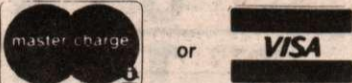

# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

## Twenty Years Ago

The Gulf Islands Pioneer Village Society was incorporated by the Salt Spring Lions Club. Members met for dinner to hear Jake Barker explain the proposal to raise \$12,000 to help pay for the housing project. Club president Walter Mailey told the guests that the project was not an "old-age housing project" but homes for senior citizens.

A committee would be formed in Ganges to plan further action on construction of a sewer. Charles Horel said that the Chamber of Commerce may take control of the committee. It would engage an engineer to survey the area and detail costs. The committee also would look at how the system would be administered when completed. The engineer's study was expected to cost \$1,200.

Oysters from the shores of Salt Spring were being harvested and concerns were being expressed that the harvest was too great. While the practice of harvesting oysters was legal, the size of the catch worried some people. Letters sent to the fisheries department called for a limit to the size of the harvest.

The Salt Spring Seals took to the hardwood floor against the Duncan Hoopsters and won 53-41. Top scorer for the island basketball team was Roy Lee who sank 12 points and made key defensive moves. Ray Simard was the second highest scorer for the home side with nine points. The two teams would play a rematch in Duncan later in the month.

For 50 years, the Canadian Girls in Training had been in operation on Salt Spring and the current leader, Miss Corbett, put out a call for former members and leaders to join the group for an anniversary party.

## Fifteen Years Ago

Junk littered the roadsides of Walker Hook Road on Salt Spring and the Chamber of Commerce was seeking a solution. A resident of the area spoke out against the derelict vehicles, abandoned refrigerators and other junk along the road. Chairman Gavin Reynolds pointed out that littering carried a \$500 fine but if the junk were on private property, the land owner had to get rid of it.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the road crew had been busy and "all those familiar holes in the road were plugged." Uncle Art Ralph was to have been the Saturna reporter for the week but had been too busy as sidewalk superintendent.

The Ladies' Auxilliary to the Royal Canadian Legion at Salt Spring sponsored the 12th annual pancake race in Ganges and David Hastie of the Bank of Montreal won the international event. The women's open went to Penny Quesnel while Jim Spencer was first in the men's open. Judges were Jack Lamb, A. Butler-Cole and Peter Bingham. Jack Smith was the starter.

January had been a dry month, reported Ganges weather-watcher Howard Carlin. A total of 5.97 inches of precipitation fell including 2.5 inches of snow. The temperature reached a high of 55 degrees and dipped to 28 degrees. The year before saw 5.31 inches of precipitation and a temperature range from 51 to 13 degrees.

## Ten Years Ago

The proposed subdivision bylaw for Salt Spring Island met with

unanimous approval at a meeting called to discuss the matter. Bob McWhirter had been chairman of the bylaw committee which had worked for a year to draft the bylaw. A suggested change was to include agricultural land in the provisions. Several suggestions were to zone farmland appropriately when and if it were to be taken from the agricultural reserve. The bylaw went to the Capital Region for final approval.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that Nick Tuele of the Greater Victoria Art Gallery brought a display of Eskimo art to the school. He explained the art with the aid of slides and the display was enjoyed not only by the children but also by the adults who had attended.

Gulf Islands weather-watchers reported on conditions so far in the year. At Galiano, Robert Aston had measured 21 inches of snow and a low temperature of 25 degrees. Howard Carlin of Salt Spring reported 19 inches of snow and a low of 23 degrees. On Mayne, Walter Hunt-Sowrey found 14.9 inches of snow and a low temperature of 25 degrees.

Centennial Park in Ganges would be the responsibility of the Recreation Commission. Chairman of the Centennial Park Society, Peter Bingham, officially turned the park over to the commission. The society had been formed in 1966 to create the park as the centennial project for Salt Spring.

## Five Years Ago

The Pollution Control Board approved the Ganges sewer project

but ordered an extension of the outfall pipe by 2,000 metres (6,560 feet) further down Ganges Harbour to a point south of Welbury Point. The decision came 2½ months after the marathon 38-hour meeting held at Salt Spring to discuss the issue.

Mouat Park in Ganges could be used as a site for the proposed recreation complex, Parks and Recreation Commission chairman Glenn Woodley reported. The Islands Trust had approved rezoning of the site and the Capital Region had approved the scheme. The ministry of lands, parks and housing would turn the site over to the CRD and rezoning would follow a referendum in the fall, Woodley said.

The Silver Maynes held a regular meeting before getting down to the real business at hand: a Valentine Box Social. Al Wardle, president of the group, reminded the meeting that garden lots were available for a rental charge of \$10 but applications had to be in before the beginning of March.

The Gulf Islands School Board will seek more information on full-spectrum lighting before testing the system in classrooms. Strick Aust had brought a request from parents to the school board meeting to have the lights tested.

The Women's Institute on Pender elected a new slate of officers. Myrtle MacGregor would be president with Ellen Corbett as vice-president; Hattie Zarek, secretary; Phyl Ireland, treasurer; and Elizabeth Campbell, courtesy secretary.

## 100th anniversary marked

A memorial service was held Friday at Salt Spring Island to mark the 100th anniversary of the arrival here of Thomas William and Jane Manson Mouat.

The lives of early family members were recalled and tributes paid to them with a special tribute to Jane Manson Mouat, who was known as Grannie Mouat to early islanders.

Seventy-five grandchildren, great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren gathered at Ganges United Church for the occasion. Also present was Mrs. Jessie Mouat Toynbee, 88, the only surviving child of Thomas and Jane Mouat.

Following lunch in the church hall, a private family service of remembrance and thanksgiving was held. Rev. Al Skinner and Rev. John Bailey conducted the service while Mae George was the organist.

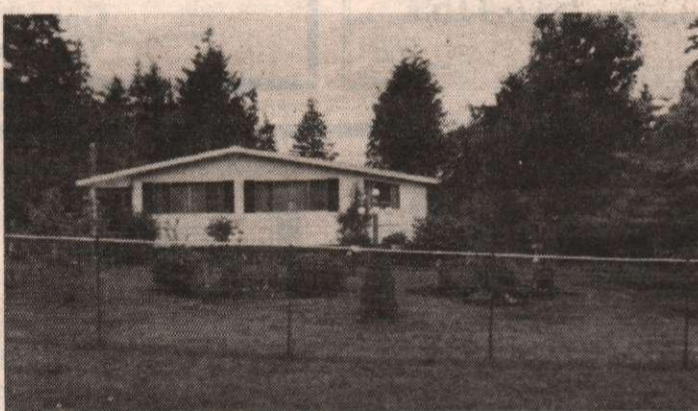

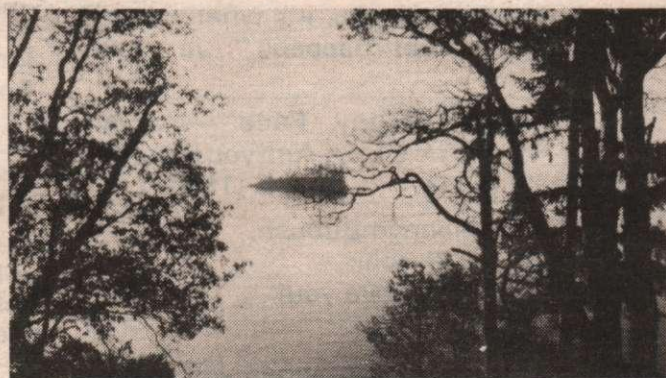

# Wharf condition checked

The wharf at Welbury Bay on Salt Spring is in bad repair and the ministry of lands, parks and housing

wants to know how bad it is.

A works crew from Inter-Island Piledriving has removed some of the timber of the wharf to test its condition. They removed portions of the wharf and some of the dolphins.

The wharf belongs to the crown and has for several years been in disrepair. It is where the barge containing the outfall pipe for the Ganges sewer was tied when the pipe was set on fire by arsonists in 1981.

Firemen had a difficult task reaching the barge across the crumbling deck of the wharf. It had been dismantled near the shore to stop people from using it.

If the damage is not repairable, said Doug McColl of the ministry of lands, the structure will be removed.

The ministry is the agency from which foreshore leases such as the ones in Welbury Bay are obtained.

B.C. Ferries holds a ferry reserve at the northeast corner of the bay and there is a private moorage granted for the area as well.

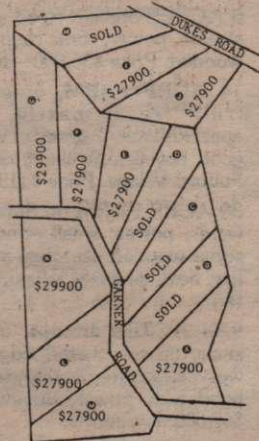

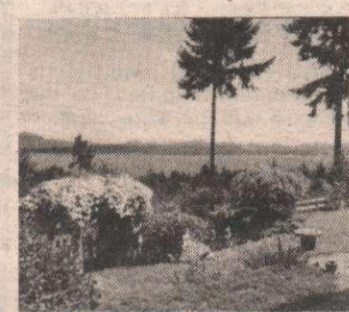

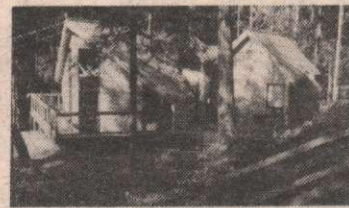

# Why use poisons when interplanting does the trick

How would you like to control garden pests with high-quality organic fertilizers? Consider, for example, my favourite and most relentless carnivorous pesticide, the little black hunting spiders. These tiny assassins do not make webs, they hunt instead, and mercilessly so.

We encourage swarming hordes of them, at a rate of thousands to the square metre, simply by providing a dense mulch of sheared weeds or clover. Aside from its moisture-retaining cover, it provides a haven for those armies of tireless hunters. The mulch, of course, adds fertilizers, minerals and organic substance to the soil with its decay as well.

But those spiders, being very small and very hungry, eat as much as they possibly can, and consequently have to go to the bathroom, in the garden, all the time. Garden pests are converted to spider manure in very short order, and eventually, upon their demise, the spiders contribute their very substance as well.

So the mulch, spider manure and spider substance are all turned into high-quality organic fertilizer in the end. In this light then, one would want as many pests, and as many spiders, as possible; and it sure beats buying poisons, any way you look at it. The beauty of it all is that it does not cost any money at all. The spiders come and proliferate all on their own, gladly and enthusiastically; there is no equipment involved; the labour of placing the mulch is minimal, and has its own benefits; the spiders are 99.9% effective; and the whole thing is as

paper wasps are gourmet connoisseurs of cabbage worm, and when they cannot have cabbage worm, or tent caterpillar, they take anything else they can get their mandibles on. Then there are all kinds of other wasps, most of them minuscule, and armies of carnivorous flies of all sizes, numerous midges and gnats, all with voracious appetites for worms, grubs, larvae, caterpillars and what have you. All are merciless, full-time pesticides, pollinators and contributors of fertilizers and organic substance to boot.

All we need to do to ensure their continuous presence in our gardens is to grow some herbs, some food and some green manures. In their reproductive cycles, when the female lays her eggs in caterpillars and larvae, she relies on floral nectars for her sustenance. Therefore she will not stray far from her food supply.

As most of them are tiny things, with an even tinier proboscis, shallow, easily accessible blossoms are her only source of nectar. All the umbels like parsley, fennel, dill, angelica, coriander, Queen Anne's lace, among many others, and the compositae, the daisies, yarrows, and sunflowers, are excellent sources of nectar for all of these beneficial insects.

Another sunflower, the Jerusalem artichoke, provides extra floral nectar, easily accessible nectar on leaves and stems, in addition to its floral nectar. So do cherries and buckwheat. Extra floral nectars are particularly valuable for their constant availability over a long period of time, a dependable mainstay for a thriving population of beneficial insects.

Of course, the Jerusalem artichoke is good food for us as well, and buckwheat is a source of honey, green manure, and a deep soil conditioner all at the same time too; and Jerusalem artichokes and buckwheat can be interplanted to great advantage as well. Due to their aggressive nature, Jerusalem artichokes are best planted at the perimeter of the garden with an intervening walkway to separate them from the garden, and a couple of cherry trees near the garden would help too.

## Farming and Gardening

Blackberries have also been found to be excellent hosts to beneficial insects and particularly to insects preying on scale. Herbs can go anyplace at all, and a central herb garden in the small garden, or around the perimeter of the larger garden, will assure the vital availability of nectar to the beneficial insects. In the very large garden, until we find out more about the travelling range of these insects, a permanent herb or artichoke bed at intervals of 100 feet should do the trick.

Permanent herb beds are particularly effective since blooming parsley, inordinately beloved by dancing clouds of insects, can be left to bloom in its second year, and to sow itself for a never-ending stand of parsley. Thus the provision of a haven for countless hordes of beneficial insects provides us too with herbs, food, green manures, and a host of other benefits all at the same time, at minimal, or no cost to ourselves.

Why we ever went down the poison road shall, mercifully, remain a dark mystery to me. Interplanting is the last and remaining step towards a pest and disease-free garden. Scientific tests have now demonstrated conclusively that the mere presence of a buffer crop reduces pest and disease infestations by fully one half.

Cabbages surrounded by clover, for instance, or tomatoes by bush beans, among many other combinations, prevents the spread of problems simply by interposing a different medium. It is simply that a cabbage aphid, worm or disease spore perishes in the clover when attempting to travel to another cabbage. It also provides a moisture-retentive ground cover, high nitrogen green manure, food in the case of beans, also a startling increase in yield; a cover for spiders, and organic content to the soil.

Monocrops on bare ground are an open invitation to disaster, and it should not surprise us when it comes. It is a matter of dynamics again. Life-positive dynamics benefit all life in an ever-increasing spiral of life; and life-negative dynamics do the opposite thing, just as dependably. It works; there is no doubt about it; we have managed only about half of what is suggested

here; lots of spiders, some wasps, some blackberries, only half-decent soil, some interplanting of mostly weeds, some parsley and some dill, but we can count our pests on the fingers of our hands, and we are completely disease free.

Of course, as soon as any poisons are introduced into this fabric of life, the whole thing collapses catastrophically, and inevitably.
