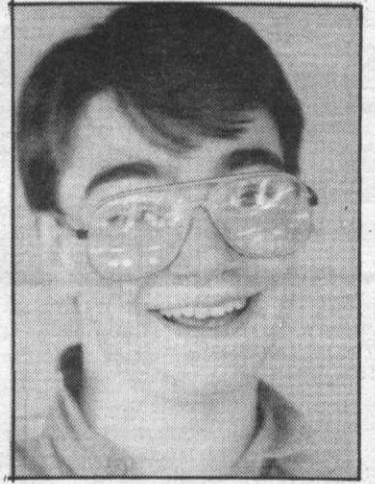
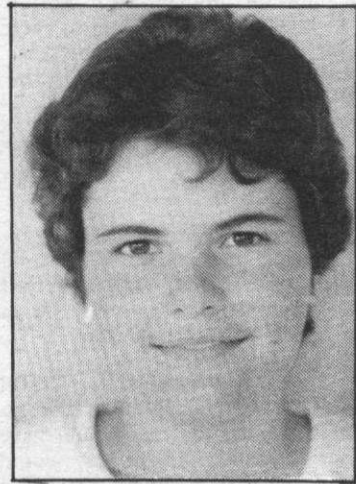
All other Gulf Islands students will finish school on June 27 except for Pender, where students will finish on the 25th.

Going to Expo for the day?

Going to Expo? Make a day of it! Last week I tried out the daily trip from the islands. Mind you, there's more than one way of doing that and I chose the easy way. I travelled over the water by the Queen of Nanaimo and over the land by Pacific Coach Lines.

The cost was not high, but I could have done it cheaper and shortly I will.

At 7 am on Tuesday I sailed from Long Harbour to enjoy bacon and eggs on board the ferry. There was a fair representation of islanders, many of whom were also heading for Expo. We collected more travellers at Otter Bay and Sturdies Bay.

I had called the coach lines office in Victoria and I was assured that there would, in fact, be a coach picking up island passengers. Shortly before disembarking at Tsawwassen an announcement called interested passengers to the cashier's desk to learn of the transportation system.

We must disembark from the car deck and turn left as soon as we came off the ramp. There, located between berth 3 and berth 4 we would find a waiting room for the coach lines bus. And she was right and we did.

There was no bus to be found and a number of travellers walked over to a nearby bus to ascertain whether it was ours. That was the first mistake. The driver assured us that not only was his not the bus we sought but that the information we had been given was wrong and that we must walk to the terminal entrance, there to find the bus waiting outside.

There proved to be no bus at the entrance and a ticket agent explained that the coach lines bus did not pick up island travellers. I assured her that we had already been informed to the contrary and she, obligingly, phoned for confirmation.

Yes, there were facilities for boarding the bus and, yes, it was located between the two berths as we had been originally informed. The bus came to that appointed place, we boarded and travelled to Expo for the fare of \$5. We left the bus at the West Gate bus station a few minutes before 11 am.

This detailed explanation is only offered as an assurance to any other islander who might be misled by earnest but misinformed sources. The driver of the bus travelling to the city explained that the system only works when there is an overload on the Swartz Bay ferry and more passengers seek transportation than can be accommodated on the vehicles travelling with the ferry.

There is usually an overload at 9:30, he added.

Weary, footsore and half asleep, I boarded the same bus at the same West Gate at 7:30 pm and arrived at Tsawwassen with an hour or so to spare for the 10:05 home.

Would I do it again? Yes! Travel cost me \$10. Had I gone to Victoria with the car the cost would have been parallel and the day would have been less interesting. Mind you, being very old, I travelled free on the ferry. A more normal, more youthful reporter would have paid an additional \$3 each way.

Doing it again, I would call the Pacific Coach Lines office in

Victoria the day before and confirm that there would likely be a bus available at Tsawwassen. The city bus leaves the terminal, however, at a few minutes before 10 o'clock and stops at Delta, where you switch buses. You then have some four blocks to walk to Expo. It is also cheaper that way.

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Stored herbs can be reminder of summer of 86

This weekend marks the arrival of summer, and if the weather follows the usual pattern, hot weather will soon be here to stay, at least for a few months. The one unfortunate fact which coincides with this event is that the days will once again begin to shorten, silently but surely ushering us back to the short, cold, wet dark days of winter. This should serve as an incentive for us all to make the best of this nice weather, so enjoy the sunshine while it's here and, above all, get out there and do some gardening.

One pleasant way to brighten those dreary winter days ahead is to take some reminders of the summer of '86 along with us, in the form of preserved, dried, stored or frozen fruits, veggies, flowers and herbs. Properly dried and hung or fresh-frozen herbs can bring back the memories, titillate the taste buds and enhance your other home-grown foods.

In researching these articles on herbs, I also looked for a decent definition, only to find varied and incomplete efforts. By the time you cover all of what we might call "herbs", few plants are left out. An herb can be any cultivated plant; annual, biennial, perennial, woody sub-shrub, coniferous evergreen, full-sized shrub, or even tree, provided some portion of it serves, or has served a useful consumptive purpose for mankind.

Such purposes include actual uses in cooking, cosmetics and skin-care, perfumes, dyeing, spirits, wine and beer making, flavouring, medicinal applications, and, significantly, as a social and historical link to our "horti"-cultural heritage. This last use for herbs provides the most interest for the avid gardener, since many of the herbs that we grow

today have historical significance that may go back 2000 years or more (every herb has a story to tell), yet many of them are no longer of any physical, consumptive use today. It is quite interesting to note that virtually all herbs have been kept true to their species and form, just as they were found in the wild, centuries ago. These plants were given uses for the powers and virtues that they already possessed and thus were cultivated in the herb garden without any further breeding or hybridizing. Only in the last century have we begun to develop assorted types of mints, various shades of bergamot (*monarda didyma*) and sought to create new cultivars of herbs that would serve as useful plants in landscaping or gardening displays. Many herbs possess unique foliage, form, and flowers that make them beautiful contributors to the garden landscape. Herbs can even be gathered together in collections that follow a theme, or regional topic. Such themes include medieval gardens, scented gardens, textured gardens, the ubiquitous cook's gardens, bee-attracting gardens, garden-aid gardens (those herbs that are used as natural insecticides, pest repellents, and natural fertilizers or composting aids), tea gardens, dye-providing gardens, and last but not most impressive is the herb garden assembled with the object of providing a glorious display of floral colour and beauty.

Many herbs would find a place in several of the above theme gardens, and most can be used with mixed plantings of shrubs, trees, bulbs and other perennials in the garden landscape. For this reason, descriptions, care and cultivation of the individual herbs will be dealt

with first, and then we'll provide some lists for their various usages in your gardens.

One of the most used and appreciated herbs is basil or sweet basil (*Ocimum basilicum*) a culinary accent that delights the palate in Italian and French cooking, and for that matter in almost all regional or national cooking. Basil was first introduced to Europeans in the sixteenth century, from its native habitat in Asia. This annual can reach heights of two feet or more, has leaves that are two to three inches in length, and in mid-to-late summer small white flowers are produced. One cultivated variety, Dark Opal basil, has purplish-bronze leaves that are larger and has flowers that are deep pink to purplish in colour. Bush basil (*Ocimum minimum*) is a more compact, smaller-leaved species, originally from Chile, that also yields those sweet, pungent leaves. Basil is most flavourful when used fresh, but the harvest can also be dried or frozen.

Basil plants can be started indoors when the weather is too cool for direct seeding out of doors. Seeds should be sown in a sterile, well-drained mix, and attempt to provide some bottom heat to stimulate rapid germination and growth. Late April to early May is good timing for starting your sowings, as transplants can only be set out once the weather is really warm and the soil is no longer cold, usually the end of May or even early June. Transplants can be purchased from a nursery or else you can seed basil directly into the warm soil during late spring. However you choose to get them going, they should be grown in full sun in a warm location with a soil that is moderately rich, and drains well. The soil should be kept slightly moist and fertilizing is only

needed if the soil is deemed to be poor quality. Use fish fertilizer or liquid seaweed to stimulate full growth. Pinch them back to encourage bushy plants (use the pinchings as an early harvest) and cut off any flower spikes that appear, before they open, so that the plant won't go to seed and subsequently stop growing and die. Since basil goes so well with

tomatoes and because they both need the same growing conditions, they can be planted together in a deck tub or planter where the bountiful harvests will be compatible.

Basil can also be grown indoors in a sunny window at any time of the year to add its fresh flavour to any dish.

Annual meeting stresses importance of efforts

Salt Spring resident Carol Janyk recently returned from the annual general meeting of Amnesty International, held this year in Ottawa on May 30, 31 and June 1.

This Nobel Peace Prize-winning organization, currently marking its 25th anniversary, featured its founder, Peter Benenson, as guest speaker at the annual general meeting.

Janyk said Benenson stressed the importance of continuing Amnesty's work, and of supporting its mandate with conviction and courage. If people are punished for expecting and working for basic human rights, he said, Amnesty members must promise to help them and their families.

Benenson also stressed the four freedoms: freedom of life; freedom of speech, freedom of religion and beliefs; and freedom from pain.

He went on to say that the plight of the refugees should be of crucial concern to Amnesty, and must be one of its chief areas of work now.

Amnesty has experienced tremendous growth and support over the last 25 years and is now active in 42 countries around the world. Amnesty's local group, number 72, has an active Urgent Action Network and one Russian prisoner of conscience.

The Urgent Action Network deals with particularly urgent cases where individuals are being threatened with possible torture and executions, without any legal

protection.

Working for Amnesty International can be a sobering experience at times, said Carol, but members are encouraged by the sight of "so many dedicated volunteers working so hard for someone they don't even know."

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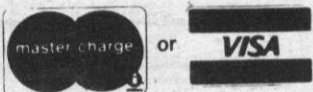

Luxury soap line is selling by truckload

It contains proteins, vitamins and minerals, it's mild and gentle — and Cleopatra once luxurated in tub-fulls of it. That, says Salt Spring Islander Eric Donnelly, is good reason to use milk, specifically goat's milk, as a base in soap-making.

"You could cleanse just in goat's milk," Donnelly says. "It's got a mild cleaning agent, and won't dry up your skin."

Numerous clean people must agree. In the 15 months Donnelly has managed the Dana Soap Factory, the six-year-old business has doubled its sales. Through a nationwide distributor the luxury soap line is selling by the truckload across the country. Mail orders have taken cases of Dana Farm Soap products east to Nova Scotia, south to New Mexico and north to the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

Dana Farm's Jim Scott started the business late in 1979, after chemist Tom Stokes noted the value of using goat's milk in cosmetics. Within two years, they had developed four products — shampoo, liquid hand soap, hair conditioner and a hand and body lotion.

Donnelly began managing the company over a year ago because, as he puts it: "All Jim wants to do is raise goats."

Scott's goats still provide the milk and Stokes remains a consultant, but Donnelly holds absolute control over the company, and his entire family is responsible for making, labelling and boxing the products.

Even four-year-old Liam works, says Pam Donnelly: "We had him packing boxes last time."

Donnelly is a carpenter. "I knew nothing about sales or selling, so I put my products in my handy-dandy briefcase, and set out." Without the selling expertise, Donnelly decided it wasn't worth his time or trouble. Nine months ago, he hired a distributor and hasn't looked back since.

When the Donnellys decided liquid soap "is not everyone's cup of tea," they set out to create a bar soap. After months of research, however, they discovered bar soap is not an easy product for a cottage industry to make. Many commercial bar soaps are not soaps but detergents, and are usually produced by machine presses.

The bar soap project, which Donnelly says is really Pam's "baby," became a reality last Christmas after much experimentation.

"It went over like a rocket," Donnelly says.

The Dana Farm bar soap, labelled a "body shampoo," differs from industrial soap in its exclusive use of natural products. It contains vegetable oils, milk, and sodium hydroxide.

"What we are trying to do is to not just produce soap," Donnelly

says. "If you just want to be clean, buy ordinary soap and take a shower." The Dana Farm line is a luxury one. A single handmade bar, sold in a gift-type box, costs \$3.95. "We're not encouraging a family with 15 kids, which buys tons of soap, to use our product exclusively."

Since the creation of its body shampoo, the Dana Farm Soap Factory has expanded its bar soap line to include a milk and honey bar, a complexion bar made with oatmeal, a bar for calluses and rough skin, and one for sensitive skin.

Employing the expertise of local potters Bas Cobanli, Meg Buckley and Garry Kaye, and Silk Questo designs, the Donnellys have created novelty gift items to accompany the sale of their soap and other products: a handmade bowl for shaving soap, clay pots for scented room fresheners and glass jars for pot pourri.

"We still enjoy taking our products to craft fairs," Donnelly says. "Pam has re-invented ancient, exotic bath oils and salts, which we're trying to re-

introduce. All this has involved 12 trips to Vancouver, an incredible amount of research and a lot of work."

According to Donnelly, goat's milk is preferable over cow's milk because it is naturally homogenized. To prepare the milk for use in the soap products, they need only to separate the cream (the Donnelly household always has fresh cream on hand), and kill the bacteria through pasteurization.

Production of approximately 120 bars a morning, three times a week, and 50 to 60 cases of liquid soap each week has turned every available inch of the Donnelly home into soap factory space. Jars, boxes, labels, equipment and soap components crowd shelves and can be found stacked in corners.

And yet, Donnelly says: "We hope to double our production."

A four or five-year plan the Donnellys have in mind would see a custom-built soap factory added to their house. The addition would include a lab plus production, packaging and storage areas.

At this point, Donnelly says they can't put their products out fast enough. "We seem to go

from one panic to the next. We've got no garden, the place is overrun, both our vehicles are breaking down. But we really enjoy it."

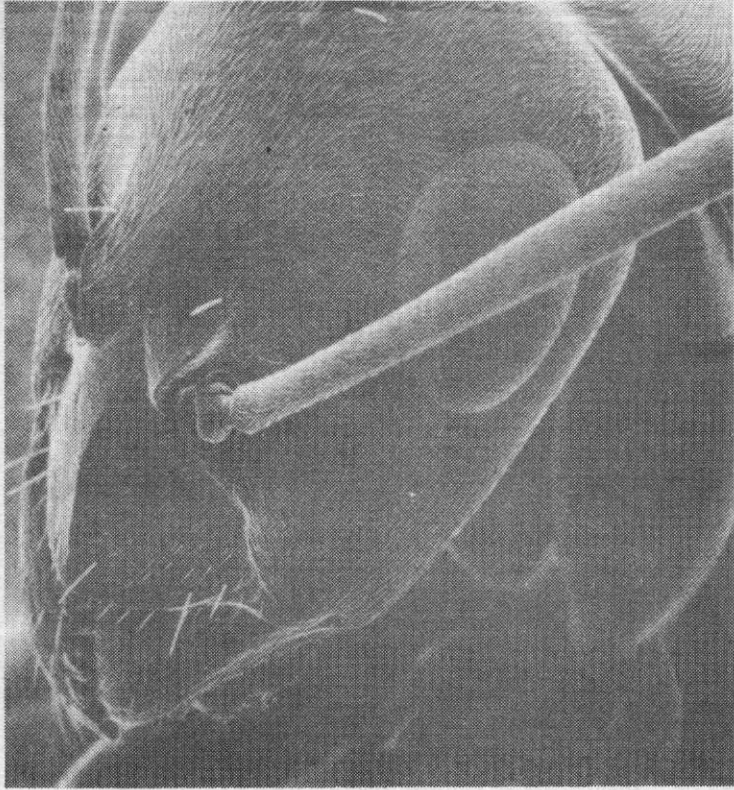

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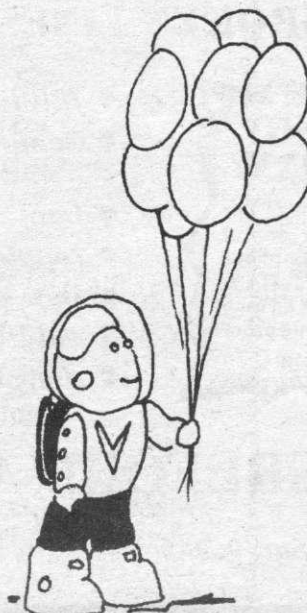
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Islander to undergo heart transplant next month

He reported on the Plant Introduction Scheme now operated by the UBC Botanical Garden, whereby new varieties developed at UBC are made available to local nurserymen, on condition that they be propagated and put on sale to the public.

Twenty-five years ago

C.R. Horel said that, under the village plan, the area would retain the present 10 mills in tax revenue that presently goes to the province. The village would also receive a further \$24 per capita as an outright grant to the village, all of which would produce revenue of about \$20,000.
