

Liberal candidate brings wealth of civic experience to candidacy

Michael Coleman brings a wealth of civic experience to his candidacy as the Liberal representative seeking the Cowichan-Malahat-The Islands seat in the current federal election.

Coleman had served two terms, from 1979 to 1982, as mayor of Duncan and before that he had been a three-term alderman, 1973-1979, in the Vancouver Island city.

He has also been involved in the Cowichan Foundation as a founder and president; founder and director of Big Brothers of Cowichan; and founder, vice-president and director of the Valley Native Friendship Centre.

Coleman was born in Vancouver and has also lived in Victoria, Regina, and Toronto. His father, Bishop Coleman of the Anglican Church, had been minister in those cities and on Pender Island.

But for the young Coleman, the Toronto connection involved four years of high school at Upper Canada College. He obtained a Bachelor of Arts in Canadian history and political science as well as a Bachelor of Law from the University of British Columbia.

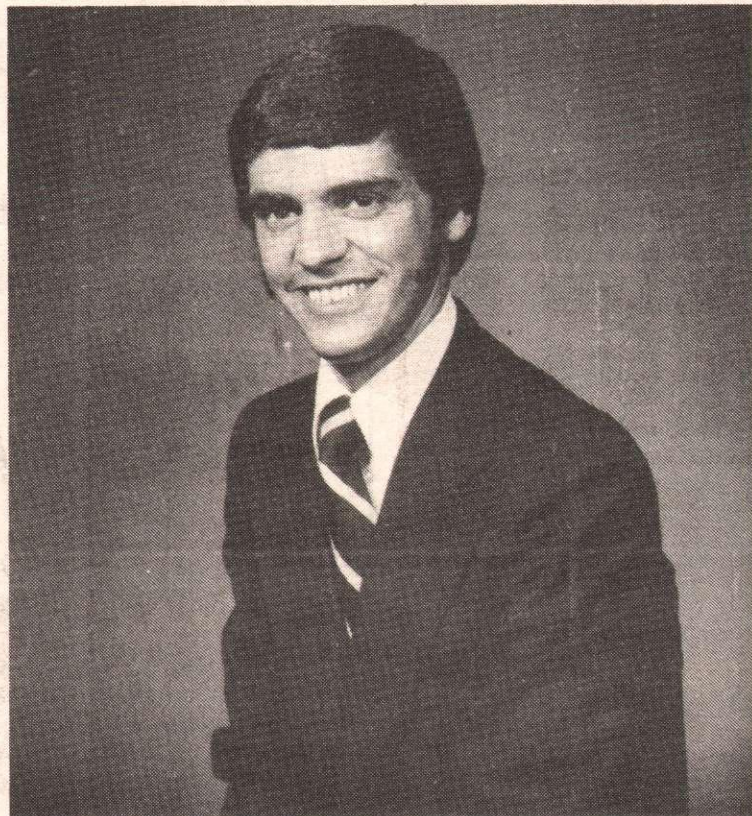
He was called to the Bar of B.C. in 1969 and currently practises the profession with the firm of Coleman, LaCroix, Nesbitt, O'Shea and Wright in Duncan.

As a lawyer, Coleman has served with the Nanaimo County Bar Association as well as the national and provincial councils of the Canadian Bar Association.

In his professional capacity, Coleman also was a co-founder of the Legal Aid Clinic in Duncan.

Coleman is a member of the Canadian Authors Association and has had three books of poetry published. As a poet, he has won many prizes for his work.

His political involvement began in 1960 when he joined the Liberal Party while a student at UBC and



served on the University Liberal Club executive. He helped organize and became the president of the B.C. University Liberal Federation and also served as an executive member of the national branch of that organization.

While at U.B.C. he was active in federal election campaigns in Burrard and provincial campaigns in the riding of Point Grey.

After his move to Duncan to practise law, Coleman continued his involvement with the Liberals as president of the provincial association for Cowichan-Malahat and the federal association for Nanaimo-Cowichan-The Islands.

When the new federal riding of

Cowichan-Malahat-The Islands was formed, Coleman became the president of the Liberal association, a position he holds now.

He and his wife Barbara Joan have raised three children, Charlie, 18, Teddie, 13, and Jamie, 5.

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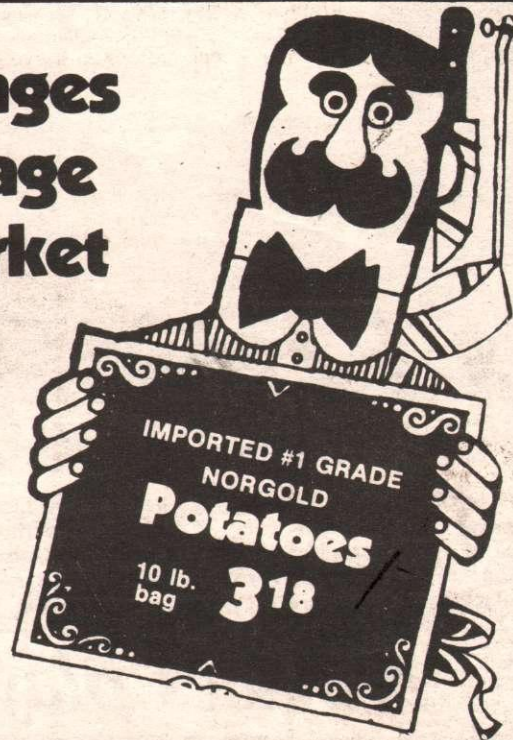
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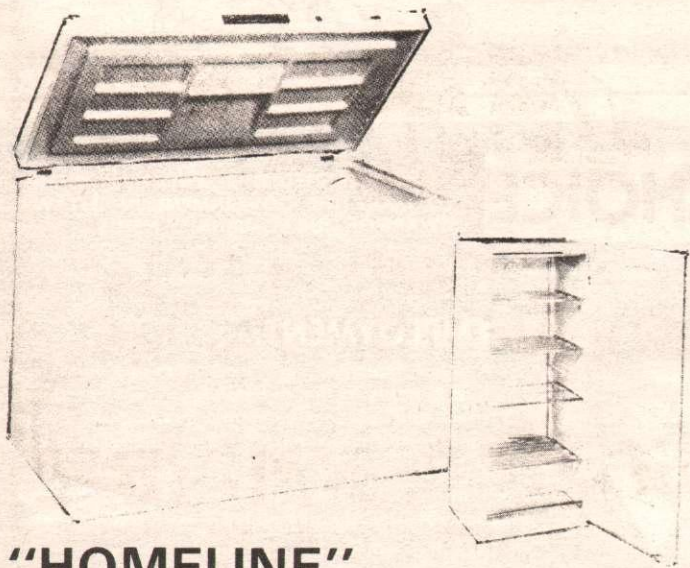

Novices play 231 games

The first novice tournament sponsored by the Salt Spring Tennis Association was held Saturday at Portlock featuring doubles play for the participants.

Loes Holland, with her many years of experience with beginners, was chief umpire. Carolyn Mouat, a Tennis B.C. teacher, umpired matches in the morning when the novices needed most supervision in scoring their matches.

All the established players involved in the organization of this tournament or there as spectators were amazed at the stamina of this group in playing 157 games before lunch and with just as much enthusiasm completing a further 74 games in the afternoon, a total of 231 games in the five hours of play.

It was a tremendous effort by these newcomers to tennis, particularly the men who played constantly all day in back-to-back matches. The winner of the men's individual highest score was Harvard Budgeon, while Linda Sokol beat runner-up Alice Richards by one point in the ladies' division.

The draws for the championships are posted at the courts and the play-offs are in progress. Off-island entrants are contacting their opponents to try to arrange most matches on Salt Spring because of the greater number of public and private courts available.

The semis and finals of this event on September 1, 2 and 3 usually end the organized schedule for the season but this year the association is sponsoring a tennis rating day, tentatively set for later in September. This is a standard method of classifying all tennis players across Canada using a format with professional verification.

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Stacey, McQuiggan win Victoria tourney

When the last volley of the mixed doubles event had been completed at a Victoria tennis tourney last weekend, Peggy Stacey and Gordon McQuiggan of Salt Spring emerged as champions.

The island pair defeated eighth-seeded Lisa Leung and Justin Jay, of Victoria, in the Times-Colonist Tennis Tournament.

Stacey and McQuiggan won the final matches 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 to take the title.

The event began with 80 competitors. Stacey and McQuiggan took at least six games from their opposition to win the title. They had entered the competition un-seeded.

Last year the team won the mixed doubles title of the Salt Spring Tennis Association.

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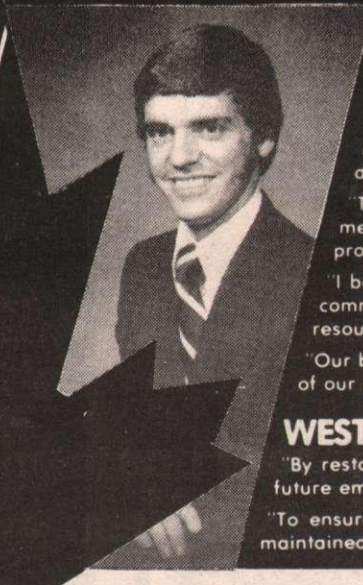

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Classrooms will be ready in October

The two-room addition to Fernwood School on Salt Spring will be open for classes by the end of October.

The classrooms had been scheduled to open for September 4 but a delay in obtaining funding from the ministry of education has pushed the date back two months.

Frank Sutherland, supervisor of works for the school district, said that a three-month building schedule had been arranged but the hold-up of funds from Victoria set the schedule back.

The money for the two-room addition, which is needed to ease overcrowded classes not only at Fernwood but also at Salt Spring Elementary, had been part of the \$1.5 million approved for the new school in Fulford.

But a mix-up in the capital budget process caused by the government's restraint program caused a lengthy delay in approval of the money for Fernwood.

The cabinet approval came in

June and the tendering procedure took another month from the schedule. All tenders have been let except one for suspended ceilings in the classrooms.

The final tender, for the roof, was given to Tyler Sheet Metal of Salt

Spring.

The cost of the addition had been budgeted at \$186,278. The work had been split into sections for tendering and ten contractors will be involved in the project, which is to be managed by the school district.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty years ago

At midnight on Saturday night, the telephone switchboard in Ganges was retired. Isabel Goodman took the last shift before the changeover to automatic dialing.

It was, said Mr. Clegg, a big fish. He landed a 46 lb., 8 oz. salmon to win the Salt Spring Island Legion fish derby. Vic Jackson brought home the largest cod at 24 lb., 4 oz.

The Gulf Islands School Board announced the staffing of Salt Spring Elementary School for the coming year. J.M. Evans would be principal of the 18-member teaching staff, which included a young teacher named Glenn Woodley.

The Fathom Phantoms hosted 65 divers from Vancouver Island, the mainland and Washington in a competitive dive at Vesuvius beach on Salt Spring. They went fish hunting for four hours and the Mudsharks of Seattle brought back 55 lb., 14 oz. of fish. Don Irwin was the top hunter for the home side.

The Salt Spring school was overcrowded and space for classes would be found in Mahon Hall and the staff room. The kindergarten would be moved to the study hall in the dormitory on Ganges Hill.

The Ganges Belles went down to defeat, 29-3, at the hands of the Fulford First Aid Kits. The game was revenge for the south island team after they had lost the first game of the challenge match earlier. A tie-breaker would be played at a later date.

Organizers of the hospital bargain sale were looking for remnants of dress goods as well as other odds and ends of sewing material. The sale would be held on September 10, said Mrs. A.M. Brown.

Fifteen years ago

Ferry service to and from Fulford stopped for a day. Work crews were fixing the wharf and the ferry crew had the day off. A timber in the wharf had collapsed and the wharf had been used, at a reduced weight limit, until replacement parts could be found. The stressed timbers were replaced by steel beams.

The spring salmon weighed in at 36 lb., 1 oz. and it took Bill Earl of North Vancouver three years to land it. He had been coming to the islands to fish for that length of time without having caught anything. He hooked the spring in Stuart Channel.

The health inspector was on holiday and no septic field installations would be checked until September. Islanders were upset because the health inspector had been withdrawn earlier in a dispute with the province over money. When that dispute had been settled and the inspector came back to work, he was sent on a holiday.

There was to be a provincial election and three candidates sought the seat for Saanich and the Islands. Don Johannessen of the New

Democrats and Louis Lindholm of the Liberals were going against incumbent John Tisdale of the Social Credit.

Capt. L.B.D. Drummond died in Lady Minto Hospital and the island mourned his passing. He was 88 years old. Capt. Drummond had been a prominent sportsman on Salt Spring for many years. He had donated land on Fulford Harbour for a children's park.

A cougar was reported to be roaming Mouat Park on Salt Spring and Bob Akerman brought his dogs to find the big cat. Nothing could be found.

Ten years ago

Parents of school children on Pender Island were upset when the Gulf Islands School Board appointed Mrs. D. Austin as principal. A. Rundle-Woolcock had been acting principal until the appointment and would stay on staff at the school. The Pender delegation to the school board meeting had been led by Gordon Wallace and N.H. Doyle.

Premier Dave Barrett was the special guest at the Mayne Island Fall Fair. He took part in the opening ceremonies, toured the exhibits and then caught a plane back to Vancouver.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the Lions Club met with president John McDonald as chairman. John Silvester would be the head of the wood-cutting gang to supply firewood for the Community Hall.

Thieves visited Thieves Bay on Pender Island and took an outboard motor belonging to Mrs. N. New. She told RCMP that the motor went missing from the back of a boat sometime Friday night.

The last large oil tank had been moved to the new location on Galiano Island. Ollie Garner brought his grapple loader while Roy Harding drove the trench hoe. The tanks were being moved from the water side to a location near the service station.

A grant of \$3,512 would help the Pender Island Silver Threads create a recreation program for seniors. The money came from New Horizons and the recreation program was being developed by Finlay Sterling.

Five years ago

Fog slowed the Bowen Queen as she plied the route between Fulford and Swartz Bay. The boat almost went aground but avoided the shallow water just in time. But at Gosse Channel at the entrance to Swartz Bay, the ferry brushed the channel buoy.

A temporary injunction would be sought to stop construction of the dock at Bennett Bay on Mayne Island. The Islands Trust had been prompted to act at the urging of Barry Wilks of the Bennett Bay Preservation Committee. Weldon Pinchin of the Mayne Inn had ordered the work on the dock

started again after months of no action.

The golfers vied for honours in the Salt Spring Invitational and Ian Shopland won again. Low net went to Tom Butt. For the ladies, Irene Hawksworth took low gross and Lois Popkin-Clurman won the low net. The most honest golfer was Aage Villadsen.

The Sh-Qu-Ala Screaming Eagles of Pender won the championship in men's fastball. Led by pitcher Ted Bowerman, the Pender team defeated Langdons Loggers 4-2 on a grand slam homerun by Harry Danylchuk.

The annual fall fair at Mayne Island attracted more than 800 people. The parade kicked things off and Fred Dodds introduced special guest Jack James who officially opened the fair.

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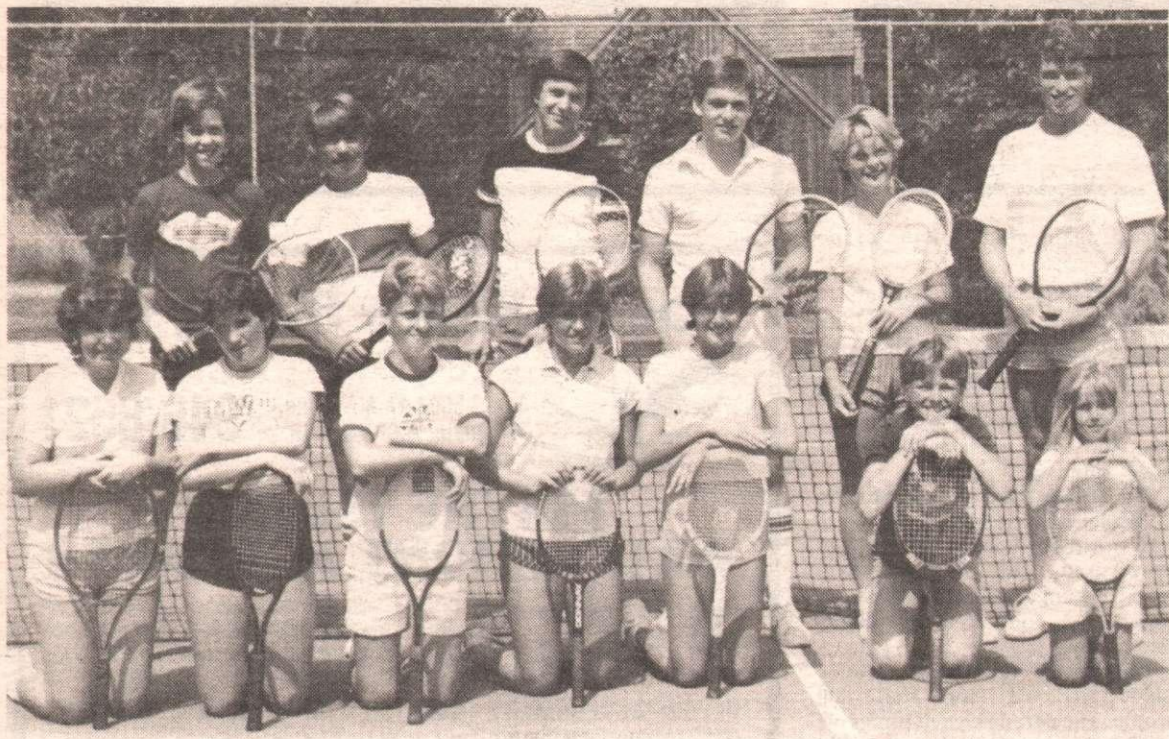
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Clinic offered

together on Salt Spring to find ways of getting around the approval of the Musgrave development.

"We've got to get the public riled up," said Wallace. "This is a hell of a thing."

He said that Musgrave was not the main issue but was symptomatic of the situation which concerns the Trust.

Gilbert went on to say that the

developer, Rico Holdings, seemed intent upon taking over the bay at the landing. There is a government wharf in the bay and visitors to Salt Spring sometimes anchor their boats there, he said.

If the developer takes over the bay, it could take away the rights of the public to use the area, he said.

The Trust Committee decided to write letters to the federal fisheries

people urging that the water lease be expanded to cover more of the bay. Another letter will go to Jim Manly, local MP, to enlist his support in the efforts.

During the discussions on the issue, Hank Schubart of Salt Spring suggested that the Islands Trust should change its own regulations to counter the changes made by the provincial cabinet.

He told the meeting that a "planned unit development" zone should be put in place to cover characteristics of strata developments. That way, he explained, developers would have to meet local concerns and the issue would have to go to public meeting.

Humphries told the meeting that the staff of the Islands Trust were looking at ways, such as that suggested by Schubart, to get around the strata title changes.

Minister signs lot size bylaw

Municipal Affairs Minister Bill Ritchie recently approved an increase in the minimum lot size for the Stowe Lake watershed to four hectares (close to 10 acres).

The Salt Spring Island Trust Committee had sent the bylaw making the change in parcel size from 2 ha. (almost five acres) to the minister last October. The minister's approval came in July.

The Stowe Lake watershed is the only Watershed 2 zone on Salt Spring. The watersheds for the other lakes, such as St. Mary, Cusheon, Weston and Maxwell, are

zoned Watershed 1.

The minimum parcel size in those zones is set at 4 ha. The Maxwell watershed, major source of water for Ganges, has a minimum parcel size of 12 ha. (close to 30 acres).

The Trust Committee had sent a bylaw approving the 12 ha. limit in all Watershed 1 zones to the minister last fall.

But he refused to sign it. The Trust was urged to find other ways of protecting watershed zones.

The bylaw affecting Stowe Lake watershed was given final approval by the Trust Committee last week.
