## Deportation procedure shocks island residents

When Mrs. Margaret Van Dieman was confronted by immigration officials and police in her home in Victoria last week, island residents Pat and Marlein Slingsby were shocked at the treatment she received.

Van Dieman, a friend of Marlein Slingsby's grandmother, was deported to Holland last week following a 26-day hunger strike after immigration officials denied her final appeal for permanent residence in Canada.

Marlein and Pat took Oma, Marlein's 85-year-old grandmother, to visit Van Dieman in Victoria where she was living in the Daffodil Motel. The two women had known each other when they attended the Fraser View Assembly Church together in Vancouver.

"When we arrived at the motel in Victoria, Mrs. Van Dieman told us that they were coming to take her away," Marlein explained. "We didn't believe it. She didn't, herself, believe it."

Shortly after the inquiry, Van Dieman received her mail. The Victoria Board of Health had named her volunteer of the year and a banquet was being prepared in her honour, Marlein said.

The irony of the deportation order was becoming more evident to the Salt Spring visitors.

When Van Dieman asked Marlein to take care of her passport, she put the document in her purse. It remained there until the following day when Ganges RCMP called upon the Slingsbys to release the passport to immigration officials.

When Van Dieman was given the choice of riding in a police car to the Royal Jubilee Hospital or travelling via ambulance, she left the motel in the ambulance, wearing only night clothes.

At the hospital Marlein acted as intermediary between the 54-year-

old Van Dieman and immigration officials when neither party could successfully communicate any further.

"She was hospitalized and listed in stable condition and then jailed and refused permission to get belongings from her hotel room," Marlein said.

Marlein returned to the motel where she packed two suitcases and took toiletries to Van Dieman before she was taken to the Victoria city jail.

"If she had been a Canadian criminal she would have received better treatment," Pat noted. "The government should have had someone representing her like a civil liberties group...."

Even a criminal is entitled to a lawyer, he added. But Van Dieman had exhausted her funds on legal fees during the last nine months of

her 45-month stay in Canada.

"The Victoria police had a forceful attitude and the sequence of events was upsetting," Marlein confided.

### Could face criminal charges

The immigration officials warned the Slingsbys that they would be charged with aiding and abetting a criminal if they failed to return the passport. Marlein returned to Victoria the following day and gave the passport to Van Dieman.

Today, Margaret Van Dieman is in Amsterdam. Her life-savings have been spent on a three-year wait in Canada when she believed she would receive citizenship after a

three-year term, but was refused by Immigration Minister Lloyd Axworthy. She was not able to work during the three years, but managed to survive on her life-savings. She spent most of her time doing volunteer work in Victoria for various groups.

"She had even refused marriage proposals by Canadians insisting that she wanted to come in through the front door and not the back," Marlein said.

"The cost to taxpayers for the whole ordeal must be incredible," Pat Slingsby added. "The immigration officials, the ambulance drivers, the doctor at the hospital, the nurses, the social worker on hand, the Victoria police, the overnight babysitter, the jail fees and hotel and airline fees... why didn't they get one person to investigate and save the taxpayers thousands?"

### Inquiry held in motel room

Shortly after the Salt Spring Islanders arrived, the Victoria City police arrived with an ambulance following. An inquiry was held in the motel room and two immigration officials and an adjudicator declared Van Dieman as being mentally unstable.

"It was as if we were a communist country," Pat Slingsby said.

The police told the Slingsby family to leave and threatened them with charges of obstructing the law, Marlein said. They stood outside the room and later were called back in and asked to convince Van Dieman to leave. Marlein explained that it was up to Van Dieman as to what action she should take.

## John and Kathy Hall leaving island after one more year of teaching

Teachers John and Kathy Hall opened the Ganges Hill School three years ago to offer a more flexible education to children on Salt Spring Island. The school year of 83-84 will be the last for the Halls who intend to move from Salt Spring Island where they have resided for the last 10 years.

The Ganges Hill School has never been a financially successful endeavour, but according to John Hall, it was never meant to be. With the opening of the school, the Ganges Educational Society was established. Parents of students registered at the school, along with John and Kathy Hall, formed the non-profit organization.

Members of the society contribute to the Ganges Hill School's maintenance and in addition to the contributions, tuition fees run at \$100 per month

per student. Together, during the school year of 82-83, John and Kathy Hall made approximately \$6,500 between them.

"It works out to be about a \$1 an hour," UBC scholar and Harvard PhD graduate Hall admitted ruefully. "But living on Salt Spring Island is so much cheaper than living in an urban area."

Hourly wages are not Hall's immediate concern. This has been the first year that the teachers have made any money. Both are more interested in their education policy and in providing as challenging and broad an education as possible.

Kathy Hall, a graduate of the University of California at Riverside, is familiar with the Montessoric method of teaching and much of the method is incorporated into the Ganges Hill teaching process. Students are able to move ahead at their own pace without competing with their fellow students. The emphasis in the class is on the basic academic subjects.

In addition to learning the three R's, the Grade 3 to 8 students receive instruction in a variety of other fields including sewing and music. Each student receives a weekly music lesson with John, a classical violinist. The Hall residence boasts a music room and library where students can listen to any variety of musical genre in the Hall collection.

Regardless of John Hall's determination to remain in the armchair and off the fitness circuit, he can infrequently be found behind the school during morning break wielding a hockey stick with students. As a reluctant participant, the classics professor cuts an academic profile even when he's away from his books and into the net.

When the Halls leave, the Ganges Educational Society will find itself with a gap that will need filling by concerned teachers or parents who want to keep the school alive.

"Whoever takes over the school when we leave can use their methods

to teach, use the residence as well or rent out the school area exclusively," Hall explained. "We think there is enough interest for a small private school to survive. Although it is presently arranged for an average of 10 students, there is room for expansion."

The Halls have added courses to their curriculum and John intends to teach Latin in his last year. But the Ganges Hill School is not completely divorced from the standard educational program offered by the public school system.

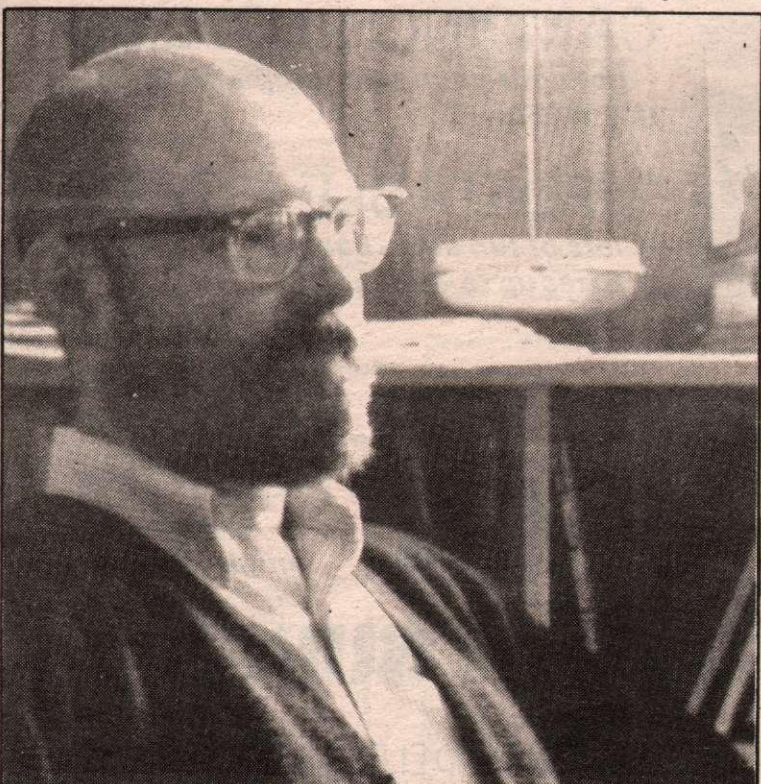
"We follow the ministry of education guidelines for two reasons. We use their materials and students can re-enter the public school system when they leave here without problem," John said.

The next school year will be the first year that the school has been

eligible for assessment by the ministry of education. Once a school has been running for four years it is assessed by the government and according to whether or not a favourable assessment is given, the school is either provided funding by the government or left to continue on the resources provided by the society.

"I feel that either the public school system should be given greater flexibility or parents must be given alternatives in the education of their children," John commented.

In the meantime, Kathy Hall looks forward to using the University of Victoria library facilities in the event their next move will be to Vancouver Island, while John is tuning up his violin, anticipating some work with a chamber orchestra.

# Islanders will miss Bob Dugas and Charlie Gardner

In the course of a few days Galiano will have bid farewell to two well known residents. When people are active in community life their departure is immediately noticed, and both Bob Dugas and Charlie Gardner have been conspicuous—each in his own way.

Bob took over the Salt Spring Lands agency a couple of years ago from Jean Lockwood on her retirement, just as the recession began to bite and property sales plummeted. After years of teaching in the Queen Charlotte Islands he became principal at Mayne Island and while there he decided to try an alternative career.

Bob really enjoyed life on Galiano: he joined the Lions, supported the activity centre, played golf, basketball and helped coach the school team. He was known to the bridge fraternity as a bold bidder with good card sense.

Much as Bob would have liked to continue living on Galiano he found that this had become financially impossible. He is moving to Esquimalt and will work for an Oak Bay real estate firm. Bob already has a base in Victoria where his wife has a business. We shall be as sorry to see Bob go as he is to leave.

Charlie Gardner needs no identification or explanation. Accolades and brick-bats are the same to him. He is undoubtedly a character of the kind no community should be without. He has been provocative and stimulating, both verbally and in print.

Perhaps less widely known are his deeds, for he was no idle talker. At the senior citizens housing it would be Charlie who cleared the walks of snow, lit the fire in the lounge when the power failed, worked in the garden or cleared up the grounds, and all as an unpaid volunteer. The fire hall and golf course were also the beneficiaries of his volunteer labour.

Recently Charlie has taken to expressing his unorthodox views in print. His letters to the editor have been a regular feature in *Driftwood* and "Have you read Charlie's latest letter?" became a common conversational gambit on Galiano. Although he was regarded as a Cassandra, more credit to him for persisting in attacking our complacency.

Charlie, now well into his senior years, kept as fit as a fiddle as befits a curler who once competed in the Canadian championship, the Brier.

Also a keen bridge player, the Gardner Club bidding system is named for him. He is leaving Page Drive on Galiano for White Rock where he will be nearer his family. He will be missed.

### Fish Kill

On Sunday afternoon the incoming tide carried with it thousands of dead and dying hake as it streamed out of the north end of Active Pass into the Strait of Georgia.

The fish ranged in size from less than a foot up to two feet and most had their gill openings distended. A large red snapper was among them, floating upside down and unable to submerge because of its bloated air bladder.

One possibility is poisoning but in the large volume of water in which the fish were, this seems unlikely. There may be a natural explanation such as disease. On occasion a trawler approaching port will throw overboard fish which are unsaleable, as are hake which, with a very soft flesh, will not transport well.

Sea gulls showed some excitement but did not feed on the floating bodies. However, a gardener who was out in a rowboat collected about 50, grabbing them with bare hands as they floated by. After beaching his craft he loaded them into a wheelbarrow and dug them into his garden.

If the department of fisheries is interested in this phenomenon and wishes to investigate it, a specimen frozen in ice in a milk carton waits in a freezer.

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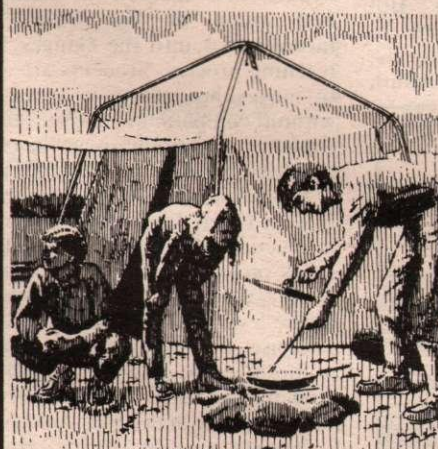
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## Annual circumnavigation

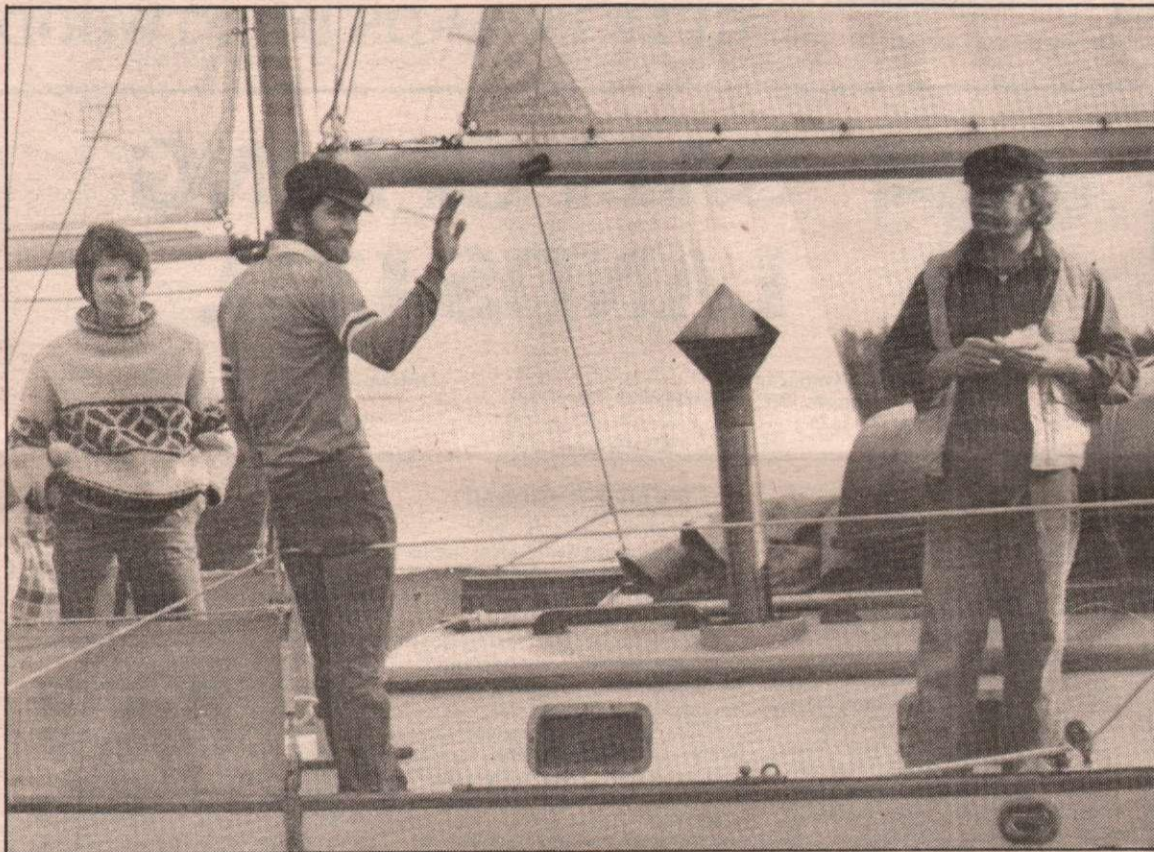

## Geologists view salt springs

The salt springs give the island its name and no similar springs are to be found anywhere else in the world.

Salt Spring Island's salt springs attracted the attention of a group of geologists last week. They came to the island for a visit as part of the Geological Association of Canada's annual meeting held in Victoria.

The group of 18 geologists came, saw and wondered. The salt springs, located in the area between Fernwood, North Beach and North End Roads, contain water which is three times as salty as the ocean.

Alan Dakim, a consultant with Piteau and Associates Ltd., conducted the tour of the springs on Garnet Young's property.

He told the visitors that the springs present quite a few unknowns. The water seeps along a major fault line which runs from the eastern shore of St. Mary Lake towards Trincomali Channel.

The rock is primarily shale and

sandstone and indications of exposed rocks on the beach show that the bedrock in the area seems to be standing on end. The water comes to the surface from a great depth but is not hot but cold.

The springs break the surface through mounds formed around the vents.

Young said the springs are affected by earthquakes along the west coast. The springs plug up only to vent in another location.

Dakim told the group that the closest similarity to the salt springs would be the brine generated from drill holes in an oil field.

The land around the springs is approximately 60 metres above sea level and the springs are spread over an area of 16 hectares. There have been no published studies on the hydrogeology of the springs although Young has studied the springs on his property for more than 20 years.

Chemical analysis of the water from the springs revealed that it contains more than 70,000 parts of dissolved solids per million parts of water. Sea water in Active Pass, flushed by the Fraser River, contains 23,000 ppm of dissolved solids.

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# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

## Twenty years ago

The *Queen of the Islands* was launched in Burrard Inlet to join the B.C. Ferry fleet of 16 vessels. The cost of the boat had reached \$2.5 million. She was 236 feet in length with a weight of 1,600 gross tons. The new boat would carry 40 cars and 400 passengers between the terminals of the Gulf Islands.

Another attempt to convince Gulf Islanders of the need for a gymnasium and science room at the Salt Spring School would be held. The trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board set June 22 as the date for the referendum.

Spring would officially be recognized at the Salt Spring Golf and Country Club. An early season tournament would be held over three days and entry would be limited to club members.

The Legion on Salt Spring held an auction and rummage sale. The events raised \$650 to help finance the new addition to the hall. The Legion planned to build extra space measuring 20 by 40 feet. Official opening had been set for the middle of June.

Open house at Lady Minto Hospital drew visitors on a warm spring day. Tours of the facility were conducted by members of the auxiliary to the hospital and donations amounting to \$220 were collected.

The scene changes. In 1871, Salt Spring was home to one percent of the population of B.C. which in turn had one percent of Canada's population. By 1963, Salt Spring held one-eighth of one percent of the provincial residents while B.C.'s share had risen to nine percent of the national total.

Sports day at the Salt Spring School held the attention of pupils while parents took part in the PTA sale of home-baked goods and plant sale.

The event occurred a year late, but the Trading Company in Ganges celebrated 50 years of service to the Gulf Islands. The store had opened 51 years previously. Up to 335 islanders joined the owners and staff of the establishment in celebrating the event.

## Fifteen years ago

Taxes for the Gulf Islands hospital district stood at .13 mills for the year. The functions of the district were to be assumed by the Capital Region Hospital District but the Gulf Islands district would continue to run the local hospital.

Non-teaching employees of the Gulf Islands School District were granted a seven percent pay increase. A further \$160 would be allotted according to need. The award was intended to "mitigate inequalities cited by the union," said a school trustee.

Georgina Point Road on Mayne Island was undergoing improvements. The sharp curves were being eliminated and rocks along the route were being blasted to smooth out the bumps.

The flower show held in Fulford Hall displayed abilities of the members of the Salt Spring Garden Club. The flower display was combined with an art show presented by groups from Galiano, Crofton, Duncan and Salt Spring.

The Ladies' Service Club on Galiano Island held a meeting to discuss plans for the upcoming months. Members would celebrate the birthday of the club in May and would hold an evening talk about gardening at the end of the month.

Tenders for the construction of five classrooms at Gulf Islands Secondary School had been called for. The building project had been approved by referendum the previous December and the closing of tenders was set for May 30.

Thefts and vandalism broke out in Ganges. RCMP reported the theft of seven fire extinguishers and three batteries. The fire extinguishers were missing from vehicles. Foam had been sprayed on several of them.

Lady Minto Hospital experienced a busy year, according to reports released at the 54th annual meeting. Each department at the hospital reported increases in activity over the past year.

## Ten years ago

The sale of lots in the Walker Hook area of Salt Spring had been stopped by a decision of the B.C. Court of Appeal. The subdivision had been approved in 1891 and the lots were one-quarter of an acre in size. The medical health officer had refused permission for septic tanks or wells on the lots due to the small size.

Lady Minto Hospital continued the trend to more activity. The increase in patient care required a larger kitchen. The Capital Regional Hospital Board had allotted \$16,700 to add to the food preparation facilities.

The Lions Club of Galiano honoured the powers behind the scenes when they hosted a meal and evening of entertainment for the wives of club members. More than 50 people showed up to pay tribute to the efforts of the ladies. Each of the special guests was presented with a gold pin displaying a cultured pearl and the crest of the Lions Club.

Tommy Douglas, member of parliament for the Gulf Islands area, was on Galiano to talk with people. He reported to the island residents on activity in Ottawa during the past sitting of the house. Following that

meeting, Douglas toured South Pender Island.

A bus service for seniors in the Outer Islands would run on the ferry to Swartz Bay with connections to Victoria. The seniors were invited to shop in the capital city and return on the bus to the islands.

The tourists were on Mount Maxwell to see the view. When they started down the winding road in a 1966 Dodge van, the brakes of the vehicle failed and the van ended up in the ditch. The occupants were treated at Lady Minto Hospital for minor injuries.

The Salties roller hockey team returned from Victoria with bruises and a victory in a game which at times became rough.

Ganges RCMP planned a bicycle safety campaign aimed at youthful riders. With the co-operation of the island Lions Club, the police were to conduct bicycle safety classes in preparation for a road-e-o.

## Five years ago

Taxes for operation of the Islands Trust would be three-quarters of a mill for the year. The low mill rate resulted from a decision of the provincial government to pay a major portion of the operating budget. The tax bite had been two mills.

Discussions at the Saturna Community Club revolved around the water situation and election of four representatives to the Advisory Planning Commission. The Capital Regional District board had allocated \$15,200 to study a water system proposal for part of the island. The four people were elected to advise the Islands Trust on matters affecting Saturna.

Enrolment at the Gulf Islands Secondary School dropped by 30 students in a short period. Families moving from the Gulf Islands was mentioned as part of the reason for the decline. The Salt Spring Elementary School experienced a five-pupil increase during the same period.

Galiano residents enjoyed themselves at the Spring Faire held on the school grounds. The event included games for the children, vendors selling wares and an auction. The efforts raised almost \$900 toward construction of a covered play area for the school.

The culprits carefully cut a hole in the window. When RCMP investigated the apparent break-in at Salt Spring Elementary School, they could find nothing missing.

## Planning association meets

The Salt Spring Island Community Planning Association met on May 11 and discussed land exchanges, the Ganges Citizens Committee, the Farmers' Market, water taxes, safety measures for cyclists, zoning changes and the community plan.

Chairman Ray Hill reported that the all-candidates' meeting left the association \$50 in the red. The five participating political parties are expected to cover the loss.

The jurisdictional dispute affecting the Farmers' Market was explained by Murray Reiss and it was decided to invite all interested parties to the next meeting. One hour will be set aside to discuss setting up a non-profit society to administer the market. Representatives from the Vendors' Association, the Recreation Commission, Ratepayers' Association, Farmers' Institute, Chamber of Commerce and the Ganges Centre Association are invited to attend.

The make-up, function and terms

of reference of the newly-formed Ganges Citizens Committee were detailed by Arvid Chalmers, its chairman.

Safety measures for cyclists brought many suggestions: rest areas, safety lanes, filling in ditches, and landowners allowing access. It was decided to write the B.C. Ferries Corporation, asking for cyclists to be unloaded last from ferries arriving at island terminals.

The Islands Trust will be notified of the planning association's wish that all rezoning be held in abeyance until sewage treatment and the community play are brought up to date.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 8.

**Plan to be amended to clarify grey areas**

First call for amendment to the Salt Spring Island community plan will likely be measures to clarify areas not clear in the original plan.

Salt Spring Island Trust Committee has examined the grey area of Ganges, where the plan does not make it clear whether a lot may be rezoned from commercial to residential use in the "core area."

The present plan includes no specific statement against commercial ribbon development, although local trustees have maintained that ribbon development is not acceptable.

The borderline of potable watersheds is also not clear in the Salt Spring Island plan. Development in these areas is limited as yet, but if the plan seeks to protect such areas, the necessary amendments will have to be made.

Those features of the plan were the first to be brought to the attention of the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee by the planner, Richard McKellar, this spring.

The planner suggested that provision may be made for

residential downzoning in the core area by including single-family dwellings as a permitted use in Blocks 1, 2, 5, 6 and 13.

As far as watershed boundaries are concerned, the proposed amendment would call for limited commercial activities if the area is approved for such use by the medical officer of health.

Limited commercial development might also be approved subject to the guideline that the commercial use shall not exert a greater impact on the area than the potential impact of the current zoning.

A further proposed amendment would permit recreation facilities, public and private as and where need indicates, subject to location or development criteria which minimize local disturbance and protect watershed quality.



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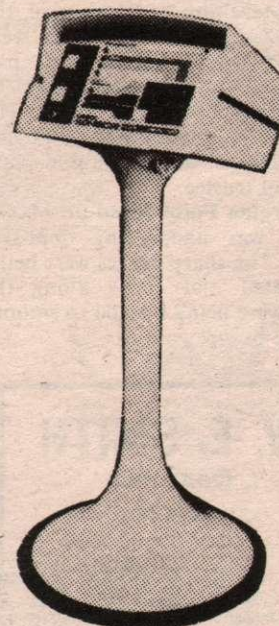
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**At Yacht Club**

**Summer anticipated to begin any day now**

Boating at the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club has been slow until now but caretaker Jim Ballantyne anticipates the beginning of summer any day at the club's 10-acre resort at Scott Point on Salt Spring Island.

Ex-RCMP Sergeant Ballantyne has been caretaker at the Yacht Club for three years. Retiring from the police force as a photographer, Ballantyne went into the yacht brokerage business and learned about the caretaking position through his membership with other, similar clubs.

The Royal Vancouver Yacht Club has a membership of approximately 1,500. The two major Vancouver mooring stations are at Jericho and Coal Harbour while four outstations provide the city yachtsman with holiday moorages. Outstations of the club are located at Silva Bay on Gabriola Island, Alexander Island, Gambier Island and Secret Cove on the Sunshine Coast.

The Scott Point outstation provides city yachtsmen with another retreat. Club members are not permitted to moor for any longer than two weeks at each outstation.

The club at Scott Point, formerly known as Scott Point Marina, is open to club members only. Available at the island outstation is volleyball, ping-pong, and on occasion, club members organize weekend entertainment at the clubhouse. Four secluded cottages provide land accommodation for the overcrowded sleeper-yacht. There is also a swimming pool.

"Summer lasts for seven or eight weeks," Ballantyne explained. "There's a maximum of 1,500 feet of moorage space."

In order to join the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club an initiation fee of \$800 is required in addition to monthly payments of \$45. Adult fees can go as high as \$8,000. There are around 20 island residents who belong to the club.
