Courts need work

The tennis courts at Portlock Park on Salt Spring will need a new surface and the job could cost up to \$8,500.

The Parks and Recreation Commission heard a report on the condition of the courts Monday. Bob Wanless said the surface could last up to two more years before needing replacement. He had received estimates of costs from a firm in Duncan.

The courts need cleaning and the task would be best accomplished by a high-pressure system.

Once cleaned, the courts could be surfaced with an acrylic base and the lines put in place.

Another treatment would eliminate the acrylic base and would cost \$7,700.

A patch job without the acrylic base could suffice but the contractor was unwilling to put a price on it. The high-pressure cleaning would remove the surface which is in place, requiring more patching.

One of the problems with the courts is low areas. Someone drove a vehicle across the courts when they were being constructed and the rain gathers in the low spots.

The contractor indicated that the low spots could be filled when the surface is repaired.

The commission decided to take the matter under consideration and watch the courts closely for further deterioration before committing itself to the expense of repairs.

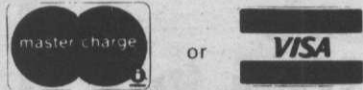

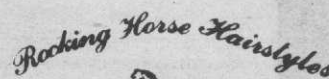

There are two standards for parking spaces in commercial areas. Last week a Ganges merchant asked the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee for an assurance that the committee would apply its own bylaw.

Pub zoning approved

The zoning change needed for the neighbourhood pub on Galiano Island has received approval of the minister of municipal affairs.

The pub is to be located at the intersection of Porlier Pass Drive, Georgeson Bay Road and Sturdies Bay Road. The bylaw approved by the minister sets subdivision standards for the property with a commercial zoning.

Bylaw 28 is to be dealt with by the Galiano Island Trust Committee before it gains final approval.

no assurance that the regulations will not all be changed in the future.

The ministry of highways has a basic standard of seven parking spaces per 1,000 feet of trading area. The Islands Trust calls for 4.2 spaces.

The Salt Spring Island community plan is being revised and all these regulations could be changed, Tom Toynbee was warned.

The question raised some concern among trustees.

Gordon Wallace expressed consternation to learn that the ministry of highways can change any Islands Trust parking regulations at its whim.

"That is why I bring you the question today," explained Toynbee.

The committee took a firmer stand on resisting any imposition of outside standards. But proposals to write to the ministry were set aside and the trustees decided to call for a meeting with the ministerial "upper echelons."

Ministry approves purchase

The school to serve the Fulford area of Salt Spring Island will be built on five acres situated on Southridge Road just outside the harbour-side village.

The Gulf Islands School Board has purchased the site for \$55,000 and approval of the transaction came through from the ministry of education on September 15.


The contractor, Herb Bate Ltd. of Victoria, has waited patiently to begin construction on the \$1.36 million facility. Work had been stopped on the original site on Stewart Road at Beaver Point Road earlier this year.

That site is in a watershed zone and a school is not a permitted use for the property.

The contractor has not evoked penalty clauses in the contract, said Amy McLeod, district secretary-treasurer, and is willing to shift building locations for the agreed price.

The architect had to be called in to make adjustments to the original drawings to fit the proposed building to the new site. The drawing adjustments cost the school district \$16,000.

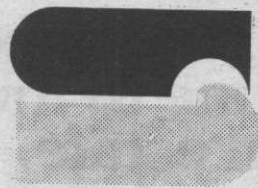

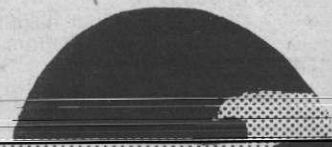

Trust calls for legal advice regarding duplexes at Fulford

Salt Spring Island Trust Committee is seeking legal advice on the use of rural property for duplex dwellings in Fulford.

The committee has expressed concern on a number of occasions over the rental residences erected on Salt Spring Island by Texada Logging Co. The committee has contended that the buildings were not approved for multiple-family residences.

On Wednesday morning last week the committee decided to ask the Trust solicitor for advice.

The committee was informed that the use of a duplex in ALR is only permitted where such residence is necessary to the operation of a farm. The lessee of such dwellings is reminded that the dwelling is in sheep farming country and dogs must be kept from roaming.

Trustees agreed that it was

strange that a tenant essential for the operation of a farm would have to be informed in writing that he was in farm country.

The solicitor will write to the owners explaining the requirements of the zoning bylaw and asking for compliance.

The committee will also write to the B.C. Land Commission bringing to its attention the circumstances and asking what action the commission might wish to take.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Candidates for the local seat in the provincial election outlined their views and commitments on the front page of *Driftwood*. Earle Westwood was representing Social Credit while Dave Stupich stood for the New Democratic Party. The Liberal was Robert Weir and Cornelia Wildman was the Conservative candidate.

The flowers filled Mahon Hall for the Salt Spring Chrysanthemum Society show. Mrs. W.A.C. Bennett opened the event and the top prize, the Scott and Peden trophy, was won by Dorothy Fanning.

The annual bazaar was being planned by the Old-Age Pensioners' Organization on Salt Spring. The group met in St. George's Hall to discuss the plans. The sale would be held at the hall in early November and several items had been donated as door prizes.

Students had returned to the hollow halls of Gulf Islands Secondary School for another year of learning. The elections for the student council had been held following four days of hectic campaigning. Russell Thorburn was chosen as president of the seven-member council.

The Salt Spring PTA met in annual meeting to choose a new executive for the coming school year. J. Evans, principal of the school, was picked to be the president of the group. The seven-member executive would guide the fortunes of the PTA. During the meeting, three new teachers were introduced.

The Guild of Sunshine was checking to see if books for children could be purchased for the Salt Spring library. Members of the guild were also selling tickets for a raffle. The draw would be held at a tea and sale at the end of November for the prize, a doll.

Bursaries were awarded to two graduates of the Gulf Islands high school by the Salt Spring Farmers' Institute. Malcolm Bond and Marshall Heinekey received the awards to help them continue their education at the University of British Columbia in agriculture.

Fifteen years ago

Green plastic garbage bags were bobbing in the salt chuck off Salt Spring but B.C. Ferries could not identify the source of the debris. The ferry workers collected garbage on each boat and stored it in green bags on board for collection at each terminal, but no one knew how the garbage came to be floating about.

Curling rinks were the topic of discussion by two Salt Spring groups. The Golf Club and the Lions Club talked about building facilities for curling on the island. The Lions' plans were more ambitious and included a swimming pool and skating rink but the idea would have to gain approval of voters. The Golf Club planned only a curling rink.

The *Mayne Queen* ran late. A truck loaded with hay attempted to

board the vessel but the load was too high and the truck got stuck. Workers toiled for 45 minutes to free the truck and get the ferry moving again.

Lot sizes in residential subdivisions in the Gulf Islands should be limited to a minimum of one acre, said the Gulf Islands Joint Council. The group intended to ask the minister of municipal affairs for consideration of the lot limitation to help control growth.

A referendum calling for approval of a multi-million-dollar hospital expansion in the Capital Regional District was being planned. The expansion of health facilities included a 20-bed addition to Lady Minto Hospital on Salt Spring.

Postal service to South Pender was not what it could be, claimed a resident of that island. The north island enjoyed daily mail service with the rural route deliveries going out three times per week. The southerners had to settle for twice weekly service or travel across the bridge to pick their mail up at the post office. The south island did not contain sufficient number of people to warrant its own post office, was the ruling from Ottawa.

Ten years ago

The sequel to the April drowning was heard in Ganges court. The owner of the 12-foot aluminum boat which capsized and threw seven men into the water was fined \$300 for dangerous boating. When the boat tipped, one of the men was lost and the remaining six were picked up by Rold Hildred of Salt Spring.

The Gulf Islands were fragile, noted a report to the provincial legislature, and the area should be subject to a land freeze until the report would be acted upon. One suggestion was to create an islands trust to control land use on the islands and no subdivisions would be allowed until the governing body had been set up.

The Salt Spring fire department had a new leader. Kelly Hanke would assume duties as fire chief. He was a veteran of 21 years with the Vancouver fire brigade and had spent the previous eight years in

charge of the city's fire boats.

The injunction against use of the aircraft landing strip in Fulford would be appealed. The Capital Regional District had obtained a temporary injunction against use of the strip and would ask another judge to rule on a permanent injunction. Meanwhile, no aircraft could land or take off from the strip except for the owner's plane.

The school on Saturna would be the little green schoolhouse as a result of a summer paint job. While the colour was cool, the children were warm after a visit to the circus. Jim Money took the children and several other people to the event for an outing.

Sabots raced about Ganges Harbour in the national championship events. The title was taken by Belinda Straight of Vancouver. She had won the event the last two times it had been run. Salt Spring sailors took four of the top 10 positions.

Five years ago

Residents of Saturna Island would have an opportunity to vote on the proposed water system for the island. The minister of municipal affairs, islands MLA Hugh Curtis, had approved the referendum calling for the expenditure of \$580,000 to take over and rebuild two private systems on the island. Annual cost to Saturna taxpayers would be \$16,000.

Tragedy struck on Galiano Island. A nine-year-old girl was stabbed four times and the young man who was believed to be responsible had hanged himself. No names were released.


The Capital Region director for Salt Spring Island, Jim Bryce, died in hospital the previous week. He came to Salt Spring to retire and took over the position with the CRD when George Heinekey retired. Bryce had lived in Surrey for many years before coming with his wife to the island.

The Black Sheep of Pender Island brought home the prize from the Salt Spring Fall Fair. The ewe took three firsts, two seconds and the Champion Animal trophy in the commercial division.

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Energy Data
Autumn Planning

The days are growing shorter and autumn is fast approaching. Now is the time to plan ahead for the coming winter.

Let's face it, one of the facts of life in Canada is that we use more energy in winter. A greater use of space and water heating, lighting, TV and other forms of home entertainment—it all adds up. Furthermore, if past trends are any indication, all forms of energy will likely cost us more this winter than last. So it will pay you well to find ways to make your home more energy efficient.

A careful inspection of your home can determine what needs improvement and where you will get the best results for the time and money invested. Your checkup should include air leaks, insulation, window areas and the furnace. These areas will be examined in detail in future articles.


One of the easiest and most effective ways you can reduce the drain on your energy budget, and a good place to start, is to use your thermostat intelligently. Heating costs money; overheating wastes it. Set your thermostat to suit your activity. If you are sitting watching television in the evening, a temperature of 21°C (70°F) should be comfortable. If you are more active, doing housework or involved in the workshop, 18°C (65°F) is much more comfortable and appropriate. At night, the temperature can be lowered five or six degrees C (nine to 11°F) to provide energy savings of 10 to 15 percent. You will probably find the cooler temperature more conducive to sleeping and also healthier for many house plants.

For most of us, with couples working and the youngsters at school, our homes stand empty most of the day. This is another opportunity to turn the thermostat down several degrees and save dollars by reducing heating requirements.

There are several types of "smart" thermostats that can help you cut back. They can be programmed to adjust the temperature automatically at set times throughout the day. They cost from \$100 to \$125 and can easily replace most existing thermostats. It is usually just a matter of taking off the old thermostat and reattaching the wires to the new device. If used to advantage, a programmable thermostat can pay for itself in one to two years. You can, of course, do the same job yourself by turning the thermostat down as you go to bed or leave the house, and turning it back up when you get up or return home. The advantages of an automatic unit are that it does not forget, and you have a warm house when you want it warm. But either way, if you match temperature to need, you will pocket substantial savings.

Every two weeks through the winter season we will continue with our home energy checkup and offer suggestions for simple home improvements and energy-saving habits. We trust that these will help you avoid the cold discomfort of winter and reduce your energy bills at the same time.

Fervent support seen for tighter controls on watersheds

Second public meeting on Salt Spring Island to consider the increase of restrictions on watershed development showed overwhelming support for tighter controls.

On Tuesday evening in Central Hall, the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee heard fervent pleas for tighter controls in the name of safeguarding water supplies. The voices raised to maintain zoning regulations unchanged were fewer if no less fervent.

The Trust committee had initiated measures for increased restrictions in watersheds when a subdivision was considered recently in respect of property adjacent to St. Mary Lake. Trustees expressed concern that parcels were too small and called for measures to ensure that no more subdivisions of such dimensions could be approved.

The minimum lot size in watershed areas was raised from 10 to 30 acres in the amendment bylaw written by the Trust committee. The bylaw was refused by Municipal Affairs Minister Bill Ritchie and sent back to the committee for reconsideration.

CALLED FOR NEW MEETING

The minister called for a new public meeting and urged that all persons affected be advised of the meeting. About 100 residents attended on Tuesday and another 40 wrote their views.

The proponents of the new restrictions called for a reduced potential density of population as a measure to protect water quality. Opponents explained that there were many other aspects of development, besides density, that affect potable water supplies.

While a number of letters received by the Trust objected on the grounds that the measures planned would be restrictive, a number offered alternative methods of protection of water supplies.

Letter from MacMillan Bloedel

stated that the company, owning property at Cusheon Lake, had learned of the proposed bylaw and had written to the minister of municipal affairs objecting to it, noting that the company had expected notification of the meeting at which plans for the bylaw were publicly discussed. The company had asked the minister not to approve the bylaw and felt that Cusheon Lake should not be included.

Charles Horel wrote to suggest that there are measures which could be taken to accomplish the desired water source protection.

'LOSING SIDE'

"I believe I will be on the unpopular and losing side of the submissions," wrote Horel, "because so many of my friends and neighbours believe it is going to ensure ample fresh water for ever, which will be so pure and vitamin-packed that they will all live longer, happier lives with larger pensions and no cavities."

If he thought this were true, he would be a fervent supporter, added the writer.

Horel termed a myth the allegations that there is a shortage of water. The rain off the roof and a cistern would make a homeowner independent of lakes which are being hardly touched, creeks, drilled wells or other supplies.

The value of lakes for recreation brought the population into the watershed areas many years ago, said Horel. He had gained the report from a health inspector that the state of water supplies was irreversible and that lakes on the island were multi-purpose, for recreation as well as water supplies.

He looked at the fractional acres, splinter properties and other holdings lying in watersheds and on lake shores with inadequate septic tank systems, tanks too small,

insufficiently pumped out and even submerged at high water. He saw one existing substandard lakefront septic system corrected as accomplishing more than the bylaw providing for larger minimum-sized lots.

"With good sense and management we can share this island with many more residents and visitors," he concluded.

FOR MILLIONAIRES

While he agreed with the decision of the Islands Trust regarding the Fulford School site, John Davies feared that the proposed control of watersheds was leaving the land for the millionaires. Watershed should be protected, he agreed, but he felt that the present bylaw was too restrictive. He looked for protective measures in terms of controlling tree cutting and the use of the land.

When Gordon Wallace explained that the Trust had no means of controlling logging he urged that it seek the necessary legislation.

Norman Mouat went along with Davies. The Trust restricts the development of new lots but permits those using developed parcels to do as they please without any controls or checks. He and his family own 300 acres within half a mile to a mile and a half of the lake, he told the meeting. The switch from a minimum lot of 10 acres to a minimum of 30 acres reduces the potential value severely. Like Davies, he saw the measure as closing the barn door after the horse is gone.

Owners of subdivided property have a free hand. He cited the dumping of septage on a site, not in a watershed, but within a half-mile of a lake. A mortgaged property could be paying more than the new, reduced value after the bylaw is passed, said Mouat.

He asked for an immediate freeze on land involved in the bylaws until compensation is paid to the owners.

Rosemary Boehringer felt that water was not just for the people of the present.

"It should be there for our children and for anyone who wants to use it."

When 100 acres is split up into 10-acre lots, the new state brings 10 new roads and 10 lots of tree cutting, she charged.

VALUES SOARED

Tom Gossett stated that when the minimum sizes were increased on Maxwell Mountain, values soared.

If every water consumer were required to add \$5 a month to every water bill, a fund might be built up to buy out waterfront properties and turn them into a natural reserve, proposed Fred Bruynse.

Trustee Bev Unger protested that the water districts have been remiss in the past. They have made no attempt to control septic tanks and disposal systems. She cited Stinson Beach, California, where water and sewage are administered by the same body. If the septic tank is not up to the mark, they cut off the water supply, she explained.

Norman Mouat saw the popular impression that it is unfair for property owners in the watershed to profit at the expense of those outside. He transposed the view to read that it is unfair for people outside the watershed to profit at the expense of watershed property owners.

Les Linnitt asked whether a study had been made of the population the island could support. No information is available on the quantity of ground water available.

The meeting heard some consideration of land-swapping and some thought of the transfer of development rights from one property to another.

WOULD LOSE ONE LOT

Maureen Bendick was among the speakers with affected property who supported the more restrictive bylaw. She stands to lose one lot, she told the meeting.

Owners of watershed should pause to consider the implications of ownership, she urged. She also called for an enquiry into offering a tax break for those who suffer potential loss from such protective measures as are embraced by the bylaw.

"Whatever is necessary to protect water must be done," she urged.

If the question is seen as an issue between safeguarding property owners or safeguarding water, said Sabara Humes, unless water is safeguarded there will be no development.

Jack Avison felt that the emphasis should not be on money but on concern for the community.

Bruce Campbell charged that the procedure of reducing the potential value of land, without compensation, is "stealing".

Islands Trust Act which permits a conditional approval, and suggested that this could be applied.

The community plan needs to be changed in order to define the problems of watersheds and watershed protection and to outline possible solutions. Conditional approval could take into consideration such factors as the type of soil, topography, vegetation and usage planned, he suggested, making the approvals site-specific.

CONDITIONAL APPROVAL

The chairman examined a conditional subdivision bylaw, specifically related to permitted development densities.

He could foresee a mandatory averaging requirement, whereby a developer would be required to site

large lots in the vicinity of water sources, with smaller lots farthest away from the sensitive areas.

Drainage mitigation with an attempt to retain vegetation could contribute. He also visualized a measure whereby a subdivider might be granted permission for a greater number of lots in exchange for a course of action protecting the water quality and quantity.

Any such measures would require expert advice in order to avoid charges of favouritism, he warned.

NOT THE ONLY ANSWER

"In approving the bylaw we must recognize that density is not the entire answer," said Humphries. "A variety of things must be done if we are to protect water in the future."

The bylaw will be accompanied, on transmission to the minister, by a full report of the public meeting.
