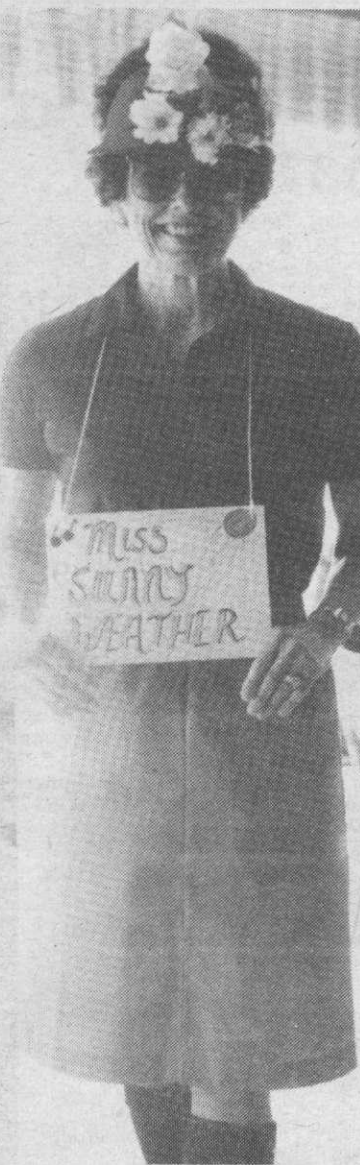

Negotiations close to agreement

Contract negotiations between the Gull Islands School District and its support staff, which have dragged on for more than a year, could be wrapped up during a planned two-day session April 9 and 10.

The two sides, reported Salt Spring school trustee Ron McQuiggan last week, have

tentatively agreed to wage and job descriptions comparable to the Saanich school district.

They are, however, bogged down by the wording of the contract. Representatives of the Canadian Union of Public Employees had suggested a wide range of wording changes in the contract.

Salary agreements for 1984 and 1985 are also close to settlement.

The support staff has been working without a contract since the previous one expired at the end of 1982. That year, they had a three percent salary increase.

McQuiggan pointed out that the Gull Islands district is one of about 30 districts which have yet to come to a contract agreement with support workers.

Regulation changes urged

The federal department of transport is being pressed for regulation changes by MP Jim Manly following a recent coal spill in Stuart Channel.

Freighters anchoring in Gulf Islands waters have sparked concern about regulations governing freighters in this area and inadequate enforcement of existing regulations.

Manly points out that had the coal spill occurred in a harbour, the ship responsible would likely have been charged under bylaws enacted by a harbour board or commission.

Local waters, however, although they are used as an overflow anchorage area for ships waiting to dock at Vancouver or Roberts Bank, are not protected by such bylaws. Some protection is offered by the Fisheries and Canada Shipping Acts but, says Manly, they may need amendments to afford adequate protection in this area.

The Fisheries Act only allows charges if damage to habitat can be demonstrated. Manly questioned

Fisheries Minister Pierre de Bane following the Stuart Channel spill.

Investigation officials, the minister replied, were unable to confirm that coal dust had been deposited on beaches in the vicinity. He also said coal dust is considered non-toxic.

Canada Shipping Act regulations are not generally designed to give full protection to areas such as the Gulf Islands which are being used as anchorage areas, says Manly. The

act prohibits the dumping of only specific chemicals such as PCB's and oil but not coal dust.

Manly has also brought up concern over the regulations regarding holding tanks in commercial and small vessels.

Whereas there are draft sewage regulations regarding holding tanks being circulated, Manly pointed out, there is a lack of responsibility being assumed for providing pumping stations.

Kindergarten to Grade 7 for new Fulford school

The new school in Fulford will contain kindergarten to Grade 7, the Gulf Islands School Board decided last week.

Bob Brownsword, principal of the new school, asked the board to make a decision on the grade structure for the school and for a definition of the area to be served by the school.

Brownsword told the trustees that pupils reached a certain maturity by Grade 7 and help supply leadership and role models for the younger pupils.

"The thing I always look for is the model," he said.

Mike Marshall, district superintendent of schools, agreed with the need for a complete range of grades.

"The school that does not have Grade 7's," he said, "is a little different."

He reminded the trustees that the Grade 7 class from Fernwood would be returning to that school from Salt Spring Elementary School in September. He expressed confidence that the three island schools would benefit from the kindergarten to Grade 7 structure.

The area limits were yet to be determined, he told the trustees. Last year, supervisor of instruction, Larry Holbrook produced a report on the various numbers of pupils who would live within two defined areas.

One area limit had been set to run across the island from the top of Lee's Hill. Holbrook had estimated a potential school population within that area of slightly more than 100 pupils.

The second area was south of a line near Cusheon Lake. The potential number of pupils from that area was slightly more than 140, he had reported.

The ministry of education has set

a maximum pupil limit of 150 full-time equivalent pupils for the six-room school. The first area would allow for expansion while the second area would come close to filling the school as it opened.

Marshall told the trustees that he would check the newest figures on potential school population and give a report at the next school board meeting, April 11.

New school named

The new school at the south end of Salt Spring will be known officially as the Fulford Elementary School.

The Gulf Islands School Board accepted the recommendation to name the school from Salt Spring school trustee David Eyles last week.

Eyles noted that consideration had been given to naming the school in honour of an individual. The Fulford Hall Committee had suggested the name Roy Lee.

But, Eyles noted, so many people had done so many things for the community that choosing one name would be difficult. The school had become known as the Fulford school through wide use, he said.

Meanwhile, construction of the school is behind schedule but the contractor has taken steps to catch up.

Ron McQuiggan, Salt Spring school trustee, told the school board last week that the contractor had hired an additional crew to work on the exterior of the building.

Work on the interior would be subcontracted to ensure completion for the planned September opening. The subcontractor, however, must

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Caring for rhodos easier than learning to type

It is somewhat disconcerting to find out that my fingers are smarter than my mind. They can now rattle off certain syllables on the typewriter before I have time to even think about it. This is a new one on me—I did not know they could do that. In fact, things go a lot better if I let my fingers do the talking, so to speak.

The spelling ability of the little machine continues to improve. There was a time when I almost despaired, especially when I found that it did not know how to spell "I". It would come up with "o" or "u", both misspelled, of course, and I began to wonder if it had an ego identification problem.

Our basic working agreement that I won't look at the keyboard and that it will give up its preference for ancient Kurdistan over English is starting to pay off, though, and it has helped us both through a most difficult time.

RHODOS EASIER

I now know that looking after rhododendrons is a lot easier than learning how to type; actually it can be done in one easy lesson.

Rhododendrons are natives of a forest environment and will thrive beautifully if we can supply those conditions.

Above the ground they prefer partial shade throughout most of the day, such as under trees or on the

east and north elevation of a house, garage or shed.

Below the ground rhododendrons will thrive in loose, airy and moist soils, slightly acid and containing much "duff", bits of twigs, needles, rotten wood and leaves. This is easily provided either with fine bark mulch, peat moss or the real stuff collected from the woods.

This organic debris, or duff, should constitute about 50% of the soil mix. Later on, a two to three-inch deep ground cover of bark mulch over the root zone will be of great benefit to hold moisture, provide that important airy condition, replace decaying organic material in the soil and keep down weeds as well. It also looks good.

Just with these basic provisions you are assured of healthy, splendid specimens which will delight the eye and the heart. An occasional high phosphorus rhododendron fertilizer in spring and again in fall, when the buds of next season's blossom are beginning to form, will result in healthy green growth and profuse blossoms of this otherwise completely undemanding shrub.

TWO ASPECTS

There are two important aspects concerning the selection of rhododendrons for your particular situation. Within the rhododendron family there is also a great variation for exposure to sunlight. The

smaller and darker the leaf, the more exposure to direct sunlight will be tolerated. Conversely, the larger and lighter the leaf, the more shade is required. Thus there are actually varieties, small-and-dark-leaved, which will do well in full sunlight, given the preferred soil conditions.

The other consideration is size. Rhododendrons range from dwarf up to four feet tall (125 cm) maximum, to 30 feet (10 metres) at maturity.

The eventual size potential may be easily determined in a young shrub by the length of its new growth. If the length of the new stems between last year's and this year's blossoms is short, it will be a relatively slow growing, small shrub.

If these stems are long, up to a foot (33 cm) or more, it will be a rapidly growing, tall shrub, which would not be suitable for planting

under a window, for instance. The only other consideration would be the colour of blossoms which ranges from many shades of white, yellow, orange, red, mauve, blue to purple, subject only to personal preference.

PINCH OFF BLOSSOMS

To keep a rhododendron looking its very best it helps a great deal to pinch off all spent blossoms before they go to seed as this takes a heavy toll of the energy resources of the shrub. The looks of a rhododendron can be further enhanced by judicious pinching of the new green shoots as they emerge from under the blossoms. The idea is to encourage at least three, four or more new shoots of equal size and vigour for more blossoms next year and a well formed, dense shrub.

If only one or two new shoots emerge these will dominate and prevent the growth of more shoots resulting in a leggy and sparse shrub. Gently break these dominant

shoots off at their base and a greater number of shoots will grow, and each will carry a blossom in its next season.

This is all there is to it; the proper soil and light conditions make all the difference between a sorry and a glorious specimen and an hour of pinching a year, for a large shrub, adds that touch of perfection to its natural beauty.

It is very natural for the old bottom leaves to wither and fall off as they are shaded out by newer leaves above and hence is not a cause for any concern whatsoever.

We are fortunate to be living in one of the two ideal climates for rhododendrons, the other is England, and I am glad of it. And next year I hope, the annual rhododendron article will be typewritten, giving sufficient further improvement in my relationship with the little machine.

Island spirit of local democracy seen in Peace Petition Caravan

Now that Prime Minister Trudeau has announced his resignation, his highly publicized peace initiative seems to have become nothing more than yesterday's news. Today all the media fuss is about "leadership", not about issues. The focus is on the personalities and images of John Turner and Brian Mulroney. It is a question of style, not substance.

Meanwhile, out in the rest of the country, people are still concerned about the deadly serious issue of disarmament. Many Canadians know, even though it's not in the news every day, that the arms race continues its insane spiral. In response, people work for peace in different ways.

Sometimes individuals get tired or discouraged but new people come along to dedicate their time and energy to the cause. They keep alive the dream that our children's children will live in a world free from the nuclear menace.

In the last year, a growing number of these Canadians have been organizing something called the Peace Petition Caravan. Their idea is to canvass every federal constituency asking people to sign a petition that will be presented to their M.P. The petition has four main goals:

1. An end to the testing of the cruise missile on Canadian soil.
2. The conversion of industries from arms manufacture to peaceful

purposes.

3. Declaring Canada a nuclear weapons-free zone.

4. A call for a vote in parliament on each of these issues.

I've always been very interested in the Peace Petition Caravan, partly because it was born at the grass roots level on Salt Spring Island. It has the island spirit of local democracy, of people working door to door in their own community.

By pressuring the government through their M.P., these people would demonstrate the degree of local support they have and seek a voice in the House of Commons. The entire strategy depends on the

old idea, "If the people lead, the leaders will follow."

The movement was endorsed recently by Pauline Jewett, the external affairs critic for the New Democratic Party. She pointed out on March 16 that New Democrats have already presented motions in parliament that would prevent testing of the cruise.

We have already introduced bills that would make Canada a nuclear weapons-free zone. I support the goals of the Peace Petition Caravan, and I hope many people in our community will also get behind it. If you're interested, please contact my office in Duncan or Langford.

The first swimmer of the year was Mark Harkema of Fernwood who took a dip at Hudson Point. "It was cold," he commented.

Ten Years Ago

Spring break brought problems to Gulf Islands parks. Boisterous campers were asked to leave Mouat Park on Salt Spring as well as Montague Park on Galiano. RCMP were called to back the actions of the park officer in both cases.

The food market in Ganges was broken into and thieves took meat and cigarettes as well as the cash register. The burglary was discovered by staff when they showed up for work in the morning.

In general terms the intent of:

- Proposed Salt Spring Island Trust Committee By-law No. 88 being Zoning Amendment By-law No. 5, 1983, is to amend By-law No. 14 cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978", by altering the method by which Development Permit Areas are identified.
- Proposed Salt Spring Island Trust Committee By-law No. 95 being Zoning Amendment By-law No. 8, 1983, is to amend By-law No. 14 cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978", by rescinding the authority of the Highways Approving Officer to determine whether or not the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee shall have authority to issue Development Permits regulating the siting and design of off-street parking and loading facilities in areas affected by Part 6 of the Highways Act. Part 6 of the Highways Act pertains to controlled access highways.
- Proposed Salt Spring Island Trust Committee By-law No. 96 being Zoning Amendment By-law No. 1, 1984, is to amend By-law No. 14 cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978", by rezoning several parcels to the West and South of Weston Lake, South Salt Spring Island, so as to more precisely redefine the watershed boundary in that area. The areas affected are as follows:
 - the zoning classification of that part of Lot A, Plan 40323, Section 60, South Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District, which is not within the topographical watershed of Weston Lake is changed from the Watershed 1 Zone (W1) to the Rural Zone (R).
 - the zoning classification of that part of Lot B, Plan 40323, Section 60, South Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District which is not within the topographical watershed of Weston Lake is changed from Watershed 1 Zone (W1) and Agriculture 2 Zone (A2) to the Agriculture 1 Zone (A1).
 - the zoning classification of that part of Lot B, Plan 40323, Section 60, South Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District which is within the topographical watershed of Weston Lake and which is zoned Watershed 1 (W1) is changed to the Agriculture 2 Zone (A2).
 - the zoning classification of Lot 1, Plan 39582, Section 60, South Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District is changed from the Agriculture 2 Zone (A2) to the Agriculture 1 Zone (A1).
 - the zoning classification of Lot 1, Plan 28945, Section 60, South Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District is changed from the Watershed 1 Zone (W1) to the Rural Zone (R).
- Proposed Salt Spring Island Trust Committee By-law No. 97 being Zoning Amendment By-law No. 2, 1984, is to amend By-law No. 14 cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978", by creating a new zone to be called the "Watershed Protection Zone" having as its permitted use "Potable Water Generation".

The By-law also changes the zoning classification of areas to the North West of Maxwell Lake, as follows:

- the zoning classification of that part of District Lot 35, North Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District, which is within the topographical watershed of Maxwell Lake is changed from the Watershed 1 Zone (W1) to the Watershed Protection Zone (WP).
 - the zoning classification of that part of District Lot 35, North Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District, which is not within the topographical watershed of Maxwell Lake, and which is zoned Watershed 1 (W1), is changed to Uplands and Forest Cluster (UFC).
- Proposed Salt Spring Island Trust Committee By-law No. 98 being Zoning Amendment By-law No. 3, 1984, is to amend By-law No. 14 cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978", by changing the zoning classification of part of Lot 1, Plan 40786, Section 3, Range 3 East, North Salt Spring Island, from the Agriculture 1 Zone (A1) to the Multiple Family Zone (MF) and to designate the area as a Development Permit Area.
The land affected is located in the Ganges area, at the end of Corbett Road, and is the site of the proposed Senior Citizens' Housing Development.
