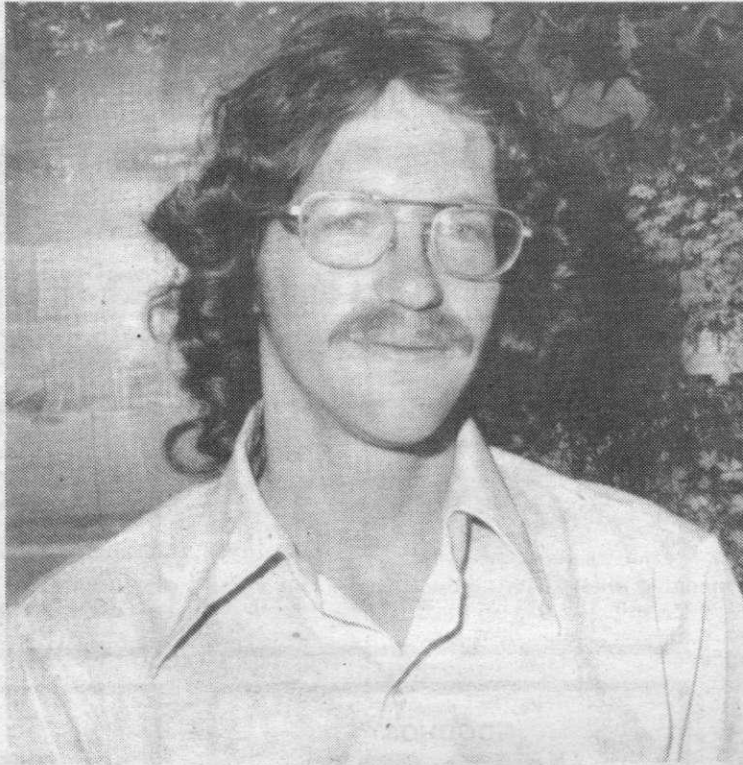

The agricultural program at Gulf Islands Secondary School will be moving to the Farmers' Institute property in September.

The trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board have come to terms with the Farmers' Institute on a lease for the facilities. Several minor points remain outstanding.

The trustees will be checking on storage facilities during the summer months as well as access to the storage space during that time.


The lease is worth \$1,080 per month with a 10-month total of \$10,800.

The agreement gives the agricultural program the use of the grounds and the building.

Exact status unknown

Sale of property at Isabella Point on hold

The sale of the Isabella Point school property on Salt Spring has been put on hold by the Gulf Islands School Board because the exact status of the property is unknown.

Residents of the area came to a meeting of the school board last week to ask that the property not be sold but turned into a park for local use.

The .61 acre parcel had been decided to the Isabella Point school district by Johnny Pallow, a Kanaka, who had settled on the property in 1896.

It had been used as a school site until the late 1950's when the school district became part of the Salt Spring school district. There were not sufficient pupils to keep the school open.

The property was registered to "School District 64" and its successors for ever" to be held in trust for school purposes and as a

school site.

The property is also crown land. Ron McQuiggan, Salt Spring school trustee, told the meeting that the sale of the property as well as other unusable parcels of land was crucial to future expansion plans of the school board.

He said that within 20 years, up to 15 acres of land would be needed for a school site to accommodate the growth of the school-age population on Salt Spring. A legal opinion on whether the property can be sold or not will be sought by the Board.

The proposed sale of the teacherage on Pender Island also came under criticism. That parcel is one of the four properties which the school board considers to be unneeded.

Joy Ridley, school trustee for Pender, told the meeting that the property could be needed as a residence for one of the new teachers

who are coming to the Pender school in September.

The school trustees earlier this summer decided to sell four properties which are considered excess land. The teacherage on Galiano as well as the five-acre site

at the corner of Stewart and Beaver Point Roads on Salt Spring are the other parcels up for sale.

The Stewart Road property became the centre of a controversy when it was discovered to be in the Stowe Lake watershed. Zoning

bylaws prohibit schools in watershed zones.

When the Islands Trust refused to exempt the property from the watershed, the school board had to purchase another site closer to the village of Fulford.

Busing contracts approved

Contracts worth slightly more than \$76,800 for bus service for school children were approved by the Gulf Islands School Board last week.

Membership costs \$8,250

Membership in the B.C. School Trustees Association will cost the Gulf Islands School Board \$8,250 for 1984-1985.

That amount includes a basic fee of \$7,550. The school board also opted to take the teacher qualification service offered by the BCSTA for \$400. The fee is split 50-50 between the association and the school districts.

A further \$300 goes for a fee for service. The school board would take advantage of legal services, collective bargaining research, trustee effectiveness seminars and computerized teacher registry for that amount.

In addition, the Gulf Islands School Board will be part of the Canadian School Trustees Association. The fee for that group will be \$104 which is based on 9.5¢ per student in the school district.

The trustees agreed to bus contracts for service on Pender, Mayne and Salt Spring Islands.

The Mayne bus service carries a price tag of \$23,750 while the Pender contract is worth \$25,900. On Salt Spring, the school board will be paying out slightly more than \$27,000.

The school bus on Mayne had previously been used only to transfer children from the Outer Islands to the school. The new contract allows children on Mayne to be picked up. The extra cost of service will be offset by savings resulting from the school board not having to pay transportation assistance to Mayne parents who had driven their children to school.

The Pender contract also involves increased costs. The bus route will be extended down Gowlland Point Road to pick up and drop off children who live there.

When Salt Spring school trustee Ron McQuiggan objected to the increases, the trustees agreed to look at student numbers when school opens in September. If the number of students using the buses is fewer than anticipated, the trustees will try to renegotiate the contracts or rearrange the bus route.

KICK-OFF

Off-island players slow to register

Last week I discussed the major programs the Salt Spring Soccer Association will offer for the coming season, and this week I will

look at our minor programs. These programs play an integral part in the success of our full program.

First, though, I will encourage all those who wish to participate in our program this year to get registered now. If you wait too much longer you may miss the chance to play on a team or we may not have enough players to register our teams.

Our off-island players have been particularly late with registering and so I urge all of them to register now. It is easy to do, as you either mail your blue form with payment and a copy of your birth certificate to S.S.I.Y.S.A., Box 1191, Ganges, or come to Portlock Park this Thursday or Friday from 8 am to get registered (forms are available at the field).

Scholarship program

One of the most important factors in running any program is fund-raising. In previous seasons our participants have raised over 75% of their own funding through fees, Kick-A-Thon, car washes, bingo and ticket sales, and this year should be no different.

The other 25% we have tried to raise from the business community, clubs, individuals and the Recreation Commission and we have received tremendous support in the past.

Our sponsorship program is in three levels: off-island teams, on-island teams, or the association as a whole, with an appropriate amount at each level. In return our association gives out a plaque and invites the sponsors to our Christmas dinner and banquet.

It is a very worthwhile program and we hope the community as a whole will help us achieve the funding necessary.

Shoot-A-Thon Program

This is our club's main fund-raiser by its participating members. The players will be taking a series of 10 penalty shots at their own goalkeeper to see how many times they can score.

We supply the players with a form which they take around the community to get people to sponsor them for so much per goal scored and after achieving their total they will collect the money owed.

Of the money collected 25% stays as a credit for the player to use towards purchase of soccer equipment and the other 75% goes towards the association in general revenues.

This program is experimental this year as it replaces our Kick-A-Thon program, which did poorly last year.

Referees' Program

Our referees' program has developed youth referees and linesmen over recent years to give us an excellent crop of officials.

Under the tutelage of Lin Beattie we have exams to attain certified officials. We will also be doing field exams and starting a mentor program (senior officials working directly with junior) to improve officials even more.

Coaches' Program

Coaching programs have been few and far between in recent years mostly due to the difficulty of finding time to assemble them all at the same time—games always interfere.

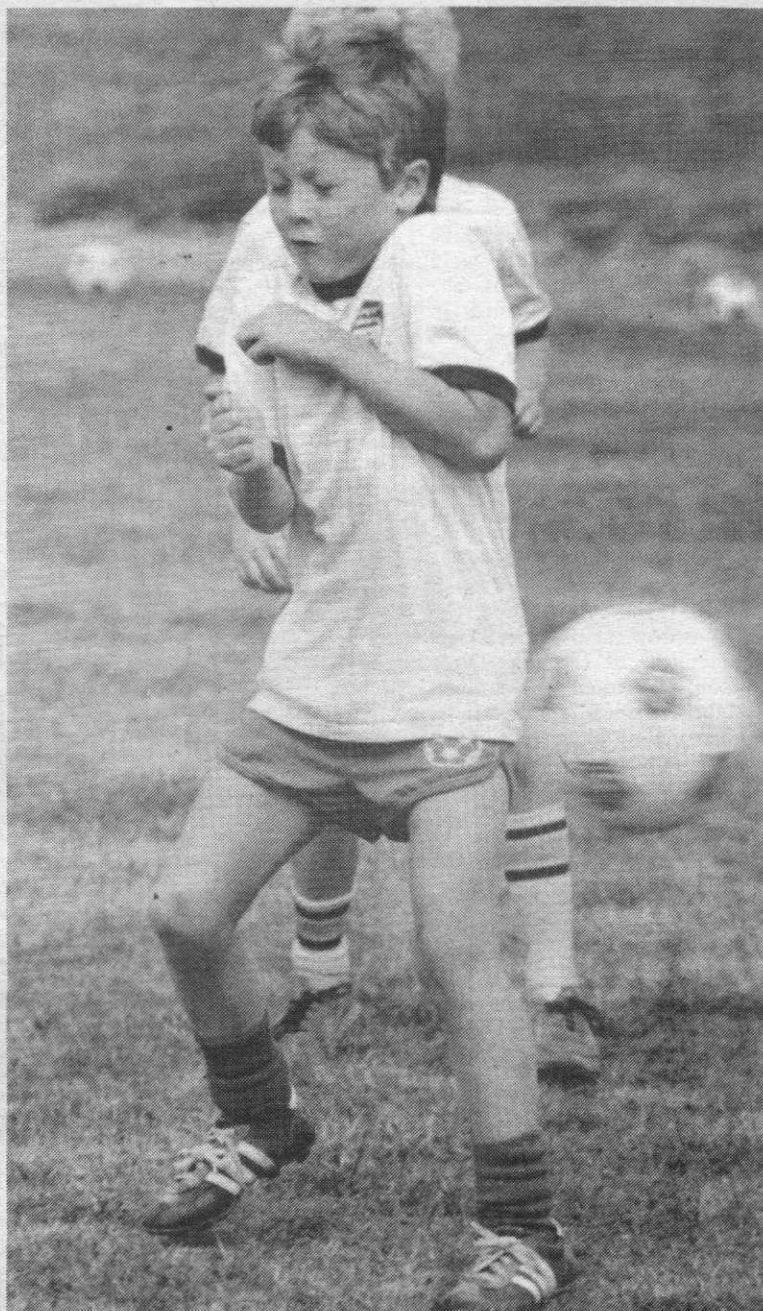
We hope this year to offer some clinics and guests to assist our fine crop of coaches, which last year was the best group we have ever had.

New approach quiet revolution in agriculture

There is a sort of revolution going on all over the place, and it seems that it is rather infectious. At one time revolutions, and revolutionaries, were confined to far-off foreign countries with an intense and volatile disposition, but not any more.

Methinks that it is quite a natural consequence of our doing, as the 3,000 revolutions per minute of my purring engine propel me into town, the vehicle itself a product of the industrial revolution. All those revolutions produce a profoundly propelling effect, as I am propelled from our place to town, as the water is propelled from the well to the toilet tank, and as an aircraft or a boat propels itself from one place to another.

There also seems to be a more subtle effect of all of those revolutions; it is as if a revolutionary element has crept into all our affairs, and I am beginning to feel like a piston. Just as I have returned to a state of calm and deserved equilibrium, yet another forceful event explodes above my head and sends me once more around the bend.

NO SHORTAGE

There seems to be no shortage of these impelling events; the arbitrary ignition of a blatantly mysterious fuel in the Musgrave Landing rounds; yet another explosion caused by the familiar mix of volatile effluent and revolutionary sparks in the continuing ups and downs of our sewer sage; and the faithfully recurrent implosions of services, social and otherwise, by those who profess to govern in the interests of the whole, rather than the self. It is enough to drive a piston to exhaustion.

In the meantime, the spark plugs are getting dirty, the oil is getting thin and worn, the next oil change seems thousands of miles away, a distinct rattle may be heard from the pistons, while the whole engine is overheating and in danger of coming to a grinding halt. Wherever we turn, there is something turning around, and in the near future we are asked to make a choice between several new sets of spark plugs to drive our national tractor (this is a gardening article after all) into the golden fields of our future, at least according to all the plugs.

Yet there are other kinds of

revolutions as well; these are not initiated with a bang, God forbid, but seem to come slowly and ever so gently, and moreover, with a definite element of free, personal choice. I made that choice long ago, choosing life over death, or life-positive over life-negative dynamics, as I am prone to say.

EXPERT IN HEALTH

Therefore I am not an expert in all manner of dastardly diseases, fierce fungus infections, bacterial blights and dreadful devastations. Rather, I am an aspiring expert in health, with an intense interest in the health of the whole, since it requires constant heroic efforts to maintain even a semblance of health in an unhealthy environment.

The same goes for wealth, by the

way, a different aspect of the same dynamics, really. Since health and poisons, life and killing are mutually exclusive, poisons do not have a place in our garden, in our food and in our lives, and we have thus become, by our choice, partners in a quiet revolution of life. We are therefore very much pleased to find that many of our agricultural authorities have realized that a natural approach to insect and disease control is fully as effective as chemical control, but much cheaper and much healthier.

UNREALISTIC

One cannot get rid of every aphid, every cutworm, or every fungus with chemical means anyhow, and neither can one with natural controls. Fully as much flawed produce is discarded from chemically controlled production as would be from naturally controlled growing methods, and agricultural experts are now saying that 100% perfect produce is an unrealistic impossibility.

Yet our experience runs contrary even to that opinion. When I described our success with various vegetables in this space last week, I

forgot to mention one thing, perhaps because we are taking it for granted by now, that our produce is perfect.

There are no ifs and no buts about it, we have perfect produce. And we have not done a single thing to bring this about, other than to encourage, mildly, the presence of natural predators, and to improve the quality of our clay, also mildly, and mostly with weeds. Eighty percent of our soil improvements would have to be attributed to recycled weeds, and the remainder to chicken manure, compost, seaweed, lime and rock phosphate combined.

The health of our soil takes care of the diseases; we simply do not have any. The spiders in the mulch, a few wasps and other assorted predatory insects take care of insect pests, well, almost. We have a middling aphid infestation on two of our more than a dozen dill plants, and the odd little slug in the lettuce; that is it though, there are no more. In the scheme of things, then, the presence of a few pests is necessary to guarantee the presence of their predators, and this is the new approach to the natural control of pests, a quiet, but very fundamental revolution in agriculture.

40 historians tour dig at Pender

Many years ago islanders from Mayne, Pender, Galiano and Saturna who were interested in local history formed the Gulf Islands Branch of the B.C. Historical Federation. Over the years the exigencies of the ferry service have made it increasingly difficult for members from the four islands to

general meeting, and for the first time for many years were gratified to be able to form an executive with equal representation from each of the four Outer Islands. Ann Johnstone of Mayne is secretary, Douglas Harker of Pender treasurer, Lorraine Campbell of Saturna vice-president and this writer president.

Any member of this executive will be glad to enroll new members, receive program ideas, or orders from local outlets for the branch's publication, *Gulf Islands Patchwork*. In addition each island is setting up a local sub-committee to arrange island meetings, at which members from the other three islands will be most welcome.

meet together.

It is therefore noteworthy that last Thursday almost 40 members, representatives from all four islands, met for an interesting field expedition to the archeological dig on Pender. They were most fortunate to have as guide the leader, Dr. Roy Carlson from Simon Fraser University, and three graduate students, Lou Beram, Heather Moon and Richard Garvin.

The excavations, the initial phase of a three-year project, have been done on the shores of the canal that separates North and South Pender Island. The wash from boat traffic has already eroded 60% of the original site. Vertical shafts in a sloping bank have been driven in an attempt to reach sterile soil in which there are no signs of habitation. This summer's findings will be worked on during the winter at the university.

Tentative suggestions are that the site was occupied for three to four-month periods from as long as 3700 years ago. Shellfish such as grow around the bay today were an important food item. Soil has been riddled through fine mesh screens to isolate plant seeds from which a botanist may be able to deduce climatic conditions pertaining at the time.

The historians were fortunate to be present when a cache of 12 projectile points was discovered. They were very interested in a display sample of artifacts from this site including ones made of quartz, basalt, serpentine and obsidian and notably adze blades, a larger than normal labret or lip ornament and a soapstone spool designed to fit in the ear.

As many as 5,000 visitors have viewed the Pender site this year, indicating that the services of a guide are needed to allow the archeologists to get on with their work. With this in mind the branch voiced their appreciation to Dr. Carlson and the SFU team and voted a contribution of \$100, and will be writing a letter to the Heritage Conservation Branch of the provincial government suggesting the need for additional funding to pay for a project guide.

After a refreshing lunch at Pender Lodge, the branch held their annual

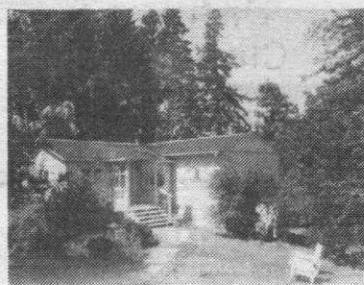

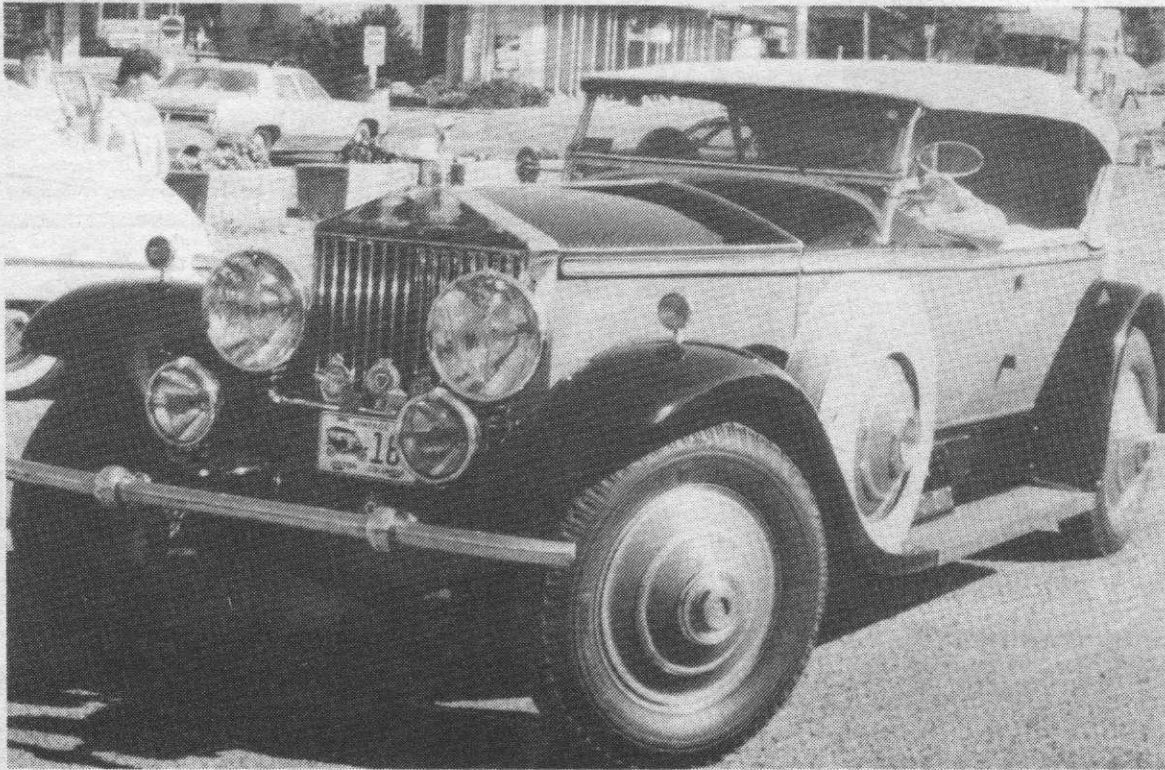

Old cars selling cheap?

Try this one at 20 times its price new!

There was a gathering of vintage cars on Salt Spring Island August 19 and one of the few European cars was this 1926 Rolls touring car. But it was only part-European.

The American Rolls Royce was a hybrid. The parts were manufactured at the home plant in Derby and then transported across the Atlantic to be assembled and completed in the Springfield plant of the American branch of the British manufacturer. There was a difference, alright. The Massachusetts car had a distinctively American body style.

This particular car has an additional claim to distinction. It was once the property of moviemaker Mack Sennet. That makes it the more attractive to a Hollywood buyer.

The market for early models of Rolls Royce has never been brisker. This car was offered for sale in 1926 for \$11,450. That was in the United

States and the dollar was probably about level with the Canadian. The old car was worth about a quarter-million, suggested its proud owner, and that's not a bad mark-up in almost 60 years.

CHEAPER IN USA

Incidentally, the price of an imported Rolls Royce is not immediately to hand for 1926, but if the pattern followed earlier years, or later, the domestic Rolls was cheaper than the import. This could have been a duty cost. In 1923 the complete Rolls built up in Springfield was priced at that \$11,450 figure. The price of an imported chassis with the same Silver Ghost engine was \$12,285. And you still had to buy a custom

body for it!

The 1926 40/50 Rolls Royce was equipped with a six-cylinder engine of 48.6 rated horsepower. It weighed about 5,000 pounds. The later Phantom was a slightly smaller engine of 43 hp.

After 1926, the year of manufacture of the weekend visitor, Rolls Royce of America Inc. gave up offering the car with its own body. The various styles were discontinued and the chassis was available in 1927 at \$12,335 for the Silver Ghost and \$13,835 for the Phantom. At that time there was no eight-cylinder Rolls Royce. Experiments had proved too noisy and the Best Car in the World was also the quietest.

Each chapter is involved in service projects in the community.

A survey of the chapters throughout the world has revealed that more than \$9 million was raised by the groups in one year and the members put in close to 2 million hours doing it.

The money went to national charitable organizations and was also used for other worthy causes.

Each chapter holds 18 meetings

per year and each member is involved in two projects during the year.

A chapter on Salt Spring would be formed if 10 women become involved. Membership is \$15 per year with an initial fee of approximately \$35. As a woman proceeds in the chapter, she moves through five levels depending upon the amount of time in the chapter.

Company stakes mining claim

No notification upsets buyer

There is no gold rush happening at the south end of Salt Spring Island but a claim has been staked by a Toronto-based mining company.

Kidd Creek Mines Ltd. has staked out about 123 acres part way up Musgrave Rd. as part of "general geological reconnaissance," according to a company spokesman in Vancouver.

But that's no consolation to Arthur Farrow, Bittancourt Rd., who is in the process of buying a piece of property on which part of the claim lies. Farrow was upset that the company would stake out the claim without contacting the owner.

The Mineral Act, however, doesn't require a miner to contact a property owner before staking a claim. A spokesman for the provincial ministry of energy, mines

and petroleum told *Driftwood* that while the law doesn't require it, his ministry advises miners to do so as a matter of courtesy.

A spokesman for Kidd Creek Mines said his company doesn't always contact the property owner in such a case because they regard information about their claims as

confidential.

A miner can prospect or mine any property that is unused. But he must notify the owner before he begins mining.

The Kidd Creek Claim is one of many on the south end of the island. Most of them have been staked for at least a year.

Police harvest crops

When the RCMP helicopter flew over Salt Spring and Galiano Islands last Thursday, the officers found what they were looking for.

Following the flight, RCMP visited five gardens and harvested the crop. But the crop was marijuana and charges of cultivating marijuana will be brought against the people involved.

The crop from the gardens weighed 100 pounds.

RCMP also report that investigation of the case of the hydroponic garden discovered on Mount Maxwell continues.

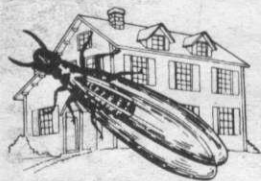

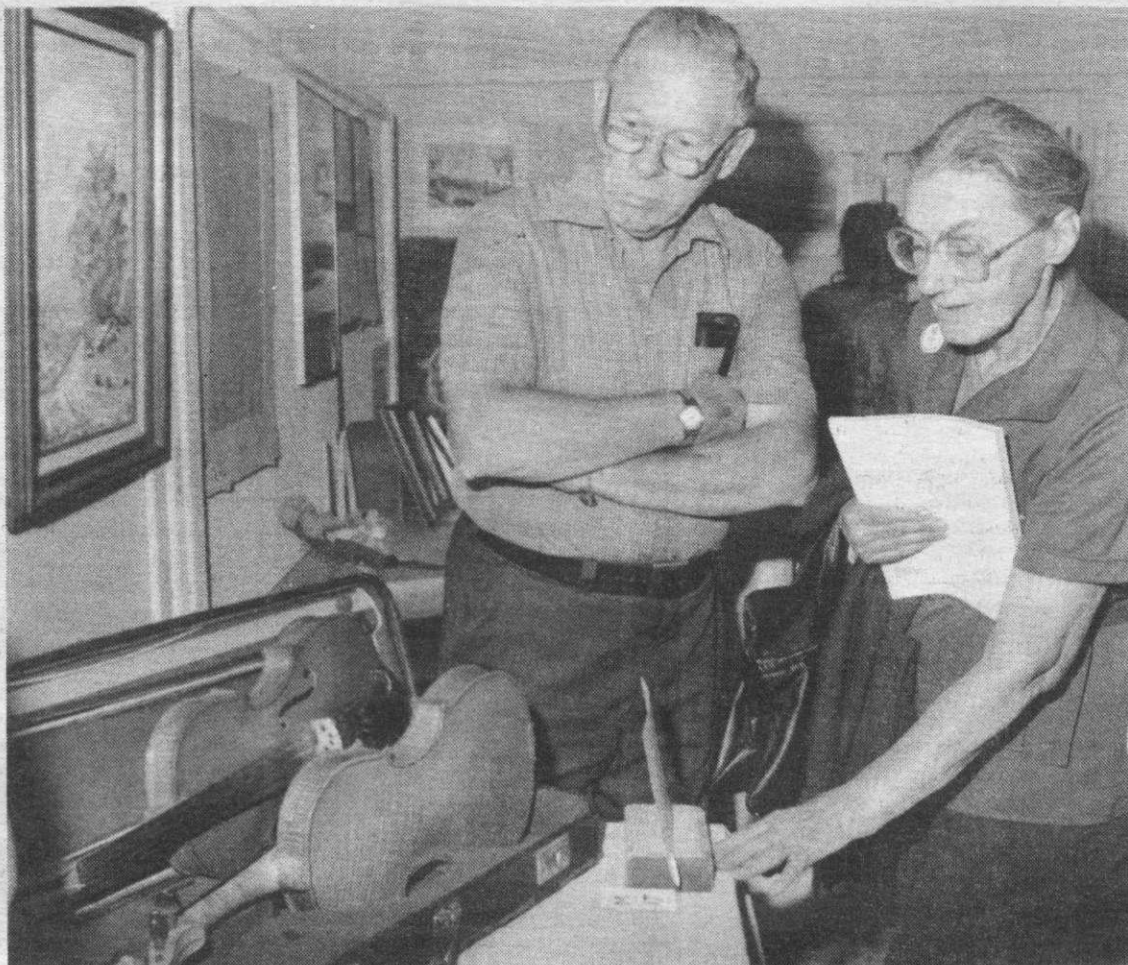

Final \$600,000 will be borrowed against the Ganges sewer subject to a committee report at the next meeting of the Capital Regional District directors.

Last week the board debated the clause to borrow the money as part of a \$3 million bylaw covering the Northwest Trunk, refuse disposal and the Marigold pumping station, all functions of the region on Vancouver Island.

It was noted in the bylaw that the board was authorized to borrow a total of \$2,700,000, of which \$2,100,000 has already been borrowed.

Acting secretary of the board, W.M. Jordan, explained that the action had to be taken before January, 1985, because the federal regulations under which the loan was made will no longer be in force after this year.

There was discussion of the purpose of borrowing the money and both Ernie Beland and John Mika expressed some question.

The board will hear a report from both the water and sanitation committee and the health committee regarding the use of the moneys under consideration.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

When the telephones on Salt Spring went automatic, Josephine Overend retired. She had been with the Ganges exchange as operator since 1943 and had been the chief operator since 1959. She had come to Salt Spring from Manitoba in 1939.

A centennial suggestion from Fulford on Salt Spring was to utilize the Indian Reserve for either a public or a marine park. The Canadian Centennial would be marked in 1967 and organizers were seeking ideas for projects.

The Fulford ladies had been challenged by a team from Ladysmith but when game time arrived, the off-island team wasn't about. So the south Salt Spring ladies challenged the Grandpas and lost 35 to 19. Their next game would be on Labour Day in a rematch with the Ganges Ladies.

The St. Mary's Guild summer fete was to have been a garden party except for the rain. The event moved indoors to Fulford Hall where Archdeacon G.H. Holmes was guest speaker. Guild chairman Doris Anderson introduced the archdeacon to the assembly. The ladies collected \$247 during the afternoon tea and sale of goods.

Dave Stupich, local M.L.A., opened the Mayne Island Fall Fair. More than 600 people streamed through the grounds. Big winner in the exhibits competition was Sylvia Aldridge who took home four of the nine trophies. G. Jennens of South Pender took first spot in two of the livestock and produce competitions and Colleen Piggott was tops in the children's class.

The car was travelling along Fulford-Ganges Road on Salt Spring but the driver lost control and the vehicle ended up in a field. Robert Bonar was treated in hospital for four cracked ribs which he suffered in the accident.

Fifteen Years Ago

High winds and heavy seas caused the loss of two scows off Galiano Island. The scows had been tied up in Cooks Cove when the storm struck and efforts to move them to shelter proved futile. The scows had been used by divers working on the Hydro line being laid underwater from the mainland to Galiano. The scows sank near Gossip Island and were later located for salvage.

Papajohn reported from Saturna as a druggist, not a pharmacist, that ammonia water was the best relief for bee or wasp stings. Not as good, but helpful, he added, was "good old soda bicarb."

Top fish in the Fulford fishing derby tipped the scale at 6 lbs., 4 oz. and was caught by Margaret Leck. The event raised \$100 for the Drummond Park fund. Lorne Barker won the junior section with a 3 lb., 4 oz. salmon. Bad weather and the presence of naval vessels hindered the fishermen in their quest.

The large ferries cruised quickly through Active Pass and bounced boats anchored and moored in Miners Bay on Mayne Island. When the ferries hit a speed of 18 knots on a seven-knot tidal current, the waves hit shore at up to 30 knots. Damage had been caused not only to boats but to shoreline property as well. Pleas for speed controls through the pass were being ignored by both federal and provincial officials.

The highway repair crews had been out on Montague Road on Galiano and residents along the road wanted to thank John Shaw and his men for the blacktop. No

more dust would disturb their homes.

Schools in the Gulf Islands were to open for another year of learning. The children were expected to be in classes for at least half of the first day. But then everything would be back to normal with a full schedule on the second day of school.

Ten Years Ago

The Bowen Queen ran aground on Clive Island on the way into Swartz Bay. Thick fog had hampered the ferry and she waited on the rock until high tide before floating off. Damage was done to the drive shaft and several plates were buckled. The Salt Spring Queen would fill in on the route to and from Fulford for two weeks while the Bowen was being repaired in Vancouver.

The Salt Spring Invitational Golf Tourney was played out over two days the previous weekend and Ian Shopland took low gross, again. Les Rathy, of Nanaimo, had the best low net score. Low gross for the ladies was scored by Muriel Parsons of Vancouver while Betty Harrison of Salt Spring took the ladies' low net.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that three children swam across Winter Cove to Samual Island. Stevie Lawson was the first across followed closely by Susan Beaudry and Dale Lawson.

More than 40 people gathered at Peaceful Valley Ranch on Galiano to celebrate Archie Georgeson's 80th birthday. The huge cake was made for him by his great-niece, Sylvia Head.

The clam diggers were enjoying their stay on Salt Spring Island. In real life they were eight retired district governors of the Lions Club and had come to the island for a week's visit with Tom Portlock, who also was a former district governor of the service club.

When the Galiano Hall Club members met, the discussion centred on whether and when to effect repairs to the hall. President Basil Benger chaired the meeting which also offered praise to Beth Beach for her work on the arts and crafts show.

The volunteers of the Salt Spring Fire Department were called to deal with a grass fire on Sky Valley on Saturday afternoon. The firefighters responded quickly and

no damage was done. The blaze was blamed on careless campers.

Five Years Ago

The Welbury Bay log dump on Salt Spring Island continued to be the centre of debate with the Islands Trust. Peter Thompson came to a meeting of the Trust to urge that the prohibition against dumping logs in the bay be lifted. The lease for the dump was being transferred from one company to another and the ministry of lands had placed a ban on dumping until the transfer had been completed. Residents of the area opposed not only expansion of the lease area but also dumping logs in general.

The Pender Island Fall Fair had been enjoyed by crowds of people. The fair site had shifted from Hope Bay to the school grounds three years previously but organizers were becoming concerned about lack of space because the fair was expanding. Top winner was Joyce Jones while Kim Challis won in the senior children's section and Joshua Goldstein took the junior children's prize.

When the Garner family gathered in Victoria for a reunion, 88 of the 110 relatives showed up. From Galiano, Fred Robson and Ollie Garner took their wives to join other members of the family who came from all over North America.

Water taxi service for students from the Outer Gulf Islands attending high school on Salt Spring was to be looked at by the Gulf Islands School Board. A committee would look at various aspects of the idea. Jeannine Dodds of Mayne, Jim Ripley of Galiano, Tom Davidson of Saturna and John Zacharias of Pender would be the school trustees studying the plan.

A salmon bake and boat-in was being planned by the Mayne Island Lions Club for Labour Day weekend. Gordon Ducklow and Jerry Medcalf were organizing the event to be staged at the Mayne Inn grounds on Bennett Bay.

A lottery grant may be available to the North Salt Spring Waterworks District to help pay for improvements to service. Islands M.L.A. Hugh Curtis made the announcement but added that no decision on the money had yet been made.

Boating course begins September 5 at Ganges

Safety afloat is the main objective of the Canadian Power Squadrons and to this end member squadrons across Canada each fall and winter conduct basic boating courses to any boat owner who wishes to sign up for the course.

On Salt Spring the local squadron will again be conducting the basic boating course as well as a number of advanced courses. Under the direction of training officer Ian Waterlow the course this year will again be conducted in the high school with the first session starting on September 5.

Topics which are taught during the 14-week course include seamanship, rules of the road, safety at sea, charts and piloting, aids to navigation, equipment and government regulations, the mariner's compass and manners and customs on shipboard.

All instructors for the course volunteer their services and do not receive any remuneration for the many hours they devote to the program.

The Salt Spring squadron, one of 18 in the Vancouver Island district, has an enviable training record with a high percentage of successful graduates each year. Last year 25 students successfully completed the course.

In addition to the basic boating course other courses available include advanced pilotage, junior navigator, navigator, marine maintenance, seamanship power, seamanship sail, marine electronics and weather.

Registration for the course is available at the Village Cobbler in Mouat's Mall. This year the course is limited to 26 students.

List of contractors being compiled

The Gulf Islands School Board wants to hear from contractors in the Gulf Islands.

Frank Sutherland, the school district supervisor of works, is compiling a list of contractors who wish to do business with the school district.

He is particularly interested in contractors in the Outer Islands.

The information being sought includes equipment type and capacity, rates, as well as operator insurance and licence details with the effective date for each.

The contractor should also include a list of references.

Other contractors who can supply such things as gravel, rock and other materials should indicate the source is a registered pit.

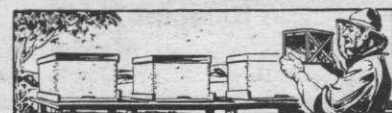

Pharmacy Facts by Les Ramsey, Pharmacist, Ganges Pharmasave



This article is concerned with the treatment of wasp and bee stings.

The difference between these two stinging insects is that the bee leaves his stinger imbedded in the victim's skin, and afterward dies; whereas the wasp can use its stinger over again. This difference necessitates a difference in treatment.



With a bee sting, the difficult part is removing the stinger. Using a gentle scraping motion over the affected area, with a fingernail or tweezers, carefully dislodge the stinger and slowly pull it out. The reason for this is that the sac containing the venom is found at the tip of the stinger. If the area is squeezed, the venom may be released. Apply a paste of meat tenderizer (papain) in water (e.g., 1/4 tsp. in 1-2 tsp. water) to relieve pain. Leave the paste on as long as necessary, then wash with soap and water. An antihistamine such as ChlorTripolon or Tavist can be taken as well to help ease the swelling.

For wasp stings, where removal of a stinger is not involved, take an antihistamine immediately and apply ice packs to the affected area.



The treatments suggested above apply to people who are not allergic to insect stings. Those who are should not attempt to treat themselves. Instead, they should be rushed to the nearest doctor or emergency ward; similarly those whose stings become uncommonly irritating and swollen.

office space taking up the bedrooms.

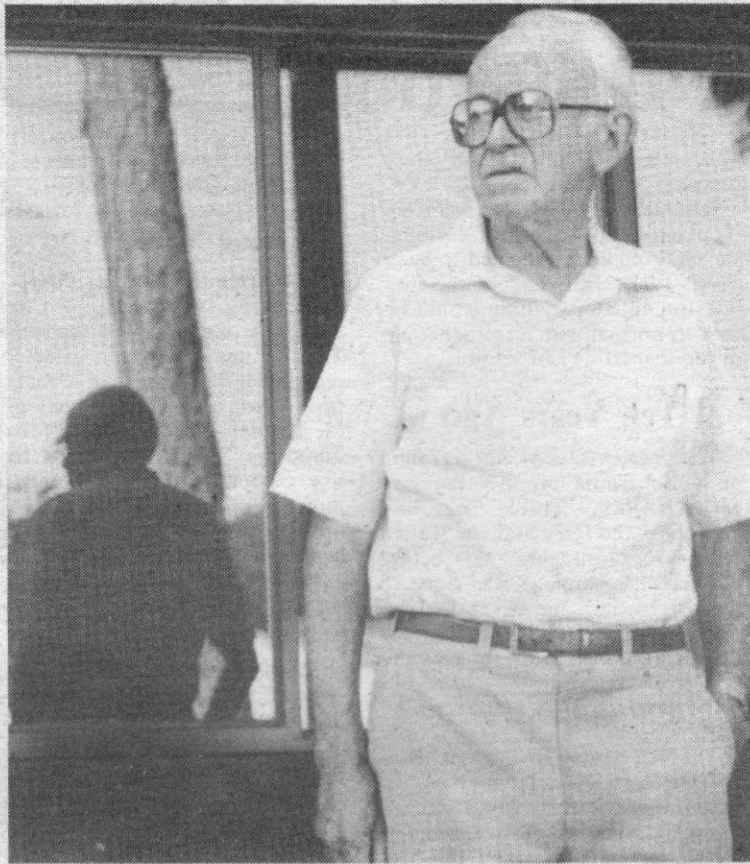
The set-up is temporary, said Edwards, until a permanent property can be purchased.

will cost \$4,100.

The capital budget includes \$31,450 to be spent on improvements to the Galiano school. That amount covers \$30,000 for the new septic field with the remainder to be spent on such items as a portable platform for the gymnasium, a study carrel as well as table tennis table and equipment.

The largest portion of the capital budget is aimed at adding \$225,000 worth of improvements to the Mayne school. The gymnasium will be expanded for a cost of \$150,000 with an additional \$50,000 to be spent on change rooms and showers.

Conversion of the home economics room will cost \$25,000.

As well, the insurance company used by the school board has recommended intrusion systems to be installed in the schools. That task would cost an estimated \$100,000. That amount would be over and above the other costs in the capital budget.

The ministry approved capital spending for the current school year of \$307,558.

She entered a guilty plea to the charge. Judge R.E. Hudson heard that the offense took place on April 8 while she was still 18.

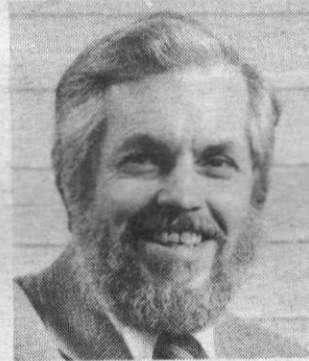
