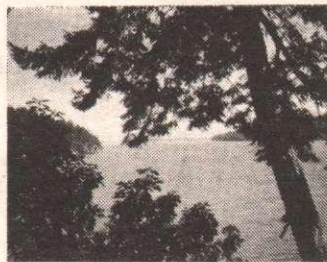

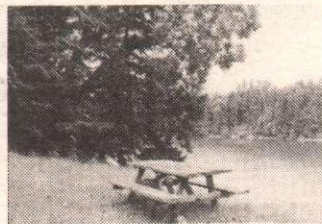

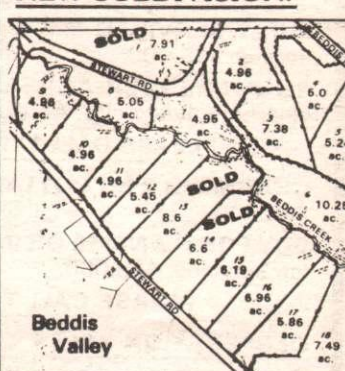

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

The late evening quiet of Ganges was shattered when the burglar alarm at the bank began to howl. RCMP corporal Ken Aquilon and bank manager Lorne Earle were summoned to the scene but could find nothing wrong. The alarm decided to short circuit itself just to prove it worked.

Arts and crafts of the Gulf Islands were a featured attraction at the Hudson's Bay Company store in Victoria. Margaret Robson, of Galiano, was organizer of the event for the Gulf Islands branch of the B.C. Historical Society. Bea Freeman of South Pender was her assistant. Included in the display were craftsmen showing their skill at weaving and other endeavours.

The \$1 breakfast, sponsored by the Ladies' Auxiliary to the Royal Canadian Legion, was set to go. The annual event, which had attracted more than 300 people the previous year, was held to raise money for the Legion Bursary Fund.

St. Mary's Church in Fulford would have a furnace installed to help keep parishioners warm during the winter months. At a special meeting of parishioners, 18 of the 22 in attendance voted in favour of the furnace.

Members of OAPO Branch 32 left Ganges for a trip to Butchart Gardens. Organizer of the trip was Mrs. E.J. Monk who was also planning another trip to Victoria for shopping. Secretary of the branch, Elsie Thacker, urged as many members as possible to take advantage of the outing.

The bean supper at Beaver Point was late but 360 people showed up at Solimar to be welcomed by hostess Grace Gillson. The event marked the 11th year of the supper. Mrs. Stevens led the cooks in cooking 55 pounds of beans and none were left. Bill Evans and his border collies, Jack and King, entertained the crowds.

A challenge was issued by the Fulford ladies' softball team to any team from Ganges. If the northern village could put a team of ladies in the field the south-end bunch would welcome the challenge. The game would be part of the Fulford sports celebration later in August.

Fifteen Years Ago

Hunting in the Gulf Islands would be by shotgun only. An order-in-council banned the use of rifles in the islands. Deer hunters could use rifled slugs in their shotguns but otherwise shot was the only acceptable ammunition. Farmers, under the Sheep Protection Act, were exempt from the ruling.

Ferry service to the Outer Islands was halted for most of the day. The *Mayne Queen* blew a clutch and rammed the wharf at Swartz Bay. Repairs took most of the day but service was restored eventually.

The salmon were very small. The Salt Spring Rod and Gun Club held its annual fishing derby under the direction of Fred Morris. The weigh-in was conducted by Laurie Mouat, Vic Jackson and Wally Edwards. Mouat won top weight with a 7 lb., 14 oz. fish. The junior winner was Mike Horel with a 5 lb., 11 oz. salmon and the largest cod had been hooked by Linda Anderson at 20 lbs., 6 oz.

Sheep dog trials at Fulford attracted 200 spectators to watch 11 dogs run through their paces. John Wickson of Oyster River took the Bill Evans Memorial Trophy for the efforts of his dog Misty. During the morning, various experts talked about sheep breeding and judged island stock. Gordon Ruckle took top prizes in both the light and heavy breeds competition.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that many visitors were on the island. He expressed delight at the sight of diapers suddenly appearing on clothes lines at the homes of retired senior citizens.

Ten Years Ago

The international park being talked about was opposed by residents of Point Roberts in Washington. The park had been proposed by the International Joint Commission as a means of solving a water shortage problem for Point Roberts. The proposal had raised a storm of opposition in the Gulf Islands.

Ganges RCMP were investigating the shooting of three sheep on a Salt Spring farm. John Stepaniuk reported the dead sheep which he found in a field.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the Lions Club honoured Taimi Hindmarch, Gloria Smith and Betty MacDonald for their efforts in the box social. It was also MacDonald's birthday, which added more fun to the event.

A census of killer whales was being carried out by a Nanaimo group. Residents of the Gulf Islands were asked to phone the group when any of the whales were sighted. A boat would be sent with a cameraman aboard in an effort to photograph the killer whales for identification.

The light aggregate plant on Saturna Island had closed its doors. The plant had been producing finely ground and cooked shale for use in cement. A similar plant at Salt

Spring had stopped operations about 10 years before.

Sidewalk superintendents were busy on Mayne Island directing the efforts of Andy Mitchell and John Crawford. The pair were constructing a building behind the old gaol for a display space for old farm implements. The museum in the gaol, under the supervision of Sidney Brannon, Hannah Coates and Jan Chipman, would be open to the public each day between 9:30 am and 4:30 pm.

Ganges detachment RCMP issued a stern warning against nudity on public beaches. Nude bathing was not permitted on such beaches, the warning stated, nor on beaches open to public view.

Five Years Ago

Sheep dog trials at the Farmers' Institute grounds on Rainbow Road at Salt Spring were enjoyed by 1,200 spectators. Ten dogs were entered in the event and Trixie, owned by John Wickson of Courtenay, won the Bill Evans Memorial Trophy. Russ Lazaruk and his dog Hamish won the Foxglove Trophy for best local dog.

The mixed doubles tennis tourney held at Galiano Island was won by the team of John Fraser and Jandi Johnstone. The pair were successful in meeting the challenge of teams from both Galiano and Salt Spring Islands.

The children's picnic on Pender Island was sponsored by the Farmers' Institute. Gordon Wallace was in charge of the races and everyone enjoyed the John Christenson Magic Show. Clown Bill Race kept the children laughing with his antics.

A Capital Region bylaw proposal to ban outdoor concerts which included amplified music in unorganized areas of the CRD was turned down by the directors. More information was needed, decided the directors, and they proceeded to table the bylaw.

The fishing derby held by the Galiano Rod and Gun Club was won by Edna Hurlbert of Bellingham, Washington, with a 26 lb., 11 oz. salmon. Largest cod was caught by Fred Bennett of Mayne Island, a 21 lb., 4 oz. catch. The children's derby was held at Sturdies Bay wharf and Mike Davey won three silver dollars for his 13 oz. perch.

The three acres on Fulford Harbour sat next to Drummond Park and although the price was set at \$100,000, the Salt Spring Parks and Recreation Commission wanted the land to expand the park. The commission had applied to the lottery commission for a grant to purchase the property.

Islander commands drill rig

Rob Franklin of Salt Spring Island has taken command of an ocean-going oil drilling rig operating on the Grand Banks off Newfoundland.

He recently assumed his command after working the rigs of the Hibernia oil field since last September. Franklin, who now holds a deep-sea master's certificate, commands the rig *Bowdrill 3*.

It was launched and commissioned in January at St. John, New Brunswick, and is a semi-submersible drill rig. The *Bowdrill 3* is also the first oil rig to be built on Canada's east coast.

Prior to beginning his rig duties last fall, Franklin had worked for B.C. Ferries for about four years. Before he headed east, he had attained the rank of chief officer on the *Queen of Tsawwassen*, running between the Gulf Islands and the mainland.

Franklin and his wife Brenda have been married for 12 years and before they came to Salt Spring five years ago, they had crewed a freighter which was touring the

globe. They signed on to the freighter in New Brunswick and travelled through the Panama Canal before leaving the ship at New Westminster, B.C.

They have a three-year-old son, Luke.

to share the same space.

Schools open for classes on September 4. Either option would be in effect for three weeks and four days. The population of Salt Spring Elementary School in June, including the Fulford children, had been 409.

The delay in opening came about when a contractor from off-island, who was to have been finishing stripping the wallboard, came into conflict with another contract he had elsewhere.

Workers, said McQuiggan, have been out in force in recent days but the classrooms will not be finished in time.

Construction of the school had been delayed a couple of times in the early spring. Bad weather had slowed work for several weeks and labour disputes had also caused other delays.

McQuiggan said the school trustees do not consider the delays to be the fault of the main contractor, Herb Bate Ltd. of Victoria, and therefore will not invoke any penalty clause of the contract.

The next meeting of the school board is scheduled for August 22.

Tourism sees slow start

The tourist season in the Gulf Islands started slowly this year but is gaining momentum.

Resort owners report that business didn't begin to pick up until the warm weather arrived a couple of weeks ago. Although the visitors came in a slow but steady trickle earlier in June, the flow has not yet matched that of last year.

A similar tale is told by retailers who cater to the tourists. Sales were slack for June and early July but are increasing, although the tourist dollars have not yet matched totals for 1983.

On the other hand, B.C. Ferries reports heavy traffic on the route from Tsawwassen on the mainland to the Gulf Islands. When the ferries head to the Outer Islands, they sail at less than capacity but when Salt Spring is the destination more cars and people crowd the boats.

Heavy ferry traffic depends upon

the time of day as well as day of the week.

The heavy ferry traffic is reflected by visitors to the tourist information centre in Ganges. Signatures have been appearing in the visitor's book at a rate comparable to last year.

Organizers at Artcraft in Mahon Hall in Ganges point to a similar pattern. Visitors to the craft show come from near and far with addresses listed from Europe, Australia, the United States as well as many places in Canada.

At the customs office in Bedwell Harbour on South Pender Island, visitors continue to come and go. The officials at that office report processing 150 visitors each day on average which just about matches

the numbers for last year.

The cooler weather of early summer shares some of the blame for the missing visitors but other factors have been mentioned as well. The economy rates as a prime reason for the slump in visitors.

B.C. Ferries are also blamed. Some resort owners as well as retailers point an accusing finger at the schedule for ferries to and from the mainland.

The need for reservations can cause tourists to consider other destinations.

But with the arrival of the warm weather, the visitors are coming and Gulf Islanders dependent upon the tourist trade remain optimistic about a good year.

It was an exercise, not a spill

The radio message to Ganges detachment RCMP said a tanker was sinking near the San Juan Islands and up to one million gallons of oil had escaped.

The report, which came over the air on July 25, also noted that the oil spill had been contained.

RCMP passed the message on to Ganges coast guard unit as a matter of routine. The coast guard sent a vessel out to offer assistance but couldn't find the spill.

After two hours, word came through that there was no oil spill. The entire thing had been set up as an exercise for the American coast guard but no one said it was only a trial.

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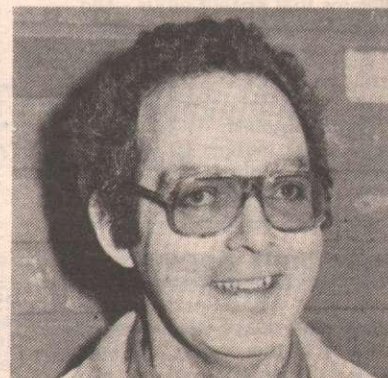

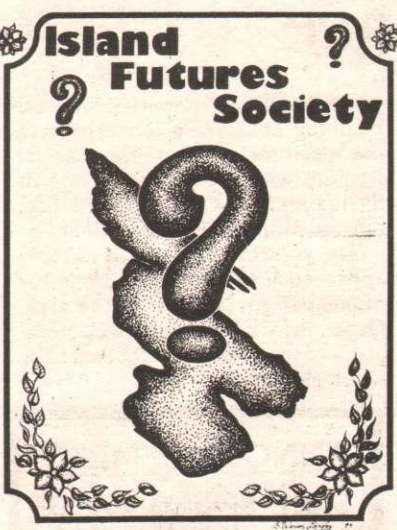

Problems caused by ministry, not districts, says Wallace

Regional districts came under criticism from Municipal Affairs Minister Bill Ritchie last week for restrictive planning regulations but Gordon Wallace, vice-chairman of the Islands Trust, says the problem lies with the ministry.

Stating that some areas of the province are "over planned", Ritchie said that the new rules will be delivered to regional districts and municipalities soon.

He has expressed criticism in the past that regional districts have imposed planning regulations on rural areas. The rural areas should be planned by the people and not the regional districts, he has stated.

Wallace said, "It (the new rules) shouldn't affect us at all because the Trust is not a regional district."

He also pointed out that with two trustees elected to the Islands Trust from each of the major islands, the Trust represents "grass-roots planning".

Recently the minister of municipal affairs met and talked with the Islands Trust Council. Wallace said that Ritchie told them the Islands Trust was considered to

be too urban in its approach to planning.

Planning should be done locally, Ritchie told the council, but at the same time it shouldn't interfere with provincial objectives.

Wallace stated that the greatest problem the Trust has with planning is not from the regional districts of the area but from the ministry of municipal affairs.

He cited the Musgrave Landing strata title development as a planning process which was imposed on Salt Spring by provincial officials.

He cited another case on Pender Island. The Island Trust Committee attempted to place height restrictions on potential motel developments. Wallace said the bylaw change would not have affected the density of such developments, only how tall they were to be.

The minister of municipal affairs, however, refused to sign the bylaw change and told the Trust Committee that it was too restrictive.

One result of Ritchie's efforts to

get regional districts out of land use planning has been a move to have the electoral areas of the Capital Region, with the exception of Salt Spring and the Outer Gulf Islands, opt for municipal status.

The voters of Metchosin recently approved a referendum calling for municipal government in the area. Other such votes in other electoral areas of the CRD are expected to be taken this year.
