Alan Best recalls his expeditions to the Falklands

Catching penguins old hat for island man

Penguin-catchers are a rare breed. They are more rare than collectors of dozens of other animals and probably less successful in the long run. But for Alan Best of Ganges, penguin-catching is old hat.

Best began collecting penguins as a freelance collector of zoo animals across the globe, following the second world war. His penguin expeditions took him to the Falkland Islands as far back as 1946 and he returned to the islands several times on repeated missions, more successful than the first.

In 1946, Best lost his collection of penguins in the heat of Montevideo. Two more trips as a collector were successful, however, but penguins are difficult birds to take home.

First of all, they have an affinity for cool climates. Freezing temperatures are welcome to the sub-antarctic birds but as soon as the thermometer rises above 40 they have to be cooled. This was done by using a stirrup pump which Best claimed was an invaluable tool for transporting penguins.

He would pump water into them, a life-saver at South American airports, and would also fill the birds with ice if it was available and if the birds were in critical condition.

CANNOT ADAPT

Penguins can't sweat and they cannot adapt to warm temperatures. Their body temperature is 102° F. and if the heat rises into the 70's the penguins simply keel over and die.

Secondly, penguins tend to have voracious appetites particularly the Emperor penguin which weighs about 80 pounds. So feeding the penguins posed a big problem to Best who was figuring on collecting around 70 during his final expedition to the Falkland Islands.

When Alan Best became curator of the Stanley Park Zoo in Vancouver in 1951 his days of penguin catching appeared to be over. But in 1959, when the zoo wanted to replenish the penguin pool at the Vancouver zoo, Best was called on as the man to do it.

On December 8, 1959, Best left Vancouver for another trip to the Falkland Islands.

It was Christmas by the time the curator had landed at Stanley on the Falklands so the Canadian spent the festive season renewing old acquaintances and making plans for his expedition to South Georgia.

LEFT DECEMBER 30

The Falkland Islands were home to several varieties of penguin but not the king, macaroni or chinstrap, which Best would find on South Georgia. He left Stanley on December 30 aboard the *John Biscoe* for the "long, lone island of forbidding glaciers" in the Scotia Sea.

The trip to Grytviken Harbour in South Georgia took four days and on arrival the *John Biscoe's* course was modified, leaving Best at Grytviken Harbour and The Point, a "village" housing a British weather station and a Norwegian whaling station. Best realized there that his plans weren't falling into place as well as they might have.

A trip to the macaroni and king penguin rookeries proved to be more difficult for Best than he had expected. But he was lucky when Nigel Bonner, a biologist at The Point, offered to exchange labour,

If Best assisted Bonner in tagging 1,400 seal pups, he would help Best in his expedition to the macaroni rookeries on Bird Island.

TAGGED 400 A DAY

They left The Point via a Norwegian seal catcher with a crew of 10 aboard. They moved into an eight by six tar paper shack during which time they succeeded in tagging about 400 seal pups a day.

Best and his colleagues lived on giant albatross eggs and grew used to the 10-foot sea elephants and over-protective harem bulls that lived around them.

Once the tagging was completed the team set out for the macaroni rookeries on the island's other side. There, thousands upon thousands of penguins conglomerated...a myriad of sea-fowl so crowded that conditions would horrify animal lovers unused to the penguin rookery.

The macaronis weren't difficult to gather and pack into sacks. Three pairs were collected before Best decided to capture three pairs of ringed penguins in the same area.

The Norwegian seal catcher took the men to the Bay of Isles where a fast trip in poor weather conditions saw the sailors with curator and biologist gather 30 king penguins.

HAD TO FEED THEM

Back at The Point, Best had to deal with the appetite of 40 penguins. The birds could eat anything from two to five pounds of fish daily.

The residents at The Point were as concerned as Best and something similar to a fishing derby was the first tactic tried in order to find food for the hungry birds.

Twenty fish were caught. They provided but a mere snack to the

famished birds by the end of the first day.

The whaling station saved the day when it offered sei-whale meat to feed the penguins. Best attempted to feed the birds and after several force-feeds the birds took hungrily to the meat. Soon he was sliding one and two-pound slivers of fish down the throats of the penguins.

Alan Best returned to the Falkland Islands where he continued to gather gentoos, jackasses and rockhopper penguins to take with him to Vancouver.

LEFT AFTER THREE MONTHS

On February 22, 1960, Alan Best left the British colony with his last penguin collection. After nearly three months spent in the islands and nearly \$6,000 later, he set out for the long, anxious trip home.

Best struggled with the birds from Montevideo to Santiago. The curator tested two penguins in a cargo plane to see if they could survive the altitude of the Andes. And in Santiago he used his stirrup pump to revive the heated birds.

Best didn't lose one bird during his return trip and was aided by airlines and pilots who co-operated with the ice-feeding procedures on runways and visits to the belly compartment of the aircraft.

The birds made it to Stanley Park and were immediately placed in the frozen confines of the penguin pools.

Best is now concerned with extermination of various species of penguin in the Falkland Islands.

When the king penguins were threatened with extermination several years ago, the rookeries

were carefully tended and protected until they had been rebuilt and populations had increased.

Best said that the gentoo and Magellan penguins were threatened because of the Argentine fishermen who kill the penguins without following the restrictions and quotas.

TAKEN FOR OIL

The birds are taken for their oil. Best, who retired to Salt Spring Island several years ago, and who grew up on the property where he now resides, commented on conditions in local waters.

"The main problem on the west coast is over-fishing. The seals from California have migrated north in search of food because their food stocks have been commercially fished out of existence.

The most basic of marine food is herring. The herring fishing that takes place annually has destroyed the balance and upset the marine ecology on the west coast. The herring served as basic sustenance to fish and as it disappears so will the marine consumers."

Best was curator of the Stanley Park Zoo for over 20 years.

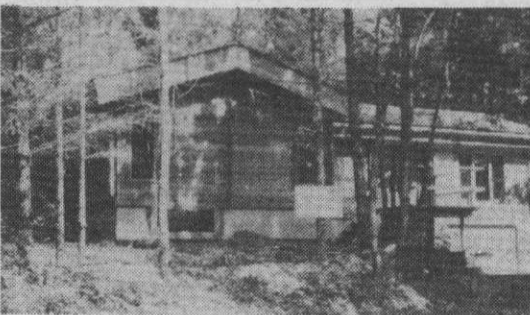

Rental aid increased

Senior citizens who qualify for Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters received good news recently.

The ministry of human resources announced an increase in the maximum allowable rents which means the seniors will end up each month with more money to spend.

Effective July 1, 1982, the new maximum rent level for singles will be \$330, increased from \$265. For couples the new ceiling will be \$365, up from \$295.

S.A.F.E.R. benefits equal up to 75% of the amount by which rent exceeds 30% of the applicant's total income. To be eligible, the person must be at least 65 years old

and receive Canada Old Age Security as well as meet a residency requirement.

The S.A.F.E.R. program is evaluated each year in order to ensure that elderly renters can meet the costs of shelter. The previous review and increase was in July, 1981.

Senior citizens who qualify for G.A.I.N. for seniors' supplement to federal pensions and who need more information on S.A.F.E.R. can contact Roma Sturdy at 537-5470. The ministry of human resources also has a toll-free direct line for information on the program. Call Victoria at Zenith 2656.

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Fire hazard high

The lack of rain and the hot sun have dried the Gulf Islands to the point where the danger of fire ranges from high to extremely high.

On Salt Spring Island, loggers have been asked to curtail forest operations by 1 pm and chain saws cannot be used in the afternoon. Refuse incineration on the island has been limited to early mornings or late evenings.

On Saturna, the fire hazard is extremely high. Fire chief Mike Graham has requested B.C. Ferries to announce the fact to incoming visitors. The forests of that island have been closed to logging operations and no open fires, including camp fires, are permitted until the danger passes.

The hazard rating on Mayne Island also stands at extremely high and fire chief John Halliday has stopped issuing permits for

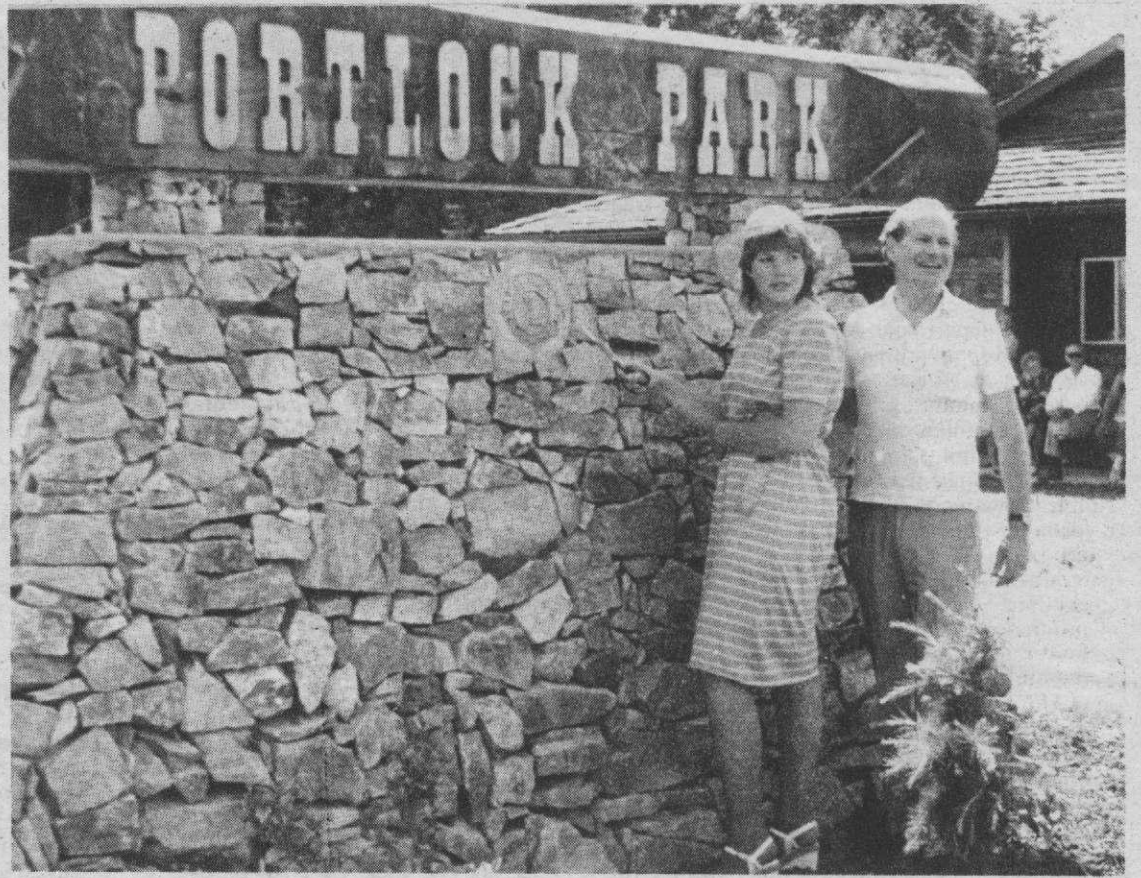
burning. No camp fires are allowed. Logging on the island is on a day-to-day footing and chain saws can be used if properly exhausted.

Ted Bowerman, fire chief on Pender Island, will issue no burning permits and has set the rating on that island at a high hazard. No camp fires or other open blazes are allowed.

The Galiano fire department could not be reached for comment.

On Salt Spring, the hot weather was blamed for spontaneous combustion in a pile of stumps on North Beach Road near Castillou Way. Volunteer firemen were called to the scene last Wednesday afternoon.

The stump pile had been lit on fire about one month ago in a controlled burn but the flames started up again apparently spontaneously. No other damage was reported from the scene.

The Salt Spring Advisory Planning Commission is one member short but the position will be filled.

The APC helps the Salt Spring Islands Trust Committee determine the merits of various applications concerning land use and is composed of representatives of various groups on Salt Spring.

The groups had been asked to submit names of the representatives to the Islands Trust and each

group, except for the Gulf Islands School Board, was heard from at the meeting of the Trust Committee last week.

The school board, naming Bert Beitel as nominee, had sent a letter dated June 11 to the Trust but it apparently did not arrive in time for the meeting.

The Trust Committee accepted the names of Arvid Chalmers, representing the Salt Spring Planning Association; Russ

Lazaruk, Farmers' Institute; Don Storr, North Salt Spring Water District; and Gerry Bourdin, Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce.

The trustees decided, at the urging of Bud Kreissl, to prepare an amendment to the APC bylaws in order to replace the school board representative with one from the ratepayers group on south Salt Spring.

The change will be debated at the next meeting of the Trust Committee in July.

Official opening

Portlock Park on Salt Spring Island was officially opened Saturday. The park was named in honour of Tom Portlock who had worked to see the dream of a park come true but died shortly after the venture began. Suzan Portlock, his granddaughter, helps Hugh Curtis, MLA Saanich and the Islands, cut the official ribbon. The stone work and sign are the handiwork of Peter Cartwright.

Crawfurd Twiss dies at 98

Crawfurd Ouchterlony Twiss, the oldest pioneer resident of Galiano Island, passed away in Royal Columbian Hospital in New Westminster on June 5. He was 98.

Born in Southsea, England, he was the eldest son of Admiral and Mrs. Guy O. Twiss. After spending some years in Burma and South Africa, he emigrated to Canada in 1910 to the Okanagan. He met and married Alice Edith Gilmour in 1913.

In the same year they moved to Galiano Island where they bought property on Whalers Bay, built the family home and raised three children. Times were hard and primitive in those early days — one boat a week, one telephone in the only grocery store.

The year 1930 found Twiss en route to work for the Anglo British Fishing Co. on the Skeena River. He was employed there until his retirement in 1960. Then he and his wife Alice spent many hours in their home "Kennymore", taking time out for many trips to England, United States and touring B.C. His wife died in 1972.

In 1978 Twiss moved to the Icelandic Home in Vancouver. During his time there he made trips back to Galiano where he was able to visit and chat with his old-time friends and sometimes go fishing and tend his garden.

Last September ill health forced him to be moved to the Royal Columbian Hospital, where he remained until his death.

He leaves to mourn his daughter Barbara and husband Bernard Clarke of Richmond, son Lyndon and wife Vera of Burnaby, son Roger and wife Ethel of Saanichton, grandsons Michael and wife Ginny of Richmond, Paul

and wife Debbie, Rob and Patsy, granddaughters Sandra and Deborah, great-grandsons Peter and Darren, all of Victoria, great-granddaughter Ann Michele of Richmond.

He also leaves many nieces and nephews in England, as well as nephew John Liver and wife Winnifred of Galiano Island, nieces Betty Johnson and Nancy Gardner of California, sister-in-law Mrs. Ethel Liver, England, and many friends.

Funeral service was held at Holy Trinity Cathedral, New Westminster, on June 10 and cremation followed. Rev. L. Rivers and Rev. T. Allan officiated. There will be a memorial service in St. Margaret's of Scotland Church, Galiano Island, Saturday, June 26 at 1 pm. Graveside service at the family plot in Galiano Cemetery will follow.

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Two evenings of teaching by Buddhist

Next Monday His Eminence the Venerable Kalu Rinpoche will return to Salt Spring Island, beginning his visit with two evenings of teaching at the Activity Centre in Ganges. His topic will be *Working with Thoughts and Emotions*.

Kalu Rinpoche is a senior meditation instructor of the Kagyu School of Tibetan Buddhism, one of the four great lineages of the transmission of buddhadharma in that country. He is highly regarded by all these sects and has both given and received teachings from the greatest of the Tibetan lamas, including the Dalai Lama and the Gyalwa Karmapa.

He is one of the main forces in the propagation of Tibetan Buddhism in the west, through the

establishment of many centres in Europe and North America and particularly by making the three-year retreat available to Western students. Salt Spring Island offers one of the very few situations where this can be done, others being in France, New York and Sweden.

On July 22 of this year, after

three weeks of teaching, Kalu Rinpoche will conduct a number of students from Europe, North America and Asia into the retreat centre on Mt. Tuam where they will spend the next three years and three months in intensive study and practice of the teachings of the Buddhism of Tibet.

Following this period, the

students may, in their turn be empowered as teachers, thus becoming a living link between East and West.

The talks in Ganges on June 29 and 30 will give islanders another opportunity to receive a glimpse of the ocean of wisdom of this incomparable teacher, catalyst of such a profound cultural contact.

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Signs may be back

The no parking signs have been taken down on Rainbow Road but they may be back.

The Salt Spring Island Trust Committee last week reviewed the parking problem on Rainbow Road just past Kanaka Road. Complaints about vehicles parked on the road being a danger to school children had prompted the highways department to put up the no parking signs.

Richard Murakami had raised objections to the signs he claimed adversely affected his parents' business. The signs, he said, had been put in without consultation with the property owners on the road.

In addition to the Murakami business, B.C. Hydro, Cubbon Lumber and the fish plant are in the area. The meeting was told that workers in the various businesses would be allowed to park on the various properties.

"The next move is up to the highways," said Lott.

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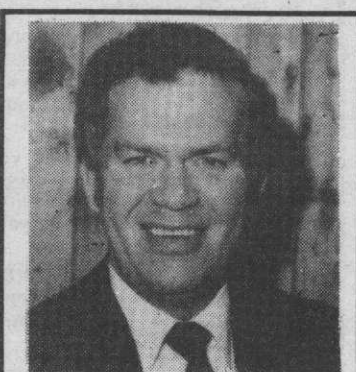


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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

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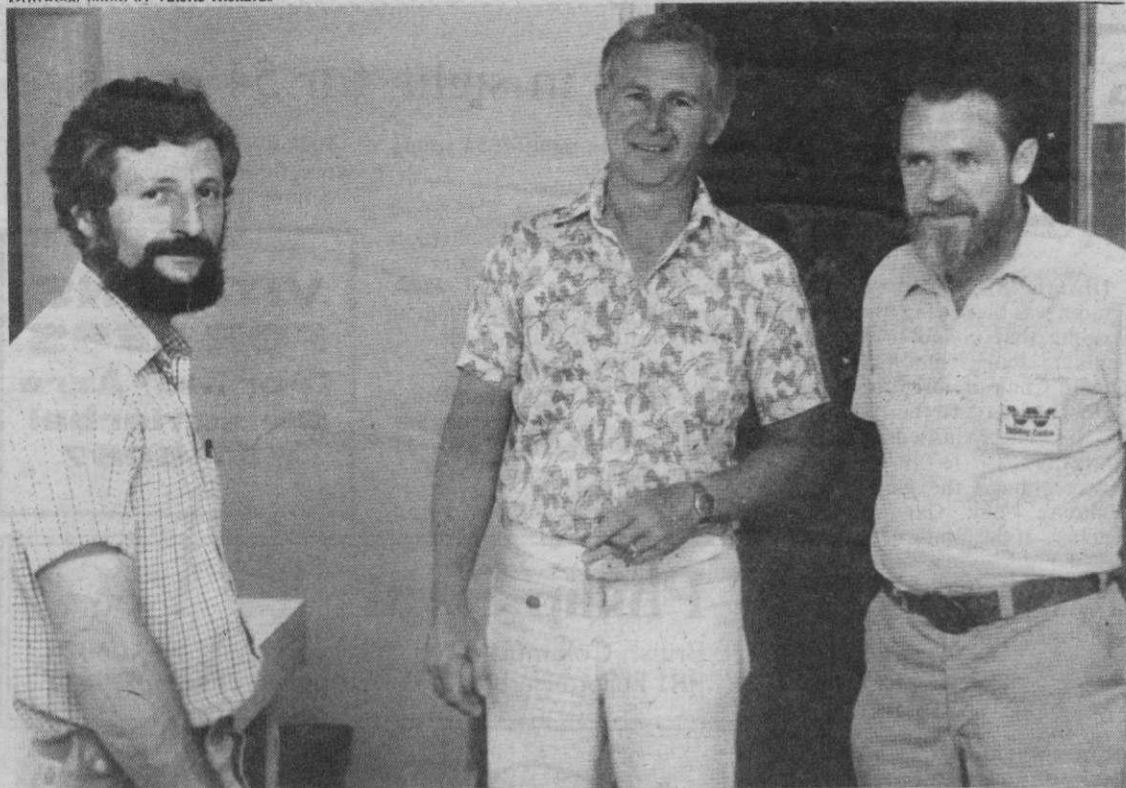

Mahon Hall restoration fund balance down to \$6,000

Response to the appeal for funds by the Mahon Hall Restoration Committee has been "most heartening", John Crofton, chairman of the fund-raising subcommittee, said last week.

"A cash grant of \$2,500 has been made by the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 92. This generous grant," Crofton said, "is most welcome and will now enable us to go ahead with the construction of the wheelchair and loading ramp at the parking lot entrance to the

hall. Work on the ramp will go ahead as soon as the modifications to the entrance, now under way, are completed.

"In addition, two of the service clubs on the island will contribute substantial amounts of labour and material for major restoration projects.

"Painting of the exterior of the building will be undertaken by the members of the Lions Club. They will supply the paint and the labour to do the job. They are hopeful of making a start on the painting within the next few days," he said.

"The Rotary Club has committed to underwrite the expense involved in modifications to the plumbing in the hall," Crofton announced.

They will cover the costs of materials and Rotary member David Rainsford has volunteered to do the necessary installation work. This will include installing a new double sink and small hot water tank in the kitchen, a laundry tub in the board room for the use of the potters and the installation of a new basin and toilet in the bathroom adjacent to the kitchen.

"This work should be completed before the opening of the annual Artcraft show and sale on June 25," Crofton said.

In expressing his gratitude to those who have "committed to these generous contributions", Crofton said "that in just over two weeks since we launched our appeal for funds about 50% of our objective has been attained. This is most encouraging and we are confident that the balance,

amounting to about \$6,000, will be obtained without difficulty."

Plans for raising the remaining amount of the appeal objective are well under way, he said.

"We have prepared a letter which will go out directly to members of the community at large asking that they make a contribution to the fund to help restore the facility which for so long has been the focal point of the cultural and artistic activities of the community. In addition we are developing plans to stage a lamb barbecue to mark the closing of Artcraft on the Labour Day weekend. Approaches have also been made to the B.C. lottery fund, through the ministry of finance.

"In the meantime," Crofton concluded, "anyone wishing to make a contribution to the restoration work may send it directly to the Mahon Hall Restoration Committee, Box 1304, Ganges."

complying with that stipulation, he said.

"We were trying to give the locals a break," he said.

Hal Wright, another Salt Spring trucker, was permitted to work on the unloading Thursday. He is a union member and his trucks carry union certification.

COULD HAVE BEEN AVOIDED

He told *Driftwood* that the incident could have been avoided if the truckers had either joined the union or had received a permit to work on a union job.

The Teamsters in Victoria, he said, would supply the work permits to islanders because of the out-of-the-way location of the Gulf Islands.

The work had been progressing smoothly and the barge was almost half-empty when the union officials enforced the stoppage. The four Bobell trucks ran overtime and the barge sat in Ganges Harbour longer than expected. It cost the company \$2,000 per hour in lease fees.

Wright said that the union problems may only be beginning. He predicted that when the construction for the sewer project begins, only union truckers would be allowed to work.

No delivery on Saturdays

The postal contract which controls rural route deliveries for Saturdays on Salt Spring Island's rural route one has expired.

Contracts run for five years and expiration date for both rural route two and rural route three have a one-year and four-year wait respectively for termination of mail delivery on Saturdays.

Post office public affairs spokesman Fred Morley explained that the rural route delivery on Saturdays is being phased out across Canada. There is no letter carrier service on Saturdays in cities and urban areas.

Already Manitoba and Alberta have a five-day delivery system province-wide, Morley stated.

There isn't very much mail on Saturdays and once the six-day delivery contracts expire, they will not be renewed, he said.
