

Restraint program stops renovations

Renovations to the old Ruckle cabin at Ruckle Park on south Salt Spring Island were discontinued last January after several thousand dollars were spent to stabilize the old building.

When asked when further repairs would continue, Al Kirk of the heritage and conservation branch in Victoria explained that continued renovations to the cabin would depend on the forthcoming budget.

"We're two-thirds of the way through the major history of the site, Kirk explained. "It's important we know everything about the area and house before we go ahead with modifications or remodelling. As far as continuing the renovations on the house, the options were tentatively planned for the fall."

Kirk explained that the lands, parks and housing officials at Nanaimo were also working on the future plans of the 19th century house.

Spokesman at Nanaimo, Bill Merilees, explained that eventual

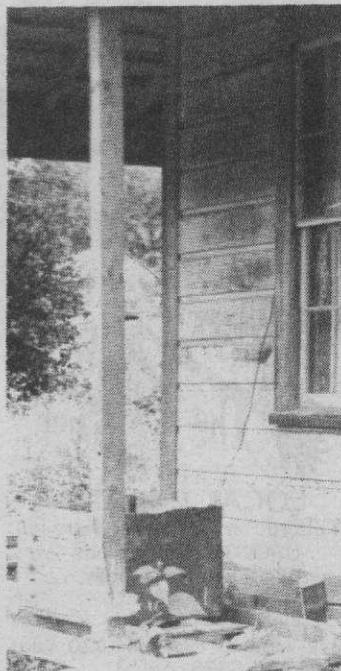
plans for the entire property were for a heritage farm.

But repairs on the dilapidated cabin had been discontinued due to the restraint program as well as to the fact that further time was required to assess the areas in need of repair.

"As you know, we're in the process of figuring out the 1983 budget," Merilees stated. "We've already put thousands into the foundation and supports to stabilize the building. But we're in the process of identifying what further work there is to be done. If we do a little each year there won't be a great bill to pay at the end."

Merilees explained that the heritage and conservation branch identified the needs and funds required for the building while working in conjunction with the lands, parks and housing ministry which boasts its own construction section.

"It will be three to four months before further work there can be identified," Merilees said. "It's really a matter of priorities."



For Jim Kenney and friend Eric Gummason, both of Coquitlam, the old house at the Ruckle farm is looking sad. Fourteen-year-old Kenney recalled his childhood when he spent each summer staying at the cabin with his family, courtesy of the Ruckle family. He remembered how the rooms had been carpeted and the bathtub had



sat in the kitchen. Kenney admitted that the floor was safer and the ceiling drier than last year. The boys stay with Kenney's grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. W.G. Smith, at Beaver Point.

Historians see Galiano display

The heritage collection shown at the Canada Day Jamboree by the North Galiano Community Club was put on display again for visiting members of the Gulf Islands Branch of the B.C. Historical Society.

Not only did the club go to the trouble of reassembling the exhibits but members also provided refreshments for the visitors by serving ham and salad followed by raspberry shortcake. What a hospitable group of people live at the north end!

Numerous photographs, some nearly 100 years old, illustrated the strong maritime influence on the history of North Galiano. Many of the vessels that served the needs of the population and plied the B.C. coast during the past century were pictured. Almost every family, even those engaged in farming, depended on the sea in some way.

Access to the Shaw farm was via Shaw's Landing and as postmaster he would have to row out into Trincomali Channel to pick up the mail from passing steamers. Curator Alistair Ross provided the commentary which gave life to the

pictorial exhibits.

By a stroke of good fortune the registers for the North Galiano School were discovered in an old shed and the rolls from 1916 until 1953 when the one-room school was closed are on display. In the list of some of the earliest classes is found the name of Violet Devina Allison who as Devina Baines was present for the occasion with her husband Harry.

Master at the school for 14 years was H. Hall Taylor. The registers for this period indicate one of the important qualifications of a teacher in a small rural school. At one time Mr. Taylor contributed five children of his own to the class enrolment, enough to raise the number above the minimum required for a government grant.

The inclusion of Japanese names during the 20's and 30's

reveals the period when five herring salteries were in operation in the area. Abruptly in 1941, Japanese names disappear from the registers. About this time the names of many of the North Galiano fishermen appear on the rolls: the Baines, the Crockers and the Weatheralls.

Unfortunately a very interesting visit had to be curtailed to enable the visitors to catch the last ferry to return to their own islands.

GALIANO NEWS

Firemen aid seniors

Page Drive senior citizens housing complex has been plagued with plumbing problems during the past few months. On several occasions recently the water issuing from the residents' taps has had the colour and consistency of cocoa.

The directors approached the volunteer fire department with a request that the volunteers pump out the storage tank and hose out the sediment that had accumulated over the seven years the system has been in operation. On July 19 firemen Blackwood, Finnis and Hoebel supervised by Chief Williams used a Wajax pump and the pumper truck to clean out the tank.

The 500 gallons were not wasted, for as part of their practice, a hose was laid to the seniors' raised-bed vegetable garden, on which the water was sprayed.

This action did not, however, rectify all the faults in the system so the following day Chuck Hagan removed the immersion pump from the tank. It was discovered that the connecting galvanized pipe was so corroded that it was perforated in several places, thus preventing the pump building up pressure.

Most Galiano water has a low pH reading because of the acidity caused by dissolved sulphides. Even brass fittings have been eaten away at Page Drive.

Also of concern is the lower yield of the well, down almost 50% from its original rating. In this same neighbourhood the school and the fire hall have had to have new wells drilled, both to a much greater depth than the original. As the population increases the proliferation of new wells cannot but help to magnify the water problem. The number of people storing water in tanks or cisterns is increasing.

The average rainfall on Galiano falling on the roof of a modest house will produce upward of 10,000 gallons of rain a year. Is it not time that there was more encouragement of rain water catchment and storage, particularly by the departments of highways (subdivision approving officer) and health?

Fatal Accident

For the second time this month an accident has taken the life of a young woman on Galiano. Pauline Rimmer arrived at Sturdies Bay on the morning ferry from Tsawwassen last Wednesday.

Sometime between noon and 1 pm, a few miles north on Porlier

Pass Drive, she was struck by a motor vehicle and died shortly afterwards from her injuries. The accident occurred where there is a sharp dip in the road and vision is somewhat restricted. Skid marks indicate the vehicle tried to brake suddenly, but the driver did not remain at the scene of the accident.

Each summer residents of Galiano contemplate with concern the masses of cyclists disgorged from the ferries at Sturdies Bay. Many of these seem quite inexperienced and indifferent to the dangers of cycling on narrow, winding and hilly roads. Words of caution and advice are often greeted with rudeness.

The Monday evening prior to the accident the Chamber of Commerce executive had conferred with RCMP Const. Kim MacDonald on possible action to reduce the danger. It was suggested that warnings to cyclists be read over the public address system on the *Queen of Sidney*.

It was also proposed that the hazard of cars parked on both sides of Sturdies Bay Road be reduced by the posting of additional "No Parking" signs and that the regulation be enforced by the issuance of parking tickets.

Coming Events

Yellow flyers announcing some of the attractions of the Annual Lions Club Fiesta on Saturday, Aug. 7 have been delivered to households and put on display. This event, sponsored by the Lions, but in which almost all

With this event only just over a week away, it is time to assemble your Fiesta costume - perhaps at the Thrift Shop on Saturday between 2 and 4 pm. 

Squash court proposal gets tentative nod from Trust

Despite objections that the facility could add to the nutrient content of St. Mary Lake, the proposed racquetball and squash courts on Salt Spring Island received tentative blessings from the Islands Trust last week.

The courts will be constructed on a parcel of vacant land at the Central intersection and will be

about 1,600 feet from the lake.

Mike Larmour of the North Salt Spring Island Water District told the trustees that courts could add to the pollution problems of the lake which is a source of water for many island residents. He said the property is probably close to the watershed line and water used at

the facilities would find its way to the lake.

The water district, he told the Trust Committee, was against the project as not being in the public interest.

Gordon Sloan, an island lawyer and a proponent of the sports complex, told the trustees that he found it difficult to believe that the courts could add to any problem of the lake water.

"We have as great a concern about the quality of the water as anyone," he told the meeting.

Larmour said the problem is an accumulative effect of all the properties in the area.

"There are some things in that area we'd sooner not see," he said. "But they have been there for some time and there's little which can be done."

Several people who own property in the area also objected to the proposal. Their fears ran from loss of property value to the possible noise and included concern about intensification of spring flooding in the area as a result of the development.

Brian Cunningham, who owns the property, told the meeting that a corner of the lot is prone to spring flooding but that placement of the building could help overcome the problem.

The trustees accepted the proposal which now goes to the minister of municipal affairs for approval. However they are insisting upon specific proposals aimed at curbing the flooding and discharge of septic wastes. They would be negotiated between the Trust staff and the developers. Those proposals would be part of the development permit.

Building permits at 24

There were 24 building permits issued in the Gulf Islands during the month of June.

While Salt Spring Island saw a total of 14 permits issued, Pender had four, Galiano two, Mayne three and Saturna one. Total value of building permits issued in June was \$1,151,767.

There were 34 permits issued for the same period last year and a total of \$1,627,555 was the value of the building.

To date, there have been 78 building permits issued in the islands with Salt Spring Island leading with 44 and Pender following far behind with 14. Galiano has seen a total of seven permits so far this year, Mayne 11 and Saturna Island two.

The total value of building permits for the first six months of the year was \$3,983,343. The figure is down by approximately half from last year.

Last year's figures for the first six months show a total of \$7,508,663 in building permit values. Salt Spring had 89 permits issued, Pender 29, Galiano six, Mayne 25 and Saturna one during the first six months.

Total value of the building permits during the first six months on Salt Spring in 1981 was \$4,739,924. This year the value has dropped to \$2,066,274. Another big drop in building permit value is seen at Mayne Island.

Total permit value on Mayne was \$1,091,365. This year, total value is \$501,687.

Access requirements protested at meeting

The question goes beyond the rights of privacy versus the public's access to the water, said Salt Spring Architect Hank Schubart last week.

"Who does the planning for this community?" he asked the Salt Spring Island Trust committee on Tuesday.

He wanted to know if the planners for the developers in conjunction with the planners for the Trust were the ones to set the plans or did the department of highways in Victoria have the right "to turn everything upside down."

Schubart was at the committee meeting to protest against a proposal for public access to the water demanded by the highway officials. He told the trustees that a

subdivision he was involved with had a long history of debate with the department.

Planned for land near Isabella Point, the proposed subdivision would create nine residential properties with the smallest being one-half hectare. The owners had agreed to dedicate a 20-metre strip on the eastern side of the development to allow the public access to Stuart Channel.

But, said Schubart, they were going to fight a department of highways requirement for a similar dedication at the western edge. That access would deprive potential owners of privacy, said Schubart, and, because of the high rocks and skimpy beach, would be of little benefit to the public.

He pointed out that further west from the subdivision lay three narrow strips of property followed by a full 20 metre public access dedication. He questioned the need for three accesses in such proximity.

He listed the objections to the highways officials' requirements. The owners did not object to public access to the water, just the need for two such parcels. They were also against the suggestion of creating a 10-car parking lot at the dedication strip as well as the need to pave the roads within the proposed subdivision when the roads leading to it were gravel.

The trustees agreed with Schubart and will once again talk with the highways officials to try for a reasonable solution to the problems.

Lighting problems at centre

The Salt Spring Players are having trouble with the lighting at the Ganges activity centre. Players president Jack Poole says.

In a letter to the Gulf Islands School Board, Poole asked if someone could be named responsible for the storage and maintenance of the lights at the activity centre.

When the Players went to use the centre recently the dimmer panel was in need of repair.

Poole added that the damage had not been done by the Players because they had left the system in good order.

The existing lighting system at the activity centre would cost several thousand dollars to replace, Poole wrote, and management of the lighting system is necessary to avoid repeated incidents of misuse or abuse.

The school board decided to investigate the matter.
