

June 24 opening date for Salt Spring museum

Members of the Farmers' Institute on Salt Spring Island have set June 24 as the opening date for the Bittancourt Heritage House Museum on Rainbow Road. The date has caused a stir at the museum and members involved are working overtime in order to organize the showcases and arrange the items received by the institute from both local and off-island donors.

Members of the institute active in restoring the old Bittancourt home hope to provide a 19th century replica of a bedroom and to offer a general display of old machinery and furniture used during pioneer days. Included among items donated are an old wringer-washer, circa 1920, and an old 1898 Oliver typewriter.

There are three main rooms in the museum and one will be used expressly for a bedroom display. Items included in the display will be a studio couch with a horse-hair mattress made at the turn of the century. Donor Ruby Alton once slept on the couch. It resembles a contemporary roll-away bed but contains a more intricate metal netting.

A hat box, once containing a silk hat, was donated by Mrs. Ethel Palmer who also donated a large bedspread made by the late Willy Palmer's grandmother. The bedspread is decorated with a centre-piece peacock that has been completely hand-stitched. Also donated by Palmer is a Limoges boudoir china-set that had belonged to the late Willy Palmer's mother. She had been a housekeeper to Henry Bullock.

A wedding dress worn by Les Mollet's grandmother on her wedding day in the 1860's has been given to the museum for display by Les Mollet. The dress sports a tiny waist and the fabric is delicate and silky.

Betty Galt of Ganges has given the museum a 1905 edition of J.R. Miller's *The Wedded Life* that contains personal congratulations

brass and china lamp is in perfect condition and will be on display at the museum in June.

to a newly married couple of 1907. Four large display cases were donated to the institute in 1977 by Mouat's Store of Ganges. The oak display cases will contain such items as the old fall fair programs of 1907, donated by Marg Croft of Ganges.

The programs are entitled *The Islands Agricultural and Fruit Growers' Association* and the association encompassed Salt Spring, Thetis, Kuper, Galiano, Mayne, Pender, Saturna, Moreby

and Prevost Islands. Salt Spring Island-grown apples won the Royal Horticultural Society medal at the Royal Hort Show held in London in 1909. The medal was recently donated by Mrs. P.G. James of Vesuvius. A lamp, in perfect condition, was donated to the museum by Joan Hayward of Ganges. The coal-oil lamp was used by her family 70 years ago in Kelowna.

Although the museum has

received a variety of artifacts of both Salt Spring Island and Gulf Islands history, the institute members are seeking more in order that the museum may be well enough equipped to provide the visitor with a walk through island history.

"We need much more furniture and bedroom displays," explained Frances Eide, museum organizer.

A wide variety of machinery is included in the outdoor display. Organizing the machinery display is Russ Lucas who spends most of his

spare time rebuilding old motors and corresponding with manufacturers for parts.

Last year Lucas rebuilt a 1929 Fairbanks. The oldest piece of equipment that will be displayed at the museum is Lucas' 1916 Fairbanks Morse stationary engine.

The committee invites islanders to help with its research of island history or to part with antiques or family memorabilia.

"We also need members to supervise the museum during the summer months," Eide said.

True north strong and free supports Mika

Although the province-wide election results surprised many of the pundits, the voting pattern on Galiano remained true to form. As could be predicted from signs and attendance at meetings, Hugh Curtis secured more votes than his four opponents but only out-poll his NDP rival by 20-odd votes.

Of the three polls on Galiano, only the true north strong and free gave a plurality to John Mika.

Thursday evening parties arranged by NDP adherents to celebrate victory turned into wakes when the provincial results began to come in. Social Credit supporters went as far as Victoria to express their jubilation and relief in the form of a large cake bearing the iced message, "We did it".

As the tumult and the shouting dies we can relinquish for another four years our illusion that the politicians run the province.

Galiano Island for \$69

Tee Pee Tours are advertising a two-day vacation on Galiano for \$69. The description includes the information that "for cyclists the roads are not crowded; we will show you how to dig clams, pick oysters, catch crab and fish the teeming waters."

The holiday-maker must pay his way to Sturdies Bay so that for \$69 he gets four meals, overnight accommodation in a teepee (bring your own sleeping bag), transport on the island and the services of a tour guide.

Tee Pee, a division of Wayward Tours Ltd., is also looking for a marketing representative and an area tour operator who would have to invest \$15,000 in a franchise.

Earnings from a seven-day tour of 40 cyclists paying \$299 each show \$3,100 going to direct tour expenses, \$3,588 to marketing, \$418 to head office and to the operator as profit on his investment, \$4,943. In percentage terms 26% of the vacationer's fee is spent directly on the tour, 30% goes to the marketer, five percent to head office and 41% to the operator.

The benefits to island residents are minimal; possibly casual tour guide work at \$100 a day and perhaps a little business for local resort operators and food outlets, inadequate compensation for further depredations on the diminishing supply of oysters, clams and crabs, and increased traffic on our supposedly uncrowded roads.

Fire permits

The volunteer fire departments remind residents and property owners that the fire season is upon us. No outdoor fires are permitted without a permit which will specify the conditions under which the burn may take place.

The Forest Act states that the cost of suppressing a fire may be charged to the owner on whose property the fire starts. Should the fire spread to forest land the levy could run into thousands of dollars.

Permits are issued by fire chiefs

who should not be called on the emergency number, 539-2122, but on their home phones.

Progressive bridge

Jean Beatty, who recently exhibited in Vancouver, has reserved a large selection of new paintings for island viewers. Through the eyes of this North Galiano painter we see the flowers, trees and butterflies of our familiar landscape imbued with a magic and mystical beauty.

Marie-Claire's daughter Dominique will show woven fashion tops. Dominique, who has been many times to India, learned from the women there how to make rugs in the Tibetan style, which whetted her appetite for weaving and led her to create fashion garments in silk, cotton and wool.

Tona von Rezori came to live on Galiano a year ago from Greece where she and her sculptor husband still have a home to which they occasionally return. In Greece Tona

began to embroider with gold thread and beads. Through working with beaded bags she saw the possibility of leather as a fashion material.

From imported washable suede leather she now designs and makes tops, pants, skirts, scarves and cushions using colour-contrast and reversing the fabric, applique or punched holes to re-iterate the unique geometric and swirling line of her designs.

Highlight of the exhibition will be a fashion show on Sunday morning at 11 am, at which Dominique and Tona will describe and model their own creations.

Meanwhile at the school the annual fair, in aid of extra-curricular education, will this year take the form of a Country Hoe-down, to which all islanders and their guests are invited to attend in cowboy costume.

The show will open at 11 am on Saturday, May 21, with a Grand Horse Parade by Anny Bobak's Maple Stirrup Riding School.

Frog control

In Exodus, Chapter 8, is described how Egypt was afflicted with a plague of frogs. Although frog population explosions have been recorded from time to time, it is surprising they have not been more frequent considering the fecundity of the female frog.

The spring chorus of mating frogs can drown out any other night sound and seems to suggest a large

population of the amphibians in local ponds.

Predators of course reduce the frog and tadpole numbers, but a recent scientific discovery shows that tadpoles have a built-in chemical population control system using a pheromone.

A pheromone is defined as a substance secreted externally by certain animal species to affect behaviour or development of other members of the species. In a hive a pheromone determines the development of worker bees instead of queens.

As winter rain-fed ponds begin to dry up in spring, tadpoles are faced with diminishing supplies of water, oxygen and food. When the first few tadpoles reach a certain size, they produce a pheromone which inhibits the activity and growth of smaller tadpoles, leaving the few to develop to the metamorphic stage and become adult frogs.

When Moses and Aaron were plaguing Egypt to obtain the release of the people of Israel, were they able to induce a pheromone failure? The human species has had made available to it by the cosmetics industry a whole battery of synthetic pheromones whose effect, unfortunately, is the reverse of the one used by tadpoles.

The tee-off time is 6 pm, and to

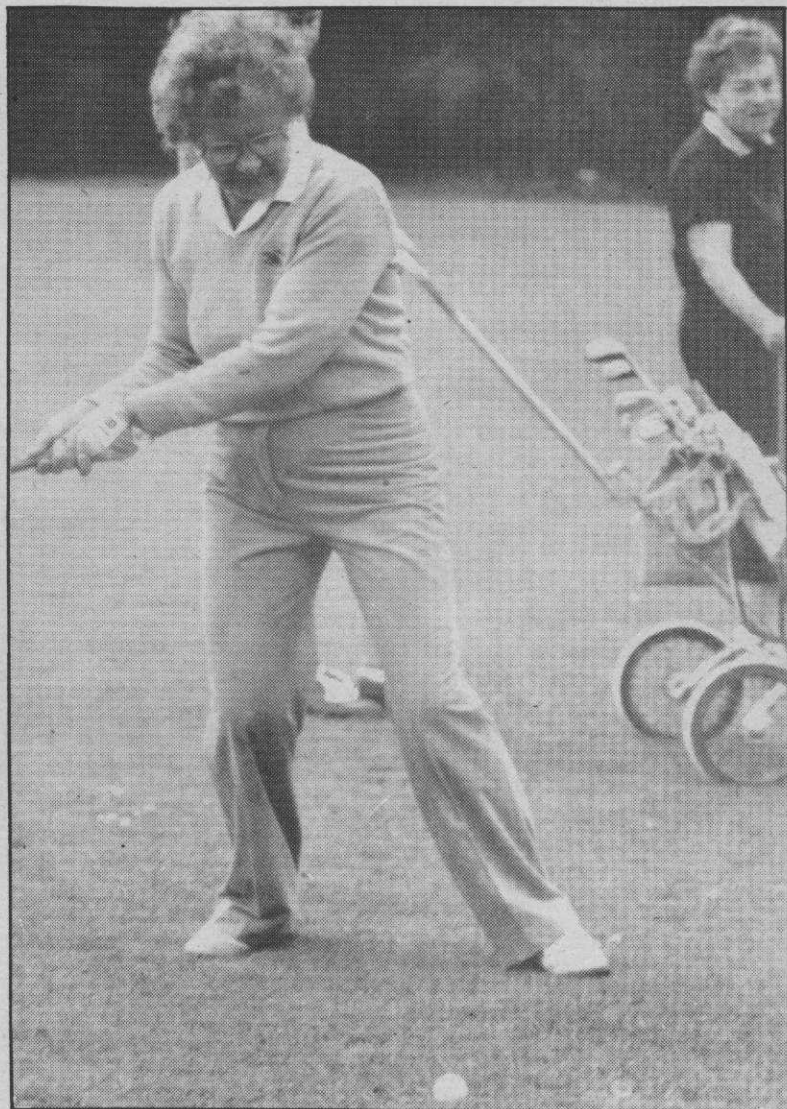
get out on the golf course on a fine spring evening just makes you so glad to be alive.

The Capital Regional District tax requisition for the Outer Gulf Islands has been set at \$185,048 for this year.

The tax requirement shows a \$43,970 increase, 31.2 percent over the \$141,078 taken from islanders last year. The largest increase comes in the costs of elections and the introduction this year of payments for building inspections.

Last year inspections were covered by housing start grants from the provincial government. The grants are being used this year for the purchase of property to house the building inspector's office.

Gulf Islanders are also being charged with part of the costs of

septic disposal in the CRD. The service, not used by islanders, benefits other areas of the CRD. The letters patent for the service are being adjusted to equalize the costs of the service with the use of it. In 1984, the Gulf Islands, both Salt Spring and the Outer Islands, will be exempt from that cost.

The Outer Island taxpayers are exempted from paying for land banking and housing as well as the feasibility study reserve this year.

The assessment base in the Outer Gulf Islands has been set at \$41,130,140 for 1983, down from the \$46,358,795 assessed value for 1982. Islanders on various islands also will face tax bills for special services for those islands.

You'll go home when you get your wings, he wrote

It is nearly 40 years since the death of Sgt. A.W.F. Fear of the Royal Air Force.

Like the thousands of airmen who died during recent wars, he "will not grow old." He was a young man on that September day in 1943. He was a young man bursting with pride at having gained his wings. Already he was eager to get home to Blighty to demonstrate his new rank and his new brevet and his new status. He had graduated and he wanted to share the triumph.

His death might have gone unnoticed had he not been addicted to the pen. For a thousand who gained their wings there was probably only one, perhaps two, who were eager to translate this new joy into words.

Fear remembered Lewis Carroll and wrote a parody of the *Walrus and the Carpenter*, entitled *You'll Go Home When You Get Your Wings*.

The parody appeared in the *Patrician*, station magazine of the Royal Air Force unit at Patricia Bay Airport, No. 32 Operational Training Unit.

In the summer of 1943 his last literary accomplishment was published and he had not only become a fighting airman, but he had offered a satirical expression of thanks for the prospect of going home. He never went.

Coming in to land *Hampden No. AN 146*, Fear lost his life when the plane spun out of control and crashed on its final approach. It burnt out at the airfield.

Sgt. Fear had no direct link with Salt Spring Island. He knew the island. He knew it well, as every pilot knew it who flew in and out of

Patricia Bay.

Here is Fear's verse, translating the Walrus on the beach into the newly-qualified pilot ready and eager to take off and get into battle:

"The time has come," the Groupy said,
"To think of other things,
Of cockpit checks and faster kites,
To fly with brand new wings."

And so we left our service schools,
Out hearts and heads were high,
For we were really pilots now,
And we could truly fly.

Nine weeks we dwelt on distant Isle,
Where spuds and girls abound,
The spuds were good, as were the girls,
Too good for us we found.

"The time has come," the woof-

woof said,
"To think of other things,
Of grass that's free and kites that fly,
And chiefy's crown and rings."

And so we left that lovely Isle,
Its maids still sweet and pure,
For though we did our level best,
Those girls were much too sure.

"The time has come," the mountains said,
"To think of other things.
The man who can't fly now, will match
A halo with his wings."

The time's not come for our next trip,
We sit around, we gloat,
Believing fondly it will be
Aboard a "blighty" boat.

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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

A Salt Spring Island resident was injured when a jet enroute to Edmonton flew through turbulent air and dropped 800 feet. Charles Marcotte was one of 25 people injured when the airplane dropped suddenly in the stormy air.

Repairs to several roads on Salt Spring were reported by the transportation committee of the chamber of commerce. A retaining wall had been put in place on Lower Ganges Road in the village. Beaver Point Road was widened and straightened in places. Work was also carried out on Walker Hook Road and Sunset Drive.

Replacement of pipes with larger lines was part of the work carried out by the North Salt Spring Waterworks District during the previous year. A water tax had been introduced which would generate at least \$8,000 per year for the district.

Pupils of Grades 1 and 2 presented *Hansel and Gretel* for the enjoyment of parents and children. As the play unfolded, the 56 young people charmed the audience with their rendition of the children's classic.

Snow fell on Fulford-Ganges Road May 2. Up to four inches of snow also covered the peak of Mount Bruce.

April had been dryer and colder than the previous year. Howard Carlin, Ganges weather watcher, reported 1.98 inches of precipitation compared with 3.51 inches which had soaked the island the year before. The high and low temperatures had stood at 61 and 34 degrees. The other April had recorded 68 and 36 degrees as the range of warmth and chill.

The rummage sale held by the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 92 took in \$650 for use in constructing an addition to the Legion hall.

The store was the third business establishment broken into in a seven-month period. Someone had broken the bolt on the rear door of the local creamery. Missing from the building were several items but no money had been left around for the thief to take.

Fifteen years ago

The annual meeting of members of Central Hall committee had to be postponed when the required quorum of 10 people did not show up for the meeting. The meeting was rescheduled for May 13.

A public meeting had been called by the director of pollution control to hear support or opposition to the proposal to pump partially treated sewage into Trincomali Channel from the Maliview housing project. At least 200 residents showed up at the meeting and listened to the talk for four hours.

Why do they call them flower children, asked Papajohn of Saturna. Flowers look beautiful and smell fresh and clean, he observed.

The department of highways denied responsibility for the flooding problems in Ganges. The

department said the high water resulted from land drainage and followed the natural flow of water. The chamber of commerce claimed the problem had been worsened by the highways crews when drains and ditches were placed beside roads without alleviating the problem in the village.

The Lions Club had decided to attempt to gather support for a recreation centre for Salt Spring Island. The centre would house a skating rink, a curling rink and a swimming pool as well as other facilities for sports and recreation.

A survey conducted for Lady Minto Hospital called for expansion of the health care facility of the Gulf Islands. The study recommended an addition of 20 extended care beds as well as six more acute care beds.

The Red Cross fund drive on Mayne Island had been completed for the year and the canvassers had collected \$118.95.

Ten years ago

The mill rate for Gulf Islands school taxes stood at 22.38. The new rate was down from 26.53 the previous year. The school budget had been set at \$883,020 and the island taxpayers would have to cover \$843,089 with the provincial government paying five percent of the budget or \$39,931. The new mill rate was 10 mills less than the provincial average of 32.76 mills.

The Aage Villadsen golf tournament limped into history despite the absence of notable duffers. The event drew entrants and they paid \$361 into the pot for Lady Minto Hospital. D. Nisbet took home the trophy for best shooter while low gross was won by L. Miller.

The concrete flower boxes were in place at Centennial Park in Ganges. The Salt Spring Island Centennial Committee thanked *Driftwood* for starting the drive to cover the costs of the boxes and the Lions Club for making up the difference between the amount collected and the final costs. The sum of \$1,166 had been donated and the Lions added \$634 to bring the total to the \$1,800 needed to pay for the 20 boxes.

The rummage sale held by the Galiano Ladies Service Club earned \$250. Items had been donated to the club for sale and the day had been described as a "big success".

Tommy Douglas visited Saturna

Island to talk to his constituents. About 20 people showed up for the relaxed and informal get-together.

The members of the provincial legislature visited the islands to talk with the residents. The message from islanders consisted of a plea for approval of community plans.

Engineers had completed a study of Ganges Harbour and the findings had been sent to the Capital Regional District for action. The study had been part of the preparation for the Ganges sewer.

Five years ago

A light airplane landed at too high a speed and the westerly wind did the rest. The plane veered from the runway, slipped between two parked aircraft and came to a halt against a fence. No one was injured in the accident at the landing field in Fulford.

A meeting of 150 residents of Salt Spring Island and officials of the Capital Regional District heard plans and comments about the proposed sewer in Ganges.

The taxes collected on the Gulf Islands and the way the money was allocated were to be the focus of a study of the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce. Islanders were concerned about the excess taxes collected locally which went to pay school costs in other parts of the province.

A meeting on Galiano Island, co-sponsored by the chamber of commerce and the Galiano Club, heard about the efforts of the RCMP. There would be a full-time constable on the island for the summer months and the evening was devoted to explanations of how the police force operates.

St. Mary Lake was dying and the islands Trust held a meeting to find out what could be done to save the lake. The trustees met with various provincial and federal officials concerned with water resources to come up with an answer.

Efforts to improve facilities at Central Hall proceeded as the approval for the electrical system arrived. Donations to the fund continued and the Old-Age Pensioners' Organization contributed \$100 in pennies. Other money came from various residents interested in the restoration of the historic hall at Central.

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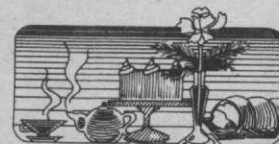
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School carnival Friday

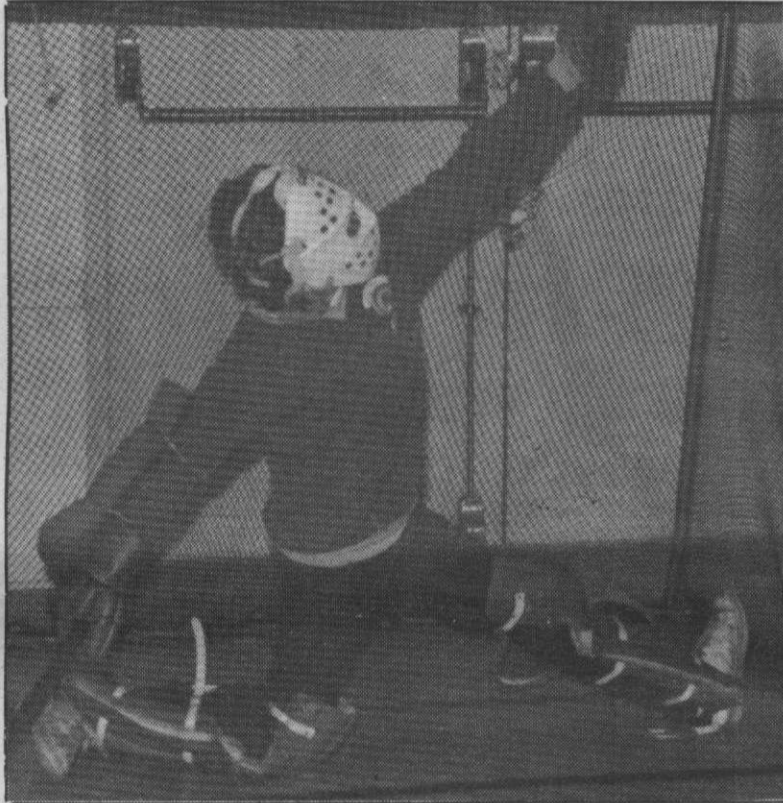
