# World Development Tea helps run TB control program

Thanks to the seed money, \$3,000, provided by the proceeds from last year's World Development Tea, a small, rural hospital in southern Mexico will be able to run a TB control program for the indigenous peoples of the region with a total of \$216,000.

How does \$3,000 become \$216,000, you ask?

For the past three years, the four churches responsible for the annual fund-raising tea have pooled the money raised and selected projects that CIDA (the Canadian International Development Agency) will back with matching grants, sometimes matching locally raised money as much as 3:1.

This past year, the tea fund contributed \$2,500 towards the TB control program for the Altamirano hospital and our local chapter of the B.C. Save the Children Fund contributed \$500 to bring the total amount of the seed money for the

project to \$3,000. The project was then endorsed by the B.C. Save the Children Fund which agreed to contribute \$11,000 towards it and to submit the project to CIDA for matching funding.

CIDA felt that the TB control program was an important one and agreed not only to match the now \$14,000 at a 3:1 rate, but also agreed to contribute approximately \$40,000 a year for an additional four years.

The project was initially proposed to the local Tea Fund Committee by Salt Spring's Gary Sawdon after Gary had visited the area last spring with some other B.C. residents in order to check on the Guatemalan refugee situation in the area. There is almost a complete media blackout in North America about the civil war in Guatemala and Gary's fact-finding mission was specifically aimed at bringing back news about the Guatemalan refugees living in Mexico.

Southern Mexico has seen

upwards of 100,000 Guatemalan refugees cross its borders in the last few years. The refugees in this case are peasants, part of the large indigenous population of Guatemala which never mixed with the Spanish and whose direct descendants were the Mayans. Many of the refugees, besides fleeing the most brutal persecution imaginable and spending up to six months evading government troops and patrols, arrived in Mexico only to confront a new problem—the highly contagious tuberculosis.

A young doctor from Vancouver, Dr. Stephen Gray, working in conjunction with B.C. Save the Children Fund, has designed the five-year TB control program for the small rural hospital in Altamirano. The hospitals in southern Mexico available to serve the local, primarily indigenous, populations have been beset with the problems of attempting to provide adequate health care with a minimum of resources for both

indigenous people of the area and an ever-increasing refugee population.

Although tuberculosis has been endemic with the indigenous population, it was a relatively new problem for the refugees and has had a devastating effect.

Dr. Gray's program will involve identification of contagious cases, eradication and control of the disease, and education and training for local health promoters. As well, Dr. Gray is hoping to involve the Mexican government and organizations like the World Health Organization by asking for donations of medicines for the treatment of the TB.

The Salt Spring Tea Fund committee will be kept up-to-date on the progress of the Altamirano project over the next five years and United Church Minister Rev. Al Skinner hopes to visit Altamirano next fall when Dr. Gray goes to

Mexico for two months.

This year's annual tea fund-raiser will be held at St. George's Church on Saturday, Apr. 27. Everyone involved in preparations is hoping that the recent generosity shown by islanders will continue. The organizers would like to raise \$4,000 at this year's event.

When a committee like this can turn local funds into large development and assistance grants for worthwhile projects, it deserves all the support it can get.

The organizers look forward to a good turnout at this year's tea which will mark the 24th year in which this local fund-raising activity has taken place.

The glimmer was provided by the Sockeyes who defeated Castaways 3-1 in Victoria. Due to their Cup being a double knock-out tourney it means that both teams now have one loss and will meet this weekend once more, with the winner taking the cup.

Last weekend's win was not a sure thing as Castaways opened the scoring in the first half converting a penalty shot, but the Sockeyes roared back in the second half on three goals by Beth Straarup to force the deciding game this weekend in Victoria.

Unfortunately the other cup finalists, the Wranglers, Selects and Cosmos, all fell to opponents.

The Wranglers faced an immense task against Bays as they had only nine players, due to several players being away on trips and an injury.

This was all the advantage Bays needed as they picked holes in the weakened Wrangler team, winning 5-1.

All in all it should be a great weekend of youth soccer as we



## Fernwood bus route changed

The route of the Fernwood School bus changed Monday in an effort to improve safety.

When the bus reaches Vesuvius Bay Road it will turn around at the ferry compound before travelling to Chu-An Drive. At that point the bus returns to travel along Elizabeth Drive to Woodland and exits at the Mobrae intersection with Vesuvius Bay Road east of Tripp Road.

The school trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board approved the change a few weeks ago. Children were waiting for the bus at

intersections along Vesuvius Bay Road at the same time as ferry traffic was using the road.

Another change in the route involves direction. The bus now runs north from the school to circle the route by way of North End Road and Sunset Drive.

In the past, the bus came south to Vesuvius Bay Road and then made the circle to Southey Point and back to the school.

The new direction allows the bus to miss the ferry traffic at Vesuvius.

## Link park to sewer—director

The sewage disposal system approved for a mobile home park on Salt Spring Island came under fire last week at the Capital Regional Board meeting.

Eric Simmonds, Victoria alderman and chairman of the sanitation and water committee of the region, had commented at a committee meeting that he had been assured that ground disposal was not feasible on Salt Spring Island

and now a ground disposal system had been approved.

Director Hugh Borsman told the board that it had not been ruled impossible to dispose sewage into the ground. It had been impossible to find a suitable area.

The mobile home park is a quarter of a kilometre from the periphery of the trunk sewer.

Simmonds was not convinced.

The volume of effluent from the park is 28,600 gallons per day.

"That is a substantial amount of sewage," he said.

In view of its proximity to the designated sewer area it would make sense to join and hook up to take advantage of the system, suggested Simmonds.

- a) to add a new zoning classification, "Water A1 Zone (WA1)" which provides for the uses permitted in the Water A Zone (WA) and an additional permitted use which is log dumping and booming on a temporary basis. # Variety of plants can be seeded outdoors

In order to carry on in this business of living and laughing—even if only on occasion—of thinking, writing, loving, planting and generally fooling around, we shall need some photons, those precisely packaged little sparkling units of sunlight, to recharge our mitochondrial batteries.

The best all-round photon catchers, the only ones around for that matter, are the green folk, and the nice thing is that we can grow our own photon traps, and then eat the whole trap, photons, mitochondria, chloroplasts and all.

Peas, mustard greens, radishes and parsley, onions and early potatoes can all be seeded outdoors now, for all those who have nice, well drained soil in a nice, sunny spot. Raised beds will help, as usual, to improve the drainage and to warm up the soil. One-metre-wide beds work best for us, as this makes it easier to reach into the centre of the bed without undue strain. We usually grow four rows of carrots, onions, greens, beets, and so forth in a one-metre-wide bed, or two rows of peas, beans, cabbages, tomatoes and all those which require more room.

Potatoes require at least 24 inches, or 60 centimetres, between rows for hilling later on. Make an eight-inch-deep furrow, or 20 centimetres, sprinkle a nice layer of compost in the bottom, plant your seed potatoes about 14 inches, or 35 centimetres apart, and cover with about two inches, five centimetres, of soil.

Later on, when the first green has come up to about four inches, or 10 centimetres, cover again, leaving only the top leaves exposed. Repeat this procedure accordingly, until the potatoes are well hilled later on. To prepare beds for planting, for those who are not in too great a hurry and who have good, rich soil, a thorough hoeing is all that is required, to be followed by another hoeing in two weeks or thereabouts.

This will cause weeds to germinate and grow, and the second hoeing will take care of those. If dolomite lime has not been applied yet, this can be done now at 50 pounds per 1,000 square feet, or per 300 square metres. Rock phosphate at 100 pounds for the same area, if not done yet, or within the last 10 years, will also help a great deal.

Early in the year, young seedlings,

and especially tomato seedlings, are often invaded by flea beetles. And although they have never managed to cause significant damage at our place, this year I am going to try mulching with weeds to encourage our tireless pest eliminators, the little, black hunting spiders. Although I value the weed for its contribution of minerals, nutrients and organic material, we always start out with clean, tilled beds.

Later on, most of our garden has a mulch of sheared weeds with thousands of relentless spiders under it, and not a sign of any other insects, but early in the season our beds are bare, and spiders are few. Perhaps it is only due to the lack of a protective cover for bird-shy spiders that the flea beetles can have a field day. We will try it this year and see what happens.

To this end, we shear and save some weeds from other places for a spider-sheltering mulch early in the season. We seed peas at the rate of one every three inches, or eight centimetres, 1½ inches deep, about four centimetres, and the others, parsley, greens, radishes and onions, go in about three seeds to the inch, or a seed per centimetre, about one-half inch deep, which comes to a little more than one centimetre.

Do not lime where the tomatoes are going to grow as they like acid soils a lot better. Make up for it where the cabbages are going to go—they like lots of it. All of them

like phosphate rock though, for their mitochondria.

Mitochondria, also unencumbered by anything resembling a brain, nevertheless know how to assemble phosphorus with other common ingredients into a rechargeable storage battery for trapped solar energy, our little photons.

It is this photon-charged phosphorus which our mitochondria hold for us, to discharge its photons when we need them for living, loving and thinking. It is a

marvellously complex and interrelated enterprise, an amiable co-operation of various bits of life, of chloroplasts, mitochondria, man and the nitrogen-fixing bacteria of the soil, all busily engaged in passing solar energy around, with solar energy, like so many canapes at a party.

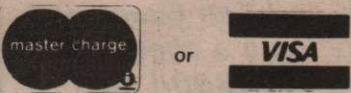

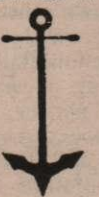

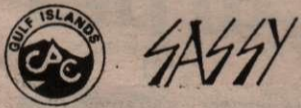

# First telephone wire strung at Salt Spring in 1896

## Concert held to raise funds for phone service

**"N**umber please!" The call sign of the telephone operator for half a century was that single request, "Number please!"

The island subscriber calling another number would lift the receiver off its hook, twirl the handle and wait for the operator to answer.

It was Robert Burns McMicking who brought telephones to Vancouver Island. On Salt Spring Island the author of the instant communication was Keith Wilson.

Wilson was the son of Rev. Norman Wilson, who tended the souls of members of the Anglican parish of Salt Spring Island and lived at Barnsbury. Keith was one of his children. And Barnsbury stood where the Salt Spring Island Golf Club is now located. The old house was, in fact, the golf club headquarters when it burned down.

The story of telephones goes back many years before that.

In 1896 Keith Wilson strung a wire from Barnsbury to Central, with the other telephone in Broadwell's Store. There were two subscribers, young Wilson and Joel Broadwell.

### A NOVELTY

In 1896 the telephone line was a novelty. In 1898 it became a part of the community around Central. Wilson hooked up other homes in the neighbourhood and they were able to order their supplies direct.

The next extension took the line to Fernwood. And in 1899 the community set out to increase its revenues. There was no tribunal, provincial or national, to arbitrate on the justification of an increase to the neighbourhood telephone co-operative. Instead, the community staged a concert to raise funds for the telephone service. The records possibly reveal the extent of the concert's success. But Tony Farr did not get that far into the economic history of island telephones when he addressed the Salt Spring Historical Society recently to talk of the history of telephones in the province, on Vancouver Island and on Salt Spring Island.

The progress of the telephone call was observed in the island's only publication of the day, *Parish and Home*, church magazine of the island. The editor of the newsheet was Keith Wilson's father, the minister.

By 1900, four years after its inception, the telephone service was a recognized entity at the north end of the island and a committee was set up to manage the operation.

The speaker did take a quick look

at the economics of early phone companies. Farr reported that the monthly fee for telephone service was \$3. For that princely sum, and it was worth far more than the figure would suggest today, the subscriber might abandon his telephone and buy a 36-pound salmon.

The management committee elected 85 years ago included the president, J. P. Booth, Member of the Provincial Parliament; secretary Percy Purvis, pioneer Salt Spring Island merchant; treasurer Joel Broadwell, pioneer Central storekeeper; Frank Scott, A.L. Wilson, A.R. Bittancourt, Fred Bittancourt, S. Conery and Joseph Nightingale.

This committee managed the island operation until it was taken over, in 1904, by the Dominion Government Telephones.

The revenues were not, thus far, impressive. The charges in the past had been \$5 a year per subscriber.

The island service was shortly afterwards linked with Crofton and North Saanich through submarine cables to Isabella Point and Fulford. The purpose of this link was to provide an alternative route to the line over the Malahat.

### 157 PHONES

In 1904 there were 157 phones in the island operation and they were linked through 63 miles of wire. The telephone exchange was located on Hereford Ave., in Ganges, where Western Cyclogical is found today.

The island central employed a staff of operators, under the general supervision of a chief operator. Tony Farr gave a list of chief operators on Salt Spring Island, Effie Turnor, Kitty Allan, Frena Aitkens and Josie Overend.

During the years of telephone expansion on the island, there were sometimes more customers to a line than would be tolerated in later years. Dorothy James, said the speaker, was one of 17 people sharing one line.

But the system grew and in 1932 it was taken over by the B.C. Telephone Co.

Two years later a second switchboard position was installed to meet the demands of the growing island.

Josie Overend was the last chief operator to serve at Ganges. She

was in the office when the telephone service was automated. Every subscriber had a dial on the telephone and a staff of operators was no longer needed.

### GONE FOREVER

"Number please!" was gone forever.

One day the operator was destined to cut in on a long-distance call and enquire, "What number are you calling from?"

That was when direct dialling long distance was inaugurated, but the equipment did not automatically read the number of the subscriber dialling the call.

The end of the manual phone, with its hand-cranked magneto, was the end of an era. It was more than that, it was the end of the first chapter of telephone history.

The caller could no longer get the information he was seeking from the operator. The desperate caller could always depend on the operator in an emergency. The dial telephone offered no such service.

No more chatting and no more listening in; the telephone was now a mechanical marvel and devoid of the personality it had for so many years corrowed from its operators.

For example, said Farr, when Dorothy James had a sick child,

many years ago, and needed to keep in touch with the doctor, the operator left the two lines connected overnight in case of emergency. Telephone service closed off at 10 pm until the morning.

The operator also filtered out nuisance calls. Ellen Bennett remembers connecting an obstreperous caller with a pay telephone and announcing after a few rings in an empty call box, "They do not answer!"

A number of former telephone company employees are still living on the island and enjoying the modern service while remembering the happy days of listening-in.

Tony Farr glanced at the future, but offered no firm predictions. He did offer his audience something substantial for their telephone future.

An electronic exchange is planned on Salt Spring Island in 1989, he observed.

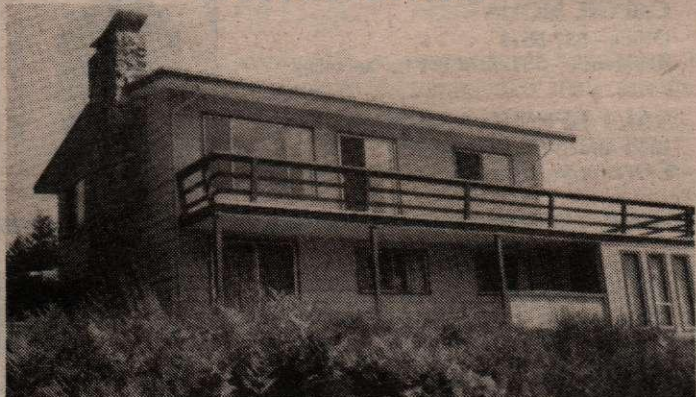

# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

## Twenty-five Years Ago

**Driftwood** began publishing a newspaper for Salt Spring Island and the Gulf Islands each Thursday. Editor Woody Fisher had come to the island for a month five years before and had stayed.

A chimney fire at the home of Miles Acheson on St. Mary Lake attracted the attention of the Salt Spring fire fighting volunteers. The fire truck from Fulford arrived at the scene before the truck from Ganges. Actually, both trucks were in Ganges for a practice session and the Fulford truck managed to get a head start. No damage was caused by the fire.

A golden wedding anniversary was celebrated in Vesuvius when friends gathered to honour Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Duke. The couple had been married in Vancouver in 1910 and had lived there until moving to Salt Spring and their home in Vesuvius. The party was held at the home of Mr. and Mrs. T. J. Sharland.

Young pianists from Salt Spring brought back honours from the Cowichan Music Festival in Duncan. Doris Crofton, the piano teacher, took eight of her pupils to the festival. Heather Anderson took top spot for the 14-year-old class and managed 170 of 200 on sight-reading to top all participants. That effort won her a special prize as well as first place for sight-reading in her age group.

## Twenty Years Ago

A dog destroyed six lambs on Col. Des Crofton's property in Ganges. He had heard the sheep bawling in the night and the next morning discovered that the lambs were missing. A check revealed the carcasses in the bush. RCMP gave him clearance to shoot on sight any stray dogs in the area.

Clam-digging machines should not be allowed because of the large number of clams taken. The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce was prepared to write a letter of protest against the use of the machines. President Tom Portlock noted that letters of protest would go to provincial and federal authorities.

The assistant fire chief retired from active duty with the Salt Spring Fire Department. Ben Greenough had spent 16 years with the volunteer brigade and members of the fire department gathered to award him an honorary life membership and present him with a suitably carved totem pole.

The Salt Spring Seals met their match when they played a basketball team from Saanich. When the Seals visited Saanich, they lost by a score of 47-34. Top scorer for the Seals was Glenn Woodley who hooped 20 points. The next game was held on Salt Spring and the Saanich team edged the Seals 39-33.

## Five Years Ago

The B. C. Supreme Court ruled that the provincial government did not have the right to overrule decisions of quasi-judicial bodies which it had set up. 
