Fire hall property for sports field at Fulford

Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission has authorized chairman Glenn Woodley to go ahead with an agreement with the Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District to lease the rear two or three acres of land behind the new Fulford Fire Hall.

Woodley told his commission two weeks ago that he had discussed the matter with the fire trustees and that the general outlines of an agreement had been examined.

The leased property would be used for sports activities and would be held on a 10-year lease with an option to renew for another 10. The commission would be responsible for fences

and to ensure that no intrusion would be permitted on fire district property. Ditching or works of any kind would be undertaken in consultation with the fire trustees.

The tentative agreement to devote surplus fire district land to recreational use was reached three years ago when both the fire district and the recreation commission sought to acquire the land from the Gulf Islands School District. The fire district was successful in its bid.

Chairman profiled in magazine

What does the chairman do?

According to a report in *The Connection*, house magazine of the British Columbia Buildings Corporation, chairman Tom Toynbee keeps in touch.

A Salt Spring Island businessman, Toynbee serves as chairman of the board of the corporation.

The magazine's brief profile of the chairman quoted him as saying that he believes it to be important that the chairman be active and not just tune into the corporation for board meetings.

He heads the nine-member board and he is always familiar with the answers. It would be embarrassing to have to find an answer and call back, he explained.

To keep up to date Toynbee goes into the Victoria office of the corporation once a week and at other times he visits regional offices around the province.

What does the corporation do? It administers all buildings used by the provincial government and

its ministries and agencies. In its own words, the corporation provides and services the accommodation requirements of the provincial government.

The corporation, serving that function, is unique in North America, said the chairman, and probably the only one of its kind in the world.

"We are being watched and studied by many other government jurisdictions," he told *The Connection*.

Under such scrutiny its performance has to be excellent, he suggested.

Toynbee was chairman of the B.C. Housing Corporation before moving to his present chair.

He graduated in commerce from UBC in 1958 and spent a number of years in the lumber industry before returning to his native Salt Spring Island to join the family business.

Abandoned fawn content with goat's milk

Young Ingrid Thornhill of Burrill Road discovered what appeared to her to be an abandoned fawn near the Thrift Shop. The fawn was taken to the Thornhill home where feeding it appeared difficult.

Fortunately, Jordan Hartmann, who lives on Valley Road, has a milking goat and offered to see if the baby deer would accept its milk. When the doe is placed in the milking stand the fawn suckles directly from the teat.

After imbibing its ration of goat's milk the fawn acts as if exhilarated or intoxicated and gambols around the pasture.

Getting the fawn to drink milk from a dish is another matter. Willow, Jordan's wife, has discovered that the fawn will only drink the milk if it has first been allowed to pull at her ear. How long this practice will continue or how long Willow can stand the ear-pulling is not known.

Ingrid and the Hartmanns realize that this situation is not satisfactory as the fawn will lose all fear of humans and the many dangers they create for wildlife. There is a tentative plan to take the fawn to a game farm since it would be impracticable to return it to the wild state. Wildlife experts recommend that if a fawn is discovered in this way the best thing to do is to leave it alone, as more often than not the mother will eventually return to care for the fawn. However, it is not surprising that a child's kind heart dictates a different course of action from that advocated by the adult expert.

Park Follow-up

Following the attack on the gorse at Bellhouse Park reported last week, the three park rangers returned to the site again Saturday to burn the piles of brush which had been piled on the rocks at Bellhouse Bay.

Kevin Davies, Larry Frend and George Parsons were assisted by Cliff Coolidge whose property adjoins the park. Fire Chief Chester Williams was on hand to check that there was no danger of the fire spreading. The oil contained in the plant made for a rapid and spectacular burn.

Nature Notes

Roses are particularly associated with the month of June. The rose family is a large one with

over 3,000 members. To the gardener we leave that most beautiful of flowers the hybrid tea rose, to the orchardist the apple, pear, plum and cherry, and to the market gardener the strawberry and raspberry.

The nature-lover is left with a great variety of local wildflowers in addition to the two common wild roses now blooming. The large Nootka rose has a typical pink, five-petalled flower two to three inches across, with a centre of golden stamens, while the smaller dwarf rose is a miniature, less than an inch across with deeper pink petals, less conspicuous but common enough in shady areas at the edge of woods.

Some rosaceae are obviously close cousins of the familiar rose. The large white five-petalled flowers of the thimbleberry can now be seen, often mingling with the orange-fruited salmonberry whose bright pink flowers could be seen as early as March. There are many other members of the genus *rubus* including the many wild blackberries, raspberries including the white-stemmed one with sweet, black berries.

Among the wildflowers are the many cinquefoils, the potentilla, the Latin name derived from the belief that certain of the species had powerful medicinal qualities. Probably the most surprising inclusion in this large family are the spireas, the flowers so small it is hard to discern a similarity to the rose.

Not classified with the spireas but so alike in appearance is *holodiscus discolor*, better known as ocean spray and just about to have each twig-end break into a creamy cascade of tiny blooms.

This is one of the commonest of west coast shrubs with very hard strong wood. This shrub makes fine pea sticks and in pioneer days was used as dowelling to replace nails in the construction of barns.

Student painters coming

A Canada-wide organization run by and for students is coming to Salt Spring Island.

College Pro Painters was founded by a student in Thunder Bay, Ont., 11 years ago. Greg Clarke was unable to find work so he set up his own painting business.

Today, students involved in the operation expect that College Pro Painters will provide employment for 1,600 students across Canada by next month. It is the largest student employer in the country.

Jim Gibson, who is moving to Salt Spring for the summer, and Geoff McLean, have been with College Pro for two years. They hope to employ a minimum of eight students on Salt Spring Island this summer.

The business is a seasonal one, only operating between May and September. The only requirement for a job with College Pro is that the applicant is a university or Grade 12 student. Experience is helpful but not necessary, as College Pro will provide training.

The business is a limited company with franchises across the country. The Victoria franchise, of which McLean and Gibson are a part, has been running for three years and employs about 50 students in one season.

The two students indicated that quality control was a high priority with College Pro Painters. A two-year guarantee goes with their work and customers are asked to give a rating of a paint job following completion. If the rating is less than eight on a scale of one to 10, the company will check on the job.

If a job is poorly done the students responsible are required to do it over again.

Trust staff to spend summer on plan

The Islands Trust staff will spend the summer redefining some terms, rewording others and generally tightening the proposed regional plan for approval by the full Trust council in a September meeting.

The regional plan was the subject of discussion at 14 public meetings on the islands as well as in Nanaimo, Victoria and Vancouver. Approximately 440 people attended the meetings to express opinions on the plan.

The opinions will be weighed by the Trust staff and either included in the final draft or discarded.

The one obstacle to the regional plan is the proposed Land Use Act being put forward by the ministry of municipal affairs. The act had first reading last December and if passed by the legislature would take planning away from the local level and make it the responsibility of civil servants in Victoria.

Trust chairman John Rich of Bowen Island told the trustees that if the Land Use Act is passed, the regional plan would become merely a policy statement.

The Trust council approved a motion to seek a meeting with the cabinet in order to outline the concern of the Islands Trust about the loss of local planning initiatives through the act.

They also agreed that each trustee should seek support from the public against the act and urge people to write to the minister of municipal affairs in opposition to it.

If the Land Use Act is not law by the September meeting of the Islands Trust council, the trustees must decide whether the document becomes the official plan for the islands or remains as a statement of intent with regard to planning the future of the islands.

Commission finds most people want Farmers' Market left alone

Leave the market alone, was the message delivered to several members of the Salt Spring Parks and Recreation Commission who visited the Ganges Farmers' Market last week.

The investigators learned essentially the same things as did *Driftwood* in an unofficial survey of the market a week earlier.

The committee of commissioners also heard suggestions that the market should be limited to island vendors only as well as complaints about lack of space.

Only two of the vendors interviewed by the team disagreed with the inequitable distribution of space. Other suggestions concerning space included use of a booking system which the commission had considered but rejected. One scheme would see the area of the Centennial Park parking lot marked off and vendors limited to the space between two markers.

TURN CORNER

The market could also turn a corner, said some. The corner to be turned would take the market into the parking lot reserved for users of the government wharf. The commissioners consider it unlikely that the federal government would allow the use of that parking lot for a market.

Some people questioned, who were not at the market, said they object to "junk" being sold there and would not return until it reverts to the original concept of a farmers' market.

Others seemed to favour the separation of the "flea market"

aspect from the stalls selling farm and garden products as well as crafts. As space in the market becomes scarce, the idea may take form.

The commissioners agreed that an expanded flea market might prove to be a real attraction provided space could be found close to the park and the current market.

HARD TO LIMIT

The parks group had received a legal opinion that no easy way existed to limit the market to islanders only. They had also been told that any charge for off-islanders would legally have to be applied to local participants in the Saturday morning outdoor garage sale.

Competition for established business in Ganges, said the commissioner, became "a question of whose ox is being gored." Merchants who do not face direct competition from the market welcome the crowds attracted by the market while those who may

lose sales "feel quite differently."

In a report on their day at the market, the commissioners noted, "...as one person stated, the merchants are hesitant to express their opposition to the market since they fear a boycott by a significant number of shoppers."

The concern for the merchants translated into an unwillingness by most of the vendors to see the market open for any longer than just Saturday.

The commission, at its next meeting, will discuss the Farmers' Market in light of the feelings and opinions given to the group. They invite written submissions from interested persons.
