

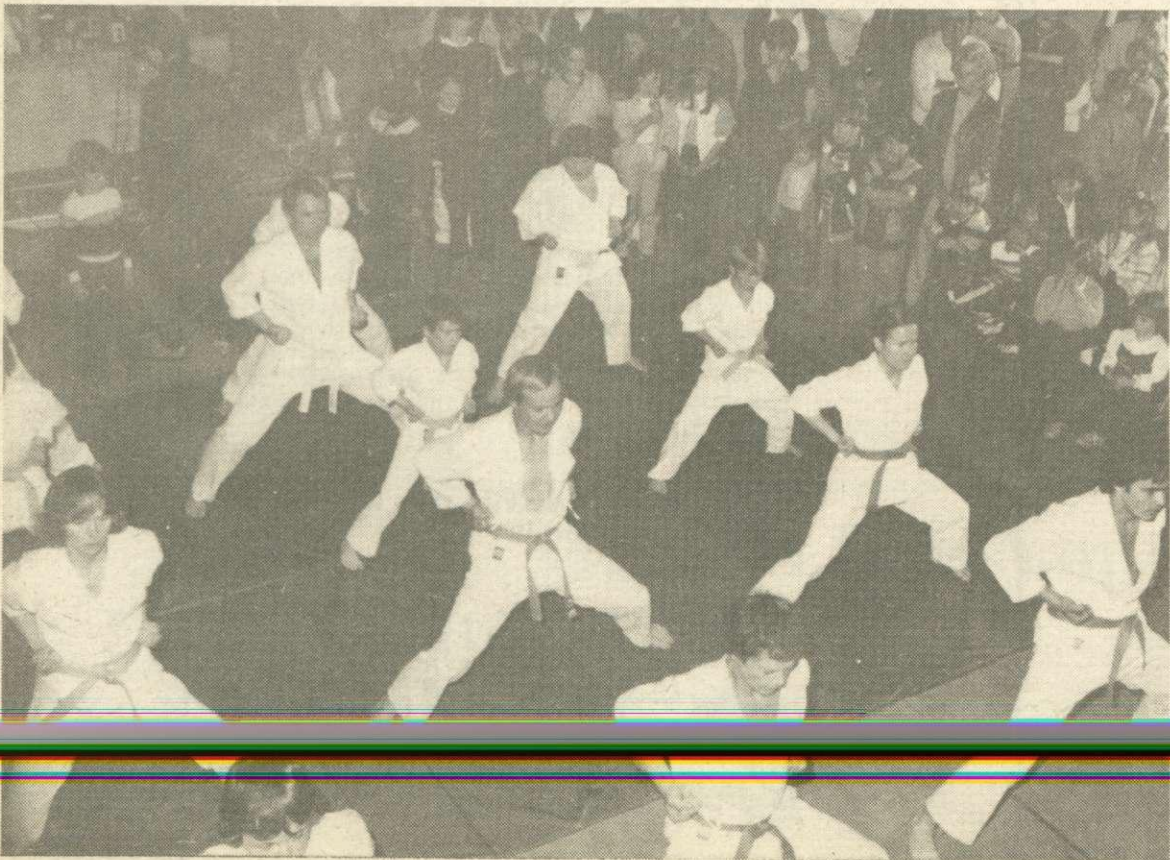

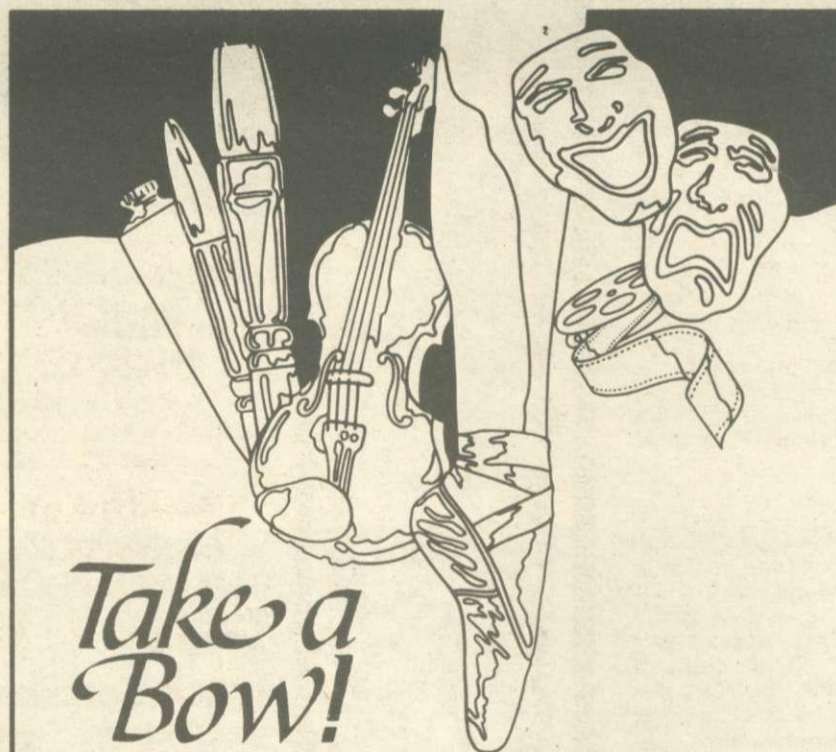

# Both climbing, bush beans require frequent picking

While it is quite true that authorities are a "de facto" minority, since most of us would rather not be saddled with the responsibility which is the automatic consequence of assuming an authoritative stance, there are those who choose to embrace this bristly burden.

It is perhaps in innate recognition of this minority of authority that a "glitch", a creature which haunts all those concerned with the transformation of manuscripts into print, and which at times may exhibit an inordinate degree of wisdom, has transformed my written authority into a printed minority.

In last week's article I was glad that scientists and other authorities are coming around to my point of view, and this week I am glad of the perceptive wisdom and profound insights inherent in the perspicacious transformation of

## Special education committee named

The special education program for Gulf Islands schools will be headed by a seven-member committee; the Gulf Islands School Board decided last week.

authorities to minorities.

However profound the process of transformation may prove to be, in this or other respects, we will concern ourselves with a more prosaic, if equally profound transformation this week, the transformation of a bean into a hill of beans.

### TWO KINDS

There are two kinds of beans, those which climb and those which do not. The differences are more profound than appears at first glance and involve far more than a climbing or bushy habit of growth. Climbing beans typically begin to bear beans about two weeks later than the bush types but keep on

bearing until it gets too cold for them.

Bush beans on the other hand, aside from producing beans earlier, have a much shorter and much more concentrated period of production.

Thus the more determinate, or bushy their growth habit is, the shorter and more productive their harvest period will be, to come to a complete stop long before the season for beans comes to an end.

This is the result of plant breeding for commercial bean production and machine harvesting at the peak of their production. A happy medium between the two kinds is my favourite bush bean, "Blue Lake Bush", which has a very nice bushy habit but retains the long production period of the climbing types. It is also of excellent quality in taste and texture.

### PICK FREQUENTLY

Both the climbing and bushy types have this in common though; they both require frequent picking to keep on producing beans. Picking on the young side is far better than

when the beans begin to fill out. At that time the plant starts to produce hormones which prevent blooming to quicken the ripening process.

So, altogether we have a wide range of choices to suit every purpose, from a quick, once over harvest, to a continuous supply, for the three-crop soil and fertility improvement rotation, and for interplanting.

The *Organic Gardening* folks have run several well controlled experiments with some amazing results. For instance, bush beans interplanted with cabbages resulted in a 23% greater yield of cabbage and a 100% yield of beans as compared to the mono-cropped control plots.

Bush beans interplanted with staked tomatoes yielded a 100% tomato crop combined with a whopping 66% increase in bean production as compared with the mono-crop control plots.

Even beans with peppers fared quite well. Although pepper

production was only 64% of the mono-crop control, the beans came in at 164% over normal. This should have the most profound implications, especially for commercial produce production, when two excellent harvests can be obtained from the same plot at the same time. Even the reduced yield of the peppers still came from the same plot of a massively increased bean harvest at the same time.

Added to all this is better moisture retention with complete green ground cover, less incidence of insect and disease damage and the nitrogen rich plant residue of the beans when returned to the soil as green manure.

Double-bumper crops from the same plot at the same time are an indication of the potential of the earth and we have not even begun to scratch the surface of her potential. Perhaps even here we shall see a transformation of methods, a change from fighting nature to one of intelligent co-operation which will benefit all concerned.

a raffle and tickets are currently being sold. This painting is on display at Mout's and the lucky ticket will be drawn on the Monday of the exhibition.

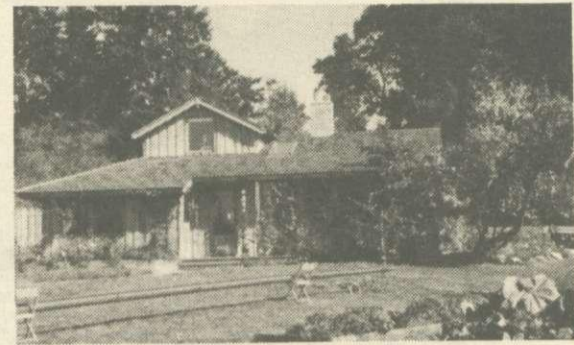

## 'Recycle depot could be busier'

The recycle shed behind the Valcourt Centre in Ganges gets busy at times, but it could be busier, says depot co-ordinator Donna Martin.

The recycle depot, where bottles, cans as well as newspapers and magazines can be left, is a project of the Salt Spring Community Society.

Each month, Martin said, two tons of paper, up to four tons of glass and between one and two tons of flattened cans are shipped to Victoria.

But consider the fact that only about five per cent of the island's residents utilize the recycle depot.

And Martin wants to increase that figure as much as possible.

About 80% of the garbage produced in the home can be recycled, she said. If the depot were utilized more, it could become self-sustaining and supply employment for two or three people. For instance, she notes, newsprint can bring in \$85 per ton.

Currently, Martin drops in three days each week to separate the bottles by colour and break them in large barrels. The tied bundles of paper are stacked in a corner of the shed and the flattened tin cans are neatly piled.

On Saturdays, Eddie Waddell comes in to give her a hand.

The real problem for the recycle depot is people who recycle the wrong way. Martin has a few tips for recyclers. She suggests that while newspapers, magazines and cardboard can be brought in, each kind should be separated and tied in secure bundles.

Cans should be tin or aluminum. They should be washed, labels and the ends removed and the can flattened.

The depot cannot handle scrap metal, so no bottle caps, nails or empty paint cans need apply.

For glass, Martin suggests that the bottles be cleaned, lids removed and the bottles be brought in unbroken.

She also suggests that no flat glass such as window panes be added to the load.

Martin also offered some suggestions to increase business at the depot.

A logo should be designed and painted on a sign letting people know what the shed is all about. The shed itself should be painted. "If it looks good, it will be treated better," she said.

The approach to the depot can,

on occasion, become muddy and Martin suggests the placement of gravel to avoid muddy footprints in people's cars.

A home pick-up service should be given careful consideration and if possible such a service should be started.

To that end, Martin suggests a publicity campaign to inform people about recycling. The campaign could be extended to the schools as well.

Other suggestions include setting up collection points for used motor oil and pesticide containers.

Although she estimates that only five per cent of island residents use the depot she would like to make sure. A book will be placed in the depot and anyone using the facility is asked to sign his name. That way she could find out how many people send things out for reuse.

win a door prize. For those not living on the Penders and wishing to attend billets will be arranged. Contact Frank Jones or Victoria Gillespie.

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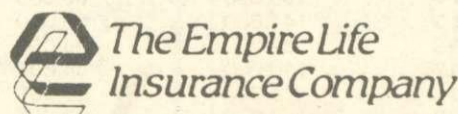

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# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

## Twenty Years Ago

A referendum for expansion of school facilities had been approved by the department of education. Voters would be asked to approve \$463,912 for a new high school as well as \$12,540 for a new teacherage on Galiano. The vote would be held as soon as possible.

B.C. Premier W.A.C. Bennett officiated at the launching of the new ferry, *Queen of New Westminster*, and announced further expansion plans for B.C. Ferries. One of the new ferries would travel between Swartz Bay and Tsawwassen with stops in the Gulf Islands and three new, smaller ferries would be put into service in Howe Sound and the Gulf Islands.

Bea Hamilton reported from Fulford of more events for May Day. Bob Akerman, she said, was looking for entrants in a horseshoe pitching contest. The fun would include a parade with action taking place in Shaw's field while the W.I. would hold a tea in Fulford Hall.

A fresh water fishing derby was planned by the Salt Spring Rod and Gun Club. Fred Morris was in charge of the tickets and the club was expecting many entrants. A bass and trout season derby was planned for members of the club only.

The water lines between St. Mary Lake and Fernwood on Salt Spring were nearing readiness for supplying water to the north end community.

The North End Neighbours of Salt Spring had prepared and shipped 14 more boxes of clothing to the Unitarian Services Committee. With the latest shipment, the total number of boxes for the year stood at 51. The committee in charge of the effort issued a thank you to all islanders who had helped, with special thanks to *Driftwood* for publicity as well as Mouat Brothers and Dave Winters for transportation of the boxes to Victoria.

The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce would be holding a public meeting to gauge opinion on the need for a community plan. They would also discuss a proposal to create a park in Ganges as a national centennial project.

## Fifteen Years Ago

A dinner meeting of the Galiano Chamber of Commerce heard island MLA John Tisdalle announce plans to blacktop many island roads. New president Fred Robson and vice-president Steve Riddell were sworn into office. Catering was done by the Galiano Club under direction of Tom Carolan. Chamber membership secretary Mrs. Ches Williams reported that 66 people belonged to the group.

A fire in Montague Marine Park on Galiano Island was fought by the Waggon Wheels Square Dancers of Salt Spring. The group had gone to the park for an outing and when Alphonso Sencio saw the fire, the group went to work. A bucket brigade, under the direction of Bert Barber, quelled the blaze so that by the time Galiano fire fighters led by fire chief Dave Laughlin arrived, everything was under control.

The department of highways was confused. Letters to the department

from two Salt Spring groups expressed opposite opinions. The Chamber of Commerce wanted some of the highway hazards eliminated. The South Salt Spring Residents Association wanted the department to do nothing to island roads.

The Community Association of Mayne Island gathered to talk about problems at the First Aid Post. Association president Alan Steward chaired the meeting which decided to take action to begin first aid courses and purchase a pump for the post. Other action approved by the meeting included starting pollution control in efforts to clean up Miners Bay.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that Granmarie and other ladies of the island were treated to a Sunday service at church without the men. The men of the island decided that the ladies deserved Mother's Day in church to themselves.

The *Sechelt Queen* was back in service following a refit. Captain Denis Carter and Salt Spring terminal agent Robert Anderson held a guided tour of the vessel to show the changes. A dining room and coffee bar had been installed. The funnel had been moved so that the smoke did not come back to the passenger deck. Changes to the ship cost an estimated \$500,000.

## Ten Years Ago

The public hearing lasted only a few minutes and could qualify as the shortest such meeting held on Salt Spring. A mistake was made when bylaw 66 had been drawn up and it prompted a rezoning application for the Valcourt Centre. A portion of the property had been zoned industrial 2 when it should have been commercial 1, Yvette Valcourt told the hearing. When no one else spoke the hearing was closed off and the application approved.

The Capital Region Hospital Board approved \$500,000 to upgrade and improve facilities at Lady Minto Hospital on Salt Spring. The work was needed to modernize and expand the kitchen.

They sailed around Salt Spring Island for the first annual Marshall Sharp Memorial Trophy race. Geoff Cue, in the 30-foot *Tessera*, took first place despite being caught for seven circles in a whirlpool in Sansum Narrows. Laurie Neish, in the 23-foot *Clarion*, skippered by Aileen Neish, crossed the finish line first but when the handicaps were applied, Cue's vessel was declared the winner. Neish's time was 14 hours, 23 minutes, while Cue took 15 hours, 12 minutes.

Papajohn reported from Saturna on plans for a chickenalia to be put on by the fire department of the island. Jim Money and the boys were ready to host the event with the refreshment bar opening at 4 pm and dinner being served at 6 and 7 pm.

The alternative class from the white house on Ganges Hill held a bottle drive and raised \$88.69. The money was presented to the Salt

Spring Lions Club by Lisa Sigurgeirson. Aage Villadsen accepted the donation which was to go to the fund for the proposed recreation complex on the island.

A strongly-worded letter in opposition to the proposed international park was sent by the Galiano Chamber of Commerce to federal cabinet minister Mitchell Sharp.

The long weekend of May 24 prompted plans for increased police patrols. In the past, youthful visitors caused problems. Two police patrol boats would cruise the waters and more officers would patrol on land.

## Five Years Ago

The provincial election resulted in the return of the Social Credit government. Hugh Curtis maintained his seat representing Saanich and the Islands. The Socreds ended up with three fewer seats than they held prior to the election while the NDP gained eight. With one election out of the way, islanders prepared to vote for a candidate in the national election.

Construction began on the controversial wharf at Bennett Bay on Mayne Island. Weldon Pinchin, of the Mayne Inn, said the work was legal according to the British North America Act and challenged the Islands Trust, which had turned down his application for the wharf, to take him to court to prove otherwise.

The official re-opening of Lady Minto Hospital took place. The hospital had undergone a \$450,000 expansion. Mrs. Warren Hastings opened the door just as she had done when the hospital had been opened in 1958.

The golfer used a four wood on the fourth hole and scored a hole-in-one. Marion Duncan achieved the feat at the Galiano golf course while playing the game with her husband Bill. She was the first lady golfer for many years to card an ace.

The Farmers' Institute on Pender Island heard guest speaker Len Henshaw of South Pender talk about raising sheep. Short-legged sheep such as Dorsets were favoured for the Gulf Islands, he said. On small properties, two ewes to the acre was the ideal size flock.

The mill rate for the school tax in the Gulf Islands had been set at 46.938 mills. That represented a reduction of about one-tenth of a mill from the previous year. The average mill rate across the province stood at 49 mills. Gulf Island taxpayers would be contributing \$430,000 to other school districts in B.C. as part of the government's equalization tax.

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# Smoking regulations get board approval

Smoking is out. The new smoking control bylaw was approved by the Capital Regional Board last week and now awaits provincial sanction before coming into effect.

Where people gather, the smoking bylaw exerts a restriction on the freedom to smoke. Where smoking is permitted the establishment must post signs to indicate the fact. And where smoking is permitted in a public place the bylaw regulates the area which may be given over to smoking.

Purpose of the bylaw, outlined in the preamble, is to safeguard the public from the discomfort or danger to health of second-hand, or exhaled tobacco smoke.

Stores, offices, places of entertainment, even churches are required to provide an area set aside for the purpose if smoking is to be permitted.

**NO SMOKING UNLESS**

The bylaw simply rules that smoking is prohibited in the various places specified unless an area is designated for the purpose.

In retail stores smoking is permitted only where a lunch counter is provided or in a rest room or staff office. And the management must set up signs to indicate that smoking is forbidden. The bylaw also specifies the size of type to be used in such signs.

Barber shop, tattoo parlour, beauty parlour or health spa or any other personal service establishment with a seating capacity for more than 10 persons, may designate a non-smoking area of not less than 25% of the total seating capacity.

Customers can't smoke at the counter of a bank or in an elevator or escalator and smoking is not permitted on a stairway. In a taxicab the consent of all passengers and the driver must be obtained before the traveller may light up.

Buses and school buses are restricted and if you are in a line-up you must wait for a puff until you are served.

Restaurants were taken out of the regulation. The customer will establish the pattern.

**SMOKING AREA**

In places of public assembly, such as schools, churches, theatres and other gatherings, an area may be designated a smoking area provided that it does not occupy more than

50% of the total floor area. The smoking area may not include the seating area, display area of art galleries or museums or any area where smoking is prohibited by the fire marshal or other bylaws.

Signs may include a cigarette in a circle with a line through it. And the cigarette in the symbol also means

cigars, pipes or other lighted smoking equipment.

The penalties are consistent. The maximum penalty for failure to put up a smoking regulation sign is \$500. And the maximum penalty for smoking where smoking is prohibited is \$500. The smoker also

faces a minimum fine: \$25 first time around up to \$150 for the third or subsequent infractions.

New regulations will apply in all parts of the Capital Regional District, from Sooke and Victoria to Sturdies Bay and East Point.



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
