Golfers will have more fun as changes made to course

Golfers will have more fun on the first hole at the Salt Spring golf course this year as a result of changes made over the past few months.

Greens supervisor Don Atkinson has rearranged the tee for the first hole and golfers who swing from the right will have less chance of curving the ball on to Lower Ganges Road.

There are two tees for the first hole, which becomes the 10th hole for those who play 18. One of the tees is sitting back near the gate to the grounds and forms a dog-leg. The other tee offers a straight-away shot but gives the golfer more room

to aim on the fairway.

Meanwhile, down at the green, drainage in the area has been improved and three sand traps added. The sand traps sit invitingly at the back of the green.

The hole has been extended to a par five from a four and measures up to 530 yards, depending on which tee is used.

The par for a nine-hole round, 36 strokes, has not been increased. The seventh hole, which was a par five, has been lowered to a four.

Atkinson is spending about \$3,000 to make improvements to the golf course.

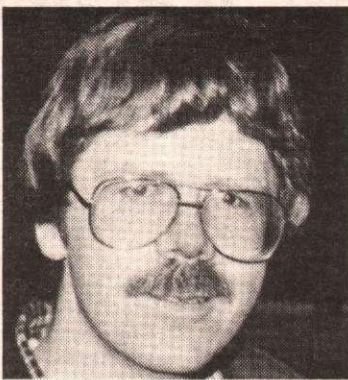
Two summers ago, Craig took eight B.C. teachers on a tour of Nicaragua and the group has not stopped working for the country since.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

The opening ceremonies for the Salt Spring Centennial Library would take place on February 1. The date had been announced at the annual meeting of the library association. Financial statement for the year showed an outstanding debt of close to \$2,400 which was expected to be paid within the year. The library had \$37.60 in the bank.

Overcrowding at the Ganges school prompted the Gulf Islands School Board to begin plans for a new high school. Both elementary and secondary classes were being held in the same building. Efforts to pass a referendum to finance a new school had not gained the required public support.

The dance which ended the old year at Fulford Hall resulted in about \$350 being added to the coffers of the hall committee. The dance, said a spokesman, was well attended and the money would be used for upkeep of the hall.

The salmon derby staged by the Rod and Gun Club of Salt Spring was under way. Organizers reported many fish caught but few weighed in above the 10-pound minimum required by the contest rules. Nels Degnen led the way with a 12 lb. spring.

Fifteen Years Ago

B.C. Ferries announced the appointment of Robert Anderson as Gulf Islands terminal agent. He would work out of a mobile office at Long Harbour and be responsible for shore operations on each of the Gulf Islands. Anderson had been involved with the traffic department in Victoria and would replace Capt. George Maude as agent on Salt Spring.

The Lions Club ordered a new ambulance to supplement the emergency service. Delivery was expected in six weeks and the new vehicle would be powered by eight cylinders with automatic transmission.

Driftwood gave up the duty of being ferry schedule interpreter for islanders. B.C. Ferries had issued a time table which, although colourful, was also readable. Travellers were able to understand not only how to get there but at what hour.

Snow fell during December to record depths. There were 43 inches of the white stuff blanketing the Gulf Islands. Previous high snowfall occurred in 1964 when 36 inches were measured. The high temperature for the month stood at 52 degrees with the low being seven above zero.

The ferry company hoped to have the terminal at Mayne Island in use by the middle of the month. A ferry

had damaged the wharf at Christmas and the only link with the outside world was a passenger service from Miners Bay.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that pupils at the school on the island had taken two first prizes and two second prizes in essay contests for each grade in the Outer Islands schools. Another Saturna youngster had placed second in a zone contest.

Mary Hawkins retired from active service with the Salt Spring library board. She had been the moving force behind efforts to improve the island library for 10 years.

Ten Years Ago

Meals on Wheels came to Salt Spring Island. Hot meals would be delivered to homes three days per week, Monday, Wednesday and Friday, at a cost of \$1.25 per meal. The service would provide three meals on each of those days for people who were ill, aged or handicapped.

Mayne Island children sang Christmas carols to collect money for UNICEF. The 10 youngsters toured the island to sing their songs and collected \$83.38.

High tides backed water into the lower shopping area of Mouat's Mall in Ganges. The high tides also caused flooding in other low areas of the islands.

Work on the ferry wharf at the Long Harbour terminal would be completed ahead of schedule. The Queen of the Islands would be back at Long Harbour on January 18, two days ahead of the previously announced date of January 20. The boat had been using the facilities at Fulford while the repairs were being made.

The alternative class had the required number of students but the trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board had not hired a teacher. Seven individuals had applied for the position but no choice had been made.

Tuesday evening in Ganges marked the volunteer firefighters gathering for their weekly practice. They had an opportunity to fight the real thing when fire broke out in the freezer at the K & R store. The prompt action by the firefighters prevented the fire from spreading. A large quantity of food was lost.

Activities for the Salt Spring Old-Age Pensioners club were outlined for the year at a meeting of the

group. There would be two meetings each month with entertainment at each gathering. The January get-together would feature an apple contest.

Five Years Ago

The Capital Region would take over the task of dog control. The job had been carried out by the ministry of agriculture and the CRD would receive a grant of \$10,000 to begin the program. The province would also cover half of any deficit up to \$10,000 per year for the first three years of the new program.

Herring roe fishery in waters around Salt Spring would be closed for one year. The Fisheries Service closed Ganges Harbour, Welbury Bay and Long Harbour to the taking of the roe.

Vesuvius Bay had been covered by an oil slick. The slick was up to 50 feet wide and followed the shoreline of the bay. The origin of the slick was unknown.

The Mayne Queen got as far as Mayne Island, Friday night, when it broke down. The vessel limped back to Swartz Bay on one engine and repairs were made. Outer Island residents were without ferry service until the early Sunday morning run.

Parking tickets made an appearance on Salt Spring Island and Jo Logan was the first recipient. She had parked her van in front of the Crest Restaurant and police claimed it was jutting into the street and obstructing traffic. She not only had to pay a \$15 fine but also the charge for having her vehicle towed away.

Fernwood School would not be completed until approval for the septic disposal field was given. The delay marked the third time completion was put off. Problems with an electrical panel caused one delay and another came when it was discovered that a tackboard and chalkboard had not been included in the original estimates.

The Galiano Lionettes met for an annual meeting. They approved \$150 for a donation to Greenwoods for purchase of a useful gift. Mary Knudson was re-elected as president of the group for another year.

Saturna Island pupils wouldn't have to go to school on Wednesdays for 10 weeks. The Gulf Islands School Board approved a request for a swim program for the pupils to be held in Saanich on those days.

Fence gives 'prison-like' effect

Chain-link fence being erected around the school board office and Mahon Hall in Ganges has been described as "retrogressive" by the president of the Gulf Islands Community Arts Council.

In a letter to the Gulf Islands School Board, Gerry Layard says the fence gives "a prison-like effect" to the area.

"In light of the beautification project carried out last summer...to improve the appearance of Ganges, we can think of nothing more

retrogressive than this fence," she wrote.

She asked that the project be reconsidered and a better solution be sought.

She also noted that directing students down the sidewalk behind Mahon Hall "seems to invite more garbage than is already there and the very low windows could so easily be broken."

Layard pointed out that children would be directed out on to a busy street without a crosswalk.

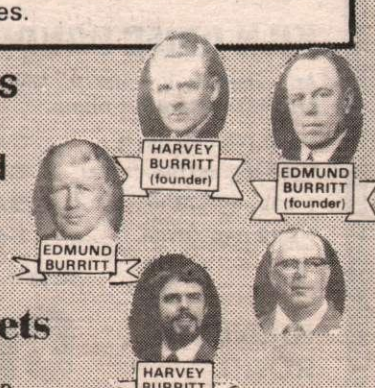

'Legion must change to survive'

If the Royal Canadian Legion does not begin planning for the future soon, says Salt Spring Branch 92 president Jake Javorski, it may not survive in its current form.

Javorski was speaking in an interview about the future of the Legion, which acts as a service club for war veterans and ex-members of the armed forces. He said that by the turn of the century, few survivors of World War II will be alive.

Veterans of World War I are already few in number with those remaining being in their 80's.

Statistics released by the Legion show possible decline in the number of veterans of the second war of about 17% for each five-year period until 2001.

"There's quite a transition period that is difficult to get through," said Javorski of the decline in membership facing the Legion.

The Legion comprises 1,801 branches across Canada, 47 in the United States and two in West Germany. The membership as of December, 1982, stood at 573,181 with another 90,000 in the Ladies' Auxiliary.

Membership is open to war veterans and ex-members of the armed forces. The membership extends to offspring of vets as well as RCMP officers and members of the Canadian Coast Guard.

Javorski said a trend towards granting membership to spouses of vets, if the other spouse is a member, has begun.

The number of men and women who served in the armed forces of Canada in the first and second world wars and Korea is close to 1.75 million. As of 1981, only three-quarters of a million veterans of the second war were alive.

The Legion must look at options for survival such as moving towards becoming a community service club, said Javorski. The Salt Spring Branch is moving in that direction.

It has become involved with other island service clubs in the efforts to create more housing for senior citizens and offers aid to members of the general community who need it.

Change must begin, said Javorski, or the Legion won't exist in 15 years.

Series of break-ins investigated

Ganges RCMP are investigating a recent series of break-ins at five businesses in the village.

The police were called to Black Duck Antiques on Fulford-Ganges Road January 11 by an island resident who had noticed that the glass in the front door of the building was broken.

Investigation revealed that \$1,200 worth of antique silverware had been taken from a display case. Nothing was missing from The Attic, which occupies the same premises.

On Sunday police were called to check on illegal entry to Salt Spring Insurance and Salt Spring Lands offices in the village. Someone also attempted, without success, to enter Mouat's Trading Company the same night.

Permits for 13 houses in November

Permits were issued for the construction of 13 dwellings in the islands during the month of

November, 1983. In addition, one permit was issued in respect of moving a dwelling on Salt Spring.

Outer Islands building amounted to \$4,503,751 up to the end of November. On Pender there were 35 permits for single-family dwellings, one for a mobile home and two for commercial projects valued at \$2,291,696.

Tickets at four locations

Commuter tickets for B.C. Ferries can be purchased at several locations but not in the Outer Islands.

There were permits for six single-family dwellings on Salt Spring and six on the Outer Islands; three on Pender and one each on Galiano, Mayne and Saturna. One permit was issued for a mobile home on Salt Spring Island. One permit for a commercial structure was issued at Galiano.

In order of totals, Mayne ranks next with a total of 20 single-family dwellings, three mobile homes and an industrial project at a cost of \$1,395,961. This figure includes the moving of one dwelling.

The ferry corporation has the tickets for sale at Swartz Bay and Crofton.

The value of new construction was estimated at \$792,363. This was \$346,370 on Salt Spring Island; \$248,038 on Pender; \$59,086 on Galiano; \$72,069 on Mayne; and \$66,800 in respect of Saturna.

Eighteen permits were issued for single-family dwellings on Galiano and one for a commercial structure. Total value placed on the projects was \$1,095,936.

On Salt Spring, the tickets can be obtained at the Fulford terminal or at Long Harbour.

The month's activity brought the year's total to 93 single-family dwellings, six mobile homes and one commercial project on Salt Spring Island, valued at \$8,232,598. This figure includes permits for the moving of four dwellings.

There were 15 single-family dwellings undertaken on Saturna up to the end of November last year, representing a total of \$720,158.

Cost of the books, which contain 10 tickets, is \$40 and covers not only the vehicle but also the driver. Books of 10 tickets for passengers only can be had for a cost of \$10.

Senior citizens can purchase tickets to cover the vehicle only, at \$30, if they present their Pharmacare card at time of purchase. Seniors, as passengers, travel free Monday through Thursday but must pay for the vehicle.

Residents of the Outer Islands can buy the tickets at the Vancouver Island or Salt Spring outlets.

Sales of commuter tickets have been steady, reports a spokesman for the corporation.

Sales in the Gulf Islands early this week totalled 672 books for vehicles and drivers plus 306 books for passengers only.

The money involved comes close to \$30,000.

The sales represent trips from Swartz Bay to Fulford and the Outer Gulf Islands as well as Vesuvius to Crofton.

Permits are issued by the Capital Regional District.


