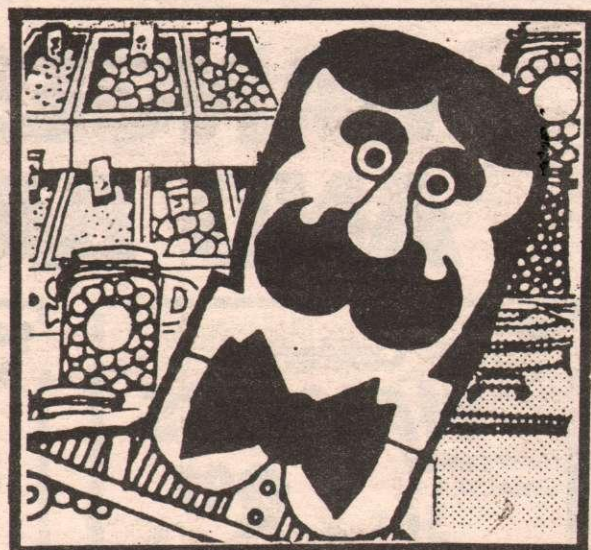

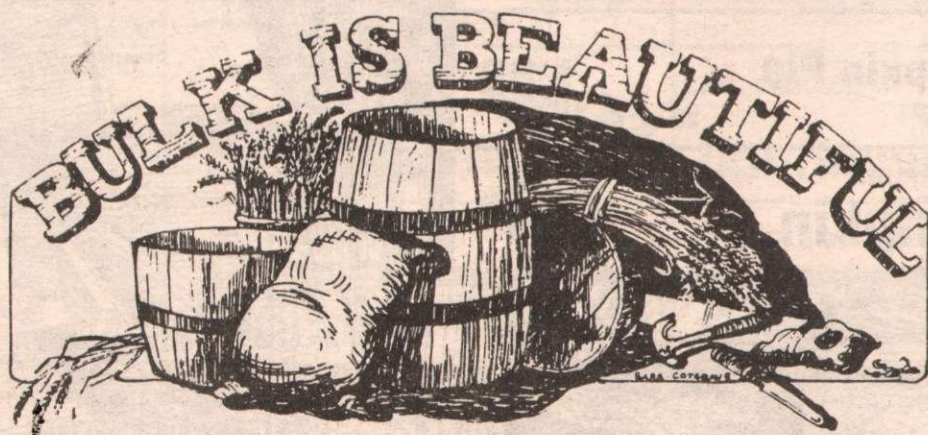

Instruction program redesigned

The Red Cross has redesigned its water safety instruction program and organizers are looking for Gulf Islanders to take part.

The new program, with a two-level approach to instructor training, replaces the leader-instructor program which had been used since 1945.

Area consultant for the Red Cross swim program, Judy Smith of Nanaimo, said the program "has been completely redesigned to reflect the many changes which have taken place in aquatic recreation over the years."

The first stage of the new instructor training program qualifies a person to teach the basic four levels of the Red Cross water safety program.

The second level of the training program allows the individual to teach the more advanced levels.

Both levels of training teach such skills as communication, supervision, class management and planning.

The program will be run in the Gulf Islands if interest is shown. The instructors will come to the islands for the classes.

Christmas mailing deadlines near

Deadlines for mailing Christmas cards and parcels are rapidly approaching.

The last mailing days for surface mail, parcels, packets and unsealed Christmas cards, begin this month.

For surface mail aimed at some parts of Asia and the South Pacific, the deadline is October 15. The last day for mail to the U.S.S.R. and Poland is October 16.

Surface mail for South America and the Caribbean should be sent before October 19 while such mail

for Australia, New Zealand, Singapore and the Philippines should go before October 25.

October 29 is the deadline for some parts of Europe but if the destination for the surface mail is Great Britain, Ireland, Sweden, Switzerland, France, West Germany, the Netherlands or the Canadian Forces Post Offices (CFPO), the deadline falls on November 1.

Surface mail to Hong Kong

should go by November 2 and such mail to Japan should be sent out before November 9.

Airmail deadlines fall due in late November and early December.

The first deadline for small parcels and packets headed for Sweden, Poland, the U.S.S.R. as well as other countries in Europe and Asia falls on November 23.

That day also marks the deadline for small parcels and packets going to most places in the Pacific, Africa,

South America and the Caribbean.

Letters sent airmail to the preceding countries should be in the system by November 30.

Parcels and packets sent by air to Great Britain, Ireland, France, West Germany, CFPO's, Switzerland, Hong Kong and Japan should be mailed before December 1.

Letters for those places, to go by air, should be mailed by December 6 except for Great Britain which has a deadline of December 4 for letters.

Dance workshops will be presented to high school and elementary school students at Salt Spring Island next week by instructor Sheila Blake of Victoria.

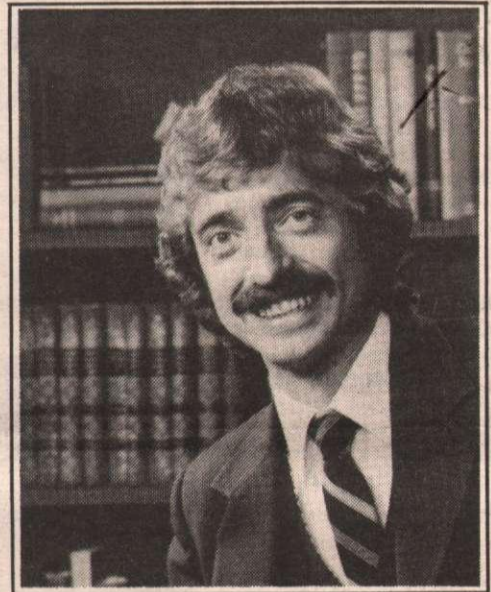
