

Bud Kreissl leaves many friends

Bud Kreissl, who died at Salt Spring Island last week, was part of the local scene. For years he was to be seen at a variety of gatherings on the island, puffing smoke and placing the spent match back in the box.

He came as a retired American doctor and stayed as a very active Canadian administrator. His first love was the North Salt Spring Water District. He was elected to the board many years ago and joined with a group of professional men who used their own expertise to strive for good, potable water for the island.

The problems of water supply were personal problems to Bud Kreissl. He worked here on the island for the water district and he

made many a trip into Victoria to solicit provincial help and support for his beloved water district.

When he entered regional politics, as local trustee on the Islands Trust, he continued his concern for good water on a wider range. He was still determined to safeguard the water of the North Salt Spring district, but he was now equally concerned with the availability of water elsewhere and particularly over the intrusion of salt water into island systems. On an island with a large elderly community, salt intrusion was particularly dangerous, he asserted.

The retired doctor was not only active in public affairs. He was a staunch member of the Catholic parish of Salt Spring Island and

served at one time, as chairman of the parish council. He and his wife Ruth were almost fixtures at the Saturday afternoon mass.

When he served with the parish administration he was as scrupulous in the details of parish affairs as he was, later, in public matters.

And he rarely missed a meeting of the Royal Canadian Legion on the island. Bud was interested in almost everything around him. And he adapted his experience and his experiences to every new situation. He enjoyed a memory that would recall almost any instance from his own experience or from his extensive reading.

When Dave Barrett was premier of the province and his actions or statements were under fire, Bud would shrug off the suggestion that Barrett was showing his socialism. He was showing the Christian principles he had learned at a Jesuit school, insisted Kreissl.

He attributed his interest in philosophy to his scrupulous education by the same preceptors. Throughout his life he read new presentations on the subject and was always eager to debate a new angle on an old subject.

His eager concern for everything and everyone around him brought Bud into contact with a wide segment of the island population and the esteem in which he was held was evident in the regularity with which he was elected to his various offices.

Bud Kreissl came here from California, where he practised as a pathologist. He used to explain that he never drove hard and that he had examined too many victims of the highway toll to want to take risks at the wheel.

Coming here as a retired American doctor, a veteran of the

American navy, a resident of populous centres, he settled into island living as if there had never been any other way.

He has left a large number of friends on the island, and beyond. Bud Kreissl will be missed. And his memory will be revered.

Church is packed at service for Bud Kreissl

More than 150 mourners crowded into the church of Our Lady of Grace in Ganges on Tuesday morning to take part in the funeral mass for Dr. Leonard John (Bud) Kreissl.

He died in Lady Minto Hospital on Friday morning after a long bout with heart trouble.

Dr. Kreissl came to Salt Spring with his wife, Ruth, to retire in 1971. He was practising as a pathologist in California up to that time.

In the years of his retirement he took an active part in many phases of island life. He served two terms as trustee of the North Salt Spring Water District and he was twice elected to the Islands Trust as a Salt Spring Island trustee.

He was a member of the Catholic parish of Our Lady of Grace and served on the parish council.

He was a member of the Royal Canadian Legion at Ganges and the Legion was well-represented at the service on Tuesday.

He was a member of the Salt Spring Island Golf and Country Club and he organized the Red Cross fund campaign on the island for many years.

WATER QUALITY

In 1976 he became a Canadian citizen, after which he took an active part in public affairs and became an outspoken participant. Throughout his service with the Islands Trust

and with the water district he was vitally concerned with the provision of an adequate supply of potable water to the island.

The deceased came from Chicago, Illinois, and graduated from Loyola University in that city. He received his medical degree from the University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

During the Korean War he served in the United States navy.

He leaves his wife, Ruth, at home; a son Jay and daughter-in-law, Maureen; his daughter and son-in-law, Mary and Ken Warner; two daughters, Laura Jean and Teresa; two grandchildren, Rachel and Peter Kreissl; and a brother Leary Kreissl.

Funeral mass was celebrated by Rev. P.A. Bergin.

Donations were invited to the Canadian Heart Fund.

Goodman-Jones Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

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Many guest speakers expected at Baha'i-sponsored meeting

A full day of activities is planned at Ganges Sunday when the Salt Spring Island Baha'is hold a gathering at the Farmers' Institute building on Rainbow Rd.

New Dimensions of Spiritual Strength is the theme of the gathering, for which many speakers are expected to visit the island.

A large part of the day will be devoted to native North Americans and a panel discussion, beginning at 3 pm, will look at Native Spirituality: Individual Approaches.

Panelists will include John Lucas, Tom Anequod, Chief John Thomas, Riel Aubichon, Dorothy Francis, Maynard Eakin and Shawani Shaw, all of whom represent many different backgrounds.

"The native peoples of North America have in common a unique destiny as prophesied in the Baha'i scriptures," said Baha'i spokesman Margot Mckague. "Many different cultural, ethnic and racial groups have been distinguished in the Writings as holding in their power an integral part of the process of spiritualization of the human race. The native North Americans hold such a station as a group."

She said between 20% and 25% of Baha'is in North America are native.

But the gathering will not focus on native peoples alone. World-minded education will be the topic of Reggie Newkirk of Surrey, who will lead an open forum on the subject at 10 am. Bill Brewer from the Comox Valley, one of the founders of Greenpeace, will lead a forum on spirituality and politics at 1 pm. Brewer was at one time a director of the Capital Regional

Board.

Later in the day, at 6:45, internationally known Esperantist Stuart Kitteridge, who has been attending an Esperantists' convention at the University of B.C., will speak.

The day's activities begin at 4 am with a dawn prayer circle at the Farmers' Institute building.

The day will conclude with an evening unity gathering, a time, said Mckague, of sharing talents and interests.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

Sheep dog trials held at the farm of Norman Mouat attracted 12 dogs and their handlers to Salt Spring. First place was taken by Rob and handler R.C. Sibbald of Matsqui. Bill Evans and Rainbow King of Salt Spring were second. The event had been organized by Evans and Irene Hawksworth.

Record rainfall for the month of July was reported by Ganges weather-watcher Howard Carlin. Precipitation for the month measured 2.12 inches. The temperature ranged from a low of 46 degrees to a high of 81 degrees.

The Garden Fete put on by the Salt Spring Anglican Parish brought in \$870. Lt.-Col. D.G. Crofton opened the event and the crowd visited booths to buy articles and take part in various contests. The hat decorating event was judged by Eric Faure and Pamela Utterbach of North Vancouver won. Marjorie Jansch ran the tearoom with the members of the Evening Women's Auxiliary as servers.

Bea Hamilton reported from Fulford that the Athletic Club wanted to express gratitude to Jack Tomlinson for the work and time he put in fixing roller skates. Jack Roland spoke for the club.

The Abbotsford School Board would hold a regular meeting on a ferry en route to Salt Spring Island. School superintendent W.J. Mouat of Abbotsford was bringing the school trustees to the island where he had been raised for a day of leisure and fun.

Shopping in Victoria would be a day-trip for members of the Salt Spring OAPO. They would leave Ganges by bus in the morning and a highlight of the day would be a chicken dinner at Eaton's which would cost 75c for each member.

Fifteen Years Ago

Construction in the Gulf Islands was effectively halted by an administration strike at the board of health. Dr. J. Whitbread, medical health officer, had withdrawn the services of the health inspector for the islands as a means of making a point in a dispute with the provincial government over more money. If septic fields were not inspected, people could not move into their new houses.

Papajohn reported from Saturna, in between times of changing his grandson's diapers, that the entertainment committee had shrunk to one from three. Arne Rasmussen had been the only one left but Tom Davidson stepped in to give him a hand to arrange events for the enjoyment of islanders.

Truck traffic to and from Salt Spring Island was in a bind because of weight limits. The ferry out of Swartz Bay to Fulford had a restriction of 90 tons and would not carry any more than two big, heavy trucks at a time. Meanwhile, the wharf at Crofton on the run to Vesuvius had a weight restriction of 10 tons which meant that vehicles

such as cement trucks could not go that way.

Mayne Island Fall Fair was undergoing final plans. The various competitions and events were being co-ordinated by various islanders. Gordon Ducklow was in charge. He and his assistants, Joyce Mitchell and David Bradley, would be staging a tug-of-war, a rolling pin throwing contest as well as different lumber jack competitions.

The vessel caught fire just moments after being filled with fuel in Ganges. Robert Dudley and his family from Nanaimo were on board the boat. The engine didn't run too well after the refuelling and when Dudley lifted the hatch, flames shot out. He got his family overboard and they were rescued, but the boat burned to the waterline and sank.

Ten Years Ago

The Vesuvius ferry to Crofton was not running during lunch hour and the wait had people up in arms. While ferry workers went to lunch, traffic for the boats backed up with the result that the 1 pm sailing was often too crowded to take everyone who wanted to go.

The Art Show on Galiano Island ran for two days and attracted many people. A display of interest was presented by the island's Group of Seven. Each artist painted the same landscape and the results showed seven views of the one scene. Shari Street had submitted a series of photo-art.

Papajohn reported from Saturna on plans for the superb chicken barbecue to be held in front of the firehall. The birds, he explained, would be at "their epitome of juicy, mouth-waterin' goodness." The wood, from Saturna naturally, would give off the right amount of heat to allow the Saturna chefs to cook skilfully in the fresh Saturna air.

A warning was being issued to boaters who fished Active Pass that the larger vessels such as ferries had the right of way. Complaints had been made to RCMP that the small vessels were being very slow in getting out of the way of the bigger boats.

The Heart Fund campaign in the Gulf Islands had gathered \$2,718, reported organizer Dick Toynbee. The previous year the campaign had collected \$915. The total for B.C. stood at \$767,858, well above the target of \$725,000.

The strike which closed the

pozzolan plant on Saturna Island was over. Workers agreed to a settlement which ended the 10-day walkout.

Sinister golfers took over the golf course on Salt Spring on Sunday. It was the occasion of the Dods left-handers Tourney and Mac Mouat won with a low net of 67. Pat Doherty wondered if playing the port side would improve his game.

Five Years Ago

A log dump at Welbury Bay on Salt Spring near the old pozzolan plant was the target of criticism. The bay was not zoned for a log dump, claimed residents of the area, and they asked the Islands Trust to stop the operation.

The Sea Sprite out of Seattle exploded and burned in Montague Harbour on Galiano. The vessel had just taken on fuel and was still tied to the dock. The flames destroyed the vessel as well as fuel pumps and part of the dock. Boat owner J. Buttonhof and another person escaped unhurt and the hulk was towed to Parker Island after the flames had been extinguished.

The fishing derby staged by the Pender Island Legion attracted 130 entrants. The big fish was landed by Glen Glover, 16, of Burnaby. He weighed in an 8 lb., 13 oz. salmon. The young man was the great-grandson of George Pearson who had established the Pender CARE Christmas Tree. Weigh-in was conducted by Charlie Harrison and Jack Little.

The Galiano Fiesta was held the previous weekend at Bellhouse field on that island. Ollie Garner was in charge of the fishing derby while Cam Prior and Reg Cornwall ran the sales booth. The event was sponsored by the Galiano Lions Club.

Bruce Fiander caught a fish. The Salt Spring fisherman entered the Legion Salmon Derby and weighed in a 24 lb. fish. He took top spot and the Fred Morris Memorial Trophy. Junior winner was Alan Stepaniuk with a 4 lb., 10 oz. salmon. Largest cod was brought in by I. MacMillan with a weight of 9 lbs., 15 oz.

The sign to be posted at the float in Ganges Harbour would remind pilots of float planes to taxi out to Goat Island before taking off. The Islands Trust put the sign there in response to complaints from island residents about the noise generated by the planes at take-off.

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons who deem their interest in property affected by the following proposed By-laws will be afforded an opportunity to be heard on the matters contained therein at a Public Hearing to be held at the Harbour House Hotel, Ganges, Salt Spring Island, on **WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 15, 1984**, at 1:30 p.m.

In general terms the intent of the following proposed By-laws is to amend By-law No. 14, cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978", as described below:

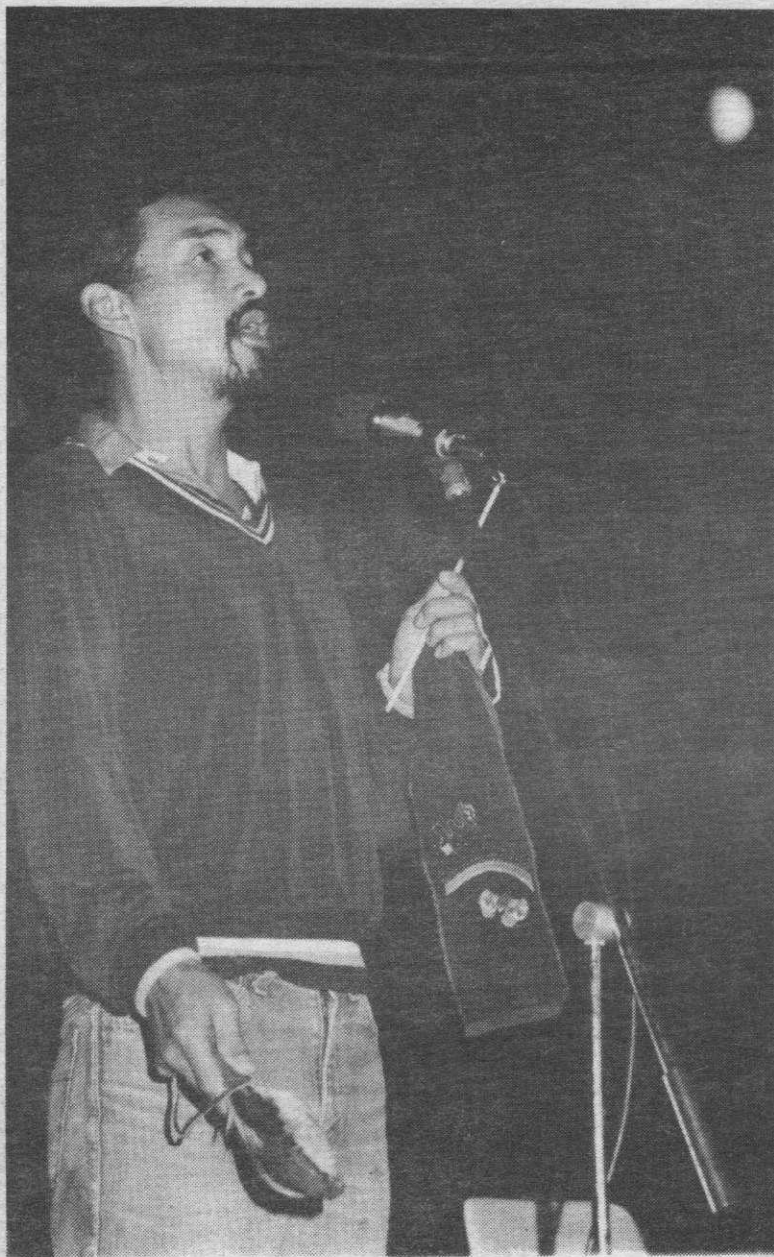
- Proposed By-law No. 109, cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978, Amendment By-law No. 13, 1984":
This rezoning expands the WC zoning on Water Lot 62 in Burgoyne Bay by changing the zoning around the Lot from Water A (WA) to Water C (WC). Water A is the general non-commercial water zone around most of Salt Spring Island. Water C is the water transportation and industrial zone. It permits log storage.
- Proposed By-law No. 110, cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978, Amendment By-law No. 14, 1984":
This rezoning would remove the Commercial 4 Zone (C4) from the corner of Lower Ganges Road and Upper Ganges Road (next to the Harbour House Hotel) and replace it with the Multiple Family Zone (MF). This would permit the construction of multiple family dwellings.
- Proposed By-law No. 111, cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978, Amendment By-law No. 15, 1984":
This rezoning replaces the existing Public and Recreation Zone (PR) with Watershed 1 Zone (W1) for four privately owned parcels off Natalie Lane on Cusheon Lake. W1 zoning permits building of a single family home; PR does not.
- Proposed By-law No. 112, cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978, Amendment By-law No. 16, 1984":
This amendment corrects a map error by zoning as Commercial 1 (C1) a small unzoned waterfront parcel near the ferry terminal in Fulford.

A copy of the proposed By-laws may be inspected at the Islands Trust Office, 716 Courtney Street, Victoria, B.C. between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive.

For the convenience of the public only, and not to satisfy Section 720(2) of the Municipal Act, R.S.B.C., 1979, C. 290, an additional copy of the proposed By-laws may be inspected at the Capital Regional District Building Inspection Office, Salt Spring Island.

The victim, left unconscious by the blow, was then kicked "for about five minutes" by the other two.

The informant said about 100 people were camped at the site, but most of them were asleep at the time.

According to police, Paul McGowan, 28, of Victoria was taken to Lady Minto Hospital with lacerations to his scalp. He was later transferred to Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria where he was treated and released.

Meanwhile, the event brought some additional trade to local businesses.

David Peek of Nan's in Fulford said he had standing room only in his restaurant from 7:30 am until 8:30 pm on Sunday. He said most of the clientele were concert-goers and that the affair "helped tremendously."

It was the restaurant's busiest

weekend since last year, he added.

A spokesman for the Harbour House Hotel said the concert had no noticeable effect on business. Jackie Hembruff of Kanaka Place

Restaurant reported that her business was up slightly because of the concert.

Rita Dods of Rita's Inn said business was "definitely" better.

Where else but Beaver Point would a Salt Spring Islander set his beans? They practically invented them. So the selection of a recipe for Beaver Point baked beans is a natural in a new Gulf Islands cookbook.

Jo Kynaston has cooked her meals on Salt Spring with a warm regard for the meal and an affection for those who will enjoy it. In her book, *Cooking in the Gulf Islands*, Mermaid Press, she draws a fantasy around her culinary favourites by identifying some recipes with island names and island features.

That's where Beaver Point gets the beans. Kynaston offers them to all comers, through her little book.

The recipes are by Jo Kynaston and the photographs of islands and islanders are the work of her brother-in-law, Luke Kynaston.

Mayonnaise, you may observe, is not attributed to Mayne Island. But the island gets the stew with an outline of Mayne Island oven stew.

CLOSE TO HOME

Staying close to home are Pender Island rhubarb cake and Port Washington lemon bars. Otter Bay knows its onions with Otter Bay onion buns.

Village Bay butter tarts are unrelated to the ferry and Trincomali could be linked with one of several islands.

Sturdies Bay brown bread might be enjoyed with Montague Harbour fondue if you happen to be fond of brown bread. All the islands share the bounty of Lady Minto and well may identify with Lady Minto peach chutney.

Salt Spring Island, being the biggest, as well as home to the author, gains the greatest number of quotations. Foxglove rhubarb pie could be the complement to Long Harbour lunch loaf. Although probably not intended as such, I would take Driftwood nut roll in preference to Ganges granola. Gulfstream barbecue sauce goes better with plumbers than plumbing and Caldwell clam chowder brings memories of a quiet beach and a generous owner.

Sunshine figures released

The sun has been shining, sometimes, this year, according to figures released by the Gonzales Weather Station in Victoria.

Up to the end of June, the sun shone 1,028 hours in the first six months of the year. That compares to a yearly average of 1,068.5 hours.

Then for the first 24 days of July the sun shone for 308.2 hours.

January had the least sunshine at 87 hours, up from the average of 68 hours. May was the brightest month with 235.8 hours of sunshine but that figure was below the average for May of 276.8 hours.

be a great break after a strike and Vesuvius venison might yet be too rare. Salt Spring leg of lamb is one of those dishes that every farmer should know. It appears that Salt Spring is predominantly a savoury island as you reach Shepherd Hills cabbage rolls. Sansum squash puff comes closer to Salt Spring than any other island, while Mount Maxwell soufflé sweetens the pot.

Further afield comes Denman Island harvest cake and Gabriola cheese bread. Thetis coleslaw upholds the north end of the Gulf Islands group, with Quadra carrot meat loaf from up north of the group.

Valdes chicken supreme reigns thus with a touch of Hornby Island creamed spinach. It is unfortunate that Texada Shipwreck and Queen of Sidney quiche come so closely together, but the two never meet.

Back in the nearby islands we find Saturna lamb casserole and what they don't know about lamb on Saturna is not worth studying, as well as Galiano spinach pie.

Bear in mind that those are only a sampling from the book. The mass of the offerings are not attributed to any particular island or islander.

And that's all for now. If you want to try for yourself, you get the book! It's on sale in the islands.

Global Island theatre group of creative youngsters

Jam Sandwich or Global Island Theatre is a group of talented young ladies and gentlemen, recently arrived on Salt Spring Island from the University of Victoria.

If these extremely enthusiastic and creative youngsters are indicative of the ability of UVic and other Canadian universities to develop artists for the theatre, then theatre shall be alive and well and thriving in Canada.

The following is extracted from an interview conducted at Beaver Point Hall, where the group has been creating and rehearsing their latest theatre piece, *A Different Mirror*, a play about Chile.

It will be performed at 8 pm Saturday at the Salt Spring Centre on Blackburn Rd. The performance will be a benefit for Amnesty International, during its present Campaign for the Abolition of Torture.

Questions:

Q: Why a play on Chile?

Keith: Well it started with human rights in Central and South America. And I guess the idea was to focus on one area. We figured, the more we focus on a specific, the greater the impact.

Jennifer: Also it was choosing the Island of Chilloway. A lot of it had to do with where we live now.

Q: Salt Spring Island.

Jennifer: Yeah. And where the tour is taking us is all the islands, and Vancouver Island. And it's very similar....Remember that Chile before the junta was very much like Canada.

Q: That's how you had seen it so you made the parallel.

Paddy: From pictures of Chilloway, the Island of Chilloway, one of the things that struck me about the island was that the geography and building materials were very similar to what you see here on Salt Spring Island.

Jennifer: You know so much political theatre ends up going BAM BAM BAM and bashing people on the head, that people turn off. And this way we can get to people, because it's us and we're Canadians,

and we are potentially in that same position.

Q: Do you think that people on this island really want to come down and see a play about Chile?

Almeda: Yeah, I think so. When people here in Canada think of Chile they think of the military junta, and all kinds of morbid things...torture, that's all we get here, in the libraries and the news...violence and misery. And what we're trying to present in this play is a picture of Chile...what is Chile? Not this mistake, this junta. But the culture of Chile and the life of it, and the beauty of it.

Jennifer: As well as the existing junta.

(I asked them why their theatre poster is so oppressive, and lamented that it may turn people away).

Paddy: The artist that did the poster has not seen the play.

Jennifer: This is a good statement on how people perceive Chile. The artist made an automatic assumption that it was a vision of grief. So, yeah, sure, we agree with you about the posters.

Almeda: I know. It's terrible. It's so stark and black and red.

Q: Tell me some more about the promotion of the play.

Jennifer: Our mythological characters we will bring to the streets for promotion.

Q: Streets and farmers' markets.
Jennifer: And the Farmers' Market. In Ganges. Next Saturday.

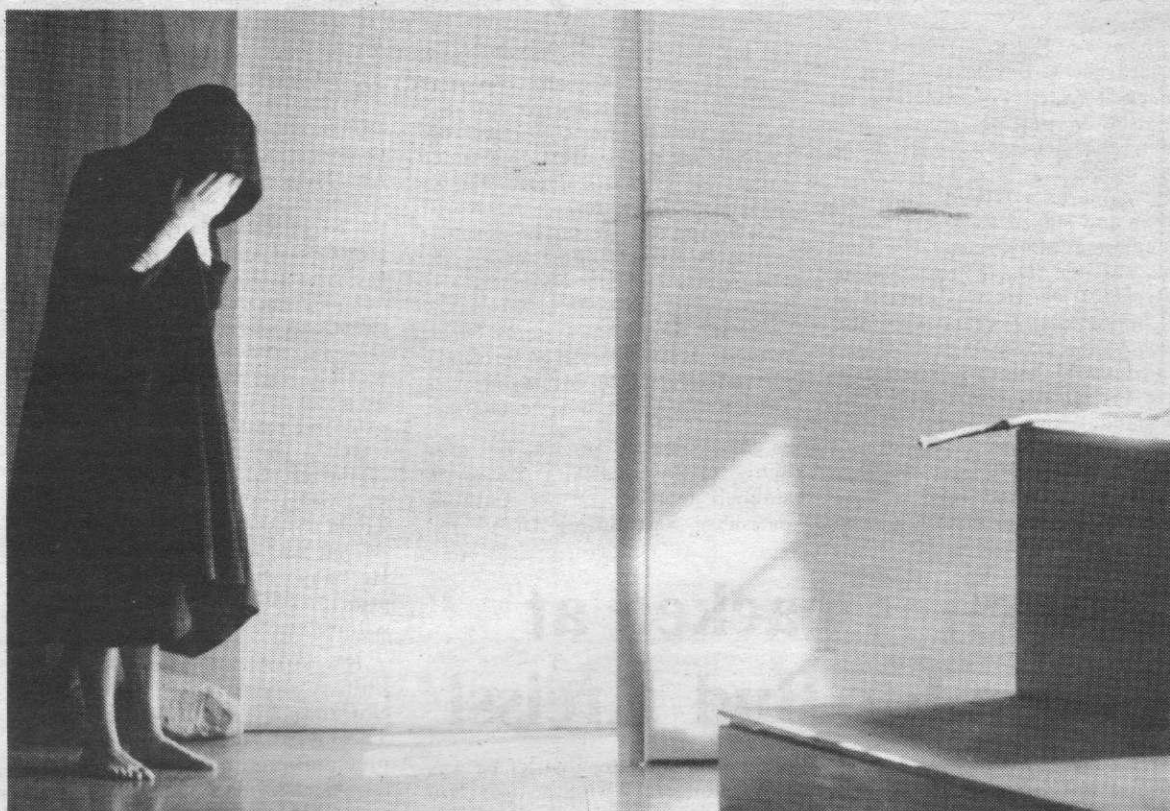
Q: Who the heck are you guys anyhow?

Almeda: Well, we met at UVic last year. We got together this political theatre group, and then more and more concern groups started asking us to write shows, so we decided to apply for a grant. The first one was Jam Sandwich.

Jennifer: Assuming of course we'd get neither grant and we got both of them.

Q: And you all live here now?

Almeda: Well, we all moved here from Victoria in the spring to rehearse and write our show. And it has....Salt Spring Island is the perfect place, so inspiring and

beautiful. We have the free use of this beautiful community hall...apparently it's a lot like the Chilean community halls.

Jennifer: The people have been very receptive to us here. Very positive about everything we're doing.

Paddy: Coming back here from Victoria is like tension relief.

Almeda: People recognize us when we get back...in the stores...on the ferry...in the pub...

Jennifer: My dream is to be a star on Salt Spring Island.

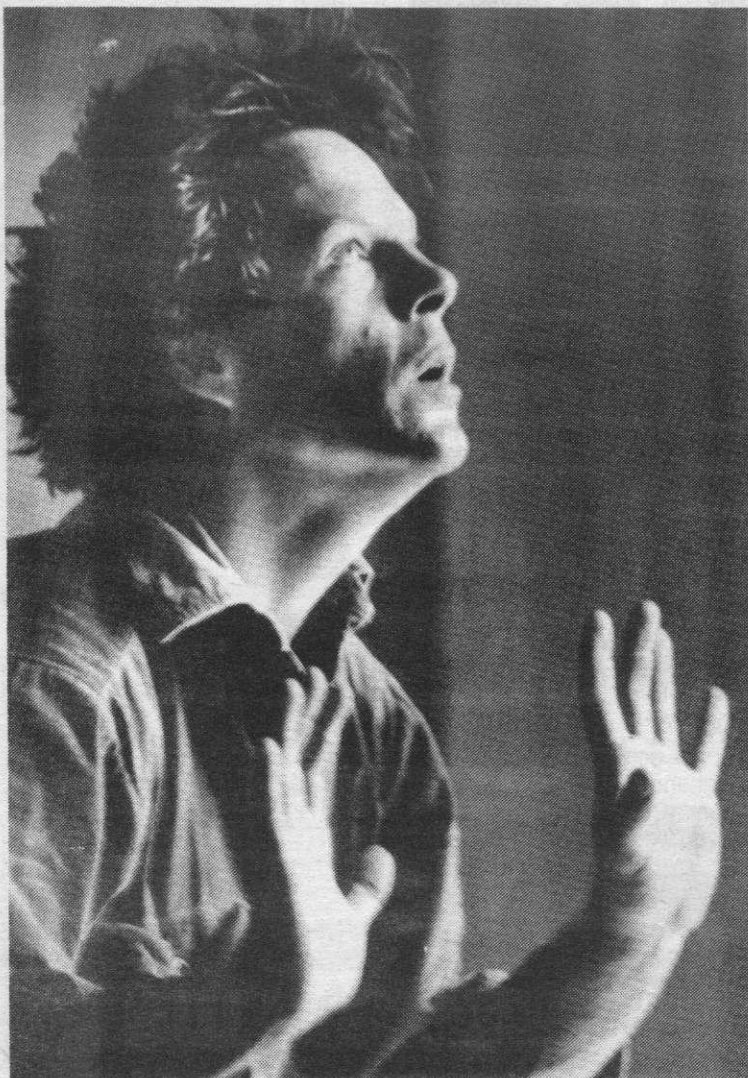
