Sailboat runs aground at Galiano

Last Friday evening at high tide a 38 ft. ocean-going sailboat, the *Wonder* from Olympia, Washington, went aground on the reef opposite Lion Islet.

All next day islanders and coastguard with rigging, anchor ropes and chains worked to get the 14-ton boat refloated without damaging her hull.

The *Wonder*, the full-time home of the Harmons, of Olympia, was returning from a sail in Desolation Sound via Porlier Pass in preparation for a world cruise when the accident occurred. After a flotilla of well-wishers had offered help all day long, two boats from Salt Spring managed to pull the *Wonder* off the reef without damage on Saturday evening. Mr. and Mrs. Harmon wish to thank the many kind people who gave them help and encouragement.

River Runners

Not to be outdone by the Salt Spring ladies, six bold Galiano-ites set off last Saturday for a two-day wild, whitewater rafting trip.

Arriving at Shaw Springs, their friendly hosts, the River Runners, made camp for them and then drove them to Ashcroft to meet their boatman, Dave Sonnenberg, and swamper, Darlene Munroe.

After a lecture on raft safety, the group was tightly corseted into lifejackets and embarked on their maiden voyage on the Thompson River, with boatman Dave pointing out scenery highlights and also preparing them for perils ahead.

Breaths were held for the first big rapid. Fears were allayed by Dave's skilful steering. After 2½ hours rafting the voyagers landed in Black Canyon for lunch and then went back on the river for a further 2½ hours to reach their overnight campsite. Exhausted by their day and a huge supper, the party declined the offered bus tour of the night spots and retired early, in anticipation of the next day's adventures on the best rapids of the river.

Awakened by the hot sun the group, after a large breakfast, were soon on the river again and this time the rapids were beyond all expectation.

Arriving at Lytton, the journey's end, soaked through but jubilant, the adventurers agreed that it was the best weekend they had had for years, and, but for the Salt Spring women, they would never have tried it. Garden Club

Last Wednesday, Aug. 10, members assembled to hear President Aini Haksi give details of the Flower Show sponsored by the Garden Club and this year to be held on the long weekend, Saturday, Sept. 3 in the North Community Hall, from 11 am to 4 pm.

Show catalogues are now available in the stores and all islanders are urged to enter as many classes as possible. Exhibits should be left at the North Hall between 5 and 8 pm on Friday, Sept. 2. Those south-enders unable to deliver their exhibits to the hall at this time may contact Kathlyn Bender at 5702, Frank Reader at 5316, or Audrey Simas at 2070. Islanders are also asked to begin planning their contributions to the plant and bake sales accompanying the show.

The gardeners then discussed with Fred Maybee, of Salt Spring, detailed methods of propagating. They heard that hawthorn, hazel, laurel and mock-orange could now be easily rooted by leaving a short heel of old wood on a new 12-inch shoot and pushing this six inches into the soil.

Rhododendron, forsythia and dogwood cuttings should be 3 to 4 inches long with a rosette of leaves at the top. Suckers from lilac and roses can be re-rooted. Grafting wood can be cut in the fall and buried until spring when grafting should take place. A six to eight inch gash may be kept open with a chisel and bound with electrician's tape.

There will be no Garden Club meeting in September.

Raptors and Rabbits

Raptors are not common, for by their very nature, as birds of prey, they need a large territory to provide them with sufficient food to survive and feed their young.

Bald eagles are an exception because they congregate in fairly large numbers when and where the fishing is good, as do the sports fishermen at the south end of Active Pass. Many raptors feed on small mammals, and eagles are no exception. One was reported

recently to have descended on an open pen in the Montague area, and gripping a young rabbit in its claws made off with it to devour it at leisure.

There are in the Bluff Road area a number of rabbits which have been inconsiderately released by their former owners to become wild, and a pest to gardeners.

AND TWO HAWKS

There are in the same area a pair of red-tailed hawks which at a distance can be mistaken for eagles, although at closer range the smaller size, whiter colouring and the red of the upper tail feathers can be discerned.

These birds dive at their prey with claws extending down emitting a shrill squeal reminiscent of the Stuka dive-bombers of World War II. Pip Finnis observed one of these birds dive on and capture a white rabbit.

For some reason, after the bird had regained altitude, it let the rabbit fall and it landed on a stump. Pip approached the stump and picked up the rabbit still warm but dead. Pip did not spurn this gift from the sky and reports that the rabbit tasted delicious when cooked.

Shared Sorrows

For many months Kendall Roberts, who lived at the end of Ellis Road, has been in intensive care in a Vancouver hospital.

Last Tuesday, Aug. 9, his long struggle came to an end. His memorial service was held at St. Mary's Church, Kerrisdale, on August 15.

Kendall, who became assistant warden at St. Margaret's last January, was very interested in the Boy Scout movement. 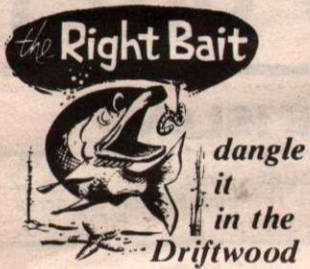

WORLD VISION

They help where help is needed

The family is homeless and the children are hungry but when World Vision becomes involved, ordinary Canadians take part in the response to their needs.

World Vision is a nonprofit Christian humanitarian organization which grew out of the efforts of Dr. Bob Pierce to help Koreans during the war which tore that country apart in the early 1950's.

Trudy Sweatman is the Vancouver Island regional representative for the group and she will be in Ganges Sunday and Monday to explain about the efforts of World Vision to help the needy.

A neighbourhood meeting will be held in the Community Gospel Chapel on Monday from 7:30 to 9 pm. Sweatman will be showing a film, *A Way of Caring*, as focus for the discussion which follow.

At least 16 residents of Salt Spring are part of World Vision as sponsors of children and families in developing countries.

THEY ARE STRANGERS

"We have come to realize that often several people living on the same street are World Vision child sponsors," said Sweatman, "and they don't know each other.

"This meeting will give them a chance to meet and discuss their common interests."

Sweatman will also be part of the regular evening service at the Community Gospel Church Sunday, when she will show a film, *A Partnership of Love*, and talk about World Vision.

The organization draws people

together in the efforts of helping the needy. Around the world, 300,000 children benefit from the donations of sponsors. The aid reaches into 19 countries such as Korea, Costa Rica, Bangladesh and the Philippines.

For \$23 a month, sponsors ensure that children have sufficient food, health care and education.

Sweatman is a teacher who lives in Victoria. She holds a B.A. from the University of British Columbia with a major in sociology.

She has been described as a tireless worker with a gift for recruiting and training a corps of dedicated volunteers from all parts of the Vancouver Island region.

While the World Vision organization does reach so many children, Sweatman said there are at least 1 million more children who need sponsors.

The meetings next week are being held to explain the need for sponsors as well as how individuals can reach out to help.

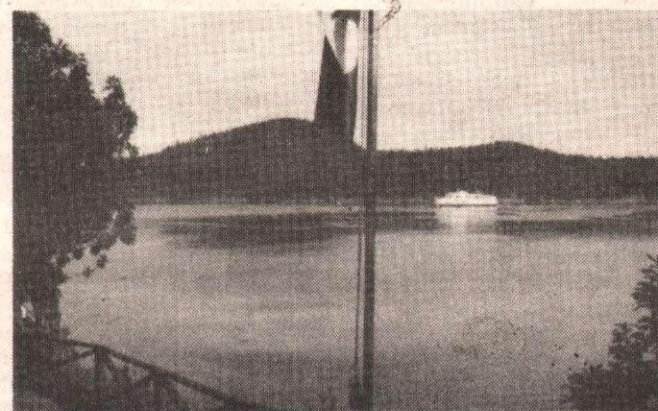

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Pirate Days, by all accounts, proved a success. Residents of Salt Spring and visitors to the island enjoyed three days of merry-making. The opening ceremonies on Friday drew close to 1,200 people. Over the weekend, the festivities were staged in Ganges and Fullford on land and on sea.

The **ferry company** was taken to task about advertisements touting a one-day visit to Salt Spring. The *Queen of the Islands* brought visitors who expected white sandy beaches and other amenities of holiday life. The day-trippers found no such facilities and residents were concerned that the island was getting a bad name.

The **Gulf Islands School Board** released the names of the teaching staff for the upcoming year. At Salt Spring elementary and secondary schools, 17 teachers would be in the classrooms with eight teachers in the elementary section. For the Outer Islands, seven teachers would teach with two on each island except Mayne which would have only one teacher.

A **dormitory** for Outer Islands students attending secondary school on Salt Spring would be set up sometime during the new school year, the school board decided.

A **display** of Indian racing canoes formed part of Pirate Days. The cedar vessels were brought to the island from Saanich. Each canoe had been carved from a single log. The canoes were 54 feet long, two feet wide with a hull thickness of a quarter of an inch. The canoes were handled by 11 crewmen.

The **Fathom Phantoms** held a dive-in on the weekend. The event drew 69 divers forming 24 teams to fish for prizes. With a total of 364 pounds of fish weighed in, the Seattle Mudsharks took first place with more than 75 pounds of fish.

The **visitor** arrived too late for the fishing derby. He had expected to win a first prize. He used a 10 lb. test one with a herring strip and an eight oz. weight. He was disappointed not to win the top award for the largest clam brought up by hook.

An **accident** at Salt Spring sawmill could have been more serious. The worker was tending a trimmer saw when it got out of control. His arm was drawn into the machine and he was rushed to hospital with a severely lacerated arm.

Fifteen years ago

The **Salt Spring library** rejected an offer to merge with the school library. A suggestion to merge the two libraries for the benefit not only of the children but also all islanders was met with disapproval by the library board. Jim Campbell of the school board indicated the matter would be pursued further to bring such a merger about.

The **sheepdog trials** returned to Salt Spring following a 30-year absence. The event drew eight entries from Salt Spring and Vancouver Islands as well as the

mainland. Bill Evans came second to a handler from Nanaimo, Don Beaton. The sheep were wild mountain sheep from the farm of Ted Akerman and the dogs had difficulty herding the wild woolies.

A **ban** on hunting on Galiano Island gained approval of the Gulf Islands School Board. The trustees were concerned about rifles being discharged close to the school on that island. The janitor of the school told of shots being fired over his head while children had seen a hunter coming from the bush on to the school grounds.

The **car** skidded 104 feet along a ditch, hit a culvert and spun through the air for another 80 feet before bursting into flames. Two people were injured and damage was set at more than \$2,000. The driver faced charges of driving without due care and attention. He was fined \$60 and lost his driver's licence for three months when he appeared in court on the charge.

The **salmon** bit an the fishermen kept the crew at the weigh-in busy at the Legion salmon derby. The top prize was awarded to Herb Skuce for a 14 lb., 12 oz. specimen. There were 21 salmon entered and Bruce Fiander came down the list with a 3 lb., 7 oz. fish. Largest cod tipped the scales at 4 lbs., 14 oz.

Ten years ago

Ferry company employees were to vote on possible strike action. The vote would take place by week's end and island residents were concerned that the boats might stop. Resorts reported a loss of business due to the threat of a strike.

The **children** enjoyed the days in the sun on Saturna Island. The wards of the Children's Aid Society were guests of Jim and Lorraine Campbell. The children camped out and carried out the chores of camping for themselves. The group came to Saturna from Vancouver.

An **evening of films** was being sponsored by the Silver Maynes. The group of senior citizens was bringing films to the island for the enjoyment of residents. The events were being set for each Saturday evening in the community hall until the end of the year.

The **bicycle ride** would take two Salt Spring residents to Halifax. Art Simons and son Bob planned to peddle for 40 days on the trip from Victoria to the capital of Nova Scotia on the other shore. The journey was being sponsored by Mohawk Oil Company.

Artists and craftsmen of Galiano Island gathered for a two-day show of their work. Part of the display was taken up by various participants exhibiting their skills on the spot. The weavers and spinners showed their ability to turn yarn into attractive articles.

Sunday service at the two Salt Spring Anglican Churches would be conducted by the Bishop of British Columbia, the Reverend Roy Gartrell. He would be visiting the parish for the day and would begin with breakfast with the parish

committee.

A **fire** roared through the garbage dump on Saturna Island. Volunteers fought the blaze for 12 hours using the water from a swimming pool to put out the flames.

The **three 13-year-olds** from Salt Spring were part of a Babe Ruth baseball team which went through a tournament in Oregon undefeated. David Woodley, Mike Rozanno and Wayne Reynolds were part of the all-star team which won three games in the exhibition matches against American teams.

Five years ago

B.C. Ferry Corporation came to the rescue of a Galiano man. He became seriously ill and required transportation to the mainland for treatment. Contact with the ferry people was made and space on the ferry was arranged.

Fire on a beach on Saturna Island cost two men \$20 each in court. They were accused with starting a fire within 20 feet of beached logs. By the time the fire had been put out it had burned more than 1,200 square feet of logs.

The **weavers** were commissioned to create a wall-hanging for the Royal Bank in Victoria. Josie Clements and Judith McKenzie of Salt Spring Island would use more than 150 pounds of wool for the tapestry which would greet visitors to the bank.

The **Galiano Hall** blossomed with blooms and displays of vegetables for the second Harvest and Flower Show put on by Branch 94, Senior Citizens. The gardeners vied for prizes in various categories and showed flowers and vegetables as well as home cooking to best advantage.

Stowell Lake watershed received attention from the Islands Trust with an amendment to the bylaws to restrict the area to one residence per five-acre minimum lot size. There would be no provision for an additional cottage per parcel. The Islands Trust would be looking at other lakes on the island when a report on the subject was completed.

The **Saturna Lions Club** held another of its annual summer auctions. Mike Hayes as auctioneer, encouraged bids on such items as small appliances, stoves and handcrafted wood tables. The sale raised several hundred dollars for the Lions.

The **beer strike** continued but the liquid could be had at the liquor store in Ganges. The price was \$26 for 48 bottles per customer. The higher price reflected the fact the beer had come from the United States.

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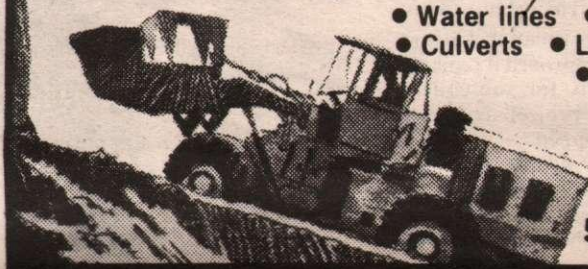

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School board will await sewer committee findings

The Gulf Islands School District has two concerns about the sewage disposal situation at the Ganges school complex: paying for a cure and what the cure will be.

Ron McQuiggan, Salt Spring school trustee and member of the Ganges Citizens' Committee, explained the position of the school board to the members of the committee last Thursday.

He told the meeting that the new financial structure for school districts proposed by the ministry of education made it difficult to determine where any money for a solution to the school problem could come from.

The ministry has told the school board what the budget will be for the next three years but has not indicated how extra money can be gained.

"The new legislation will have severe impact on school budgets across the province," he said, "and particularly in this district."

THEY DON'T KNOW

As for money in the capital budget, the school district is in the same position: they don't know.

A capital budget is prepared each year in December and January, McQuiggan said. The proposals are sent to the ministry for approval and once a project is approved it remains in capital budgets for subsequent years until the project is either completed or dropped.

While projects proposed in the past received approval in the capital budget for this year, other projects put forward for the first time have not yet been approved, he said.

He indicated that it will be very difficult for the school district to obtain extra money until the ground rules of financing are put forward by the education ministry.

The one thing the school board is assured of, he told the committee, is "we'll be in a shrinking budget situation for the next three years."

WHERE TO GO?

The trustees are also concerned about a proposal for ground disposal of the septic waste. The one area available to the schools is the playing field of the elementary school.

The condition of the soil in the field would not allow an adequate septic disposal site, said McQuiggan. He agreed with Capital Regional District director Yvette Valcourt that when the problem of excess water in the Ganges area is addressed, the field may prove adequate.

If a raised field is necessary, McQuiggan noted, provisions for a perimeter collection system must be made to avoid having waste run out to the roads.

Another concern of the school board is the length of time needed to put a ground disposal into the site. If it is only a couple of months, the children could find other areas on which to play. But if the system requires up to a year to be put in, problems would develop.

AWAIT DELIBERATIONS

The trustees of the school district have decided, said McQuiggan, to

wait until the committee has completed its task before addressing the problems at the school complex.

The septic system currently in use is composed of a sewer pipe running down the hill from the secondary school to a septic tank. The line then continues to a second septic tank near the elementary school which

also serves that building. The line runs into the harbour near the log dump.

Mahon Hall and the school board office are on a separate line with a septic tank in front of the office. A line carries the waste to the harbour at the point of discharge from the schools.
