Plaque to be presented

Beaver Point School will be the scene of a celebration on September 25.

The Beaver Point provincial park board will be celebrating the presentation of a plaque from the Heritage and Conservation Branch with afternoon tea and an evening potluck dinner and dance at the nearby Beaver Point Hall.

In 1979, the Heritage and Conservation Branch contributed \$6,500 to improve the building, while maintaining the original flavour of the architecture and site.

The old school, the longest continuously running school in the history of the province, was opened on September 30, 1885 by Samuel John Beddis.

The school was built by Beddis and his two sons, Henry and Charles, who were its first pupils. The first enrolment at the school totalled 17 pupils. The Beaver Point School was closed in 1951 when the consolidated school at Ganges became the central school and the only school on the island.

The Beaver Point School was closed and abandoned complete with desks and decorations left by students in 1951. The old wood heater and prayer books still remained when the building was renovated in 1979.

From 1951 until 1970 the school was used for various affairs. Christmas concerts, christenings and church services for all denominations were held at the

small building on the hill.

In 1980 the school was reopened and has since been running on a private basis, supported by parents and local teachers.

The celebration on September 25, just five days short of the 97th anniversary of the school, will see the unveiling of a plaque donated by the heritage fund commemorating the history of the school.

The plaque will be unveiled by Andrew Stevens, once a pupil at the school.

The Beaver Point park board will be holding a reunion at which ex-students have been invited to

attend. Afternoon tea will be sponsored by the Salt Spring Island Historical Society.

The school was renovated in 1979. New foundations, new roof and re-skirting of the building was done by volunteer labour. The doors and windows were re-hung and the school was painted railroad red. The grant of \$6,500 covered the cost of materials.

Without volunteer labour the grant would not have been enough for required repairs, commented Jonathan Yardley, island architect and Beaver Point park board member.

Girl Guides need leaders

Girl Guides have had a busy year on Salt Spring Island with 95 girls and 13 leaders involved in the Guide and Brownie packs.

But the island packs are experiencing a shortage of leadership while expecting larger attendance this September and leader Marion Goodwin is inviting volunteer help from adults on the island.

The Brownie pack, which includes six to nine-year-old girls, the Guides, which involves nine to 12-year-olds, and the Pathfinders, who are 12 to 15, are each led by two to three adults.

The latest plan by the Guides is to expand so that it is similar to the Brownies in that there are companies at Fernwood, Ganges and Fulford.

Classes for volunteer leaders are

available in the fall for orientation and training.

The Girl Guides began in 1909 when a group of girls gate-crashed a Boy Scout rally. The organization's membership has since grown to eight million members in 105 different countries.

The four pathways of home, community, world and the outdoors provide the basic pattern of challenge and achievement of young girls over the world.

The stated aim of the Girl Guides is to provide opportunities designed to help girls become responsible, resourceful and happy members in society.

In order to achieve the aim the organization devised objectives which the girls could follow. They include the development of personal values and respect for self and others; the development of respect for nature and order of things; to have new experiences and outdoor adventure; to make friends and have fun; to achieve a sense of well-being; to learn the importance of decision making; to function in small groups; to achieve a sense of pride in accomplishment; to acquire practical and leadership skills and to develop an ability and willingness to help.

Libraries get books

The Canada Council increased the size of two Gulf Islands libraries recently.

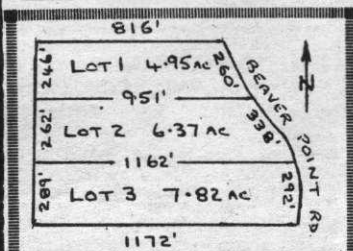

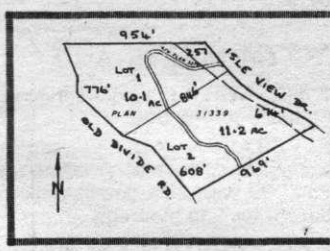

Examination of nuclear dilemma found 'thoroughly convincing'

Review

BY J.G. HALL

The Fate of the Earth by Jonathan Schell. (Knopf, 1982).

In *The Fate of the Earth* Jonathan Schell deals with our current nuclear dilemma, examining the arms race and suggesting a way to avoid nuclear disaster. He thus deals with what is often called "the unthinkable", the potential destruction of not only vast cities and regions, but even of human life and its natural habitat, the earth itself.

The first chapter describes the known results of nuclear bombing, particularly on the city of Hiroshima, and proceeds to consider the possible results of present-day nuclear weapons. These are so many times more powerful and so numerous that their use could only be catastrophic.

As he says, the only living things that could survive such a holocaust and its radiation would likely be "grass and insects".

CONSIDER MEANING OF DEATH

In chapter two Schell asks us to consider the meaning of death, the death of an individual person, then of the human race, and of most life-supporting systems on the earth. We understand and accept the death of individuals because our societies and cultures continue

after us. But it is difficult to understand, let alone accept, the death of mankind.

We reject it outright. We cannot really conceive of nothing human existing on the earth. Yet it is precisely this that our present nuclear policies threaten to bring about.

What can be done? To end his book Schell points out how urgent any solution is. We all must realize that atomic knowledge is part of our daily lives. The genie will not go back in the bottle. The present over-arming of powerful nations must stop, and then the nuclear weapons themselves must be rendered useless.

Even this is only a temporary measure, but essential as a first step. The more serious problem is how to give peoples a way of settling differences without resorting to war. Schell sees the need for nations to look beyond their regional sovereignty with its conflicting demands, to find the ways to achieve nonviolent resolution of disputes.

TWO PATHS

These measures are no longer pleasant pipe-dreams, he says, but absolutely necessary. "Two paths lie before us. One leads to death, the other to life. One day we will make our choice."

If I may speak personally for a

moment, I find this book thoroughly convincing. As a classicist and historian I have derived great benefit and pleasure from studying other ages and cultures. I find it horrible to think that by our atomic apathy we might deprive future generations of the same privilege. That, in fact, there might not be any future generations at all. I hope that all of you will read this book, and act on it. I will too.

Schell's book is available at the Mary Hawkins Library in Ganges.

Carelessness causes forest fires

Last year in British Columbia, the danger of fires in provincial forests was extremely high with more than 2,700 blazes consuming 107,000 hectares of forest lands.

The forest fire season started on April 15 and runs through to October 15 and the forest ministry officials are gearing for emergencies. The heavy snows of the past winter augur well for a reasonable fire season but a shortage of rain could change the picture.

Forest fires are one of nature's ways of balancing the growth between old, over-mature trees and newer growth. Up to one-third of the fires in B.C. forests are caused by lightning, although last year the total moved up to almost two-thirds of the fires.

Carelessness causes fires. Carelessness with campfires, cigarettes and matches. In 1970, a carelessly discarded cigarette started a forest fire which raged for 10 km up the Fraser Canyon and came close to destroying the town of Lytton.

Similarly, a year later another fire began by a discarded lit cigarette destroyed three kilometres of timber in two hours before hitting the village of Lillooet where 10 homes, a community hall and a church were burned.

The Gulf Islands are particularly prone to forest fires. When the weather turns hot and the rains visit other places for a while, the trees which add beauty to the scenery become hazardous.

During the summer and early fall months, signs posted at various locations give information on the fire danger ratings.

A low danger rating means activity in the forested areas are not restricted and any fire which may break out can be easily controlled.

Moving up the scale to a moderate warning informs people that while forest activity remains

unrestricted, caution should be exercised especially near areas of logging slash, forest debris and what not. Forestry officials consider any fire which breaks out at times of moderate warning to be also easily controlled.

A high fire danger rating results from periods of no rain and various restrictions on forest activity can be imposed. Fires started in periods of high danger ratings are difficult to control and may break out in light brush or forest debris after only a few days of sunshine.

When the extreme rating is imposed, restrictions on campfires, forest travel as well as any industrial activity in the forests will be closely watched. At those times, fires become difficult to control and spread easily. Most fires under extreme conditions can only be extinguished by a change in the weather.

While fires in provincial forests

are an inevitable part of summer, campers can contribute to the lessening of the dangers by observing certain regulations governing the use of campfires.

Campers or others may set out, start, or kindle a fire for the purpose of cooking, preparing food or obtaining warmth by observing the following conditions.

- Fires must not be started in any area where the forest service, land owner or tenant has posted notices prohibiting fires.

- Fires must not be located within three metres of any log, stump, snag, or standing tree.

- Fires must not be located within 15 metres of slash or inflammable debris of wooden structures.

- A suitable shovel or an eight-litre pail, or equivalent, filled with water must be kept available near the fire at all times.

- All inflammable material must

be removed down to mineral soil for a space of at least one metre in every direction from the edge of the fire.

- Material to be burned shall be in hand-built piles no larger than one metre in diameter and one metre in height.

- Fires must be attended at all times and be completely extinguished before leaving.

- Fires are prohibited when strong winds are blowing.

- A forest officer can order any person to extinguish a fire or

impose fire restrictions at any time by publishing notices in a local newspaper and by announcement on television and radio.

The regulations are designed to protect both the public and the forest themselves and anyone breaking the rules can be liable to a fine.

Even when the danger of fire is low, a person should obtain a permit from either a fire chief on the islands or from the forest officers before lighting any open fire other than a campfire.

Election Act changes

Provincial election campaigns will be less than a month long when amendments to the Election Act are passed in Victoria.

The legislators are debating various amendments to the act and one change will mean campaigns lasting only 29 days instead of 38 as is now the case.

A section of the act which is being dropped could have taken the vote away from an unmarried woman and another section which required knowledge of English or French as a voter qualification is being dropped as well.

A section added to the act allows for regular enumeration of voters for the first time. The enumeration begins on the third Monday of

September in the second year after a general provincial election.

Anyone who finds his name not on the list can register for a vote at the polls on election day. The application must be made through the returning officer of the electoral district where the person lives and must be proven by two "documents that provide evidence of the applicant's identity."

Other changes to the act remove the prohibition on straw votes during an election campaign and also give enumerators access to apartment buildings when the name gathering is on.

The government has had the voters list computerized and the changes to the act should make voting easier for many people.

GALIANO NEWS

Planning Commission reviews year's activities

The Galiano Island Advisory Planning Commission held its annual meeting in the Community Hall on Friday afternoon. Chairman Mimi Wishart, confessing her inexperience at presiding at public meetings, nevertheless did an effective job.

Responding to a petition to schedule the meeting at 7 pm so that working people could attend, Mrs. Wishart explained that the meeting was usually held on a Saturday afternoon but that a prior booking of the hall by the Painters Guild had forced a change in time. As notices had already gone out it was decided to proceed with this year's meeting as planned.

The work of the commission during the past year was reported. Of the 14 applications for subdivision eight were approved, as were applications for the construction of eight wharfs. A rezoning application for Parker Island was rejected.

The designation of Shaw Lake as an ecological reserve received approval, although other government agencies still have to make similar decisions before this status is confirmed. Mrs. Wishart paid tribute to her committee for the long hours of work they had put in on the job of serving the community.

THREE ELECTED

The meeting concluded with the election of three members to the commission. Bob Knowles and Pat Weaver were re-elected for further two-year terms. They will be joined by Bill Penny who beat out Charlie Wells, Matthew Schoenfeld and Bob Dugas. Mimi Wishart and Ed Jones are continuing members and Cathie Buttery is the recording secretary.

Following the meeting there was an informal discussion of the home occupation issue with vice-chairman Bob Knowles presiding. The concept of home occupation, which had been recommended in the Galiano community plan, received general approval.

A lobby of people already engaged in some form of home occupation recommended several alterations to the existing zoning bylaw clause to allow for the use of an accessory building and other relaxations to restrictions presently imposed, to bring the Galiano situation more in line with that applying on other Trust islands.

Problems discussed were the difficulty of defining a home occupation, the undesirability of over-regulation, ways of enforcing regulations, the danger of having unsightly structures spoiling the landscape, the invasion of industry into a rural environment and how to make a distinction between a business and an occupation.

The range of home occupations is so great that any regulatory

bylaw will be extremely difficult to frame and enforce.

Garden Club

The Galiano Garden Club held its monthly meeting on July 14 in the North Community Hall. Peter Weis, *Driftwood* columnist, was the guest speaker.

His topic was Soil Improvement and from a wide background of knowledge and experience he was able to advise members on improving that basic component of good gardens. The importance of adding organic matter to the soil by every possible means was stressed, with particular emphasis being placed on the value of seaweed, both as a mulch and a source of essential trace elements.

An organic method of adding the three basic minerals is by means of cover crops which are dug into the soil. Clover or other legumes will add nitrogen, buckwheat draws up phosphorus from the subsoil and fall rye adds potassium. To go into more detail would be an invasion of Peter's territory.

Delinquent Gardeners

During the business part of the meeting the gardeners were dismayed to learn that eight of the number were delinquent. Tom Liddell, the secretary who provided this information, did not reveal the nature of the delinquency so a member having close connections with the law is seeking a legal definition.

Meanwhile, we can only speculate as to what these gardeners have done to deserve this appellation.

Perhaps the member who promised to care for and cherish one of Mrs. Pierrt's geraniums and then abandoned it on a Community Hall window sill is guilty of desertion. Then there is the lady who, after all she had learned about the art of bonsai, bought a one-hole pot.

A gardener who loves making concrete constructed a raised bed of this material without installing drainage holes and now she has a water-bed. Is she delinquent?

Maybe some of the organic gardeners have failed the insecticide test - were traces of arsenic found on their vegetables? Did one of the show table exhibitors use steroids to pump up the size of his marrows?

The most widely held opinion is that the delinquents failed to carry out president Aini Haksi's monthly quota of "jobs to be done in the garden."

Members of the Garden Club await the next meeting with trepidation and dread, wondering if they are delinquent and, if so, what their punishment will be.

The thoughts of all their friends will comfort and strengthen Fern Stewart and Dorothy Lupton who each lost their mother this last week.

Fire Warning

Despite the recent rain, so beneficial to the gardens, the fire hazard remains high, reports Chester Williams. The pumper truck was called out early last Friday to a bush fire on the Lapham property.

The fire was noticed at 5:30 am by Ed Lee who was working on the log boom in Whaler Bay. The fire was easily extinguished but could have been more serious if it had not been noticed at an early stage. The cause of the fire could not be determined.

Art Show

The success of an art exhibition can be judged by various criteria, the number of red stickers being the most obvious but, for guild members, not necessarily the most important.

The Galiano Painters' Guild annual Summer Show is also a social occasion. The steady stream of viewers, both islanders and visitors, and the pleasures of conversations with artists, added to the enjoyment of examining their work, made for a very pleasant experience.

The pictures were tastefully displayed with plenty of space to promenade or stand back to get the overall view. In most cases the style is as distinctive as the face and a glance at a painting identifies the artist, nevertheless there are changes. Gill Allen has experimented with forest scenes in the style of Emily Carr, a considerable change from conventional landscapes.

Of particular interest was the interpretation in stained glass by Paul Hawbolt of Shari Street's watercolours. The glass gives a luminosity the pastel shades do not possess and like a poem translated

from one language to another becomes a work of art in its own right.

Alistair Ross also exhibited stained glass together with quite a variety of techniques and subjects. A new exhibitor was Tony Kingscote who paints in the traditional Chinese style. Frank Reader, who also exhibited for the first time, is more conventional with landscapes in oils. Jean Beattie, who loves and paints the Galiano landscape, puts into her pictures more colour and magic than the subject possesses.

A dozen other artists, well known on the local scene, contributed to the attractiveness of the Painters' Summer Show.

ONE MIND

A place to gather without 'consuming poisons'

One Mind is the name of a kind of tea room in Ganges that aims to serve good food in order to create healthy minds from healthy bodies. Owner Leah Ananda, a 60-year-old ex-Montreal resident, opened the room to the public eight months ago.

Ananda came to the island with artist Joanna Evans in 1979. He envisaged a place where people could gather to communicate and socialize in complete serenity.

According to Ananda, people don't allow themselves to be themselves and through awareness and enlightenment inhibitions are destroyed and replaced with a type of spiritual fulfilment. Ananda works on the premise that breath, energy and sound work in unison to create physical and mental harmony.

A TEMPLE

One Mind, located at Valcourt Business Centre in Ganges, is what Ananda describes as a temple or a living room. It is a place where people can gather without having to drink, or according to Ananda, consume poisons.

The cushions are of velvet and cotton and the low, petite lamps are covered in coloured twines to enhance the glow and subtle shades and bright wall hangings in the large room. The room offers seating for about 50 people and there are tea, juices, treats and popcorn available.

At One Mind a feeling of unity and "oneness" is encouraged.

A vegetarian, non-smoker, non-drinker, Ananda wanted a place where his friends and himself could socialize without having to confront those habits he shunned. He wanted a meeting place where a common spirit could generate

among friends.

NOT A MYSTERY, FAD

"One Mind isn't a mystery, it's not a fad, it's not an exotic place," Ananda said. "One mind means talking direct to one another, high vibrations, not from pot but from thinking."

During weekends, Ananda often performs on his drums for small audiences. His strong spiritual convictions centre around the premise that breath, energy, and sound work intrinsically to increase awareness and allow one to share with one mind that awareness.

A man who professes to be a "street" yogi, Ananda admits that he likes to communicate with people on their level. He likes to help people to become aware of themselves as much as possible and emphasizes his theme of breath, energy and sound.

"If they're writers, I like to help them to become better writers. If they're musicians, I like to help them become better musicians," Ananda stated. But for Ananda, One Mind is a place to go for people who have some sort of awareness.

BODY IS SACRED

"You can't buy cigarettes here," Ananda disclosed, "and you can't buy anything that might cripple your brain." For Ananda, the body is as sacred as the mind and it is important that it be kept cleansed and pure in order for the mind to excel.

One Mind, explains Ananda, is a place where one goes 'not to be crazy'. Habits such as smoking and drinking are abandoned while within, taking tea, talking, relaxing, reading a book or listening to the diverse collection of music on the ambitious stereo

system, are enjoyed by the clientele.

Delicately decorated by Joanna Evans, One Mind features a raised stage, whereon Ananda and other performers can present their shows. Plants, a skylight and long,

low tables which provide ample seating are part of the decor which is dressed in the rich, zesty colours of Evans' artistry. Evans constructed the tables and sewed the cushions and did two paintings in the room.

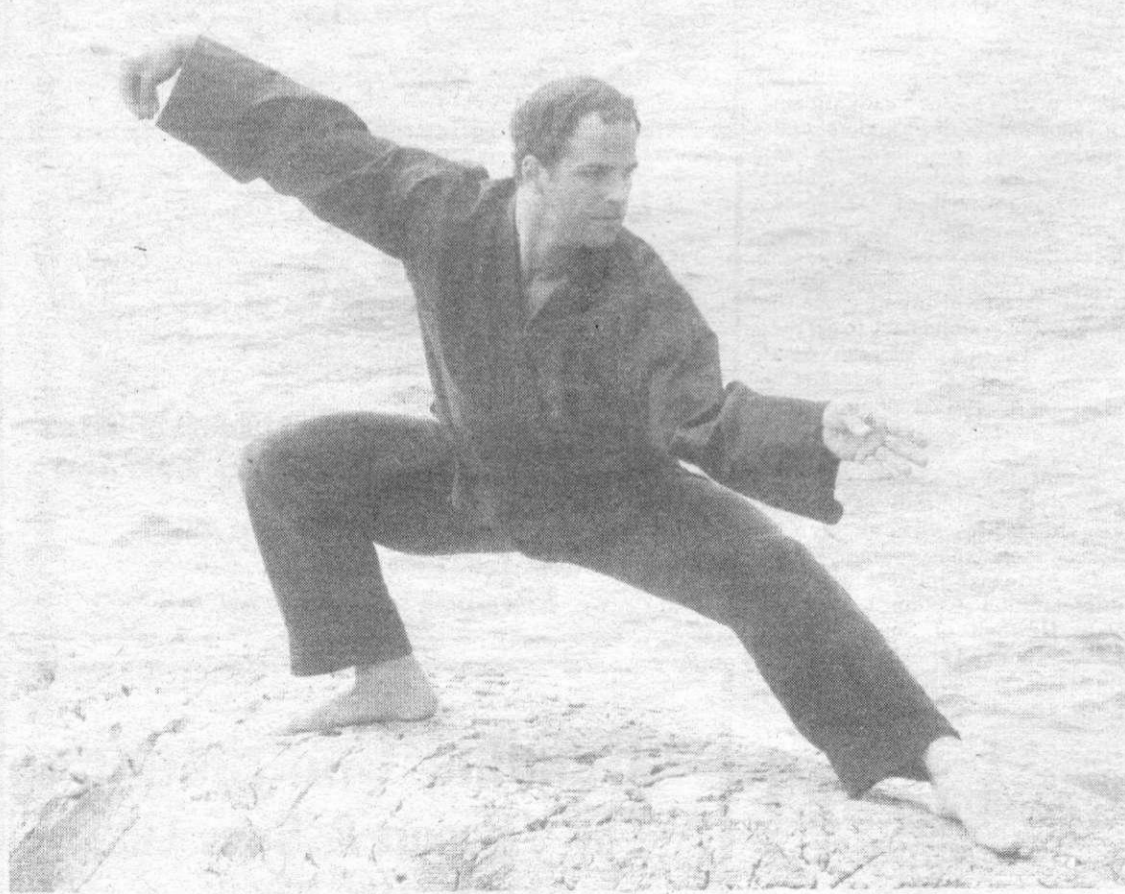
Modest about her accomplishments, Evans is planning an art exhibition at One Mind this year.

It was noted that the school was within two weeks of its scheduled progress. The board has also gained the support of the highways crew on the island. "Stepaniuk has done a fantastic job," reported trustee Don Fairweather.

New regulations

The changes are now law and tide-water sport fishermen would be wise to check before wetting a line.

The federal ministry of fisheries and oceans recently announced that the changes to fishing regulations outlined in the 1982 British Columbia Tidal Waters Sport Fishing Guide are now legally enforceable.

To date, the only restrictions which had been enforced were the 30 seasonal bag limit and a 45 cm minimum size restriction for chinook.

Fishermen who go after salmon or other fin fish in tidal waters can have an unlimited number of fishing lines over the side provided everyone on the boat has a valid licence and is eligible to fish.

Those under 16 years of age can fish without a licence as long as at least one adult on board has a

licence. If any adult on the boat doesn't have a valid licence, the eligible anglers are limited to one line each.

Sinker weights are a maximum of one kilogram and the use of downriggers greater than one kg must be rigged so that the line is attached by means of an automatic release clip.

Various areas have been closed to various fish catching and each is outlined in the guide.


Cutthroat trout in tidal waters must be at least 30 cm in length but no more than two trout per day can exceed 50 cm. South of Cape Caution the daily bag limit has been reduced to two from four.

Chinook catches must be recorded on the licence "immediately after catching the fish, not later," said the press release from the federal fisheries.

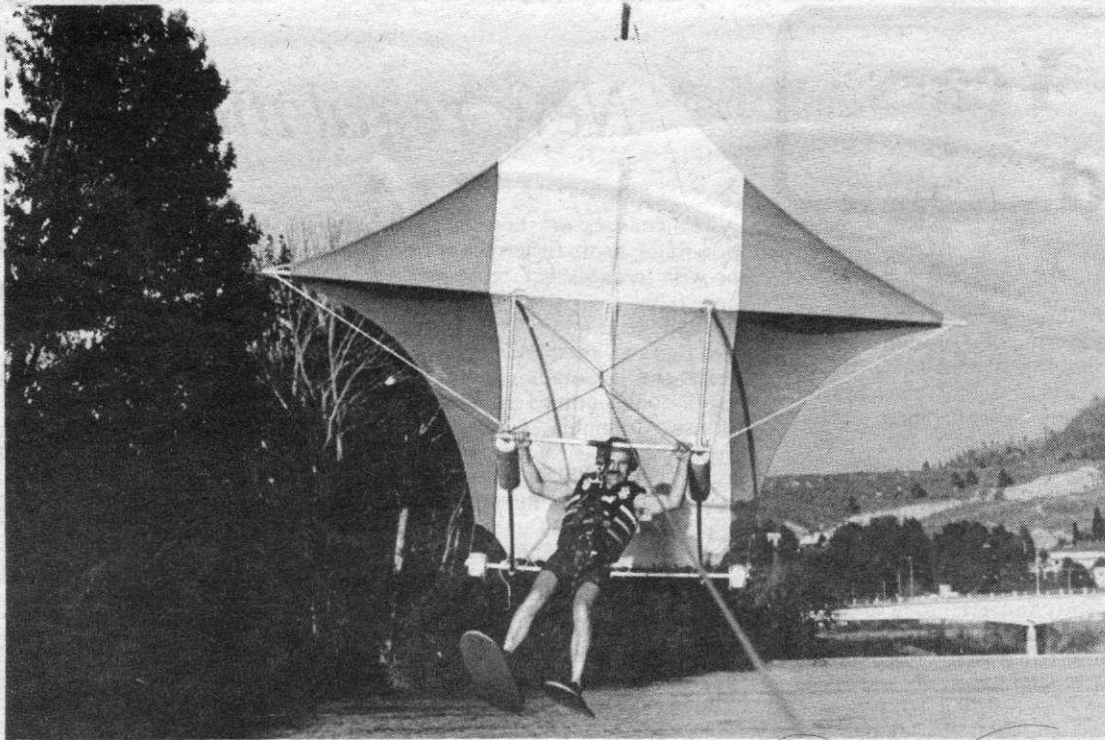

At Mayne

Lawyers disagree over airfield

The airfields in the Gulf Islands are private operations and the Islands Trust can only sit and watch.

The Village Bay Preservation Society took the matter of the airfield near Village Bay on Mayne Island to court and the judge ruled that the group had no standing as an incorporated society and the action was not heard.

The group also argued that the matter had a bearing as a constitutional affair but again the judge ruled otherwise.

The other airfields, on Salt Spring and Pender, have also drawn public concern but not to the extent of the Mayne field, said Islands Trustee Gordon Wallace of Pender Island.

The matter on Mayne is a difference of opinion between two lawyers, Wallace told *Driftwood* this week. The lawyer for the society maintains that the Islands Trust can control the strips through zoning bylaws and community plans. The lawyer for the Trust maintains that such is not the case.

Private airfields are controlled by the federal department of transport, said Wallace, but that department tends to take a hands-off attitude in the matter. The operators of the Mayne field have permission from the Agricultural Land Commission to use the land as an airfield.

The only control the Trust would have on the airfields would

result from the operators attempting to charge landing fees, selling gasoline or offering any maintenance other than emergency repairs, said Wallace.

The Village Bay Preservation Society, at a meeting May 2, ruled out an appeal of the court decision as well as legal action by individuals of the group. They decided instead to continue to lobby the Islands Trust to institute court action to have the matter settled.

In a letter to Trust chairman John Rich of Bowen Island, the Mayne Island group outlined the sequence of events as they saw them. They had gone to court but were refused a hearing and were disappointed that the lawyer for the Islands Trust had not continued the case, the letter stated.

"The Trust lawyers did not support the society in court," read the letter, "to the extent that the judge was confused as to where the Trust stood."

"Further, when our society was not given standing in court, the Trust did not take on the rest of the case, despite the opportunity to do so. This lack of direction and preparation is shocking to say the least, after nearly three years of talk and letters of support from the Islands Trust."

The letter went on to reiterate correspondence between the Trust and the society dating from

September, 1979.

Wallace said the Trust has no right to invoke zoning bylaws in such a case, especially where permission from the Land Commission had been obtained. He compared the situation to offering a friend parking space in a driveway.

The airfield owner allows permission from friends to use the field. There are not that many flights in and out, said Wallace, but the situation could be dangerous because the flight path takes the aircraft over a residential area near Village Bay.
