Fifteen years ago, when Canada celebrated the 100th birthday of Confederation, most Canadians shared in a mood of jubilation and optimism. Maybe the 20th century would be Canada's century after all, just as Sir Wilfred Laurier had promised.

Today the mood is quite different as we observe our national holiday. The litany of personal, community and national problems is so well known, and depressing, that it does not need to be repeated here. Some people may well ask, "What have we to celebrate?"

Certainly, the economic conditions in Canada today rule out any national festival of foolish exuberance. Instead of increasing the budget for fireworks, the government would be better advised to put more money into job creation.

Although the mood may be more restrained, Canadians have many good reasons to observe July 1 with gratitude for the past, and with hope for the future.

CAN BE THANKFUL

We can be thankful that our ancestors fought for and won basic freedoms in such matters as religion, political affiliation, free speech, a free press and freedom of assembly.

An earlier generation put in place the measures that help to cushion today's hard times: old age security, workers' compensation, unemployment insurance, family

allowance, medicare and welfare payments. The fact that none of these programs is completely adequate should not blind us to the fact that ours would be a more cruel world without them.

Our public school system gives every child the right to a basic education and over the years we have enlarged our definition of what constitutes education. We can be thankful that our police, our law courts and our civil service are not riddled with corruption and that we can criticize their shortcomings without fear for our personal safety.

We have armed services to protect our sovereignty, fire

departments to protect our homes, air sea rescue facilities.

We have churches that help us to see our lives in the perspective of eternity as well as helping us to live in the midst of daily problems. We have labour unions and professional associations that struggle for decent wages and working conditions, we have businesses that provide basic goods and services. Farmers and fishermen produce food while factory workers produce needed goods, scientists, technicians, office workers and store keepers all make their contributions.

PEOPLE WHO CARE

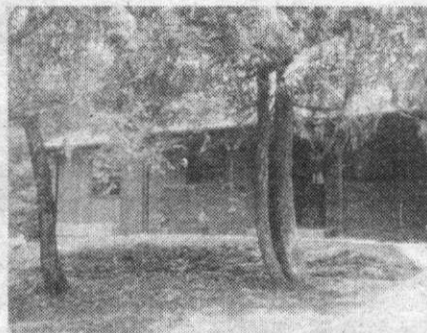
We have people in our society

Communications confusion seen

Courtenay fair opens July 9

The chairman didn't call, the representative didn't call and the trustees wondered what was going on.

"There seems to be some confusion in communications," said Tom Davidson of Saturna Island, the Gulf Islands School Board representative on the board of directors of Camosun College in Victoria.

Davidson had been appointed to the position following his defeat in the school board election last fall. He had served Saturna as school trustee for many years previously.

The trustees of the Gulf Islands had questioned why Davidson did

not report to them about the happenings at Camosun College. He had been waiting, he told the trustees last week, for an invitation to report to them.

He had requested information from the board and had not received it. The two boards are negotiating reserved seats at the college for graduates of the Gulf Islands Secondary School and Davidson needed to know how many students were to be accommodated as well as which courses were to be chosen.

Davidson told the board that he would report to them at least every two months and that he was

available at any time to talk to them.

School board chairman Strick Aust had indicated at an earlier meeting that Davidson might be replaced by a trustee in January 1983. Davidson pointed out that the appointment to the Camosun board was for two years and his term would not expire until 1984.

A number of Gulf Islands residents are expected to take part in the annual Renaissance Fair at Courtenay next week.

The fair, sponsored by the Central Island Arts Alliance, opens July 9 for three days at the Comox Valley exhibition grounds.

The event has been held every

summer for the past seven years, attracting artists and musicians from all over Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands.

This year will mark the first time that the contents of each of the 101 crafts booths will have to pass a rigid standards inspection by a jury of five professional crafts people.

Committee is at work on obtaining Knowledge Network

The Knowledge Network is a way for young and old alike to obtain up-to-date information in the convenience of their own home.

The network offers Teleseries and Telecourses which can be viewed on certain cable channels and may be used for post-secondary credits.

Teleseries are offered for the viewer's enjoyment and self-education. There is a list of 89 summer shows which are varied and informative. They range from biochemistry and molecular biology, to a look at the Canadian government's policy and process, to learning shows for children aged three and older.

Telecourses are educational courses that may be used for credit at the post-secondary level.

Unlike college lectures, if you miss a show you will have a chance to view it later in the week as most programs are aired bi-weekly.

As with Teleseries the shows can be watched for personal interest only. The list of summer courses includes 25 programs, ranging from introductory computer applications to home improvement to introductory astrology.

Fast-track courses can be completed in under two months. These are shown in four episodes per week. The summer list includes 14 different courses ranging from sketching techniques to learning German to marketing basics.

Knowledge Network is one step closer to Salt Spring Island thanks to the efforts of a committee chaired by Don Outram.

The Community Arts Council has been approached to act as the organization to apply for a government grant for the installation of Knowledge Network on the island.

The CAC is arranging a meeting

some time next month with the network. More information about the installation and maintenance of the satellite dish is needed before a final decision can be reached.

Anyone with cable television on the island may some day be able to enjoy Knowledge Network.

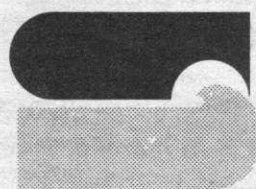

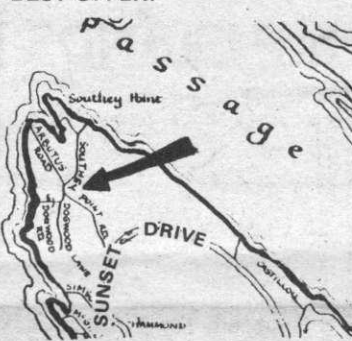

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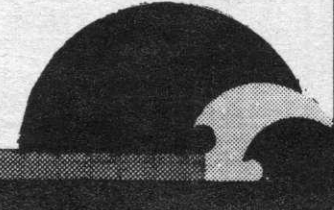
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A day at beauty retreat is a day in heaven

Cubs, Sea Scouts at Pender Island ceremony

Cubs, Sea Scouts gather at Pender

In February 1980 Frank McKenzie and Tom Turner started a Cub Pack on Pender Island with eight boys.

In September of 1981 27 boys showed up. The boys were split into two groups, the older ones, with leaders Ray Neil and Phil Roach, formed a Sea Scout Pack and the younger ones, with leaders Tom Turner, Richard Tallboy and Brian Hanson, a Cub Pack.

Tom Turner resigned for personal reasons in March and his place was taken by Anne Forbes, who assumed his position of Akela, which means head wolf.

The Cubs, Sea Scouts and their leaders gathered recently at the school community centre for a presentation of badges and for some of the leaders to be formally invested.

Two leaders from the Greater Victoria Regional Area came for the event. Flo Jensen, who is an Akela with her own pack, but who is also head Akela of all those in the Greater Victoria area, formally

invested Anne Forbes of the Cubs and Ray Neil of the Sea Scouts. She was accompanied by Marj Ball who is the Regional Service Scouter for the group committees. The group committees are the parents of the Cubs and Scouts and Ball assists them.

Five boys from the Cubs took part in the ceremony conducted by Mrs. Jensen when they officially moved from the Cubs to the Sea Scouts. They were Jamie Thorne, Simon Tallboy, Travis Bradshaw, Michael Palmer and Ben Ellis. These boys had previously attended the Cub Camp at Sooke for those about to become Scouts.

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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Work began on the new school board office and health centre. The building was being built on the school property in Ganges at a contracted cost of \$17,955.

The Victoria Presbytery held a meeting at the Ganges United Church. The get-together of churchmen was the first such held on Salt Spring Island. With about 60 laymen and ministers in attendance, the meeting began with a luncheon followed by a communion service.

The public works department announced cancellation of all federally funded building projects for which contracts had not yet been let. A casualty of the cutbacks was the proposed improvements to the Ganges boat basin.

B.C. Toll Ferry Authority was planning to bring a ferry from Okanagan Lake for service in the Gulf Islands. The boat would be dismantled for the journey and reassembled on the coast. The rumour indicated the ferry would be in use as a direct link between the mainland and the islands.

The Gulf Islands School Board was advertising for tenders on certain improvements planned for the Galiano school building. The planned improvements included cutting doorways to the hall, installing shelves and counters as well as electrical work.

Inter-Islands Cup competition was set to begin at the Salt Spring Golf and Country Club. The golfers from Galiano were ready to defend the trophy they had won the previous year.

The Cowichan Valley Summer School, to be held at Mount Prevost Junior Secondary School in Duncan, would offer high schoolers the opportunity to make up credits for work missed during the regular school year. The courses included English Language and Literature as well as several commerce courses.

Fifteen years ago

The Gulf Islands School Board met in a special meeting to discuss the results of the defeated referendums. The voters of the Gulf Islands turned down the board's request for additional classroom space at the high school as well as accommodation for Outer Islands students on Salt Spring.

The department of highways announced plans to improve road conditions on Mayne Island. Following complaints by residents, the department decided to take measures to reduce the dust. They also moved several hydro and telephone poles to ensure safety on the roads.

Ganges RCMP were investigating an incident of drivers playing "chicken" after a car ended up in a ditch. The game involves two cars competing for road space and the first driver to give in is "chicken" or dead.

The Salt Spring Island Recreational Holdings Ltd. were to hold an annual meeting to discuss merger with the Salt Spring Island Golf and Country Club.

Driftwood information: There are 41 telephones in service for every 100 population in the area of British Columbia served by B.C. Telephone.

Five cases of dynamite, dated 1923, were found on a property on Mayne Island. As dynamite ages, it becomes sensitive and police said the find on that island could have destroyed the entire property.

The Galiano Electrification Committee held its final meeting. The group had led the drive for electricity for the northern part of the island. In two years and two months, they had cleared 15 miles of right-of-way as well as planted \$10,000 worth of volunteered poles. The committee voted to turn the remainder of their trust fund, \$94, over to the Galiano Community Club.

Ten years ago

The Salvation Army fund raising drive collected \$1,624 to date for the year. The organizers had set a target of \$1,500.

The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce wrote to the attorney-general to request additional police aid on holiday week-ends. They cited problems encountered during the past long-weekend when the population of the island almost doubled and the local police had difficulties coping with the tourists. The chamber letter-writers praised the efforts of the Ganges RCMP but said they were too few in number to handle the problems.

Activity in the Outer Islands includes the annual Saturna Lamb Barbecue and the Mayne Island Salmon Derby. The events would entertain people for the week-end.

The Salties, roller hockey version, won a game from Pacific Logging, 7-2 at the George Pearkes Arena.

Driftwood noted the results of a "social indicators" survey conducted by the Economist. Canada led all nations as the most habitable country. Countries were scored on such items as murder rate, population density, car ownership, economic growth, infant mortality as well as other social indicators.

The subdivision was approved in 1891 and lots were finally being offered for sale. The property, on Walker Hook Road, had been

subdivided before the turn of the century and the recent rules did not apply. The subdivision contains about 200 lots with an average size of one-quarter acre.

Five years ago

The school, located on the former Fernwood Farms on Fernwood Road overlooking Fernwood wharf would be known as Fernwood, decreed the Gulf Islands School Board.

B.C. Ferry Corporation was toying with the idea of charging fares for inter-island travel. When the fares had been eliminated, the traffic between islands increased and caused problems with traffic to the mainland. The ferry officials were to meet with islanders at the Community Hall on Galiano to discuss the proposal. Persons planning to attend the meeting were asked to leave their vehicles behind to avoid traffic congestion on the ferry.

The minister of municipal affairs refused consent for the building of a 26-unit apartment complex in Vesuvius. The minister, Saanich and the Islands MLA Hugh Curtis, would not approve the bylaws of the Capital Regional District for changes in the Salt Spring community plan.

The well at Galiano School went dry. The witcher came and found a spot. The drill filled. The hole got deeper but no water came up. The drill could reach a maximum depth of 433 feet. Water began to flow at 423 feet. The flow was 25 gallons per minute.

The Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal raised \$3,332. The islanders gave more than the \$3,000 target.

The Gulf Islands Secondary School graduated 40 students in ceremonies marking the end of their high school education. Guest speaker, Ivan Mouat, recalled incidents from his career in Gulf Islands schools as well as his graduation 40 years previously.

The office of Driftwood was broken into by two youths. A resident, passing the office at the time, apprehended the young men in the building and called police.

Pender hosts Legion meeting

Pender Islands Legion branch was host to the Zone Council Meeting of the South Vancouver Island Zones' 11 branches recently.

Sixty Legion members were present, including 11 members from Mayne Island.

Deputy zone commander Walt Logan of Branch 42 chaired the meeting, assisted by secretary Al Gray, Branch 91, and treasurer Len Stewart, Branch 7.

Logan informed the branches that at the Dominion Command

elections held last week in Montreal Don C. Chapperal was elected president and S. Dunstan was elected first vice-president. Dunstan is from Pacific Command.

Zone commander Harmon was away in Newfoundland and so was unable to take part in the meeting.

At the close of the morning business meeting, lunch was served by the Ladies' Auxiliary of Pender Island.

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Youth in critical condition

A Ganges youth is in critical condition in Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria as a result of an accident last Wednesday.

Robert Clark, 17, had been holding on to the driver's side door of a car driven by Albert de la Franiere, 18, of Ganges. De la Franiere drove away and Clark struck his head on the side of the moving vehicle.

He was taken to Lady Minto Hospital for examination and then rushed to Victoria by helicopter. Clark had not regained consciousness by noon Tuesday.

RCMP are investigating the accident which occurred at McPhillips and Jackson Avenues.

New voters list shows nine percent increase here

The provincial voters list has been prepared and the figures for Saanich and the Islands show a nine percent increase in names over the list which had been prepared for 1981.

With a population of 68,869, the local constituency has 43,896 registered voters, representing 63.7% of the total. Provincially, the voters lists contain 1,575,623 names of 57.4% of the province's residents.

The voters list had been compiled during a door-to-door enumeration by approximately 6,000 people in March. The name gathering cost the province about \$5 million and the results were compiled on a computer.

In the last provincial election in 1979, 1,673,111 names were on the provincial list with 42,242 registered to vote in Saanich and the Islands. A cross check by the ministry of the provincial secretary, responsible for the list, showed up to 157,000 names listed twice on the lists used in that election.

No figures were available to show duplication of names for Saanich and the Islands.

Registered voters will receive confirmation cards in the mail telling them they are on the list. Anyone not receiving a card should contact the nearest registrar of voters, election office or government agent. Gulf Islanders can get in touch with the government office in Ganges if no card arrives.

To be eligible to vote in a B.C. provincial election, a person must

be 19 years of age or older, a Canadian citizen or British subject. The potential voter must have been a resident of Canada for 12 months prior to the election as well as having been a resident of this province for six months previous to the day.

The minimum age of 19 must have been reached on or before election day.

Eligible voters left off the list can register at any time up to an election campaign when registration is limited to certain times. A phone call to the government agent will help inform individuals how to get their names on the list.

The new voters list is the result of the first province-wide enumeration in 35 years.
