

History speaks of urban males

Mayne Island historian looks at pioneer women

There's more to history than the activities of men in towns and cities. That was the message of Mayne Island historian Marie Elliott when she spoke to the Salt Spring Island Historical Society last week.

The historian and author centred her address on women of the Gulf Islands. She also outlined the avenues of research open to the historian.

The history of early British Columbia deals with the urban centres and virtually ignores the women of the pioneer families, charged Elliott. And she went on to prove her point.

The urban history of British Columbia opened in the early twenties, said the speaker. Prior to that time the province had been largely a rural community, but the emphasis remains on early urban activities.

THE PIONEER WOMAN

Historians have left out the pioneer woman and they have given little attention to the native people of the province, the society was told.

Tradition tells of the early white settlers who lived with a native woman and cast her aside when white women appeared on the scene. Elliott described the setting in the rural communities. Most partnerships between white settlers and Indian women were permanent relationships in the rural areas, she recalled. The temporary nature of interracial associations was the character of the town dwellers, she asserted.

With family after family she cited

instances of lifelong partnerships where there was no thought of terminating a happy and successful marriage.

In the rural district Indian women were held in much higher esteem than in the urban centres, she said.

DIFFERENT ACCEPTANCE
Both in the course of her presentation on the woman and history and while showing slides of early photographs, Elliott held up this different acceptance of the native woman in a predominantly white community. Among the islands the number of permanent partnerships established in this manner proved the difference between rural reality and history's prejudice, asserted the island historian.

Women in the rural communities were dependent upon each other in so many areas that they accepted each other without hesitation. This lack of concern of racial difference was to be found when the Japanese families came to settle on the islands. The Japanese presence on Mayne Island was particularly strong and the tomato co-operative was one of the biggest growing operations on Mayne Island.

JAPANESE COMMUNITY

When the Japanese first settled on Mayne Island they were accepted cheerfully by the island community. Not only were they accepted, but many formed close and lasting friendships with the established community. The speaker recalled that the first disharmony in the relationship between the two races was sown by the islands member of the provincial parliament, McGregor McIntosh.

She also noted a basic difference between the Japanese men and women. The men were associating with the English-speaking community in the conduct of their normal affairs. They quickly became familiar with English. Many of their wives were not faced with the requirement to understand English and tended to speak Japanese exclusively. Over the years, however, there was a constant exchange between the women of the two races, she recalled.

Marie Elliott spoke with regret of the departure of the Japanese during the war.

ALL WERE EQUAL
She summed up with the explanation that all women were accepted as individuals in the islands and as equals.

After examining the contribution made by the pioneer women of the

islands to their history, the island historian outlined the manner in which research may be undertaken in order to draw a clearer picture of an earlier era.

Two basic rules offered the historical society were, "Never, ever, close the book!" and, "Always be stubborn!"

She cited examples of these maxims.

It is never possible for a historian to be satisfied that she has learned all there is to know about a historical incident. Writing history is a matter of reading history, she explained.

LOOK AT THEIR WILLS

Wills are an excellent lead to history. They show where money went and how it was passed on. They indicated the social class of the individual and they give a lead to people and conditions.

Directories are of great value as are early photographs. The photograph shows the styles and dress of the historical character. They also tell of associations and conditions. Colonial correspondence is a constant source of information as are contemporary diaries.

Sessional papers, recording provincial administration, reveal great detail of an earlier day.

Elliott showed a copy of sessional papers in 1879. It was the property of her grandfather.

TWO EARLY SCHOOLS

A random glance revealed that in that year there were two schools on Salt Spring Island. The Burgoyne Bay school, under the tutelage of Miss McNaughton, and an enrolment of 15 boys and 11 girls.

At Vesuvius, or the "Northern settlement", the school served four boys and eight girls and was taught by Miss Clarke.

Emphasizing the need for constant search for material, the speaker referred to the story of the murder of Frederick Marks and his daughter a century or so ago. The story has been written many times, including her own work.

While examining some early colonial correspondence she found reference to the Marks incident that has not been mentioned in any historical reference to those deaths. She is still investigating it and she explained that she will rewrite the story to include her new information.

ON BEING STUBBORN

Stubbornness paid off, she told her audience, when she researched the history of Winifred Gray, early

settler on Samuel Island. Mrs. Gray had reported that her family home in the south of England had been destroyed. She also revealed that when the stone was quarried by her father for his house he donated stone for the construction of a new church.

Elliott decided that for the lack of a picture of the early home she might settle for one of the church, contemporary and linked with the family. Accordingly, she wrote to the community.

The reply explained that the original home was still standing and she was given a picture of both.

That, said Elliott, was

stubbornness.


EARLY PICTURES

Part of her presentation consisted of a slide show of early photographs, with a running commentary on the outline of early pioneers and the records of the pioneer island women.

Marie Elliott is the author of *Mayne Island and the Outer Gulf Islands: a History* and many other historical writings. Daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Bennett of Mayne, she is equally aware of the present-day activities in their relationship to history. She is serving as one of Mayne Island's trustees on the Islands Trust.

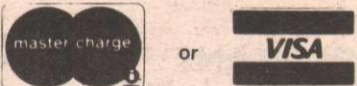

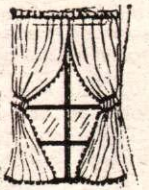

No vehicle deposit required**

Customers making travel plans closer to the sailing date can call for a vehicle reservation within five days of that date, and no vehicle deposit will be required. Trace elements crucial to health

This week we shall look at the need for selenium, a trace element which is present in soils at a rate of about one part per million. From there it gets into plants, into greens, into grasses and weeds, into lettuces, or tomatoes, or into apples.

It is, like many others, a rather crucial element, and if it goes missing in animals, their muscles turn white and the animal dies of muscle failure. We are not sufficiently far removed from animal to be able to do without this element—we need it just as much. We get our selenium from produce, or from meat raised on green fodder—at least we used to.

What actually happens goes like this: Let us suppose that we get our selenium from the soil, with our produce or our meat. It gets incorporated into our corporal substance and there it sticks around for a little while. So far, so good.

We make and lose about one billion red blood cells every day. The cells of our skin last for about 10 days, and our muscle cells have about the same life expectancy before they are replaced with new ones. Except for the cells of our bones and teeth, there is a rather hurried coming and going of the cellular tenants of our physical selves.

With our expired cellular tenants goes their baggage, though, the selenium, cobalt, and what have you, as they are unceremoniously evicted through the back door. It all goes to the sewers, and then to the sea. That is it: gone, lost, goodbye and farewell.

After a few years of this sort of agriculture and waste management, the original—one part per million—traces of selenium in the soil have been sifted from the soil, via our wastes, to the sea. Now then, as soon as we found out that there is something amiss, that things die without selenium, we started looking around for other sources, for mineral deposits containing selenium, and we now extract, refine, ship, distribute and add it to our animal feeds: laying pellets with precise proportions of manufactured selenium, salt licks with cobalt, goat rations with selenium, and so forth.

Since selenium is now added to animal feeds, those who eat meat

and fish will get it in the right amounts, but the pure vegetarian will have to rely on the drug store for his, or on seaweed, or on weeds grown on uncultivated soils, or on bona fide organically grown produce. Hence my fondness for seaweed, for the incomparable weed, and for grass clippings grown on septic fields.

I can see the day when we will be building huge facilities to extract trace elements from sea water, separate and purify them and ship them off to our farmers and gardeners at great expense for everyone concerned, just to send them back to the sea with our wastes.

We have made a beginning along these lines with the commercial collection, dehydration and pulverization of seaweed. Of course, were we to recycle all animal and human wastes to our soils again, the whole thing would take care of itself, and we would not have to give it another thought, or spend another penny for it. In the meantime, though, the ordinary gardener can get all the trace elements from seaweed, if readily available, or from weeds in uncultivated places.

Unless animal pastures are manured with the animals' wastes, the selenium goes to the animal, then to us, and from us to the sea again, and as far as selenium is concerned, or any other trace element, even pasture weeds would be deficient, and we would be no better off again. So where seaweed is not readily available, weeds from totally uncultivated places and from green growth on septic fields are a natural and, except for the labour, free source of all the trace elements.

A wild variety of weeds would help a great deal too, since every kind of plant has its own typical complement and variety of trace

elements. Use clippings and weeds in your compost, and as a surface mulch between your vegetables, and one could even make teas, for human consumption, from some of the more palatable weeds.

By now it must be well known that I harbour a fondness for all manner of weeds and I attribute the strapping health of our produce almost entirely to my weeds. The other day, I dropped in at a neighbour's place which I had not seen for a year or so. There were a few shrubs, some trees, an as yet bare garden with waiting raised beds, and some perennials here and there in small places.

Yet I could tell that they have followed my advice to a "T". The signs were unmistakable. At this cool, early and slow time of year, even the hardest things seem a little worse for wear. However, all the growing things in this neighbour's garden just overwhelmed me with their strapping and exuberant health. There was not even a nibble anywhere on any of the solidly robust early perennials and shrubs. This then is the other side of this story of the green life and our life, and it is the side I like by far the best.

To many of those who are interested in the work of the Salt Spring World Development Committee, providing the van in the accompanying photograph has seemed the most valuable of the several projects that have been initiated.

The truth of its value is emphasized in the following quotation taken from an Operation Eyesight newsletter. The speaker is Dr. James Kuruvella, an ophthalmic surgeon in India. The doctor, who had just come from the operating room where he had finished restoring sight to three people, had this comment to make:

"Sure, I'm an ophthalmic surgeon, but I see myself more as a family physician. You see, I cure whole families...not from eye disease but from starvation. Let me explain. When a person blind from cataracts and who was once the family breadwinner is positioned on my operating table I have a two-fold responsibility: first, a responsibility to the patient and then a responsibility to the patient's family. Once I restore that person to sight I literally save the family from starvation.

"You simply have no idea what impact a sight restoration can have. The family survives. If there are

relatives, such as old people and children dependent on that breadwinner, well they survive also. This surprises you? I don't wonder. Coming from a land of plenty you have no idea what want really is, of the fine line between existence and starvation.

"There is no surgery that is so inexpensive, yet produces such dramatic, earth-shaking results as cataract surgery. My patients literally come back from another world to this one. They get a whole new start in life, go back to earning a few rupees and the families eat again.

Salt Spring Islanders have every right to be happy and proud that they brought about the gift of the van in the picture.

Again there is an opportunity to help. The World Development Tea, the tea that makes the beginning of a project possible, will be held in the Ganges United Church halls on Saturday at 2 pm. The Anglican, Community Gospel, Roman Catholic and United churches are doing the work, under the leadership this year of the Anglican women. Stalls for home baking, plants and white elephant items are planned. Tea will be served. Following the plan of last year, there will be a silent auction.

At the silent auction there will be

an opportunity to bid, on a sheet of paper, for a cake decorated by Margaret Howell, a corsage made by Isabelle Mouat, a clown crafted by Lois Bushell, a rhinestone brooch and earring set and a number of other useful and interesting items. The would-be buyer may look at former bids and enter a higher one.

The object of the afternoon is to collect as much money as possible in order to raise the living standard of at least another small part of the under-privileged world. The largest part of the total comes from donations of money. Receipts for income tax are given if desired.

Let's give ourselves a challenge: by far the most common donation is \$2. Could each of us who thought of giving \$2, give \$5? Donations of \$100 are not uncommon. Why not make it \$200 or even \$500 this year?

All of us unhesitatingly buy luxuries for ourselves. Can we not match some of those luxuries in money for necessities for others?

A goal of \$4,000 has been set for this year's tea. Salt Spring Islanders are noted for their generosity. Can they work together and achieve that goal?

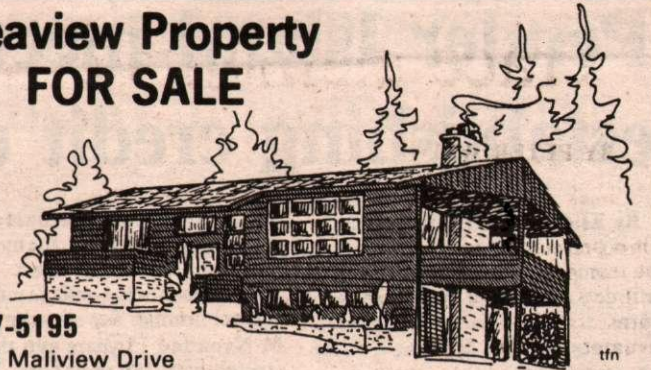

Brian Robertson was chairman of the meeting. He is president of the Mid-Island Co-operative at Nanaimo and president of the Vancouver Island Central Services Co-Op Association, which represents an amalgamation of all the co-ops on Vancouver Island.

Each co-op, be it a store or credit union, is autonomous. They are not part of a chain and every co-op exists to meet the unique needs of its individual members. There is no head office.

home-owned wholesaler from whom we purchase many of our supplies," said Robertson.

Robinson said 400 families is a logical number for starting a co-op. In Nanaimo 15 years ago the co-op started with 180 members. Today it has 11,000.

A Pender Island weekender said he belongs to a Vancouver co-op, where members give two hours per month of volunteer labour. There are two paid employees. Members can do 85% of their shopping there and they believe they save 15% in doing so. He felt there were enough people living on the Penders for a co-op.

Harry Down, president of Peninsula Co-op at Brentwood Bay and a director of B.C. Central Credit Union, said they had made a study and suggested a combination credit union and co-op might be a feasible way to go. Technical expertise and assistance is available

through B.C. Central Credit Union. To start out it is essential to keep the overhead costs down, which means using volunteer labour.

Ian MacPherson, a director of B.C. Central Credit Union, said there are thousands of co-ops operating in Canada, and each one serves a unique situation.

It was mentioned that at present the grocery market on southern Vancouver Island is very competitive and a survey showed that of four stores, including one co-op, prices were within one percent of each other overall.


One of the advantages to the co-op member is at the end of the fiscal year he receives his "patronage refund" in cash.

All speakers stressed that the success of the co-op depends on the commitment, enthusiasm and work of the members.

About 40 people attended the meeting.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty-Five Years Ago

The school assembly met at Mahon Hall with students from Grades 7 to 12 in attendance. School board chairman George Heinekey presented the school with a set of Encyclopedia Britannica in honour of the work for the school district carried out by Gavin Mouat.

Nominees for the honour of being May Queen on Salt Spring were introduced. The girls had been chosen from classes at the high school. From Grade 9, Elizabeth Beech and Nancy Reynolds were selected. Grade 10 nominees were Cathy Morrison and Susan Graham while Marguerite Gear and Penny Peterson would represent Grade 11. The Grade 12 girls chosen were Kathy Butt and Kristie Morrison. The May Queen and her two princesses would be chosen April 26.

The revenue statement for the Gulf Islands School District showed a total expenditure for 1959 of \$200,494 which included a surplus of \$1,543. The largest expenditure shown covered salaries for teachers, \$111,196.

The ladies of the South Salt Spring Women's Institute met at the home of Mrs. D. Slingsby. Each woman received a gladiola bulb to grow. When the flowers had bloomed in August, a competition to see which lady had the best bloom would be held.

Twenty Years Ago

The school board budget for the year had been set at \$349,688. The mill rate to raise money to meet the budget had been pegged at 23.92 mills, which was a 2.58 mill increase over the previous year. Local taxes had to cover 95% of the budget with the remaining five percent coming from the provincial government.

The awards night for the Salt Spring roller hockey league was held with league president Mike Byron as host. Guest speaker Bob Holloman spoke of his involvement in sports. Awards went to Fulford Cougars for winning the league championship. The team also took the Jack Roland Trophy. Various awards went to individual players as well.

The Spring Flower Show would again be put on by members of the Salt Spring Chrysanthemum Society and Garden Club. The annual event would be held at the beginning of May. Show secretary would be Mrs. A.K. Wilson and deadline for entry forms had been set for later in the month.

The Stripteasers had challenged the Lions Club to a roller hockey game. Captain of the Stripteasers, Don Lawley, reported that the challenge had been accepted. The game would be played in Fulford Hall.

The regular monthly meeting of H.M.S. Ganges IODE met with Regent Mrs. E.K. Parker in the chair. The ladies heard an urgent call for more paperback books which would be sent to Canadian servicemen serving in Germany.

Fifteen Years Ago

The new justice of the peace for Salt Spring would be Hugh Ross. He was sworn in by Judge M.F. Peiler. The judge had acted as justice of the peace in addition to his regular duties for several years.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that he had returned from a holiday. The Community Club had met while he was away with chairman Rev. Jack Dangerfield in charge. The members of the various committees had been sorted out.

The new fire chief would be Joe Sumislawski "with anyone who can breathe as his helpers."

The paving machine had started at the ferry terminal at Long Harbour. It travelled down Long Harbour Road to Ganges and was on its way to Fulford. By the time the highways of the island had received a layer of asphalt, the workers would have put down 70,000 tons of new roads at a cost of close to \$700,000.

Luke Harrison and his Harbour House cronies had collected \$71 to help pay for the heart machine which the Salt Spring Rotary Club was purchasing for Lady Minto Hospital.

The water at the Saturna school had been condemned by health authorities. School trustee for that island, Tom Davidson, reported that a purifying unit could be purchased for \$300.

The playing field at the elementary school in Ganges was in terrible shape when rain fell, complained a parent. Children had to play in several inches of water and mud. School trustees were not sure how to solve the problem.

The Fulford Hall Committee had decided to abandon the May Day festivities. Problems which had developed could not be solved and the group voted to end the event. May Day for many years had been the annual sports day and parade for the south Salt Spring community.

Ten Years Ago

Residents of Salt spring would be asked to approve an increase in the minimum lot size for watershed property from five to 10 acres. Ballots for the informal vote were to be tallied by the Community Planning Association and the results passed on to the Capital Regional director, George Heinekey.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the Lions Club members had completed the ceiling for the addition and the vestibule at the Community Hall. The work had been finished in time for the Lions Club to hold their anniversary dinner in the hall.

Competition between the Rod and Gun Clubs of Salt Spring and Galiano Islands was won by the Salt Spring group. Bernie Reynolds of Salt Spring won the calcutta while Lloyd Baines of Galiano took the singles high overall trophy. The shoot took place at the Salt Spring range.

The various mill rates for property taxes for Gulf Islanders were released by regional director George Heinekey. The school taxes would be based on a mill rate of 30.98 mills. The previous year the mill rate for school taxes had been 21.1 mills. In addition, the hospital mill rate would be 0.94 and the general property tax would be 10 mills.

Members of the Rotary Club at Salt Spring would be cleaning away debris and cutting grass and weeds at the cemeteries. Gavin Reynolds would be boss of the Ganges crew while Bob Akerman would be in charge of efforts at Fulford.

Five Years Ago

The water supply for the Campbell-Bennet Bay Water District on Mayne Island showed a high coliform count and residents were warned to boil the water before using it. Several children in the area had become ill and the cause was traced to the coliforms in the

drinking water.

Bargains were to be had at the Galiano Ladies Service Club Annual Rummage Sale held at the South End Community Hall. Rain did not deter people from attending the sale and carrying home choice bargains. Money collected would be used by the club to help meet the needs of groups or individuals of Galiano.

Pender Islanders were shedding weight at a new clinic set up by Susan Powell, the island nurse. The clinics were held in Dr. Sutherland's office each Thursday evening and up to 50 islanders had attended to learn how correct eating habits could help them lose pounds.

The holding lane area at the Vesuvius ferry terminal would be improved and expanded. Tenders for the work had been called for by the ferry corporation. Work was to be completed within eight weeks with minimal disruption to travellers or residents of the area.

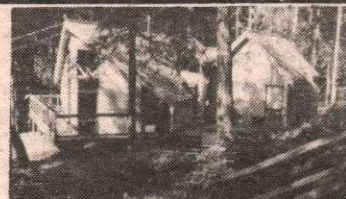
