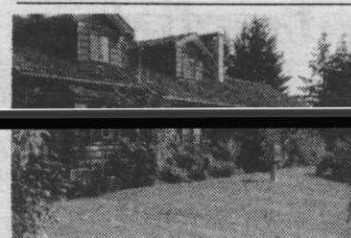

## Different totals calculated

The money is gone but not forgotten, and officials of the Gulf Islands School Board want to know why their total differs from the ministry of education figure.

The ministry had said that money which should have gone to teachers but for the three-day strike in November would be applied to the education system across the province.

The Gulf Islands School District lost \$40,406 as a result of the decision.

But when district superintendent Mike Marshall totalled the pay for teachers of the district for those three days, he came up with a figure of \$33,500.

So he phoned the ministry of education to find out where the difference came.

The ministry reply was that support workers, members of the Canadian Union of Public Employees, were also on strike at the time and their pay was part of the total.

That was the first time the ministry had mentioned the support workers.

So Marshall went back to his calculator and ran more numbers through. The second total was

about \$1,500 less than the ministry figure.

The \$40,406 was deducted from the amount which the school district was given to pay the bills for December.

Marshall will keep making phone calls and talking to ministry officials to find out why their total differs from his.

# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

## Twenty Years Ago

A storm brought high winds and rain through the Gulf Islands to disrupt Hydro and telephone service for most areas. The storm hit Sunday but by Tuesday, repair crews had completed their work. Restoration of service was slowed due to damage to lines in the Victoria area.

The volunteer firefighters of Salt Spring answered 33 calls during the previous year, reported Fire Chief Fred Donaghy. The 22 firefighters also put in 1,650 hours of training. Dollar estimates of the fire damage had been set at \$21,000.

Music would offer a diversion for Salt Spring residents early in February when the HMCS Naden Band would come to the island to play in Fulford Hall. The arrangements were being carried out by Doug Dane in co-operation with the Lions Club, the Legion and the Fulford Hall committee. The band would play a matinee for the children and play again in the evening for adults.

The Ganges school was overcrowded. Driftwood staff went on a tour of the building and found one class being conducted in a hallway. The commerce and science rooms doubled for other classes as well as the intended use. A science class was being held after school hours on three days each week.

Work on the boat basin in Ganges Harbour neared completion and vessels were using the facilities. The construction of the docks had begun in July and was to have been finished in four months.

The North End Neighbours were at work gathering clothing for the Unitarian Services Committee. The group had received high commendation from the USC branches in both Vancouver and Victoria. They were preparing layettes for shipment overseas.

The Salt Spring library would be officially opened by Mrs. W.A.C. Bennett on February 1. The library would open for business on February 3.

Prices listed in various advertisements in Driftwood showed: a two-acre lot selling for \$3,750; cream corn at four 14-ounce tins for 49¢ and a new 1964 automobile was listed at \$1,695.

## Fifteen Years Ago

The new fire hall on Mayne Island would carry a price tag of \$14,684.28. The job had been put to tender and successful bidder was Bert Girardi of Mayne. There were three bids submitted and the task would take four months to complete.

B.C. Ferries changed the rules. Pickup trucks, small vans and small trucks would pay commercial rates for trips across the water. Previously, the vehicles had been covered by commuter tickets but the ferry corporation decided to class them as commercial. Use of the commuter tickets cost the traveller \$1. The commercial rate stood at \$1.80. Regular fare was \$1.75.

News from Saturna, reported Papajohn, was scarce with many residents getting over the flu.

The post office in Ganges would be changing its hours of service. It would be open all day Wednesdays and a half-day on Saturdays. Letter carrier service would not be affected because there was none. The changes had been decreed by the post office in Ottawa.

The three candidates for the federal by-election in Nanaimo, Cowichan and the Islands spoke to a meeting in Ganges. Tommy Douglas was in the race for the New Democratic Party while Eric Winch represented the Liberals and Magnus Verbrugge was the Progressive Conservative.

The department of highways worker on Galiano, Ralph Stevens, not only cleared snow from the roads, he also helped motorists climb Montague Hill. His efforts during the previous two weeks were appreciated by residents of the island.

Pee wee roller hockey on Salt Spring saw the Fulford Warriors play to a 3-3 tie with the Ganges Mounties. An exhibition game kicked off the senior roller hockey season. The teams were made up of players from each team in the league. The Red Shirts defeated the Black Shirts 11-5.

## Ten Years Ago

The water taxi Southeastern was reported stolen from Stacey's Marine Service in Ganges. A search of the Strait of Georgia and the Gulf Islands was begun by RCMP. The vessel was eventually located in Sidney.

The community plans for South Pender and Galiano Islands received approval from the provincial government. The Salt Spring plan had yet to be approved by the Capital Region and plans for the other islands were still in the formative stages.

Farmers on Salt Spring had shot and killed five dogs which had been chasing sheep. The farmers reported the loss of three sheep in the previous two weeks. The annual toll often reached 50 sheep.

Christmas tree sales netted the Salt Spring junior sports program \$236.40. The trees were sold from K & R food store in Ganges and the money would help cover some of the costs of sports for youngsters on the island.

The Galiano Club formed a committee to look into the possibility of expanding facilities at the Galiano Community Hall or building a new building. The 97-member club was finding space at a premium. The report of the committee would be presented to the membership at the annual

meeting.

The park that would encompass Point Roberts and the San Juan islands on the American side and the Gulf Islands on the Canadian side was put on hold. The International Joint Commission ran into stiff opposition to the proposal from residents of the Gulf Islands.

## Five Years Ago

Gasoline prices would go up three cents per gallon April 1 to help pay for transit in the Capital Region. Residents of the Gulf Islands did not like the idea of paying for buses in Victoria when there was no bus service in the islands. MLA Hugh Curtis would review the situation before it went to cabinet for approval.

The Mayne Inn had been granted permission to construct a dock and floats in Bennett Bay by the Land Management Branch. The foreshore lease angered some residents of Mayne Island. The Islands Trust had denied an application for rezoning the foreshore but the government department approved the lease.

Sea Capers would entertain Salt Spring Islanders for two days in June. The celebration from the previous year had gathered \$2,091.80. The Sea Capers committee kept \$1,000 to pay for the upcoming funfest and the rest went to six community organizations as donations.

Parents of children at the Saturna School planned a bottle and battery drive. The money raised would help the children pay for trips off-island for swimming and skating activities.

A bylaw aimed at controlling dogs was being processed by the Capital Region. The bylaw, once passed, would come into effect March 1 and licences for the animals would be required. Male and female dogs would cost \$15 while an animal which had been altered would cost \$5. The bylaw also set out a series of fines for allowing a dog to run at large.

B.C. Ferries released statistics covering the amount of use to which the Swartz Bay-Fulford ferry was put. August was the month of heaviest use when almost 10% of the year's total rode the route. But November and December were the months when the most travellers were left at the terminals because of lack of space.

**Licence sales totalled \$71,368 last year**

There are more dogs out in the sticks than in all of the built-up communities of the Capital Regional District.

According to a report received recently by the regional directors, dog licence sales to November, 1983, amounted to \$71,368 in the electoral areas of the islands and the western regions. This, said J.G. Masterton, manager of the electoral areas services department, is more than the combined total for all the four core municipalities. It compares with \$40,389 for the same period of 1982.

The report on animal control for November was very close to the report for the same month in 1982, Masterton reported to the electoral area services committee.

The month of November, with its short daylight hours, is not usually an active one for animal control, his report stated. The number of complaints received showed a rise. Up to November, there were 60 offence notices issued last year

resulting in fines totalling \$1,400.

Only case taken to court, in respect of a barking dog, was successfully prosecuted by the animal control officer.

Among the statistical details in the report was the revelation that the islands were the least problem in November.

On Salt Spring Island six animals were impounded and control officers travelled 132 miles to look after them. Compensation was paid in one instance. There were 12 complaints of running at large; one of a dog-bite and four of

miscellaneous problems. Only other island listed is Pender with three complaints of running at large and a mileage of 30 covered by control officers.

Colwood and Langford generated the month's longest list of complaints with 40 and 41, respectively.

allot \$138,500 for the two-room expansion of Fernwood. The money had been part of the \$1.5 million set aside for the construction of the Fulford school.

The ministry had decreed that the board could use the difference between the tendered price of construction and the allotted amount. The tender came in at close to \$1.3 million.

The ministry had placed a freeze on capital spending for projects and would allow only emergency needs to be met. Tentative approval for the Fernwood expansion had been given before the freeze was put in place.

Marshall told trustees of the board that he would continue his efforts to find out what happened.
