## Denman looks at watershed

Watershed protection is best when each area is considered individually, says a municipal affairs official.

Residents of Denman Island are attempting to introduce watershed management guidelines into their community plan.

The Denman group asked for ministry opinion on four possible measures:

- Designating certain areas as watershed zones to allow specific protective measures;
- prohibiting activities of an intense or dense nature in watershed areas;
- requiring extended setbacks from surface waters and whether the setbacks would be allowed on feeder creeks and the holding basin;
- zoning all lands within a watershed to low density use such as 25-acre silva-culture or agriculture zones.

Elizabeth Cull, director of the urban planning section of the development services branch of the ministry, answered the questions.

She noted that any answers to the problems of watershed protection depended upon the characteristics of each watershed area and the nature and extent of possible

contamination resulting from the activities.

She suggested that the importance of present and potential contamination should be examined as well as ways to deal with it.

Questions should also be asked, she pointed out, about the consequences of the proposed uses as well as the effectiveness of the management techniques relative to the cost of implementing them.

Cull noted that watershed zones should be designated in consultation with both the ministry of environment and health.

"...The starting point should be the determination of the sources of contamination and their relative significance and manageability," she said.

Contamination as well as the characteristics of the watershed itself could render prohibition of intense land use ineffective.

Setbacks of buildings would be of limited use unless sewage disposal field setbacks were the same distance from the source of water, she wrote. An additional problem could arise if setbacks were in effect but no controls were placed on clearing of vegetation. Vegetation control, she said, would be difficult to enforce.

Large parcel zoning, land use and density controls range in effectiveness from being an effective tool through being a blunt instrument to being totally useless.

"Their value," she said, "depends upon the nature of the problem in the particular watershed."

# Highways says road stabilizer is non-polluting

There should be no concern about the spray used by the department of highways to keep down dust on gravel in the Gulf Islands, says an official of that department.

Several residents of Mayne Island had expressed concern about the spray to the Islands Trust. Highways officials were contacted for an explanation.

The spray is known as M&F road stabilizer, concentrate which comes from waste by-products of pulp mills. The highways department

mixes one part concentrate to three parts water before spraying the roads.

The road stabilizer, claim developers Mackenzie and Feiman Ltd. of Vancouver, is non-polluting, non-toxic, non-corrosive and non-flammable. The spray binds dust particles together to create a dust-free road surface.

It also holds gravel on the road as a means of reducing regravelling costs, claims the developer.

Eric Smith, an official with the

highways department of the Saanich district, explained that the spray was put to use because of concern about the use of calcium chloride.

The disadvantage of the road stabilizer shows up on hills and tight curves on roads with moderate to heavy traffic use. The highways department tested a section of Renfrew Road in the Cobble Hill area to determine its ability to withstand traffic.

The results showed a need to

respray the road in mid-summer. But, noted Smith, traffic in the Gulf Islands is not that heavy and the roads would require only one spray each year, usually in spring.

The road stabilizing material is stored in tanks in Sidney. When it is needed in the Gulf Islands, it is brought in and mixed with water before being used. Adequate coverage is obtained by spraying two litres per square metre of road.

When sprayed on the roads, the stabilizer leaves a light brown stain. In contrast, when bunker fuel is

used, the stain is a dark brown. However, the increasing cost of bunker fuel has prompted the highways department to switch to the road stabilizer to a greater degree.

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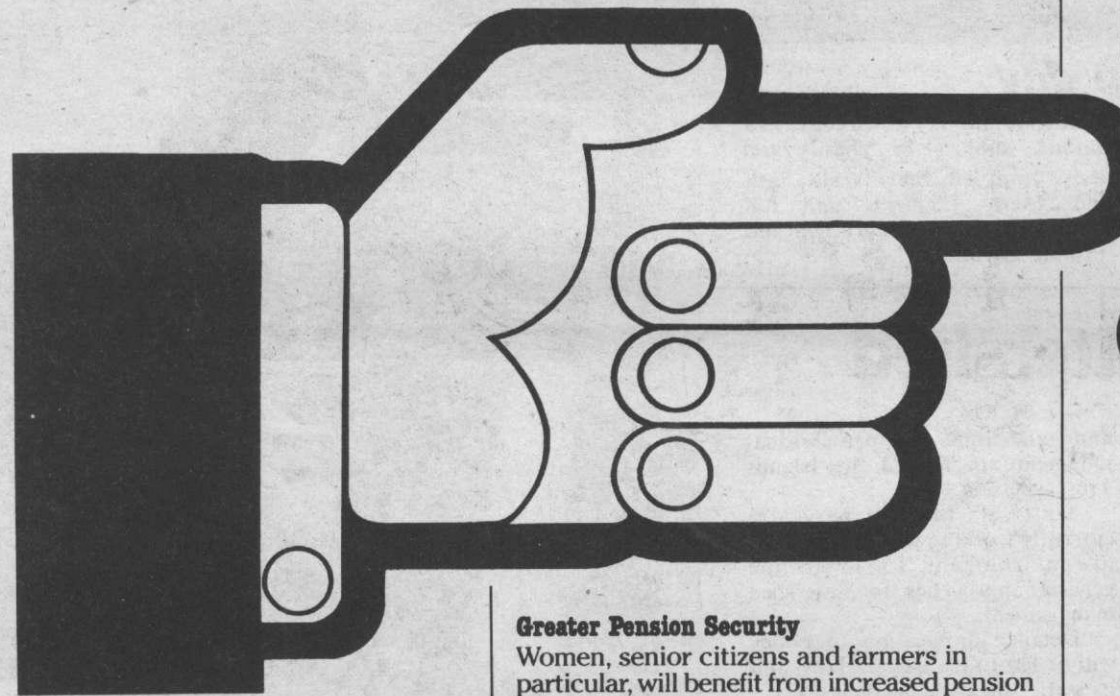
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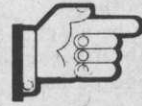
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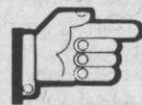
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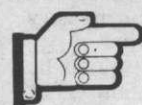

# Evening of British comedy a jolly experience

The Galiano Players reverted to British comedy for their latest production at the Community Hall on Friday and Saturday last. The play, *Table Manners*, was more recent and had more substance than their two previous productions, for the comedy was only a veneer over the tragedy of failed relationships and pathetic characters.

However, the audience chose to enjoy the comedy and the actors to emphasize it, so the evening turned out to be a jolly experience.

The play got off to a good start with curtains parting to reveal a credible set by Joe Fleming assisted by Ian Hooley and another beautifully painted backdrop by Keith Holmes. The cast of six actors shared the burden of the play equally.

Much of the merit of the play lies in the verbal fencing. The success of this technique relies on timing, which was often excellent, but fell flat when actors had to resort to the prompter, discreetly undertaken by Doreen Hillier.

It would be invidious to pick on any of the six principals—Enid Gaylor, Margret Howell, Stephen Gaylor, Ben Miltner, Ken Pattison and Rosemary Walker—for praise or blame. All were adequate to their task and played as members of a team.

Producer Frank Greenhalgh and his assistant Helen Foster probably made the most heroic efforts to ensure the production's success, but the highest award for merit must surely go to the audience.

The Galiano audience is probably not unique but it is entirely different from the usual theatre crowd. The actors are all related to the audience by blood, marriage or personal acquaintance, and each individual in the audience to others by similar bonds. The actors can sense immediately that the spectators are with them and cheering them on, much as a partisan crowd will support the home team.

Those of the audience having critical faculties from experience of professional theatre or participation, suspend these for the evening.

The Galiano Players are to be commended for the entertaining and worthwhile contribution they make to the life of the community.

# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

## Twenty Years Ago

The grand prize, a portable television set, was won by Reg Price and the lucky ticket was drawn by brother Harold.

The Golf Club held its annual meeting and Mac Mouat explained the work being carried out on the new clubhouse. Construction would be finished, shortly, he told the meeting. There would be a spacious lounge, kitchen and washrooms on the second floor to complement the locker rooms and showers on the ground floor.

The Women's Hospital Auxiliary was set to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Lady Minto Hospital in May. Mrs. Douglas Cavaye chaired the meeting, which laid plans for the event.

The Meritorious Service Medal, the highest award of the Royal Canadian Legion, was presented to Arthur "Togy" Layard. Current president of Salt Spring Branch 92, F.W. Kirkham presented the medal to the former branch president for his many years of service to the Legion.

Bea Hamilton reported from Fulford on the number of black ducks crowding the harbour. She noted that when the ducks took to the air together "it is a terrible noise."

The dog, Moby Dick, was reported missing by Dr. O. Stanton and his wife. The pet was found on a ledge near Long Harbour ferry wharf where it had spent two precarious days. Moby Dick was hungry from the ordeal but otherwise all right.

## Fifteen Years Ago

Pender Island residents were considering a plan to set up a trustee-run fire brigade. The idea was approved almost unanimously by 75 islanders who attended a meeting at Port Washington. The fire department would come under the wing of the Capital Region and property owners would help pay for it through taxes.

The department of highways would be paving roads in the Gulf Islands during the summer. On Salt Spring, the road from Fulford to Vesuvius would be seal-coated. Winter had damaged the road and repairs were necessary. Georgina Point Road on Mayne Island would also be paved.

March had been sunny and dry, reported Howard Carlin, the Ganges weather watcher. During the month temperatures ranged from a high of 60 to a low of 31. There had been 3.27 inches of precipitation for the month. The previous year, 6.04 inches of precipitation had been measured.

Papajohn reported from Saturna

that the *Mayne Queen*, scheduled to arrive at 9 pm, didn't get to the island until after 1 am.

The Walkathon on Salt Spring was over for another year. The Lions Club had staged the event with walkers and runners travelling the road from Ganges to Fernwood and back to the village by way of Walker Hook. Terry Stringer was first across the finish line. Robert Dixon had pledges totalling \$313.50.

The Pollution Control Board held a hearing on plans to run a sewer line from Maliview Estates into Trincomali Channel. Many of the residents of Salt Spring who showed up at the hearing held in Victoria were opposed to the idea.

Parishioners of Our Lady of Grace Church would hold a meeting to hear reports from the Salt Spring parish council. Chairman Frank Schwagly would outline plans for the future as well.

Air service between the Gulf Islands and Victoria or Vancouver would be increased to three flights each day to both cities. The airplane would leave Ganges with stops at the outer islands.

## Ten Years Ago

The Capital Region dropped its legal challenge to the airstrip in Fulford. George Heinekey, Salt Spring director to the CRD, had recommended that the action be stopped. The airstrip, owned and operated by Gordon Cudmore, had been the centre of controversy since it was built.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the ferry company planned to put a waiting room on the wharf. They had a well drilled close to the wharf to supply the waiting room with water but the water proved to be salty.

The annual art show held by the Mayne paint and sketch group was being prepared. The event would take place on two days and while adults would be charged admission, children could get in free. There would also be refreshments available.

The vessel L.S. 1516 ran aground on Black Rock in Porlier Pass at the north end of Galiano Island. A department of transport boat attempted to pull her free but failed. When the high tide returned after dark a salvage vessel managed to tow her from the rock.

Opposition mounted to the proposed international park, which would include Point Roberts, the San Juan Islands and the Gulf Islands. Islanders were urged to

send letters of protest to the governments in Ottawa and Victoria.

Driftwood printed the report of the International Joint Commission which recommended an international park as a way of solving water problems at Point Roberts. The report covered 4½ pages.

Water from Lake Maxwell to homes in Ganges was often discoloured, a meeting of the waterworks district was told. The discoloration occurred when the fire department drew water. A filtration plant would correct the problem but the waterworks district was arguing with the highways department about closing a road near the lake. When the argument was solved, the plant would be put in place.

## Five Years Ago

The proposed Bennett Bay marina on Mayne Island was the subject of a public meeting held by the Islands Trust committee for that island. The committee suggested an amendment to the zoning bylaw, creating a new Water B1 zone, to offer safeguards to the surrounding areas. The bylaw amendment would go to a public hearing later in the month.

The *Solskin*, a 50-foot sailboat, ran aground on Danger Reef north of Thetis Island. Horst Klein, out of Otter Bay on Pender Island, answered the distress signal. The sailboat had been chartered by a mainland high school group to practise navigation.

A separate school district for Mayne, Pender and Saturna Islands was suggested by Pender school trustee John Zacharias. He made the proposal at a parent-teacher club meeting on Pender. The school district would cost taxpayers close to 50 mills per year to run, he said. The Gulf Islands School District would have a mill rate of 54 mills for the next year.

Voters in the Gulf Islands would be confused by two elections being run simultaneously. The federal election featured candidates for Cowichan, Malahat and the Islands with voting on May 22. The provincial election featured candidates for Saanich and the Islands and would take place on May 10.

The boat launching ramp in Ganges would be put back together in June. The Parks and Recreation Commission announced that 100 yards of gravel and 100 bags of cement had been purchased for the ramp.

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## Community spirit alive here, fire victims find

Nicholas Gaitt and Diane English lost their Burgoyne Valley home to fire in January but they have discovered since that community spirit is alive and well on Salt Spring.

Neighbours of the couple, led by Robert Andrew, established a trust account at Island Savings Credit Union and the account holds \$2,000.

Susan Cogan organized a benefit dance at Beaver Point Hall and the event raised another \$800.

Gaitt told *Driftwood* this week that many people have come forward with donations of household items and have offered to help with reconstruction of the house.

"I've had tons of people coming over to bang nails," he said.

Dale Fewings donated time and his bulldozer as did Greg Coles of Salt Spring Bobcat Service. Dan Akerman, of Akerman Bulldozing, hauled 12 yards of gravel to the project site.

Phil Swift offered his services as a land surveyor and Rob Barnard drew up the plans for the new house.

When the fire was put out by volunteers of the Salt Spring fire department, only the shell remained. Gaitt was faced with an additional expense of tearing the shell apart until the firefighters came up with a solution.

They used the shell for fire practice and when the exercises were completed, they stood by until the remains of the house had been completely burned.

Construction of the new house has benefited from the generosity of island businesses as well as the individuals who gave time and labour.

Windsor Plywood, for instance, donated 50 sheets of various sized plywood. The manager, Geoff

Swift, arranged with Boyd Distributors of Victoria to share in supplying 20 bales of R20 insulation.

Windsor Plywood also supplied other building materials for the new home at close to cost price.

Glassy-Eyed Productions supplied the glass for the windows.

A & W Plumbing has offered to carry out that part of the reconstruction under direction of owner Art Munneke.
