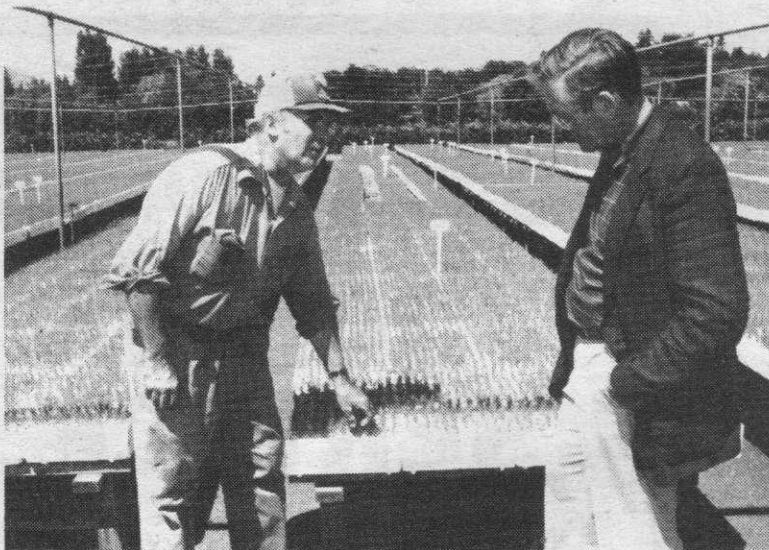

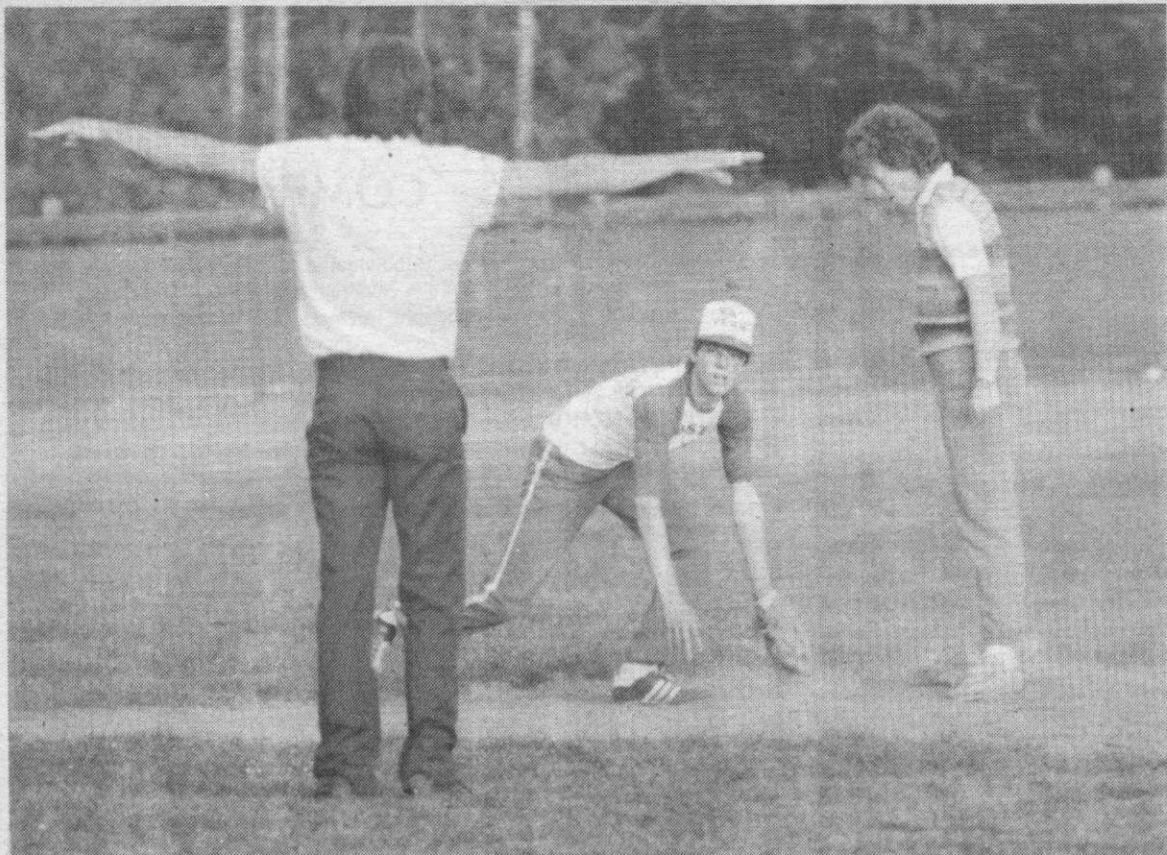

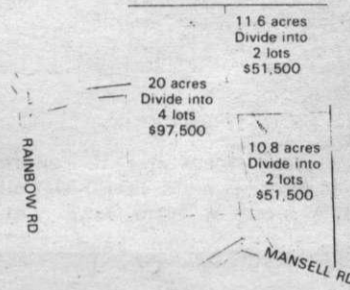

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

Telephones in the Gulf Islands were to be switched to automatic dialing. The change-over would cost \$645,000 with \$320,000 being spent on the lines on Salt Spring. The Ganges exchange would have a 537 prefix followed by four numbers. The Outer Islands phones would have a 539 prefix with four other numbers.

Breakfast was served by the Ladies' Auxiliary to the Salt Spring Legion and 325 people showed up. The meal was organized to raise money for the Legion scholarship and when the last plate had been served, there was \$343 in the till.

The Bambrick Trophy, symbolic of the inter-island golf championship, was won by the eight-man Salt Spring team. A.M. Brown, W. Carlson, Dermott Crofton, Mark Crofton, Ray King, Bob Raguin, Ken Ralph and Ed Richardson won out over teams from Galiano and Pender Islands.

A cougar was suspected of killing sheep on the Ruckle farm at Beaver Point on Salt Spring. Bob Akerman would take his hounds to the hunt. A big cat had washed ashore on Sansum Narrows earlier, apparently drowning when the tide was too strong. The cat on the loose had killed four sheep on the south-end farm.

The Order of the Eastern Star had raised \$130 from a coffee and pie sale held at Alec McManus' Shell Station in Ganges. The money would go to pay for cancer dressings.

The Fulford Sports Festival drew 600 people despite the cool weather. Horseshoe pitching, softball games and a baby contest highlighted the day. Later in the evening a dance was held at Fulford Hall. The festival took place on the sports field which Bob Akerman had donated to the community.

Fifteen years ago

The health inspector was back on the job in the Gulf Islands. He had been withdrawn from service by Dr. Whitbread, the regional health officer, as a result of a dispute with the provincial government over money. New homeowners had been unable to move into their homes because no inspections of septic systems had been carried out.

Heavy trucks were having a difficult time reaching Salt Spring Island. The ramp at the Fulford ferry terminal had been damaged and only light vehicles were being allowed across it. Trucks had to take the Outer Island ferry and transfer at Otter Bay to catch the *Sechelt Queen* bound for Long Harbour. The Vesuvius ferry was also out of bounds for trucks because of the weight restriction on the Crofton wharf.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that Donna Begon had spotted a wild goat near the shale plant. Some friends, he said, were boating near Samuel Island and had spotted a llama on that island. Papajohn did not believe the story.

A sewer survey would be funded by the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce. An engineering firm had been hired to check, once again, on the need for a sewer in Ganges. The chamber had allocated \$250 towards the project.

The ferry wharf at Saturna was in bad shape. Bob Hindmarch told a meeting of islanders and ferry officials. Ferries often bumped the wharf too hard, he said. Vehicles were being side-loaded at the wharf and Hindmarch called for construction of an end-loading wharf.

The fish went for the bait in the Salt Spring Legion salmon derby. Top weight was taken by E.J. Morrison with a 17 lb., 13 oz. catch. Junior prize was taken by Keith Winter who landed a 7 lb., 13 oz. salmon while Barbara Toynbee topped the ladies with a 16 lb., 3 oz. salmon. Jack Webster won a consolation prize.

Ten years ago

B.C. Ferries introduced a new fare collection system for Salt Spring Island. Travellers would buy a round-trip ticket at either Swartz Bay or Crofton and not on the island. The system, said a ferry company official, would speed up the loading process.

Vandals had taken the flags from Centennial Park in Ganges for the last time. The latest incident involved not only the removal of flags but also the halyards. Legion officials had no plans to replace the missing items.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that work on the addition to the Community Hall, under the direction of Harvey Jensen, was proceeding just fine. The sidewalk superintendents were being kept in line by Jo Ann House. The flag pole would have to be replaced. It was found to be rotten about half way up so a new one would be found to hold Art Ralph's flag.

Trucks hauling logs may be stopped from using the ferries to get off-island. When a loaded logging truck uses a ferry, the weight limit meant that only about 10 other vehicles can be taken.

The Mayne Island Fall Fair would be officially opened by Premier Dave Barrett. Marjorie Haggart had her crew getting things in shape for the event. Foy Miles was in the process of setting up some interesting activities for visitors to the fair.

The fishing derby held by the North Galiano Community Club lasted for two days. Top prize went to E. Godfrey who landed a 21 lb. spring salmon. Jeremy Hope won the children's competition with a large ling cod. Colin Berry hooked a 9 lb., 12 oz. dogfish. The largest ling cod in the commercial class was weighed in at 51 lb. It was caught by Tony Ujeyama.

The fire hall in Ganges had been expanded. The volunteers of the fire department held an open house to show off their new facilities. MIA Hugh Curtis attended the opening ceremonies.

Five years ago

The Queen of Alberni went aground on a reef in Active Pass. No injuries were reported but the 60 vehicles on board the ferry were

damaged when tossed around by the impact. Damage estimates went as high as \$1 million. The ferry was towed off the rocks about 14 hours after it hit.

The Cowichan resident caught a 23 lb., 9 oz. salmon but it came second in the Mayne Island salmon derby. The Lions Club of that island sponsored the event and top prize went to Andy Waswick of Mayne who landed a 33 lb., 6 oz. fish. Brad Richter was the second-place finisher.

The controversial dock at Bennett Bay was being worked on again. A piledriver was driving piles while a tug brought in more lumber. The Islands Trust was taking the issue to court to determine if it had the authority to regulate zoning matters.

A report that a gambling casino was to be built on one of the Gulf Islands received a short, precise comment from Hugh Curtis, MIA for the islands. His comment was: "No way."

New water quality report a 'rehash' of previous studies

Water quality in St. Mary Lake has been going downhill for a number of years, states a ministry of environment report released recently.

The report, *A Trend Study of Water Quality in British Columbia*, compiles figures accumulated from 7,154 sites across the province over the past 15 years.

The St. Mary study showed "that the water quality...had significantly changed over the past decade, the most important change being the increase in nutrients."

The report goes on to state that land development around the lake caused an increase in phosphates going into the lake. The result is year-round blooms of blue-green algae. The lake is eutrophic and oxygen is depleted in deeper parts of the lake.

The chemistry of the lake water has changed "to the point that the lake sediments have now become a net source of phosphates."

"Lake restoration will require both artificial change to the lake

chemistry and control of nutrients from land development and sewage disposal," the report stated.

Mike Larmour of the North Salt Spring Water District said the report was a "rehash" of previous studies of St. Mary Lake. The figures, he said, indicate that the lake is in "pretty bad shape".

The fish and wildlife branch of the ministry of environment will be installing an aeration machine in St. Mary Lake this fall in an effort to increase the amount of oxygen in the lower depths.

Larmour also noted that algae growth this year is not as prevalent as in previous years. He credits the lessening of the algae on the flushing action in the lake caused by the heavy rains which fell last year.

The aeration will help, he said, but no noticeable effects will be seen until next summer.

The report showed a steady decrease in dissolved oxygen at depths from five to 25 metres over the past years.

Dr. Malcolm Clark of the

environment quality unit of the ministry of environment was the author of the report. He said that although some areas, such as St. Mary Lake, showed signs of getting worse instead of better, levels of contaminants in water across the province were generally on the decline.

Rustlers at work

Rustlers are busy at Musgrave landing on Salt Spring Island.

RCMP report that Robert Balantyne has lost at least three sheep to rustlers from his property on the isolated west coast area. The sheep were slaughtered at the site and taken away.

The carcass of one sheep had been left at the scene.

The missing sheep were reported Monday and investigation of the theft is underway.

Beauty from Sidney stops at Sturdies Bay

Lily is a lady and she is simply beautiful. Her lines are perfect. She is elegant and superbly turned-out in sleek white. She is both robust and tender. Her style is Whitehall and her home is in Sidney. *Lily* is a rowboat.

Seventeen feet in length, carvel planked and powered by two pairs of curved-blade oars, *Lily* was made by Greg Brown of Sidney and was featured in the July '83 issue of *Wooden Boat Magazine*. This lovely boat was a visitor to Galiano last Thursday and spent the night on Robson's dock in Sturdies Bay.

The Whitehall style of rowing boat was named for a boat-builders' street in New York City. These boats were the 19th century water taxis of New England harbours. They were highly regarded because of their speed, and races for this style were frequently arranged. They were favoured by ship's chandlers, who used them to be first out to obtain the orders for supplies from the captains of sailing vessels entering port.

The *Lily's* crew of two is as interesting as the boat itself. Greg, the builder, is a cabinetmaker by profession but also a talented amateur musician. Stern oars are rowed by Jillann Siemens who doubles as a professional musician and teaches piano at the Victoria Music Conservatory.

Setting out from Canoe Cove at the beginning of the week, Greg and Jillann were thinking only of an afternoon picnic or possibly an overnight stay on one of the local islands, so they had little money, food or spare clothes with them. The trip was lengthened by a call to Prevost Island to visit with the de Burgh family which has musical members. From there the *Lily* was rowed to Montague Harbour on Galiano Island and then through Active Pass to Sturdies Bay.

At short notice a recital was arranged at La Berengerie. The duo began with baroque music with Jillann on piano accompanying Greg on the flute. An appreciative audience demanded encores and during the course of the evening the duo branched into other styles, including music modern enough for teenagers to dance to.

Early the following morning musicians turned into oarsmen and set out into Active Pass, to catch the ebb tide on their way to Russell Island in Fulford Harbour. There was talk of a return visit in the fall—at least by the musicians.

Garden Club

Galiano gardeners who forsook the outdoors on an enticingly sunny afternoon last Wednesday were amply repaid. The speaker, Bob Chicken of Victoria, is an accomplished raconteur who could enliven any topic with flashes of delightful humour.

By 1981, he was an integral part of the UVic team which won the Canadian championship for eights with cox and also fours with cox.

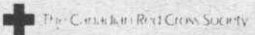
In 1982, Toulmin repeated the win as part of the fours with cox and a year later they picked up a bronze

The efforts of the Canadian rowers have earned the team a fourth-place standing among the best rowers in the world.

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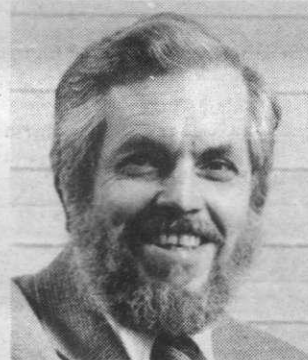


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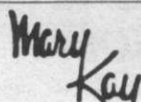


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
