gone. He wanted it because his dad had attended the races for several years, but had a heart attack and couldn't come."

Marshall spent seven days on location at the air races. It proved to be an educational as well as exhilarating experience—and one he'll not soon forget.

"There were 120,000 spectators and pilots there," he noted. "It's held every year during the second week of September. They fly a 9.2 mile oval course in these planes, everything from formula racers to biplanes.

"It (air racing) is a wealthy man's hobby. The people who do this are spending a million and a half bucks a year to win \$30,000. Some of these guys own more than one plane, too."

Although he enjoyed the air races, Marshall didn't spend a lot of time there as a spectator. Most of each day was taken up lugging video equipment around the airstrip and viewing the activity through his camera lens.

"They were long days," he notes with a grin. "I was up at 7 am, and often didn't get to bed until one o'clock. I packed a six-volt motorcycle battery around with me so I could stay out in the field and wouldn't have to come back in to recharge. The equipment only weighed maybe 20 or 25 pounds, but by the end of the day it felt like 200."

Video-taping the air races wasn't simply a matter of pointing a camera and pressing a button, either. Although Marshall was given access to many of the planes, obtaining shots of their interiors was often difficult. One night, to get some footage of aircraft mechanics working on a partially dismantled Rolls Royce Merlin engine, he climbed atop a lift truck's roll cage.

"To get the shots of the

instrument panels, I had to lower the camera down into the cockpit without looking in the viewfinder," he stated. "It was pretty hard to photograph the planes when they were in the air, too. The slower aircraft go around the 9.2-mile oval course at about 360-370 miles per hour. The modified planes go even faster; the fastest was moving at over 450 miles per hour. And some of these pilots, when they go around the pylon, are only 25 feet off the ground."

Although video-taping the air races was no easy feat, the real work on *Sights and Sounds* started when Marshall returned home to Salt Spring. Hours upon hours of video-tape had to be reviewed and edited, music had to be selected, the sound had to be mixed. Even for a company, the making of this video would have been a lengthy undertaking; for one man, it was a major task.

"I did all the shooting, all the editing, sound mixing," Marshall recalls with a chuckle. "I was the producer, director, chief bottle-washer — you name it.

"Up to this point, I have spent 600 hours on it," he said. "I'm really happy with it, especially some of the inside shots . . . It takes tremendous concentration. Sometimes, I'd spend 18 hours a day editing with no coffee, no sleep, no food. I'd work 'til two, then get up at five and start all over again."

Marshall paid special attention to the use of Ulrich's music, spending months getting permission to use it and then working meticulously to ensure that the soundtrack fit perfectly with the video's visual images. All his hard work paid off, though; anyone who hadn't heard the music before would swear it was written especially for *Sights and Sounds — The Reno National Air Races*.

"I'm two months behind my production schedule because it took me two months to get rights to the music," he noted. "But I can honestly say — and you can quote me on this — that if I'd been producing a major movie and wanted a score, I could not have got a better soundtrack even if it had been written for me. I think it was actually written about 10 years ago.

"But most of the music is supplied by Pratt and Whitney, Rolls Royce," he added jokingly. "To an engine buff, it's like listening to a symphony."

Marshall did get some help with the production of *Sights and Sounds — The Reno National Air Races*. Although he did all the writing, he hired radio announcer Bob Glover of Victoria to do the narration. Impact Audio-Visual also helped with design of the video-tape's cover art.

"I personally believe there is not an aviator alive who wouldn't appreciate this," Marshall said.

With one retail video-tape production now to his credit, Marshall hopes to work on others. The 11-year resident of Salt Spring has some ideas for future productions.

"To me, it's the creating that's most important," he said. "I'd like to stay with the aviation theme. There's a fellow who writes incredible poetry about flying. I'd like to see if I could marry some of his poetry with video."

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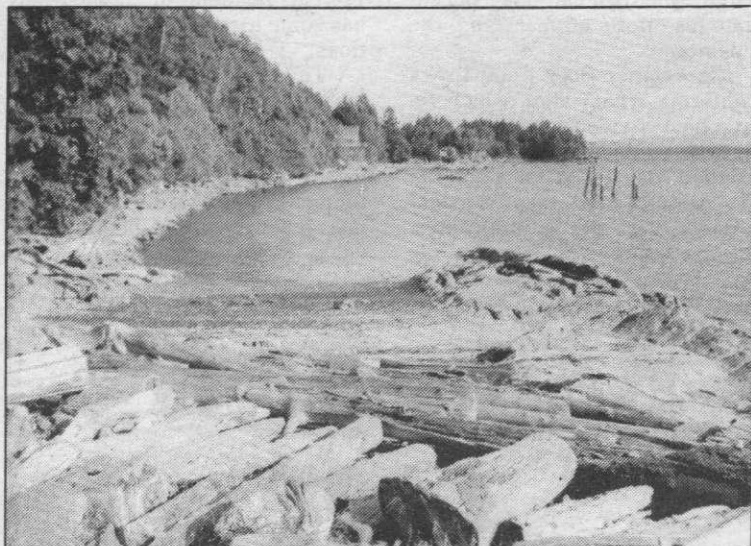

Water leases, rezoning

Marina project requires approvals

A bid to build a marina at Galiano Island's Saltery Bay is dependent on the developer rezoning a parcel of land, receiving two water leases and overturning the classification applied to one of those water lots.

Those conditions are contained in an interim agreement of sale between Galiano Island resident Peter Klau, who is proposing the marina project, and MacMillan-Bloedel, the legal owner of the property adjacent to the water lease sites.

One step in the procedural chain leading to possible appro-

vals and a sale was taken recently when Klau applied to the Crown for two water leases covering almost 3.3 hectares of the bay.

At the same time, Klau has asked Municipal Affairs Minister Rita Johnston to withhold her signature from a rezoning bylaw given three readings by the Galiano Island Trust Committee. The bylaw, which requires the minister's signature and a fourth reading before it can be adopted, downzoned the water lot from a commercial designation to one permitting only residential and recreational uses.

The Trust Committee initiated the rezoning earlier this year, after MacMillan-Bloedel allowed the water lease to lapse. The forest company had planned to use the property and the bay for log dumping and storage, then decided it would not use the site for that purpose. Shortly afterwards, MacMillan-Bloedel offered the land for sale.

Klau's application for two water leases — the 2.77 hectare lot held by MacMillan-Bloedel and a 2.14 hectare lot extending

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Celebration marks break in school term

She uses a 20-year-old Pentax camera with a variety of lenses to obtain slides that have been reproduced in different publications, including Dr. Lewis Clark's beautifully-illustrated *Wild Flowers of British Columbia*. Woollett has been a hard-working supporter of Thetis Lake Park since its inception, and it is in these surroundings that some of her best nature slides have been taken. She has, however, also travelled to the high Arctic twice, the Far East and desert canyon terrain in the southern U.S.A., and on garden tours in the U.K. She shares her distillation of visual experiences by giving shows to many garden groups. Life on other planets just theory—speaker

It would seem that the possibility of extra-terrestrial life is fascinating to many people: on June 11, approximately 135 Pender residents came to hear the subject discussed at an Outreach lecture sponsored by the Pender Island Library Association.

The speaker, Dr. James Hesser, is director of the astrophysical observatory in Saanich.

Dr. Hesser explained that the various elements necessary to form life on earth came about when

hydrogen and helium were converted into other elements — particularly carbon — in the cores of early stars. He then went on to discuss the possibility of extra-terrestrial life, and the ways in which scientists are attempting to locate other inhabited planets.

Dr. Hesser concluded by saying that, as of yet, there is no evidence for life on any planet other than the earth; and that perhaps we should proceed under the assumption that life in the universe is entirely located on this fragile planet, and treat it accordingly.

Marina at Saltery Bay dependant on rezoning

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past the first — have been passed onto the local Trust Committee for comment. In his application, Klaui says he would use the two offshore lots and the land as the site for a marina.

A sketch attached to the application shows a wharf, boat-launching ramp and breakwater would be constructed, and an area near the shore would be dredged and filled with rip-rap. It also notes that mooring buoys would be placed in the bay.

The property, which grows from a thin sliver at the south boundary to a relatively wide piece at the north end, lies beside the main North Galiano road and covers about .42 hectares, including about 610 feet of beachfront.

Galiano Island Trustee Donald MacDonald said the land has always carried a rural-residential designation and that it would have to be rezoned by the Trust for commercial use before Klaui's plans could go ahead.

A group of North Galiano residents, meanwhile, has formed the Saltery Bay Preservation So-

ciety to oppose Klaui's marina proposal. Shirley Chambers, head of the society, said the group's opposition stems from a belief that the marina may become much larger than what has been outlined in the proposal, and that the bay is an unsuitable site for a commercial development.

Klaui, a commercial fisherman, is applying for the water lots under a company name, Galiano Island Fishing Charters Ltd. He said last week the main issue surrounding his plans is whether access to smaller islands off Galiano will be supplied by his marina and boat-launching facilities, or whether a "few" North Galiano residents will deny that access to a larger group of boaters.

Klaui added that his plans for the development call for nothing large-scale. "It sure as Hell isn't a False Creek project — it's just a bunch of mooring buoys," he said.

Klaui also pointed out that the bay has housed commercial activity before. It was once home to four herring salteries, which gave the bay its name.

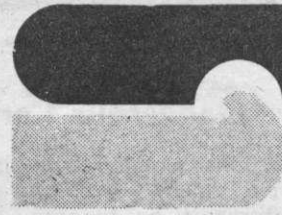
The Pender ladies won the tournament by 29 points. The two teams compete again next month, at Galiano.

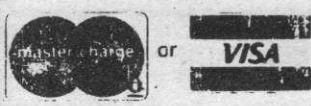

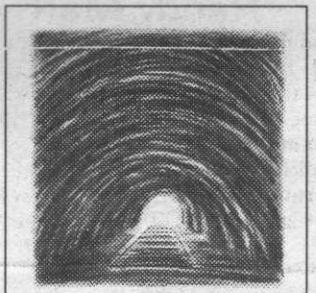

Building activity slowing

After a surge in the first months of 1987, construction activity on Salt Spring Island marked time in April, dropping year-to-date figures closer to the levels reached a year earlier.

Statistics released recently by the Capital Regional District (CRD) building permits office showed the value of work launched this April was higher than in 1986, while the number of permits issued and the revenue generated for the CRD were virtually the same as a year earlier.

Figures for April, 1987, with corresponding statistics for 1986 in parentheses, are as follows: permits issued, 43 (46); construction value, \$859,365 (\$708,404); and permit revenue, \$8,995 (\$8,976).

Cumulative totals for the 1987 period from January through April, meanwhile, show the value of work underway this year is still well ahead of last year's pace.

Year-to-date figures for 1987, with corresponding statistics for 1986 in parentheses, are as follows: permits issued, 136 (158); construction value, \$2.191 million (\$1.886 million); and permit revenue, \$23,692 (\$22,704).

To date this year on Salt Spring, permits have been issued for 21 single-family dwellings, five mobile homes, one moved dwelling, seven commercial or industrial buildings, 52 plumbing jobs, 23 chimney projects and 27 jobs defined as 'other.'

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Trust chairman discusses Ganges government options

The Islands Trust "has done pretty well" with respect to Ganges but "we know it's not good enough," Salt Spring Trust Committee member Nick Gilbert said this week.

Gilbert was the guest speaker at a dinner meeting of the Chamber of Commerce Monday evening when he suggested that all the options must be considered in deciding how Ganges should be governed.

Gilbert expressed interest in a proposal for an elected village council. It would advise the regional director and take over some of the services now carried out by the Capital Region.

The council would also advise the Islands Trust on land use matters. Gilbert proposed that the council would name three of its members to the Trust Committee. Thus, when the committee met to debate issues concerning Ganges, it would consist of eight trustees.

Gilbert noted that perhaps incorporation was the answer but he felt it was important to examine all the possibilities.

The Islands Trust chairman

touched on a number of issues affecting Ganges, including the bypass, the Jackson Avenue extension, Ganges Creek flooding problems and multiple-family housing. With regard to the latter, Gilbert said recommendations on multiple-family housing are due within the next month.

He said the Trust was looking at a possible density of 10 units per acre between the downtown area and Atkins Road, with maximum site coverage of 25 per cent.

The Trust's goal, he said, was "to maintain the rural atmosphere but allow people to live close to Ganges" and its amenities. There are developments in the planning stages now, he explained, which would see housing offered in a variety of unit sizes and prices.

Gilbert also discussed parking in the village and said some minor revisions in standards would likely come from a recent Trust survey. He said the Trust is looking for a happy medium in promoting a pedestrian-oriented village with adequate parking facilities.

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Byron calls end to 37-year classroom career

Mike Byron walked through the doors of Gulf Islands Secondary School on Friday for what may be the last time. After spending 37 years as a teacher both here and in the Lower Mainland, the Salt Spring resident is leaving the classroom behind to work on his island farm.

"Yes, it's my last day," he said in an interview last week. "I'm going to retire."

Byron, 56, was raised on Salt Spring Island and attended North End School. After leaving the community, he went to the Lower Mainland and worked in Surrey for 11 years. The last 26 years have been spent on Salt Spring, where he's taught "a little bit of everything," from English to Agriculture.

"When I came, everyone was crowded into the elementary school," he pointed out. "I taught the parents of some of the children I'm teaching now . . . Even some of the people who taught me are still around, which is pretty incredible."

Although many years have passed since he started teaching, Byron claims children haven't changed.

"There isn't any basic change in the students," he said. "Maybe the educational philosophy has changed, and the parents' philosophy, but the kids are not really different."

"I think over the last few years there's been greater stress placed

on the academic and university programs, and I think that there are a greater number of the students going to university from this area now."

Byron has enjoyed his 37 years as a teacher. He feels instructors who work on Salt Spring are particularly lucky because they "know the parents, the families. I think we have a better rapport

because of it."

He has a few words of advice for students, too. "I think (it's important to have) an optimistic view," he said. "They've got to believe in themselves."

Gulf Islands Secondary School students obviously respect the soft-spoken agriculture teacher. In honour of his retirement, they presented him with an axe — which he notes will go well with the power saw received from the Gulf Islands Teachers' Association.

Both tools will likely get a lot of use in the months and years ahead. Although Byron is retiring, it's unlikely he'll be idle. Working his Beaver Point farm will keep him busy year round.

Byron will take a lot of fond memories with him into retirement. Looking back over his career, the teacher/farmer has little difficulty identifying what he considers his greatest achievement.

"I survived," he says with a laugh.

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Lake data analysis continues

The St. Mary Lake task force continues to analyze data that may prove useful in solving the problems facing Salt Spring's largest body of fresh water, the group's chairman said last week.

Hart Graham, head of the task force established last fall, said Thursday the group is continuing its efforts to learn everything possible about St. Mary Lake and various techniques employed elsewhere to deal with water quality problems.

"We're still analyzing data," Graham noted. "The (Salt Spring) Water Preservation Society is writing around the world to get information."

The task force has studied two reports on St. Mary Lake water quality that were prepared by the ministry of environment and parks in 1975 (J.M. Goddard) and 1983 (Rick Nordin). It found that phosphorus in the bottom sediments and in the water column caused most of the symptoms of unsatisfactory water quality — turbidity, taste and odor.

According to Graham, phosphorus in the watershed is generally caused by septic systems, land disturbance (such as tree clearing and road-building), and the use of farm fertilizers. Heavy seasonal rains wash the phosphorus and phosphorus-coated earth particles into the lake where they become the food source of weeds, zooplankton and algae.

Graham pointed out that development in the watershed is controlled by the Islands Trust. However, he said, nutrient leakage from septic systems is not monitored at all unless it is obvious. To correct this situation, the task force is exploring suitable procedures with the ministries of environment and municipal affairs.

During the past several months, the task force has visited farmers in the watershed and pointed out the problems caused by phosphorus.

"Reactions were mixed," said Graham.

"Visits were also made to resorts having boat-launching facilities to talk about Eurasian milfoil and to pass on descriptive posters and pamphlets. Response by owners was excellent and all will inspect off-island boats and trailers before allowing them to launch."

B.C. Ferry Corporation employees have also volunteered to give educational pamphlets on the weed to boaters bound for Salt Spring. "Their interest and efforts are greatly appreciated," said Graham.

Aeration of St. Mary Lake recently resumed, and it is expected this too will significantly reduce the amount of phosphorus returned to the water from bottom sediments.

On another matter, Graham said that recent high copper assays from the lake indicate that copper sulphate is being used to combat weeds and parasites responsible for "St. Mary Lake itch." Ministry of environment officials say the benefits are only temporary.

Graham said the task force does not know when its work will be completed. However, he noted that when the review concludes, it will be up to "the politicians" to take the lead.

Rex Daykin, the operator of a bulldozer at the Solimar Resort, unearthed several bottles wrapped in brown paper. Most of them were broken, but two remained full. They contained, according to their labels, Lindeman's Australian Burgundy.

Twenty years ago

Janis Smith and Eric Gladman were two winners in the Canadian Forestry Association of B.C.'s forestry essay contest.

The two Gulf Islands Secondary School students were among 24 winners selected throughout B.C.

The incorporation referendum in Ganges was a dismal failure. Incorporation was proposed as the vehicle by which a sewer system could be installed in Ganges. The villagers, however, opposed the move for fear their taxes would be higher than those collected in nearby unorganized areas.

Voters turned down a school district proposal to construct three classrooms and an industrial education room at GISS, improve dormitory facilities on the island, and build a teacherage on Pender.

All three referenda required 60 per cent approval to pass, but none gained more than 55 per cent.

A Ganges woman suffered serious cuts to her face and body in an accident involving a child's toy.

While on holiday off-island, the woman tripped over some toys in a living room and fell against a glass door. The door shattered, and she sustained cuts requiring 45 stitches.

Fifteen years ago

L.W. Linnitt of Beddis Road was named auditor for the Salt Spring Fire Protection District.

Linnitt was nominated by W.E. Delmonico after Dennis Andrews had reported that the annual meeting had been delayed owing to the long processing of the financial statement.

A majority of Salt Spring Island was in mourning following the death of two well-known island youths.

The youths died in an automobile accident along Lower Ganges Road, south of the Canal Road junction. A third occupant of the vehicle was thrown clear and suffered minor injuries.

The first phase of a building program was getting expensive for the Gulf Islands school district.

Trustees were told that the cost

of providing adequate sewage disposal for the new school facilities was likely to exceed original estimates.

The movements of school superintendents around the province was having an impact on the Gulf Islands district.

The new Gulf Islands superintendent was C.E. Stewart, who was also slated to supervise the Lake Cowichan district. In the past, the Gulf Islands had shared a superintendent with the Saanich district.

Ten years ago

Strong protest was being voiced by Phil and Yvette Valcourt against the Capital Regional District's handling of local affairs.

One of the Valcourts' main complaints was that they were unable to get a permit from Regional Health Services to go ahead with a proposed food store to be built north of Foxglove Farm and Garden Supply. The island residents claimed percolation tests on the property showed there was no basis for refusing to allow the construction of a septic tank and drainage field.

There was an oil slick on Fulford Harbour.

Molly Akerman reported that a slick 200 yards long was visible on the western side of the harbour. It disappeared within about three hours, however.

Five years ago

A conveyor belt unloading gravel at the Ganges wharf

stopped and didn't start up again until non-union truckers left the job.

The work stoppage, ordered by Teamsters officials in Victoria, occurred because four trucks and drivers from Salt Spring did not belong to the union.

There was a men's softball team on Salt Spring that wished ice hockey season continued right through the summer.

The Salt Spring Slugs, a team that played hockey on Vancouver Island during the winter, decided to play only softball. They were reportedly regretting the decision, having lost 29-13 to the Vesuvius Inn in extra innings.

A Duncan man was listed as missing and presumed drowned after his boat was found adrift.

The man was last seen on his 36-foot sailboat. Shortly after, however, residents living along Sansum Narrows heard calls for help and contacted the RCMP. Police searched the area but found no sign of the missing individual.

A Saturday afternoon of fishing almost turned to tragedy for two mainland fisherman angling in Active Pass.

Ernie Pirson of Burnaby set out in an 18-foot fibreglass outboard motorboat with his friend Peter Deasey of North Vancouver. Tide was flooding Active Pass when the craft was struck and sheared in half by the seiner *Nordic Pride*, from Seattle. The two men were almost swept under the fishboat's bow, but managed to swim clear and were picked up by another fisherman.

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

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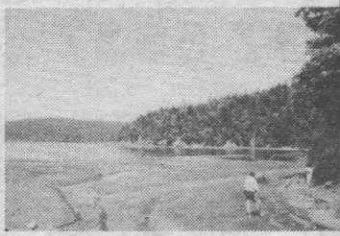

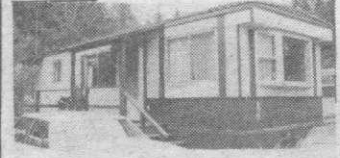
