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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

Gulf Islands voters would decide on building a new high school on Salt Spring Island. The proposed project would cost close to \$465,000 with islanders paying slightly more than \$230,000 as their share of the cost. Included in the referendum would be a proposal to spend a further \$12,500 for a new teacherage on Galiano Island.

The board of management of Lady Minto Hospital held its annual meeting on Salt Spring. Maurice Atkins and Mrs. Warren Hastings were re-elected to the board. A motion to rescind the bylaw requiring meetings on each island was defeated. Harold Hoffman, the hospital administrator, reported a profit of \$467.78 for the year.

The 50th anniversary of Lady Minto Hospital was celebrated with the auxiliary members as hosts. Auxiliary president Mrs. Douglas Cavaye and hospital board chairman Mrs. G.A. Scott of Pender Island welcomed visitors to the hospital for the afternoon of festivities. Tea was held in the board room, convened by Mrs. Finn Lepsoe.

A fund-raising drive by the Salt Spring branch of the Canadian Girls in Training brought in \$511.40. The money would be sent to the Cancer Drive.

The mill rate for the hospital improvement district of the Gulf Islands was set at .63 mills. The previous year the mill rate had been .72 and when the new hospital had been built seven years before, the mill rate had stood at 1.21.

May Day was celebrated in Fulford and Pixie Thorburn was chosen as May Queen. Diane Kyler and Mary Harrison were princesses. During the day, Art Moulton, in charge of food, got rid of more than 800 hot dogs and the Women's Institute made more than \$60 from the tea held in the hall.

The Salt Spring Garden Club enjoyed a slide presentation on wildflowers of British Columbia. Mrs. Dan Munday, of Vancouver, gave a slide show and was introduced by Mrs. P.G. James.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Island Princess had been purchased by the provincial government to be added to the ferry fleet. O.H. New of Galiano had been running the vessel between the mainland and Vancouver Island with stops in the Gulf Islands. He also sold the Brentwood Bay service to the province.

Lady Minto Hospital showed a year of growth, reported board of management chairman Doug Cavaye. More than 3,300 people were treated compared to 2,200 the previous year. The number of births stood at 35 for the year, almost double the number of the previous two years.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that he had discovered a new trick. While watching television he learned that putting ice cubes in window and hanging baskets keeps the plants watered. He also noted the election of Lorraine Campbell to the board of management of Lady Minto Hospital.

The elementary school softball teams from Salt Spring won two games and tied one against teams from Alexander School in Duncan. The girls' team, led by pitcher Bernice Foulis, won a game 13-11 and tied the second game 24-24. The boys' team, with Paddy Taylor and Toby Seward pitching, won its game

11-10 in extra innings. The boys came from a 6-0 deficit to win the game.

Visitors flocked to the Gulf Islands for the long weekend with the result that the ferries ran behind schedule. Cars and travellers were left behind at both ends of the Gulf Islands runs but by the end of the holiday everything was returning to normal.

Bishop Remi de Roo, of Victoria, visited Salt Spring Island. He confirmed a score of candidates at a mass and joined the parishioners for a supper and discussion. The meal had been prepared by Frank Schwagly. The informal talk centred on the needs of the church in a changing society.

Ten Years Ago

A poll to gauge opinions of islanders about the proposed international park resulted in 794 votes against it and only two in support. *Driftwood* had been conducting the poll with support from various businesses in the Gulf Islands. Of those who responded only 12 did not sign their names to the ballot. The results would be sent to the prime minister in Ottawa to let the government know how islanders feel about the idea.

RCMP were looking for a man who had phoned in a bomb threat. The bomb, he had said, was in Salt Spring Elementary School and police searched the school while firemen stood by. No bomb was found. The hoax had been phoned in after the school had closed for the day.

A collision between two pleasure boats in Active Pass sent Nigel Phillips of Phillips Marine into action. He arrived at the scene to offer help and took the skipper of one vessel to Lady Minto Hospital for treatment of a serious scalp wound.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that since Dr. Peter Rowell had removed the wax from Papajohn's ear, his car had developed squeaks. The Chickenalia went well, he reported, and bragged that the Saturna Barbecuers, under the direction of Jim Money, could barbecue a camel.

Mary Backlund reported from Galiano Island that the school soccer team beat the team from the Mayne School by one goal. She also reported on heavy traffic using the ferries with the result that the 9:30 pm ferry on Friday did not arrive at Galiano until 12:15 am.

The business education teacher at Gulf Islands Secondary School, Mhora Zelter, won the Sheila Cameron Award as the top commercial teacher in the province.

The Salt Spring Youth Activity Centre received a grant of \$9,523 to provide 12 jobs in children's recreation for the summer. The program, being run by Linda Stafford and Mrs. L. Beijk, would provide summer recreation for children aged three to 11.

Five Years Ago

Don Taylor, Progressive Conservative candidate for Cowichan-Malahat-The Islands, won the election. He defeated Jim Manly of the New Democrats by slightly more than 1,500 votes. Taylor joined other P.C.'s in forming a minority federal government with Joe Clark as prime minister.


The shale pit near Cusheon Lake on Salt Spring Island was being run properly, according to a report from the ministry of mines. The pit, operated by Harvey Reynolds, had been the subject of complaints from neighbours. The Islands Trust asked the mines ministry to check it out.

A new ambulance was delivered to Pender Island by Phillip King, secretary of the Lions Club of that island. He had travelled to Victoria to pick up the ambulance which would serve the Penders from the McKinnon Road medical centre. Lions Club president Gordon Wallace accepted the vehicle on behalf of the club and island residents.

An injunction would be sought by the Islands Trust to halt work on the controversial dock at the Mayne Inn on Bennett Bay. The owner of the Inn, Weldon Pinchin, said he would comply with the injunction if it were issued but would start proceedings of his own to have it lifted.

Ganges detachment RCMP announced that Constable Lorne Harper would be stationed on Galiano Island until the end of August.

Sandra Klein of Pender Island, received two awards for her work on the rescue vessel *Queen of Storm*. One award came from the province and the second was sent by Governor-General Ed Schreyer. The awards recognized her efforts in a rescue mission during December when she rescued a man from the water.

Chamber position outlined

The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce wants to know what's happening with the lease arrangement for Centennial Park.

Chairman of the Centennial Park Committee of the chamber, Jonathan Oldroyd, sent a letter to Regional Director Hugh Borsman to outline the chamber's position on the park in the centre of Ganges.

The chamber, he wrote, would like to see the park given as a free crown grant to the CRD, "the same as those being given by orders in council on a very frequent basis to other communities."

In addition, the chamber wants direct negotiations between it and either the Parks and Recreation Commission or a sub-committee as representative of the CRD to work out the details of the operation of the park.

"The chamber does want Centennial Park," he wrote, "but as its president Dale Codd has said from the start, we do not want to be a political scapegoat nor do we want to be passive managers of pre-determined conditions."

When a public meeting was held last fall to discuss the park and the Farmers' Market, a committee was formed to deal with the ministry of lands, parks and housing about the lease. The chamber had a representative on that committee.

The committee was "publicly sanctioned to investigate a number of questions which, despite their best efforts, remain unresolved," Oldroyd said in his letter.

The committee had been talking with officials of the ministry of lands but the talks have since shifted to the CRD and the ministry.

And the shift has the chamber upset, noted Oldroyd.

"The Centennial Park committee was dismissed by ignorance without

acknowledgement," he wrote, "and there is a growing sentiment that the community will shortly find itself with a new lease and all the old animosities and debate."

The chamber sees its suggestions as a way around that situation.

"It would be a shame to see the

energies, ideas and willingness of good people stifled by ignorance and omission," said Oldroyd.

The chamber asked Borsman to "remedy any proceedings which may be under way and contrary to the sentiments" expressed by the chamber.

Schedule easier to read

Reading the ferry schedule will not require extensive interpretation this summer, according to B.C. Ferry Corporation spokesman Bill Bouchard.

Islanders and visitors expressed difficulty in reading the ferry schedule last year.

This year's schedule looks like easy reading in comparison. The new ferry schedule involves island names instead of ferry terminals to aid the visitor and connection routes are colour-coded.

Bouchard explained that the corporation will be taking extra steps to combat "no-shows", or unused reservations, this summer.

Last year, travellers were turned away at Gulf Island and Tsawwassen ferry terminals when all space was reserved. Often, the ferries would sail with less than a full load as a result of unused reservations.

This year, Bouchard explained, no-shows at sailing time will later be contacted and questioned.
