

Payments up in October

Increases in the Old Age Security pension, Guaranteed Income Supplement and Spouse's Allowance will take effect in October, Monique Begin, minister of national health and welfare, has announced.

The basic Old Age Security pension will be increased to \$246.92 monthly from the present \$239.73.

The maximum Guaranteed Income Supplement for an individual or a married person whose spouse is receiving neither a

pension nor a Spouse's Allowance, will be increased to \$247.89 from its current \$249.67. Added to the basic pension, this will give a person receiving both the OAS and the maximum GIS a monthly total of \$494.81.

The Maximum Guaranteed Income Supplement for a married couple, both of whom are pensioners, will increase to \$191.12 each from \$185.55. Added to the basic pension this will give each married pensioner receiving the maximum GIS a total of \$438.04,

or \$876.08 for the couple.

The Guaranteed Income Supplement is paid to pensioners whose income, apart from the Old Age Security pension, is limited and the amount varies in relation to their income.

The maximum Spouse's Allowance will increase to \$438.04 from \$425.28. It is made up of an amount equivalent to the basic Old Age Security pension and the maximum GIS at the married rate. It is paid to persons between 60 and 65 years of age who are

married to OAS pensioners and meet residence requirements. Entitlement to a Spouse's Allowance, and the amount paid, is based on yearly income.

Where the pensioner spouse dies, the surviving spouse may be eligible for the continuation of the allowance to age 65 or until remarriage if the person has no income or a limited income.

Increases in Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement payments are calculated quarterly based on the cost of living.

No parks on Gambier for 10 years

Mining on Gambier Island is a problem to the Islands Trust. Mining claims on the island have tied up all Crown land for the next 10 years and there can be no parks or other public facilities developed there as long as prospecting claims are outstanding.

The review of a proposed legal action brought out the references to copper claims at Friday's meeting of the Islands Trust Council.

Municipal Affairs Minister Jack Heinrich told the Trust that the problems created on Gambier did not only affect the Trust.

He forecast further announcements regarding the island in the near future, but he did not enlarge on his comments.

The Trust faces a court action whereby trustees are being sued for failure to uphold Trust bylaws in order to halt mining plans on Gambier.

Alicia Anderson, organization and membership convener, has formed a committee to study proposed changes to the CWL constitution.

At the close of the meeting the ladies enjoyed a social hour. Lucille Campbell, Doris De Long and Helen Carey provided refreshments.

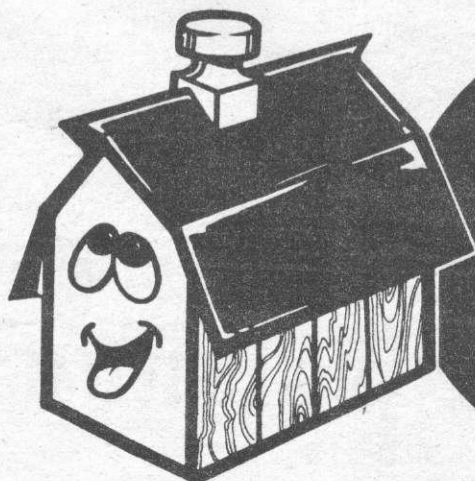

Proposed By-law No. 24 for Mayne Island is a By-law to amend Mayne Island Zoning By-law No. 14 being "Mayne Island Planning Area Zoning By-law, 1980" as follows:

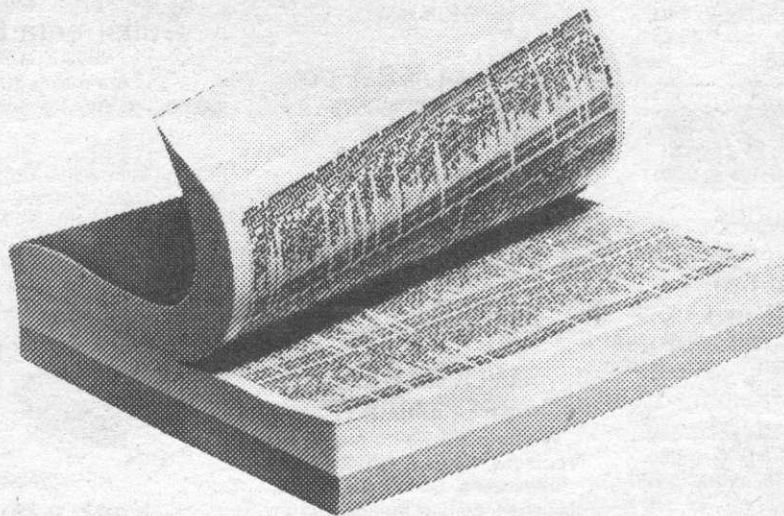
- (1) By designating the following lands as being within the Rural Zone:
 - (a) Curlew Island - District Lot 19
Lot A, Plan 15753
 - (b) Georgeson Island - District Lot 23
District Lot 24
- (2) By amending schedule "A" to show the above listed parcels as being zoned Rural.
- (3) By zoning to Water Moorage Zone (W-2) the areas of water surrounding Curlew and Georgeson Islands which are not already zoned W-2.
- (4) By amending Sections 20.1 and 20.2 to require that moorage in the W-2 Zone be provided only for upland areas adjacent to and abutting the water areas concerned.

Taxi cost up 15%

The water taxis used by students of the Outer Islands will cost the Gulf Islands School Board almost 15% more for the next year.

Bob George, operator of Gulf Islands Sailing Charters, agreed to a renewal of the water taxi contract with a price of more than \$78,000. The previous contract had been worth \$68,050.

George has replaced the *Cruzon* with the *Ministik*, a 30-passenger vessel that has received Canada Steamship Inspection approval.

One of the standards set by CSI requires vessels of more than five tons to have a deckhand. George will not be using a deckhand on the run to pick up Saturna Island students because an exemption has been granted for less than 12 passengers.

For the run to Ganges, George uses one of the students, also with CSI approval, said Mayne Island trustee Jeannine Dodds.

The school board has also insisted upon a comfort clause in

the new contract which will be met on the *Ministik*, which has an enclosed cabin. The *Cruzon* had a canvas cover over the passenger section.

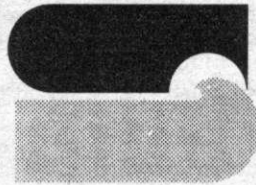
The new contract runs for a year from September 1 and will not have to go to tender when up for renewal next year. A clause in the contract stipulates that if all conditions are met, the contract is automatically renewed subject to agreement on the price.

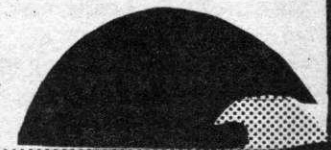

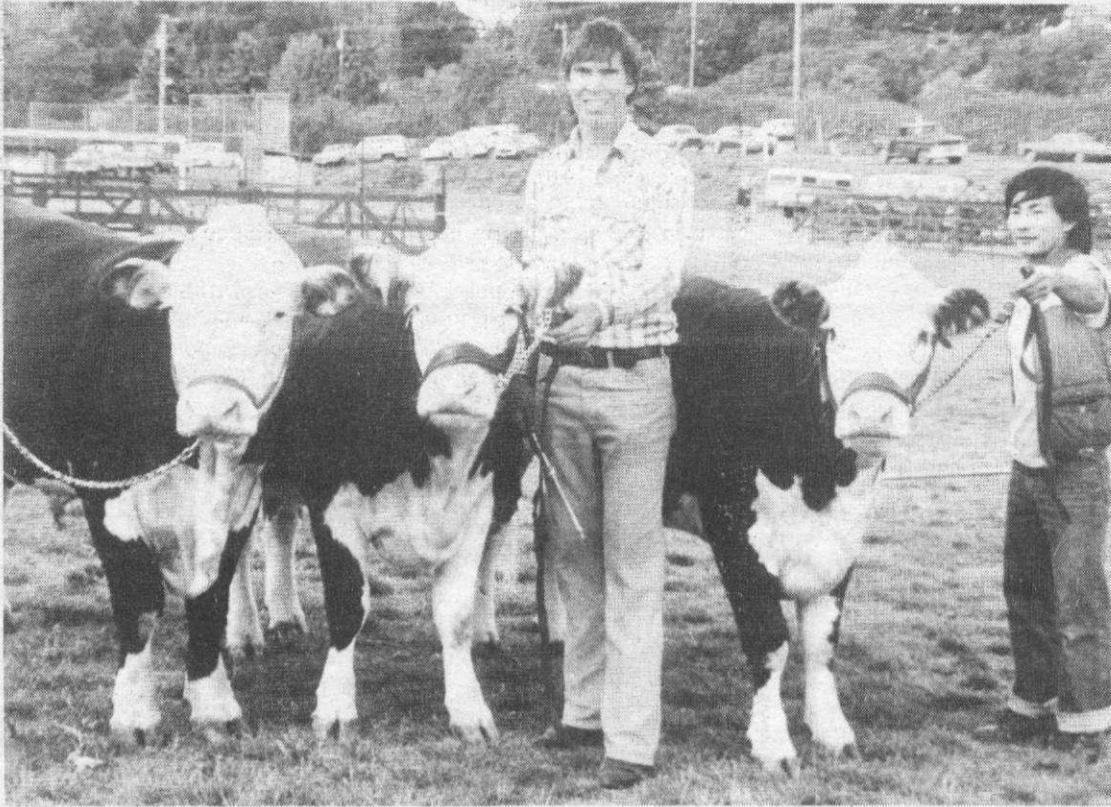

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Institute is oldest organization on island

The Salt Spring Island Farmers' Institute is 86 years old this year, making it the oldest organization on the island. This year the institute will be showing its new home to the public at the Fall Fair Saturday.

Members of the Salt Spring Island Farmers' Institute have been working hard lately to finish the building on Rainbow Road in time for the fair. The institute purchased 10 acres of land five years ago and today both a museum and a large multi-roomed barn stand on the property as a result of much planning and hard work.

Hard at work on the museum is Ray Stewart. A volunteer worker and member of the institute, Stewart has been stripping floors, painting and spending hours on the renovation of the old building.

"Nothing lines up as far as windows and walls," Stewart said. "I keep finding something crooked all the time and if one side lines up the other is out an inch."

But while the building can pose problems to the workers who have been repairing and renovating, it boasts a long, exciting history which grants it a place of honour among aged island buildings.

The museum once served as a store to Vesuvius residents when Estalon Bittancourt lived there during the 1890's. The building was moved from Vesuvius when the Farmers' Institute saved the old landmark from being torn down to make room for a parking area.

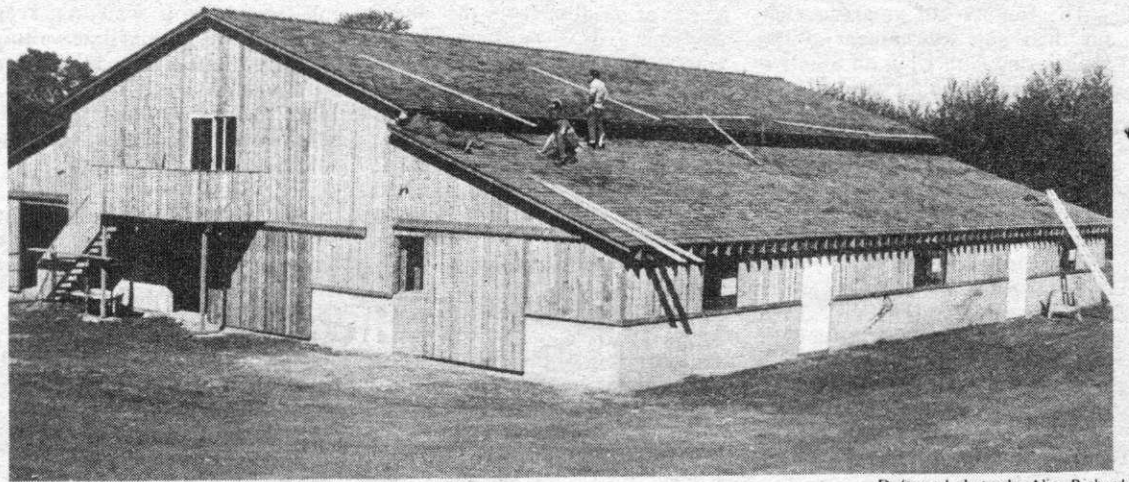
Standing north of the museum is the large, impressive looking barn containing enough floor space for exhibitions and livestock shows as well as an office area upstairs where institute members can meet.

Built almost entirely by volunteers

The unusual feature about the 8,000-square-foot building is that it has been built almost entirely by volunteers.

Leading his colleagues on in the construction of the barn was carpenter and institute member Perry Booth, who was foreman of the project. The winter saw the foundations built and during the summer volunteers have been busy working toward completion.

Farmers' Institute to help out with the project, Stewart explained. Several island organizations have given the institute a hand donating their labour. As far as money is concerned it has been a struggle for the association but a total of \$50,000 has been spent on the construction of the barn.

A government grant as well as debenture sales covered a fair chunk of the costs incurred during construction.

Chairman of the institute, Alan Gear, together with Booth sketched the plans of the building by referring to the size of the Ganges elementary school which has housed the annual fair in previous years.

The Island Farmers' Institute was once known as the Gulf Islands Agricultural and Fruit Growers Association. It was a mouthful for a member or a letterhead but the name held until 1902. Islands north of Salt Spring as well as the Gulf Island chain were tied in with the association and the farmers were unified by it.

The fairs were big events on the island during pre-World War II days.

Membership as low as 25, as high as 400

But during and after the war the fairs slowed down and farming on the island became tougher and tougher. The membership in the institute has been as low as 25 and as high as 400, according to the

institute's minute books which are stored in the Ganges library for safe-keeping.

"When our family came in 1919," George Heinekey of Vesuvius explained, "there were over 350 full-time farmers in a population of over 1,000 people." That farming was the main industry was seen in the large well-attended annual fairs and the very active farmers' institute.

Heinekey, who served as chairman of the institute for over 25 years, comes from a farming family. He operated a dairy farm at Vesuvius following the war.

In those days you could still survive on 15 cows and raise a family but costs spiralled during the 60's and Heinekey gave up the farm in 1967.

"The island grows good fruit. Growing vegetables or raising stock isn't really what the soil or climate is good for," Heinekey

explained.

The Island Farmers' Institute opened their first agricultural hall when Mahon Hall was built on property sold to the institute by fruit-farmer Frank Scott who had property on Scott Road.

Mahon Hall was built by men who worked for 12 hours and \$2 a day.

The story is a bit different now. Cost of labour has gone down once again and the Farmers' Institute is costing nothing but sweat to the men who have been pounding nails all summer.

The land includes 30 fruit trees left on the property which was once owned by the late Stan Rogers.

"All I hope for now is that it doesn't rain," Stewart commented, standing in the deep dust surrounding the building, "but I wouldn't mind a sprinkling, just a sprinkling to settle the dust."

Everybody does nothing

Relation between red tide and sewage

Sewage and marine discharges are polluting the Strait of Georgia, the Islands Trust was told last weekend.

Vice-chairman Mike Humphreys reported on his enquiries into marine dumping of wastes into the strait.

Commercial shipping is controlled by the federal government and private vessels by the province. The province awaits the federal action and Ottawa is faced with reaching international accord on such controls, reported Humphreys.

"Everyone," he told the Trust, "is doing nothing, vigorously."

There appears to be a relationship between sewage and red tide, he continued. The tide depends on the production of phyto plankton, which is influenced by three factors. The plankton may breed off the rotting vegetation after an upswelling from the sea bed. They may also result from the nutrients in sewage or other discharges.

While red tide occurs whether or not there might be a surfeit of sewage and wastes, there appears a close relationship between its incidence and those wastes.

TO STUDY POLLUTION
The ministry of the environment

is planning to make a study of this association and of wastes in the water, said the speaker.

The tying up of deep-sea ships around the islands contributes to pollution, said Humphreys. There are regulations controlling the discharge of pollutants and these are policed by the Canada Coast Guard. But there are international agreements or Ottawa may go it alone.

The government has not yet made a decision on which way it will go, said the speaker.

In the meantime, B.C. has done nothing and does not plan to do anything about private vessels until Ottawa takes the lead.

Deplores means of clearing rights-of-way

Use of flails for clearing roadsides was flailed at last week's meeting of the Islands Trust Council.

The machine destroys everything in sight, protested Gabriola's Jim Tyhurst. They are handled in a very destructive way, he charged.

Trustees will have to make it their business to record the use of inappropriate equipment, he warned his colleagues.

John Rich to vacate chair at end of current term

Islands Trust chairman John Rich will vacate the chair for good at the end of this year.

The four-year veteran of the preservation agency told his colleagues that he has entered law school and will be a full-time student.

The announcement came when the chairman was reviewing the accomplishments of the Islands Trust and looking to its future.

In respect of its future, the Trust was still in the balance, but the chairman explained that he was taking the "positive view".

The council meeting, whereby each of the 26 local trustees gathers in Victoria with the staff and exchanges experiences and studies,

is not statutory, he noted. He described it as an opportunity for exchange between local trustees and general trustees.

The council disseminates information, said Rich, on technical matters and issues affecting the islands.

INVENTORY
A heritage inventory has been prepared by the Trust with the aid of a student. The local trustees were urged to examine the information gained, relative to individual islands and to report approval or needed changes before the information is published.

As far as local planning is concerned, the Trust is in good shape, reported the chairman.

"I think we've done a good job." The Trust had also worked closely with the B.C. Ferry Corporation on the preparation of the new ferry schedules.

The Trust has worked closely with all provincial government ministries and agencies and has established an increasingly close liaison.

At the conclusion of the chairman's remarks, Jim Tyhurst, Gabriola, warmly endorsed his comments.

"The Trust is also one of the most interesting and effective forms of government in terms of

land use," commented Tyhurst.

It is important to recognize, he added, that this effective government sponsored the great response when plans were afoot for the elimination of the Trust.

"This great interest is not only here, but also over all Canada and beyond."

Highways disagrees with Trust

Ministry of highways makes the final decision on subdivision plans as approving officer.

On Friday trustee David Lott told the Islands Trust Council that two applications in recent months have been granted by the ministry over the strong objections of the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee.

Ministry asks for local opinions but is not bound by them.

Rich is given ovation

Chairman of the Islands Trust, John Rich, was given a send-off on Friday weeks before he leaves.

Rich told the Islands Trust Council in Victoria on Friday that his enrolment in law school has led to a decision to seek no extension to his term as chairman after the November election.

On the Islands Trust since the beginning, North Pender's Gordon Wallace has worked for four years with John Rich, he told the meeting.

"We have been very fortunate to have a young man to give enthusiasm and dedication to the Trust," he told the council. "I would like to publicly thank him for his dedication and untiring efforts."

Rich enjoyed a standing ovation.

Garden Club Speakers

The featured speakers for the August and September meetings of the Garden Club have each made the long trip from Victoria, leaving home before 9 am and arriving back after midnight.

Last Wednesday Ernest Lythgoe, past president of the Vancouver Island Rock and Alpine Garden Club, discussed and illustrated with slides the many native plants of the Pacific northwest suitable for growing in an alpine garden.

packaged and in place by 1 pm. Books and home baking will be additional attractions.

Everyone is familiar with the chemical varieties of mosquito repellent which use an unpleasant odour to prevent pesky little insects biting human flesh.

Apparently only pregnant females carry out this activity, because blood is required to nourish the eggs they bear. Such females are no longer interested in the opposite sex and take flight to avoid romantically minded male mosquitoes, which give warning of their approach with the high-frequency whine so disturbing to human sleep.

Use has been made of this high pitched note to develop a mosquito repellent which consists of a small cylinder about the size of a cigarette lighter. The device, which may be hung around the neck by a cord, is battery-operated and emits a high-frequency hum resembling the sound of a male mosquito.

This causes the rapacious blood-sucking females to flee the scene thus protecting the wearer. An overseas visitor to the Flemings, Queenie Farmer, had such a device which, she reported, successfully repelled the relatively harmless Galiano mosquitoes.

It is rumoured that the Galiano Men's Defence League and the Galiano Branch of the Feminist Coalition are thinking of forming a consortium to develop this device with a more human frequency.

Although these two groups may appear to be strange bedfellows, they must feel that some mutual advantage would accrue from the development of such an instrument.

Sinister

One of Galiano's perennial letter-to-the-editor writers referred in last week's *Driftwood* to a "sinister political invention". With its sibilant sound this word has a villainous flavour.

The Oxford dictionary includes among its definitions "ill-looking, malignant and even flagitious". The derivation from this Latin word for *left* is also interesting, referring in heraldry to a device on the left side of an heraldic shield, a

sign of illegitimate ancestry.

Perhaps the writer was subconsciously indicating he thought the political invention was a bastard and certainly he would condemn it for being on the left, for he is much further to the right on the spectrum of political philosophy.

Sinister, during the present century, has evolved into a word used by an authoritarian political regime to describe any opposition to its program or philosophy.

The "sinister plot" is a favourite propaganda phrase used by dictatorial governments of both the right and the left. In this sense his use of the word in describing the Islands Trust is itself sinister.

On Saturday April Wilson was married to William Dermody in St. Margaret's Church on Galiano with Rev. Dr. Murdo Nicolson of Ganges officiating. Although the bride was from Ladner she chose to be married on Galiano because of many family connections with the island.

April had planned to be married in Montague Park but the inclement weather caused the ceremony to be held in the church and the reception in the Community Hall.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Wilson of Ladner and niece of the late Pat Wilson of Galiano. April's paternal grandmother is Rose Cook, daughter of the pioneer Galiano family of Mr. and Mrs. John Cook, who farmed the southern Cook Farm five miles up-island.

Rose, with brothers Nick and Jack from Duncan, were among the early pupils at Galiano School when it was located at the intersection of Bluff Road and Gesgeson Bay Road.

A congregation of over 80 consisting of many members of both families were on hand to witness the ceremony. A large contingent led by grandparents of the bride, Mr. and Mrs. George Clifton, came from Prince Rupert, including Bill Bennett who proposed the toast to the bride.

The bride's attendants were maid-of-honour Joy Wilson, bridesmaid Tanya Harris, ring-bearer Benjamin Catcher and flower-girl Julia Clifton. The groom's best man was Sam Hess and Marvin Wilson acted as usher.

Lady Minto Hospital reported 61 patients under care during the month of August including one each from Vancouver, Richmond, Duncan and Alberni. During the month five babies were born. The hospital also reported 50 minor operations and 45 patient x-rays.

Schools in the Gulf Islands lacked space for gymnasium activities. The parents of Saturna sympathized with students at the Salt Spring Elementary and Senior High School about the lack of proper facilities. A solution which would enable all Gulf Islands schools to enjoy indoor athletic activities was being discussed - a floating gymnasium.

Fifteen years ago

Motorists on Saturna Island are keeping their eyes on the gas gauge as well as the road. The RCMP had closed the only gas outlet on the island for an infraction of the Fire Marshall's Act. The pumps were situated too close to the docks and thus exposed every user of the wharf facilities to danger. Appeals to the provincial government resulted in dispensing of gasoline on an emergency basis while the situation was corrected.

Bill Evans of Salt Spring Island took his border collie Rainbow King to the Cowichan Exhibition and returned home with the B.C. Sheepdog Trophy. King herded the flock of sheep through the course, which was timed for 14 minutes, in only six minutes to outdistance all rivals.

The gasoline was stored in a farm shed and when police found some in a car, the young Salt

Spring driver spent eight days in jail awaiting trial. In court, he was fined \$25 after the magistrate took the time spent in jail into consideration. The magistrate was also swayed by the character references submitted by responsible members of the community.

The Mayne Island Ratepayers Association heard a report from the roads committee that most of the repair work on the main roads of the island had been finished during the summer months. An additional mile of roads had been blacktopped but no oil had been laid on gravel roads because of the costs involved. Horton Road would be widened during the winter months, the meeting was told.

Ten years ago

Camp Yawaca on Salt Spring Island was formally opened by Robert Bonner, former provincial attorney-general and head of MacMillan Bloedel. The land for the camp had been donated by the lumber company and Bonner also presented the YWCA with a cheque worth \$1,000 to help defray costs of operating the camp.

Residents of Old Scott Road, Salt Spring Island, reported seeing a mysterious light flash rapidly across the sky from south to west. The flying object had not been identified.

The Salt Spring Island community plan was unveiled to reveal a call for lot sizes of five acres to accommodate a potential population of 18,000. The plan was the result of work co-ordinated by the island Community Planning

A Galiano Island community plan had also been presented to residents. The plan was the second to be put forward on the island. The first plan had been identified with part-time residents of the island while the new plan was the result of consultation with regular residents. The two groups were urged to get together to reach a consensus before any plan for the island would be adopted.

Five years ago

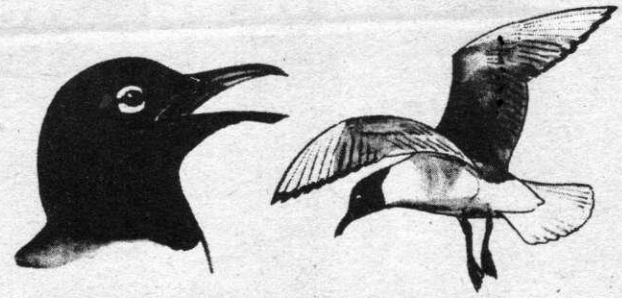
The Ganges Farmers' Market was under fire from the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce. Officials of that group had written to the Capital Regional District asking that the site be ruled unsuitable for the market and that the Saturday sale be moved elsewhere. Earlier efforts by the Parks and Recreation Commission to have the market moved had resulted in a 1,000-name petition in support of the market as it was.

The Capital Regional District was too busy to help formulate a community plan for Fulford. The South Salt Spring Residents' Association had asked the CRD for assistance but was told the planning department was swamped with work planning other regions of the district.

The laundromat on Rainbow Road, Salt Spring Island, was closed by the water rights branch of the water resources centre in Victoria. The owner said he was considering the disposal of the washing machines and the conversion of the building to a residence.

The Gulf Islands School Board adopted a motion to dispose, by sale, of the various teacherages as circumstances permitted.

Marsh World



BONAPARTE'S GULL (*Larus philadelphia*) - Slightly smaller than Franklin's gull (about 28 cm in length), it can be distinguished from this species by the white forepart of the upper wing, which shows up clearly when the bird is in flight. A wide-ranging species, Bonaparte's gulls occur in migration on marshes, lakes and rivers, travelling in loose flocks often of considerable size. Nests are located by marshes and lakes in the coniferous forest zone. Generally built in a spruce or fir, at heights varying from 6 m to 10 m, the nest is made of twigs and grass, lined with moss and lichen. Its breeding range extends from Manitoba west to B.C.

Attendance 14,645

Artcraft sales up 15%

"With gross sales of approximately \$114,000, Artcraft this year shows an increase of about 15% over the 1981 show," co-ordinator Ilse Leader announced last week.

"Of that amount," she said, "close to \$93,000 goes directly back to the community through the returns to the 185 contributing artisans. The balance, an estimated \$21,000, will also find its way back into the community, after show expenses have been met, through the grants and awards program of the Community Arts Council, the sponsoring body of Artcraft."

Asked how to account for the substantial increase over last year in this time of recession and tight money, Leader said she attributed it to the fact that this year's show had a larger variety of articles on display and that the overall quality was higher than last year.

She said also that this year's intensified advertising program made a significant contribution to the increase.

"In general," she said, "the organization of the show and the displays were greatly improved and we had two paid co-ordinators, one on duty at all times during opening hours, which increased the operating efficiency."

"And of course I can't say enough for the help we receive from the many volunteers who give so willingly of their time for the show."

This year's paid attendance to the show was up slightly over last year, moving from 14,000 to 14,645. As in previous years the Artcraft guest book reads like the registrar of the United Nations with guests from Sri Lanka, India, England, Ireland, West Germany, the Netherlands, Spain, Italy, and many of the United States as well as all the provinces and territories of Canada.
