Tomatoes, peppers are fond of photons, heat

What you have before you is some paper — made from a sun-spun tree — which reflects photons and therefore appears as white. On it are little black characters — made of carbon from an incompletely burnt tree — which absorb photons and therefore look black to us.

Here, then, we have the reason why it is so much easier to read in the light, rather than in the dark. Yet there is more to reading than meets the eye, so to speak, more than just the juxtaposition of reflecting and non-reflecting materials. The photons which are reflected by the paper arrive in the eye and there set some neural activity into motion, all the way to the proper place within the brain, where the light and dark patterns are decoded.

The eye, of course, has been assembled with solar photon power in the first place — and so has the brain — from carrots and other such light-assembled ingredients. When we, and our brain, have grown for about six years — all on sun-spun greens, milk, seeds, steaks, or what have you — we then go to school, made from sun-spun trees mostly, to be instructed in the art of decoding light and dark patterns, by larger and older sun-spun people.

The process of learning to translate reflection patterns into some sense is carried on in the privacy of our heads, with photons, and stored in photon-generated memory patterns. It is a marvellously complex, and at the same time marvellously simple affair, as intimate an affair with

light as anyone could wish to have — and wishes are, of course, spun by light too.

Now that we know how we read, only one question remains; why? So far the best answer I have come up with is because we want to know.

In this light, then, we may now proceed to read about the care and raising of a couple of delicious, sun-spun members of the green family, tomatoes and peppers. Both of these are very fond of photons, and of heat. Peppers, of late, and even some of the more finicky tomatoes, have proven a bit tricky for us, as the general ambience of restraint which has descended upon us seems to have infected our summers as well.

First of all, select only tomatoes with a time to maturity of 70 days or less, and the shortest-time-to-maturity peppers you can find. Our cool summers, and our even cooler summer nights, add about one-third as much time again to local maturity. So a 70 day eastern tomato will take about 95 days to ripen here. Fantastic, Salt Spring Sunrise, and Oregon or Kootenay from Territorial Seeds have been reliable producers for us, as well as any of the small Arctic varieties.

However, a bit later on, we shall mention a relatively easy way to improve upon our restrained summer situation. Tomatoes need somewhat acid soil conditions, between 5.5 and 6.0 on the pH scale, whereas peppers require near neutral conditions, and the familiar purple colouring of tomato seedlings is entirely due to a lack of

this essential mineral. Bonemeal is an excellent source of phosphorus and should be in good supply at the seedling stage as well as outdoors.

To start tomato and pepper seedlings the soil temperature must be between 70 and 75 degrees F. (21-23 C.) When raising tomatoes indoors, or without a soil-heating cable, it is best to let the soil warm up to room temperature before seeding. A loose and light soil mix, with plenty of organic content for good moisture retention, is essential to avoid root damage at transplanting time.

Transplant seedlings when the first true leaves have appeared, into individual four-inch (10 cm) pots. Tomato seedlings can be buried right up to the first leaves on transplanting into pots or, later on, into the ground. This will result in much larger root systems, and consequently, in vigorous plants. Peppers can also be transplanted somewhat deeper than grown, although not nearly as much as tomatoes.

Additional light, or photons, will supply extra growth energy, both at

the seedling and at the transplant stage. After transplanting grow tomato seedlings in relatively cool situations, an unheated greenhouse will do just fine, for dense and stocky plants.

Peppers are a bit more touchy and prefer steady temperatures above 55 degrees F. (12 C.) to do well. Chicken manure, bonemeal and compost, and a touch of seaweed, under each plant when transplanting outdoors, well mixed into the existing soil, will supply all the required nutrients. At that time, plant tomatoes 18 inches (45 cm) apart, in a staggered double row, to increase tomato production by about 50 per cent.

Yields can be further increased by planting tomatoes among bush beans, which will also effectively reduce insect and disease incidence, and it will increase moisture

retention in the soil as well. We grow tomatoes in wire cages made of old stock fencing which beats staking and tying by a mile and adds beneficial electro-magnetic conditions as well. It also lends itself readily to a simple clear plastic cover to provide extra heat and an abundance of ripe tomatoes.

Treat peppers in the same manner, but omit the bush beans. Although it increased bean production significantly, it would reduce pepper yield. The plastic cover, though, is essential for any hope of ripe peppers, other than in a hot spot in Vesuvius perhaps. With any luck and given a half-decent summer, we can encourage those dancing photons, in this manner, to stick around and spin tomatoes — and eventually our thoughts — instead of going off into the wild blue yonder.

Islands contributed eight percent

The 11 recycling depots in the Capital Region collected 1,179 tons of waste products last year and the three depots in the Gulf Islands contributed 95 tons, or eight per cent of the total.

Donna Martin is in charge of the recycle depot on Salt Spring and she noted that 74 tons of recycled material went through the depot last year. The depot at Pender Island collected 14 tons of newspapers while the depot at Saturna Island

gathered seven tons of newsprint.

A breakdown of the material from the depot at the Valcourt Centre on Salt Spring shows that island residents brought in 16 tons of newspapers, 52 tons of glass and six tons of tin cans.

The recycle depot, Martin said, collects about five tons of material every two weeks. When the amount of recycled material gets that heavy, it is taken off-island to the main depot in Saanich.

She also stages a pick-up of toxic materials on selected Saturdays at the Farmers' Market in Ganges between May and September. The toxic waste is taken to the waste management branch in Victoria for disposal.

The depot on Salt Spring, Martin said, is always open. Residents should prepare the disposal material and sort it in kind. At the depot, she

requests that it be placed in the appropriate bin.

Newspapers should be tied securely. Brown paper bags and corrugated cardboard, flattened and tied, are also welcomed.

Cans should be washed, flattened and have the labels removed. The aluminum trays from such things as TV dinners can be washed and dropped off.

Glass jars and bottles should be washed and the metal neck rings, foil and lead wrappings should be removed.

Magazines should be sorted from newspapers and tied in bundles.

Study ready in six weeks

The main part of a study investigating incorporation of Salt Spring Island won't be ready for about six weeks. According to Ray Hill, chairman of the incorporation steering committee, the facts and figures contained in the study must be rechecked.

About two weeks after the study's release a public meeting is to be held to explain details and answer

questions. Negotiations to determine the terms of incorporation would likely be undertaken if the public indicated that the committee should continue its work.

Another public meeting would follow to give islanders another chance to discuss the issue and to decide if a referendum should be held.

Institute speaks out against bylaw

Sounds of protest against the proposed anti-noise bylaw for Salt Spring will be heard from the members of the Farmers' Institute as they don't like the way it could affect the operation of their farms.

Regional director Hugh Borsman has been circulating the proposed bylaw to gather comments for or against it before presenting it to the CRD board of directors for action.

"It's one more piece of nuisance that we don't need," institute president Russ Lazaruk told the members last week at the annual general meeting.

The proposed bylaw defines objectionable noise as including "any sound which disturbs or tends to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort and convenience of the neighbourhood or of persons in the vicinity."

The bylaw expressly exempts "the operation in a reasonable manner of farm or forestry equipment."

But it does note that "no person shall keep or harbour any animal which makes frequent or objectionable noise."

Louise Harkema told the meeting that the bylaw may not affect farmers now but when the island becomes more settled in a few years, there could be problems. Farm noises are not objectionable to farmers, she said, but the people who move here from the cities may find a rooster crowing in the morning to be objectionable.

The meeting decided to endorse a motion protesting "as strongly as decorum allows" the anti-noise bylaw as it could affect farmers.

One member told the meeting that his neighbours of many years had sold their property and moved away. The new neighbours, who live in a house approximately 1,000 feet away from his house, object to the roosters greeting the dawn.

Harkema told the meeting that she had attempted to explain the

objections farmers had to the proposed bylaw to the CRD director. She added that Borsman didn't seem to understand what she was trying to say.

The members agreed to write letters and make phone calls to various officials to protest the bylaw.

Institute elects directors

The Salt Spring Farmers' Institute members gathered for the 1985 annual general meeting last week and selected eight directors to run its business for the year.

Russ Lazaruk, Perry Booth, Paul MacKenzie, Bill Vanderwekken and Ross McLeod were chosen to serve another term. Also elected were Lisa Lloyd, Linda Woodley and Paul Minvielle.

The new slate of directors will meet in early April to choose the officers as well as chairmen of the various committees.

The meeting, which also heard reports from the committee chairmen on activities last year, was attended by approximately 35 members of the institute.

Circus Of Dreams

David Peterson premiered his solo *Circus of Dreams* Saturday evening at La Berengerie. Set in a bleak (post-nuclear) future when "unauthorized possession of a clown nose" is prohibited and clown commandos armed with tickling feathers and exploding combat-issue noses roam the streets, this is a fine piece of theatre (albeit a trifle demanding on a post-prandial tummy).

The cast of characters (eight in all) ranges from a shy munitions saboteur through a lozenge-voiced newscaster to Madame Wed, a torchy chanteuse. All are ably handled by the talented Peterson, who wrote as well as performed this black *Circus of Dreams*. (Contributed by Martha Miller)

Two films

Two films were sponsored on Sunday by Continuing Education. About 30 adults watched *The Other Way* and *Mondragon*.

The first film explored the work of Shumacher, author of *Small is Beautiful*. He feels that high technology is being used for its own sake, with a vast waste of energy and high unemployment as a result. He has formed a company called Intermediate Technology to develop medium-cost, relatively simple machines which utilize a reasonable amount of manpower.

Shumacher feels that men want to work creatively with their minds and hands, and that technology should serve this end.

Mondragon discussed the Basque co-operatives based on the 18th century formula of Robert Owens. The original producer-owned co-op was founded at Mondragon in the 50's, and has served as a prototype to over 80 functioning producer and consumer-owned co-operatives, including a bank. As of filming, no co-op based on the Mondragon model has ever failed.

Special thanks are due to Martha Miller, serving beyond duty with a recalcitrant projector.

Hunger Project

The Hunger Project briefing on Ending Hunger was held Thursday night and about 10 people attended. A very detailed, professional presentation was given by Barbara Moore, a former CUSO worker in Africa.

The Hunger Project itself is an organization with the purpose of educating people about world hunger, and collecting signatures of people who pledge themselves to do what they personally can to end hunger.

The participants were divided in their response to the Hunger Project's aims. Some felt it was not right to have a group for solely educational purposes, since other groups provide both education and aid. Others found the amount of information rather overwhelming.

However, many appreciated the detail. They felt it would help them to be specific when discussing the problem of hunger. The discussion was stimulating, and some of the participants are planning personal projects.

Another briefing session may be held if numbers permit.

Those caring for a relative who cannot be left alone can arrange some much-needed time off for a few hours each month.

Region approves park proposal

Redevelopment plan for Centennial Park in Ganges gained the support of the Capital Regional Board on Wednesday afternoon last week.

Down through the years with Driftwood

Twenty-five Years Ago

Beaver Point Hall was the scene of another famous bean supper. Convener Nan Ruckle organized the efforts of the Beaver Point residents to put on the evening of feasting and bingo. The group made \$273.

Driftwood noted that the consolidated school at Ganges opened its doors on April 1, 1940. Approximately 500 residents, visitors and children had shown up at the opening ceremonies when the minister of education, G.M. Weir, officiated. He was joined by the minister of labour, G.S. Pearson, with each man planting a tree on either side of the entrance. The school had eight classrooms, a chemistry and science room, a home economics and domestic science room with two spare rooms unallocated for any special purpose.

The foursome played a round of golf but no one kept score. Dr. W.T. Lockhart, 92; Sam Adams, 80; W. M. Mouat, 75; and youngster W.C. Wells, 71, played golf regularly on the Salt Spring golf course. The figures were their ages, not their scores.

The Parent-Teacher Association, met at Mahon Hall in Ganges. The treasurer reported a bank balance of \$161.66 and the meeting decided to assist the Cowichan Music Festival with either a cup or a cash donation. Membership in the group stood at 110.

The albino whale was sighted again. It was with a group of blackfish when Pat Patterson saw it off the north end of Salt Spring.

Twenty Years Ago

The proposed bridge linking Salt Spring to Vancouver Island and spanning Sansum Narrows had been the subject of discussion between Art Young of Salt Spring and Reeve Norton of North Cowichan. The bridge approach would start at the bottom of Lee's Hill and the span would be 1,600 feet across the narrows with a further 1.5 miles of approach on the Cowichan side.

The Ganges sewer had been the subject of a meeting of residents. The group decided to form a committee to look into the feasibility of the project. The medical director for Greater Victoria, Dr. J. Whitbread, explained to the meeting that at least 40 septic fields in the village were not working and were contributing to contamination of the area. The committee would be composed of Art Young, Chuck Horel, J. McManus, John Waterfall Jr. and Dr. Ted Jansch.

The Wayside Sale was held indoors at St. George's Parish Hall because it rained. Nevertheless, the sale netted a profit of \$74. Contest winners were Mrs. V.L. Jackson and Miss F. Aitkins.

The Red Cross fund-raising campaign came to an end and convener Mrs. Lazenby reported that \$904 had been raised.

The Cowichan Music Festival proved to be a gold mine for young Salt Spring musicians. The local group brought back 14 firsts and 16 seconds. Susan De Burgh won the Gertrude Moyle Memorial Trophy as most promising performer in the piano class.

Fifteen Years Ago

The sailboat drifted down Trincomali Channel with its mast bent and the sail trailing in the water. A search and rescue operation was launched by Lt. Col. D.G. Crofton of Ganges. Despite the efforts of such helpers as Bill De Long at Fernwood, no trace of the passengers could be found.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the women's bake sale was a success. Edie Whiting sold tickets for a raffle while the home-baked goodies, he reported, "were snapped up real fast."

A buffet luncheon at the home of Jesse and Elsie Brown at Mayne Island was held to say goodbye to Reverend Benjamin Fream. He had been in charge of the parishes of Mayne and Galiano for two years and was retiring to live in Sidney. Members of St. Mary Magdalene Church gathered to wish him well.

The Fulford May Day parade was cancelled for the year. Controversy over the selection of the May Queen could not be settled and the sponsors, the Fulford Hall Association, decided against holding the event. The May Queen had been chosen by the sale of tickets but in the previous year she was chosen by a vote of students at Gulf Islands Secondary School.

Members of the Advisory Planning Commission for Salt Spring had been named. Capital Regional director Marc Holmes would be joined on the APC by Adrian Wolfe-Milner, Dennis Seward and Mrs. G.M. Baker.

Ten Years Ago

Canada, including the Gulf Islands, officially switched from Fahrenheit to Celsius to measure temperatures in the nation. The change-over to the Celsius measure became mandatory as of March 31, 1975.

A storm lashed the Gulf Islands with winds up to 75 miles per hour. A camper on Mayne Island was killed when a tree fell across her tent. Her companion was injured. The ramp at the ferry wharf at Vesuvius Bay on Salt Spring was damaged and service halted. Ferries were not running to the mainland but the Fulford-Swartz Bay ferry operated occasionally. Electrical and telephone service was knocked out in all parts of the islands.

Tommy Douglas, M.P. for the Gulf Islands, would be in Ganges for an afternoon meeting with his constituents. He would be at the United Church to talk to people and answer their questions.

Walkers walked the roads of Galiano Island for eight miles, ending at Retreat Cove. Dean Albrecht, 11, collected the largest number of pledges while Stanley Jackson and Mrs. I.A. Murphy were the oldest walkers. The event was sponsored by the Lions Club to raise money for the Galiano Housing Society.

Lions walkathon on Salt Spring was won by Art Buitenwerf who travelled the eight miles between Ganges and Fulford in 53 minutes. Chariot race was won by the Royal Fulford Harbour Gentlemen's Yacht Club. The Chamber of Commerce chariot fell apart at the finish line.

Five Years Ago

The Capital Region considered two sewer proposals for Salt Spring Island. The directors heard about revised regulations and rates for the system at Maliview. Salt Spring director Yvette Valcourt, tabled discussion on the rates for the Ganges sewer system.

The pub at Harbour House Hotel was closed for two days because police had discovered minors drinking in the establishment. The Liquor Control Branch made the ruling at a hearing on the matter. The hotel management had been warned of the consequences of serving minors but the infractions had continued.

The meeting at Pender Island brought the two sides in the dispute over education quality at the Pender school together. Spokemen for each side set out their views on the


matter. At the conclusion of the meeting, school district secretary-treasurer Wilf Peck, who had chaired the meeting, told the parents that the school board could do nothing and that they would have to work their differences out among themselves.

The Salt Spring Slugs played in a tournament at Summerland. Led by the inspired play of Boom-Boom Bergstrom and Captain Crunch Jukes, the Slugs went down to go glorious defeat. Tournament organizers invited the Slugs to return the following year — as spectators.

Traffic accidents on Galiano Island resulted in injuries to five men. In separate incidents, three men were hurt in one accident while two men suffered injuries in a second accident. The crashes occurred on the same road on the same night.
