Program for peace follows U.N. session

The UN disarmament session has just concluded with platitudes and inaction, so it was appropriate that the Galiano branch of Operation Dismantle should put on a program for peace at the Community Hall on Saturday evening.

The Film *If you love this planet* was loaned by the Salt Spring Nuclear Disarmament Committee who also sent speaker Peter Pentz to update some of the new urgency that now pervades the peace movement.

That this film was made by the Canadian National Film Board is remarkable enough, but the horrifying and certain consequences of nuclear war listed by Australian doctor Helen Caldicott, and illustrated by clips of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, present an incredible picture of total disaster and the destruction of all existing civilizations. The hands of the atomic scientists' clock now stands at four minutes to the midnight of annihilation.

The showing of the film was followed by readings of their own verse by local poets, Lorraine Vernon and Maxine Gadd. Poetry celebrates life, an antidote to the despair engendered by the apocalyptic prophesy of the film, but some of the best poems are about war, from the Trojan to the world wars of this century. There will be no poems about the nuclear holocaust, for no poets will survive.

Although millions of people are becoming involved in campaigns aimed at first freezing the development and then eliminating nuclear weapons, these millions are far outnumbered by the disinterested. Thirty-five adults and a dozen children attended this meeting.

As Helen Caldicott concluded, "You're going to have to change the priorities of your life if you love this planet."

Chamber of Commerce

The Galiano Chamber of Commerce held its long-delayed annual general meeting on Saturday afternoon. The chamber had postponed the meeting to allow the sun-followers, who disperse in February to warmer climes, a chance to attend.

The attendance of 24 included several of the "sun birds", a critic and a columnist but an afternoon meet appeared to exclude many of the "commercial" persons on the island who were busy at their place of business.

The inclusion of "Commerce" in the title of the organization is thought by many to be a misnomer as the chamber functions more as a ratepayers' society, providing a forum for islanders' concerns and acting as a pressure group on

government departments and agencies and other public bodies whose decisions affect the lives of the residents of Galiano.

President Sparky New recounted the year's activities which included the protracted ferry schedule battle and the re-opening of Clanton Road. The chamber regards this as a continuing project, the next phase of which is the blasting away of a large rock to improve the gradient.

The Galiano Lions Club have donated \$500 to cover the expense of this operation which will be conducted by vice-president Ollie Garner. The ultimate aim of the chamber is to persuade the department of highways to resume responsibility for the upkeep of Clanton Road.

The meeting concluded with the election of officers. Oswald New, Ollie Garner and secretary Shirley Coulter were re-elected by acclamation and Edrie Holloway will be the new treasurer.

The eight directors elected to the executive committee were Elspeth King, Harry Stewart, Fred Robson, George Tully, Allan Buttery, Art Mackenzie, Linda Kenyon and Nancy Quist.

Cyclist Injured

Volunteer ambulance attendants Jean Dunn and Jill Penny were called out on Saturday afternoon to attend to a cyclist who had fallen from her bicycle near South Wind Drive after descending the long, steep mile of Montague Hill.

She was taken by ambulance to Dr. Hales' surgery with a suspected skull fracture and then by helicopter to Vancouver General Hospital. This is the second time in two weeks that help has been called to assist a cyclist who has wiped out on this dangerous hill.

Constable Kim MacDonald, after examining the scene of the accident, was of the opinion that a sign warning cyclists to check their brakes and exercise extreme caution should be posted by the highways department at the top of the hill, a suggestion we heartily endorse.

World Churchman Visits

Every seventh year the World Council of Churches meets. Next year for 2½ weeks 4,000 people will gather on the UBC campus from all corners of the world from countries as diverse as Argentina, Korea, USSR, India and Greece. The theme of the council is to be *Jesus Christ, the Life of the World*, stressing that the peoples of the whole world may be brought together to breathe through Christ a new life of peace and truth.

On Galiano last week was Dr. Dieter Trautwein who is moderator of the International Worship Committee for next July's council. One of the objectives of this committee is to publish a worship book of prayers, psalms and poems on the theme of *Jesus the Living Life*.

Hymns and short liturgical forms of singing praise will be created to meet the needs of people of differing cultural backgrounds and language. Dr. Trautwein found the peace of Galiano conducive to the composing of new music for this purpose.

On the first Sunday of the conference there will be an open service in the Pacific Coliseum planned by the Canadian churches. An open eucharist will be celebrated on the second Sunday to be followed by a multicultural meal and entertainment. On the third Sunday the delegates are open to invitations to attend churches, not only in the Vancouver area but also in Victoria, Bellingham and Seattle.

Compulsory immunization under study by ministry

Children in British Columbia may be part of a compulsory immunization program sometime soon.

Dr. Allan Arneil, health officer of the Capital Regional District, told the community health committee last week in a report on the subject that compulsory immunization of school children is being studied by the ministry of health.

At least 90% of children in the CRD have been immunized, he told the committee, through a program of voluntary compliance. He said, "I am not entirely convinced that satisfactory levels of immunization can only be reached by compulsion."

Only New Brunswick and

Ontario have compulsory immunization programs against measles, he said. Saskatchewan has reported a level of 98% coverage through its program of voluntary shots, he also noted.

Every state in the U.S. insists on compulsory immunization against measles before children are allowed into school. Exemptions are granted for medical, moral or religious objections, he told the committee in his report.

Vancouver is the only B.C. jurisdiction with a compulsory program. Children in that city must have shots against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, polio, measles, mumps and rubella. While the shots are a must, provisions in the rules allow for exemption on religious or personal

grounds.

SOME WOULD OBJECT

Dr. Arneil, in stating his preference for voluntary immunization, said that if the shots became mandatory some parents would object to being forced to have their children protected.

"I am opposed to compulsory measures for anything," he said in the report, "unless this can be shown as being the only practical and best approach to a specific problem; as unnecessary compulsion, to me, is odious and may actually mean that some might refuse on principle who might agree to immunization on a voluntary basis."

The CRD's community health

services routinely and freely supplies voluntary immunization against the range of diseases which the Vancouver compulsory program covers.

The best approach to the problem, Dr. Arneil said, depends upon the mood of the community. Where immunization levels are low, rigid enforcement of compulsory shots could increase the percentage of children protected. But voluntary programs can attain the same results, he said.

TRUSTEES WILL DISCUSS IT

While immunization of children is voluntary in the CRD, school boards could implement a compulsory policy, he said. The trustees of the Gulf Islands School

District will be discussing such a program at their regular meeting in August.

"Immunization is an effective method of reducing the incidence and prevalence of some infectious diseases," said Dr. Arneil. "Immunization is most effective when given to the child, or adult, at the correct intervals in the correct amounts."

The CRD should wait until the ministry of health decided upon a course of action, he recommended, and "in the meantime, every effort should be made to encourage immunization of as many children as possible, as early in life as possible."

Study proposal filed

The proposal to study various alternatives for treatment of sewage in Ganges was supposed to have gone to committee last March. It finally arrived last week.

The local works and services committee of the Capital Regional District board had approved on March 10 the spending of up to \$25,000 for a study of alternative methods of sewage disposal for Ganges.

The matter came before the full board on March 24 and was referred to the solid waste management and sewage disposal committee for consideration.

Last Wednesday, that committee had the item on its agenda. Salt Spring Island director Yvette Valcourt asked that the matter be received and filed for recall at a later date upon request.

The motion called for proposals from three engineering consulting firms for studies "to determine if on-site treatment systems, including the maintenance of properly functioning septic systems, repair and replacement of septic units and limited sewerage could be environmentally sound, technically feasible and less costly than a large, central collection system for maximum daily flows of 90,000 imperial gallons."

The second part of the motion called for the creation of a sub-committee to review the proposals and make recommendations to the CRD committee. Proposed

members of the sub-committee were to have been Pat Tiernan, Sharon McCullough, Peter Pentz, Andy Orkin and Arvid Chalmers, all of Salt Spring. The CRD was to have been represented by Valcourt and David Krauel, director from Colwood, as well as CRD engineer Norman Howard.

The money to finance the study was to have come from the housing starts grants funds which is administered for the CRD by the local works and services committee.

Valcourt told the committee last week that "many things could happen to prevent the going ahead of the Ganges sewer and if that happens, there would be no money available for alternative studies."

She emphasized that something had to be done to correct the situation in Ganges and the motion would keep an option open to the board.

Death of pioneer resident

Salt Spring lost one of its pioneers when Mrs. Hilda Lacy of Fulford Harbour passed away at her home June 24.

Affectionately known as Mother Lacy, she died in her 95th year after spending 60 years at the south end of Salt Spring Island.

Federation seeks funding for art school at Ganges

Since the beginning of this year the 40-year-old Federation of Canadian Artists has been planning the construction and formation of an art school on Salt Spring Island, similar to the Banff School of Fine Arts.

The federation was formed to allow interested Canadians and active painters to share their common aims and creative practices with other Canadians across the country.

At the last meeting of the Islands Trust, the federation's proposal was approved.

The federation, led by president David White, needs \$256,000 to purchase the 11.2-acre property on Churchill Road near Ganges.

HOLDING SEMINARS

Since 1980 the federation has been holding summer seminars on Salt Spring Island. They received such widespread response that the seminars were continued. For two weeks each summer, artists have been invited to visit Salt Spring Island, to share a cottage with other artists and paint.

They attend workshops, painting sessions, portrait instruction and often private instruction given by such acclaimed artists as Harry Heine.

This year approximately 80 artists came to the island from as far away as Seattle.

"I didn't know what to expect. I just signed up and with another friend came to the second session

of the seminar. It has been just wonderful," Kay Rea from Vancouver explained.

"When you're at home, you're the only artist within miles. Everyone tells you how wonderful you are and then you attend one of these. You begin to see where you're going wrong. You watch your detail work and try other mediums."

But the federation is hoping to see a school built for such activities as the summer seminars. Artists have nowhere indoors to work during these sessions, although the Catholic Church on Drake Road has provided space for the painters.

Benefits up July 1

The school would also be available to artists in theatre and literature.

"We hope to go through with the option on the land but we have to raise the money first," White said while on a visit to the island during the last days of the seminar.

The FCA is anticipating support from corporations and various levels of government in their efforts to see the school operating.

The G.A.I.N. payments have, since April 1979, increased four times each year in line with rises in the cost of living as reflected by OAS/GIS increases made by the federal government.

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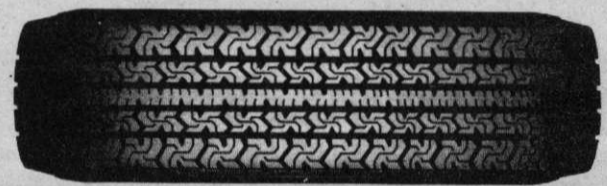
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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

The By-law further provides for a change in the zoning classification of Parcel "C" (DD 33080-1), Section 7, Range 1 East, North Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District, and Lot "B", Section 7, Range 1 East, Plan 20780 except Plan 24798, shown on Plan No. 1 which forms part of the By-law, from the Rural Zone to the Commercial 5 Zone. 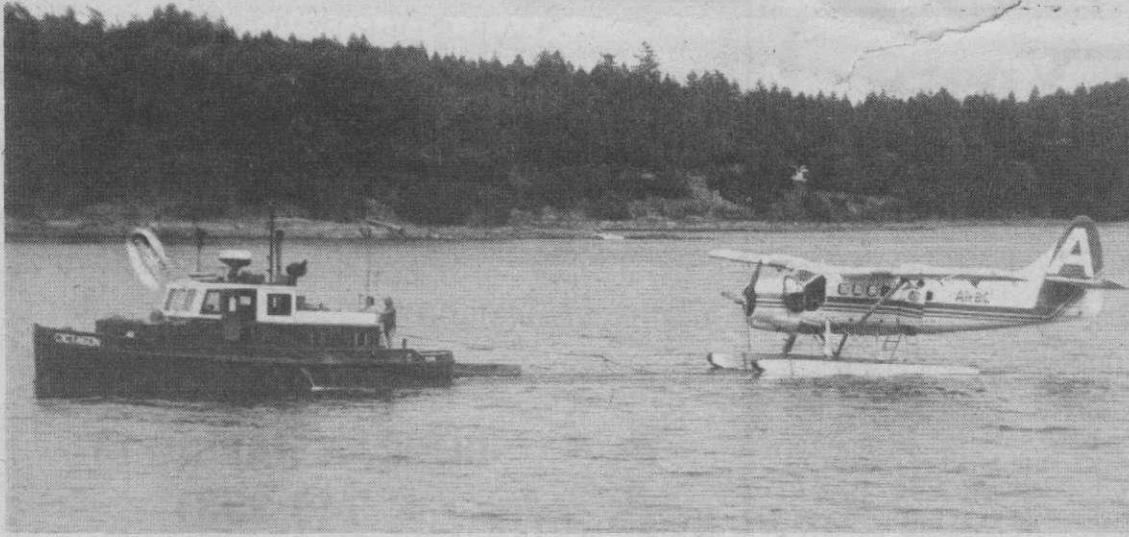

Air B.C. Otter is towed into Ganges by the Octagon

Plane makes forced landing

The stop at Ganges wasn't part of the regular schedule of Air B.C. but the Otter set down in Captain's Pass last Thursday anyway.

The unscheduled landing was forced on pilot Brad Nelson when a cylinder of the one-engine seaplane blew out on a flight from Vancouver to Victoria. The 10 passengers aboard the plane were

transferred to two smaller aircraft for the remainder of the trip to the capital.

When the Otter put down, immediate assistance was given by the Octagon, a beachcomber out of Sidney. Octagon skipper Mike Sparken and deckhand Keith Yow aided the transfer of passengers to the other planes.

With everyone safely on their way to Victoria, the Octagon towed the crippled aircraft into the government wharf in Ganges for repairs. Mechanics worked on the engine and the Otter was on its way the next day.

No one was injured in the forced landing.

Carpenter injured

Island carpenter Wayne De Vane was rushed to the Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria via helicopter on Monday afternoon following an accident.

De Vane, employed by Speed Brothers Construction was working at a home at the north end of Salt Spring. While working, the island man slipped on a board and fell against his skillsaw.

The saw cut through the upper part of De Vane's arm, completely cutting a major artery and damaging nerves in the arm.

Jack and Gordon Speed and Ernie Mellstrom, who were present at the scene, drove De Vane to Lady Minto Hospital where he was examined by doctors and then transported by helicopter to Victoria at 2:30 pm. Gordon Speed accompanied him.

Nerve damage to the arm resulted in micro-surgery at the Jubilee Hospital on Monday night.

Spokesman at the hospital reported that De Vane's condition was good Tuesday morning.

Road in Ganges. Water samples should be taken on Tuesday or Thursday mornings and the bottles returned to the health office before noon on those days.

The samples are picked up on those days for testing.

CHECKS ARE FREE

The fluoride checks are free and samples can be submitted up to

July 27. If fluoride is found to be present, the health officials would recommend a full chemical analysis of the water.

Dr. Arneil also asks any well user who has had a recent private check on the water to submit the results to his office for inclusion in the survey.

The records of public waterworks were also checked and the chemical analyses revealed only acceptable levels of fluoride.

Fluoride in wells has been detected on Saturna, Mayne and Salt Spring Islands as well as on Gabriola and Thetis Islands and Yellow Point south of Nanaimo. The area forms part of the Nanaimo Drift, a massive

geological split along the east coast of Vancouver Island which terminates at the Malahat.

Fluoride, said Dr. Arneil, occurs naturally in drinking water in some areas although it has been thought that occurrences in water in British Columbia were relatively rare.

The highest levels have been noted in wells deeper than 200 feet but checks have shown the presence of fluoride in shallower wells also.

"The extent of the problem," said Dr. Arneil, "if there is one, both by degree or by distribution, is unknown but is being looked into so as to be best able to advise parents regarding their children's teeth."

Damage estimated at \$1,500

The deer wasn't damaged but the Dodge was.

James Jenks of Ganges was driving his 1971 Dodge on Cusheon Lake Road at midnight on July 3. When he turned on to Stewart Road a deer ran out in front of the vehicle.

When Jenks swerved to miss the creature, the car slewed in the gravel and ended up in the ditch.

Jenks was treated for minor injuries and damage to the vehicle was estimated at \$1,500. Passenger in the Dodge, James King Jr., was not injured.
