

Coroner's recommendations passed on to Islands Trust

Last week the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee considered the coroner's report into the death of a Vancouver cyclist last summer on Galiano Island. In finding the death of Pauline Rimmer an accident, the coroner also asked that provisions be made to alleviate the dangers to cyclists on narrow island roads.

The coroner recommended cycle paths, unloading of bicycles after motor vehicles have left the ferry and periodic checks on cyclists by the RCMP.

The minister of tourism directed that the plea for cycle paths be addressed to the Islands Trust.

The committee was told that the ministry of highways had warned the Islands Trust that island roads

would have to be widened to accommodate cycle paths and that the Trust had strongly opposed highways of a width greater than that necessary to accommodate traffic.

The B.C. Ferry Corporation had ruled that it is not feasible to unload motor vehicles ahead of cyclists, reported chairman Mike Humphries. He could offer no explanation for this stand, he added.

ALREADY DOING IT

One watch at Fulford has already adopted this procedure, reported Nick Gilbert.

The committee agreed that the only hope for cyclists in the islands is cycle paths, but there was little

hope expressed that the province would take up the issue.

South Salt Spring Residents Association has expressed its concern to the government, reported Joan Ingram. Among the most serious danger points is Beaver Point Road, she told the committee, because cycle traffic is heading for Ruckle Park. She felt that a double line on the road might dissuade drivers from passing where it is dangerous.

Nick Gilbert urged that in recognition of the special needs of the islands, the province be invited to contribute towards the cost of the project.

Mika looks at provincial projects

On Friday evening, John Mika, NDP candidate was a guest at the home of Mr. and Mrs. D. Stevenson, when 25 people gathered for an informal discussion.

Mika was nearly an hour late in arriving off the Swartz Bay ferry and many cars were left behind.

He opened the meeting by reading a letter from Hugh Curtis of May 7, 1977, in which Curtis said if he was elected there would be no reduction on the ferry service and no increase in rates.

The gathering brought up numerous questions. A written question from Cliff Harrison asked "how can the present government justify tax dollars on mega projects such as B. C. Place and Pier B.C. and others in severe economic recession times?"

Mika replied that, for B.C. Place, \$125 million has been borrowed from B.C. Building Corporation, a Crown Corporation.

The original money came from the taxpayers.

As this is a potentially productive use of money it is a legitimate thing for the government to do, said the New Democrat, but the same amount could have been spent on a natural gas pipeline to Vancouver Island, which would have reduced prices for home heating.

He then discussed the north east coal project as an example of a mega project. Mika said if the NDP are elected they will re-negotiate the agreements with the Japanese.

Mika said some of the money to finance the North East Coal projects is being taken from health care and

education budgets. The \$800 million available for a "rainy day fund" which was available three years ago has been dissipated in mega projects, he warned.

"NDP," said Mika, "plans to

bring back the succession duties stopped by the Social Credit in 1977, at that time producing thirty million." This could have been used to avoid cutting down on Pharmacare and the Dental Plan.

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Kicks advance to District Cup final

The Kicks poured on the pressure early in the second half and soon raised their lead to two. Howell took a Marleau pass and forced his way through their defence before dropping the ball to Bruce Caspar. Bruce rifled the ball home and the Kicks must have figured the game was theirs.

The boys had numerous chances to put the game away but some solid goal-keeping and missed chances allowed Prospect to stay close. It was all they needed as they tallied twice in the last 20 minutes to force overtime.

The overtime period became the Ken Marr Show as the Kicks' goalie put on a brilliant display of goal-keeping to save the team from elimination. Once again the teams

were tied and this time they had to go to penalty shots.

The first two shots from each side produced no goals but on the third, Prospect scored to take a lead. Steve Marleau got that one back, but on the fourth shot Prospect scored while the Kicks missed.

If Prospect could score on the next shot victory was theirs. Fortunately, they hit the post, allowing Bruce Caspar to tie the score once more.

Shot number six was missed by both and Prospect missed the seventh also. Up came Gordon Hitchcock, who only saw limited action in the game, and he shot a ball that the goalie got a piece of, but not enough to stop it from going in.

Victory belonged to the Kicks, a fine achievement for a very deserving team.

Against A-calibre teams the Kicks have shown the desire and maturity to make them worthy challengers in the final on March 20 in Victoria.

Work begins on parking area

Work on improving safety within the Ganges school complex has begun and parking will be restricted in future.

Wilf Peck, superintendent of facilities for the Gulf Islands School Board, asked school trustees at a recent meeting to affirm the resolution passed earlier to make clear what actions will be taken to complete the interim project.

He asked the board for clear authority to implement the interim steps.

Parking within the complex, including the Mahon Hall lot, will be limited to employees of the school board and others having legitimate business with the schools. Students of Gulf Islands Secondary School will not be permitted to park within the complex.

A sign will be posted at the entrance to the complex at Rainbow Road noting that unauthorized vehicles parked inside the complex will be towed away at the owner's expense.

Other signs will indicate no-parking zones and traffic controls will be put in place.

The construction of the parking lot on the playing area near the tennis court behind the school board office has been completed. The parking area off Church Road at the rear of the complex will be improved. Students of the high school can use the lot there.

When the project is completed the price tag is expected to be approximately \$25,000.

Region may chip in \$20,000

The Capital Regional District may be chipping in about \$20,000 to correct the drainage problem in Ganges.

The public works and services committee last week decided to recommend to the board that up to \$20,000 be allocated for the work of correcting the drainage systems in the village.

The Salt Spring Advisory Planning Commission earlier this month heard that the department of highways was considering spending \$15,000 to run a drainage ditch along Rainbow Road to divert

water from the creek which runs through town.

The Rainbow Road diversion would alleviate part of the problem of flooding in the core of Ganges but a similar system would have to divert water running from Mount Belcher on the opposite side of the village.

Vern Roddick, CRD director for the Outer Gulf Islands, said the amount had been set at \$20,000 to give notice that the eventual bill should, if possible, not exceed that amount.

The weekend activities at the centre, located on Blackburn Road, begin Friday at sundown. Saturday morning the Rabbi will conduct a Sabbath service and the remainder of the weekend will be filled with teachings on general topics.

The thrust of the teachings will concern the symbolism and meanings of Passover. The religious celebration begins March 29 and commemorates an incident which occurred when the Jewish people were attempting to be free of Egypt in the time of Moses.

Schachter is a teacher, scholar and author. He is professor of religion at Temple University in Philadelphia. Born in Poland in 1924 but raised in Vienna, Austria, he fled to the United States in 1941 from imprisonment in Vichy France.

He was educated in Brooklyn and became a rabbi, at 23, in 1947. From 1956 to 1975 he was professor of religion and head of the department of Near Eastern and Judaic studies at the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg. Since 1975, he has been with Temple University.

Known as a contemporary mystic with a practical bent, Schachter pioneered developments in prayer, liturgy and nigunim (melodies). He advocates equal participation of men and women in Jewish religious life and has provided a modern expression of Jewish mystical and meditative traditions. He is also considered a major creative force in the current Jewish renaissance.

Five hurt

The accident report to the Gulf Islands School Board last week showed five students were hurt recently.

A Grade 8 student injured a knee on a ski trip and was taken by helicopter from Mount Washington to the Comox hospital. Another student, in Grade 9, injured a thumb on a ski trip.

At Salt Spring Elementary School a Grade 6 pupil bruised and scraped her hip when she fell on loose gravel on the pavement outside the school.

Another pupil at the school was injured on the left eye. The Grade 7 pupil was taking part in exercises on the parallel bars.

In the Gulf Islands Secondary School a Grade 11 student suffered a broken nose when struck by an elbow. The student was taken to the hospital for treatment.

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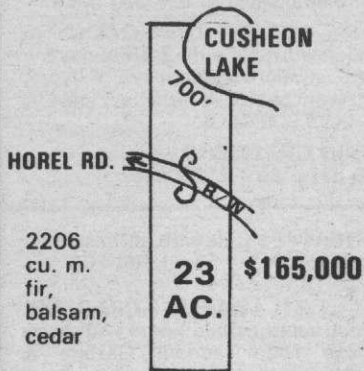

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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Politics and pancakes didn't mix well at the annual pancake races held on Salt Spring Island. The MP for the area, Colin Cameron, came last in the international race. The NDP representative was slightly behind Social Credit candidate Doug Dane. *Driftwood* editor Woody Fisher came second in the men's open event. The annual pancake races were sponsored by the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Royal Canadian Legion, Ganges branch.

The Fulford Hall committee annual meeting heard that the new plastic-covered floor would stand the strain of roller skates. The installation of the floor cost \$2,500. The Lions Club donated \$1,000 towards the costs and paid the entire bill. The committee would repay \$1,500 to the club out of revenues from rentals of the hall.

A special committee of the Gulf Islands School Board was looking into a proposal for a high school on Mayne Island. A suggestion from Galiano Island that the school district be split with the Outer Islands in a separate district met with disfavour. The taxes collected on the Outer Islands did not pay for the schools situated on those islands. The approximately \$12,600 difference between operating costs and taxes was being covered by taxpayers on Salt Spring.

The Salt Spring orchestra held its debut. The five-man combo offered entertainment at a dance held in Mahon Hall. The group had been organized by the Legion earlier in the year.

The car flipped over near the golf course on Salt Spring when it struck a pile of black-top paving material in the dark. The pile was for use by the highways crews and had been marked by reflectors. Someone tossed the reflectors into the ditch and the driver did not see the pile of pavement.

The bus developed tire trouble in the mountains and radioed for help. The bus was near Spokane, Washington, and the radio call for help had been picked up by a ham operator on Salt Spring who relayed the message.

Fifteen years ago

The strike by ferry workers entered its second week and life in the islands continued close to normal. Shuttle services to bring food and other supplies to the islands had been set up and were running relatively smoothly. The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce sent telegrams to Premier W.A.C. Bennett and local MLA John Tisdale to urge resumption of ferry service to the islands.

The flag fund was filled, thanks to the generosity of Salt Spring businesses and residents. The flags were on order. Thieves had stolen flags from Centennial Park and the fund had been established to replace them.

A public hearing on Pender Island would be held to discuss

plans for a 60-house subdivision. The applicants were asking for permission to discharge sewage into Swanson Channel with maximum flow being 14,000 gallons per day. The sewage would undergo primary sedimentation treatment before being discharged into the channel.

Education Week in the Gulf Islands School District would be marked by open house at the schools on Salt Spring Island. The secondary school would feature displays prepared by the students while a speaking contest would be part of the events at the elementary school.

Teachers continued the domination of the pancake races held annually in Ganges. Bob McWhirter, vice-principal at the secondary school, was the winner of the flying pan event while elementary vice-principal Glenn Woodley was third. The races marked the 10th year of pancake competition sponsored by the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Ganges branch of the Legion.

Fulford Warriors of the Pee Wee roller hockey league defeated the Ganges Mounties twice by the score of 9-1. In the intermediate league, Fulford Cougars came out ahead of Fernwood Flyers 11-1 and followed up by outscoring South Ganges 13-3.

A student from Gulf Islands Secondary School, Pat Stewart, took second place in the public speaking contest Adventures in Citizenship held by the Duncan Rotary Club.

Ten years ago

The provincial government had initiated a land freeze in an effort to retain farmland for farming. A new twist in the land freeze was announced on radio by the minister of agriculture. The Gulf Islands would be a green belt, he said. Construction and other development projects in the islands had come to a near halt and the latest news brought immediate protest from residents.

The creek and the inner harbour of Ganges were polluted with sewage, noted Dr. Derek Ellis of the University of Victoria. He had been studying the harbour to determine the extent of the problem. The check of harbour water was being carried out to establish effective measurements for the future.

The play went on in Mahon Hall and one customer enjoyed the evening until he returned to his car. Someone had emptied the gas tank while the owner was enjoying the play.

Gulf Islanders would be going to the polls in March to decide the fate of two spending requests. The school board wanted approval to begin \$281,000 worth of renovations to the secondary and

elementary schools on Salt Spring. The Capital Regional District was seeking approval for a \$22.5 million program for hospitals in the region.

The community plan for North Pender Island would feature minimum lot sizes of 1.5 acres and extensive parks. The plan had been worked out by residents of the island but its fate was not known due to the land freeze instituted by the provincial government.

A footpath along Lower Ganges Road between the village and Lady Minto Hospital was planned by the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce. Construction of the pathway, which would feature benches located along the way, was part of the Local Works Initiative program.

Five years ago

The herring fleet arrived at Salt Spring for the annual catch. At least 200 boats plied the waters around Ganges Harbour in search of the herring. Gillnetters stood to collect \$430 per ton while seiners could expect \$220 per ton. The value of the catch was expected to approach \$100 million.

A master plan for recreation on Salt Spring Island would cost \$11,000, said Parks and Recreation Commission chairman Glenn Woodley. He urged the commission to back the study of recreation on the island. It would allow the commission to plan at least five years into the future as well as to have a guideline for up to 20 years. The provincial government and the Capital Regional District would help cover part of the costs of the study, he said.

The Central Hall fund-raising drive would be put on hold. The committee in charge of gathering money to renovate the old building decided to wait until the Heart Fund, Cancer Appeal and other charitable fund drives were completed before going after the extra \$5,000 needed to finish the renovations.

The rummage sale at the Ganges United Church was a success. Sales were so brisk that some books from the church's lending library had been sold. A volunteer had put her gloves down but managed to rescue them, marked for quick sale, from one of the stalls.

The Gulf Islands Secondary School would be holding a Band-Aid dance to raise money for the proposed west-coast tour of the high school band. Music would be supplied by members of the school band.

The lady drove along Beddis Road, carefully. The cause of her care was a bull with its harem. The RCMP rounded up the stray bovines and the lady noted that she had also encountered, at various times, two mules and a sow on that road.

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WILL RELOCATE TO BUILD.

Water preservation campaign will include membership drive, petition

An all-out campaign will begin soon to obtain community support for efforts to preserve the watershed of Maxwell Lake.

The Salt Spring Island Water Preservation Society will shortly launch a membership drive and at the same time will be seeking signatures on a petition to be presented to the provincial government, chairman Tom Gossett said Friday.

Gossett pointed out that efforts in the past two years to prevent development on the watershed lands have been largely unsuccessful. Repeated appeals to the concerned ministries of the provincial government and to Texada Logging, which is currently developing two mobile home sites on land it owns within the watershed, have been met with an apparent indifference and negative responses, he said.

In spite of a written commitment last June that it would stop all residential development on the land for a period of one year, Texada is now going ahead with its program to install a mobile home pad. The foundation for one has been completed and awaits only the hard surfacing. A septic tank has been installed and Hydro has recently completed the job of running lines to the site.

AGREEABLE TO EXCHANGE
Frank Rainsford, spokesman for Texada, has stated that the company would be agreeable to a land exchange on a value for value basis if the society could work out a deal with the provincial government. He said also that the company would favour a controlled logging program of its holdings on watershed land.

Following receipt of the letter from Texada the SSIWPS wrote to Hugh Curtis, MLA for Saanich and the Islands, and to Jim Chabot, minister of lands, parks and housing. Encouraging replies were received from both ministers.

However, when the matter was referred to Tom Waterland, minister of forests, he vetoed the land exchange suggestion but said he would have his department investigate the possibility of controlled logging.

That was just over a year ago and nothing has been heard from any of the ministers since.

"The lack of action by the government and the apparent contravention of its commitment by

Texada leaves the SSIWPS with no alternative than a direct confrontation of the government ministries involved through the presentation of a petition expressing the concern of the people of the island over the degradation of the watershed lands surrounding the lake and the lack of government action to prevent it," Gossett stated.

Maxwell Lake is the only major source of fresh potable water left on the island and currently supplies water to 500 outlets in Ganges and the adjacent residences. And, according to Mike Larmour, superintendent of the North Salt Spring Water District, water from Maxwell could in the future be supplied on a temporary basis to the

distribution system carrying water from St. Mary Lake, should an emergency demand it.

"This should be a matter of immediate concern to all residents of Salt Spring," Gossett said, and he urges everyone to sign the petition. A signature canvass will take place in the downtown Ganges area on March 10, 11 and 12 and again on March 17, 18 and 19.

Elsewhere in this issue is a membership application form. Residents are asked to fill out the form and mail it to Salt Spring Island Water Preservation Society, R.R. 2, Ganges, with the \$5 fee or drop it off at the NSSWD office, Foxglove Nurseries, or at et cetera. Membership application forms are also available at these outlets.
