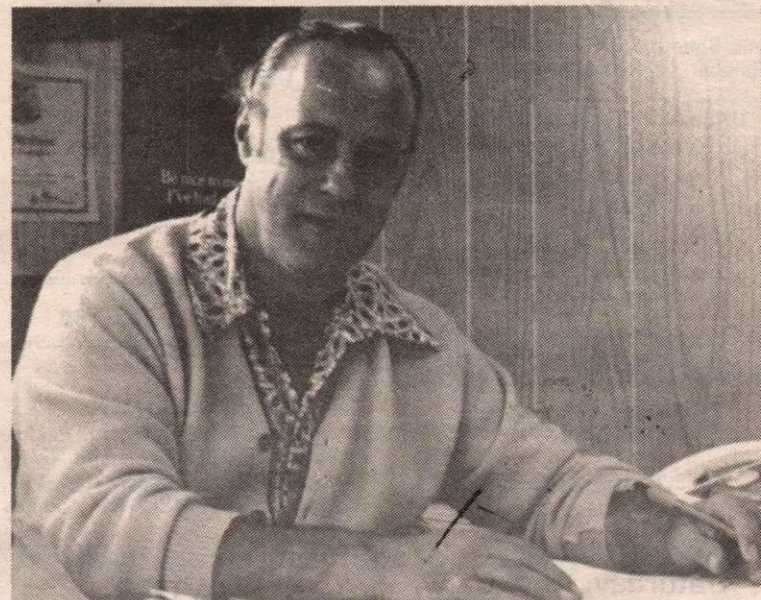
The move will be effective August 9. Driver's licences, tests and temporary permits will all be

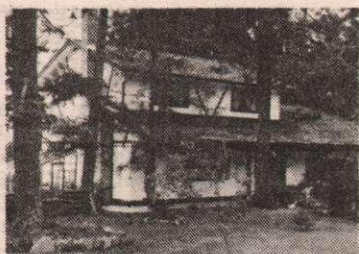

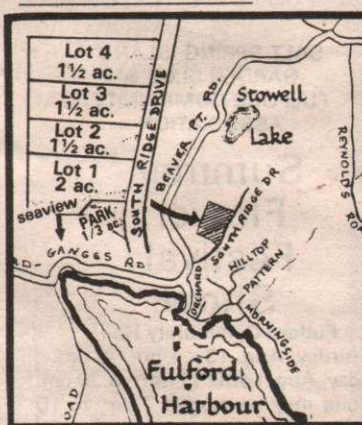

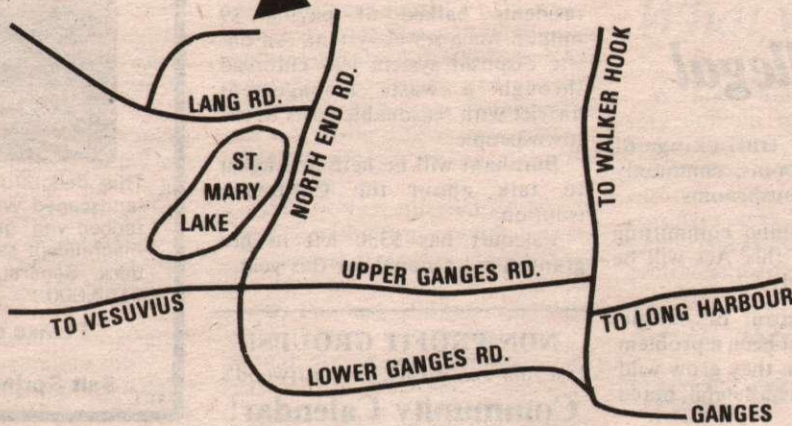

Committee expenses near \$1,000

The Ganges Citizen's Committee spent \$761 up to June 23 on various expenses.

Committee chairman Arvid Chalmers told the group last week that the Capital Regional District finance department had issued cheques for that amount for such items as paper, recording tapes and copies of reports.

The expenses of the committee to

the June date do not include other items which have been needed since. Chalmers said the total expenses should be near or over \$1,000.

The committee will, however, be getting help with an anticipated cost. The Western Communities of the CRD will chip in to pay the travel expenses for Jack Burnham who will explain the sewage disposal situation in Stinson Beach,

California.

David Krauel of Colwood and Shirley Wilde of Metchosin told Salt Spring's CRD representative Yvette Valcourt that each would be willing to put in \$250. Valcourt had told the committee that she could make a similar amount available from her grant-in-aid account.

Stinson Beach had a sewage problem similar to Ganges and residents balked at paying \$9 million for a sewer system. An on-site disposal system was enforced through a waste management district with reasonable costs to the townspeople.

Burnham will be here in August to talk about the California solution.

Valcourt has \$330 left in her grant-in-aid account for this year.

Magic mushrooms illegal

Magic will definitely be out of mushrooms, according to the RCMP.

Ganges detachment RCMP released the following notice this week:

"As a result of the Supreme Court of Canada decision on Regina versus Dunn, 23 November 1982, the justice department has reinstated charges under the Food and Drug Act dealing with

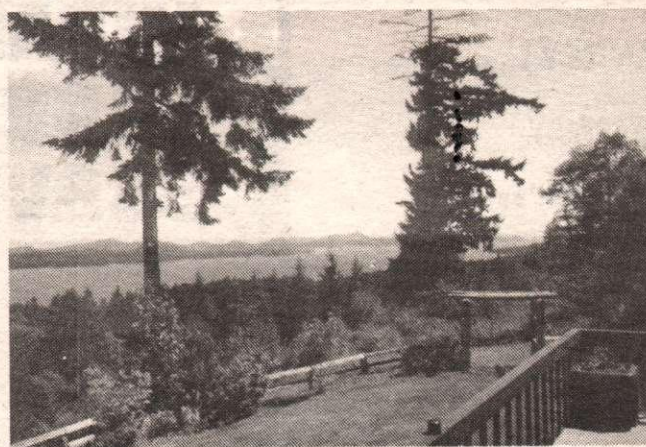
possession and trafficking of psilocybin mushrooms, commonly known as magic mushrooms.

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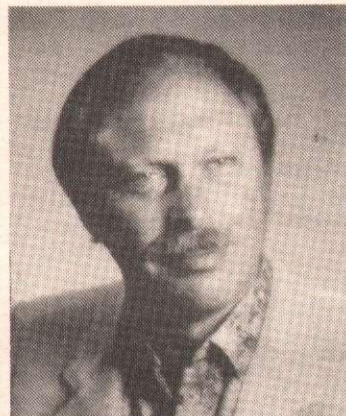

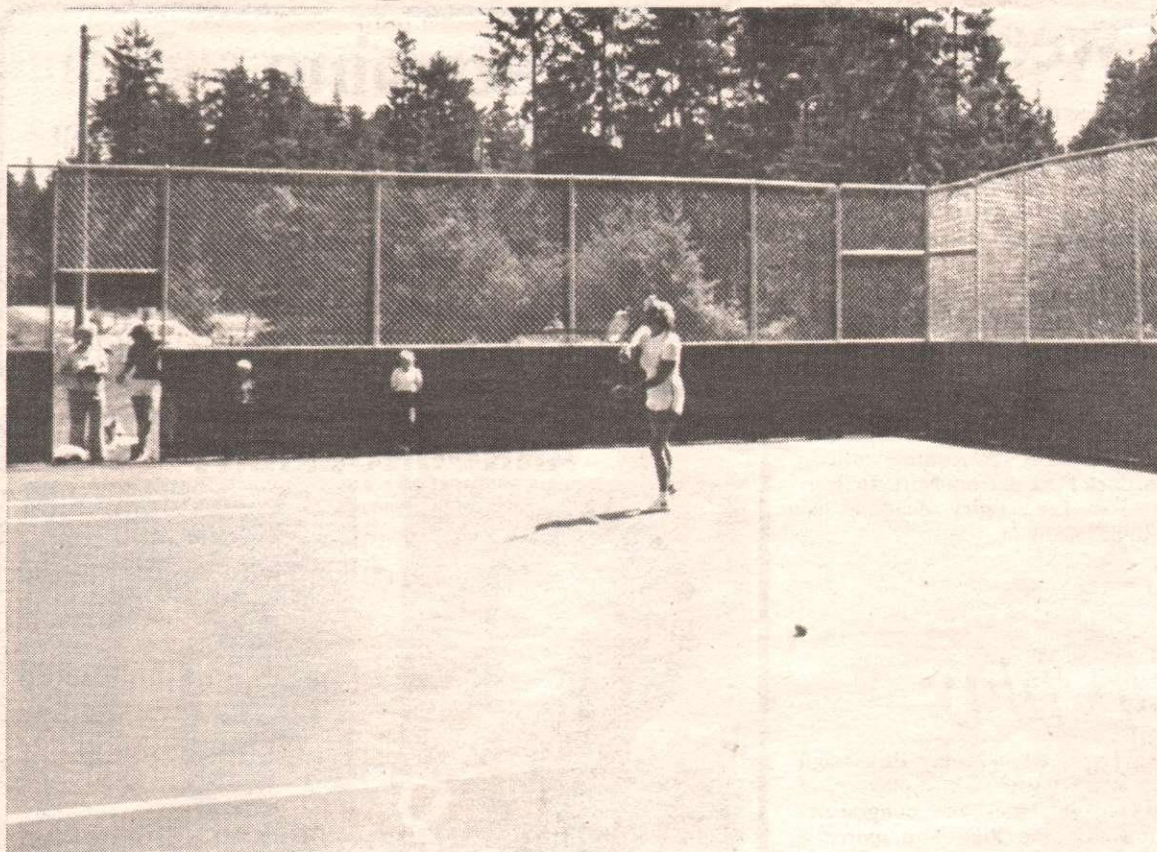

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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Summer traffic on the *Queen of the Islands* resulted in an extra trip to and from Tsawwassen to accommodate the unexpected number of travellers. The boat departed from Long Harbour at noon with stops at Village and Sturdies Bays and returned directly from the mainland terminal to Long Harbour.

Pirate Days were about to descend upon Salt Spring. The three days of festivities would include a display of water skiing, a ski-diving exhibition as well as a dance, water events and fun.

The escapade began in Victoria and ended on Coal Island off Swartz Bay with stops at various Gulf Islands. A young man stole a car in Victoria, a boat at Sidney and another in Ganges. He travelled to Mayne where another boat was taken and on to Gossip Island to take yet another boat. RCMP caught up with him on Coal Island.

Lady Minto Hospital had a new x-ray machine. The machine was purchased through a provincial grant which covered one-third of the cost. The remainder of the money came through donations from Gulf Islanders. The machine had a greater capacity than the one in use at the hospital.

The Salties won one softball game but lost the other. Sooke Forest Products defeated the local team 16-4 in the first game but the Salties took the second game 7-6.

The golfers of Salt Spring led the race for the islands golf championship. The Salt Springers were in front of Galiano with Pender third. Final games in the tourney would be played on Galiano.

Another shipment of seven boxes of used clothing went to the Unitarian Service Committee from people in Fernwood. The boxes were shipped to Victoria for distribution to the needy in underdeveloped countries.

The Lions Club had their rowers in top shape and had issued a challenge to all comers for the rowboat competition at Pirate Days. The Lions had accepted the challenge of the Chamber of Commerce crew but were not worried about losing.

Fifteen years ago

The *Queen of the Islands* would be replaced for the remainder of the summer by the *Sechelt Queen*. The increased capacity of the *Sechelt Queen* would help with the increased traffic between the mainland and the Gulf Islands, ferry officials hoped. The replacement vessel had capacity for 75 vehicles and 250 passengers, double the room of the *Queen of the Islands*.

Colin Cameron, 71, died in a Nanaimo hospital. The member of parliament for the area had been admitted to hospital after suffering a stroke. He had first been elected to parliament in 1953. Cameron had been re-elected only six weeks prior

to his death.

Active Pass lived up to its name as the larger ferries were experiencing difficulty negotiating through the fleet of smaller boats fishing the waterway. RCMP had issued a warning to the fishermen that they had to move out of the way of the big boats or face charges.

The cod weighed 45 pounds but was not the winner in the Rod and Gun Club salmon derby. The cod had been caught a week before the derby began. The largest derby cod came in at 31 lbs., 3 oz. with the second cod weighing one ounce less. The largest salmon tipped the scale at 14 lbs., 9 oz.

The Gulf Islands Historical Society would be holding a Delve In at the community hall on Saturna Island. The display would feature many artifacts of earlier times in the Gulf Islands.

The Mayne Island archaeological site showed evidence of human habitation on the island as far back as 3,000 B.C. The site was located on the Indian reserve at Helen Point and students of the University of British Columbia excavated a pit 30 x 36 metres (100 x 120 feet) to a depth of 140 centimetres (56 inches).

Another public meeting would be held to discuss the application by Maliview Estates Ltd. to be allowed to pump partially treated sewage into Trincomali Channel. A meeting on the subject had been held but no explanation of the need for the additional meeting was given.

Ten years ago

The Gulf Islands could be removed from the Capital Regional District, noted the minister of municipal affairs, James Lorimer. Residents of islands in the Strait of Georgia were not happy with the arrangement of being with regional districts and the minister hinted at forming a separate district.

RCMP would have the use of a helicopter to patrol the islands. The attorney-general said the patrol would allow quick response by police to any incidents such as had occurred on a long weekend earlier in the year.

Summer theatre would be given a tryout on Salt Spring. Stuart Margolin would direct a play with a cast of two. Canadian actress Margot Kidder and U.S. actor Joshua Bryant would be featured in the play *Sea Marks*. Margolin hoped to establish summer theatre as a regular event on the island.

The dry weather and carelessness by campers were the cause of six fires on Galiano Island. Two blazes broke out at Montague Park and four other fires were doused after they started on small islands near Galiano. Fire officials asked for co-operation from campers to avoid the outbreaks.

The agricultural land of Salt Spring Island had been defined and mapped. The results would be on display in the high school for two weeks and the public was being

asked for comments on the plan. All agricultural land in the province was to be protected by the Land Commission Act. The land had to be defined in order to be included in the provincial plan.

The Salties finished the roller hockey season without suffering a defeat. The island team beat the Victoria All Stars 6-4 to take the championship.

Activity on Mayne Island included putting the finishing touches to the miniature golf course next to the community hall. The 18-hole course would be officially opened by local member of parliament Tommy Douglas at the Mayne fall fair. Work on the former Mayne gaol was also proceeding quickly in the efforts to turn it into a museum.

Five years ago

Mahon Hall would be turned over to the community by the Gulf Islands School Board. With the opening of the new school at Fernwood, the hall would not be needed for classes. The school board would be talking with community groups about having them take over the running of the hall.

RCMP would have two boats in Active Pass to check that fishermen get out of the way of the big ferries. One of the police boats would be marked but the other would be plain. The patrol was in response to complaints that the fishermen were not moving when the ferries came through the pass.

The salmon was larger than the cod. The Galiano Rod and Gun Club sponsored a salmon derby and the largest coho weighed 28 lbs., 4 oz. The largest cod was only 23 lbs., 13 oz.

Mount Baker was the destination for 47 members of the Pender Island Silver Threads. The group went on a bus tour to the mountain for a one-day outing.

Tennis buffs took to the courts at Portlock Park on Salt Spring for a tournament. With 44 entrants in the event, organizers expressed satisfaction with the level of play and the enthusiasm of those involved.

The Islands Trust established ground rules for subdivisions on Salt Spring Island. The land must be capable of producing up to 250 imperial gallons of water per day or be located where access to a community water service was available. The water must meet health standards.

Properties at Walker Hook could not be withdrawn from the agricultural land reserve for use as a mobile home park. A similar application to subdivide the property was turned down as well by the Islands Trust Committee on Salt Spring Island.

Circus Minimus began performances in the Gulf Islands with an evening of fun on Galiano Island. The mime, masque and clown group would be performing for audiences on Mayne as well as Salt Spring later in the summer.



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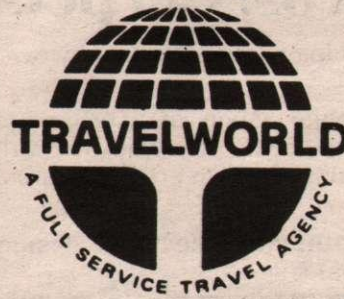
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Pet show howling success with 18 entrants
