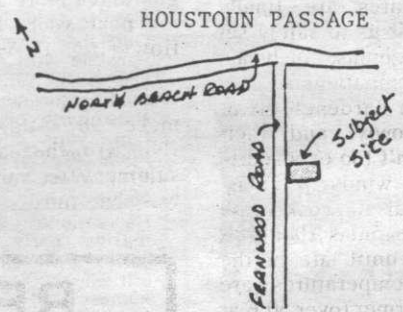

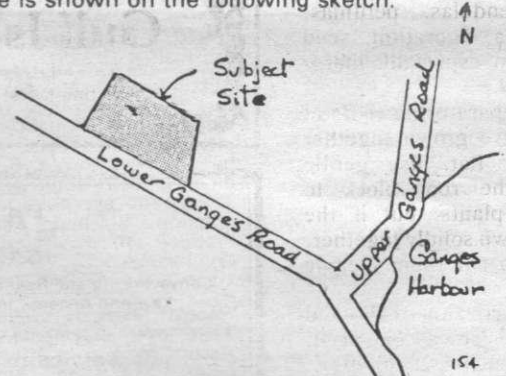

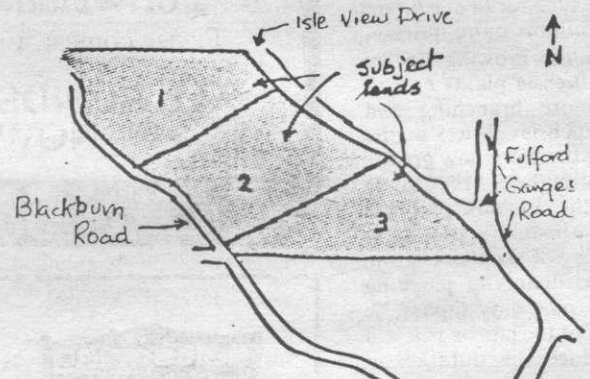

# Re-seeding could be required to compensate for poor spring

The ambitious gardeners who seeded out peas and sweet peas (and several other seeds, for that matter) early have lost some due to rot. They've also lost their patience.

Re-seeding is needed to compensate for the slow, poor germination and, if the weather holds up, all other seeding can go on, full speed ahead. It's time for sowing lettuce, beets, radishes (the second crop), a late crop of broad beans, midseason potato crops (many first plantings have rotted in the soil), carrots and a host of others.

Don't bother to sow out basil, squash, cucumbers, melons or pumpkins until the end of May or early June because it's far too cold and failure is inevitable. Previously-started tomato plants can now be transplanted out in a full sun position.

Our temperatures are finally warm enough for us to safely set out fibrous begonias, fuchsias, geraniums and impatiens as long as they've been hardened off or acclimatized slowly, and their planting spot isn't too exposed to any cold, raw winds. Zinnias, salvia, coleus, balsam, cockscomb and tuberous begonias shouldn't be planted out until late in the month when temperatures are considerably warmer (over 50 F at night).

Almost all of your annuals should have their growing tips pinched out just after planting, to generate greater bushiness and more abundance, quality blooms. Pinching out makes a world of difference with stocks, snapdragons, calendulas, petunias, phlox, verbena, ageratum, seed geraniums and especially marguerites.

When you separate the roots of plants that have grown together in a pack or flat, use gentle traction on the root block to separate the plants, but if the roots have grown solidly together, use a knife to cut them cleanly apart.

Commence fertilizing at the end of May and use a balanced, soluble fertilizer like 20-20-20.

With zonal or ivy-leaved geraniums, you should endeavour to pinch out the first flower head or cluster, to stimulate more branching and active growth. There will still be four months of abundance, joyous blooming ahead, so do it now.

Be careful to avoid overwatering as this can cause rot to set in and can kill geraniums quite quickly.

Pinch out the growing tips of your young fuchsia plants now to encourage more branching and blooming. Fuchsias flower at the leaf axils, so the more new growth you can stimulate, the more bounteous the blooms will be. One caution, though, is that there will be a delay of six weeks from when you've done the pinching until the new blossoms appear, so don't pinch out too late or you will severely reduce the duration of the blooming season.

If you want to have gladiolus blooming right up until fall frosts arrive, continue planting them every two weeks through May and all of June.

Those bulbs that have finished flowering can have the spent blooms and seed pods removed, but don't pull or tear out the whole flower stalk, or the leaves, as this may provide entry for rots, and will also weaken the plant, because it's now turning its

energies to make next year's blooms and fatten up that bulb.

Let the green foliage stay until it starts to yellow, and then you can mow it down or tie the floppy leaves up into a knot to tidy up the bed. If you have to move or relocate the bulbs, try to take along as many of the roots as you can; they are after all, still growing.

After the spring-flowering shrubs have finished blooming, prune them back to stimulate more new growth this season and guarantee more abundant blooms for next year. Shrubs such as flowering currant, flowering quince (japonica bush), forsythia and early-blooming spireas will make 1987's flower buds on the 1986 growth that develops this summer, so prune them back at least one third.

Keep a watchful eye on your roses to enable swift control of aphids and fungal attack. The best means of controlling powdery mildew and black spot is to conduct preventative sprayings every two weeks with garden sulphur (or phaltan, funginex or benomyl) solutions on those plants you know to be susceptible. Control of powdery mildew is difficult once it has entered and infected the leaves, because it then requires a systematic fungicide (benomyl) to combat its advance.

With this cold, wet weather we've had, it's bound to be a problem early this year. If you have a problem with rust, sanitation and lime sulphur are needed. Clean up and burn all leaves in the fall, especially, then spray the bare stems with a 1:9, lime sulphur: water solution.


The arrival of May has finally brought us temperatures and weather that we can honestly term spring-like. The long delays caused by the poor weather in April make this May a frantic month in the garden. Oh, aren't we lucky?

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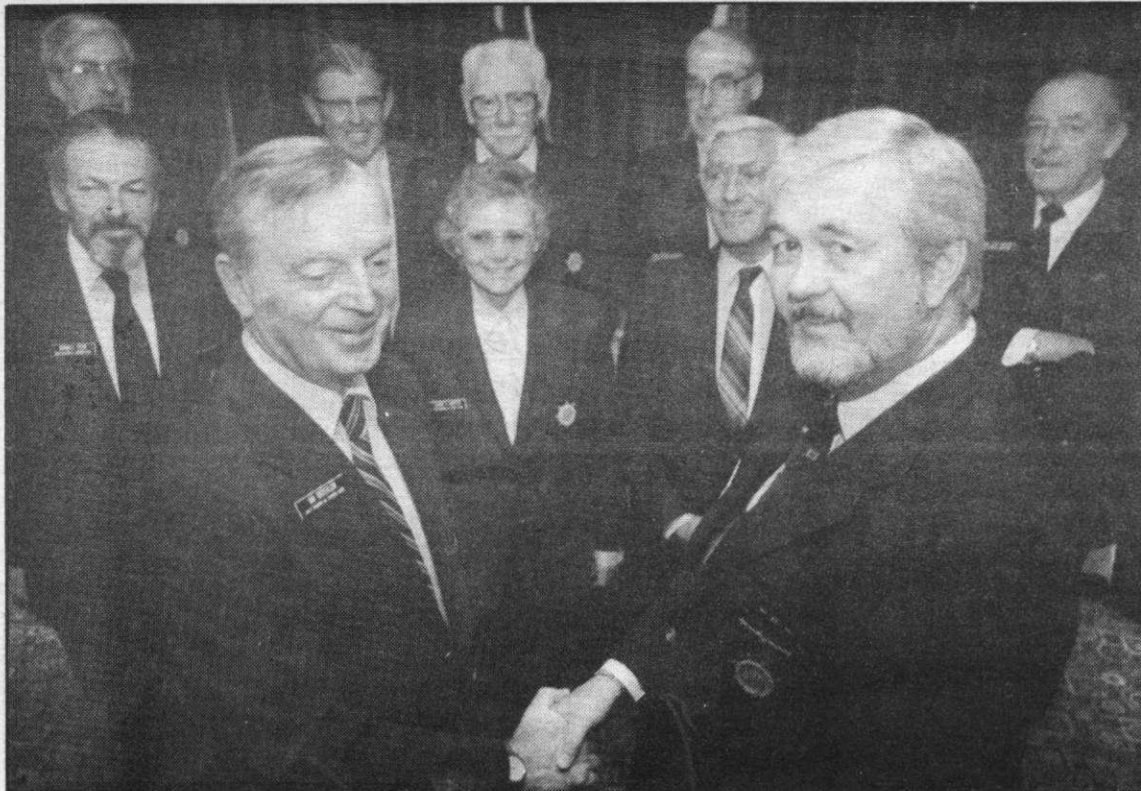

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# Opening showcases brilliance of three island artists

The ikon is a small, intensely-designed image which is considered to carry an aura of holiness with it. Such seemed to be the images we saw on Friday at the opening of Stewart Brands' art show at the Dandelion Gallery.

These little paintings (mostly of Galiano), about the size of a novel are painted in the "Flemish manner", which involves mixing oil paint and varnish at high temperatures. This was invented by Van Eyck (15th century) for painting sacred works, and the effect is one of great brilliance in even the smallest brush strokes, which gives the impression of a magic world, more real than ours.

Even a picture of a gloomy day over Active Pass shows this quality, for through the heavy clouds the sun is breaking — not directly visible, but casting a strong reflection in the distant water. This is a typical Gulf Islands scene, and yet Stewart is the only artist I know who has captured the moment properly.

Of course, this kind of painting is most at home with exquisite portraits of intimate scenes — a single tree in blossom, or a dilapidated shack. It is a tribute to Stewart's genius that he can make even a shack look magical.

Stewart was trained as an apprentice by various artists, notably A. J. Casson of the Group of Seven. He has been living a hand-to-mouth existence on the island for many years, living sometimes in a hut, sometimes in a tent. This show marks his inauguration into the Dandelion Gallery, so at last he seems to have achieved the recognition he deserves. He turns each little corner of the island into a gem.

Also at the same show was stained glass by Kurt Zuwicki and furniture by Paul Piotrowski. The glass was of great interest, as it was mostly opaque and free-standing, giving the impression of tiles or square dinner-plates; and it was brilliantly decorated with abstract designs giving the effect of "shafts of colour in the darkness." Kurt moved to the island quite recently (he is originally from Berlin) but shows much promise of being one of our greater talents.

Paul's furniture was a surprise. No pine-wood garden chairs here, but elegant polished mahogany. The artistry of it quite put to shame anything to be seen in the finest city furniture stores. I had known that Paul was tinkering away at Ganner Drive with some project to do with furniture, but I never expected this.

### Birth Day

In England and most other countries, midwifery is recognized as a distinct profession. Here in Canada, however, the whole process of birth is given over to doctors, whose real business is curing the sick. Mothers disgusted with the barbaric practices in hospitals (mostly for convenience and scheduling) have increasingly chosen to give birth at home, assisted by midwives who, however, are not legally recognized. And here our story begins.

On Sunday, a talk and discussion was held by Gloria Lemay, accompanied by Mary Sullivan, two midwives about to stand trial in Vancouver on May

12, (just after Mother's Day) in what promises to be one of the major court cases in B.C. history. The ban on publication of stories relating to the case was only lifted on Monday — so you read it first in *Driftwood*.

The charges (criminal negligence and practicing medicine without a licence) relate to a tragedy that occurred precisely a year ago, when these midwives assisted at a birth in which a rare emergency called Shoulder Dystocia resulted in the suffocation of the baby. Although a similar death had occurred six months earlier at Grace Hospital, and although the parents in the new case did not wish to complain, Gloria and Mary were charged under the Criminal Code.

Gloria herself has had an interesting life. She started out as a stockbroker, then owned a clothing store. It was the experience of giving birth that made her realize how regimented the process had become; and yet she was a businesswoman accustomed to making her own decisions and having them carried out. From that time forward she felt her destiny was to help women achieve a sensible, decent and humane approach to birth, and to this she dedicated herself.

The upcoming court battle is important, because it could greatly advance or retard the practise of midwifery, especially as a jury in Ontario has already recommended legalization. Gloria stresses that the most important element in a midwife is not scientific learning (although this is necessary) but extensive personal experience with birth. This trial will cost a quarter of a million dollars of public money, which could be spent on legalizing midwifery.

### Garden Club

Also that afternoon, the Garden Club held its spring plant sale and bake sale. This was so successful that the numerous things for sale sold out very quickly. Interesting among these were a considerable selection of herbs (such as southernwood and chives), and on

the goodies table were chocolate medallions, as well as such delicious treats as peanut butter cookies.

The next Garden Club meeting will be on May 14, when Douglas Hosgood of the Vancouver Rose Society will discuss roses.

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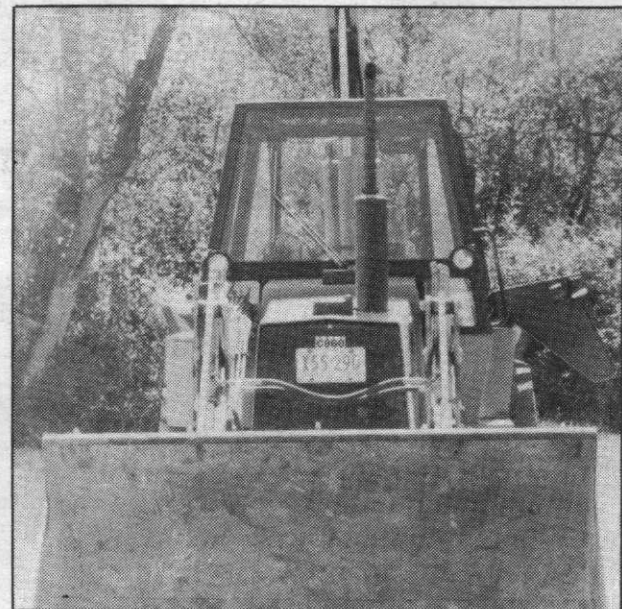

# Mexican medical aid program had beginnings on Salt Spring

A Mexican aid project born on Salt Spring has expanded beyond its original expectations.

The project is tuberculosis (TB) treatment for people living in and around Altamerano, Mexico. Born through seed money donated from the annual World Development Tea staged by women involved with Salt Spring's church groups, it has since received support from the *Save The Children Fund of B.C.*, the Canadian International Development Association (CIDA), the Mexican government and a world-recognized expert in the field of TB control.

"That's all happened because of Salt Spring," says Dr. Stephen Gray, a Vancouver physician in the public health field who is closely associated with the Mexican project. Last week, he visited Salt Spring to give a project progress report to local residents.

Gray said the project first began through conversations between the *Save The Children Fund* and Salt Spring residents eager to improve social conditions in the Third World. Discussions soon drew in Gray, whose affiliation with UBC's department of health care brought him into contact with its TB experts.

One of those experts is Dr. Stephen Grzybowski, an internationally-respected authority on TB who immediately lent his backing to the Mexican program. With that support, CIDA soon became involved.

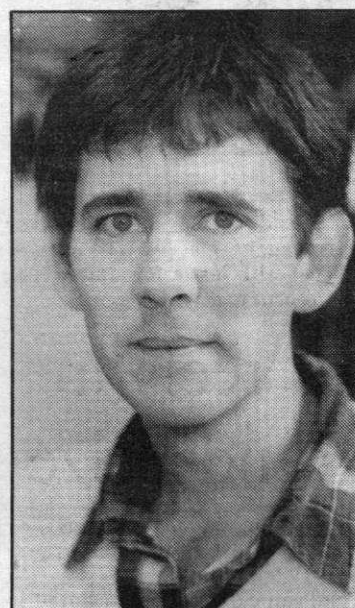
Gray said the initial approach suggested for a TB control program was to purchase a truck and X-ray machinery to screen people living in the Altamerano area. That idea called for a heavy monetary investment, Gray said, so he proposed a simpler system of testing only those people who were coughing. They were asked to cough on slides and, if tests showed they carried infectious TB, the people were treated.

Along with saving money, Gray said, the approach serves the purpose of training Mexican physicians to deal with disease with the limited resources they may have on hand.

"It (the project) has turned into a TB program for small hospitals," he told *Driftwood*. "The issue is not just to give these people trucks and machines, but to provide them with the ability to do things. We don't want to just throw money into a pot — we want to give them the ability to run a program by themselves."

He added: "Instead of taking the glamorous approach of flying in supplies by helicopters, we're building an infrastructure to give the Mexicans the ability to deal with their problems. If we can teach them organized approaches to illness, hopefully it will rub off in other areas. For instance, we don't know if this program will see a decline in TB, but it will give them the ability to better deal with that and other diseases."

The Mexican government, he added, is excited about the progress made by the project and is considering using it as a model for similar community health care schemes around the country. To

Gray, that may be the most important result of the project.

"It's a good quality aid program," he said, "geared to people and a co-operative approach."

Salt Spring residents, he added, should feel good about how

their backing of a relatively small project has turned into a far-reaching program. He noted that the World Development Tea, which recently raised \$2,715 for projects, last year sent the Altamerano program \$2,500. Tied in with that was a local *Save The Children Fund* that has also identified Altamerano as a worthy project for support.

"From the relatively small amount of money raised here, we've been able to build up and run a program that should now have a large impact on TB," he said.

Along with informing people about the program's progress, Gray said the purpose of his visit was to increase awareness of the causes of TB in the project area. Much of it is suffered by refugees fleeing repression in Guatemala, he said, where years of military rule has meant repression of the populace.

The Altamerano area, he said, was once crowded with those refugees and in dire need of a TB control program. The refugee camps are now being moved, he said, and the TB program will concentrate more and more on the area's indigenous people.

Meanwhile, the final seven days of the derby saw weekly prizes handed out to three anglers.

Jennifer Butterworth of Duncan won a trophy and two nights' accommodation for two people at Blue Gables for a three-pound, nine-ounce cutthroat pulled in at St. Mary Lake on April 28.

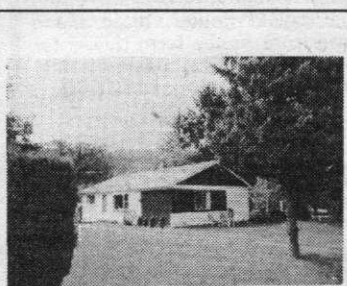

## Play on racial tensions slated for Salt Spring

An evocative, funny and moving examination of the race relations issue will be staged on Salt Spring this Friday, May 9.

*Skin*, set for the Activity Centre at 8 pm, is a presentation by the Green Thumb Theatre for Young People and the company's artistic director and co-founder, Dennis Foon.

Island residents Roma and Jeremy Lake, who first saw *Skin* at a conference for teachers of English as an additional language last March, say the production grew out of interviews Foon held with youth, educators and specialists in race relations.

Material from those sessions were used with actors in a series of workshops and improvisations to develop the material that now forms the basis of the play.

"It its presentation of the problems faced by teenagers who

are members of visible minorities," the Lakes say, "*Skin* juxtaposes the stories of three young people and reveals the pressures they each face in their lives."

The play presents Phiroze Meta, who was born in Bombay and moved to Canada when she was four; Karen Williams, a native Canadian from Lillooet; and Tuan Hung Wong, a Vietnamese refugee. The characters, played by members of visible minorities, are realistic and convincing.

• Tommy Douglas, retiring leader of the New Democratic Party, will be the guest speaker at the annual dinner meeting of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce later this week. As MP for Nanaimo-Cowichan-the Islands, Douglas will discuss the future of the Canadian economy and the prospects for the islands in particular.

• Transport Minister Jack Davis announced last week a staggering rate hike of nearly 400 per cent in B.C. Ferry fares for Gulf Island residents travelling to Vancouver Island. Effective June 1, a Salt Spring couple driving to Victoria will pay \$9 for the return trip as opposed to the present rate of \$2.50. It will cost an Outer Island couple travelling to Vancouver Island \$12.80 compared to \$3.70 now.

While rates are going up throughout the province, Gulf Islanders will be hardest hit by the rate increases since the provincial government has also done away with commuter tickets. The government also announced that there will be a further increase within the next two years.

### Five years ago

The *Vesuvius Queen* will be transferred to the Pender Island run.

A spokesman for the ferry corporation explained that the

• The Gulf Islands School Board is considering moving the Grade 7 class out of Fernwood School and into Salt Spring Elementary School, a meeting learned Monday evening. Board Chairman Strick Aust explained that using a growth projection rate of five per cent, the district would qualify for an additional six classrooms in September 1982.
