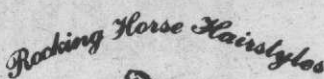

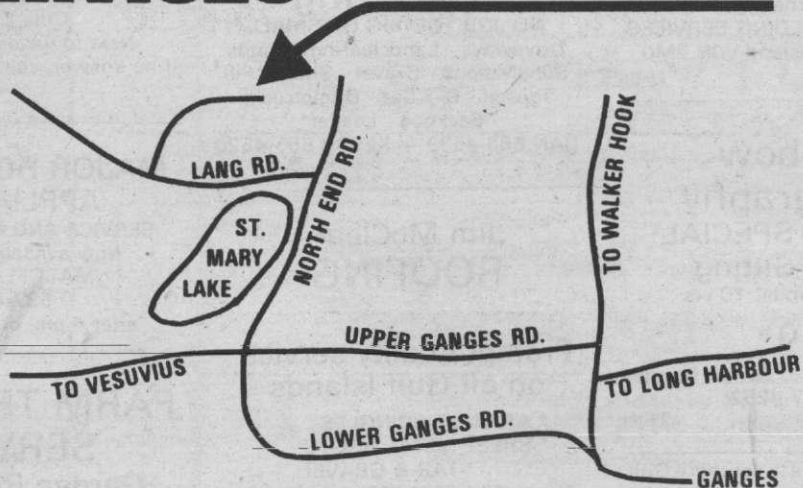

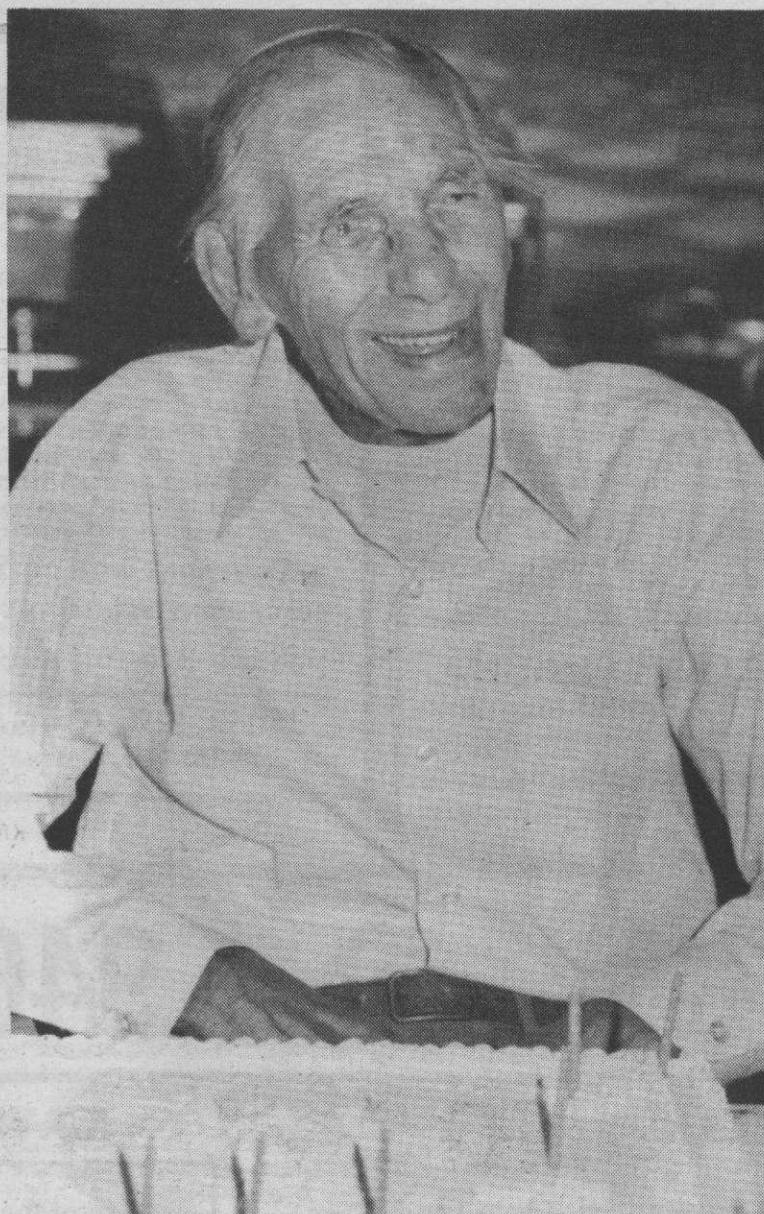
Dow received notes of congratulation from Vancouver, San Diego, Calgary and Ottawa.

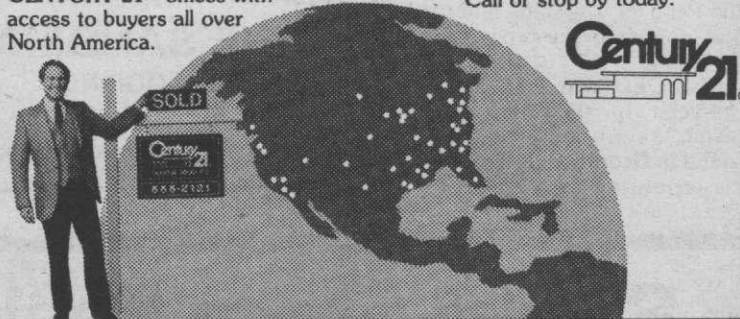

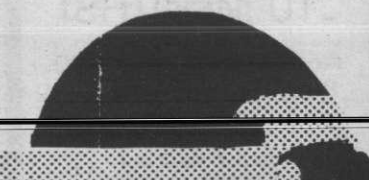

Last Saturday a group of Galiano people were among the crowd of over 100 who gathered on Pender to mark the anniversary of Hiroshima Day. Terry Paugham of the Victoria Voice of Women reminded her listeners that people were still dying as a result of that first use of an atomic bomb in war and both she and successive speakers emphasized that world peace can only come through negotiation and not through violence. An interlude of flute and recorder music followed.

Automatic doors auxiliary project

The Lady Minto Hospital Auxiliary has a new project with a price tag of almost \$12,000.

The volunteer ladies will be gathering money to purchase automatic doors for the front of the hospital. When the doors are in place, they will make easier the entry and exit of stretcher, wheelchair and handicapped patients.

The automatic doors, including installation, have an estimated cost of \$11,900.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

A petition calling for changes in the proposed boat basin and parking area in Ganges was being circulated by *Driftwood*. The proposal called for the boat basin with a 2½-acre parking lot adjacent to the shore. The petition called for a park in the area instead of a parking lot.

Cold and wet were the results of weather during July. Howard Carlin, the Ganges weather observer, reported the coldest, wettest July in 12 years of record keeping. The high and low were 75 and 48 with 1.98 inches of rain. The previous year the numbers read: high 84, low 47, rain 0.4 inches.

The road crews were out in force and rendered Isabella Point Road into a road. They sanded and gravelled the road for a mile and a half from the Fulford-Ganges Road intersection.

A garden party held by the Anglican Church welcomed as special guest the lieutenant-governor of B.C., George Pearkes. The event had been held annually for 30 years on the grounds of Harbour House. The guests enjoyed food, games and sports in the sunshine.

The grass caught fire on Simpson Point and help to combat the blaze came from an unexpected source. A flotilla of naval vessels was passing the island near the point and noticed the flames. Sea cadets were put ashore to form a bucket-brigade to aid efforts to contain the fire.

The Gulf Islands contain no poisonous snakes, deadly insects, ferocious animals or poisonous plants such as poison ivy or poison oak.

A court of revision held by the North Salt Spring Waterworks attracted only two official appeals against assessments for water. Both appeals were turned down. Several other residents showed up to ask questions about the assessments.

A woman was dying wool when the lamb fell into the vat. She pulled it out and found it had become a beautiful pink. A tourist saw the lamb and bought it. The woman decided coloured lambs would make a profitable business and so became the biggest lamb dyer on the island.

Fifteen years ago

The young man's hair was long and three island residents decided to give him a haircut. They ended up in court to face charges of assault and were fined \$150 each.

The rules for the fishing derby had been set and local salt water anglers were ready to vie for honours in the Royal Canadian Legion salmon derby. The fish could stay in the water but the fishermen could only be on top of the waves from dawn to 4 pm.

The *Sechelt Queen* would be plying Gulf Islands waters and word went out that 30 jobs were available. The vessel, an ex-Blackball ferry, would add more space and speed to the runs. 300 people lined up to seek employment on her.

Rock Crusher Corner on Salt Spring crushed a cement truck and the driver of the vehicle ended up in court for not paying attention to his driving. The driver, from Victoria, failed in efforts to negotiate the notorious curve on the Fulford-Ganges Road and the cement truck crashed to the bottom of a gully. The chassis went one way and the cement barrel went another. The driver received a suspended sentence in court.

The roads of Mayne Island were undergoing renovations courtesy of the department of highways. Some of the roads were being blacktopped while others were merely being attended to. The major work, straightening and widening a main road would require extra effort and more equipment was being brought in to deal with the rocks which had to be blasted and moved.

An original action play would present *Rigmarole Slightly Rigged* as the finale to tri-weekly classes. The play would be put on in Mahon Hall for one performance.

The mail still was not getting through due in part to a national strike by letter carriers. One result was a decline in donations to the Salvation Army's Red Shield Appeal. The deadline for donations was being extended to allow residents an opportunity to submit their contributions.

Ten years ago

Heat and lack of rain prompted forest closures in the Gulf Islands. The danger of forest fire was considered to be too high to permit activity in the bush. Logging operations were stopped and open camp fires were prohibited.

The heat wave brought discomfort during July. Ganges weather observer Howard Carlin reported only .31 inches of rain for the month compared to 2.48 inches the previous year. The temperature ranged from a high of 86 to a low of 46.

Rustlers were rumoured to be at work on Salt Spring. The high price for beef was the basis for the rumour when an islander reported the disappearance of a cow from his farm. RCMP were checking on the missing bovine.

Fulford Harbour had been closed to the taking of crabs. Concern about the apparent decline in the number of large crabs in the harbour had prompted fisheries officials to declare the ban. A survey of the population of crustacean pinchers would be carried out during the ban.

The gardener had grown a flower

with a difference. Actually, many differences. The Rainbow Road gardener reported an orange lily with 130 blooms on one stem.

The cable had been laid between Galiano and Mayne Islands. The telephone cable was resting on the bottom of Active Pass as a replacement for the one which had been cut before it could go into service. The cable could handle 200 calls at one time and placing it in the water had taken half an hour.

RCMP officers were out in force to answer a complaint. A resident phoned to complain about nude bathers at Blackburn Lake. When the police arrived, everyone was covered. Police issued a warning to the bathers: don't skinny-dip.

Five years ago

Court action had been brought against the Pollution Control Board and the Capital Regional District by Phil and Yvette Valcourt. The basis of the suit was the legality of the order for a sewer by the Pollution Control Board and the compliance to that order by the CRD.

Garbage was being collected and disposed of and while Gulf Islanders were helping to pay, they were not getting the service. Islanders asked why they should pay for garbage collection in other areas of the Capital Regional District when there was no such service available on the islands.

B.C. Hydro was to continue testing the bottom of Satellite and Trincomali Channels as well as the Strait of Georgia to obtain information about depth and composition of the bottom. The information was needed in case the proposed natural gas pipeline was extended to Vancouver Island.

The Islands Trust would offer no opinion on the withdrawal of land from the Agricultural Land Reserve. The Trust would, however, look carefully upon any plans to subdivide such land. That was the gist of a message from the Islands Trust to the B.C. Land Commission when a Salt Spring land owner sought to have property taken from the ALR.

The Salt Spring tennis players won the inter-island competition but the team from Galiano hosted a barbecue anyway. The organizers of tennis on Galiano were pleased with the showing of the team from that island and gave serious thought to constructing public courts on the island.

The fishermen fanned out from Mayne Island to seek the salmon and they did. When the weigh-in was completed, organizers of the Mayne Island Lions Club salmon derby had weighed 77 fish with a total weight of more than 900 pounds. Winning fish tipped the scale at 30 lbs.

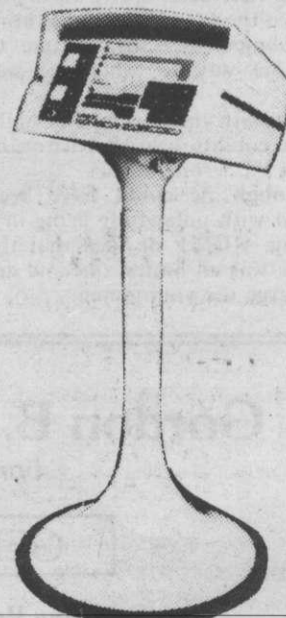

From 34% to nine percent

Shopping for groceries might be a little more expensive these days but trying to make ends meet for single mothers and females over 65 is still difficult in Canada.

Groceries that cost \$5 today might include half a gallon of milk, two loaves of bread and a pound of lard. In 1938 \$5 could buy half a gallon of milk, two loaves of bread, 1 lb. of bacon, 6 lbs. of prime rib, 4 lbs. of jam, 12 eggs, 3 lbs. of cod, 1 lb. of tea, 1 lb. of lard, 5 lbs. of oatmeal, 1 lb. of rice, 13 oz. of ketchup, 32 oz. of syrup, 1 lb. of cheese and two large tins of salmon.

Wages in 1941 were low. Statistics Canada provided a breakdown of weekly wages by occupation.

Labourer: 14.30; semi-skilled: 18.51; skilled: 20.96; clerical, commercial and financial: 22.32; professional: 30.31; managerial: 40.52.

In contrast, the worker today makes a few dollars more. Labour Canada provided averages and different classifications for each occupation.

Labourer (unskilled): 607.97; semi-skilled (pipe-fitters, etc.): 700.56. Further averages were not provided.

However, additional figures for female-dominated areas of employment were offered. Weekly wages for Canadian women were substantially lower.

Junior typist: 295.00; general office clerk: 332.00; file clerk: 291; secretaries: 346; senior typist: 320.

A labourer in 1941 spent 34% of his wages on groceries a week while in 1982 he spends 9%. Today, for the same amount of groceries, a female will spend 18% of her weekly wages.

Pub crawler ends up in wrong house

The night of rest could have had more serious consequences but it was all a mistake.

Ganges detachment RCMP responded to a call that someone was illegally in a Salt Spring house. They sped to the scene and found a visitor from Duncan asleep in the house.

When police roused the sleeper, he explained that the previous evening had been spent on a pub crawl on the island. He had left one establishment at closing time to make his way to where he was staying.
