

New tax rate set for residential properties

The tax rate for the Gulf Islands School District has been set at 3.14744 for an approved budget for 1984 of \$5,734,103.

The ministry of education will cover \$3,545,807 of the total amount which leaves \$2,188,296 to be collected from the islands residential tax base. With the homeowner grant of \$380 calculated on the tax rate, the property owners of the Gulf Islands face school taxes of \$8 to \$14 more than last year depending upon the assessed value of the property.

In 1983, under the mill rate structure, the total school budget was \$5,242,776 of which \$2,104,990 came from local taxpayers and \$3,137,786 came through a grant from the ministry of education.

The tax rate is based on residential assessment values in the Gulf Islands. Changes in the method of applying taxes on property have

been put into place for this year.

Land has been classified into various categories according to use and each category is taxed at a different rate.

For residential property taxes, for instance, the total assessed value of the property, building and improvements is multiplied by the established tax rate and then divided by 1,000.

Under the old system, the property was taxed at one-tenth of the assessed value times the established mill rate.

In the Gulf Islands, the mill rate had been set at 30.7879 mills for residential property.

The ministry of education picks up 61.84% of the school budget this year compared to 59.8% last year. The local share of the money for this year is 38.16% while last year taxpayers paid 40.2% of the amount needed for the schools.

10. Back to square one.

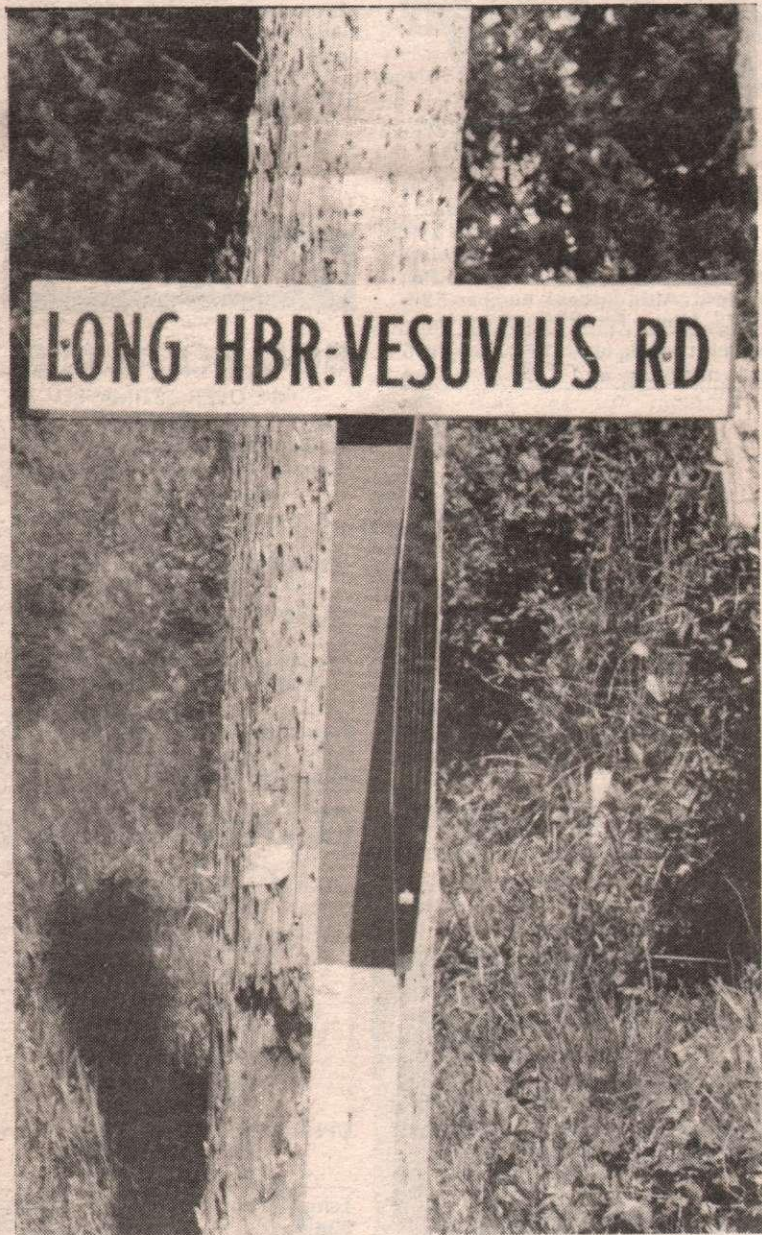
Most of the entrants found their way around the course, but some didn't. Take a guess and see how close you come to the correct answers.

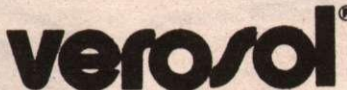

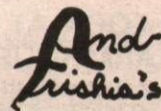

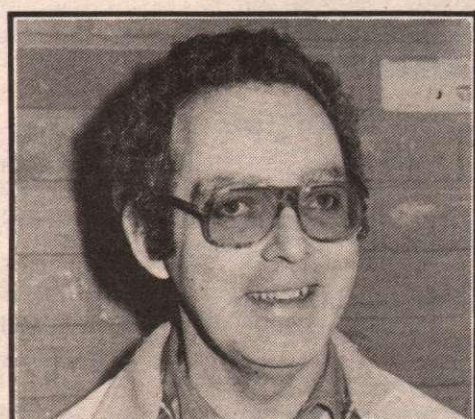

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

Trap shooters from Salt Spring finally won the inter-island trap trophy. The team of Ken Stevens, Gordon Scarff, Capt. W. Cogswell, Joe Poirier and Albert Kaye scored 201 out of a possible 250 to take the event. The competition had taken place for four years and was won each of the previous years by the Galiano team, which came second in the event.

Dr. Norah Hughes, pastor of the United Churches on Salt Spring, was awarded an honorary doctor of divinity degree from Union College in Vancouver. She had been minister to the Ganges and Burgoyne United Churches for four years. The previous year she had been elected president of the B.C. Conference of the United Church.

The volunteers of the Salt Spring fire department answered calls to deal with two grass fires during the week. The fires had spread to the grass from trash fires. The first call came from Fernwood and the second fire had been on Stark Road.

The Catholic Women's League of Salt Spring held its annual meeting, chaired by outgoing president Mrs. Bob Marcotte. The new president would be Mrs. G. St. Denis. The ladies agreed to hold a draw as a means of making money to pass on to the Salt Spring Library Fund.

Bea Hamilton, reporting from Fulford, had more news about the pink seagulls seen flying about the Gulf Islands. The birds had been spotted as far away as New England on the other coast. The coloured birds had apparently been set loose by the California Fish and Game Department in 1955 as part of a study to track their wanderings.

HMS Ganges Chapter IODE approved the purchase of a set of Books of Knowledge to allow education secretary Mrs. D.M. Abolit to donate them to the chapter's adopted school in Tatlayoka, B.C. Regent Mrs. F.K. Parker reported that the National Chapter IODE had sent \$1,000 to the Alberni flood relief fund.

Fifteen Years Ago

Salt Spring would have a full-time fire chief and a dispatcher would live at the Ganges fire hall. The annual meeting of the fire district learned the news from retiring president D.C. Goodman. The new fire chief would replace Fred Donaghy who announced plans to step aside after nine years as chief. The new president of the fire district would be Ben Greenhough. Robert Lawson was elected to the board.

The Rotary Club came to Salt Spring. Bob Blundell was elected charter president; Reg Taylor, vice-president; Gordon Matthews, secretary; Ben Greenhough Jr., treasurer. Directors for the year would be Ken White, T.V. Agar, J. Nickerson and Phil Valcourt. Ted Hamer would be sergeant-at-arms.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the Gulf Islands Branch of the B.C. Historical Society met on that island. Donald New was elected president of the local branch.

The Mayne Island flower show was a success, reported Elsie Brown. Barbara Ross took most of the prizes in the tulip section and the agricultural society was thinking of asking her to give a lecture on growing the spring flowers. Meg Drummond and Marjorie Haggart were other winners.

A hole-in-one at the Galiano Golf Club was scored by Chuck Webb, reported Mary Backlund. The Galiano feat could be attested to by Bill Cottrell, Arthur Platt and Robert Aston who were part of a foursome with Webb.

The Beaver Point bean supper drew close to 300 people to feast on baked beans and homemade pies. The supper was 16 years old and raised \$275 for the crippled children fund. Eaters went through 80 pounds of beans and many, many pies. Peggy Stewart was the organizer who offered praise for the many who helped stage the event and the many who showed up to eat.

Ten Years Ago

The Islands Trust was proposed by the provincial government. The new body would bear responsibility for land use on the islands in the Strait of Georgia. The Islands Trust would be composed of two members elected from each island as well as three general members appointed by the province. The Trust would replace the various regional districts as arbiters of land use on the islands.

The pitlampers who worked the dark of night on Boundary Pass Road on Pender Island were fined \$350 each for hunting with the aid of a light as well as shooting deer out of season. The two Point Roberts, Washington, residents had been apprehended by irate residents of Pender following the incident several weeks before.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that Rev. Jack Dangerfield, rector of St. Christopher's Church, brought the choir of St. Mary's Anglican Church of Oak Bay to the island. Choir master Charles Palmer led the group to the entertainment of Saturna residents.

The first bass of the season were taken from St. Mary Lake. Bill Sawyer, operator of a seasonal resort on Tripp Road, caught two bass which weighed in close to 2 1/2 lb. each.

May Day on Salt Spring was approaching and organizers Jack Albhouse and Ray Simard were looking for entrants in the various categories. Les Ramsey would stage

the baby show and George Lampier was itching to get the flea market under way. Hugh Curtis, island MLA, would open the day's events.

A bazaar and tea, co-sponsored by the Mayne Agricultural Society and the arts and crafts group, raised more than \$400. The money would be used to cover the costs of maintenance for the community hall. President of the Agricultural Society, Marjorie Haggart, opened the event.

A trap shoot on Galiano Island ran out of shells and some of the events could not be put on. Lloyd Baines took the doubles trophy and overall best. Don Robson won the singles while Gordon Robson took the handicap.

Five Years Ago

Fernwood School would be open on time, vowed trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board. They had authorized an island contractor, Ken Byron, to undertake reconstruction of the septic field to meet health department requirements. Costs for the rebuilt field would be carried by the contractor, Burak Construction.

The Red Cross fund-raising campaign on Mayne Island raised \$514.50. The money had been collected by seven canvassers who went door-to-door on the island.

Children at Pender School were entertained by Alihipporhinocridiligator And Gumbboot Lollipop. Actually, Dolly Hopkins of Victoria brought her touring kids show sponsored by Arts for B.C. Schools. The children enjoyed the makeup workshop and painted their faces to prove the point.

The Sophia slipped back to the water after four months of repairs. The 71-year-old boat had burned in December of the previous year and Bruce Hildred, a Salt Spring fisherman, had put in 300 hours to rebuild the cabin and deck. More than \$1,600 had been donated towards the efforts of restoring the vessel.

The beach at Stowe Lake would be improved, decided the Salt Spring Parks and Recreation Commission. The decision was made when the costs of running a swimming pool, \$32,000 for five months, proved to be too steep for consideration. The commission would upgrade the facilities at Stowe Lake as a swimming beach.

Larry Roy took first place in K1 intermediate kayak competition at the Slalom and Wildwater Kayak championship in Capilano Canyon Park. He beat out 13 other competitors to win the 30-gate race on the Capilano River with a time of just over three minutes.

Cost continues to rise

The price of the proposed dye test of the sewer pipe in Ganges Harbour has gone up to \$21,500, says project engineer Steve McMinn.

At the last meeting of the Ganges Citizens' Committee, chairman Arvid Chalmers said the cost of the test would be \$17,500. He had spoken to McMinn on the telephone to obtain the information.

The latest figure came in the form of a detailed cost breakdown from McMinn.

Earlier estimates of the cost of the dye test to check how the effluent would mix with seawater had been from \$7,000 to \$10,000.

The increase became necessary when problems with a proposal to use the community water supply arose. The North Salt Spring Waterworks District tested the water supply system and determined that only 150 U.S. gallons per minute could be delivered.

The test, noted McMinn, would require a minimum of 400 U.S. gallons per minute for a seven to eight-hour period.

The test would require 65,000 gallons to flush the harbour pipe of salt water before the actual dye test could be started.

The engineers suggest that the creek which enters the harbour near the inshore end of the outfall could be dammed to create a reservoir of fresh water. But they would have to test the proposal to ensure that the creek could supply the required amount of water.

McMinn also gave a breakdown of the overall budget for the sewage disposal study.

The original budget had been set at \$82,000. To date, \$50,000 has been spent. The dye test would bring the total to \$71,515.85 with a balance of \$10,484.15.

He noted: "Whether this balance will be sufficient to complete outstanding items of the original terms of reference will, of course, depend on the future direction of the

project as determined by your committee."

If the dye test proves that the outfall works as designed, the only task left for McMinn would be "to investigate the treatment plant site and the extent of the sewered area," he wrote.

But if more exhaustive studies are required, such as looking for "alternative outfall locations or different sewage treatment options," McMinn noted that the balance wouldn't be adequate.

The Ganges Citizens' Committee will have to seek approval of the board of directors of the Capital Region to spend money on the dye test.

The 1983 poppy campaign at Salt Spring Island did well despite the recession, reports Arthur Gale of the local branch of the Royal Canadian Legion.

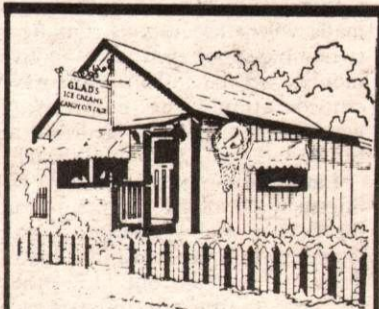
