

Amends made with apology

The motorcycle had no lights, the driver had no licence and the machine was not insured.

Brent Edwin Duke of Salt Spring pleaded guilty in provincial court last week to charges of operating a motorcycle without valid insurance as well as driving without a driver's licence.

RCMP officers from the Ganges detachment were on routine patrol near Mobrae Avenue on January 28 when they noticed a motorcycle without lights. Two people were on the vehicle and when the police stopped to check, one person got off and the motorcycle sped away.

Investigation revealed that Duke was the driver and he apologized to police for leaving the scene.

Judge G.S. Denroche told the young man, a student, that leaving the scene was not the best thing to do but amends had been made with the apology.

"That's a very good thing," said Judge Denroche, "because if you hadn't I would have taken your licence and asked the superintendent of motor vehicles to withhold it for a year. I think that's irresponsible."

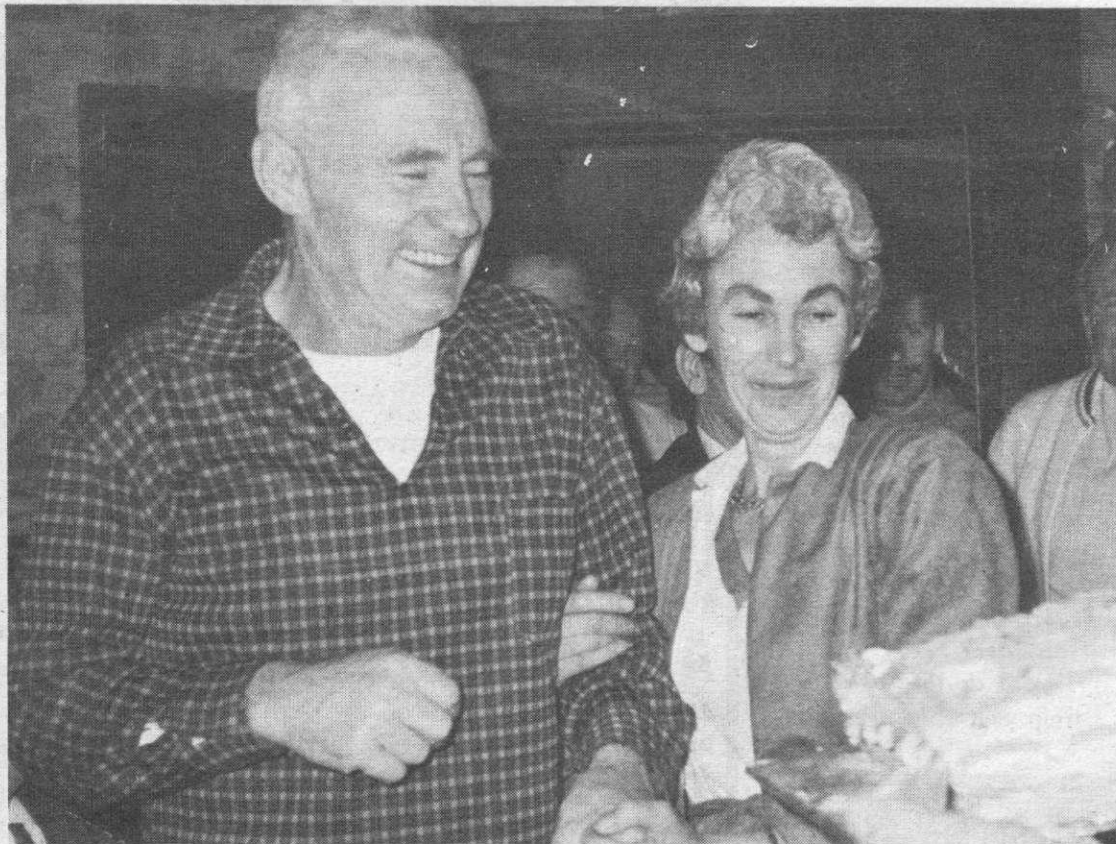

BAN LEGHOLD TRAPS!

Let cabbages grow without any restrictions

A couple of weeks ago Nonie Guthrie wrote to tell of her failures and successes with midget vegetables from Cruikshank's seeds, an experiment she was long tempted to try.

Nonie describes the muskmelon and watermelon a "triumph". Muskmelons were the size of a softball, about six to eight fruit per plant, very sweet, and fully ripened on the vine. Seeds were started indoors, seedlings transplanted in to the open after last frost.

Watermelons were another "triumph". Fruit were the size of a soccer ball, firm yellow flesh, sweet and tasty, not as watery as the pink-fleshed imports, and only about two fruit per plant. Eggplant

and pickling cucumbers were profuse bearers.

HUGE CROP

Green peppers were planted in almost straight mulchy compost and heavily watered. This resulted in a huge crop of prize-winning fruit.

Nonie potted up the best plant and by Christmas she had a pretty display of bright red fruit.

And now to your question of how best to grow broccoli and to avoid tiny spikes. I touched on this briefly in last week's column, and the following applies to all the cabbage family vegetables.

The most important aspect of growing cole-crops is to impose no restrictions whatever on the natural growing process. From seed to maturity all cabbages should have the opportunity to grow without restrictions. This means early transplanting, at the two true-leaf stage from seedbed to six-paks or individual four-inch pot, and transplanting outdoors before crowding occurs in six-pak or pot.

TRANSPLANT WHEN YOUNG

Normally five to six weeks in pots should be the maximum time allowed. Generally, cole crops transplant best when young as transplanting shock does not seem to occur then.

All cole crops are heavy feeders. They need abundant food and water. Feed plants in pots often with dilute fertilizer and keep moist at all times. Outdoors cole crops need well manured soil and ample water.

Root systems are shallow and cultivation should be minimal and careful so as not to disturb roots close to the surface.

Cool and damp fall conditions often result in small heads with the best of culture. Encourage cold resistance by side-dressing plants in fall with wood ashes or potash.

This year I am going to try growing cabbage family plants in white clover. This should provide three benefits to the plants. The clover will crowd out many weeds,

provide available nitrogen to the plants and further provide a moisture retaining ground cover.

SOW EARLY

I will sow the clover early to give it a head start, then clear a six-inch-diameter space for each transplant and apply a thick mulch of seaweed or newspaper or both around each plant. Later on I will let the clover grow in again around the base of each plant.

I will try the same thing with tomatoes. Will let you know how it goes.

Nonie further asked how best to cure onions after harvest. By far the best method I have found is to air-dry them. My preferred method is to store them in freezer baskets on our south-facing porch under the roof overhang for at least one week.

Freezer baskets are basically large wire baskets which allow free

air circulation. Frequent shaking helps to shake off dirt and to re-arrange the onions.

And my favourite long-term storage is braiding, and hanging in a cool dry place with good air circulation. We have kept onions for two years in this manner on our front porch.

Thanks for writing and sharing your knowledge with us Nonie. I am very pleased to hear from any and all our islands gardeners and especially if we can share information which will help to make all of us more successful gardeners.

Causing a disturbance costs island youth \$75

The argument was loud, the language profane and the incident cost \$75.

Andrew Holmes was found guilty of causing a disturbance in a public place and fined \$75 by Judge G.S. Denroche in provincial court last week.

The Salt Spring youth had become embroiled in an argument with Ed Cornell, owner of the recreation centre on McPhillips Avenue in Ganges, last August.

Holmes had questioned Cornell about the reasons for a friend being barred from the centre. When Cornell attempted to explain, Holmes began to shout and swear.

The exchange became heated to the point where Cornell threatened to punch the young man.

Holmes admitted to the incident despite a not-guilty plea but denied using language as foul as Cornell had claimed. The defence attorney introduced several precedents for acquittal on the charge but Judge Denroche did not accept them.

The defence claimed that a disturbance involved more than just emotional upset to which the judge replied that because, as Holmes claimed, Cornell had threatened to punch the young man, a disturbance had taken place.

"A person who owns a business," said Judge Denroche to Holmes, "should not have to put up with this sort of nonsense."

Holmes, 17, is employed as a millwright and was given until March 15 to pay the fine.

Points gained for carrying Pump-out passengers on hood of car truck forgets hose

The young men were on their way to play golf but the RCMP objected to the two who were riding on the hood of the car.

Andrew Rigg challenged the ticket for driving without due care and attention because the addition of six points might mean a loss of licence.

Corporal Peter Eakins of the Colwood detachment of the RCMP was on Salt Spring Island last June in connection with another matter when he noticed the blue Camaro and its outside passengers near the golf course.

The car was not driving at an excessive speed, said Eakins, and the traffic was light at the time. He said that although he couldn't recall the exact positions of the bodies he had been concerned about them blocking the vision of the driver.

Rigg contended that the bodies did not block his vision and that he was driving slowly to prevent

injury. The two young men had jumped on to the hood as a joke and Rigg admitted he should not have allowed them to stay there.

Judge G.S. Denroche expressed satisfaction that the incident had occurred as described by the RCMP officer and that the points would have to be applied to Rigg's driving record. He asked the clerk of the court to recommend that Rigg, a University of British Columbia student, not lose his licence because of the incident.

The tanker had emptied the septic tank at Fernwood School and as it pulled away, the driver had forgotten to unhook the hose.

A child was knocked over, and received a lump on the head when the hose swung around. Injuries were not serious and Ganges RCMP are continuing the investigation of the incident.

Adoption of Trust procedure would simplify region's work

BY FRANK RICHARDS

Although the Capital Regional Board members have, in the past, expressed concern at the time devoted to affairs of the islands, much of the time of board members is taken up with problems of zoning in the western community.

The western community includes those communities lying to the west of Victoria and Esquimalt, Colwood, Langford, View Royal, Sooke and Metchosin. They are all unorganized territory and are considered electoral areas within the Capital Regional District. They are similar to the islands in every respect except that planning and zoning of the western sector are the responsibility of the region, whereas this function is undertaken in the islands by the Islands Trust.

The regional board and its committees devote considerable time to the planning and land use regulation of the western

communities. The Islands Trust devotes considerable time to this function of the islands. There is another great difference.

In the islands a committee of the Trust sits as the administrative body on each island. All applications for zoning, planning, land-use or proposed changes are considered by the committee. On the committee sit the chairman of the Trust and his two vice-chairmen. The three officers are the general trustees, elected to the head of the Trust by their own local trustees. Sitting with the trustees from each island, they undertake all the legislation on land use changes in each island. Only the three general trustees and the two trustees from the island concerned are required to take part in the deliberations.

When the Capital Region looks at an application for land-use changes, the application will go to the committee responsible and then its findings must be approved by the board.

The simpler procedure has been successful in the islands. The minister who is responsible for the procedures of the Islands Trust is also in charge of the regional districts. It would not be a major task to meld the two procedures.

The work of the regional board would be vastly simplified if the region were given the same powers as the Trust.

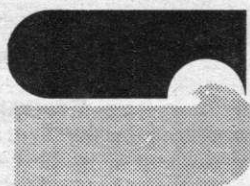

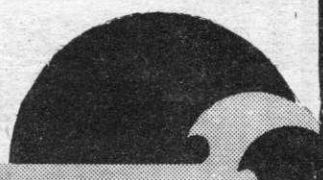

Wes Multsaid here Thursday

"It's a war zone," said Wes Multsaid after he returned to Vancouver in December, having visited the Honduras-El Salvador border.

He was part of an international observation team sponsored by the Inter-Church Committee for Human Rights in Latin America and the National Council of Churches of the United States.

As part of Salt Spring Island's World Development program, Multsaid will be speaking in the elementary school library on Thursday at 7:30 pm.

Since the 1979 coup that placed the present military junta under President Jose Duarte in power in

El Salvador, a bloody civil battle has been waged with an estimated 10,000-18,000 people reported dead or missing.

Refugees from El Salvador have been entering the neighbouring Honduras by the thousands. However, the Salvadoran soldiers conduct frequent raids, seizing refugees and herding them back across the border into El Salvador to be shot.

Two such incursions across the border into the area near La Virtud, Honduras, occurred during Multsaid's recent visit.

POLICY WRONG

Three of Canada's MP's have recently returned from the Salvadoran refugee camps in Honduras — Joseph Reid, Daniel

Heap and Warren Allmand. All of them feel that Canada's policy of supporting the proposed elections in El Salvador, slated for later this year, is wrong.

Quoted in *The Globe and Mail*, January 27, 1982, Reid said that it is "impossible for a person in opposition to stand against the yes-men of the military government of the day." (What this has meant in the past is death to any opposition leader who has dared to make himself known.)

Some direct action that the island's World Development groups could take would be to put pressure on External Affairs Minister Mark MacGuigan, to join with France and Mexico who have already spoken out against

the myth of any free elections taking place in El Salvador under the present circumstances.

CHURCH MINISTER

Wes Multsaid, our visitor this week, has been an Anglican Church minister since 1961. From 1970-73, he was the program and project director of the Christian Council in Belize, Central America. He was the co-ordinator of the B.C. Inter-Church Committee for World Development Education in B.C. from 1974-79 and is presently the co-ordinator of CUSO in B.C.

This meeting is open to the general public. Multsaid will also be able to provide information to anyone interested in CUSO's summer programs.

In keeping with Burns' philosophy and poetry the gathering was international and fraternal.

SERIOUS AND HUMOROUS TOAST

The toast to the immortal memory was proposed by Joe Fleming in an address both serious and humorous, eloquent and inspiring. The universal application and relevance of Burns' poetry was reviewed and illustrated with a liberal sprinkling of appropriate quotations all delivered from memory.

The Scottish atmosphere was supplied by the Cairngorm Dancers from Vancouver who were guests of the club for the weekend. Their performance of Scottish dances was lively and highly entertaining, their obvious enjoyment contagious. After demonstrating their art they induced many of the audience to join them in both Scottish and country dances, and many a long neglected skill was revived to the great pleasure of the participants.

At the close the guests were piped on their way into a "braw, bricht moonlit nicht". The skirl of the pipes fading into the night was a fitting conclusion to an event that everybody who attended hopes will become an annual event.

The interest shown in Scottish dancing has prompted Alistair Ross to consider starting a group to continue this activity. Those who would like to join are asked to let Alistair know by phoning him at 2294.

St. Margaret's

The annual meeting of the congregation of the Church of St. Margaret of Scotland, Gulf Islands parish, was held in the church at 2 pm on Saturday with rector's warden Roy Harding presiding. Twenty-two parishioners attended to hear reports from various committees and the financial statement for 1981.

John Dyer, priest in charge, gave his report for the year, and commended the innovation of having a tenant in the rectory so

that he and his wife had a warm and comfortable place to stay on their fortnightly visit to Galiano.

He hoped that Mrs. Eva Smith, who had given up her tenancy to be married, would be replaced by a similar person. Rev. Dyer commented on the difficulty of ministering to an island congregation from his home in Victoria, but that situation at least made visiting sick parishioners in hospital easier.

BALANCE OF \$6,460

The treasurer's report given by Charlie Morshead showed that in 1981 income exceeded expenditure by over \$2,000, and that the balance in hand at the end of the year was \$6,460. For the small congregation this situation revives the ages-old dilemma of the church. The gospels enjoin Christians to give, to share, to love, to serve. Prudence dictates contingency funds, reserves and a healthy bank balance.

Shay Foster noted that a "hoarding church" was unlikely to grow, and Cliff Coolidge queried the absence in the financial statement of donations to missions. It was left to the parish council to attempt to resolve this conflict of philosophies.

A detailed report of the work of the Altar Guild followed. Since its inception the Thrift Shop has been associated with the Altar Guild, although its primary objective is fund raising. To this end the group operating the shop plans to extend the premises for the benefit of the saleswomen and patrons alike. During 1981 the Thrift Shop revenue exceeded \$3,000.

In a small community or church the tiny core of active workers may have to wear more than one hat. To obviate further confusion between the purposes and function of the Altar Guild and the Thrift Shop, it has been suggested that the Thrift Shop should become a separate organization. Details will be worked out at a parish council meeting.

TO CHARGE \$25

The congregation decided that a charge of \$25 be made for the use of the church for weddings, but that no charge be made for funerals although donations to church funds will be gratefully received. Approval was given for raising the priest's stipend by six percent.

Nature Notes

Dr. Kingscote writes that on many parts of our continent February is the hardest month for many plants and animals. In picture writing, certain Indian tribes depicted this season with the sign of a human skull—a period of starvation and death.

If, however, one looks around there are numerous examples of remarkable adaptations for winter survival. Nature rambles to ponds, swamps and streams reveal the sanctuaries of water-beetles and aquatic larvae of dragon, stone and caddis flies—the latter in their architecturally wonderful dwellings of little sticks or stones. On the pond bottom crustaceans, amphibians and molluscs survive and thrive.

February and March are good months to watch for fairy shrimps. Morgan describes these as being about an inch long, semi-transparent, the green and pinkish tints of their bodies contrasting with the shimmering bronze of their gill-feet as they swim about on their backs.

The gliding movements of these little fresh-water crustaceans are fascinating to watch.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

The Gulf Islands School Board presented proposed 1982 budget figures which showed possible spending of \$262,103. The previous year, the budget had been set at \$229,392 but the trustees spent only \$227,923. Salaries and school expenses accounted for \$152,423, up from \$140,784. Administration costs were set at \$17,065, a rise from \$15,207. The school bus service would account for \$22,711 compared with \$21,287 for the previous year. The largest jump came in repairs and maintenance which went to \$23,185 from \$9,868.

Lt. Col. Des Crofton was elected to the position of president of the Salt Spring branch of the Legion. Crofton replaced John Sturdy who had been head Legionnaire for two years. Others on the next executive included Larry Campbell, first vice-president; Doug Dane, second vice-president; sergeant-at-arms, R.G. Atkins.

The Ganges weather man, H. Carlin, reported a dry January with only 3.23 inches of precipitation including one-half inch of snow. The high temperature was 53 degrees F. while the low stood at 17 degrees F. The previous January, 10.52 inches of wet stuff fell and the thermometer ranged from 58 down to 24.

The play is the thing, said a group of Grade 7 students, and the young actors presented theatre in the school as part of a fund-raising effort. They picked up \$50 as a donation to the B.C. Junior Red Cross. Other money-raising ideas included a fine against members for forgetfulness, a sale and 10 cent per month membership fee in the local club.

A fat lady knelt at the side of the road and a local resident, in a hurry to get to work, nevertheless stopped to offer a helping hand. The lady couldn't get up, she explained. It happened all the time, she said. The man helped her to her feet and drove her to a local hotel where she was staying. But he forgot to ask her name.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Ganges RCMP investigated a series of broken traffic signs on roads in the north end of Salt Spring Island. The police believe the culprits used a vehicle to deliberately knock down the signs and warned that conviction for damage to traffic signs could mean a \$500 fine and six months in jail.

Flowers graced the window of Driftwood office. The blooms and berries had been picked from gardens and roadsides from Vesuvius to Scott Point. The floral display was composed of 45 varieties of blooms and ornamental berries which defied the season to flower.

The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce chose E.L. Ramsey as president for the coming year. Other members of the chamber executive included Tom Portlock,

J.R. Nickerson, Robert Clarkson, A. Temmel, H. van Dack, H.S. Noakes, R. Hill, M.E. Peiler, A. Agar, Ernest Lowe and Frank Richards.

B.C. Tel hooked 107 Gulf Islanders into the telephone network in the past year. The total number of phone connections in the islands stood at 1,601, of which 1,103 were on Salt Spring and 498 scattered around the other islands.

The Fulford Athletic Society, with only six people at a meeting, decided to reschedule the meeting for a later date in anticipation of a better turnout.

The Ganges Incorporation Committee reported to the local Chamber of Commerce that the creation of a village municipality did not necessarily mean the creation of a sewer. Charles Horel, committee chairman, said the various petitions on the proposal were being completed and counted and that village status could mean better financial considerations for Ganges.

Pancake Day races attracted attention in Ganges and when all the furor subsided, the trophy returned to the Gulf Island Secondary School for another year.

Ganges wharf was being rebuilt although on a reduced scale. Protest from local groups averted federal plans to dismantle the structure in favour of repairs.

TEN YEARS AGO

The recreation referendum passed, decreed the municipal affairs ministry officials. Ballots were incorrectly counted in the election. Rejected ballots, 42 in all, should not have been considered when the percentage was determined, said the officials. Election ballot counting came to 637 for spending one-tenth of a mill for recreation and 405 against. With the rejected ballots the percentage stood at 58.76 but ministry calculations set the percentage at 61.132 which was higher than the required 60% needed to pass the money vote.

Salt Spring Island Cubs collected bottles for funds. They stored the potential cash at a local store. Someone took 45 dozen bottles and the Cubs were out about \$10.

Yvette Valcourt denied being part of the Citizen's Group on Planning which burned copies of *Gulf Islands Options* in front of Valcourt Building Supplies. She said she was there but was speaking only for herself and not as part of an organized group.

Residents of Salt Spring Island were warned to watch for a cougar which was reportedly on the island. A sheep had been attacked and killed on a Beddis Road farm and signs indicated a cougar had done it.

The Salt Spring Lions Club added an ambulance to the island fleet bringing to three the number of ambulances serving the area.

However, one of the vehicles will soon be retired after 10 years of service at the hospital.

The Gulf Islands Secondary School senior girls, undefeated in regular league play, lost two basketball games at a tourney in Belmont. The girls did manage to win a game in the invitational event.

FIVE YEARS AGO

Dogs attacked eight lambs on a Beaver Point Road farm. Two were killed, one with a broken neck and the other by being torn apart, and the remaining six suffered neck injuries. Damage to the neck prevents the lambs from feeding and if left alive they will starve. Every sheep farmer on the island reported losses to flocks and nothing seemed to be able to stop the onslaught of roaming dogs.

Gulf Islands School District paid \$294,000 to support education in other provincial school districts and the figure was expected to increase by at least one-third for the coming year.

The author, of the play *The Moon Is Made Of Green Cheese*, Joan Raeside, had to cancel plans for presentation of the opus. Not enough people auditioned for parts to allow the play to go into production. Raeside decided to set the effort aside for the time being.

The Pender Island Community hall group met to discuss the proposal for a community activity centre in the new school. In addition to the money collected from residents over the years, the province would be granting \$30,000 towards the projects.

Plans were announced for the construction of a tourist information booth in the vicinity of Centennial Park on Salt Spring. Cost would be approximately \$800 for material with volunteer labour thrown in. The booth would be in operation during the summer months.

The restrictions on residents cards had been beaten by several islanders who are landed immigrants. An interpretation of provincial statutes limited the residents' cards to electors only. The non-electors had applied for and been granted the card before the ruling had been made.

Driftwood editor sought contributions to a proposed regular feature, riming ray. The spot, limericks, had been suggested by Ray Newman. He and the editor traded bon mots in an effort to "encourage local creativity in this fun-time activity."

per mill, the general levy assessed to rural areas of 10 mills will bring in more money this year than last.

Other agencies which will have to adjust their rates to accommodate the increase in assessment value include the Islands Trust and the hospital board.

Finance Minister Hugh Curtis recently announced increases in the value basis for each class of property in rural areas of British Columbia.

The assessments are determined on actual value of property as of July 1, 1981. Each year, the ministry of finance sets a percentage of the actual value for tax purposes.

DOWN TO 10%

Residential property will be taxed on 10% of value, down from 11% from last year.

Business will be taxed at 35% of value, an increase from 24.5 in 1981. Industries' taxes increase as well, going to 40% from 28.6%.

The basis for taxes on utilities drops to 28% from 30% of value while machinery and equipment will be taxed on 34% value compared to 25% a year ago.

Forestry property has been reduced to 24.5% from 30%. Tree farms, however, face taxes on 80% value, up from 60%.

Seasonal resorts, recreational and fraternal organizations must pay on 10%, down from 11% of value in 1981. Farms are taxed at 10%, no change.

The assessment appeals will back up the computing of taxes for this year. Seasoned adjudicators at the appeal courts figure at least 20 minutes is spent on each appeal.

TAKE NINE WEEKS?

That time, given that the courts sit six hours per day, five days per week, would see the end of the appeals for Salt Spring and Galiano some nine weeks after the appeals began. The courts should be finished the business sometime near the beginning of April.

For the courts hearing appeals from the Outer Islands, the cases will linger until the middle of March or six weeks after commencement.

Taxation notices should be in ratepayers' hands by June 15. Penalties for late payment begin accruing on July 2 this year, not at the end of that month as in 1981. More penalties are added on after October 31.

Collection of taxes falls to the purview of the surveyor of taxes who adds a five per cent collection fee to the rates set by the various governing bodies.

A ministry of education official said the basic levy of 41.5 mills, set as an estimate last fall, will be reviewed when the final assessment totals are known. The levy could be lowered and the ministry costs of the basic education program increased.

A combined investigation by Ganges detachment RCMP and a special investigation unit from Victoria resulted in charges of having sexual intercourse with a female under 14 years as well as performing an act of gross indecency.

William Thomas Barry Jones, 53, faces the charges as a result of his association with a 12-year-old Salt Spring girl.
