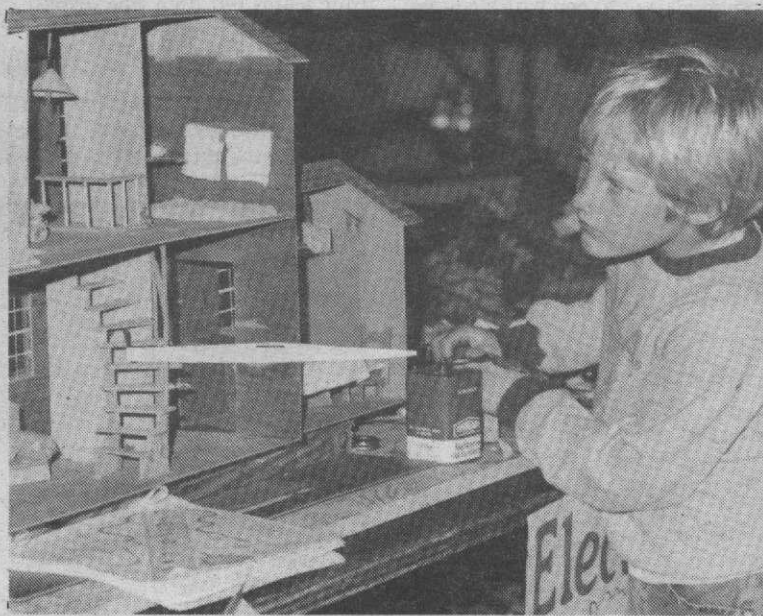

Property rezoned for seniors housing project

The property where the new seniors accommodation is to be built in Ganges was rezoned from agricultural to multiple family last week to allow the project to proceed.

The rezoning, which has been approved by the Agricultural Land Commission, was required by the ministry of lands, parks and housing. The ministry would only agree to purchase the property for seniors if proper zoning could be arranged.

A public hearing was held last Wednesday prior to the meeting of the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee. There was no opposition from the public to the rezoning of the land at the end of Corbett Road.

When the bylaw came to the committee later for second and third reading, Bev Unger said she favoured second reading but wanted it held up for a while to have health department assurance that a septic

system had been approved for the proposed 20 units.

Nick Gilbert, Salt Spring Island Trust representative, said the health department had indicated that suitable soil was available on the property for a septic field.

Unger replied that the community plan did not allow for multiple family zones until a sewer was in place. She doubted whether a septic field could be considered a sewer.

Gordon Wallace, vice-chairman of the General Trust and representative for North Pender Island, pointed out that the responsibility for checking on waste disposal rested with the Capital Region. The Islands Trust, he said, had no authority in the matter of septic disposal.

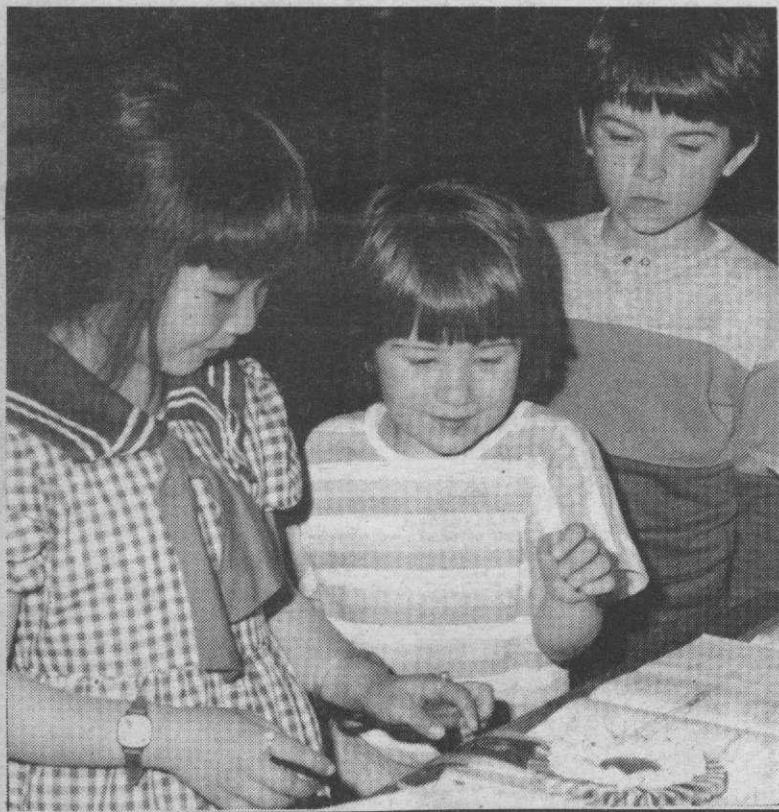
"The authority should stay where it is," he said, "and that's the CRD."

Gilbert noted that the new seniors accommodation was in the area of Lady Minto Hospital and Pioneer Village, as well as close to Greenwoods. The location of the proposed housing complex was compatible with the community plan, he said.

The bylaw passed third reading and will be sent to the minister of municipal affairs for approval.

New zone created

A new zoning classification clears the way for future expansion of the library in Ganges.

The Salt Spring Island Trust Committee began the process of having a bylaw in place to create a Public Institutional Zone (PI). The new zone would permit schools, hospitals, community halls,

libraries and churches.

The library association had asked the Islands Trust for guidance on zoning because the increasing population of the island will require expansion of the library. The property is currently zoned residential and under that classification the facility could not expand to the anticipated size.

Testing session planned

A few more people are needed to take part in a testing session early next month for those taking a General Educational Development course (GED) on Salt Spring Island.

The course and the test are designed for those who have not graduated from Grade 12. Anyone who has been out of school for at least one full academic year and has not received a Grade 12 graduation certificate from any institution may take the test.

The cost is \$40.50 and five areas are covered: writing skills, social studies, science, reading skills and mathematics.

Anyone who wishes to take part in a GED session or a test should contact continuing education director Virginia Newman at her office in Muntz's Mall.

Brochures are available, including sample questions and application forms for the testing.

Test is tentatively scheduled for May 5.

Jazz festival

"Right this way, your table's waiting," is the message this week from the organizers of the second annual Victoria jazz festival, which runs from Friday till Sunday.

The Terrific Jazz Party will feature "10 of the best and most sensational" jazz bands from the west coast of Canada and the United States. The festival will take place at five locations: the Empress Hotel, the Executive House Hotel, the Harbour Towers, the Bastion Inn and the Crystal Garden.

The lineup includes South Frisco, Hot Frogs Jumping Jazz Band, High Sierra Jazz Band, the Rainbow Jazz Band and others. The festival offers 100 hours of Dixieland to choose from.

RYLA is a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards program for students to learn more about themselves; as well as how to be a leader. I was chosen by the Rotary Club to go to Tacoma and represent the Gulf Islands.

The conferences took place at the Pacific Lutheran University for four days. I found this program very interesting, and a great experience to meet other people from different places and learn about their lifestyles. If anyone ever has the opportunity to get involved in a Rotary program like this, I highly recommend it.

I'd like to thank the Rotary Club for making this experience possible, and Tim Stafford for giving up his time to drive down to Tacoma. When we first arrived at the university everyone was nervous because none of the 114 participants that were there knew each other. Even after things got going it was difficult to remember names.

Our first speaker was Clayton Peterson, on *Modern Values and the Quality of Life*. He spoke about our values, their origins and what we do with them. Then he went on to discuss points of leadership and what makes a person a good leader.

Friday's session started with James Wall on *Not Following the Leader*. His main points were: "you need to be yourself", "you're unique", and "nobody else can be you except yourself".

Patricia Burke gave an informative talk about *The Shape of Things to Come*. Career planning, our abilities and foundations of the future were her main points.

One of my favourites was Nancy Paulson's talk on *Styles of Leadership*. Leaders of today must turn to their inward selves and no matter what happens it's important to be the person you are. Her other main point was expressed as, "the power of love isn't the power of fear." Then she guided us in a half-hour meditation session.

The Practice of Political Leadership had a heavy American bias. I found that most Americans really don't know a lot about our country.

The coach of the PLU football team, Dr. Frosty Westerling, gave a very humorous talk on team leadership. "When you're green you're growing and when you're ripe you're rotting", was his bottom line.

John Bollard spoke on the challenge of science. He talked about the space shuttle and how the tiles were made. He also passed around a tile from the space shuttle.

The final session which I enjoyed the most, was *Adventures in Trust*. Bill Owen spent three hours bringing 114 people close together. He got us talking in groups of eight about our faults. We could feel the electricity of love and friendship in the room. I felt this session brought the weekend together.

Not all our time was spent at these sessions, there was a lot of time for recreation, and some for ourselves. The major social event of the conference was a dance, it ended Saturday night. Sunday morning everyone left with a lot of close friends and warm feelings about themselves as well as everybody else.

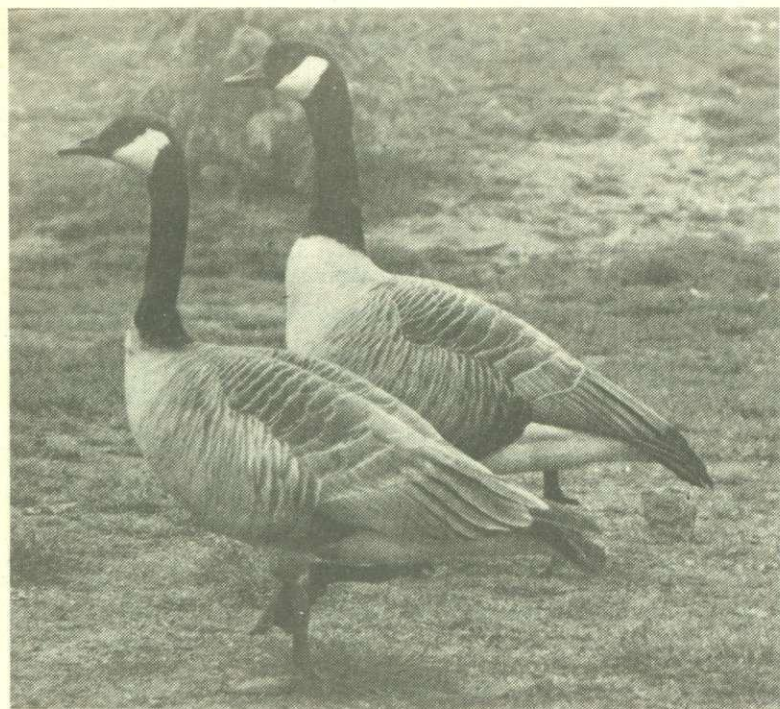

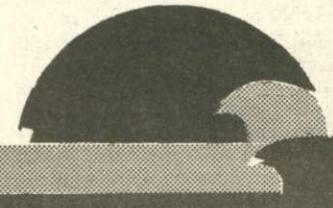

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

The operating budget for the Gulf Islands School District was approved. Trustees would be spending \$297,652 for the year, an increase of \$29,000 over the previous year. The mill rate had been set at 23.41 mills. The provincial government would cover 9.7% of the amount with 90.3% being collected from island property owners.

The Queen of the Islands was going in for refit and would be out of service for two weeks. Residents of Mayne and Galiano Islands wanting to get to the mainland would be able to use the Swartz Bay-Tsawwassen ferry which would stop at each of those islands.

The flower show held at Mahon Hall on Salt Spring resulted in two trophies being awarded to Mrs. P.G. James of Vesuvius. She won for grand aggregate points as well as best floral display. Dr. W. Bradley didn't win for his display of an arrangement using driftwood and flowers. The driftwood he used was a copy of *Driftwood*.

A separate recreation commission for Fulford was defeated at a public meeting. Jack Roland and Bob Akerman had suggested the idea. It had been approved at an earlier meeting but the vote was declared invalid. Both men accepted seats on the Salt Spring Recreation Commission, representing Fulford.

The ferry dock in Fulford was drab, so several residents got together to add beauty. It had been several years previously that Mr. and Mrs. A.E. Roddis suggested flower boxes. The more recent ones had been built from lumber supplied by C. Horel of the Chamber of Commerce. Bob Patterson supplied the earth from his chicken yard.

Rain fell but people gathered for the Anglican Primate's World Relief Fund tea at the home of Mrs. Cecil Springford on St. Mary Lake. Mrs. S.J. Leech aided the hostess. Mrs. Bob Marcotte of the Catholic Church and Mrs. Irl Bradley of the United Church represented those ladies' groups. The event raised \$130.

The cougar which had been killing deer and sheep on Salt Spring was still loose. The hunters who came to the island to shoot the cat had left a cougar hound behind when they returned home. Bob Akerman would continue to track the big cat.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Gulf Islands School Board won't be paying accounts on time for a month. The school trustees refused to borrow money to cover such items as pay cheques because the ministry of education had not submitted the monthly operating cheque on time. School board chairman George Heinekey expressed delight at the move. Interest on the short-term loans had been charged to ratepayers of the district and not the provincial government.

The school in Ganges was crowded and the school board was considering ways to ease the situation. A separate high school plus a new elementary school in a different location would be ideal, said Jim Campbell of Saturna.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that Granmarie attended a shower held by lyrical Lynn and rapt Ruth for youth in 1966. Granmarie said the ladies had fun with games and enjoyed the refreshments. But Papajohn wondered, "This refreshment sounds interesting?"

Judges for the spring flower show

on Mayne Island would be Mr. and Mrs. P.G. James of Salt Spring. The annual event on Mayne would feature the floral handiwork of islanders. Plants and food would be for sale and admission had been set at 50¢.

Pender Islanders were treated to a view of the 30-foot Tahiti ketch *Calypto*. She was tied up at Bedwell Harbour. The boat and her owners Ron and Florence Mitchell hailed from Australia and the Pender stop was part of a sailing tour of the Pacific.

Kanaka Road in Ganges should be closed, said trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board. The closure would allow the joining of the two play areas for the school as well as permit improvements to the bus compound which had been the target of vandals.

The Galiano Club met to talk business. Chairman Tom Carolan noted that the new parking lot was completed and would have room for 30 or more cars to park off the road.

Ten Years Ago

The Red Cross fund-raisers on Mayne Island collected \$341.25. Quota for the island had been set at \$300. Campaign chairman Elsie Brown thanked the 10 canvassers who took part and the many islanders who donated money.

Hugh Curtis, MLA for the islands, would open the May Day celebrations on Salt Spring. The queen and her attendants would be chosen by high school students. Organizer Jack Albhouse was encouraging islanders to submit to the talent show. Any money raised would be used for the Lions' recreation complex.

Mayne Island Terriers defeated the soccer team from Pender Island 2-1. Coach Harvey Hampshire had both boys and girls on his team and they were looking towards their next game against the team from Galiano Island.

When shots were heard at 3:30 am on Boundary Pass Drive on Pender Island, residents went to work. Members of the Chamber of Commerce and the Rod and Gun Club went looking for the people who fired at night. RCMP subsequently arrested two men for pitlamping.

Members of the Salt Spring Rod and Gun Club held two shoots. Bernie Reynolds came out on top in big bore rifle and trap doubles and also took the aggregate trophy. Laurie Mouat took the trap singles and trap handicap. Ellen Bennett was successful in the ladies' pistol shoot.

Fred Greenslade Memorial Bursary would go each year to a Grade 12 graduate of Gulf Islands Secondary School who intended to go on to post-secondary education. The \$400 award was being presented by the Mayne Island Lions Club in memory of the charter president of the club. Greenslade served as president from 1971 to 1973.

The fatted steer would be the centre of attention at the May Day fest on Salt Spring. Mike Byron was adding calories to the steer and Gerry Bourdin was selling tickets at \$1 each for the raffle.

Trap shooters from Salt Spring retained the Inter-Island Trap Trophy when they successfully outshot a team from Galiano Island. The Salt Spring team managed the win by the slim margin of five birds.

Five Years Ago

The approval for the marina at Bennett Bay on Mayne Island was killed by the Islands Trust following a seven-hour public hearing. More than 200 residents turned up for the meeting in the activity centre of the Mayne School. There were 201 written submissions, with many for the marina and many against. The Islands Trust committee decided the proposal was not in the best interest of the island and in rescinding first reading of the bylaw, effectively killed it.

Logging trucks were using the Swartz Bay ferry from Fulford because of the opposition to the log dump in Fulford Harbour, reported Gavin Reynolds. The log shippers used the ferry according to a set schedule, he said, and by doing so did not disrupt service.

The nomination meeting to choose a Social Credit candidate for Saanich and the Islands featured a two-man race. John Tisdalle, who had held the seat for two decades was seeking to represent the party again. But he was defeated by Hugh Curtis who held the seat and also the cabinet post of provincial secretary.

The annual meeting of the Gulf Islands branch of the B.C. Historical Association would be held on Saturna Island. Don New headed the nomination committee for election of officers.

A delegation from Pender Island asked the Gulf Islands School Board to consider posting a teacher-librarian to the school on that island. The school had not allotted time for a librarian and the parents, led by school trustee John Zacharias, wanted better use made of the community-generated facility.

Peter McCalman was leaving Salt Spring for Cadboro Bay. He and his wife Ann were guests of honour at a farewell dinner held by the Anglican parish on Salt Spring. The potluck was attended by 350 people who wanted to say goodbye to the popular minister. John Lomas presented the couple with a television set. Pat Barnes and Nonie Guthrie presented them with a giant quilt made by parishioners. Both gifts were to express gratitude for McCalman's 6½-years of service to the island.

Day of Dialogue to be held at high school next week

Gulf Islands Secondary School is sponsoring a Day of Dialogue May 2 for senior students, staff and members of the community. Theme of the event is *Improving Human Relationships* and organizers are hoping to provide a forum for participants to discuss humanist issues ranging from the personal to the international.

Dr. Ernest Fiedler of the UBC faculty of education will be the day's keynote speaker. In a story titled *Students May Be Our Best Hope for Survival*, published in the April issue of *B.C. Teacher*, Fiedler writes: "...the young not only have the most to gain by changing the course we're steering but they have the best hope of changing it."

Fiedler will speak at noon in the high school gymnasium. Workshops will follow with representatives from organizations such as Amnesty International, CUSO, OXFAM, Salt Spring Nuclear Disarmament Group, Educators for Nuclear Disarmament and the B.C. Teachers Federation racism committee, among others.

The public is welcome to attend all segments of the program.

The problems facing young people in 1984 must seem overwhelming, says organizer Susan Underwood, but with the help of discussions such as these, "perhaps we can all learn more about each other and about working together in a hopeful spirit."
