

We cut down trees to harvest the apples

I do not suppose that anyone in his right mind—and I am leaving woman out of this on purpose as they seem to have a natural grasp on these matters—would chop down a perfectly good apple tree just to harvest the apples.

To be sure, none of us do this sort of thing with apple trees. But we do it with all manner of other green things: with lettuces, with cabbages, carrots, beans, radishes and so forth; and to top things off, we chuck the remains into the sea.

Now hold it a minute; this goes too far, you say, and it does. It goes rather far, as it were. We carefully grow and nurture these things in our gardens, or fields, with all manner of fertilizers, and so forth—my current favourite phrase—and upon maturity, harvest them; and so far, so good. But then the carrot tops go into the garbage, with the peels. The garbage goes to the dump, wherever that may be, but it is not our garden. So do the leftovers of the meal, if any.

The other leftovers, both liquid and solid, after we have extracted our sustenance from them, go into the sewage, and from there, in most cases, into the sea.

I do not know exactly how much we retain from a carrot, and for how long. The only thing that could stick to us for any appreciable length of time would be a few molecules of minerals; everything else is used and chucked out in short order.

Ninety-nine point nine percent of any carrot, perfectly good stuff with a lot of life left in it, goes either to the dump or the sea, and is then lost to us for a long time.

And every year we do the same thing all over again. We buy our fertilizers, put them in the ground, carefully grow and nurture our crops, and then chuck almost all of it, with the exception of a few lucky molecules, into the sea. This amounts to a massive transfer of fertility from the land to the sea, at

great cost.

Take nitrogen, for instance, which is a bit tricky to do because it is a gas and floats around in the air, rather freely and abundantly at that, as it makes up about 70 percent of our atmosphere. Consequently we breathe it in all the time, and right out again, without any of it sticking to us. The only ones who have mastered the trick of holding on to it are a bunch of bacteria, and they pass it on to plants, perhaps by breathing on the roots, which I doubt though, and the plants then assemble it with water and carbon to make simple protein, and complex proteins with the addition of sulphur.

This is what we eat. We break it down and catch the electromagnetic energy released in breakdown—and nothing else—courtesy of our mitochondria, and send the whole thing, nitrogen and all, reassembled into urea, which costs us a bit of electromagnetic energy too, on its way again. In the soil it is changed around again—by bacteria—taken up by plants, its electromagnetic charge boosted with solar energy—courtesy of the little chloroplasts—reassembled into protein, which we eat and extract some electromagnetic energy from, and so forth.

This whole thing is meant to be an increasing spiral of progressively constructive, dynamic processes, a

growing mass production of indestructible, energy-carrying vehicles, akin to reusable space shuttles which pick up free solar energy on every trip, to distribute this energy to all they meet, to charge up all life along the way—for heartbeats, thoughts, these words, and so forth—and to make ever more new shuttles, all at the same time.

I dare not think how many uncountable billions of these space shuttles, with a goodly amount of energy left in them, we junk in the garbage dump, or dump in the sea, and then turn around and buy new ones, chemically manufactured by us, at great expense in both cases, just to junk them again and again. It is an exhausting business for which we have to work very hard, and pay through the nose twice over, first for the acquisition of fertilizers, and then to junk the results at the dump or into the sea. The tragic part of it all is that this is not at all necessary.

How we were every conned into this exhausting enterprise of chopping down figurative apple trees, taking one bite from an apple and then chucking the whole thing into the sea, while running ourselves ragged to buy new fertilizers for the next crop of apple trees, shall remain a mystery, at least as far as I am concerned.

I am far more concerned with the nice and easy way, with growing our soil richer and healthier with every season; with encouraging the little life and the green life to do their best, for them and for me; and I am content to let the good garden guys and the bad garden guys have it out among themselves, for the good guys always win, otherwise the story of life, and this one, would have been over before it began.

This exponentially accelerating

cycle of life, generated by life and powered by the sun, is inexhaustible until we run out of sun, and according to our best figures, we have another five or six billion years to go. Until then, it will also be the basis of the gardening methods to follow in these pages, and I am sure that long before our sun runs out, we will figure out some other way to go.

The exercise room at B.C. Systems Corporation at 4000 Seymour Place is the site for the clinic on January 25. Time for that clinic is 9:30 am until 3 pm.

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
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
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“The school nurse sent my children home. She says they have lice. She's right, but I can't believe it. I am horrified and humiliated.”

Stop feeling guilty. A lice infestation does not mean your house is dirty or you've failed as a parent.

Lice easily move from one person to another. Close bodily contact spreads lice; so does sharing such personal articles as hats or combs, even riding on a school bus or sitting on toilet seats.

Fortunately, you won't have to burn clothes or pour kerosene over the kids to disinfect them. Your pharmacist can help you considerably with the tasks at hand.

Effective treatment is easy if a few important points are remembered.

There are three types of lice — head, body, and pubic. They can be seen moving on the skin or scalp. The nits, or eggs, are clearly visible on the hair shaft as immobile, gray, oval bodies. It is important to remove each and every nit.

The medication used for delousing (getting rid of lice) may be bought without a prescription in cream, lotion or shampoo.

Two such products available are **Kwellada®** and **GBH®**. Your local pharmacy carries them and other preparations.

Read the directions carefully and ask your pharmacist for help if there is any part of the instructions that you do not understand.

Be sure to check with your doctor or pharmacist before delousing young children because some preparations will cause toxic side effects in young children.

Medication used for delousing is for external use only. It may be harmful if swallowed and may cause irritation to eyes, mouth, and open wounds.

All clothes and bed linen should be laundered or dry cleaned and all combs and brushes disinfected to prevent reinfestation.

If your child is sent home from school because the child has lice, chances are other children in the class are also infested. You won't be the only parent your local pharmacist has helped this week. It happens at the start of every school year.

Aubrey Rundle-Woolcock, principal of the Pender Islands school for the past 12 years, retired from his position at the end of December.

The Parent-Teachers Club held a farewell party last month for him and his wife Irene at which over 50 teachers, friends and neighbours were present.

Leila Weisner from Salt Spring Island provided some exciting entertainment. She did a lengthy belly dance, especially for Aub and Irene, which was enjoyed by the audience as well as the guests of honour.

Weisner wore a magnificent costume, a combination of blue and gold, chiffon scarves and gold head scarf. Later she performed an intricate Tunisian sword dance which was very impressive.

Gordon Wallace spoke, giving a brief history of the present school. He said that when his daughter

Cindy was in Grade 5, there was a great push to send the Pender school pupils to the Mayne school. There were 26 pupils in the old Pender school.

Wallace and Don Fairweather, then the Pender school trustee, with others involved came up with the idea to marry a new school building to a new community hall, as the old Port Washington Hall was becoming inadequate for the expanding population. Thus was born the present school-community building, with funds raised by the community for its share of the complex.

Wallace praised the work Rundle-Woolcock had done in his professional capacity in the school and also his efforts through the years on the Pender Trek which resulted in money to build the tennis court.

Wallace continued by saying that he felt the young people under Rundle-Woolcock's guidance turned out to be pretty special

people and he introduced some Pender graduates, Alan Neil, Kari Amies, Randy Ross-Smith and Cindy Wallace, who were present at the event.

Aub Rundle-Woolcock replied by saying that 12 years ago when he began to teach in the Pender school there were 26 pupils and two classes.

Since that time the community and the school have grown.

As the school expanded the Grade 4 pupils of his first teaching year moved along with him right through Grade 9, and thus he got to know the pupils much better than in a larger school.

"The Pender pupils are the finest to be found in any school in the province," said the retiring principal.

Woolcock said that at the present time the school is fortunate to have a group of dedicated, hard-working parents and he urged them to cooperate with and assist his successor.

Finally, Woolcock urged the parents to cherish and respect their children and think about them in a positive manner.

When asked why he decided to retire so early, Woolcock said, "When one of the school pupils had to show me how to work the computer, and when one of my past pupils just recently moved to Pender Island in semi-retirement, I thought it was time for me to quit."

Jean Bradley, the primary teacher, presented Rundle-Woolcock with a large jar full of small notes of jobs to be done around the school and his home which he didn't have time to do previously.

The volunteers quickly extinguished the flames.

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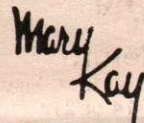

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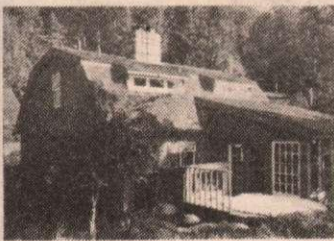

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

The Salt Spring Lions Club purchased a one and three-quarter acre lot on Lower Ganges Road for the senior citizens' housing project to be known as Pioneer Village. The property fronted the highway and had a view of the harbour.

A decision by Magistrate Ashby to commit Frank Jones to trial had been made. Jones was charged with criminal negligence as a result of a traffic accident on Fulford-Ganges Road in July which ended with the death of Victor Sholes. Trial date had been set for March.

The building debt of the Salt Spring Centennial Library had been reduced to \$1,400. W.M. Mouat told a meeting of the library board of directors. The reduction had resulted from money collected on the island. Membership included 294 adults and 550 children. There were 6,000 books on the shelves and borrowers had read 10,000 books the previous year.

December ended with a record rainfall, 3.48 inches, reported Ganges weather-watcher Howard Carlin. The rain brought the total precipitation for the month to 7.52 inches which also included a record snowfall of 35.5 inches. High and low temperatures reached 56 degrees and dipped to six. There were 19 days of freezing temperatures, he added.

Work on the new government building for the Gulf Islands began. The structure would be on Lower Ganges Road on Salt Spring and would cost an estimated \$250,000. All government services would be centralized in it when it was completed.

The newspaper took its time getting there but it did get there. Ken Byron reported from Germany that he had received the newspaper which took two years to arrive. He was serving with the Canadian army in Europe.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Salt Spring Rotary Club members were gathering money to purchase a heart machine for Lady Minto Hospital. The fund-raising drive was the first project of the newly organized club. President Bob Blundell said the fund had reached 80% of the target.

The population of Salt Spring could reach a half million people, architect Hank Schubart told a public meeting. The community planning association called a meeting to find out what residents wanted in a community plan. Schubart explained that proper planning would result in a population which the island could support. The association was also circulating a questionnaire to determine what residents wanted and expected of a community plan.

The Crofton mill was central to a controversy about wood chips polluting Stuart Channel. A fisherman told of bringing up chips in his net from the bottom. Residents of Vesuvius on Salt Spring complained of chips littering

the beaches. Management spokesman for the mill said that there was money lost when the chips fell into the water.

The shots were fired at the oil barge and when Edward Newman appeared in court, he was fined \$250 and spent a day in jail for the incident. He told the judge that the barge had come close to his fishing boat in Sansum Narrows and had cut his pig lines. He fired to scare the boat away, he said.

The Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce opened for business in Ganges. It was the second bank on Salt Spring. The bank would be doing business in the Trading Co. block where the meat market had been.

The couple were playing cribbage and when the cards had been dealt and cut, William Cantrill had a 29 hand. He and his wife were playing the game in their Fernwood home on Salt Spring. Cantrill added that it was the first such hand he had had in 30 years of playing the game.

Ten Years Ago

Fire destroyed the Vesuvius Hotel on Salt Spring but no one was injured in the blaze. X-Kalay, which was occupying the premises, had 13 people staying there. The hotel had been built before the turn of the century by the Bittancourts. It had been a general store and a restaurant as well as a hotel over the years.

The Gulf Islands School Board approved the terms of reference for a co-ordinator to be hired to look at schools in the Outer Islands. The person would assess the needs of the schools and advise the trustees on the merits as well as costs of changes.

The Pender CARE Tree raised \$7,602. George, 88, and Edith Pearson, 80, would be turning the project over to the Pender Lions Club for future years. Pearson noted that there were 24 memorial white lights as well as 593 donation lights on the tree.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the members of the Lions Club of that island took 26 youngsters to Victoria to see a play by Hans Christian Anderson. The children enjoyed the show and the Lions enjoyed the children's enjoyment.

The chairman of the Gulf Islands School Board would be Charles Baltzer again. He was selected unanimously. At the Capital Region, Jim Campbell of Saturna was elected chairman of the CRD over opposition by Alf Hood of Victoria. Hood was named acting chairman.

A streaker ran along Beaver Point

Road in the snow. RCMP began a search of the area because they thought he might have collapsed and died of exposure. The streaker was found on a boat at Fulford none the worse for wear except for scratches on his feet. Police blamed the incident on intoxication.

The first baby of the Gulf Islands for the new year was born on January 3 at Lady Minto Hospital. Clinton Leo was the 5 lb., 14 oz. son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Helfrich.

Five Years Ago

There would be no building, health or occupancy permits issued in Ganges until at least February 6. Yvette Valcourt presented a motion to the Capital Region to that effect and it passed. Jim Campbell of Saturna, chairman of the CRD, said the directors had passed the motion because it "meant nothing".

Golf and tennis balls littered the Galiano property between Bluff Road and Active Pass. Owner Ollie Garner noted that the property is about two miles from the golf course. He speculated that ravens brought the trophies, mistaking them for eggs.

The Parks and Recreation Commission of Salt Spring had broken a Capital Region bylaw by electing members to their midst. Grant McRadu told the commission that the CRD bylaws did not allow for elections to such bodies. The membership would have to be recommended by the Salt Spring director and approved by the board, he explained.

The first baby born at Lady Minto Hospital for the year waited until January 10 to arrive. Kelly Regen weighed in at 8 lbs., 3 oz. Parents were Donna and Del Regen.

The directors of the Duncan and District Credit Union would be holding a meeting for members on Salt Spring to discuss the proposed move of the branch from the Valcourt Centre to the village. Opposition to the move had been organized by Bill Delmonico who said that members who did not like the proposal might form their own credit union unless the directors listened to them.

The deputy minister of lands, parks and housing, Tom Lee, would come to Salt Spring to meet with people involved with Mouat Park. Parks and Recreation Commission chairman Glenn Woodley had set up the meeting at the request of Lee. Woodley said the ministry was interested in finding out what islanders wanted done with the park.

a) adds a new zoning classification "Comprehensive Development (2) Zone", "CD(2)", which provides for uses such as hotels, including licensed public houses, motels or other transient accommodation, restaurants, marinas, rentals, and retail uses and accessory residential use. The by-law also establishes regulations regarding building height, setbacks and site coverage for the new zone. It also establishes a site density for commercial accommodation use of 700 m² (7,500 ft.²) floor area for any parcel in the Comprehensive Development (2) Zone. Nevertheless the by-law also permits one additional accommodation unit for each 0.04 ha (1/10 acre) the parcel exceeds 0.4 ha (1 acre) in area;
b) changes the zoning classification of Lot 1, Plan 31313, Section 3, Range 4 East, North Salt Spring and a portion of the Westerly 15 chains of Fractional Section 3 and Section 4, Range 4 East, North Salt Spring Island, except that part thereof included within the boundaries of Plans 11177, 21925, 27785 and Plan 31313 from the Industrial 1 Zone (I1) to the Comprehensive Development (2) Zone, CD(2), and from the Agriculture 1 Zone (A1) to the Comprehensive Development (2) Zone CD(2), and from the Industrial 1 Zone (I1), to the Agriculture 1 Zone (A1) as shown on the plan attached to the by-law;
c) designates the land described above as a Development Permit Area pursuant to Section 717(3) of the Municipal Act.
2. Proposed By-law No. 116 cited as "Zoning By-law No. 2, Salt Spring Island, 1978, Amendment By-law No. 20, 1984"
a) amends Section 2.1 to provide a new definition of "transient accommodation".

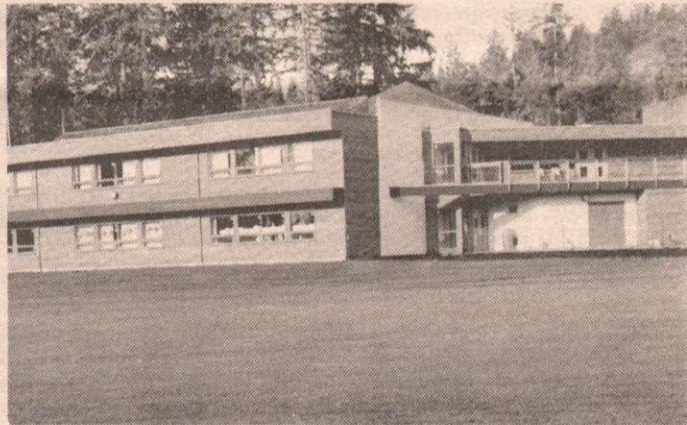
