Parents want Grade 7

A survey conducted at Fernwood School recently has shown that 20 out of 20 parents of Grade 6 students would prefer to see their children attend Grade 7 at Fernwood, rather than Salt Spring Elementary.

Fernwood principal Glenn Woodley passed along that information to trustees at last week's school board meeting, when he spoke on the board's announced intention to put off expansion of the school for another two years.

Grade 7 students in the Fernwood area have been attending the Ganges school since September in order to relieve crowding at Fernwood.

"The children find themselves out of place going to Grade 7 at Salt Spring Elementary," Woodley noted.

They have less opportunity for participation in extra-curricular activities, he explained.

The school, he said, could live with the current situation for

another year, but beyond that no extra classroom space would prove detrimental. He mentioned that a portable classroom might provide a temporary solution.

Fire at Fulford Inn Saturday

The fire was in the fat at Fulford Inn Saturday and the Salt Spring volunteer fire-fighters chipped in to stop the flames.

The fire began in the deep-fat fryer in the kitchen of the inn and smoke set off alarms. Guests and visitors were evacuated and the island fire crew arrived to sort out the damage.

The fire and smoke cost up to \$5,000 in estimated damage to the kitchen and the fryer. No one was injured in the incident.

Director refunded cost of making 4,135 copies

The charges for the use of a copy machine were reviewed and the finance department of the Capital Regional District decided to refund Salt Spring director Yvette Valcourt for \$343.82.

The copies, 4,135 of them, were made at the building inspection office in Ganges last June. When asked by *Driftwood* what the copies were of, Valcourt would say only that it was information for the whole island. She would not comment any further.

The CRD finance department received a written request to charge Valcourt for \$499.86 for the work done. The invoice was prepared on the unit cost per copy as well as charges for the actual amount of paper used.

Valcourt paid the amount in full on October 9, 1981.

In the interim, she became convinced that the charge should not have been made at all. The copies were prepared for her constituents, she claimed, and

those same constituents paid for the copy machine through taxes.

The machine also had unused capacity each month even though the building inspection office had to pay a set amount for the use of the machine.

The report from the finance committee to the full CRD board noted "The proposed regulations and procedures for Director's expense claims state that out-of-pocket expenses incurred within the boundaries of the municipality or electoral area in which elected are to be paid by the Director from the one-third of the annual indemnity designated as a non-taxable allowance for expenses incurred, which are incidental to the discharge of duties as an elected official."

When the finance department reviewed the invoice, a modification was recommended to exclude any portion of the monthly rent on the machine.

The final charge was \$156.04.

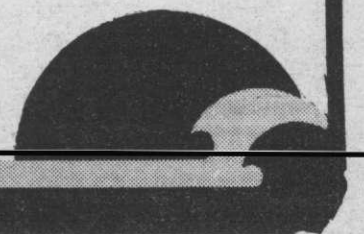

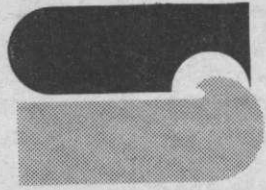

Board criticized for 'rushing' into cuts

Paring \$200,000 from the school budget this year is likely to create the attitude that the money wasn't needed in the budget in the first place.

That's what Gulf Islands Teachers' Association president Mike Hayes told the local school board last week when he criticized the board for rushing into cutting the budget as a result of spending guidelines announced by Premier Bill Bennett.

Hayes pointed out that trimming the budget could result in the attitude that "you've been carrying fat in this district. You may be laying the groundwork for a hole into which education will slide."

"We're not rushing into anything," countered board chairman Strick Aust, who added that trustees wanted to be prepared

should the guidelines be legislated into effect.

The board has requested the staff budget committee to recommend how the \$200,000 cut could be effected.

Aust said the board didn't want to see requisitions come in for items which later may have to be removed from the budget.

There was no response from trustees when Hayes concluded by asking to what extent the board was willing to fight the ministry of education to retain existing educational programs.

Galiano Nature Notes

from Dr. Tony Kingscote
February's closing week has been a rewarding one for a warmly clad and well shod naturalist. The most spectacular sight in our swampy forest glades is the golden blooms of arum lilies — a much more appropriate name than

skunk cabbage for such magnificent flowers.

Their leaves, which will soon uncurl, are the largest of any Canadian plant. In clearings alongside the road stinging nettles are several inches tall and just at the stage when they can be picked for soups, purees and tasty boiled greens.

Curly dock and miners' lettuce, like nettles, are rich in minerals and vitamins and freely available now. Nettles in bygone times were used by native citizens to make cord for fishlines and weaving, which accounts for an abundance of these plants on the sites of old villages.

Near the entrance to Montague Park will be found pussy willows in bloom, and the tall Oregon grape, with their holly-like leaves, are covered in yellow flowers. Indian children love to eat the flowers as well as the fruit of this plant.

It is interesting how many of our early blossoms, both cultivated and wild, are yellow. Botanists suggest that blossoms of this colour require the least number of light hours to come into bloom.

Danyluk to leave Pender

Pender Island RCMP Corp. Harry Danyluk is being transferred to Regina, Sask.

Danyluk, who has been at Pender for a number of years, will be in charge of the physical training unit at his new post.

This spring will see the Pender detachment increased to three permanent officers. During the summer one officer will spend three months on Mayne Island.

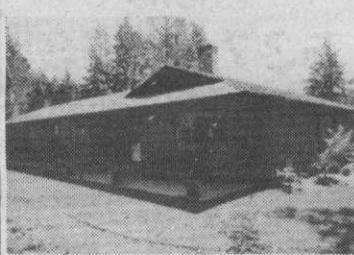

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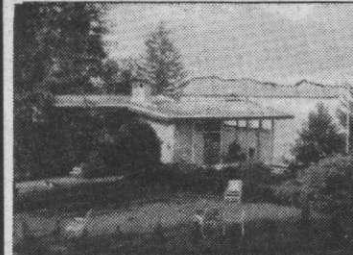

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Right to vote, stand for office:**They have immunity from notwithstanding disease**

Last of four parts

A peculiarity of the bill currently being debated by the Mother of Parliaments is that it is only four sections long and contains two schedules.

The request for legislation by the British Parliament is in English while the French version of the same request forms Schedule A. The Constitution Act, 1981, both language versions, forms Schedule B.

That Act contains its own Schedule I. It also contains two additions to be tacked on to the British North America Act, 1867: a new section 92A as well as "The Sixth Schedule".

But confusion continues as Schedule I of the Constitution Act, 1981, calls for changes to the names of the British North America Act, 1867 and all amendments up to the second one of 1975. Hereafter all that legislation shall be known as the Constitution Acts, 1867 to 1975(2) and combined with the new schedule B can be cited as the Constitution Acts, 1867 to 1981.

IT'S SO SIMPLE

Sounds so simple doesn't it? Parliament in Ottawa requests the Queen in London to request her Parliament for action on several points, one of which is endorsement of Schedule B and approval that Schedule A, the French version, has equal force.

Another request is actually a polite statement of what the British Parliament can do with its future legislation after the Constitution Act is approved, at least as far as Canada is concerned.

Finally, the name of the request shall be the Canada Act.

Schedule I of the Constitution Act which is Schedule B of the Canada Act contains changes to the BNA Act as ordered by Ottawa. The ploy is similar to Bill Number 1 brought forward after the speech from the throne opens a new session of Parliament.

That bill, usually having to do with oaths of offices, comes first to remind the Crown that Parliament is an independent body.

SIGNIFY INDEPENDENCE

The amendments to the BNA Act stated in Schedule I repeal several sections of the 1867 Act and signify the independence of Canada's Parliament. The changes deal with Section 20 as well as Class I of Sections 91 and 92.

THE CONSTITUTION

Section 20 covers the necessity of Parliament to sit at least once each year.

Class I of Section 91 deals with the amending authority of Parliament over various facets of how we are governed and includes the stipulation that no Parliament last longer than five years except "in times of real or apprehended war, invasion or insurrection." Control of language rights, Quebec's Bill 101 notwithstanding, also lies with the federal government, according to the section.

Class I of Section 92 allows the provincial legislatures the right to amend provincial constitutions except for the functions of the lieutenant-governors.

While these sections are repealed, they are also neatly covered by various sections of Schedule B or the Constitution Act, 1981.

STUMBLING BLOCK

Added to the BNA Act, 1867 is Section 92A, a contentious issue which has been the stumbling block to agreement for these long years of argument.

It deals with non-renewable resources (read oil and natural gas), forestry resources (consider the two largest forestry products producers, British Columbia and Quebec) and electrical energy (consider the three largest exporters of hydro power, B.C., Ontario and Quebec).

Translate the brackets, added by *Driftwood*, to read *big bucks*.

"Primary production from non-renewable natural resources and forestry resources" is defined by the addition to the BNA Act of "The Sixth Schedule".

Section 92A defines what each legislature can do in relation to resources, in that province. The interpretation apparently, given the problems of Newfoundland and B.C., doesn't allow a province much room for control of offshore areas.

The legislatures can legislate exploration, development, conservation, management and primary production of non-renewable, forestry and hydro resources.

PRICES MUST MATCH

The legislatures can legislate the

export of those resources so long as the price outside the province matches the price inside the province.

But here lies another although hidden notwithstanding. Federal word is paramount in any disagreement between Ottawa and a province: "...where such a law of Parliament and a law of a province conflict, the law of Parliament prevails to the extent of the conflict."

Ottawa may seem to have given away the store but it keeps the keys and controls the locks.

Another part of Section 92A allows the legislatures the power to impose hidden taxes on natural resources. Hidden taxes have, up until now, been limited to the federal folks through excise tax and such. Now the provinces can join the game but must keep the tax the same for resources going out of the province as for those which stay home.

But whichever level taxes the people, and despite the inclusion of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, this constitution aids governments more than people of whatever sex or ethnic origin.

CAN TINKER WITH THEM

We may have been given fundamental freedoms as well as mobility, legal, equality and language rights, but any government willing to say notwithstanding can tinker away at those rights at any time.

The Act specifies, mostly, rules by which governments will conduct conflict with each other.

When the men gathered to arrange the confederation of British North America, the federal government was seen to be a strong entity which would apply a unifying influence on the very different parts of the country.

The federal government was meant to be strong but not overpowering.

The balance of power, however, has shifted to the provinces through various court interpretations of sections 91 and 92 which outline the jurisdictions of each level of government.

But with the Constitution Act, 1981, the balance would seem to be swinging back to the federal

government by such influences as the primacy of federal law in natural resources.

ANOTHER EDGE

Section 36 hands Ottawa another edge. That section reiterates the search by both levels of government for equal opportunities for Canadians.

The second paragraph of that section tells the tale by restating the principle of equalization payments to bring a balance to poorer provinces. The phrases which should concern the provinces read: "...to ensure that provincial governments have sufficient revenues to provide

reasonably comparable levels of public services," and then the axe falls, "at reasonably comparable levels of taxation."

What Ottawa is saying is that money will continue to flow to the provinces but not quite to the extent as in the past. If any province wants more, it will have to levy the taxes itself which would allow the taxpayer the honour of paying more for the same level of services.

Power, privileges and guarantees form nice rhetoric but when the wind subsides, this document for government does allow citizens the unchallenged right to vote or stand for public office.

This sound and fury does signify something for Canadians which doesn't suffer the notwithstanding disease.

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Children's concert raises \$146

The Save the Children Fund is \$146 richer following a concert presented by children on Salt Spring Island two weeks ago.

Concert organizer and Save the Children Fund representative Jean Knight reports that contributions to the fund over the past year total \$833.19.

In addition to the sum raised by the Children Helping Children Concert, \$442.81 was raised through Christmas cards and \$244.38 was deposited in collection cans on the island.

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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

TWENTY YEARS AGO

The Salt Spring Island Recreation Commission annual meeting elected five members to serve on the board. The commission, a creation of the provincial department of education, was able through monthly provincial grants to fund various sports and recreation groups on the island.

A Driftwood reader compared worry to a rocking chair. Both keep you busy but don't get you anywhere.

A front-page editorial questioned the propriety of B.C. Hydro storing long hydro poles along Rainbow Road. Apparently the electric company had permission from the department of highways and despite the fact the pile of poles came to the edge of the road, the only precaution was a no parking sign.

A Salt Spring Island family missed the most important part of the television program on a space orbit. Just as splash-down approached, the television set burned out.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

The minister of education refused permission for the Gulf Islands School Board to again present an expansion bylaw for public approval. The bylaw had been defeated by only a seven per cent margin in the December election and school board officials asked the minister for exemption from the requirement that a three-month waiting period must be observed before the question could be repeated.

The killing of sheep on Salt Spring Island continued with three rams, a ewe and two lambs found dead on North Salt Spring. RCMP officers investigating the killings could not say if a cougar or roving dogs were involved but warned dog owners that all dogs must be licensed and controlled.

The Galiano Chamber of Commerce had a busy year, attendees at the annual meeting were told. The do-it-themselves power line project to North Galiano had been completed. A community first aid fund had been set up. Social events such as a fiesta complemented the routine of business of the council. The chamber filled three seats by acclamation. A new president would be chosen from among the executive at a later meeting.

The North Salt Spring hockey team in the A division of the intermediate league was beaten twice over the weekend. In the first game, the team bowed 13-10 to Ganges and were on the short end of a 12-1 score against the Fulford team.

Thomas Mouat was born in a small village in the Shetland Islands. There were only two houses in the town when he was born. His daughter, working as a receptionist for a Comox doctor, was obtaining particulars about an elderly patient. He was born in the other house of the small village.

Roller skating at Fulford Hall was cancelled to accommodate the Lions Club bingo.

The Mayne Island Improvement District held an annual meeting to select a trustee to fill a seat on the board. The only nominee won the position by acclamation.

TEN YEARS AGO

Winds of up to 95 miles per hour struck the Gulf Islands, leaving a swath of damage and injury behind. B.C. Hydro estimated at least one week of work by crews would be required to repair downed power lines and broken poles. The high winds also knocked over many trees and disrupted ferry service in the islands.

A Salt Spring property owner became upset when an invitation to speak to the Capital Regional Board concerning a rezoning application came after a decision by the CRD to reject it. The islander wanted to create a tourist resort and park on property near St. Mary Lake. The CRD had met in committee and had rejected the application. The islander had not been invited to the meetings. The Salt Spring director said the application had been considered by five different committees and commissions and had been rejected by each of them.

McMillan Bloedel announced plans to sell large tracts of its holdings in the Gulf Islands. The previous year the company, which owns thousands of acres in the Gulf Islands, had denied plans to sell parcels.

The Salt Spring Advisory Planning Commission considered applications for rezoning on the island before the plans are submitted to the regional board. Two new members were chosen to the four-member commission. Three are chosen from the public and the fourth member is the regional director for Salt Spring.

Cliff Hatch was selected as president of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce. Frank Richards became the past-president of the business organization for the island.

The executive of the Galiano Club, formerly the Galiano Chamber of Commerce, was given another one-year term at a meeting of the organization.

FIVE YEARS AGO

The Islands Trust was granted the function of overseeing

planning, zoning and subdivision approvals for the Gulf Islands. The amendment to the Islands Trust Act transferred the development control from seven regional districts under which the various islands fall. The changes reduced the number of approvals needed for changes from three, the regional districts, the Trust and the minister of municipal affairs, to two, the Trust and the minister.

Land for the new school at the north end of Salt Spring Island was released from the agricultural land reserve, the school board learned. Plans for the new school had been on hold until a decision on the land was being made. The B.C. Land Commission restricted use to a school only.

The Ganges school sites are not a health hazard, said school board chairman Charles Baltzer. The health inspector checked the discharge from the school disposal system regularly, he told a board meeting. The problem was a community one, not a school challenge, he said.

Black ice

The section of Fulford-Ganges Road running through Hundred Hills on Salt Spring can be dangerous in the early morning when black ice forms.

Patricia Duke of Ganges hit a patch of the black ice on February 27 and the Maverick she was driving ended up in the ditch. Duke suffered minor injuries and the auto was damaged to the extent of \$1,000.

Driver hospitalized

The car hit a dip caused by a driveway adjoining Porlier Pass Road on Galiano Island and the driver ended up in hospital.

Roy Treloar of Morgan Road on Galiano was driving his auto when it hit the dip. The vehicle turned over, slid down a bank and came to rest against a tree.

The man was taken to Lady Minto Hospital and then transferred to Victoria suffering from broken bones in his wrist, ankle and neck.

The accident occurred on February 26.

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District is in good shape, meeting told

The new Fulford fire hall will soon be open, the annual meeting of the Salt Spring Island fire protection district was told. The meeting was called to hear

financial reports for the past year as well as to elect two board members. Frank Richards was re-elected as a director and Bob Patterson, of Fulford, was elected

to fill the vacancy caused by the death last year of Roy Lee.

Both terms will be for three years and the pair join Dennis Andrews, Ken Stevens and RCMP Const. Ace Mainwaring on the board of directors.

Secretary-treasurer Spencer Marr told the meeting that almost \$82,000 was spent last year on fire protection on Salt Spring. With various other costs of administration added, the account showed a deficit of \$13,633.

Despite the deficit, the fire protection district is in good financial shape, said Marr, with at least \$66,000 or more in the surplus account.

Part of the costs for the district include a yearly repayment of \$8,318.49, principal and interest, towards a loan of \$27,500 for a new truck. The loan will be repaid by 1985.

Another loan of \$50,000 with interest of 15% was obtained to pay for the new Fulford hall. That loan will be repaid by 2001.

The insurance coverage for the volunteer firefighters has been increased to \$20,000 and covers them whenever they are called to

duty. The insurance covers both death and injury.

The board of directors is considering the purchase of an emergency vehicle to supplement the fleet currently serving the island. The new fire hall should increase efficiency in meeting any fire at the south end of Salt Spring.

The fire fighters also depend upon storage tanks at Beaver and Isabella Points, at Fernwood as well as Sunset Drive in the Vesuvius area.

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Price of water going up

The price of water is going up in the North Salt Spring Waterworks District.

But despite the increase, said district spokesman Mike Larmour, "water delivered at less than \$1 a ton still represents a bargain."

The district is continuing the process of upgrading the water delivery system and cost of material, labour and financing will mean higher rates for tolls, taxes and connection fees this year, said Larmour.

The waterworks district faces several problems such as relatively few connections per mile as well as the necessity of using pumps, tanks and pressure regulators to overcome the hilly terrain.

A major improvement program began in 1977 and, coupled with the general repairs and maintenance, has only partially been completed. The work has also meant the need for additional staff.

The waterworks district runs 4,200 feet of 12-inch pipe, 12,000 feet of 10-inch pipe and 12,000 feet of eight-inch pipe. It also has three storage tanks capable of holding 56,000 gallons of water.

The problem, said Larmour, can be seen in the fact that the cost for eight-inch pipe has doubled in the past five years.
