

Mass Appeal production expertly performed

Mass Appeal is a tightly-constructed, well-written piece of theatre. As presented by the Salt Spring Players over the first week of Lent, it was well-mounted, well-dressed and expertly performed.

Unfortunately, it played to less than full houses — perhaps because some people do not go to the theatre in Lent, or perhaps because too many people who had seen the movie thought they would not benefit from a live performance.

They missed a rare treat: the sight of two adult males, coming from opposing theological, cultural and philosophical positions, advancing, retreating, regrouping and re-stating, in fact carrying out all the traditional moves necessary to progress from a relationship fraught with hostility and misunderstanding, to the beginning of a close and loving friendship.

The action takes place in and around a Roman Catholic church in the U.S., and theology is one of the grounds of the initial hostile disagreement. In some senses, the play uses the two men to personify the traditional and progressive attitudes which beset any long-established institution. But the only contentious religious issue named is the priesting of women, and even that is not pursued to any length or at any depth.

No, this is much more than a dialogue between the old and the new in the Christian church. It's a dialogue between the blase and the passionate, between the worldly-wise and the crusader, between the establishment and the reformer.

That the old is exposed as hollow and hypocritical, and that the young is hasty and heedless, and that the two learn from each

other's strengths and weaknesses, to come together at the end as two strong, caring and evangelical human beings, is part of the excitement of this excellent play.

It's also a very funny play. Anyone who saw the movie with Jack Lemmon and what's-his-name, will remember the humour of the older priest. Those who were fortunate enough to see the Players' version will remember longer the tragic side of Gordon Wales' portrayal. He didn't miss a trick or a laugh of the "song-and-dance" priest, but his breakdown and humiliation were moving and memorable.

Michael Armstrong's young seminarian was full of fire but, unfortunately, sometimes his passion overwhelmed his projection. I'm inclined to blame myself for not hearing clearly, but I

heard all his quieter moments, and they were beautiful. It was some of the ranting which I missed, and God knows, I enjoy a good rant. In real life we know how hard it is to be enraged and remain articulate. On stage it is essential.

The large back-stage crew excelled themselves. The set was authentic and cleverly constructed, with the pulpit almost embarrassingly part of the audience. (Had I directed, I think I would have "planted" the "questioners" in the congregation, as well as the coughers, but Gordon Wales handled the situation well. He's a consummate actor, giving a stylish, polished

performance which amused and endeared, in spite of his manipulative techniques as a priest.

I would like to see a sequel: *Mass Appeal II!* Featuring the expulsion of the Monsignor from the seminary; the new, strong and truly loving Father Tim, and the wiser, more sensitive Deacon Mark.

Bearing in mind the true meaning of meek relating to the disciplining of a stallion — the harnessing of raw energy — such a pair could well illustrate how the meek will inherit the earth.

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
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
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Vetta Quartet to play here

Show time is 8 pm, March 22, at Off Center Stage.

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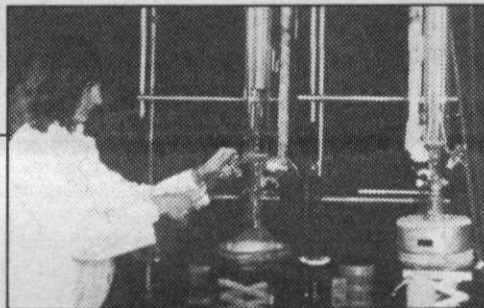
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John and Kottie Ross at Pender home

Pender Island family sailed the south seas

One is expected to return from vacations with albums of photos and armloads of native crafts. Shark stories are not so everyday.

Yet when John and Kottie Ross describe their three-year cruise to the South Pacific aboard the 41-foot sailboat which now sleeps on the lawn of their Pender property, sharks are a recurrent theme.

"There were sharks there like you wouldn't believe," John says. He should know. John, with sons Toby and Dean, spent about four hours a day diving when they were moored.

It's the difference between vacationing aboard the *Love Boat* and *The Boat You Love*. The Rosses built the boat in 1982 at Kotti's parents' house on South Pender. They've been sailing six of the last 10 years. This most recent junket was the longest at three years and 17,000 miles.

They headed for Mexico in 1983 and stayed there a year and a half. "It sounds funny to stay there that long," Kottie explains. "But you have to be safe in hurricane season." Which means you stay landlocked.

The boys studied by correspondence each morning, donning their diving gear at noon. "This is their first year of school at GISS," Kottie says.

In Mexico, and everywhere, they ate a lot of fish. John caught a 32-inch lobster there, though it

was Toby who led the family in totals. He nabbed 108 in the three years. "He's absolutely deadly with a spear gun," John acknowledges.

Toby, who was 11 when they began their trip, was a terror of the ocean floor, harassing moray eels and teasing eight-foot-long sharks. He was fearless, his father says, until a fiesty shark rammed a native Toby was swimming with. The other man was knocked into Toby, who was in turn spread across the ocean floor. After that he used hook and line from the safety of a boat.

Dean, the oldest son by three years, proved the ideal sailor, according to his parents. He was always ready to work. And because there is little else to do, to eat.

While in Mexico, the Rosses learned not to believe North American stereotypes about Mexicans. They were neither lazy nor untrustworthy, and proved gracious hosts.

They departed from Mexico with one more crew member — a non-talking parrot named Chico, who now sits on the kitchen counter at their Clam Bay Road residence.

They went to the Marquesas Islands in French Polynesia, where the lush green looked good after the Baja desert. It was here the Rosses learned the value of

Construction up on islands

Outer Islands construction activity is ahead of the pace set one year ago, and most of the work currently underway is taking place on Pender and Galiano Islands.

Building permit statistics released last week by the Capital Regional District (CRD) provided the following picture for January, 1987 (totals for January, 1986, are in parentheses): permits, 27 (16); value of work, \$211,487 (\$88,394); and permit revenue, \$2,657 (\$1,372).

The breakdowns show Pender leading the way with 13 permits, including one for a single-family dwelling, five for plumbing work, four for chimneys, and three for 'other' work. Also taken out, but not calculated into the CRD totals, were five permits for demolitions. All together, the work is valued at just under \$47,000.

Galiano Island was next in line with 11 permits taken out — two for single-family dwellings, two for

commercial buildings, four for plumbing work and three for chimneys. Value of the work underway was set at just under \$117,000.

Saturna Islanders, meanwhile, took out but one permit — for plumbing work — while Mayne residents chipped in with four permits, including one for a single-family dwelling, one for plumbing work and two for chimneys.

Churches financially healthy

The annual general meeting of the Parish of North and South Pender and Saturna islands showed all three Anglican churches are financially solvent.

The Sunday meeting followed a pot luck lunch organized by the Parish Ladies Guild. St. Christopher's Church on Saturna was not represented at the meeting but there were 65 people from St. Peter's Church and the Church of the Good Shepherd on the Penders.

Each congregation had enough money to meet operating bills but had little left for extra expenses.

Despite the loss of some parishioners to death and relocation, there was a slight increase in membership last year.

Dan Scott, youth co-ordinator for the Anglican Diocese of B.C., was the guest speaker. He spoke on Christian Stewardship.

The church paid tribute to several executive members who stepped down. Jack MacAuley replaced Bill Barnes as rector's warden of St. Peter's. Ann Forbes replaced MacAuley as people's warden.

Vickie Gillespie stepped down as rector's warden for the Church of the Good Shepherd. She was replaced by Charles Ilsley. Kit Shergold became the new people's warden of South Pender. On Saturna, Gail Trafford replaced Hazel Trickey as rector's warden of St. Christopher's. The new people's warden there is Don McLellan.

Nominations for CRD post taken April 13

Anyone aspiring to represent the Outer Gulf Islands through the Capital Regional District (CRD) can drop their nominations off at the CRD office April 13.

The resignation of director Kelly Scott has prompted a spring by-election to fill the position until the regular elections in the fall.

Candidates must drop off applications at the third floor of the CRD office between 10 am and noon, April 13.

The CRD board selected Victoria resident Thomas Moore to act as returning officer. Moore has held the position in past elections.

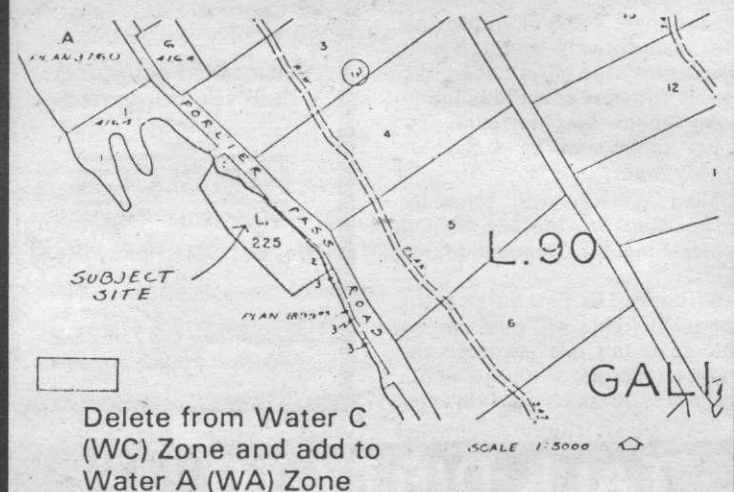

patience. They had no choice: they had all but run out of supplies, including propane, and relied on a little kerosene stove with one element. The natives assured them the supply ship was on its way. "Maybe tomorrow, maybe tomorrow," Kotti mimics. "This went on for several weeks."

In the interim, they traded dishes, pencils or paper for food. "Whatever you could spare, you gave away," says John, who parted with most of his tools. Native hospitality was unlimited. One loving host offered them a piece of his land upon which they could live if they'd only stay.

They moored at another Island — Palmerston — in which all the residents shared the same last name because they were all descendents of an Englishman who discovered the Island with his three Polynesian wives.

They spent two months in Samoa. Then, while in the Northern Cook Islands, Kotti celebrated her birthday. Island pearl divers gave her a half dozen oyster tears

— the day's catch.

From island to island, they made their way to Hawaii. While there they saw *Stars 'n' Stripes*, the U.S. racing yacht which just brought the Americas' Cup back home.

There, they phoned Kotti's parents and learned her mother had injured her hip. Almost immediately, they headed home and, for the only time on the trip,

fighting the wind on their way.

Home for them was the Vancouver docks where they had lived on previous crafts. After that long at sea, they could no longer fit into the Vancouver pace. "We can't live in the fast lane anymore," John says without regret.

So they came to North Pender, where Kotti works as a nurse and John, a sheet metal worker, takes employment as it comes.

Bengers come to Pender, discuss recent China trip

Basil and Kathlyn Benger of Galiano Island came to Pender on Tuesday evening, February 24, to give a talk to the Farmers' Institute members and friends about their experiences in China on a recent six-month stay.

The Bengers were invited by YRCC, a Chinese company with some 30,000 to teach English courses to some of their engineers in Canton. The invitation came through a Chinese student at Simon Fraser University who had been a house guest.

They arrived last year in February and were met by very cold weather. So, their first priority was to rush out to buy long

Palliative group to get help from federal ministry

A federal health and welfare grant will help Pender's fledgling palliative care seniors group.

The New Horizons program will bring a \$2,221 grant to the Pender group. President Phyllis Kimmerley said most of the money will pay for the monthly speakers. The rest will provide supplies and "the sort of things you would use if you had a small office, which we don't."

The palliative care seniors group, which started in September, applied for the grant in December after Vancouver Island palliative associations told them about it.

The group offers support and counselling to the terminally ill and the housebound, Kimmerley said. "Palliative means helping without curing."

Thirty Pender residents have gone through the training program to be counsellors, Kimmerley said. The volunteer group meets biweekly.

johns. Basil Benger mentioned that between classes, the hard-working Chinese students had to do warm-up exercises — his were mostly 20-year-olds and they were all very keen to learn.

The Bengers found the food unpleasant to a western palate; the mainstay of the Chinese diet is rice. Delicacies were a fish-eye handed to the guest of honour, held between chopsticks, and squid, snails and turtles' feet.

They saw farming villages growing grains, rice, wheat, soya beans and apples, but as China has doubled its wheat production in recent years, Canada's export market to China has decreased greatly.

China's transportation system is primarily four-legged — donkeys, mules, pony and water buffalo on farms — and some two-legged humans all mixed up together on crowded roads. It seems almost everyone, especially in cities, use bicycles to move around. Individuals do not own cars.

Today the understood policy is one child per family. China is about the same geographic size as Canada but the population is 25 times greater. There are many huge open spaces; other areas are densely populated. For every Penderite there are one million Chinese. In the lower reaches of the Yalu River there are 150 million people — thus the reader can picture how dense the population is in parts.

In the previous century many Canadian churches sent missionaries and their families to China and through this strong links were forged with Canada.

Basil Benger said that in the six months they spent in China they made many friends and the hospitality extended to them could not possibly have been greater. The Christmas mail they received on their return home was simply enormous.

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Galianoites encourage U.S. residents to visit

During the last week of February, 21 Galianoites attacked Seattle. Leaving Tuesday in the Hummingbird Inn bus they boarded the morning ferry. The bus was piloted by Captain Dionysio Alcala Galiano, whose present day reincarnation is publican and GIVA president George Harris. Among the colourfully-costumed crew were the transportation trio of George Tully and Dave Gerlach of Montague Motors, and our new taxi owner-operator, Jim Savary.

The purpose of the trip, organized by the tourism committee of the Galiano Chamber of Commerce, was to invite past, present and future friends of Galiano in Washington State to discover or rediscover Galiano Island as an attractive place to visit.

When they reached Bellingham our crew were royally welcomed by the mayor and dignitaries of that city and Whatcom County, together with the mayors of Matsqui and Abbotsford. They were then entertained to luncheon by the local Visitors and Convention Bureau — perhaps in appreciation for the efforts made by Galiano islanders last December to save the Bellingham Christmas Ship. A Channel 12 TV crew filmed these events and showed clips on the evening news program.

Arriving in Seattle by mid-afternoon, the Galiano group set up displays for the evening reception, to which had been invited anyone from the area who had previously visited Galiano. From 7:30 pm until 10 pm there was a steady stream of guests in the Cambridge Room of the Warwick Hotel. Marie-Claire Von Hausmann repeated her slide show of Galiano scenes many times, while other ambassadors were kept busy giving information to many interested guests.

During the next two days the Galiano delegation merged with a larger group from the Victoria and Vancouver Island Tourist Association, and visited a shopping centre, Pike Street Public Market, the AAA and B.C. Tourism Offices. They then visited KOMO-TV station, where they were spotlighted in the audience of the program *North West Afternoon*, whose hostess is Dana Middleton, sister of Galiano's Connie Kennedy, and whose producer is Kathy Tolan, whose parents have for many years owned the large, curving house at the end of Active Pass Drive.

Tired but happy, the group was refreshed on their way home by a smoked salmon reception in the Bellingham home of Tripo Costello, renowned for almost 30 years as the Christmas Ship Santa.

Western Bluebirds

In our culture the word *blue bird* is synonymous with happiness, and happy indeed is the local bird watcher who spots the Western Bluebird's distinctive bright blue head, wings and tail with rusty breast and back patch, for this species is rarely seen on Galiano or even Vancouver Island except in the Metchosin area. In contrast to humans, the females are duller in colour with only a hint of blue — dowdy compared with the male.

A Victoria naturalist, Harold Pollock, has been attempting to increase the Western Bluebird population of Southern Vancouver Island and the Lower Gulf Islands by providing nesting boxes in suitable locations, which are grassy balds above the 600-foot

level. He has placed boxes on Salt Spring, Saturna and Galiano. Galiano islanders who would like to construct boxes or who wish to report bluebird sightings should phone Benger at 5702.

Community Plan

Work on the revision of the Galiano Community Plan has resumed. The process is beginning with the professional staff who will consult with trustees. Proposals will next come to the APC for comment. This will lead to a meeting for public scrutiny and comment. Hopefully, this will lead to revisions of revisions, passage of an amending bylaw by the Trust Committee, and finally ministerial approval of the changes. Don't hold your breath.

Questionnaire

The leaked document which has come to our attention is dated June, 1986, and consists of a series of amendments to a previous Galiano questionnaire. The questions asked refer to details of the property owned or rented by the respondent together with his or her recreational preferences, reasons for living on Galiano, and sites on the island which should be protected. The largest number of questions concern the regulation of home occupations. The answers to these nine questions might form the basis for the revision of the definition of *home occupations* in the Community Plan and zoning bylaws.

At the time of the February 21 APC meeting, Galiano resort owners and the Trust had reached agreement on a revision of the Commercial Accommodation clause of the zoning bylaw. This will be designated C-3 and be presented to the public at the Galiano Island Trust meeting at the end of March.

His 12 blasts were often heard echoing from the greenwood above Whaler Bay to be followed shortly by the thump of detonating dynamite.

Perhaps Fred has a seismic personality. Did the vibrations of vital energy he emanates have anything to do with triggering the New Zealand quake?

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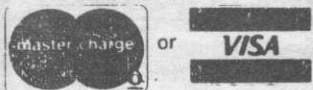

The forwards — Andrew Aust, Chad Little, B.J. Severs and Corbin Scott — worked hard and had several great opportunities but missed many and had one go off the bar.

Their only goal came from Corbin Scott, who sparkled on right wing, as he picked up a Chris Mullin pass and parked the ball in the left corner for the winner, mid-way through the second half.

Next week the Selects will try to reach the final in April with a Sunday encounter against Gordon Head at 10 am at Portlock Park.

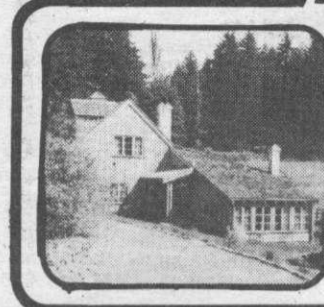
Fortunately, 15 minutes later Lance made amends by converting a Mike Brown breakaway pass and

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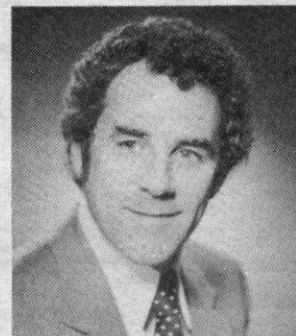

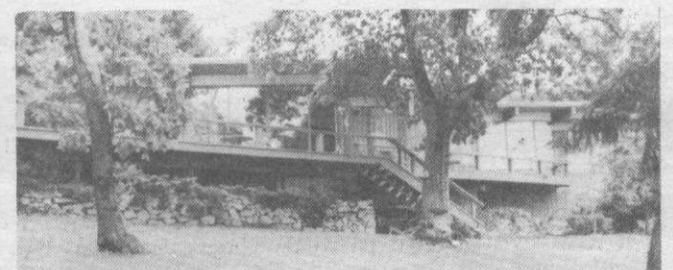

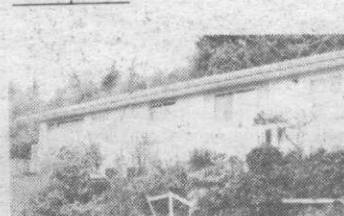

Twenty-five years ago

• Professor Tony Emery, one of B.C.'s outstanding speakers, will be the guest of honour and keynote speaker at the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce's annual installation banquet.

Emery, a man of many talents, is also a columnist for the *Victoria Times*.

• A few anxious moments were created for the crew of the *George S. Pearson* when mate A. Hazenboom fell overboard while the ferry was at the Crofton dock.

The ramp was apparently icy, and a pick-up truck slid back down. Hazenboom leaped aside to avoid the truck but lost his footing and plunged into the icy water. Because the ship was docked stern first, there was a danger that the man might be sucked into the turning propeller blades; however, engineer Tom Guerny quickly jumped down to the engine room and shut off the engines.

• The board of trustees for School District 64 passed a motion instructing the building and grounds committee to prepare a complete study of the construction of an auditorium-gym and science room.

The committee was asked to report its findings to the board and include plans for the facility, its estimated cost and other items of interest.

Twenty years ago

• Gulf Islands hospital trustees are upset over a proposal to bring all the islands into the same regional district as Duncan.

Hospital trustees weren't the only islanders rankled by the proposal. Chamber of Commerce president Les Ramsey told a meeting of local businessmen it would be easier to stay out of the Duncan Regional District than to get out.

• A case of infectious hepatitis

was identified in Ganges. The extremely infectious and crippling disease is common in areas suffering from inadequate sewage disposal.

The Salt Spring Island unit of the Greater Victoria Metropolitan Board of Health has declined to confirm the report or offer any comment. The board has a policy of not releasing information concerning communicable diseases.

• RCMR officials say the use of emergency signals by a vehicle in no haste could result in charges.

Cpl. Fred Rhodes told fellow members of the Salt Spring Lions Club that flashing lights and sirens were only to be used in emergencies. He added that if an accident occurred involving a vehicle wrongfully using emergency signals, the driver of that vehicle would bear responsibility for the crash.

• Galiano never lagged.

The Red Cross fund-raising drive on the islands has ended and, as usual, Galiano was the first to exceed its quota. According to volunteers, it was the most difficult drive ever. Canvassers had to climb over a forest of fallen trees, but residents still contributed more than \$500.

• Steve Polywkan, a Ganges banker, is the new president of the Salt Spring Island Rotary Club. He succeeds Tuppy Agar, who left the island.

Also elected were Ken Whyte (first vice-president); Gavin Reynolds (second vice-president); Gordon Matthews (secretary-treasurer); directors Alex Shelby and Charles Baltzer; and Sergeant at Arms Don Perkins.

Ten years ago

• A fire destroyed the home of Darrel and Rosemary Modeste.

The house, a landmark on North Galiano for 60 years or more, was situated in Baines' Bay and known for 30 years or more as 'Aunt Beryl's house' to all the North End youngsters who enjoyed many parties there.

• Chess winners from Salt Spring Elementary School travelled to Lake Cowichan for the second round of the C-FAX annual chess championship.

Four matches were played, and one of the island players won a berth in the next round of play. Grade One students Anthony Archer and Travis Hockley were unopposed and advanced to the next round. Grade Seven student Penny Wright narrowly lost a long, hard game to Andy Mueller. Allan Stepaniuk was unable to hold off a determined attack with queen and rook by Billy Swain.

• Ferry schedule changes for the Outer Islands might have a detrimental effect on Saturna Islanders travelling to Victoria.

B.C. Ferry Corporation officials met with Islands Trust representatives to discuss the changes.

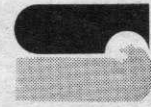

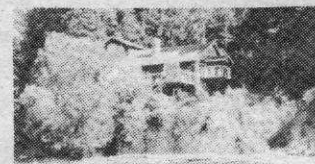

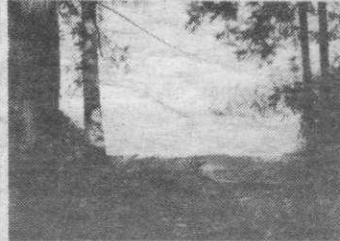
