

Dennis Young explains

Regional director is only one of the members

A regional director has no more authority on the recreation commission than any other member, Capital Regional Board was told on Wednesday afternoon last week.

When Glenn Woodley, chairman of the Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission, asked the board to explain the relationship between the two functions an explanation was offered by Dennis Young.

The executive director explained that the region has relinquished its administrative function in connection with recreation to the commission in each part of the region. The board retains an administrative function only in relation to the allocation of monies and to the operation of buildings, said Young.

The manner in which recreation funds are spent is a matter for the recreation commission and not for the board.

Woodley appeared before the board to explain the reasons for his commission having censured Salt Spring Island regional director Yvette Valcourt and to ask for a clear understanding of the administrative authority of the regional director within the commission.

VERBAL REPORT

Before the commission chairman could be heard, the board received a verbal report from the local works and services committee explaining that the committee had considered the censure motion earlier in the day and had learned that Valcourt had new information about the Fulford Fire Hall which it was felt should be passed on to the recreation commission.

Committee chairman Shirley Wilde explained that Valcourt had

reported that the fire hall property lies in the flight path of the Fulford airstrip and is not suitable for recreation use in view of the resultant restrictions by the ministry of transport.

Director Valcourt then enquired of the procedure for applications for permission to address the board.

She recalled that islanders were required, at one time, to appear in person at the board office to sign an application to be heard. In the case of Woodley, the application had been submitted by telephone and was unsigned.

NOT OPPOSING IT

"I'm not opposing it," she emphasized. "I'll even move that he be heard."

Chairman Howard Sturrock suggested that the time was not appropriate for discussion of procedures but that he would accept the motion to hear the island recreation commissioner.

Woodley explained that his commission had, by a vote of 7-1, censured the director for repeated episodes of confrontation and lack of consideration for the commission and its members. The commission had also approved a motion to bring the censure to the attention of the regional board, he said.

Woodley has been a member of the commission for 12 years and chairman for six of those years. His perception of the role of regional director is one of participation with the commission in the development of the recreational needs of the island.

To do this, the director has to attend the meetings of the commission; to listen and become involved in the ongoing debate; to vote as an individual member and, most important, to report the results of debate and the subsequent

motion to the CRD, to ensure that a clear path of communication is maintained between the commission and the regional board.

CRITICAL OF CONTRIBUTION
It doesn't work that way, he told the regional board last week.

Her attendance at meetings is sporadic; she places herself in a confronting position after the debate and a decision has been reached. She frequently feels free to override the decisions and courses of action set by the commission, he said.

Valcourt pointed out that the ministry of transport regulations on the approach to an airstrip governed the use of such property.

"I have voiced concern over the flight approach over that piece of land," she told the board. "I have conveyed that concern to the commission. Nobody would listen."

The ministry requires that an airport must have an unobstructed approach, yet 110 feet of the fire hall property abuts the airstrip, said Valcourt.

FIRE HALL QUESTION

The discussion of the Fulford Fire Hall arises from the offer by the trustees of Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District to make available to the recreation commission about four acres of the fire hall property for playing fields. The proposal is based on the plans of both fire district and recreation commission to acquire the Fulford property several years ago. When the fire district was successful it was agreed that any surplus land would be made available to the commission.

Tentative lease was drawn up by the fire district last year, and approved by the recreation commission. It has been held up by Valcourt because she favours alternative methods of finding suitable land and because she fears that the danger of a nearby airfield is prohibitive.

Sturrock interrupted when he explained he did not want to cut off the debate, but that the visiting recreation commissioner had asked for guidance as to the duties of the regional director.

IT WAS RELEVANT

Valcourt felt that the debate was relevant. She was explaining why

she had felt unable to sign the lease.

"We have already spent a lot of money on a property without a lease," she recalled. "Fulford deserves better than that. The people of Fulford are not even aware that tennis courts are being considered."

Shirley Wilde understood that the recreation commission on Salt Spring Island was very different from those in other areas.

It predates the Capital Regional Board, recalled Dennis Young.

The Salt Spring Island commission was established as a society in the 60's, he told the board. As such it enjoyed limited funding. As it grew and the need for funds grew it sought tax funds.

In order to receive a one-tenth mill levy the commission had to be brought within the Capital Regional District.

"All of the regional board's administrative powers with respect to recreation are delegated to the commission," said Young.

SPENDING MONEY

The only function not delegated out in that manner is the spending of

money beyond the regular revenues of the commission.

The wording of the bylaw is about the same as for the San Juan Recreation Commission, he noted. The bylaw directs that the director shall be a member, along with the other members appointed and the director is nothing more than another member of the commission.

"It is not my intention to hold up anything," responded Valcourt. "The property belonged to the school board and was disposed of because it was inappropriate and I have no knowledge of the reasons."

When money is being spent it is her responsibility to look into it and ask questions, stated the island director.

The solution lies with the electorate, suggested director Peterson. The question cannot be settled by the board. It must be settled at the polls.

A copy of the executive director's summary of the recreation commission's functions and those of the regional director will be furnished for both Woodley and Valcourt.

Commission can build whatever it wants on Fulford property

Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission learned Monday that the airstrip adjacent to the proposed tennis courts at Fulford is unlicensed and that the commission can build whatever it chooses on the property behind the Fulford fire hall.

Commission member Bob Wanless assured the meeting that following a check with the ministry of transport and the federal aviation department, anything up to two storeys in height can be built on the adjacent property.

Capital Region director Yvette Valcourt told the meeting that the land adjacent to the proposed tennis court property was not an airstrip but an aerodrome. She added that it was a legal airstrip, that it was open, and that it had a windsock.

"Although it is not licensed," Valcourt said, "it is in use."

Phil Hume reminded the commission that the standing of the Cudmore airstrip will be checked by the CRD.

"We can't deal with the airstrip

situation tonight," Hume told the commission, "but we can deal with issue of whether we're spending \$100,000 or \$200,000 and whether or not we're building one or two tennis courts."

Hume was referring to a letter the commission received from CRD executive director Dennis Young. He had been surprised that the commission was planning such an ambitious undertaking at the Fulford property. Young wrote to the commission explaining that director Valcourt had set the tennis court cost at \$100,000.

Dr. Hugh Borsman told the commission that Mrs. Valcourt had no right to "kick around" the figure of \$100,000. Woodley added that the commission only had \$13,000 to spend and no more. He added that the commission would need a lot of volunteer help from local residents in constructing the tennis court and that the commission only had enough money for one court.

"The figure of \$100,000 was

Chamber of Commerce brief objects to plan

The Galiano Island Chamber of Commerce is inviting the public to attend a meeting in the South Community Hall on Saturday at 7:30 pm to discuss a brief and send a message to Bill Ritchie, the new minister of municipal affairs. The brief, prepared by the executive committee of the chamber, has been sent to all households on Galiano.

The brief objects to the Islands Trust regional plan which is about to be incorporated in a bylaw by the Trust. A copy of the plan was mailed out about a year ago and was explained and discussed at a public meeting called by the Trust.

Whether it should be enacted into law is a matter of debate among Island Trustees themselves. Our own Ron Thompson is one of a group who thinks otherwise.

Should the Trust pass the plan (Schedule A) as a bylaw, which Ron Thompson predicts will happen, it must then proceed to the minister for his approval. It is at this stage that the chamber feels that it can make its voice heard and is seeking public support for its stand opposing the passage of the regional plan bylaw. The plan would give some over-riding powers to the three general trustees, who could block any amendments to the Galiano community plan which did not conform to the regional plan. The three general trustees have always been able to out-vote the two local trustees and many find exception to this.

Trustee Ron Thompson is pressing for a change to the Islands Trust Act which would ensure that local trustees' votes would be weighted so that they form the majority at Galiano Island Trust meetings and those of other islands.

There is not space in this column to dispute the many contentious statements in the brief, but one example will suffice. It is stated on page 4 that the residents of Galiano have never given any mandate to the General Trust to "preserve and protect" them. True, but the Islands Trust was given the responsibility by the government of British Columbia in the act. "It is the object of the Trust to preserve and protect... the Trust area..."

It is not the residents who are to be protected, but the environment for the benefit of those residents and the people of B.C.

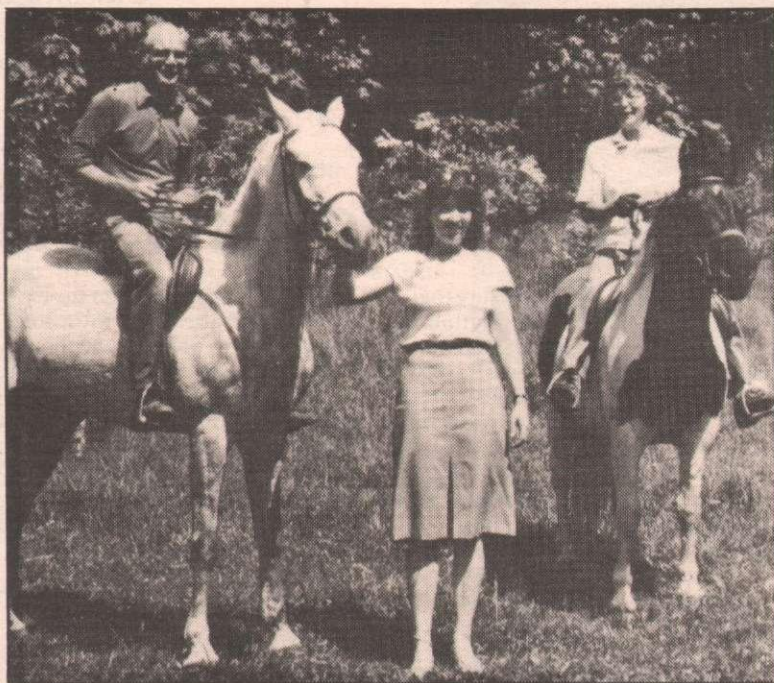
The picnic

Galiano garden

Every garden is unique. Some gardens are imposed on the landscape, others grow from it. Some gardens are busy, others are tranquil. Galiano Garden is a seminal sanctuary: a place of peace yet full of stimulating ideas for the visiting gardener.

In the space of half an acre hacked out of the forest in barely two years, three people have created a garden that delights the eye and restores the soul. Most Galiano gardeners fight

rock, but in this garden it is enlisted in the blending of Oriental and European styles into a pattern ideally suited to the Galiano landscape.

Designer of the garden is Gerhard Rehm who grew up around Lake Constance and learned his trade in southern Switzerland, where villas are located among hills which resemble our local topography.

Gerhard has a philosophy that the original setting of the site must determine the design of a garden. The plan is not imposed on a site but grows from it as the garden is developed. There are analogies with an artist painting a picture but the garden is alive and changes with the seasons and the years.

Steve Pattison, who has worked with him before, invited Gerhard to Galiano to create a garden and provided him with a site on his property on Porlier Pass Drive. Steve, who has a flair for executing Gerhard's ideas, used his Kubota to prepare the ground, removing trees and stumps, baring rocks and moving or burying others, carving the hollows and ridges which form the texture of the landscape.

The colour was applied by Ann Breddels who is both artist and horticulturalist. Mrs. Breddels is a devoted gardener who spends most

of the day on her knees. It is she who built up the patches of soil, eradicating weeds and nurturing plants. She scrubs the water-smoothed rocks that mark the stream bed and border of the pond. She weaves the lime-green moss and aromatic thymes into a soft and fragrant carpet.

The project is barely begun despite two years of hard and constant labour, for a garden takes years to develop but it is now at the stage when visitors are welcome. So its reputation has begun to spread, like ripples on the still surface of the little pond that is but one focal point of this delightful garden.



Page from the past

Cadet squadron marks 25th year

Last week I returned to my past. I attended the 25th anniversary parade of the Sidney Air Cadet Squadron. A quarter-century ago I launched the unit and brought together the various pieces.

They've changed a lot of things since my day. They wear a different colour uniform now. And they recruit young ladies into what was, in those days, strictly men only.

But there were other differences. There are a lot more cadets than when the outfit started and seven of them are Salt Spring Island members of the squadron who commute by ferry to Sidney. The commanding officer even changed the times of parades in order to fall in line with the *Bowen Queen's* schedule.

And what a lot of people! There weren't only the squadron officers and instructors, dozens of them, but all the people who have worked with the unit since its establishment a quarter-century ago.

It started in 1957 when the restaurateur at Patricia Bay Airport, Frankie Spear, came to my office at the *Sidney Review* and asked me why there was no air cadet unit in Sidney.

"We've got the airport here and there are hundreds of air force veterans to help and there should be a squadron in Sidney."

She proved very right. **COMING TOGETHER**

It was a case of bringing together the air force and a civilian sponsoring committee. After some weeks I prevailed on the Sidney Kinsmen Club to take part.

A preliminary recruiting meeting was held in Sidney in April, 1958 when two Royal Air Force veterans explained what was what. I took part in that formative meeting with F/O Ken Cantwell, who served as adjutant for the first 10 years or so. A trophy was awarded, last week, when the presentations were made,

in his memory.

It was my second outing with air cadets. I had been an instructor with a squadron in England at the close of the second war. Ken was new to the project.

In July the squadron held its first official parade and by that time Flt.-Lt. Reid Hannan had been appointed commanding officer.

We shared the old air force recreation hall with an army reserve unit, which meant that the army had the facilities and we had the use of two rooms. Within a few years the army unit had moved to Victoria and the building was formally allocated to the Royal Canadian Air Cadets.

FOR EIGHT YEARS

For eight years I served with the squadron as supply officer and as instructor until I left Sidney to live on Salt Spring Island.

On Thursday evening last week I watched the two air force jets fly past in a screaming roar as they saluted Lieutenant-Governor Henry Bell-Irving.

And I watched the cadets go through their drill with the same precision that had been instilled into them 25 years ago by the squadron's first drill instructor, Gerry Rousseau. Only difference is that he was younger in those days.

Master of ceremonies last week was Reid Hannan, still happily associated with the 25-year-old unit.

Wing Cmdr. Bob Gibbs, who once lived on Churchill Road, in Ganges, was also there on Thursday.

There were former instructors and former cadets taking part. They watched every movement of the cadets who drilled themselves and were entirely on their own for the annual inspection and they compared what they saw with what they remembered. Because Thursday was a day out of their past, as well.


IT WASN'T WASTED

And watching the squadron seeking to hold its position as top air cadet squadron in British Columbia, I decided that my time hadn't been wasted and that Mrs. Spear had been right. There had been room for a squadron in Sidney. The only nostalgic thought was for the early days when the unit was smaller and the staff represented a gathering of friends already closely associated and brought together closer for a new purpose.

With five boys from Salt Spring Island I was glad I went. And the boys were Andrew Archer, Al Innes, Rob Minvielle, Peter Aust and Mark Crouse. Another two cadets were missing from the parade last week. They are Brad Terrick and Stephen Vine.

Operation Dismantle

Ferry out of service

The 236-foot *Queen of the Islands* will become a landmark in Fulford Harbour this summer until it is removed to the Deas Dock in Richmond where it will hibernate until mid-winter.

The *Queen of the Islands* is surplus to requirements, explained B.C. Ferries spokesman, Betty Nicholson.

The boat holds 40 cars and requires a crew of 12 to 13 depending on the passenger licence. It is necessary to the B.C. Ferry fleet only during winter re-fit when other ships are being removed from their regular run for their annual overhaul.

The *Queen of the Islands* will sit at Fulford until there is room at the Richmond docks for the boat. It will be laid up yearly and will act only as a supplementary vessel during winter months.

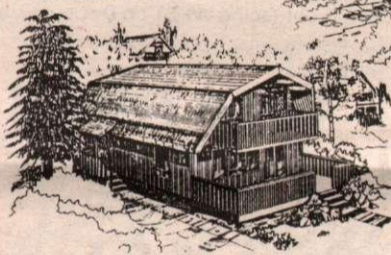

Work parties to upgrade, repair island softball fields Thursday

This Thursday there will be an enormous work party involving all the various groups playing softball. All games on this day have been cancelled and all players are expected to get out and pitch in and help fix the fields, which are in such poor condition. Action starts at 6:30 and concludes at 8:30.

Through the co-operation of the school board and the recreation commission a major effort is being made to upgrade the fields. Over 35 teams and groups will be involved with each team assigned a field and a general task.

At Central's Portlock Park the hard-rock clay infield will be rototilled and sand raked and rolled. There will be six teams working at this field.

The Hydro diamond in Ganges which has been the scene of local softball for over 40 years, is in a terrible state. Nine teams will be involved in the tearing up of the infield, rototilling, raking, rolling, painting of backstop, repair of backstop and clearing of bush.

At the little league diamond the Katimavik project will be completed

with the aid of five of the teams. Infield and pitchers circle will be improved, dugouts painted, fence repaired and bush cleared.

On the elementary field the diamonds will be limed, home plate areas established and base areas improved. This will be done by minor softball.

At Fulford the project will involve minor softball as well as four adult teams. The dugout will be cleaned and painted and the infield area of this diamond, which is probably the nicest on the island, will be revitalized.

This massive community project needs the support of each and every group and each and every individual involved in playing softball. There

are almost 500 people directly involved in softball and baseball on the island.

The cost of maintaining so many fields is difficult within the limits of the restrained budgets of the school board and recreation commission. If everyone wants to play softball or baseball let's play on nice, safe fields where no one will get hurt.

There is close to \$50,000 spent every year on softball and baseball when one considers everything from the cost of maintenance, new bats and balls, bases, babysitting, ferries, gas and transportation, gloves, hat, uniforms and T-shirts and, of course, that cool beer after the game.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Victoria Day celebrations in Ganges included a sail-past by 63 boats from the Capital City Yacht Club of Victoria. The event was sponsored by the local Chamber of Commerce and the pleasure fleet brought 200 visitors from the provincial capital for a two-day visit to the island.

Pirate Days plans continued to grow. The summer celebration on Salt Spring showed promise of much fun for the three-day festival. One aspect of the celebration would be the acceptance of the new ferry, *Queen of the Islands*, which would be in service in and around the Gulf Islands.

The debate turned to the affirmative side of whether beaver inhabited St. Mary Lake on Salt Spring. Evidence of beaver bites on trees were dismissed earlier in the spring but a tree on a lakeside property showed signs of the presence of the furry symbol of the nation.

Driftwood announced a contest, open to children of the Gulf Islands. The young set were to select an interesting piece of driftwood from the shores of the islands and explain in a short paragraph what the piece appeared to be. The contest featured 10 prizes with the first prize being \$5.

Fifteen years ago

The regulations of the department of education meant a school had to be built on each of the major Gulf Islands, said a school board official. But the same regulations allowed the government to pay less than a fair share of the salary for teachers with small classes. The school act required a school where eight or more students would attend but the community found itself paying a higher share of the salaries because of the small class sizes.

Changes in the dormitory on Ganges Hill included replacement of floor coverings, installation of new lighting and repainting the interior. Rules governing conduct of the students were also changed to allow them to spend time outdoors for a while each evening after the meal.

The cougar had been shot on Mount Maxwell. The provincial government had stopped allowing a bounty on the big cat but the Farmers' Institute of Salt Spring paid \$50 to the two hunters who bagged the cougar.

The air cadets of Salt Spring travelled to Sidney one evening each week to take part in the parade drill of 676 RCAC Squadron. The five young men had helped celebrate the 10th anniversary of the cadet squadron.

Ten years ago

The community plan for North Pender Island gained public acceptance at a meeting of island residents. The plan had been two years in drawing up with a great deal of public participation along the way. The community plan for that island joined plans for Salt Spring, Galiano and South Pender Islands on the desk of the minister of municipal affairs where each has been held up pending government action.

Lady Minto Hospital received a government grant of \$3,400 to hire students for the summer months. The students would serve in administration, grounds maintenance and the extended care service. The program would run from May to September.

SAM continued to squash cars on Salt Spring. The mobile car-crusher was making small cubes of metal from derelict autos under a plan of the Capital Regional District to rid the region of abandoned wrecks.

Five years ago

The 27-foot Kyuquot Forest ran aground in Navy Channel. The ministry of forests boat was pulled from Conconi Reef by a boat from Gulf Islands Water Taxi. The crippled vessel was towed to Tschum Harbour for repairs to the outboard motor.

Sea Capers drew closer. The Salt Spring Island celebration of Captian Cook's bicentennial would feature two days of activity. A bathtub race was scheduled as was an event to test participants ability to walk on water. A parade, boat races of various classes and food would highlight the festivities.

David Anderson, of Sooke, won the nomination for the Liberal Party for the upcoming federal election. He would face Jim Manly, New Democratic Party, and Don Taylor, Progressive Conservative. Anderson won the nomination against Jim Campbell of Saturday by a count of 144 to 53.

Construction had begun and was expected to be completed by the end of the year. The Gulf Islands Intermediate and Personal Care facility had received federal approval for an increase in the loan necessary to pay for the building. The total had been raised to \$1,246,018 as the cost of the 50-bed facility for seniors.

The Bishop of Victoria, Remi de Roo, came to Salt Spring Island to award medals to four parishioners who had aided the church beyond the ordinary. Part of the celebrations included a dinner honouring Father Bergin for 40 years as a priest.

Boats swamped

The high winds swamped at least two boats on Salt Spring Sunday evening.

RCMP received a report of a sailboat overturned on St. Mary Lake but when the officers reached the lake, the occupants of the boat had been rescued from the water by a resident in a power boat.

At Vesuvius, a sailboat was overturned and the two people in the vessel clung to the boat until they were picked up by another sailboat.

The weather office reported winds of 40 knots in the Strait of Georgia that evening.

Fire hazard moderate

Salt Spring volunteer firefighters remained inactive last week and they prefer it that way.

The hazard warning could be affected by rain, or lack of it.

No fires were reported on the island. The fire hazard warning reached the moderate stage last

Outdoor fires will continue to be allowed but on a daily-check basis. Residents are reminded that permits for outdoor fires are required.

arrived at by Mr. Young and myself," Valcourt told the meeting. She added that at the last meeting there had been suggestion of playing fields and more than one tennis court on the property.

"This commission has the ability to spend only \$13,000," Woodley assured Valcourt.

Edith Sacher told Valcourt that it was up to future commissions to decide what to do in the event of a demand for further facilities.

Valcourt then questioned the commission about plans for policing the parking facilities on the property. She added that the Ganges RCMP and herself receive numerous complaints about the parking at Portlock Park.

"Parking facilities will be provided," Woodley explained.

The commission should look into the feasibility of recreational sites in Fulford and give the people of Fulford a say as to where they want the site, Valcourt told the meeting.

"Why should the public start paying taxes on a piece of property during a recession?" Wanless asked. "Why shouldn't the public take advantage of a piece of property for \$1 a year for 20 years?"

Woodley noted that the property was virtually given to the commission.

"This commission, with God's help, can build only one tennis court. That's all we want. Shall we form another committee? Shall we look at some other avenue?"

Phil Hume told the meeting that he would like to have it on record that Mrs. Valcourt is in favour of the commission putting one tennis court on the leased site in the event the commission gets permission.

A motion was passed that the commission meet with a representative from the South Salt Spring Residents' Association to discuss the tennis court facility.

Because the CRD was not only looking at the question of the airstrip licence, but was also looking at the \$100,000 expenditure quoted by director Valcourt, Borsman said that it was important that the commission clarify its intention to the CRD.

Borsman admitted to Valcourt that prior to the commission's presentation to the Capital Regional Board meeting last Wednesday, members of the commission predicted Mrs. Valcourt's response.

"We don't mind you disagreeing with us but would like you to communicate with us those disagreements," Dr. Borsman told Valcourt. "It may get you more brownie points from the public by behaving the way you do, but you would win more respect from us if you communicated to us your disagreements first."

Valcourt informed the commission that she had to leave early for two meetings the following day.

"That's what you're paid for, Mrs. Valcourt," Borsman noted.
