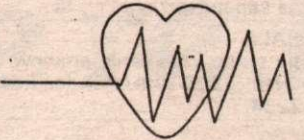

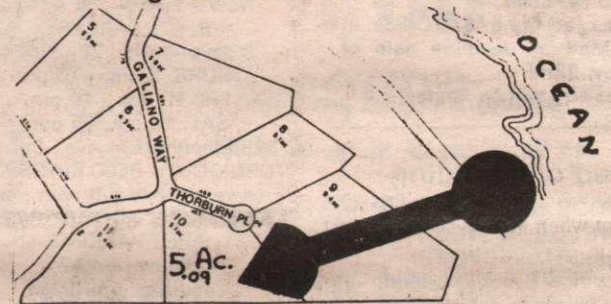

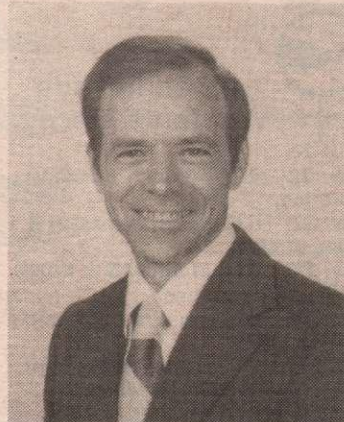

Two-part workshop on child abuse Saturday

For parents who have wondered how to speak to their children about sexual abuse, the Salt Spring Community Centre is holding a workshop this week entitled Practical Approaches to Child Abuse.

Interest in the topic was aroused following a workshop last June by Linda Halliday, a spokesman for Victims of Child Abuse. As a result, the centre's community workers have invited Jackie Vibe and Rabina Taylor to give a two-part workshop on Saturday. The two are social workers employed in Duncan by the ministry of human resources. Both deal primarily with issues related to the protection of children and have special skills in dealing with families and victims of child abuse.

A morning workshop between 10 am and noon will be presented to local professionals. Topics will include: the human resources ministry's mandate, needs of the sexually abused child, indicators of abuse and resources available in the Cowichan Valley area.

The general public is invited to attend a seminar between 1.30 and 3.30. It will focus on practical issues related to sexual abuse.

Cannonball too heavy

The cannonball sinker was too heavy so the fisherman lost his equipment.

Fred Moulton of Salt Spring entered a guilty plea to a charge of using a weight greater than one kilogram when he appeared in court last week.

Moulton had been fishing on August 6 when a routine patrol checked his boat. The weight he had been using was a seven kg cannonball. Judge R.E. Hudson imposed a \$30 fine and agreed to the prosecutor's request that the equipment, a hook, flasher and the sinker, should be confiscated.

The program will include:

- A brief review of the morning program;
- characteristics of an abused child;
- how to talk about prevention to your child;
- parental responses and concerns; and
- indicators of abuse.

Community workers hope that a group of interested people will continue to gather information on the subject and become a local resource team. Information and literature on the subject is available at the Community Centre.

Registration for the workshops is not required and there is no charge.

Also appearing will be dancer Lottie Brochin, who will perform her interpretation of part of the

Claude Bolling Suite for Flute and Jazz Piano. Brochin, who teaches ballet and jazz dance on the island, has taught in Toronto and London,

England, danced with the Capetown Ballet Company and performed in New York, London and Victoria in classical dance and musical comedy.

Admission will be \$4 for adults and \$2 for students. Concert begins at 8:30 pm at the Centre on Blackburn Rd.

No lifejackets

Fishing in Active Pass while not having lifejackets in the boat cost Raymond Vallee of Salt Spring a fine of \$45 when he appeared in court last week.

Vallee had been out in a 14-foot aluminum boat with his family. Two adults were not wearing lifejackets although a child was. The incident took place on June 22.

By law, there must be a lifejacket for each person in the boat, but the jackets do not have to be worn.

In imposing the fine, Judge R.E. Hudson told Vallee that if an accident had occurred, the child might have been assisted with assurance if the adults had been wearing their lifejackets.

The students in the kitchen had complained about feeling ill and when the situation was checked out, fumes from the shops were blamed. Various efforts to stem the flow of fumes were not successful.

The latest solution, building a wall with a doorway between the two levels of the high school building, has proved less than satisfactory.

Ron McQuiggan, chairman of the school board's buildings and grounds committee, told a meeting of the board last week that the various solutions seem to work for a time, but the problem creeps back.

The air is being monitored by health officials from the government. Efforts to correct the problem will continue.

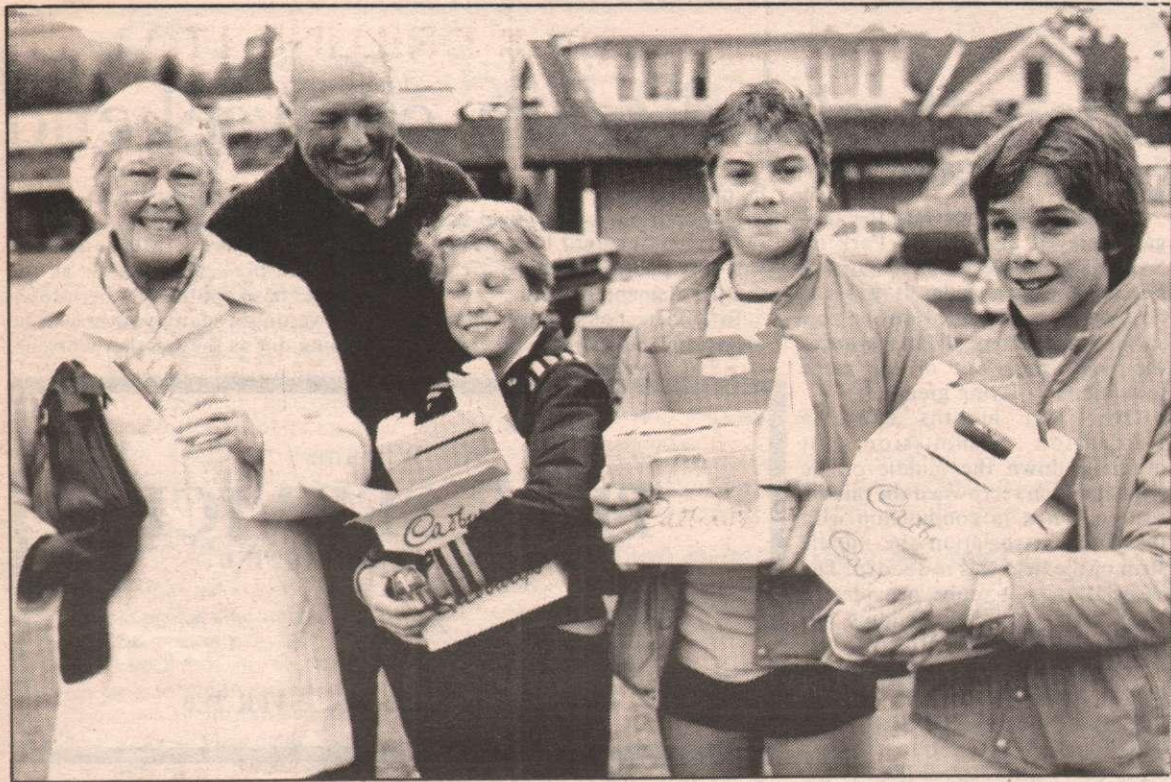

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

The new high school at Ganges was discussed by the Gulf Islands School Board and a set of plans for the building was displayed. The school would feature seven classrooms and a gymnasium grouped around a centre courtyard.

Another cougar was shot on Salt Spring Island. The big cat was spotted by Gavin Reynolds who called in Bob Akerman and his cougar hound, Pearl. Akerman took his two sons, Ted and Morry, to help hunt the cat. On Tuesday, he bagged another cougar near Fulford. That brought the total to three in just a few months.

The two Salt Springers went to Chemainus for the Nanaimo Dog Trials and came back with honours. Joe Pitts and his black labrador scored 184 of a possible 200 while Kelly Ryland, also with a labrador, garnered 180½.

The poppy drive, directed by Mrs. H.A. Emerlund, collected \$426.30 on Salt Spring. The drive on the north end was handled by Mrs. A.E. Marcotte while Mrs. G. Laundry was in charge of Fulford efforts.

A hunting trip to the Cariboo proved successful for Wayne Bradley and Lloyd Moulton. They managed to shoot a 900 lb. moose while they were in the Vanderhoof area. The antlers had a 46-inch spread.

The Women's Institute members gathered at the home of Mrs. P. Middlemiss and Mrs. R. Lee took the chair. The ladies decided to gather Christmas gifts to give to various hospitals in the province. Mrs. W.Y. Stewart would be in charge of the project.

The Centennial Committee on Salt Spring would talk to the community groups in Fulford to find out if they wanted to join with the proposal to create a park in the fill area of the Ganges boat basin as a centennial project.

Fifteen Years Ago

The approach of winter brought the highway improvement project on Salt Spring to a halt. About half the task had been accomplished and the remainder of the \$585,000 project would have to wait for spring.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that more news would be gathered if he could "drive around our pot holes with any degree of safety and speed."

The new firehall on Mayne Island was officially opened with fire district trustee Fred Greenslade as host of the event. The new facility was located on Felix Jack Road.

The Rotary Club of Salt Spring was to purchase a heart monitoring machine for Lady Minto Hospital. Funds to pay for the machine would be raised in various ways with the first event being a stag party on Grey Cup day. Hospital administrator Harold Hoffman welcomed the gift.

The school at Salt Spring would not be built. The provincial government had decreed that no school building referendum could be held. Such construction was halted as a means of combatting inflation.

The Poppy Day fund drive on Galiano Island gathered a record \$142. Organizer Mrs. J.P. Hume thanked the 11 ladies who conducted the collection of money.

The Joint Council of the Gulf Islands joined the growing protest against the 10-acre freeze on subdivisions. Many people were being financially hurt because of the government action. Many development plans had been put on hold with a resulting loss of jobs.

Ten Years Ago

Election day in the Gulf Islands saw 12 people chosen to sit with the Islands Trust. Ron Thompson was successful on Galiano Island. The school board race featured two trustees on Salt Spring, Sheila Fraser and Ann Foerster, and another, Don Fairweather, for Pender Island. There had been 30 candidates for the offices.

Junior girls' teams from Gulf Islands Secondary School did well in events in Victoria. Both the field hockey and volleyball teams came second in tournaments against teams from the Vancouver Island region.

The Remembrance Day parade was held in the gymnasium of the high school in Ganges because of heavy rain. Reverend Peter McCalman was in charge of the ceremony and Bert Drysdale played the *Last Post* and *Reveille*. In addition to members of the Legion, ladies of the auxiliary and IODE as well as boys from the Cubs took part.

The Ganges sewer proposal was put on hold by the Pollution Control Board. Ben Marr, chairman of the PCB, had held a meeting to listen to an appeal from SPEC against the proposal. He decided to give the Capital Region a 60-day period to come up with more information about the proposal.

Fulford Creek was attracting salmon for spawning. Gavin Reynolds and a crew of workers had cleared the creek and up to 100 salmon per day were to be seen in the water course.

Meals on Wheels would be charging seniors \$1.25 for a dinner. The cost of the meal, delivered to the home of the senior, was subsidized and each recipient paid the nominal fee.

Five Years Ago

B.C. Ferries called for the closing of Active Pass to small craft and recreational fishermen. The proposal met with less than enthusiasm from islanders who attended a meeting on Mayne Island to listen to the details. The meeting was sponsored by the Coast Guard

and was chaired by regional manager Herb Buchanan of that unit.

The Pig Barbecue on Saturna was an unqualified success, reported Marjorie Ratzlaff. The event was held in the community hall and was sponsored by the fire department of that island. Following the meal, the participants enjoyed a dance.

Elections in the Gulf Islands resulted in the selection of Joan Sprague to the Islands Trust for Mayne Island. Tom Davidson was returned to the Gulf Islands School Board from Saturna and Jim Campbell, also of Saturna, would sit with the Capital Region once again. Yvette Valcourt was elected to the CRD from Salt Spring.

Board officials dunked when cruiser capsized

At the school board elections for the Gulf Islands School District three trustees were re-elected.

The date was November, 1959. The three returned to office were chairman George Heinekey, A. D. Dane and Jim Campbell. J. G. Reid was elected to assume the seat vacated by J. W. A. Green and Mr. Hawkins of Mayne Island won the seat left by W. Morson.

Elections were held on the two islands at public meetings when the annual report was heard from the board.

Attendance at island schools stood at 482. Of this total, 379 were enrolled on Salt Spring Island at Ganges School and 103 attended Outer Islands schools.

Doug Dane told ratepayers that he was concerned over the hazards facing trustees travelling among the

islands and intended to bring in a special resolution covering the situation.

His concern arose from the incident the previous week when Heinekey and the secretary-treasurer, C. N. Peterson, were thrown into the sea when the cruiser in which they were travelling to Galiano capsized after fouling a cable pulling a scow.

The board had already approved payment of compensation to the two men in respect of property lost in the mishap.



CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

Pursuant to Section 769 of the Municipal Act, the following text of By-law No. 1310, cited as Hartland Road Tipping Fee and Regulation By-law No. 1, 1984" is hereby published as at third reading and prior to submission to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs.

A BY-LAW FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A TIPPING FEE AND REGULATIONS FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AT THE HARTLAND ROAD SANITARY LANDFILL

WHEREAS by Supplementary Letters Patent, dated 4th October, 1973, the Capital Regional District was granted the function of Refuse Disposal under Division X of its Letters Patent;

AND WHEREAS the Capital Regional District is empowered to establish a scale of charges payable for depositing refuse at a disposal ground;

AND WHEREAS the Regional Board of the Capital Regional District deems it advisable to enact regulations pertaining to solid waste disposal and to establish a charge for depositing refuse;

NOW THEREFORE the Regional Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires:

"Covered Solid Waste" means a load of refuse secured on the vehicle so that it cannot blow or fall off while in transit;

"Dead Animals" mean dead animals, or portions thereof, equal to or greater than 5 kilograms in weight;

"Disposal Ground" means the disposal ground established under Section 2;

"Hazardous Waste" means special waste and refuse which because of its inherent nature and quantity requires special disposal techniques to avoid creating health hazards, nuisances or environmental pollution. Hazardous Wastes are toxins or poisons, corrosives, irritants, strong sensitizers, flammables, explosives, infectious wastes, condemned foods, etc. Flammable wastes exclude plastics, paper, paper products and the like;

"Prohibited Waste" means refuse deemed by the Regional District as not acceptable for landfilling at Hartland Road landfill. Prohibited waste includes but is not limited to:

1. Explosive material
2. Radioactive substances and waste
3. Hazardous waste
4. Petroleum products
5. Dead animals
6. Industrial chemical waste
7. Motor vehicle bodies and farm implements
8. Other categories of refuse designated by the Regional District
9. Refuse that is on fire or smouldering

"Regional Board" means the Board of the Capital Regional District;

"Regional District" means the Capital Regional District;

"Solid Waste" means refuse suitable for landfilling at Hartland Road Landfill but excluding Prohibited Waste;

"Special Waste" means any chemical, compound, mixture, substance or article which is designated as "Special Waste" by regulations of the Waste Management Branch of the Ministry of Environment, Province of British Columbia;

2. The Hartland Road Sanitary Landfill Site, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto is hereby established as a disposal ground.
3. Every person depositing refuse at this disposal ground shall pay to the Regional District the applicable charge set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto.
4. No person shall, in depositing refuse at a Disposal Ground:
 - (a) deposit a Prohibited Waste;
 - (b) deposit Solid Waste except at a location provided by the Regional District for the deposit of the kind of Solid Waste being deposited;
 - (c) unless required by the Regional District, deposit Solid Waste without first having it weighed on the scales at the Disposal Ground;
 - (d) drive a vehicle anywhere on the Disposal Ground except on roads provided by the Regional District for that purpose.
5. Special wastes will be deposited only in those portions of the Hartland Road Sanitary Landfill Site assigned and indicated by the staff in charge thereof.
6. Where a charge under Section 3 is not paid within the time specified in Schedule "B" for its payment the person liable to pay such charge shall:
 - (a) in addition to such charge pay interest thereon at the rate set out in Schedule "B" from the date the charge was due to the date of payment;
 - (b) not deposit any refuse on or at the Disposal Ground until such charge and interest owing thereon has been paid in full.
7. Any person who violates any provision of this by-law or who does or causes to be done any act or thing in contravention of this by-law is liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars.

he said, a good percentage of them occurred during the evening as well.

The Salt Spring detachment does have night patrols, he said, but he was unwilling to say on which days the patrols are run. He did not want to inform the criminal element about the activities of his officers, he said.

Another restriction against the 24-hour patrols is the manpower of the local detachment, he said. There are not sufficient officers to cover the entire day every day of the week, he indicated.

Another problem was the carelessness of local businessmen, he said. RCMP regularly conduct property checks as part of their routine patrols. Often the officers find a business establishment with a

door or a window open.

The first step in crime prevention, he said, would be taken when businessmen ensure their establishments are secure.

Hanks also calls on the general public to assist police. If any resident sees or hears anything suspicious, he should call the police, he said.

Such action can result in the culprit being apprehended at the scene and also act as a deterrent to further criminal activity just by having the police visible.

"Public co-operation and involvement are very necessary components," he said.

Auxiliary pays debt

The Auxiliary to Lady Minto and Greenwoods has paid the debt which was incurred when the seniors published their book, *Bits and Pieces*.

And now the profit will accrue. *Bits and Pieces* is a compilation of stories, poems and songs which the residents of Greenwoods put together. Although the project had the financial support of the New Horizons Program, publication required a loan.

To date most of the money from the sale of the book has gone to cover that loan.

But not since the auxiliary stepped in.

The book will be available at bookstores for \$4. All money raised until Christmas will be donated to the Ethiopian Famine Relief Fund.

Crime comes in cycles

Crime, such as the recent spate of break-ins, seems to run in cycles on Salt Spring.

The previous, rash of criminal activity took place in late 1980 and police ended it by the end of January, 1981.

At that time RCMP brought criminal charges against 23 island youths, including 18 juveniles. They ranged in age from 14 to the early 20's.

That crime spree lasted about three months and was solved following an intensive five-week police investigation.

Crime prevention topic of officer at meeting

Ganges merchants were advised by RCMP last week to keep their business premises securely locked, install alarm systems and post "no money" signs to indicate no money is left on the premises.

Constable Garth Baillie spoke to the Ganges Centre Association last Thursday after merchants expressed concern over the rash of break-ins in Ganges.

The epidemic of break-ins, noted Baillie, resulted from insecure businesses. There are small precautions businesses should take, he explained.

In restaurants liquor should be locked up and controlled by an alarm system. Windows in businesses should all be physically checked before the store is locked up for the night. Items of value, such as electronic equipment, should be recorded with the serial numbers. Floats of \$200-\$300 should either be deposited or taken home. Constable Baillie stressed that money should not be left on the premises.

Lighting is essential, he added. A break-in can be conducted for hours in the dark. If a light is left on, a thief can't work without eventually being detected.

When several Ganges merchants complained of shoplifting, Bailey advised them to call police if they were certain a shopper carried stolen merchandise.

One merchant wondered about stealing by students at Salt Spring Elementary School. Baillie said police had been into the school on several occasions to explain to students the consequences of stealing.

Concert raises \$1,760

Ambassadors of Aid raised \$1,760.99 at Salt Spring Island last week following a concert by 31 young African children.

The children, who are touring Canada, sang at Ganges United Church November 12 and again at Salt Spring Elementary School the following day.

The money will provide aid to the hungry in Uganda and other African nations.
