Automated service coming

Members of Island Savings Credit Union will be offered automated teller machine (ATM) services next year.

The service will be offered through The Exchange, a bank machine network based in Seattle. It will be the first automated teller banking service in Canada with international links.

Island Savings expects to install its first ATM in May 1984 at its Duncan branch. Marketing officer Kathy Beaveridge said last week that the Salt Spring branch would get one eventually but didn't know when.

However, all members of the

credit union will be issued an ID card that can be used at any one of the ATM's in 1,000 locations in B.C. They can also be used at financial institutions in 29 U.S. states.

The service will provide members with instant, 24-hour access to their accounts. They can deposit or withdraw funds or pay bills such as Hydro and telephone.

Implementation of the service, which will be available to members of several other provincial credit unions, will mark the first time an automated banking network has been programmed to dispense different currencies in different countries.

The system will use a current exchange rate and will deduct the converted amount from the cardholder's account in his home country.

It's anticipated that cardholders in B.C. will be able to charge gasoline purchases through terminals located at gas pumps as early as next year. Funds are withdrawn directly from a cardholder's account and credited to the gas company.

It's expected that the machines, which cost between \$39,000 and \$56,000 each, will also be located at supermarkets and department stores in the future.

Start your hardy plants now

Fall is our planting time par excellence. We are very fortunate, compared to the rest of our country, that we can plant in fall. Perennials, hardy bulbs, all manner of shrubs and trees, all may be planted now to great advantage.

During our mild winters with our abundance of moisture, all hardy growing things get the best possible start towards rapid and healthy growth. By the time next summer rolls around, anything planted now will be well established to resist our late summer drought. And this holds especially true for trees.

As always, the best possible way to get a tree or shrub started is the most simple way. Do not add anything to the soil other than a pound of bonemeal per tree, or a handful per shrub. I have written about this before but since planting time is here, let me recapitulate.

It has finally been established by much research that soil amendments hinder more than they help. The sooner a tree or shrub gets accustomed to its unadulterated native soil the better.

HELPS PENETRATION

Loosening of as much soil as possible around the planting hole has proved to help easy root penetration and spread. Trees which were transplanted into backhoe-prepared holes demonstrated the best root system development as compared to any other method.

This does not mean that we need to hire, beg, borrow or otherwise obtain a backhoe, but that we try to simulate the soil loosening effect of a backhoe-dug hole. That is all there is to it, dig a good size hole, loosen as much surrounding soil as reasonably possible, chuck in some bone meal, insert tree into hole spreading the roots as much as possible, fill and tamp down.

All stone fruit require three to four feet of deep, well drained soil. Apples thrive in one to two feet of topsoil over clay and pears prefer the moisture of soggy places.

Just make sure that there is a way out for water if your planting hole extends into solid clay. Otherwise

you'll have a water trap and create a full "bathtub" effect from November to next July. Roots will rot under those conditions.

WALNUTS, FILBERTS

Since all manner of nuts are excellent sources of protein-rich food which, moreover, store well, easily and long, we shall address ourselves now to walnuts and filberts.

Of the two walnuts are more demanding of good, deep soil. Their requirements are the same as those of stone fruit, such as cherries, plums and peaches. Three to four feet of well-drained soil is needed. Walnuts also require 50 to 60 feet of room in all directions as they dislike crowding of any sort.

However, since they leaf out late and provide fairly light shade during summer and fall, grasses thrive under them and there is no reason whatsoever that two or three of them could not be grown to advantage in, on or around a lawn.

This brings up another point: walnuts have separate male and female blossoms and for some incomprehensible reason the male blossoms are ready and raring to go before the female blossoms.

Therefore, better pollination will be obtained when two or three different varieties are planted within reach of each other. Walnuts grow well only in acid soils and any kind of alkaline condition is detrimental to them, so never ever apply any kind of lime anywhere near a walnut tree.

Given these conditions, trees will start bearing in four to five years and go on forever. Trees 150 years old are not uncommon in Europe.

EXCELLENT DYE

The fleshy shell of the walnut makes an excellent deep rich brown dye for material. It's a very strong dye, evidence of which can be seen on one's fingers if some of the fallen

nuts need shelling.

The filbert and hazelnut are members of the same species. The former name is commonly applied to the European varieties and the latter to our native varieties. These nuts are not as demanding in terms of soil conditions as the walnuts and will thrive in a couple of feet of topsoil over clay, of moderate fertility.

They will grow readily wherever apple trees will grow. Avoid sheltered spots as this encourages early blooming and subsequent danger of frost damage to blossoms. Trees should be spaced about 20 to 25 feet apart and two or three different varieties planted together for cross-pollination will increase nut production.

Separate male and female flowers are borne on the same shrub with a similar inclination as walnut flowers. For better management the shrub should be pruned to one trunk to develop a tree shape, as young plants tend to sucker freely, which would result in a dense thicket. As nuts are borne on the previous year's new growth hazelnuts or filberts require regular pruning of old growth to encourage new growth and nut production.

Both filberts and walnuts are harvested by picking them off the ground. Nuts are best stored in cool, dry or humid conditions, similar to outdoor conditions. At room temperatures filberts will turn rancid rapidly.

Filberts are larger than hazelnuts and therefore more desirable. Do not plant filberts and hazels together as the latter carry a blight to which the filbert is very susceptible.

Given the conditions they prefer, both will provide the grower with an excellent source of high-protein food which stores easily. Once established they are undemanding and the filbert, with its attractive yellow catkins borne on bare branches early in spring, is an asset in any landscape.

This is also the best time for pruning filberts, immediately after their bloom is over. Both these nuts are hard to beat for their combination of attractiveness and good, solid food production. What more can we ask for?

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

School trustees for the Gulf Islands were chosen at public meetings. Only 60 of the 2,784 eligible electors turned out to four meetings on various islands to choose six trustees. Two meetings on Salt Spring drew 39 people to select four board members while 21 people turned out to meetings on two islands to pick a representative for each. Pender Island did not have an election and the annual meeting was cancelled when no one showed up.

Driftwood carried several items from Salt Spring's first newspaper, *Spotlight*. In 1951 public debate centred on dumping of garbage in unauthorized spots on the island, the Chamber of Commerce celebrated the installation of the first street light and there had been two meetings to select two school trustees for Salt Spring and 30 people showed up.

Wet weather worried Salt Spring for September, reported weather-watcher Howard Carlin. During the month he measured 7.42 inches of rain and recorded a high temperature of 68 degrees and a low of 38. The year before it rained to a depth of 4.3 inches with a high temperature of 68 and a low of 40.

B. C. Tel promised dial phones for the Gulf Islands by next year. The dial system would reduce a party line to no more than six phones and would mean only the number being called would ring. Further promises from the phone company called for direct long distance dialing by 1965.

Work on renovating the McPhillips Avenue building into a library had begun. The start was earlier than expected because the project qualified for the winter works program. Fund-raisers reported \$1,200 of the required \$3,400 had been collected.

Fifteen Years Ago

The by-election in the federal riding of Nanaimo, Cowichan and the Islands had been set for February 10, 1969. The by-election was necessary to fill a vacancy in parliament caused by the death of Colin Cameron. New Democratic Party candidate would be Tommy Douglas, national leader of the party, while Eric Winch would be the Liberal candidate.

The Welbury Bay pozzolan plant was being torn down. The plant had started operations in 1962 but had been idle for several years. The plant had processed shale for use in insulation and light-weight concrete.

A petition calling for hunting restricted to shotguns on Salt Spring brought opposition from some people. They pointed out that shotguns were just as dangerous as rifles. Organizers of the petition stressed that the restriction would not apply to farmers who had to protect their sheep from predators.

Competition against high school teams from the Duncan area took 50 students of Gulf Islands Secondary School, members of four different sports teams, off the island. The grass hockey team lost twice, the junior and senior soccer teams once each. The only wins on the trip came when the senior girls volleyball team beat Cowichan in three straight games.

The begonias disappeared when the owner moved. Someone emptied the flower garden of the old house before the owner could brighten the affair came after Driftwood ran the story. Someone offered flowers from her own

garden as a replacement for the stolen ones.

The Gulf Islands Joint Council planned a planning meeting on Saturna to give residents of that island an opportunity to discuss the issue with a Capital Region official.

Ten Years Ago

The province intended to equalize education mill rates across the province and Gulf Islands School Board chairman Charles Baltzer said it would cost island residents money. The local mill rate stood at 22 and Baltzer said it could go as high as 35 mills under the proposed plan.

The Ganges Elementary School was in the final stages of renovations. The school would be open for inspection toward the end of the month. The upper floor would be ready for use on November 21 and the lower floor a week later.

Snow fell on paradise. Weather-watcher Howard Carlin reported snow on Salt Spring on November 3. Snow had not fallen that early in the season since 1926, he said, after checking his files. There had been a nine-inch fall on November 6, 1945.

Voluntary efforts kept the kindergarten on Galiano alive and well. But the residents wanted some answers from the Gulf Islands School Board. They wanted to know if the pre-school classes could be restricted to three days per week and if the volunteers who ran the classes could be paid. The superintendent of schools would talk with the group to see if anything could be arranged.

The bitter cold wind blew and playing conditions were less than ideal but the game went on regardless. Salt Spring Lions of Division 6 soccer played Smitty Saints of Duncan to a scoreless tie.

Grass hockey on Salt Spring had been run on an organized basis for only a year. The junior girls showed that they learned their lessons quickly when they came second in a mid-island tourney in Duncan. The team was chosen to represent the zone at the Vancouver Island championships in Victoria. The girls went through the Duncan games with a win, two ties and a loss. In the

all-island games they came ninth out of 12 teams.

The flags flew in Ganges' Centennial Park for about 15 minutes before someone walked off with them. The park committee decided that the replacement flags would fly only on special occasions and only under supervision.

Five Years Ago

Two men were being sought by RCMP for salmon fishing. Actually, it was the way they tried to land the fish which was in dispute. The pair, from off-island, had been seen at Fulford Creek shooting salmon with a shotgun.

The minister of municipal affairs came to Galiano and signed three Galiano bylaws. Hugh Curtis, the local MLA and cabinet minister, signed the Galiano community plan, amended zoning bylaws and a subdivision bylaw. His actions took place on Saturday and by Monday afternoon, the Galiano Island Trust Committee gave the three bylaws final approval.

Red tide came to the Gulf Islands but was drifting away. The federal department of fisheries lifted the ban on harvesting shellfish in the islands. The ban had been in effect for most of the area between the American border and Hardwick Island.

Rum Island would be the location of Isle-de-Lis Park. Rum Island was located close to Gooch Island and both were south of Saturna. The island would be a park because the resident had given the land to the province with a provision that when she died, it would be a provincial park. The marine park was 4.7 hectares in size.

The boys drove until they were stopped. Their driving left something to be desired because the path they chose was across five lawns on Charlesworth Road. They were lectured on the need to keep automobiles on the road.

The six-team intra-island soccer league on Salt Spring had completed six games of the schedule with four teams vying for top spot. The Cosmos had nine points followed by the Goblins and the Red Devils with six each. The Hornets had seven points.

Energy Data

Energy Efficient Home Guidelines

In many homes, half the energy used is wasted through both the building's structure and inefficient appliances. Wasted energy is taking money right out of your pocket.

The question of how to ensure an energy efficient home has occupied many people and organizations since the oil embargo of 1973. Various standards have evolved. About four years ago, the Canadian Electrical Association introduced its "Double E" Energy Efficient Home Program, which B.C. Hydro sponsors in British Columbia. The program consists of guidelines designed to control heat loss and to encourage efficient operation of major energy-consuming equipment and appliances in the home. There are guidelines for both existing and new homes.

In upgrading an existing home, there are constraints on what you can reasonably accomplish. It is difficult and expensive to add insulation to finished walls, and the dimensions of your attic limit the amount of insulation you can add. Every effort should be made, however, to increase the efficiency of your home—you will be repaid in energy savings and increased comfort. For more information on the "Double E" guidelines for existing homes, contact your B.C. Hydro representative.

"Double E" guidelines for new homes are more stringent. They aim at ensuring that your home will be energy efficient today and in the future. Here are the minimum requirements for a "Double E" Energy Efficient New Home:

THERMAL INSULATION

- Ceilings exposed to the outdoors RSI 7.0 (R40)
- Roofs (including cathedral types) RSI 6.3 (R36)
- Walls exposed to the outdoors RSI 3.5 (R20)
- Exposed floors (over carports or breezeways) ... RSI 4.9 (R28)
- Perimeter insulation for slab-on-grade floors
 - heated slabs RSI 2.6 (R15) unheated slabs RSI 2.1 (R12)
- Masonry basement walls insulated to a minimum of 610 mm (24") below ground level
 - with 50% or more of masonry exposed RSI 3.5 (R20)
 - with less than 50% exposed RSI 2.1 (R12)

Windows and glass doors should not exceed 15% of the gross floor area or 10% of the basement area and should be double-glazed (with a 13 mm (1/2") air space and thermal break in metal frames) for all climate areas below 5800 Celsius degree days. (Degree days are a measure of the severity of the climate. Contact B.C. Hydro or your local weather office for information on your area.) Climate areas in excess of 5800 degree days should have triple glazing or equivalent (e.g. double glazing plus storm window). All doors other than glass doors should have a thermal resistance of RSI 0.7 (R4).

In addition to the insulation standards, there are "Double E" requirements for lighting, space and water heating equipment, and fireplaces.

Remember that the above are minimum requirements. In certain areas of the province, such as the colder northern areas, the ceiling insulation could well be increased to RSI 8.5 (R48).

Teachers walk out

the withdrawal of services was "part of action against the budget and legislation introduced in the current session of the legislature."

Tuesday morning, Marshall said, "We'll wait awhile." He was referring to possible action by the school board on the strike.

Several other school districts in the province have gone to court to obtain injunctions prohibiting the teachers in those districts from striking.

The school board met in emergency session last Thursday to play a course of action. The trustees agreed that the schools should remain open "recognizing that there will be staffing problems in schools and major disruptions to school bus service."

The buses did not run Tuesday. Bill Hitchcock, who holds a contract to bus children from various points on Salt Spring, did make his usual runs in the morning but did not pick up any passengers. **PARENT CRITICIZED**

A parent made two runs from Fulford to deliver children to the schools in Ganges. When she drove into the school complex, she was greeted with criticism from the picketers. One sign-carrier described her as being "stupid" for crossing the picket line to drop the children off at the schools.

The BCTF executive had informed the school district that principals would be in the schools "to provide for the safety of any student who might arrive and to ensure that the school is secure."

On Tuesday morning Bob McWhirter, principal of the Gulf Islands Secondary School, paced alone between the school office to answer the telephone and a classroom just down the hall where 14 students were in attendance.

Glenn Woodley opened the doors of Fernwood School and four pupils showed up, but by 9:15 they had gone home again.

In Salt Spring Elementary, Tom Watson had put the coffee on to perk before opening the doors to the 20 pupils who came to school.

The situation repeated itself at the schools in the Outer Islands. Head teacher Elizabeth Brinson held classes for four students at Galiano School.

Fires down

Forest fires in B.C. this year totalled only 1,687, well below the annual average of 2,200. However, the number of fires caused by people was 67% of the total, which is above average, according to the provincial ministry of forests.

On Mayne head teacher Ian Cocker greeted the administrative staff and seven students. Aubrey Rundle-Woolcock kept the Pender school open and while some students came to gather books, only six stayed.

On Saturna, Melanie Gaines wasn't sure if she should say how many children came but did say that some had stayed.

The instructions to the strikers to keep someone in the schools included the phrase "for the first day". Brownsword said that members of GITA would reconsider the situation on Wednesday.

'AN OFFENCE'

The legal implications of the strike action by the teachers could be severe. According to the ministry of education memo, "they commit an offence under the School Act which for legal purposes is the same as an offence under the Offence Act."

The memo notes that the teachers could be summarily dismissed or suspended by the school board or they could lose their teaching certificates.

Members of CUPE will walk the picket line for four hours a day and will receive \$50 for every 10 days of the strike. The teachers do not receive strike pay.

Mike Hayes, past-president of GITA, noted that "the public will have to take the commitment of these people to heart." He described the strike, not as illegal, but as a "courageous, moral, social act."

But Marshall disagreed. He did agree with the ministry position that the strike was not legal.

"Those folks out there are going to have to make a decision," he said. "If they want to be a union, they'll have to say so."

Members of GITA had voted several years ago on the issue of becoming a union but the idea had been rejected.

The school board meets today (Wednesday) for a regular board meeting and will make plans for action. In a letter to parents issued after the meeting last week, board chairman Charles Hingston said, "While the board feels the necessity for taking specific action at this time, we regret the uncertainty of the situation and would like to assure the parents that we will do everything possible to resolve this crisis."

Marshall said the schools will be kept open whether or not any teachers or pupils show up.

"Part of our plan is to see what the situation is and then react to it," he said. "It's not all over yet."

Liquor outlook is brightest at Saturna

Beer was easily come by on most of the Gulf Islands early this week but hard liquor wasn't as readily obtainable.

Beer off-sales were available at all three pubs on Salt Spring Island and no shortage is foreseen. Beer is supplied by Pacific Brewers Distributors of Victoria who obtain their supplies direct from the breweries. The striking B.C. Government Employees' Union isn't picketing the company.

Only two of the islands, Salt Spring and Pender, have government liquor stores and both are closed due to the strike.

The liquor outlet at Galiano is operated by the Delicatessen whose supply of beer was down to four or five cases Monday. The store reported it still had rum, vodka and scotch.

The Mayne Island liquor outlet is at Miner's Bay Trading Post, whose supply had "just about had it." The store had no beer, a few liqueurs, a bit of sherry and some vermouth.

Also on Mayne, the Springwater Lodge still had beer and hard liquor while the Mayne Inn said their stock was getting low.

The Sh-Qu-Ala Inn at Pender reported no shortage of beer and off-sales were available with a limit of one case per person.

Least affected in terms of supplies was Saturna Island.

The Saturna Point pub reported a good supply of liquor and beer and off-sales were available.

The Saturna General Store, which has the island's liquor outlet, estimated their beer would last about 10 days. Their liquor supply was good for two weeks.

A strike by B.C. ferry workers, scheduled for Thursday, could have an adverse effect on the flow of beer in the islands. A strike would halt deliveries by Pacific Brewers Distributors.
