Toynbee.

There's still more room

Despite ferry changes the overall accommodation for vehicles on all B.C. Ferry Corporation vessels has increased.

President Bert Elford told the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce last week that there is an 11% over-all increase in accommodations. He quoted Tourist Minister Pat Jordan.

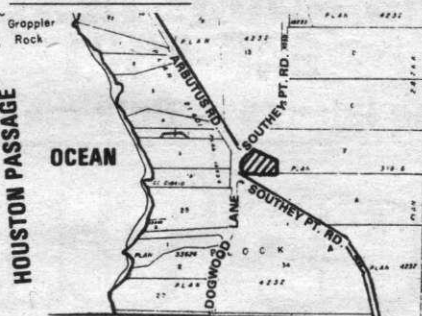

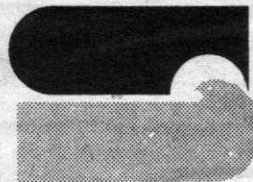

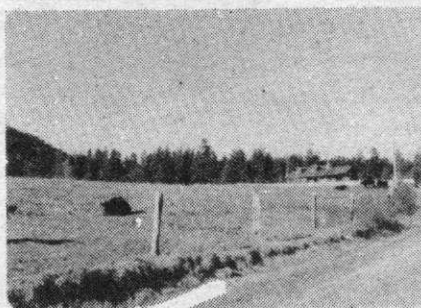

Mrs. Ratcliffe comes to the Penders on the third Wednesday of each month, when she can be found at the S.C.C., dispensing knowledge to the senior citizens of the Islands.

For several years she has been accompanying and assisting her husband, Col. W. Ratcliffe one Sunday a month conducting the service at the United Community Church on North Pender. Col. and Mrs. Ratcliffe are members of the Salvation Army.

At the Women's Institute meeting Mrs. Ratcliffe's topic was "Wills" and for each attending member she brought about 10 different pamphlets and or typed sheets with information on the subject which they could take home and keep for study.

Some of the government pamphlets brought by Mrs. Ratcliffe for distribution dealt with Community Health Services, listing where to find them and the survivors' and death benefits from the Canada Pension Plan.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

The Gulf Islands School Board budget for 1962 showed estimated spending of almost \$270,000 to educate 479 students. With total taxable values of \$10.3 million, the school mill rate had been set at 19.9 mills. The department of education was to have allowed a grant of \$50,000 to help cover the costs of schools.

The Chamber of Commerce wrote a protest letter to the minister of education about the tax situation in the Gulf Islands. The letter pointed out that between 1958 and 1962, assessment increased 60%, moving to \$10.3 million from \$6.5 million. While the school budgets went up 30% to \$270,000, from \$179,000, the mill rate increased 74% from 11.46 to 19.9 mills. Government grants to cover the cost of education decreased over the same period to 19.5% of the local school budget from 68%.

The B.C. Toll Ferry Authority announced that children's commuter tickets, available for those under 12 years old, would be transferable within the same family. The change eases the burden on large families which had to buy separate books of tickets for each child.

The annual meeting for the local hospital district was held recently and directors were elected to the Lady Minto board. The meeting was told that the hospital had stayed within budget for the previous year and had a small surplus, one of the few hospitals in the province to do so.

Fifteen Years Ago

Volunteer firemen were called to Ganges wharf to deal with a fire on the Police Boat, Sidney. Damage to the RCMP patrol boat was limited to the electrical panel and the ceiling of the cabin, with a cost estimate of \$1,000.

Ferry service suffered somewhat for several days when the Queen of the Islands was out of service.

The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce awarded the title of "Citizen of the Year" to Lieut.-Col. Desmond G. Crofton. He was past president of the Salt Spring Legion and the Chamber of Commerce as well as serving as president of the local Lions Club at the time of the award. Crofton had donated the land where Pioneer Village is located.

The Ladies Auxiliary of Branch 92 of the Royal Canadian Legion held a rummage sale at the Legion Hall. Buyers and browsers picked through articles ranging from hats, jewellery and clothes to books. When the sale was closed, the W.A. had collected \$320 for their funds.

The Ganges detachment of the RCMP were looking for eight men with a lot of pull. The men were being sought in connection with a proposed tug-of-war against a Fulford team.

Centennial Memo: The first graduate in medicine from McGill University to practice on the west coast of Canada was Lieutenant Israel Wood Powell. Powell River was named after him.

Driftwood announced that publication would be one-half day late for the following week due to the May 24 holiday which would be observed by staff. The issue would come out Thursday afternoon instead of morning.

Ten Years Ago

The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce suggested a one-day per week mini-bus service between Fulford and Ganges for a one month trial. The service would benefit shoppers and merchants and the Chamber urged merchants to get behind the scheme to give it a fair trial.

A sailor in the naval reserve lost his life when a car had been accidentally driven off the end of the Fulford-Ganges Road into Ganges Harbour. A coroner's jury ruled the death an accident and set the cause as drowning.

The Minister of Municipal Affairs, Dan Campbell, was given a tour of the Outer Gulf Islands by Capital Regional District Board chairman Hugh Curtis. The purpose of the visit to Galiano and Pender Islands was to show the minister some of the problems faced by islanders. Curtis indicated that the full regional board would be meeting on Salt Spring Island in the fall.

The student band from the Ganges school toured the Outer Gulf Islands for concerts on each island. The 40 students, aged 10 to 14, were under the direction of Major John Dought and the concerts were well received by all.

Five Years Ago

The population of the Gulf Islands stood at 6,288 according to figures released by the Capital

Regional District. The figures, from the June 1976 census, showed that 4,439 people lived on Salt Spring Island.

Taxable assessment value of land in the Gulf Islands had been set at almost \$54 million by the B.C. Assessment Authority. Land and improvements on Salt Spring Island was valued at \$25 million while on the Outer Islands the value had been placed at close to \$29 million. The value of land for tax purposes in the Capital Regional District was \$813 million.

Employees of B.C. Telephone Company went on strike and service between the Gulf Islands and Victoria was affected. Calls were handled by supervisory personnel and their inexperience on the job was occasionally evident.

Pupils from the Salt Spring Elementary School presented a musical play based on the Wizard of Oz. The two-evening engagement was produced by Irene Wright and involved almost all pupils in Grades 3 to 7 as well as many other parents and teachers.

A Southey Point woman survived a brush with death. She had been sitting on a log on the beach when the log rolled and pinned her. Cries of help drew assistance and the log was cut to free her just as the tide, on flood, reached her waist.

B.C. Ferries Corporation reduced fares by \$1 on most runs through the islands. Reduced rates for residents as well as the cost of commuter tickets remained the same. The reductions resulted from federal contributions to west coast ferry service.

The minister of health approved allocation of \$445,000 towards improvements at Lady Minto Hospital on Salt Spring Island. The planned expansion included 10 additional extended care beds as well as renovations and remodelling.

Player wrongly identified

A Little League ball player was wrongly identified in a photograph last week.

Tony Mason was photographed while up to bat but his name appeared as Tony Mazur. A player on the Salt Spring Log Sorting team, he hit two home runs in the game.

Church auction clears debt with 120 articles

St. Peter's Church held their first Auction on Saturday afternoon May 8 at the School-Community Gymnasium.

A large crowd attended to hear Stan Carey, who acted as auctioneer, dispose of the more than 120 articles, which members of the community have been donating since January to the church committee, for the sale.

Hospital allowed \$700 hike

Lady Minto Hospital will have \$700 more to spend this year than last.

The board of directors of the Gulf Islands' hospital had submitted a budget calling for spending of \$2.5 million but the ministry of health decreed a limit

of slightly less than \$2.3 million. Figures released by the board this week show 1981-82 expenditures to the end of March this year were \$2,228,220 with a deficit of \$176,324.

The ministry of health, in line

with provincial government restraints, will allow a grant to the hospital of \$2,228,972 or a 0.03% increase.

The provincial average for increases allowed by the ministry is 7.7%.

Hotel wants to expand

Salt Spring Island Trust Committee is considering an application for amendment of farmland boundaries to permit expansion of the Hastings House Hotel in Ganges.

Last week the Salt Spring Island Advisory Planning Commission heard an application from architect Jonathan Yardley, on behalf of the hotel company, to trade off the rock cliffs currently in the land reserve, for an area of green sward not at present

designated for farmland.

The hotel could then undertake construction of additional facilities, the commission was told. With no zoning change, the hotel may build two more structures, said Yardley.

Plans include the use of the marina property adjoining the hotel. The marina site would then be zoned C4 for resort use.

Following the presentation by Yardley, the commission made a trip to the hotel property and

examined the features listed in the application.

Recommendation will be made at a subsequent meeting.

Marijuana seizure reported

Although the Ganges RCMP would not comment on the incident, unofficial reports are that a resident of Salt Spring will be facing a charge relating to possession of marijuana.

The police, apparently acting upon a tip, staged a raid on an island residence last week. According to one report, a pound of the illegal substance was seized.

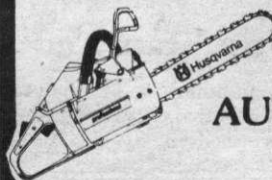
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
