

One vote looks like tale without an end

Nukes are out; farm produce is in; the Islands Trust is somewhere in outer space. There was a vote. And there was another vote. It was Saturday and the islands named some school trustees and some local trustees.

Then they went to vote by straws on the future of nuclear armaments and said, "No way!" On the Farmers' Market they urged that it stay put with some restrictions on what might be sold here.

Finally they said "Yes" to the

vague question about authorizing a study of incorporation of something.

A vote's a vote. Even if some of the Capital Regional directors are busy making sandboxes for their heads, the vote was taken and will be passed on to the federal government.

Like the regional directors, Ottawa knew what the answer was going to be before the vote was taken. Of course the nation is disturbed at the increase in weaponry.

Like the voters, Ottawa probably

knows well enough that if the United States president had announced on Monday that he and the Soviet leaders were arranging guided tours of each other's country, with complete freedom of communication between them, the question would probably resolve itself. It's easier to fight a stranger than an acquaintance.

But there was a vote and the islands are concerned over the nuclear threat to mankind.

And there was a vote on the

Farmers' Market. It was smooth and gentle and it said half what the last vote said. The last time there was a dispute over the market the Chamber of Commerce was torn apart and a thousand voices were raised in protest of its being moved. On Saturday the voices were there at the straw but they softened the message when they supported a proposal to limit the nature of commodities to be offered in the market.

All that remains is to find out how to implement the directions of the straw voters and how to enforce any regulations that might be evolved towards that implementation.

And that's as big an order as the words used to say it.

The last straw was the Islands Trust vote. Voters asked for a study into the amalgamation of the Islands Trust Act and some unidentified regional district. Go ahead and study it, said voters.

Go study it, somebody must.

Who? The Capital Regional Board? It seems a wide subject for a regional board. In the past the CRD has not always been too concerned over its mandate in connection with the Islands Trust, but this is a tall, tall order.

And if the regional directors were

to study its relationship to the Islands Trust, who would pay the costs?

It is not likely that the province would be eager, particularly in times of restraint. The last time the province made a study of the Islands Trust as a regional district the answer was "No". The present government would have to be convinced that the picture has changed to a sufficient degree to justify a new study. And it would have to be convinced enough to pay for the cost.

But the fact remains, a vote is a vote.

We have three straws to choose from.

The nuclear straw tells a tale all of its own. The sponsors want nothing more from voters than an opinion. Their next step is to persuade Ottawa to ask for a world-wide vote on nuclear disarmament. And more power to them!

The market straw tells what the voter wants and it is now up to the recreation commission and, perhaps, the regional district or the provincial government to figure out how to get there.

The Islands Trust straw may well tell a tale, but it looks like being a tale without an end.

Nuclear film shown at Pender

If *You Love This Planet*, the film narrated by Dr. Helen Caldicott on nuclear war, was shown to 85 Pender Islanders at the Legion on Tuesday evening, Nov. 16.

Frank Jones, one of the meeting's organizers, said Salt Spring and Galiano have anti-nuclear organizations and suggested one could be formed on Pender.

On December 2 there will be an inter-island meeting on Salt Spring to co-ordinate the various groups.

"War is nonsense, there is no glory in it," said Jones. He speaks from experience, having been a fighter pilot in World War II.

Peter Pentz of Salt Spring, a retired industrial chemist, said the film was made some time ago when the situation was far less dangerous

than it is now. Pentz thinks we will find the way to survive when everyone understands what a dangerous situation exists.

"Some just give up," said Pentz. It astonishes him that some young people fall into this category. He pointed out that the situation is entirely within our control. It's only men who are making these instruments of destruction and they can be persuaded to stop if enough people work at it.

The whole thing is a big swindle: trillions of dollars of taxpayers' money to produce a painful suicide. It's no wonder we have inflation, he said, as vast amounts of money are put into armaments and taken out of circulation.

"Things are now changing," said

Pentz, "because people like this small group tonight are getting together to think concretely and accurately about it."

Pentz said that to date there have been about 150 errors in the nuclear systems. The greatest danger is that a nuclear war will start by sheer accident.

If we use these weapons to punish an aggressor the great danger is the risk of destroying ourselves.

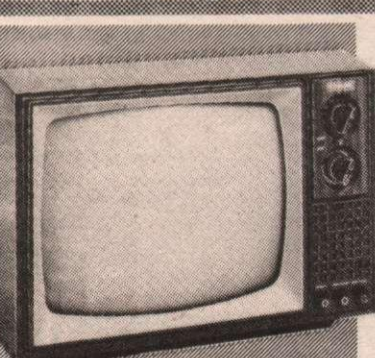

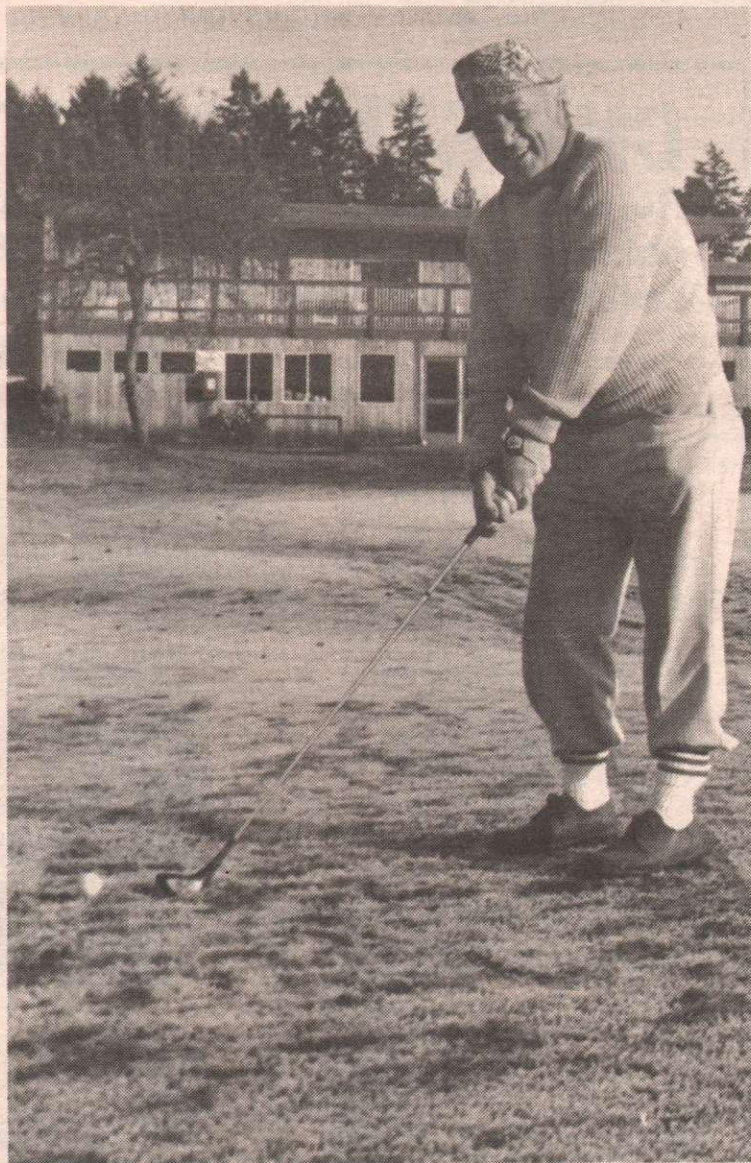

Trust races to prepare new bylaw

In a race against time the Salt Spring Island Trust last week introduced a bylaw to designate the proposed sewage treatment plant in Ganges a development permit area.

The bylaw was given two readings and a public hearing authorized.

If the bylaw is in force before the treatment plant goes ahead the committee will require that it conform to aesthetic standards established by the committee.

It would take two months to place the bylaw, said planner Richard McKellar.

Car damaged

Operation Eyesight

Local resident off to India, Sri Lanka

Operation Eyesight International works wonders for the poor in developing countries. The Calgary-based organization, by the end of 1981, had treated almost two million people in 14 countries. The people were suffering from some form of eye trouble and

the treatment restored the sight of 400,000 of those people. Surgeons in the various hospitals and mobile health units sponsored by Operation Eyesight can perform up to 60 operations each day. The cost of treatment, surgery and a pair of glasses is \$25. Operation Eyesight is supported

by church groups and service clubs and donations can be made to Operation Eyesight International, P.O. Box 123, Calgary, Alberta T2P 2H6. Cec Wakely of Salt Spring is heading to India in January as part of an international Rotary group to look, to watch, to see how the operation works.

The eyesight problems, said Wakely, are acute in poorer countries such as India. Diet works against the people and many children are blinded because of vitamin deficiencies in their food intake.

Religion and superstitions also work against the efforts of those who seek to help the people with eye diseases.

Around the world today, estimates place the number of persons who would be considered blind at 40 million. At least 80% of those people could, with medical treatment, have their sight restored.

Operation Eyesight was begun in Calgary as a means of aiding the work of Dr. Ben Gullison. He was a missionary and doctor to the poor in India and the Calgary group began to raise money to help him.

Each dollar raised is matched by a grant from the non-government organizations division of the Canadian International Development Agency.

Money helps, said Wakely, but the main problem to overcome is the lack of trained people to help. The group estimates that in the developing nations there is only one eye doctor for every one million people.

After Wakely finishes the tour of India, he intends to go to Sri Lanka. The purpose of that visit is to help set up a boys' town.

And to ensure that the letters are answered, Santa has a volunteer group to help him sort the mail.

Warren explained the volunteer set-up. "I'm happy to announce that a growing number of Canada Post employees and pensioners, along with members of senior citizens groups and service clubs across Canada, have volunteered to act as Santa's helpers in his efforts to answer the letters mailed to his workshop at the North Pole."

Youngsters are reminded to mail letters early and to use their return addresses on the outside of the envelopes, including their own postal codes.

"It is important to use the North Pole postal code, H0H 0H0 on Santa's address, say the folks at the post office.

Warren concluded, "...we are all pleased to be Santa's helpers. Hopefully, this will help make Christmas a little bit brighter for everyone this year."

Sewer plant low bid of \$563,500

Low bid on the construction of a sewage treatment centre for Ganges was the tender from Farmer Construction for \$563,500.

Tenders were opened on Friday, by the Capital Regional Board, when 13 bids were received.

Previous plans had been tendered at close to \$1 million and the Capital Regional District engineering department had modified plans to bring the cost down.

Tenders ranged up to a high of \$998,745, from Hallcraft Construction, of Vancouver.

Coupled with the bid of \$866,507 by Don Mann Ltd., Friday's figures will make a total of \$1,430,000 to complete the project.

All must take out permits

Where does the Trust committee stand when a project is built under a building permit but without a development permit?

Bud Kreissl asked the question of the committee on Tuesday afternoon last week.

Planner Richard McKellar explained he checks all applications, but that there could be instances where a building permit is not required, although a development permit is. Repainting is one.

One was in connection with the Valcourt property, reported director Yvette Valcourt. It is not a building, but a plant with a front and roof over it.

In future any application affecting the aesthetic appearance of a building will go to the Trust, the committee agreed.

Tell Pierre Trudeau to stand up to Big Ron

Children often face pressure from their playmates, to do things that they know are wrong, and that they don't really want to do. It helps if they can say in these situations, "I can't do that, my Mom won't let me" or "My Dad would really give me trouble for that."

Take the case of Pierre. Most of his best friends live several blocks away and the only other kid in his block is Big Ron. Although Pierre

and Big Ron spend a great deal of time together, Pierre doesn't really like Big Ron that much.

For one thing, Pierre thinks Big Ron is rather stupid. Actually Pierre is very smart and thinks everyone is rather stupid, but especially Big Ron. For another thing he finds Big Ron a bit of a bully, not that Pierre minds pushing his own little brothers and sisters around quite a bit at home.

NOT AFRAID TO FIGHT

But, sometimes Pierre is glad to have Big Ron around. If they ever get into a fight with the kids from the east side of town, Big Ron is a good guy to have on your side.

He's tough and he's not afraid to fight.

But this is where Pierre has problems with Big Ron's stupidity. Not only is Ron big physically, but he has an even bigger mouth and a monstrous ego. So it seems that he is always on the verge of a fight with the other kids and Pierre knows that whether he wants to or not he'll be dragged into it.

Now, Big Ron has come up with a very frightening plan. He tells Pierre that the East side kids are getting ready for a big fight and says "We should get them before they get us." And, he decides that

ordinary fighting isn't enough; he wants to use sling shots.

He phoned Pierre and told him of his plans, and then he said that he wanted to come right over and practise his slingshot in Pierre's back yard. Luckily for Pierre, his dad overheard the conversation, and understood that he was getting into pretty deep water.

So the father stepped in. "Tell that big lunk that you're not having anything to do with his stupid plans for a fight. And if I catch him over here with his slingshot he'll be in real trouble." His father's strong words had the necessary effect on Pierre, who found the necessary gumption to inform Big Ron that he could no longer go along with his plan.

FACES SIMILAR PROBLEM

The Canadian government today faces a similar problem in its relationship to the United States government as Pierre did with Big Ron. The United States wants to test the cruise missile in Northern Alberta and Saskatchewan. The cruise will escalate the arms race, because its primary value is as a first-strike weapon. A cruise missile's relatively small size makes it difficult to detect.

Its low trajectory makes it

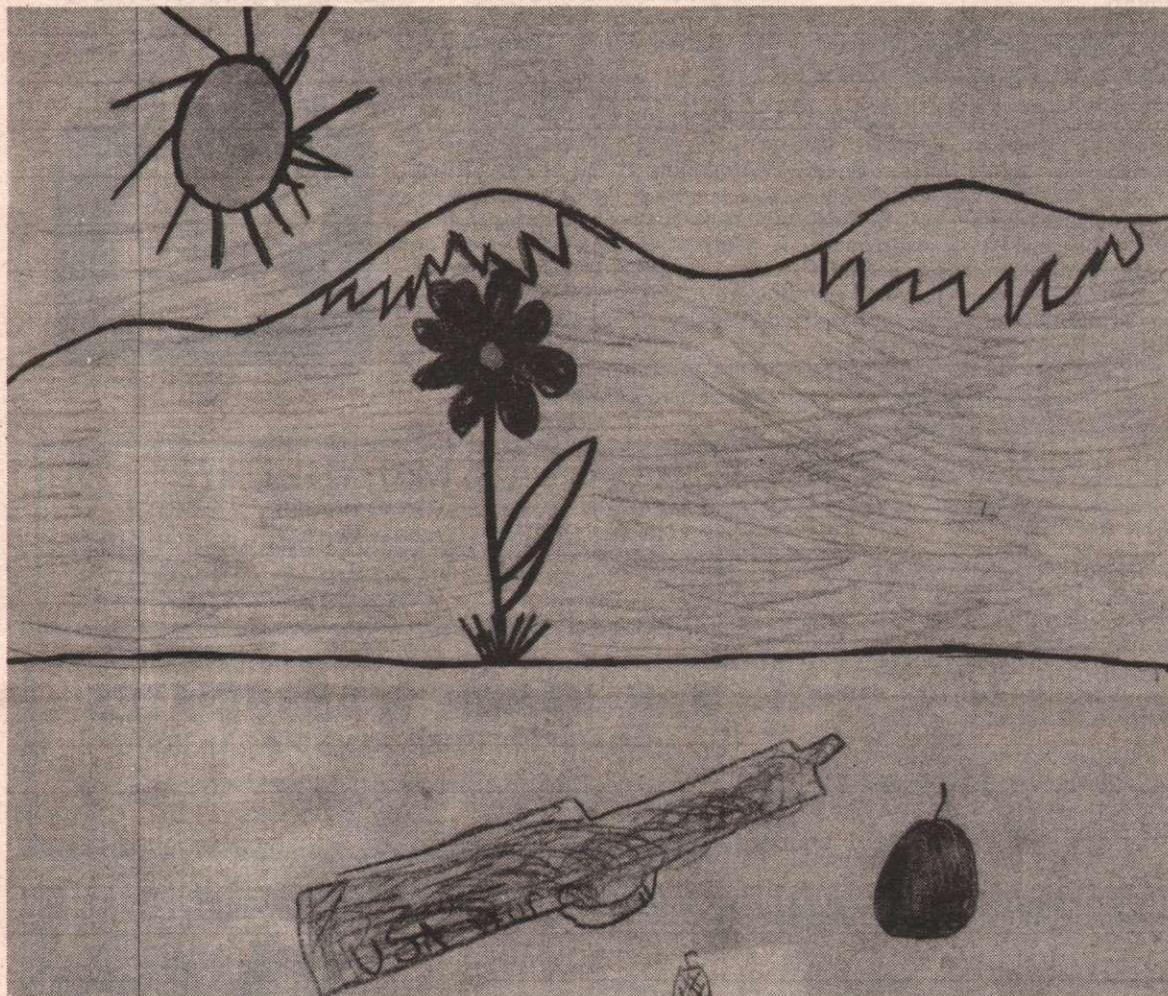
difficult for radar to detect in flight; an electronic map built into it allows a cruise to zero in to pinpoint targets. These factors all indicate that the testing of the cruise missile would contribute not to Canadian security, but would lead to heightened tensions and an increased threat of war.

I believe that Prime Minister Trudeau recognizes this danger, and does not really want the missile testing to take place in Canada. But he finds it hard to stand up to the kind of pressure which President Reagan and the United States government apply in order to get Canadian agreement to this testing.

NEEDS STRONG PARENT

What Prime Minister Trudeau needs is a strong parent who will say with great firmness, "Pierre, you know that this weapon testing is wrong. You must not have anything more to do with President Reagan's plan to develop first-strike weapons. If you go ahead with this, you will put us all in big trouble."

But where can that parent be found? Who can play that role for Pierre Trudeau who is no longer a small boy but an aging prime minister? You can!

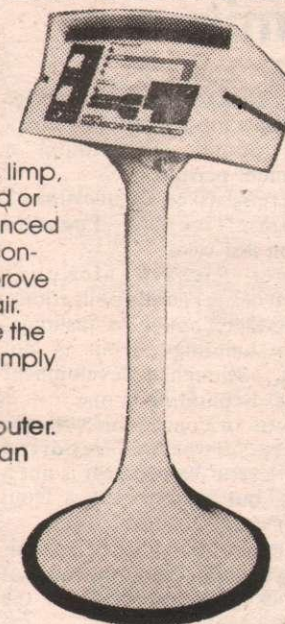

Ferry passenger saw fire destroy her home

Just as darkness was falling last Wednesday, Nov. 17, a spectacular blaze could be observed at the top of a bluff overlooking Active Pass. Seen from the *Queen of Sidney* the flames concealed the structure that was burning, but Kathleen Partington, a passenger on the ferry, knew that it was her home that was being engulfed.

Charles and Kathleen Partington lost more than a house, more even than a home, for their residence was also a symbol of their good taste, appreciation of the best things of the past and their own creative ability.

The Partingtons took an old house and gave it character by renovations that incorporated antique fittings, objects d'art, and filling it with things of beauty.

Charlie had taken early retirement from his position as city clerk of Langley, so that he and Kathleen could devote their time to the crafts of pottery and weaving in tranquility, free from the stress of urban life.

They were listed in *The Potters of B.C.* and produced ware in traditional forms which graces many a home on Galiano and beyond. Recently both of them have concentrated on fibre arts, spinning and dyeing wool into a fine quality product.

Desire for a peaceful life did not prevent Charlie taking more than his share of public duty. He was president of the Volunteer Fire Department and for two years its fire chief. He was also on the executive of the Galiano Club.

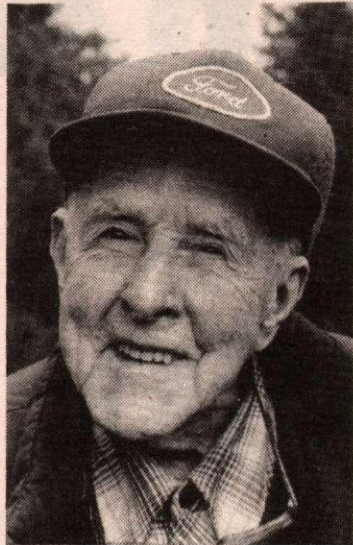
Kathleen has been an active member of weavers' groups on the island. Everyone who has known them or their work would want to express their sympathy and offer the hope that a Partington home will again grace the cliff top above Georgeson Bay.

Accessory buildings

The tragedy of the fire that destroyed the Partington home points up a defect in the Galiano zoning bylaw. Accessory buildings are limited to a total area of 450 square feet unless they are part of a residence.

This encourages the unsafe practice of having garages, carpools, workshops and other ancillary buildings attached to or part of the main residence. The bylaw should be amended so that home-owners are not penalized for the sensible alternative of having separate from the house ancillary buildings in which the fire hazard is greater.

Trustee Ronald Thompson is preparing a bylaw amendment to allow accessory buildings up to a total of 700 square feet. Perhaps the Trust should also consider the fire safety element when amending the bylaw, and encourage or require that ancillary buildings representing a hazard be completely separate from the main residence.

Nature notes

Tony Kingscote reports catching a "true" cod in Trincomali Channel last week. There must be nearly 50 species of fish with the common name cod, including about 30 different kinds of rock cod as well as several of the true cod family.

The use of cod as a word for fish is so old that its origin is lost in the mist of linguistic antiquity. The grey cod of the commercial fisherman, usually caught by trawling, is the true cod caught by Tony. Its Latin name is *gradus macrocephalus* (Cod, big-head) and it is very similar to the true Atlantic cod, with typical barbel beneath the tip of the lower jaw.

This Pacific cod may grow to three feet and weigh 30 lbs., but those few caught locally by sport fishermen rarely weight more than 3 lbs.

Painting and sculpture

Next weekend Galiano residents and visitors will have an

opportunity to see an exhibition of the paintings of Elizabeth Steward and the sculpture of Enzo von Rezori at the Earthen Things Gallery. Opening night is Friday at 8 pm and then for the next three days between 11 am and 4 pm. Elizabeth will be showing many paintings inspired by her recent stay in the historic Marais quarter of Paris.

During her visit she resided in the house of Joe Plaskett, an historic building constructed before Columbus discovered America. "This job is always changing and always rewarding and I don't mean in money," she says.

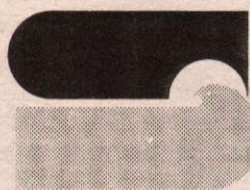
Gaines and her husband John have two children, Ian, 11, and Ingrid, 8.

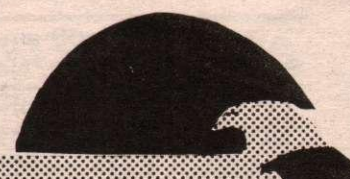

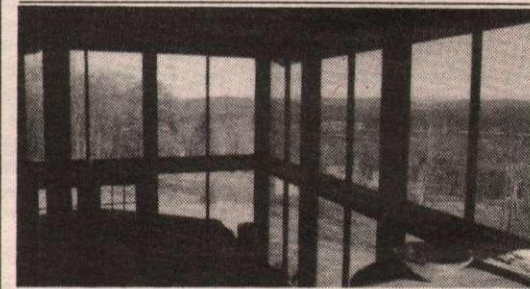

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

A school district annual meeting held on Galiano Island resulted in the election of Donald New to the Gulf Islands School Board. New defeated Mrs. H. Barner who had served a two-year term as trustee. The meeting was attended by approximately 60 residents of the island. New was post-master of the Galiano Post Office.

At the school district annual meeting on Pender Islands, the residents chose Les Armstrong as replacement for Hilda Prior who had stepped down due to ill health. Prior had served eight years on the school board.

Lady Minto Hospital appointed Harold Hoffman of Salt Spring Island as a replacement for the retiring administrator Group Captain W.E. Dipple. Hoffman worked for B.C. Forest Products and commuted daily to the mill in Crofton. The appointment would take effect in the new year when Dipple retired formally on December 31.

The Salt Spring Island branch of the Royal Canadian Legion raised \$426.91 from the annual poppy sales campaign. The fund raising efforts began on November 9 with a tag day.

The Veteran's Dinner, held at Mahon Hall, November 10, was attended by 126 servicemen and 10 servicewomen. The Venerable Archdeacon G.H. Holmes agreed to a request to continue as padre for the Salt Spring branch of the Legion. He had recently retired from active ministry.

The former manager of the Ganges bank, John Frederick, who had been transferred to the Kelowna branch, had been transferred again - to the Caribbean area.

Rumour circulated that the Salt Spring branch of the American Club would be holding a secret get-together to eat turkey and imbibe drinks in celebration of their Thanksgiving. Also scheduled, rumour had it, was the viewing of a televised football game.

The newly installed hardwood floor in the Fulford Hall meant the resumption of roller skating sponsored by the island Lions Club.

Fifteen years ago

Ferry service between Crofton and Vesuvius was back to normal. The Vesuvius Queen would be returning normal runs following the temporary, irregular service brought on by repair work to the wharf on the Salt Spring side.

Royal Canadian Legion 84, Gulf Islands reported the largest amount gathered in the poppy fund drive. The campaign on Galiano raised \$125.50 while \$40 was raised on Saturna and \$30 raised on Mayne.

The two representatives from the Gulf Islands to the Capital Regional District would seek election to the offices of directors. Joan Purchase would run for the seat from the Outer Gulf Islands and Douglas Cavaye would try for the seat from Salt Spring. Both candidates had been appointed as directors to the CRD by the provincial government when the Gulf Islands were included in the regional district.

Fruit farming could be brought back to Salt Spring Island claimed George Heinekey, president of the Salt Spring Island Farmers' Institute. The comment formed part of his address to a meeting of the group and he said such endeavours should be encouraged because the island had once been noted for its fruit crops.

The Ladies Auxiliary to Branch 92 of the Royal Canadian Legion, Salt Spring Branch, realized \$450 from the sale of poppies.

The Salt Spring Rod and Gun Club held its annual banquet in Fulford Hall. Prizes were handed out to various members. Heaviest buck award went to Bernie Reynolds, best set of horns (four points) Dennis Andrews, largest salmon was taken by Nels Degnen and the junior fishing trophy was won by Keith Winter.

The volunteers of the Salt Spring Lions Ambulance brigade took part in a St. John Ambulance course sponsored by the adult education section of the Gulf Islands School District.

The Salt Spring Island Drama Group would be presenting two plays. The group had been newly formed and plays would mark their first efforts. The plays would be staged in Mahon Hall with three performances each and admission had been set at 25c.

Ten years ago

A jawbone discovered in Drummond Park, Fulford, had been checked and was determined to be at least 100 years old. The jaw had belonged to a young Indian man or woman said the report from the provincial museum.

Electors on Pender Island would choose between incumbent Bertha Matthews and challenger Elizabeth Valislev in the only school trustee elections in the Gulf Islands. On Salt Spring, Robert Marshall and Sheila Fraser were elected by acclamation while Clare McAllister was the only candidate on Galiano to seek office as replacement for Elizabeth Beach who retired from the board.

Salt Spring Islanders would be going to the polls for a decision on a pair of referendums. They would be asked opinions on the spending of \$50,000 on a community recreation centre at the Ganges school as well as opinions on one-quarter mill to be used for augmenting the recreation allotment.

The Gulf Islands teachers would be given a pay hike of 8.9 per cent. The increase had been accepted by both the school trustees and the teachers following negotiations.

A subdivision plan on Pender Island had been rejected and the developers would appeal the decision in court. The subdivision had been approved before the Capital Region District came into being. The plan called for 287 lots on 245 acres.

The Gulf Islands School Board had named Wilf Peck as secretary-treasurer to replace Roma Sturdy who retired.

Salt Spring Island parents were informally polled about the closing of Kanaka Road. They replied to letters sent home with pupils and said yes to the proposal with a 90 per cent favourable vote.

Five years ago

Election day occurred the past Saturday and 39 per cent of the electorate on Salt Spring Island turned out to cast ballots. On Mayne Island, 60 per cent of the eligible voters marked ballots for school trustee.

New director to the Capital Regional District from Salt Spring Island would be Jim Bryce who polled 784 votes. Arthur Lloyd gathered the support of 334 voters while Robert Aston who had withdrawn from the race gained 40 votes. Bryce would take over from

George Heinekey who had retired.

The Gulf Islands School Board would be served by Jeannine Dodds who won election as trustee from Mayne Island. Dodds defeated incumbent Pearl Brau by 158 votes to 137.

Salt Spring trustees to the Gulf Island School Board would include Spencer Marr, David Stacey and Norma McCallum who took the top three spots in a six-man race for school board.

A referendum seeking preference between the Capital Regional District and the Islands Trust in the matter of planning and zoning was held on Salt Spring. Island voters decided to trust the Islands Trust in the matter by almost a 2-1 margin. Of the ballots which counted, 744 voters rejected the CRD in land use matters while 371 favoured the Victoria-based government.

A Fulford farmer reported the death of five sheep due to attacks by dogs. One of the dogs had been shot by the farmer but another escaped. He would be seeking compensation for the losses.

The senior editor of Driftwood did not appear in the office on either Monday or Tuesday. A check with Driftwood's London, England, bureau office revealed that he was expected there for an extended leave of absence. Staff members on the island were preparing a celebration for the weekend.

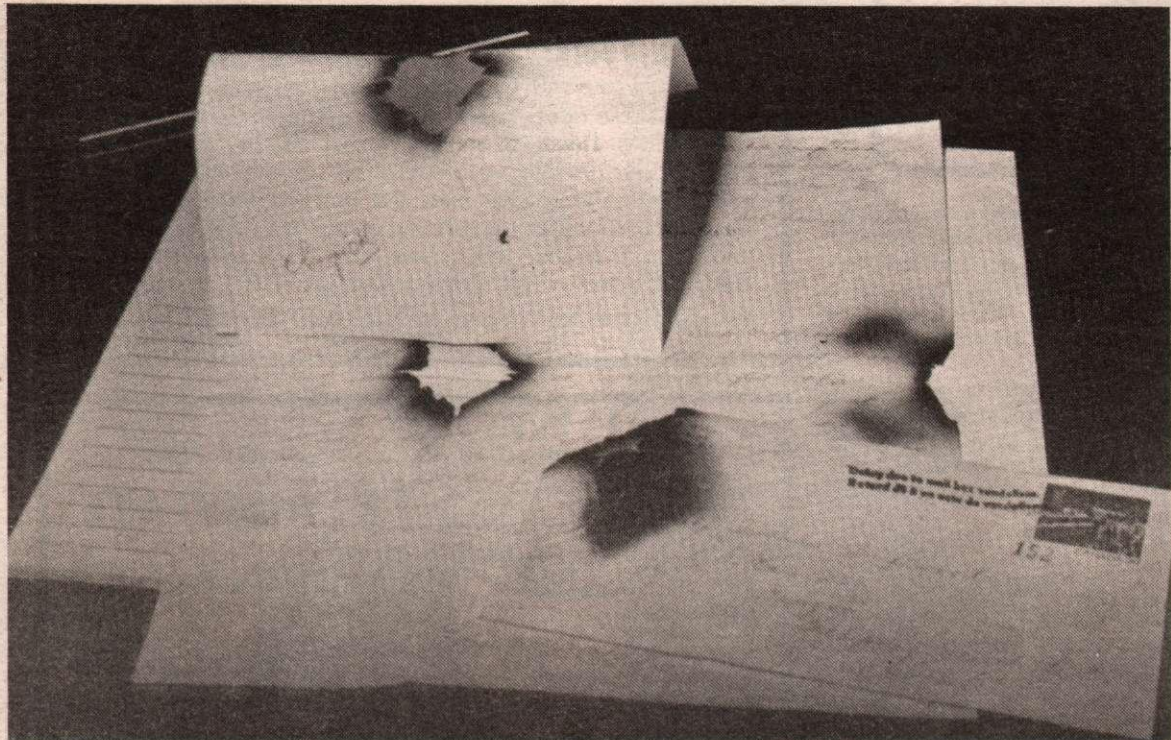

"I challenge anyone to show me where this is against the plan," said Lott. "We have to be guided by the plan," cautioned Wallace. Had he read it, challenged Lott. He had, replied Wallace.

Sewage plant plans are changed

Plans for a sewage treatment plant in Ganges were prepared by an architect.

First tenders left the regional district high and dry. There was not sufficient money.

The Capital Regional District engineering department drew amended plans to reduce costs. On their submission to the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee they were rejected by the advisory design panel.

Last week the regional engineers submitted amended plans providing for a wooden structure in place of the projected steel building.

If funds will allow, the amended style will be adopted, said engineer Norman Howard.

Last week the Trust committee agreed to pass on the new plans to the design panel.

"The plan should be changed," urged Wallace, "and if the people of the island want this project they would have the opportunity of saying so."

"If the plan was badly prepared and does not reflect the island, it should be re-written," agreed the chairman.

Valcourt challenged the chairman to state that nobody else had changed the community plan.

Tom Gossett, of Foxglove Farms, said he welcomed the proposal but not under C1 zoning. It would be too broad, he warned.

Planner Richard McKellar outlined the application of the community plan to the property under discussion and explained his view that it would contravene the plan.

There was a brief encounter between the two retiring trustees.

References to ad hoc-king meant that Kreissl did not want to make a decision, charged Lott. Ad hoc decisions are the complete antithesis of planning, countered Kreissl.

Meeting rejected the submission, with a contrary vote recorded by Lott.

The committee then moved that the new committee review the community plan.

The plan does not appear to establish firm rules on strip development, said Rich, and unless people want to get away from planning they will not support strip development.

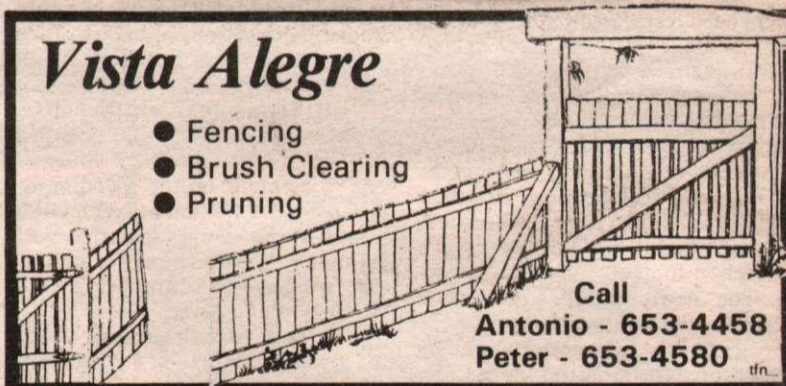
