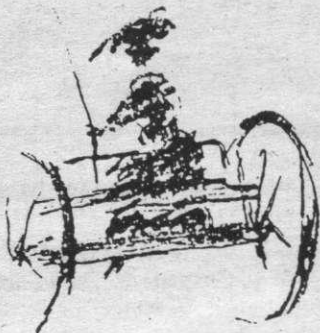

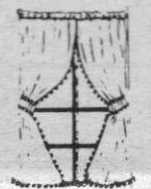

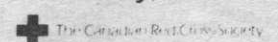

Trustees hear report on Mayne

Renovations and improvements to the Mayne Island school carry a \$26,000 price tag so far but the full bill is not yet in.

Frank Sutherland, supervisor of works for the school district, reported to a recent meeting of the Gulf Islands School Board about the work being done at the school.

The costs not yet known are for replacement of the roof over the library and an adjacent classroom as well as the cost of a new ceiling in the kindergarten room.

The estimated costs are for improvements to the industrial education wing.

Sutherland noted that certain work could be done at minimal cost and has set an August work schedule for completing the tasks.

That work would involve putting yellow safety lines and anti-slip coatings on the floors. The air compressor would be enclosed and a vent would be put into the roof over the welding area.

In that same area, a storage space would be created and machines would be secured to the floor.

Major costs would be for an extractor in the woodworking shop, \$7,000, and suspended ceilings for both the metal and wood shops, \$6,800. Placing electrical plugs in the work bench area would cost \$1,000.

Ventilation for the various areas carries an estimated cost of \$10,000. The gas furnace area will be

enclosed with the exhaust directed up "a dirty great chimney." The cost would be \$4,800.

Sutherland recommends moving the welding area and the finishing room to an enclosed space outside adjacent to the shop. The cost for the welding area move would be \$1,000 while the cost of moving the finishing room would be \$4,000.

Always be Careful

If you take to the woods this summer, be careful with fire.

Good ventilation prevents anaerobic decay

Somehow it seems to me that we have the standard concept of heaven all wrong. You know, the angels in their white nighties with halos and harps, floating on the soft strains of celestial music like dust motes in the quiet cathedral atmosphere of an empty church on an early Tuesday afternoon in summer.

Reflecting upon this it occurred to me that in my heaven there would be music of a louder and more intense kind with a good solid beat, more akin to celestial rock, and we would have synthesizers instead of harps. Also there would be a cosmic word processor to play with, an angelic mate to soar with on an eternal sunny Sunday afternoon, somewhere in some beautiful country place alive with the brilliant joy of dandelions and marigolds and soaring swallows and lots of other angels to laugh with. If this is my idea of heaven I have only two

choices: either change my idea of heaven, which I won't, or admit that I am in heaven already.

FIRE HAZARD

I had a call the other day from a fellow in the Mayne Island part of heaven. He was concerned that a big composting heap made of fresh hay could possibly constitute a fire hazard, similar to the spontaneous combustion of wet hay in a barn under certain circumstances.

At the time I did not explain fully the conditions which may lead to spontaneous combustion, which I shall do now, both to alleviate his concern and as a precautionary advice for novice farmers.

Spontaneous combustion of hay in a barn is possible and indeed has occurred frequently enough to be of concern to anyone storing hay. Wet or moist hay, especially if tightly packed and stored in an enclosed space, will, in the absence of good

air circulation, begin to decay anaerobically. This decay is initiated by anaerobic bacteria which can function only in the absence of air and its free oxygen component.

METHANE PRODUCED

We know how wet grass can easily become a dense thatched mass. Under these conditions anaerobic bacteria proliferate rapidly to initiate the anaerobic decomposition process. In this process methane is produced, the source of the familiar

stench of un-aerated compost piles and sewage pits. In the open this is never a problem, since the methane is rapidly diluted in the air to harmless levels.

In the enclosed space of a barn, though, this readily flammable gas can accumulate to concentrated levels and result in spontaneous combustion with the combination of the brooding heat of a hot summer day and the ambient free oxygen in the outside air. Out in the open then, the anaerobic process of decay poses no problems other than the odour which is intensified by the production of ammonia, a product of nitrogen and hydrogen.

This is one of the reasons for the periodic turning of the compost pile, to prevent the loss of nitrogen in the form of ammonia and to eliminate its attendant stench; secondly, to keep decomposition within the higher temperature ranges of aerobic decay, which does not produce any objectionable odours and works much faster than the anaerobic process; and thirdly, to assure rapid and thorough decomposition of inner and outer layers of the composted material.

Good ventilation of the storage area and sufficiently dry hay to allow internal aeration of the bale as well is essential to prevent the possibility of anaerobic decay and its associated dangers, and it also prevents the hay from becoming a compost pile in the hay loft, a somewhat undesirable situation, even if it should be an aerobic one.

My assurances that there would be no danger from a pile of straw in the open are based on these considerations. Also I am glad that the question arose and of the opportunity to treat it in greater detail in these pages. To those who were reared in the country the dangers of storing wet hay are well known and therefore are not even given a second thought. One just makes sure that the hay is properly dried or the barn burns down, it is as simple as that.

With the recent influx of people new to the land and its ways, people who are glad of the opportunity to keep a horse, a few goats or to raise a few sheep, this access to old country knowledge might well spell the difference between despair and happiness.

Fisheries closures announced

The federal department of fisheries has announced closures in the Cowichan Bay area effective August 1.

Chinook salmon exceeding 50 cm (19 5/8 inches) may not be taken from the Cowichan and Koksilah River systems. The closure is in effect until December 31.

The other closure, in effect until further notice, prohibits all sport fishing for fin fish in the tidal waters of the Koksilah and Cowichan Rivers. The closed area lies west of a line between a fishing boundary sign near Separation Pt. and one at the Wilcuma Lodge wharf.

Fin fish are all vertebrate fish such as salmon and cod.

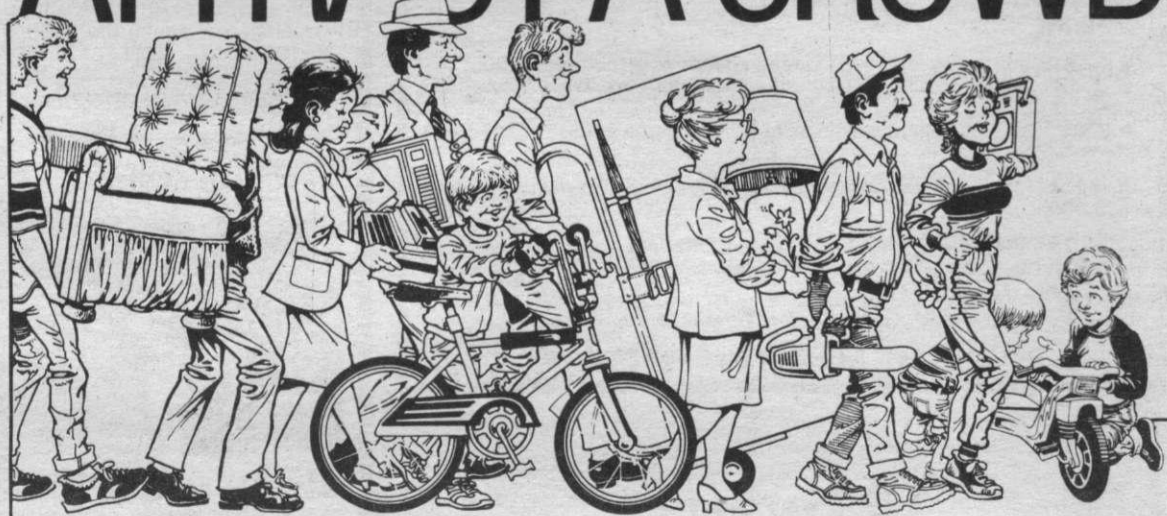

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

A three-car collision on Fulford-Ganges Road on Salt Spring left one man dead and four people injured. One of the vehicles attempted to pass another at the brow of a hill and crashed into the third automobile driving south from Ganges. Victor Sholes died when his vehicle spun into the ditch. His wife was injured. Frank Jones, driver of the car which attempted to pass, was also injured as were two passengers in the other car.

The salmon derby was won by four-year old Elaine Patterson who landed a 29-pound, eight-ounce salmon. The Salt Spring Rod and Gun Club derby organizers were amazed at the catch which was longer than the girl was tall. The two largest cod weighed in at 18 lbs., 6 oz. to provide a tie between Don Sharp and Wayne Mouat. Ruth Heinekey won the \$100 gift certificate in the draw.

The Fulford Athletic Club hosted 40 youths from Portland, Oregon, for a day of fun. The group arrived in the south Salt Spring village aboard the *Pagan*. They played baseball and spent the evening at the Fulford Drive-In. Bob Akerman led the welcoming party.

Telephone operators on Salt Spring were being replaced by automatic equipment and the ladies of the Royal Canadian Legion Auxiliary staged a tea to honour the operators. Chief operator Josephine Overend cut the cake and past chief operator Miss F.M. Aitkens accepted small gifts on behalf of the operators.

A lawn bowling challenge from Fulford was accepted from a Ganges team and the matches would take place at the Garden Fete of the Anglican parish to be held at Harbour House.

Sheep dog trials would be held at Norman Mouat's farm at the north end of Salt Spring Island. Bill Evans was in charge of arrangements and the judge would be Jack Campbell of Vancouver.

Fifteen Years Ago

A 10-ton weight restriction was applied to the Vesuvius-Crofton ferry. The wharf at Crofton was not designed for heavier vehicles, said a ministry of transport official. It had been rebuilt in 1958 but neither the federal nor provincial governments had made an effort to bring the wharf up to standards for use by all vehicles.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that Jackie Grant, Rick Pion and Cedric Robertson found an exhausted pigeon on the wharf. A band on the bird's leg identified it as belonging to a Nanaimo man. The bird had been released in California and became too tired to make it home. The boys fed and watered the pigeon and released it the next morning to continue its trip.

The Mayne Island Walkathon Committee had totalled the results and Effie Piggott, with more than \$90 pledged for her efforts, had been the largest money-maker. Participants were reminded to send the money from their pledges to Grace Evans.

A salmon barbecue on Galiano Island fed more than 80 people. The event was put on for visitors from the North Shore Unitarian Church in Vancouver who came to the

island for a visit. Hosts of the barbecue were Paul and Mrs. Reecke while Tom Carolan acted as head chef.

The underwater Hydro cables were being put into place between Galiano and Salt Spring Islands. The work was being done by the crew of the French cables ship *Marcel Bayard*. There would be three lines under Trincomali Channel to match the three lines which ran from Tsawwassen to Galiano.

A provincial election had been called for August 27. The New Democrats had nominated Don Johannesen and the Social Credit were in the process of picking a representative for the island constituency.

Ten Years Ago

Agricultural land reserves had been established by the provincial government and the smallest farm size had been set at 30 acres. On Salt Spring, 8,173 acres or 17.3% of the land had been designated as farmland. The figure for the Outer Islands was 7,778 acres or 14.5% of the land.

A hole-in-one on the second hole of the Salt Spring Golf Club was the achievement of Glenn Woodley. Pat Doherty, who reported the accomplishment, admitted he had trouble reaching the green of that particular hole.

Papajohn reported from Saturna about the Lions Club box social. Bob Hindmarch looked after the refreshments for the evening and Mike Hayes auctioned the box dinners. Lori Bouch was awarded a prize for presenting the best decorated box and Franklin Wiles turned out to be the highest bidder.

The Garden Club members on Salt Spring had been practising their craft on the plants in the flower boxes at Centennial Park in Ganges. The mass of colourful flowers attested to the skill of the gardeners.

RCMP found a body on a beach at Galiano Island. The man was unidentified and the body was taken to Salt Spring where Dr. Ron Puhky confirmed the death. No other information was available.

The weather ship Parizeau sailed around the Pacific Ocean with four

islanders as regular crew members. Senior engineer Wesley Delaney as well as John Waterfall, Mike Spencer and Steve Scotton were the island residents.

Day camp on Salt Spring was located in two portable classrooms at the high school. Valerie Knowles and Sherry Ryles were in charge of the camp which had been funded by a federal youth grant.

Five Years Ago

Salt Spring houses would be numbered. The fire protection district board of directors approved a bylaw requiring each house to be numbered. The idea was to ease the task of emergency vehicles attempting to find a source of calls for help.

Danger, Kiwi Crossing, read the new sign on Fulford-Ganges Road.

The Farmers' Market on Pender Island was doing brisk business. The market had been sponsored by the Farmers' Institute and had been organized by Frank Jones and his wife. Table rental for vendors cost 50¢ per Saturday or \$2.50 for the summer. Products must have been grown and crafts must have been made on the Penders.

The mixed doubles tennis tourney, sponsored by the Galiano Lodge, attracted 10 couples from that island and an equal number from Salt Spring. John Fraser and Jande Johnstone of Galiano edged John Reiner and Hazel Thompson of Salt Spring to take the title.

The museum on Mayne Island was proving to be popular to visitors. Ann Chatwin had hired two students, Carol Elliott and Darcy Wilks, to help her out. The museum, in the old jail house, was open daily from 10 am to 4 pm.

A refugee family from Southeast Asia were coming to Salt Spring under the sponsorship of 24 island families. The project had been arranged through the Ganges United Church. A committee of church members, led by chairman Rev. Vern McEachern, had organized the project. The group of sponsors had pledged money and support for the refugees and the cost of the venture could go as high as \$10,000 for a year.

School staffing announced

Additional staffing for various schools was announced by the Gulf Island School Board last week.

There are 13 people involved in the 7.4 full-time equivalent (fte) positions.

At Gulf Islands Secondary School, Merv Scoble joins the art department for .3 time and Maryanne Allan will work half-time with the home economics group.

Paul McKenzie was appointed .1 time for learning assistance. John Nicholson and Kent Andrews join the science and math department for .4 time each while Rob Taylor will teach both art and French for .3 time.

Down the hill at Salt Spring Elementary School, Joe Grewal will teach Grades 2 and 3 full-time while Marjorie Jones will teach kindergarten half-time.

At Fernwood, Joyce Weir will teach Grades 2 and 3 full-time. Georgette Martinou will spend .9 time with the intermediate grades while Maureen Galbraith has been hired for .6 time in the library.

John Edwards will spend full time teaching primary grades at Galiano School while Steve Nemtin joins the learning assistance and special education team at that school for .4 time.

Mike Marshall, superintendent of schools, told the trustees that efforts are being made to fill the French immersion teaching team as well as to find band teachers for each school.

The staffing level for all the Gulf Islands schools for September has been set at 74 fte.

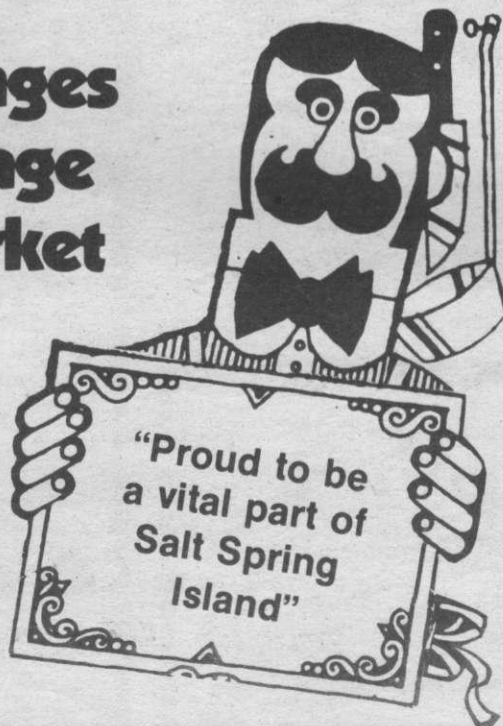

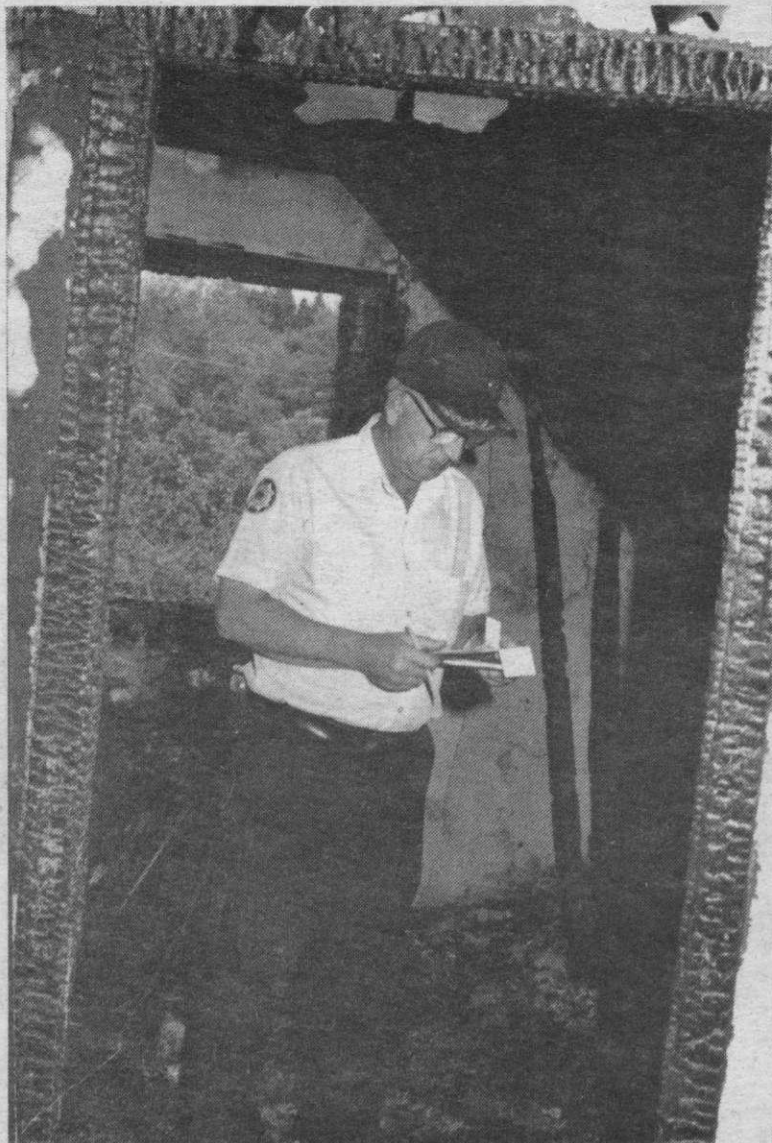

Fire damage \$30,000

Fire in the second-floor apartment of a Hereford Avenue house brought the Salt Spring firefighters out at 2 am last Friday.

Jock Stewart, the occupant of the apartment, was trapped by flames and had to jump from a window. He was taken to Lady Minto Hospital for treatment of injuries.

The fire was caused by a cigarette

which ignited a mattress, said Fire Chief Bob Leask.

While Stewart lay on the ground, his shouts woke the other occupants of the building who got out safely.

Damage was confined to the top-floor apartment and minimal smoke and water damage was caused to the two lower-floor apartments.

Damage was estimated at close to \$30,000.

Firemen did a good job

The Salt Spring volunteer firefighters did a good job, said Joyce Bowden.

She is the owner of the house in which the top floor apartment was destroyed by fire last Friday.

Prompt action by the firefighters kept the flames from spreading to the rest of the house. Water and smoke damage to the two lower apartments was minimal.

Bowden sent a letter to each firefighter expressing her gratitude for their efforts.

Schedule changed for summer

The Salt Spring Island Trust representatives will be taking time off this summer.

The two trustees usually meet the public each Tuesday between 1 pm and 3 pm in a room in the basement of the government offices on Lower Ganges Road.

But for August they will be available only on August 7 and 14. The office will be closed each of the remaining Tuesdays until September 4 when the weekly sessions will resume.

If residents of Salt Spring need assistance from either of the two trustees at other times, they could call Bev Unger or Nick Gilbert.

Fernwood tenders let

Tenders for work on the two-room addition to Fernwood Elementary School on Salt Spring have been let with a price tag of \$120,673.39.

The work has been split into eight phases which cover everything from digging the hole in the ground to finishing the classrooms.

W. Huser and Sons were awarded the contract for excavation, backfill and slabs with a price of \$16,610. The same firm will be responsible for framing, millwork and doors. That tender was worth \$56,046. They were also accepted for finishing the classrooms with hardware and chalkboards for \$8,990.

The contract for drywall installation was awarded to Dashwood and Associates with a price of \$4,235. Paint Rite won the painting contract with a bid of \$5,785 while Burritt Brothers will supply the wall coverings for \$1,937.39.

The floors will be completed by

Inlaid Flooring for \$5,500.

Salt Spring Plumbing will install the plumbing for \$4,770 and Class "A" Installations will do the electrical wiring for a price of \$16,800.

Tenders for roofing and flashing, glass and acoustic ceiling tiles were not acceptable to the school board and will be retendered.

When the treasury board and the ministry of education recently approved the capital budget for the Fernwood School addition, the cost had been set at \$186,278.

The school district will be managing the project on its own with various contractors looking after the various parts of construction.

Work is expected to be completed in time for the two classrooms to be in use in September.

Parties draw complaints

Parties at Cusheon Lake beach on Salt Spring Island get loud and noisy at times and neighbours are complaining.

Ganges detachment RCMP have been called to the beach several times lately to tone the noise down. The complaints come during the day as well as in the evening.
