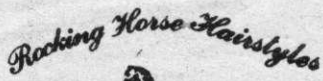

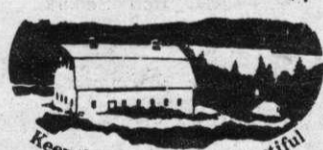

Glass thieves plague local pubs

Glasses at island public houses are disappearing at startling rates these days. It was only recently that the RCMP at Ganges decided to crack down and deter the thefts by catching glass thieves and laying charges.

Other fancy glasses as well as beer glasses are disappearing and costing the establishments up to \$100 a month.

"We order about eight dozen beer glasses every four months," manager of the Fulford Inn, Vicki Walker, told *Driftwood*. "At least we used to. Now we are suffering further losses. We pay around 95 cents per glass and lose about four a week to breakage and around 10 a month to theft."

But for the Inn at Fulford the diminishing supply of glasses

includes the high-ball glasses and the tall, fancy, long-stemmed coffee glasses. The high-ball glasses run about \$1.70 per glass while the coffee glasses are \$3 each.

"We've stopped buying the coffee glasses altogether now because we lose too many. It's not worth risking carrying them," said Walker.

About 10 glasses a week of all different varieties are lost at the Fulford Inn.

"The short high-ball glasses are popular. People like them so they take them home. Some people carry their glasses out of the bar and swear they'll bring them back. They don't, so we have to keep buying more," Walker explained.

"And if they're local people who really do intend to bring back the

glasses we can't comfortably apprehend them by telephoning the police. It would be insulting."

At the north end of the island, Vesuvius Inn loses beer glasses more rapidly.

"We lose between 10 and 20 beer glasses a month to breakage and between 10 and 20 glasses a month due to theft," Jeanie Carmichael at Vesuvius reported. "We pay up to \$1.50 per beer glass so it means approximately \$60 a month is lost due to theft and breakage alone."

And that's just in beer glasses. Another \$40 would be lost in the popular "bubble-bottomed" glasses used for high-balls.

"If we took every glass thief to court we wouldn't have time to run the bar," Carmichael said.

As of April 30, the school board had spent \$10,069 of its \$15,750 trustee travel budget. The amount remaining in the pot was \$5,681 or 36% of the total travel budget.

budget in that the trustees plan to visit each of the Outer Islands beginning with a meeting on Mayne Island in September.

Camosun director will report every two months

The Gulf Islands representative on the board of directors of Camosun College will remain with that group until the current term of service expires.

Tom Davidson of Saturna sits on the Camosun board and Gulf Islands school trustees had been concerned about the lack of information about the college.

School board chairman Strick Aust had contacted Davidson to find out what was happening at the Victoria College. He had also talked with other members of the board of directors to gauge Davidson's activity with them.

Davidson will report to the Gulf Islands School Board at least once every two months. The Camosun board sits once each month.

The directors said that Davidson attends meetings regularly and is currently working on a scheme to allow graduates of the Gulf Islands Secondary School automatic placements at the college.

Aust told the local trustees that the college would hold several positions open for Gulf Islands students at a nominal cost to the school district. The students would be able to move directly from the high school to the college without having to wait for openings.

Davidson's term expires in February of 1983 and Aust indicated that a trustee will be appointed to the Camosun board as a means of ensuring closer contact between the two bodies.

Blackflies take fun out of trip

The weekend at Long Beach should have been enjoyable but blackflies took all the fun out of the trip for students of the Mayne School.

Almost everyone on the trip suffered bites from the blackflies.

During the return bus ride Sunday, a girl suffered severe reaction to the fly bites and had to be taken to the hospital in Port Alberni for treatment.

On the ferry ride to Mayne, on Monday morning, a boy also suffered severe reaction. Prompt action by a teacher and a doctor on board the ferry prevented even more serious problems for the young man.

The boy was treated with oxygen and injection of adrenalin. Both the boy and girl were taken to Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria for further treatment and observation by immunologists.

Participants in New Horizons have published 400 volumes of Canadian history and another 200

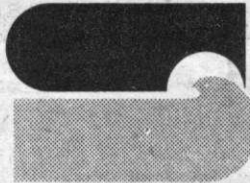
are in preparation.

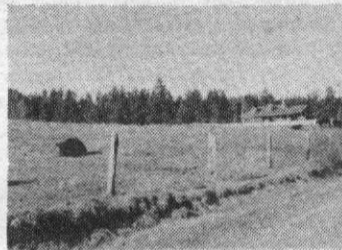

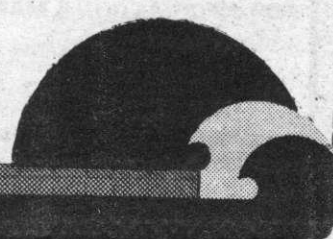

Killings renew concern

Outbreak of killings in Iran has renewed the concern among members of the Baha'i community around the world and on Salt Spring Island.

The Baha'i community on Salt Spring Island recently learned that eight members of the Baha'i faith have been killed and 23 others have been arrested in Iran.

Spokesman for the Baha'is, Peter Burt, explained that the recent outbreak of killings makes Iranian intentions apparent that the extermination of the country's largest religious minority is under

way in that country.

When six of those killed refused to recant their faith they were killed by firing squads. There was no notification of relatives and no burial.

Iran's largest daily newspaper reported the hanging of Azizullah Gulshani of Khurasan after a court verdict referring to him as a "heretic", made it clear that the Baha'is in Iran are being murdered because of their faith.

Regular prayer services are being held on Salt Spring by the Baha'i community on behalf of the

stricken Baha'is in Iran.

Several copies of *A Cry From the Heart* by Wm. Sears have been ordered. The book deals with the purge existing in Iran today.

Islander and member of the Baha'i community, Ellwyn McKague, explained that the Baha'is have reason to believe that the government in Iran is pursuing its plan to destroy the 300,000-member Baha'i community there.

Outbreaks of violence and persecution have never been so widespread and systematic at the hands of the Muslim clergy as they are today. Over 100 Baha'is have been killed by executioners and assassins in Iran.

Trust wants to take action on loophole

The land, subdivided to permit a residence for a relative, somehow ends up being sold and the Islands Trust cannot do much about it.

Provisions of Section 733 of the Municipal Act allow a parcel of land to be subdivided to provide a separate residence for a relative. An approving officer views the application but, the Trust learned, the approval has become almost automatic in recent years.

The new property is not supposed to be less than one hectare unless approved by the medical health officer and is not to be sold within five years.

The section of the act is a loophole which allows some people to sell part of their land after the subdivision has been approved. The Trust wants something done about the

The problem facing the Trust is that they receive up to 50 applications per year for subdivision under Section 733. The trustees approved a motion to change the requirements to include information on the purpose of the application as well as the name of the relative to benefit from the subdivision.

The Trust staff will compile a list of all property affected by such

applications and each local trustee will follow up with information on the eventual disposition of the land.

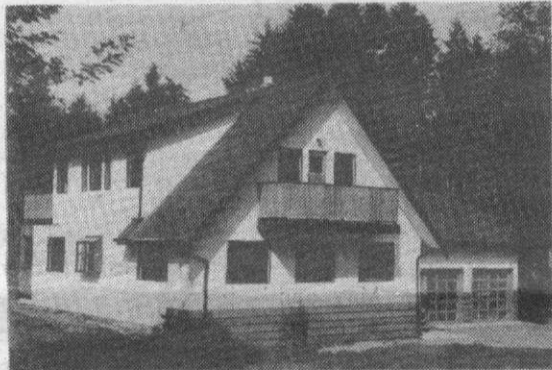
"We need some evidence," said Trust chairman John Rich of Bowen Island, "if we're going to talk to the authorities and say this (Section 733) is being abused."

The Ganges detachment of the RCMP have been receiving an increasing number of complaints of shots being fired at night. They ask for co-operation from the public in the matter.

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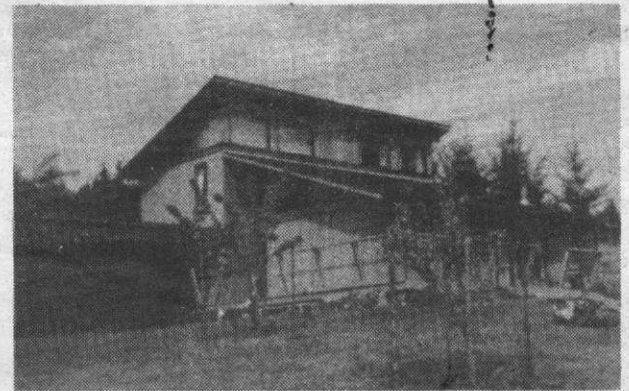
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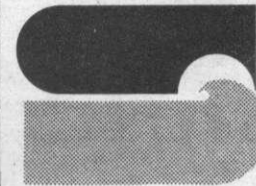

Several employment programs offered by ministry of labour

Several employment opportunities have been devised by the ministry of labour this year.

A rehabilitative employment program provides disadvantaged and disabled persons as well as income assistance recipients with an opportunity to develop work skills so that they may enter the work force.

Funding is supplied to employers from anywhere between two and six months depending on the training provided. A maximum of \$2.50 per hour is allowed. There are three varieties of program.

There is a provincial training and employment program for disabled persons which involves permanent employment. A summer program for students is also offered for disabled persons.

There is also an income assistance program which involves training unemployed and non-income persons with skills.

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING

An industrial training program is provided for employers who require or wish to apply for aid in financial and training assistance. Funding for two to six months is provided by the ministry of labour and a maximum of \$2.50 is allowable.

A program designed to encourage women to work in non-traditional areas and occupations has been incorporated into the

employment program. A non-traditional occupation for women is one which has female participation rate of less than 10%. Positions can be created or be existing vacancies in non-traditional areas.

Funding for the women's non-traditional employment program is provided from two to six months, and a maximum of \$2.50 is provided.

The ministry of labour will also cost-share employment wages for private sector employees who have been in business for a year or more. **UP TO THREE POSITIONS**

They will provide funding assistance for as many as three positions in a farm or business. Positions must be created for a minimum of two months and a maximum of four months during May and September. Cost-share wage will be provided to a maximum of \$2.50.

Students and youths are provided work through funding programs offered to tourist information centres and museums. Employment begins in May and finishes in September at the end of the tourist season.

Jobs in tourist centres and museums must be for a minimum of two months and a maximum of four months.

\$3.65 PER HOUR

A reimbursement of \$3.65 an

hour is provided for a maximum of three positions for each employer. Tourist information centres and museums have already received their application forms for hiring students.

Career-related employment is being funded to post-secondary institutions for students. Positions have to provide two months of employment between May and September. The ministry of labour is providing a reimbursement from \$600 to \$1,200.

About 8,000 students and youths will find summer jobs through the 1982 summer job creation program.

The ministry of labour will provide employers with a maximum of \$2.50 per hour to assist wage payments to students or youths who can work a minimum of 40 days. Applications for assistance from the ministry of labour closes June 25.

There were 3,000 students in Victoria alone seeking summer jobs this year.

Applications for funding are available at the government agent's office in Ganges.



Day camp, bike 'n hike, tent-event are offered

The summer program for children, sponsored by the Community Society, is getting under way at the beginning of July.

SunFun 82 consists of three different summer camp themes, explains project manager Susan Mouat. There is a day camp, a bike 'n hike and a tent-event.

The day camp is composed of four week-long sessions during which children register by the week for \$15 on island and \$25 for off-islanders. The week-long sessions begin July 5 and end on August 20. The day camp is designed for children from six to 10.

The bike 'n hike program

involves an overnight trip to Galiano Island along with a bike maintenance and safety clinic. Bikers are scheduled for July 12 through to the 15th and August 9-12.

The tent-event includes a three-day camping trip to Ruckle Park at Beaver Point. This camp, along with the bike 'n hike, is designed for children from eight to 12. The tent-event is on July 26-28 and August 23-25.

The community centre will be open on registration days of June 23 and 24. It is on a first-come, first-serve basis and immediate payment is demanded.

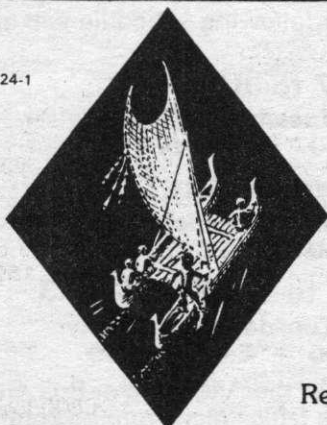

Island artist featured in Film Board production

A National Film Board crew from the Vancouver Production Unit were busy on Galiano last week shooting a film about Elisabeth Hopkins. Known to her friends as "Hoppy", this young lady achieved nation-wide fame for her water-colour paintings.

Miss Hopkins was into her 70's before her hobby turned into a vocation and she entered her "fantasy" period. She is shortly going to Toronto and the crew will be there to film her "pictures at an exhibition". One of Miss Hopkins' many endearing qualities is her evident and impish enjoyment of these public occasions, and the scepticism with which she greets the deference that is now her due.

The short film will show scenes of Hoppy's life on Galiano such as her doing her weekly shopping at the Friday morning market. The film has no script but conversations with Elisabeth will be edited to supply the commentary and provide the structure of the film. When complete the film will be available from NFB offices and probably will be shown on TV at some future date.

Health Association

Representatives from eight island organizations and Drs. Hale, Nolan and Paterson met in Page Drive Lounge on Friday at the invitation of Beverly Anderson, public health nurse for the Outer Islands, to consider the possibility of forming a health association on Galiano.

Roy Betts of Mayne and Gordon Wallace of Pender Island described the development of Health Centres on each of their islands. The Mayne Island Centre is operated under the Capital Regional health department and is subsidized by the provincial government.

The Pender Island Centre is run independently of any government agency, and without financial assistance except for a start-up grant from the Lottery Fund. Administration is undertaken by a board formed from representatives of 21 organizations on the island. Both speakers were enthusiastic about the success of their centres.

DIFFERENT NEEDS
During the discussion that followed speakers stressed that each Outer Island was different and had different needs. There was little dissatisfaction expressed by those present regarding the health services presently available on Galiano.

The volunteer ambulance service was highly praised for its handling of emergencies and Eva New, Galiano member of the hospital board, reported that island residents made much greater use of the facilities on Salt Spring than people of the other Outer Islands.

Both medical doctors were sceptical of a practice on Galiano being able to provide a family physician with an adequate income with the present population, even if a fully equipped health centre were provided by a society. Mr. O. New of the Chamber of Commerce reminded listeners that the current economic climate is completely different from the one that existed when the other two centres were funded.

The consensus was that in the present circumstances most of the services needed on Galiano are available on the island, or accessible to residents in one way or another. None of the organizations represented volunteered to take the lead in forming a health association.

However, if any group is willing to undertake such a project they could get in touch with Beverly Anderson, public health nurse on Mayne Island.

School News

The 11th successive summer swimming program concluded on Friday. Instruction was given by Mrs. C. Buttery who, as teenager Cathie Guun, gave the first lessons when the program began in 1972.

Mrs. Buttery was assisted by Matthew Schoenfeld, Ian Hooley and Roy Treloar, and all were presented with tokens of appreciation by their students. Hall and Betty Tingley have generously contributed the use of their beautiful pool which is only a short walk from the school.

Their enthusiastic support also contributed to the success of the program which over the years has taught about 200 children to swim. The school staff and children expressed their thanks to the Tingleys by presenting them with a delicately drawn etching by Ronaldo Norden.

TO STRATHCONA
Five Grade 6 students, accompanied by parent Matthew

Schoenfeld, will be joining the Salt Spring contingent attending a week's program at the Strathcona Outdoor Education Centre near Campbell River. This highly recommended program has been enjoyed by Grade 6 students for several years.

Work on the Galiano School extension is to begin before the end of June and the principal has received notice that everything must be packed and removed from the school into storage three days before the end of term.

Strong cardboard boxes will be needed and it is hoped that an adequate corps of muscular volunteers will effect the removal.

Garden Club

Gardeners are rarely caught inside on warm, sunny afternoons, but those who attended the Garden Club's regular June meeting last Wednesday afternoon were well rewarded by President Aini Haksi's talk and demonstration.

First Aini created two beautiful flower arrangements with roses. She stressed that roses must be cut on a long diagonal and plunged into very hot water to keep them fresh. With six large long-stem red roses and juniper branches she constructed the classical triangular display, and then in an egg cup around a dry vine tendril an arrangement of miniature roses.

With program convener Elspeth King as her *straight man* she proceeded to bonzai an evergreen bush which had been moved to Elspeth's garden in preparation last fall. Into the traditional two-hole pot was first placed a screen covered with turkey grit followed by a layer of pea gravel, one of subsoil and another of loam to be covered finally by one of compost. As the tap root had been removed last fall Aini confined her pruning to the branches of the pine and pinching out some of the remaining growing tips. The little tree was planted to one side of the pot and held to the desired shape by a copper wire.

Aini reminded her audience not to fertilize evergreens until September, to water from the top at least daily and twice a day in hot weather. The plant should be kept out of doors in partial shade. Further shaping and repotting may be done yearly.

The meeting closed with prayer, led by Father Bergin.

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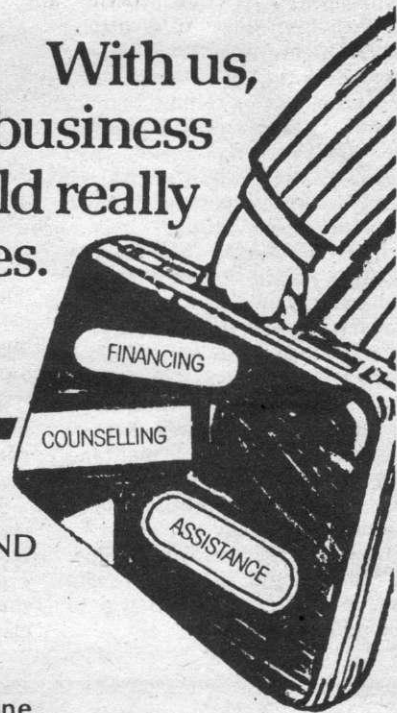
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Initial plans presented for school traffic

The first steps in solving the traffic problem at the Ganges school complex will cost \$40,000.

Henry Schubart had been contracted by the Gulf Islands School Board to develop plans to separate the children and the traffic at the elementary and high schools site and last week he presented the board with the initial steps to the solution.

In his report Schubart told the board, "These first steps do not entail the long-term commitment to purchase of land nor any major immediate physical changes. They will require budgeting of some funds as they become available."

The first step in the plan involves the development of a parking lot for use of the high school staff at

the intersection of Park and Church Roads. Entrance to the high school complex would be by a barrier-free access to the courtyard from the northwest corner gate.

The parking lot would be gravelled and the cost is estimated at \$7,500. The access route would be paved and the cost set at \$2,500.

Schubart also suggested the creation of a new road for use of the two residences on the hill beside the high school. The new road would join the lots to Lower Ganges Road near the church.

The residents of the houses currently have an easement for the use of the road from Rainbow Road. The new road would entail the moving of the round portable classroom. The cost has been

estimated at \$10,000.

Two parking lots, priced at \$5,000, would be constructed behind the school board office on the site of the tennis court and play area. The lots would provide spaces for 33 cars.

The tennis court would be moved temporarily just across the current access road and would eventually become part of a larger parking area. The court would measure 60 by 120 feet and cost \$15,000. When converted to a parking lot it would provide 24 spaces and become part of an 84-space parking area.

MOVE KANAKA ROAD

When the large lot is eventually built it will stretch from the current site-access road behind the school board office to Kanaka Road. The long-range plans call for the closing of Kanaka and moving it

further west.

The lot will take at least 60 feet from the play area but would leave sufficient space for a soccer pitch measuring 150 by 300 feet.

School board chairman Strick Aust said the siting of the soccer pitch and relocation of the softball diamond were of less concern at the moment.

"Our first and prime concern for doing this," he told the trustees, "is to make sure that kids and cars are not using the same space."

The plans will be proceeded with as money becomes available. The costs will be applied to the capital expense account of the school board.

Drawings of the proposed changes to the site can be viewed in the meeting room at the school district office in Ganges.

Enrolment is up by one in Gulf Islands schools

With less than a month to go until school closing, enrolment at Gulf Islands schools shows an increase of one over figures for September, 1981.

The enrolment report issued at

the school board meeting last week shows 23 more elementary pupils and 22 fewer secondary students.

The big loser was Gulf Islands Secondary School on Salt Spring where 20 students have dropped out since last September. Enrolment now stands at 333, down from 353 who were there at the beginning of the school year.

The secondary classes at the Mayne School dropped four to 32 students from 36. The high school classes at the Pender School increased to 11 students from the nine who signed up for classes in September.

The elementary school enrolment on Mayne stands at 45, an increase from 41. At the Pender School the numbers are up to 75 from 73 in September.

The elementary school on Galiano Island showed an increase of one to stand at 55 while on Saturna enrolment decreased by one to 17.

The largest gain was shown by Salt Spring Elementary School which increased the number of pupils to 379 from the September figure of 366.

Fernwood School also grew, having 136 youngsters in classes as compared to 132 when school began.

The district enrolment figure stands at 1,083 pupils in both secondary and elementary schools. Figures for the end of May, 1981 showed 1,043 children attending classes.

Canoe swamped in pass

It was a busy day for a Galiano Island fisherman Saturday.

When Bud Baines went fishing in his 40-foot troller *Savory Isle* he decided to cut across Active Pass to check up on fellow-islander Joshua Thompson's 30-foot boat, the *Colleen*. Thompson had anchored the *Colleen* off Mayne Island when he experienced engine troubles the day before.

As Baines was crossing the pass he saw a paddle waving in the air and went to investigate.

A ferry had swamped a canoe in the pass and a young man still sat in the boat which was full of water and sinking. The young Galiano man was wearing a life-jacket.

Baines rescued both man and canoe shortly before the Vancouver ferry returned to check the swamped canoe.

He was dropped at Sturdies Bay, Galiano Island, by Baines who returned to complete his trip to Mayne Island.

Mobrae area near St. Mary Lake, had the water in a well on his property tested and the fluoride content measured out at 13 ppm. He said that the cost of treating the water to make it drinkable was too high and the well will be abandoned.

He had sought help from various government agencies and although many people were interested in his problem, he received no help, only advice, he said.

Dr. Arneil said that people worried about possible high levels of fluoride can have tests run on the well water.

Sampling kits can be obtained by mailing a cheque or money order for \$25 made out to the minister of finance to The Environmental Laboratory, Water Resources Service, Department of the Environment, 3650 Westbrook Cres., Vancouver, B.C. V6S 2L2. The request should specify a test for fluoride levels.

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
