First arts festival week offers play, concerts, children's show

A play, two concerts and a program for children are scheduled for the first week of Salt Spring Island's *Summer Festival of the Arts*, which opened Wednesday (July 1) with a kick-off party at the Salt Spring Elementary School Activity Centre.

The events schedule for the rest of this week includes:

- *Turning Thirty*, a one-woman theatrical production featuring Cheryl Cashman of Vancouver. It will be staged this Thursday, Friday and Saturday — July 2, 3 and 4 — at Off Centre Stage, beginning at 8:30 pm each day. Tickets are \$6.

Turning Thirty is written, directed and performed by Cashman, a former Salt Spring resident. It has received rave reviews across Canada, with the *Toronto Star* describing the work as "six hilarious, off-the-wall characters at home with their bizarre ways."

The *Festival of the Arts* program adds: "The marvel of *Turning Thirty* — and it is a marvellous show — lies partly in the sincerity and simplicity of the material, partly in the quietly amazing energy of the performance and partly in the rapport between the performer and audience."

- Actor, musician and clown Stuart Nemtin appears as Conrad Flapps this Saturday, July 4, in the first of this year's productions for children. The show gets underway at 12:30 pm at the Salt Spring Elementary School Activity Centre. Tickets are \$3.

Nemtin is a graduate of the University of B.C.'s theatre department who has acted professionally with theatre companies across Canada. His zany clown alter-ego, Major Conrad Flapps, has entertained audiences around the world with entangled flying scarves, flapping propellers and firey nose-dive crashes.

The *Festival* program adds: "He (Flapps) uses laughter as a medicinal tool, for stress relief and to show that failure need not be a negative, self-defeating experience. Major Flapps is a master of audience involvement with enormous energy and charm."

- Singer-guitarist Stephen Fearing will bring his "haunting and evocative style, his dark voice and innate talent" to Off Centre Stage this Monday, July 5, at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$5.

Described as an artist who supplies an "energy and enthusiasm that mesmerizes audiences young and old," Fearing was born in Vancouver, then spent two years in Minnesota and 11

years in Ireland. That background has influenced his repertoire and style, which combines a Celtic soul with explosive rhythm and blues.

The *Festival* program adds: "Critics across Western Canada rave about Fearing's 'infinitely controllable voice,' his 'spectacular guitar playing' and his own 'stunning, original compositions.' His own songs and instrumentals

are powerful, and his interpretations of other artists' material is unforgettable."

- The Original Balkan Jam, an eclectic ethnic-fusion band from Victoria, appears at the Salt Spring Elementary School next Wednesday, July 8. Tickets are \$6, and doors open at 8 pm for an ethnic smorgasbord that will be offered before the show.

The band, a fixture in Victoria for the past two years, is fast becoming Canada's leading ethno-fusion band. The music, although steeped in the traditions of Eastern Europe, is delivered with "a drive and vitality that is clearly 20th century," festival organizers say.

Band members are David Harris (violin, bagpipes, recorder); Marty Reynard (accordion, flute, bouzouki, recorder, mandolin, vocals); Derek Hawksley (guitar, bouzouki, cymbalor, vocals); and Alex Olson (string bass). In 1984, the group recorded and released the album, *Just Off The Boat*.

The 1987 *Summer Festival of the Arts*, which operates on a Wednesday-to-Sunday format, will stage 25 performances between now and its August 2 closing date.

Tickets for events range from \$3 to \$12 and are available at *et cetera*, as is a full program lineup. Further information is available at 537-4167 or 537-5211.

Full concert lineup finalized

The lineup of performers has been set for a series of free, Sunday-afternoon concerts to be held in Centennial Park.

The series begins this Sunday, July 5, with *Les Four*, a quartet featuring Antoine Prosk on bass, Doug Rhodes on drums, Gary Lundy on keyboards and Ray Newman on sax, clarinet and vibraharp.

The remainder of the program is as follows:

- July 12 — The Ken Speller Quartet (bop and jazz).
- July 19 — The Salt Spring Singers with guest Bryan Smith (choral).
- July 26 — *Second Wind* (jazz).
- August 2 — *Nu Impressions* (crossover).
- August 9 — Ray Newman "and friends" (peace weekend).
- August 16 — Susan Cogan "and friends" (folk-jazz); *Misty Isles* (middle-of-the-road); and Thomas Mychaude "and friends" (new-age folk-pop).
- August 23 — Jazz Festival weekend. A gospel service is scheduled.
- August 30 — Dave Roland and band (rhythm and blues, rock and country); and Cross, Young and Handle (Celtic rock).

• September 6 — All-Star concert, featuring a variety of performers.

(In case of inclement weather, concerts will take place at Ganges United Church Hall.)

All concerts in the series are scheduled to begin at 1 pm sharp and last at least 90 minutes. On dates with more than one performer or group noted, each act will

be limited to a set lasting 45 minutes.

Promotion of the concerts is a joint venture launched by the Chamber of Commerce and professional musicians. It has been funded by the Music Performance Trust Fund, the chamber and donations from local individuals and service groups.

Festival offers child-care

This year's version of the Salt Spring Island *Summer Festival of the Arts* will offer its patrons more than live entertainment.

The festival, which launched its 25-date program of theatrical and musical presentations on July 1, has added a child-care service and art displays to the traditional aspects of its program.

The child-care service will be available at both festival venues — Off Centre Stage and the Salt Spring Elementary School Activity Centre. For a small fee, parents attending festival events will be able to leave children in an adjacent room, in the care of an adult.

Organizers also note that at some of the events, children under the age of 12 years may be admitted for half price — but at the plays and most concerts, children's tickets will not be sold; in the interest of avoiding distractions.

The art displays, meanwhile, will be offered at Off Centre Stage, where the gallery-bistro space will be turned over for two different shows. The first, which opened the festival, is a showing of paintings in various mediums by contemporary artist Wayne Arsenaault. The second, opening in mid-July, will feature a group show by local artists representing work in various mediums — i.e., pottery, fabric arts, oils and watercolours.

Ottawa singer-songwriter to perform on island stage

Ottawa-based musician-composer Ian Tamblyn will perform in concert at Off Centre Stage this Friday and Saturday, July 3 and 4.

Each night's concert will be staged at 10:30 pm, following presentation of *Turning Thirty*, a theatrical comedy being shown at Off Centre Stage in conjunction with the Salt Spring Island *Summer Festival of the Arts*.

Tickets for the Ian Tamblyn concerts are \$3 each and available at *et cetera* or at the door. For further information, call Off Centre Stage at 537-5211.


Tamblyn's visit to Salt Spring is being made while the artist is en route to the Arctic for his "annual acoustic study of whales and walruscs," Off Centre Stage says.

Off Centre Stage notes that Tamblyn's mixing of the sounds of natural environments with human voices and instrumentation is nothing new to the artist. His latest project, *Over My Head*, is "gentle music speckled with bird songs of each season in the Gatineaus," it says. The work was commissioned by the Museum of Natural Sciences to mark its ornithological exhibition.

Tamblyn is also involved in theatre through his collaboration with *The Great Theatre Company of Ottawa*. He has provided the music for a number of their productions, and written three plays which premiered in the Ottawa region.

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Perusal of six art magazines leaves room for improvement

Last week I had a brief look at the May edition of *National Geographic* magazine. In ancient times I would thumb through the wonderful photographs of lands and people exotic and far afield. The pages most often showed a romantic vision of the world and only occasionally hinted that some things were amiss.

This latest edition, however, presented a strong visual treatment of how man has abused his environment and the cost that he will incur by a headlong charge to get something for nothing. There ain't no free rides and actually saying this seems to be becoming fashionable. (Either this or the *National Geographic* board of governors has been usurped by the Green Party.)

This all got me thinking about art magazines and how they tend to project different but specific attitudes towards cultural awareness.

I have six of them in front of me. Three are Canadian, two are American and one is European. The Canadian magazines are *Fuse*, *Vanguard* and *Canadian Art*. The American ones are *Art in America* and *The Artists Magazine*, and the European one is *Flash Art*. Let's compare.

Fuse presents *Labour Working with Art* and *The Lubicon Lake Band Wins Cultural Boycott* as typical subject matter in their headlines. *The Artists Magazine* promotes *Capturing Realism in Coloured Pencil and Drawing with Markers*.

The two worlds could not be further apart in their concerns. Both are didactic and speak to the converted: left wing on the one hand and out to lunch on the right.

Fuse has articles such as *Cultural Struggle and Magazine Survival*, *Video News*, *Lillian Allen and the Future of Canadian Reggae* and a scathing review of Paul Simon's *Graceland* album. One illustration promotes Picasso as a union man. It proselytizes and confronts at every turn.

The Artists Magazine is the other extreme. It has lots of mail

order goodies to buy and even has an advertisers index. One is convinced that selling art supplies and related paraphernalia is really what the thing is about. In its pages we find detailed do-it-yourself instruction on where and how to sell your art, how to do wood engravings, how to paint a whale, how to collaborate with another artist. *The Art of Self Promotion* and *How to Find Happiness and Money by Communing with Mother Nature*. Sounds like Oral Roberts to me!

Let's move on to *Vanguard*. It is published in Vancouver and is billed as providing essays, reviews and information on historical and contemporary art, with the emphasis on the latter. No colour pictures here and its prose ranges from folksy to impenetrable, depending on the writer.

Try this one on for size: "As modernism devolved into eutropic closure, the futility of pursuing the idea of an abstract and autonomous art became increasingly evident." Heavy duty, but if one has patience, one might glean from its intellectual garble the germ of a new idea.

Canadian Art has nice colour pictures and its information is generally accessible to most minds. Its documentary style attempts to encourage popular understanding of art and artists and to promote

connoisseurship.

This means that when you get to be famous somebody else will make lots of money from your art.

There are lots of advertisements for gallery shows and they feature articles on well-known artists. But unlike *Vanguard*, it seems to pass by young artists showing in alternate galleries, preferring reviews of public gallery shows. It is very respectable.

Art in America is out of the same mold — glossy, sumptuous colours and readable articles on contemporary and historical artists, as well as regional news. Not much more to say except that it is bigger and cheaper but with more ads. Neither one of these magazines seeks to radically challenge, but rather to persuade.

Of all the magazines, *Flash Art* is the one which best combines all the approaches (including the technical, how-to advice). This publication is as much directed toward the artist as it is the audience, and does not pander to "collectors" as much as the previous two magazines. It has far less advertising but you pay commensurately for the higher quality.

It informs us about many of the significant international trends in art and publishes reviews and interviews with well-known artists. Some of its essays are difficult, but others are stimulating and accessible.

It doesn't say much about Canadian art or any other place that is deemed a backwater. The design of the magazine is intelligent and artful, and there is a section in French. By far the best on the market.

So, my advice is — don't subscribe to anything. Buy single issues of each when you're looking for a new perspective on art and artists.

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Diverse clientele, artworks

Approach key to gallery's success

Stretched out kitty-corner to the Volume II bookstore in Mouat's Mall is Pegasus Gallery: a space proud of its development since 1970, and proud of the quality of artworks it displays.

The gallery is owned by Yvonne Toynbee, a former musician and actress with the CBC, who took it over in 1980 from Reg Ashwell, a freelance writer and noted authority on Northwest Coast Indian art.

Toynbee has since twice expanded the gallery to accommodate the public's increasing interest in Canadian art.

The gallery reaches an impressive audience. Ashwell, who is still associated with Pegasus, comments: "We have art patrons, art lovers and collectors from around the world."

Toynbee agrees, noting Pegasus attracts customers from far and wide "because of the reputation of the gallery."

She feels the attraction of Salt Spring Island itself helps to draw an assorted audience. "The increasing interest in B.C. and somewhat out-of-the-way places, plus the fact that Salt Spring is becoming known as a place where artists and art lovers come to find good quality art, means we get a vast number of visitors," she said.

The selection of art and artists showcased at Pegasus is as diverse as the gallery's visitors. "People aren't always in the market for a large painting or a big sculptural piece," Toynbee says. "The gallery also carries Northwest Indian art in wood, gold and silver, and works by artists of all kinds. It offers high-quality gifts as well as art."

In the gallery can be found raku, small and large wood carvings, stone carvings, jewellery, watercolours, sculptures, ivory carvings, argillite figures, and a framing service. On display are the works of roughly two-dozen well-known Canadian artists.

However, the main feature of Pegasus is the captivating art of West Coast Indians. The collection centres around the Haida, Tlingit, Tsimshian, Bella Coola, Nootka, and Coast Salish tribes who specialize in wood, gold, silver, argillite and basketry. Once one is acquainted with the basics of the art, it becomes fascinating and speaks vividly of present and traditional beliefs and environment.

Toynbee suggests that having displays of works by 100-plus artists is more advantageous than offering a large collection representing one or two artists, and that it is better suited to the Salt Spring market. "We've managed to have such a diverse number of artists, excellent in so many different ways, all in the same spot."

She said the arrangement also allows prospective buyers a greater selection of attitudes and expressions in the range of artworks being considered. Thus, a buyer can choose from among a number of recognized artists all featured in one gallery, instead of searching from one gallery to the next.

While on her toes to serve customers year-round, and to please her off-island visitors, Toynbee says she listens carefully to the interests of the many collectors who patronize the gallery. While she enjoys the person-

al involvement immensely, her rapport with the clientele and artists results in a diversity of exhibitions and, quite simply, increased interest in the gallery.

Also, Ashwell's long standing relationship with many of the artists — Native and non-Native, local and international — has helped in the gallery's success. He, and now Toynbee as well, have the privilege of selecting the art they want for the Pegasus gallery in its unique location. So, they carefully pick a little from each artist and — presto! the gallery is bursting with watercolours, oils, sculptures, and carvings by many different artists. It makes for interesting shopping and difficult choices.

Evidently close contact with the clientele, close ties with the artists and shrewd shopping on Toynbee's part have enabled the gallery to boom with success.

The Pegasus is managed with energy and discretion so there is little chance the displays will become mundane. Toynbee is always looking for new art and

artists, she says: "It's become a focal point in every trip; whenever I go anywhere now I'm always looking." The gallery is subsequently restocking, rehangng, adding and subtracting from shows to keep the exhibitions current and diverse.

They occasionally do special shows — for example, the just-completed display of Ashwell's former Northwest Coast Indian art collection.

The staff at Pegasus gallery is extremely friendly and helpful, so

if you have questions about a gold bracelet, or some ivory dolphins, this watercolour or that raku, you will, no doubt, be helped promptly and informatively.

Next time you're in this area of Mouat's Mall, pop in and enjoy some current Canadian art by locals, Indian craftsmen and internationally-known artists. Be shown around by art lovers and soak up the casually sophisticated atmosphere of Salt Spring's oldest gallery: the Pegasus.

Pender residents outline ferry 'service' concerns

The Pender Islands hospitality industry and weekend commuters whose principal residence is on the island but who work on the lower mainland during the week, are just a few of many people who are upset by the new ferry schedule for service between Otter Bay and Tsawwassen.

That feeling was made clear at a meeting last Saturday when Mel Couvelier and Terry Huberts, MLAs for Saanich-and-the-Islands, accompanied by Blair Cafferky, executive assistant to the minister of finance and corporate relations.

Over 40 people attended the two-hour meeting, which got underway at 9:15 at the Community Centre.

Eileen Robertson of the Pender Islands Transportation Committee chaired the meeting. Other members on the committee of five are George McLeod, Dorothy Henshaw, Frank Jones and Shirley Searle.

On Friday evening the ferry from Tsawwassen to Otter Bay — which should leave Tsawwassen at 9:30 pm to arrive at Otter Bay at 10:45 pm — docked at midnight. That's too late, the meeting was told. Customers lose an evening at the Port Browning Pub, the Legion, Bedwell Resort, Pender Lodge and numerous other establishments.

People who keep their boats at the marinas and live on them during the summer weekends are in the same position, and recreational vehicle owners, campers and hikers encounter difficulty finding their way in the dark at midnight, it was noted.

Penny Tomlin of Cliffside stated that "the late bed and breakfast arrival will kill the b & b weekend package deals." Lou Henshaw of the Port Browning restaurant and pub reiterated that her business is suffering on Friday evening because of the late arrival of the ferry.

The Pender Islands Transportation Committee said it has received scores of letters and verbal complaints, likely numbering into the hundreds,

objecting to the Friday, Saturday and Sunday schedule.

It was also noted that the Saturday schedule has the ferry leaving Tsawwassen at 12:40 pm to arrive at Otter Bay at 1:45 pm. Last Saturday, it did not arrive until after 3:30 pm.

A separate and unpopular annoyance, the meeting said, is the trip from Otter Bay to Tsawwassen every weekday. The ferry leaves Otter Bay at 4:45 pm, which cuts down the Monday afternoon for those wishing to return on Monday after the weekend. By comparison with the previous year, the ferry left around 8 pm and the regular run was at 5:15 pm.

On the other hand, Bea Lane, a Pender resident, said "we are now receiving wonderful service to Swartz Bay."

Although the ferry service to the mainland was of critical concern at the meeting, residents also requested an opportunity to receive the Knowledge Network on TV.

Complaints that Pender roads were not up to the standard of the other islands were also heard. Couvelier replied that "it may be Pender's turn for some improved road surfacing."

The increase in small farms tax exemptions from \$1,600 to \$5,000 was another cause for concern.

Island living sure to prompt some resistance to change

The role that islands have played in human affairs would provide material for a library of books. Strategically, geopolitically, economically and even psychologically, islands have often dominated human thinking. Donne may have affirmed that no man is an island, and it follows that many a man has found that an island can be a prison if by accident, defeat or choice he is cut off from human contact.

It is thought by many that there is a psychology of islanders. The well-known expression that "you don't have to be crazy to live on Galiano but it sure helps," suggests that the psychology of anyone living on this island is abnormal.

Those who retire to live on a Gulf Island must make the adjustment from the normal psychology of an urban environment to the 'abnormal' of island living or their dream of island living will turn into a nightmare.

A special case is the person who yearns to own an island — the whole island. Perhaps there is something of this in all of us as the great success of the lottery, the prize for which was an island in Ganges Harbour. A study of such persons can be read in *Once Upon an Island*, about Wallace Island in Trincomali Channel.

In the same channel, Reid Island was once the domain of old Joe da Silva. The owner of Julia Island at the entrance to Montague Harbour manages to offend no one by perpetual absence. George Plange and Ann on Retreat Island were long accepted on Galiano before moving inconspicuously onto their island.

Sometimes owning an island is an ego trip. There is a small island off the south coast of England called Lundy, the owner of which during the period between the wars, issued his own postage stamps. Many owners of small islands develop a fierce territoriality and repel all invaders.

Is this the case with the new owner of Lion Islet? The island, a few acres in extent, is the cork in the bottle of Whaler Bay, and has been known for decades as *One-tree Island*. It has dominated the seaward view of the hundred or so residents of homes that line the shore of Whaler Bay. It must be known to thousands of fishermen, both sport and commercial, who have trolled past it, and it has been witness to more than one tragic drowning. Now the owner of a few months is having a residence constructed on the island.

No doubt the occupation of the island represents an interesting challenge both to the owner and various departments of government. How will potable water be obtained and how will the CRD check on the adequacy and purity? Will the building inspector wade across at low tide, swim or arrive by air? How will the architect deal with the challenge of such an exposed site buffeted by every wind that blows?

Local residents offered to buy back the island for the purchase price and turn it over to the provincial government or the regional district for a park to be left in its natural state. Naturally, the new owner declined and last week a helicopter spent most of a day bringing over building materials.

It is too late for *should've*. Residents whose outlook is being forever altered can console

themselves with the thought that, although it is human to resist change, it is also human to adapt to change. In a few years or even months the new-look Lion Islet will become part of the background and rarely noticed.





Frankenstein and other monsters — from Lyle, who said he had chosen it from a pile in a voodoo shop in Togoville, Togo. He mentioned that he was intrigued by the strangeness of the Western name signatures on the back.

Dave, aged 40, showed the card to his 80-year-old father, Eric Young, who was absolutely astounded to find on reading the signatures on the back of the card that they were those of former co-workers. They had sent him the card 27 years previously, for his 53rd birthday in 1960.

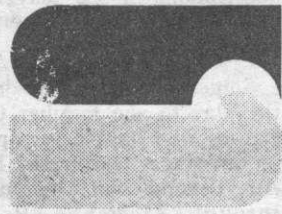
Grandfather Young recalled that his late wife used to save greeting cards and pass them on to missionaries who, he can only assume, must have sent them to Africa. Coincidence — or do you believe in voodoo?

In Praise of Younger Women

This story should bear no resemblance to the rather lecherous novel and subsequent film which praised older women. Of course age is a relative thing. As the difference in age increases, it becomes harder and harder to estimate with any accuracy the age of a young person, especially of the opposite sex. I know that my subject is not a teen-ager even from her appearance, but unless I begin some mental arithmetic using such variables as the age of her children, I have no idea whether she is in her early 20s or early 30s. But from the view of an old codger she is definitely a very young woman. I know she would not thank me for naming her even if I write to praise her, so she must remain anonymous.

Many women with great talent for business or administration are frustrated by the tradition of male dominance in those fields. From our experience on Galiano with the Activity Centre-School complex, young women prove they are as competent, hard-working and achievement-oriented as any male. The first president of the Activity Centre Society and the driving force behind the successful campaign to fund and build the Centre was Linda Laughlin, at that time a young mother. Up to now the most imaginative use of the centre has been by Akasha Forest who organized the *Summer School of the Arts*. The latest improvement to the centre-school facility is the development of a playing field.

Mere males looked at the wasteland of gravel, sparse vegetation, rock ridges and forest that made the Galiano School playing field the disgrace of the Gulf Islands School District and decided that it was impossible to turn it into a respectable sports area. Not so the School Parents Committee, who made the inspired choice of one of their number to preside over a committee to deal with the problem. She cajoled our former MLA to loosen provincial purse-strings and award a Lottery grant, she bullied the school board and superintendent, she enlisted the help of males who could be useful and she terrorized contractors and supervisors by her meticulous attention to detail and almost daily attendance on the work site. Now almost complete, the Galiano playing field will be the best in the district and will provide for public use a full size soccer pitch and a respectable ball diamond. Maybe pedestrian by name, she has run the show at the double. Let us now praise younger women.

Early Gulf Islands explorers find portent of things to come

Salt Spring Island, we are told, was first seen by Europeans in the late 1700s. However, a manuscript which came into my hands recently shows it was not only discovered — but explored, in 1721, by the famous Spanish navigatrix, Dona Juana Rumba in her galleon *Santa Clos*.

She was a most remarkable woman. She and Don Juan Rumba, the captain of the *Santa Clos*, were newlyweds when the vessel sailed from Cadiz in 1720 with instructions to explore the west coast of North America. Bewitching and domineering, Juana soon learned the intricacies of ship-handling — keel-hauling, yardam-hanging and the like — and, having demoted her husband to ordinary seaman, took over command.

The passage around the Horn and up the west coast of the Americas was uneventful, except for a ceremony in San Francisco when her husband, who had tried to organize a mutiny, was made to walk the plank. Her diary reveals that this was not an easy decision for her: "I am, after all, a member of the gentle sex," she wrote, "but que sera, sera." After watching Don Juan go down for the third time she ordered a tot of rum for all hands and weighed anchor.

Mistaking the Strait of Juan de Fuca for the Northwest Passage, she sailed through them to land at what is now Gasoline Alley on Salt Spring Island. In an elaborate ceremony, all of the land was transferred to the King of Spain, and the Indians became subjects of His Majesty. They were cautioned about the penalties for disobedience, and since they didn't speak Spanish this was repeated in a loud voice to make sure that they understood. Excerpts from her diary follow:

"May 15. Having had the *Santa Clos* hauled up on the beach with instructions to the crew to careen her with dispatch or be flogged, I promenaded with my officers to a nearby green where a market was in progress at which woven baskets, ornaments and all manner of artifacts, new or old, together with foodstuffs, were sold, while certain shamans harangued the people. On enquiring the matter of their discourses, we were told that they were head men, soliciting votes in the tribal councils, and would later be making incantations in their constituency teepee. We were also told that certain other islanders, a lesser number, wished to use the green exclusively for their drum dances and pow-wows, and were urging that the market move elsewhere. When we enquired where it should go, they indicated a long distance, either horizontally out to sea or vertically downwards"

"May 16. On this day we attended a general council of the islanders, having by diligent study learned enough of the language to understand what was said. We ascertained that the purpose was to lay before the people certain proposals for the use of the land. One man wanted to establish a factory for arrow heads, spear points and the like, but it was

asserted that the noise of his hammers would keep others awake. Another wished to smoke the bounteous local salmon (this is not in lieu of tobacco, but a process for preservation) but neighbouring islanders feared asphyxiation, as did those adjacent to a man who wished to burn out cedar logs for canoes. Harsh words were exchanged, especially when it was charged that the moon would turn blue before such enterprises would appear near the lodges of the affluent. Fearing to be drawn into the confrontation, we withdrew.

"May 17. The island being served by many trails, on this day we walked to the north end, where there are springs from which issue gushes of salt water, although

above half a league from the sea, for which reason I have named the island 'La Isla de Fuentes Saladas.'

Then, seeing a concourse of people at a nearby lake which we had named in honour of the Blessed Virgin, we ascertained that there was a dispute between many who wished to use the waters for paddling or playing on rafts with the children, and some others who with swift war canoes wished to engage in races and mock battles, thus shattering the peace. So disputatious were they that my counsel had no effect and being assailed on all sides by cries which I translated as 'get lost', I thought it prudent to withdraw.

"May 18. The *Santa Clos* being not yet ready, and wishing to explore the waters adjacent to the island, we used one of the commercial passenger canoes which depart at regular intervals for trading and social contact with neighbouring tribes. They are swift, commodious and seaworthy, and we praised the islanders for possessing them, but found, to our astonishment, that there is much disaffection about them. One complains that they are too slow, another that the food is improperly prepared or the utensils of inferior quality, another that the charge is excessive. Yet we found that the service compares with any in Spain, thought to be the best in the world, yet this being pointed out, there was only disbelief.

"May 19. The *Santa Clos* being now ready for sea, with ample supplies of fresh water and victuals, we prepared to leave, resisting the entreaties of some groups of islanders who wished to buy some of our cannons — for souvenirs, they said. We thought it was best to refuse, lest they do each other an injury. Our last act was a solemn proclamation which, in the name of His Imperial Majesty, Philip V of Spain, gave them their island back, it being decided, upon reflection, that our beloved monarch already had sufficient contentiousness in his dominions. Possibly our ancient enemy, England, may be inveigled into taking over."

This ends that portion of Dona Juana's diaries relevant to Salt Spring and the neighbouring islands. Following the return of the *Santa Clos* to Spain, she decided to settle down. She remarried — several times in fact. All of her husbands were wealthy, and all, by coincidence, had fatal accidents. With the proceeds of the estates the widow purchased a pirate ship, and went back to sea to forget her grief. Regrettably, little is known about her later career. Certainly a woman answering her description ruled West Africa for many decades. She had a harem of husbands, and was worshipped as a goddess. Was it Dona Juana? We may never know.

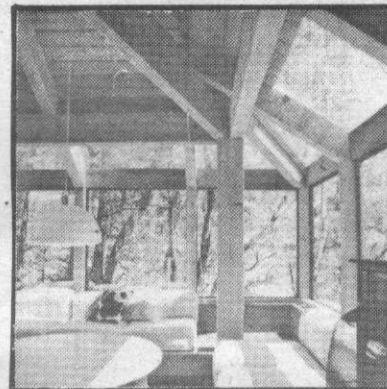

Eighth year on island

Painting workshops prove popular

An estimated 200 painting students began arriving on Salt Spring Island last week to take part in the eighth annual series of workshops staged here by the Federation of Canadian Artists.

The painters are students — young and old — who spend one week applying paint to canvas at various island locations, taking part in evening workshops and showing their works at an end-of-session display open to the public.

The first group of painters, 110 in number, visited Salt Spring last week and showed their works last Friday in the hall of Our Lady of Grace Catholic Church on Drake Road. The second group, numbering about 80, arrived last Saturday and will hang the results of their week's efforts this Friday at the church hall from 2 pm to 5 pm.

The workshops began in 1980 under the direction of local resident Allan Edwards, a noted painter and former president of the Federation of Canadian Artists. Bob Rennie, a North Vancouver resident who began co-ordinating the sessions in 1983, told *Driftwood* the event has since gained national and international prominence.

"We have participants who go down to sessions in Florida, for instance, and are told by people there that the best workshop they've been to is the one on Salt Spring Island," Rennie said, adding that this year's classes, include students from New Zealand and Australia who travelled to Salt Spring specifically for the painting instruction offered.

"We're known far and wide," he said.

The reputation of the workshops has not gone unnoticed by instructors, Rennie continued. "We have one instructor here, Max Brandt, who can go anywhere in the world to teach. He's the guru of the California school of watercolours. He only goes to three places a year to teach — and this is one of them."

There are 11 instructors for the two sessions — including two of only 50 members of a national U.S. painter's association — who spent the first week dealing exclusively with watercolours. The second session, now underway, adds one program in oil painting to the lineup of watercolour instruction.

The students, meanwhile, cover all ranges of age, background and expertise. Also in the classes this year are a number of scholar-

ship recipients, including one from Salt Spring Island. Alison Mouat joins eight art students from Capilano College and two school students from the Abbotsford area.

The program format sees classes set up easels at various island locations, primarily farms and beaches, Rennie said. Group sessions are held in the morning, and individual ones in the afternoon. Each day, the group moves to a new location and has a different instructor.

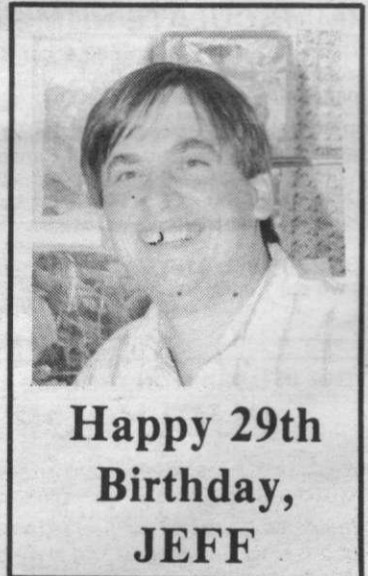
In the evenings, participants sit in on demonstrations given by the various instructors.

The group format extends from painting to living conditions, Rennie said. People enrolled in the workshop stay at one of four

"Part of this is the people

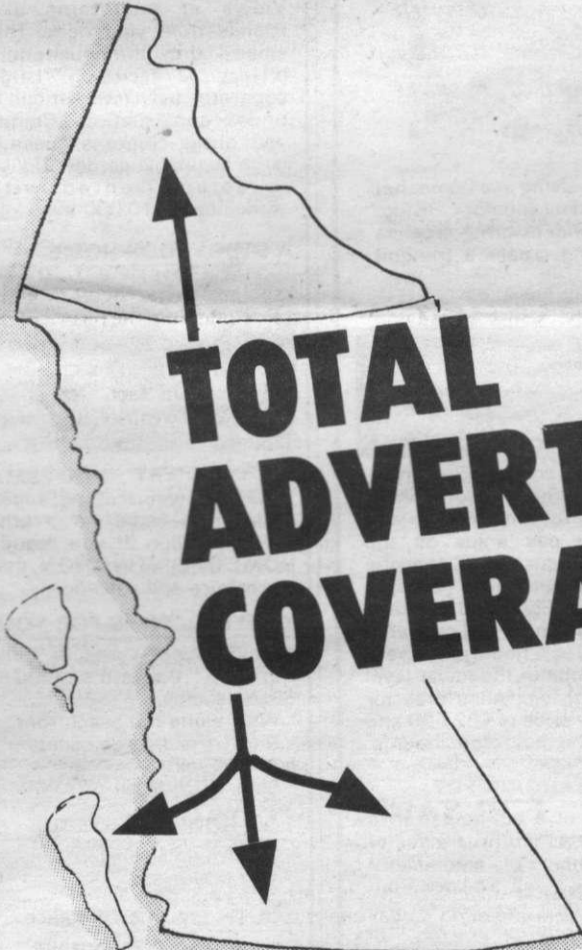
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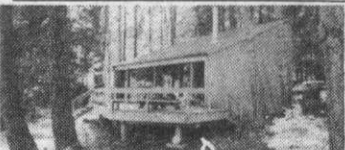
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Arrival of hot summer weather causes some concern for plants

your garden

For all it's worth, we've made our way through June and find ourselves in a bit of a heat wave. Hopefully, it will last right on through to October — but if there isn't some decent rain soon, we'll also be headed into a long, tough drought. A few wells on the island are already in jeopardy, and the soil is pretty well bone-dry. Even the subsoil doesn't have the moisture reserve that the plants will need to make it through the dry months ahead.

In reality the picture isn't all bleak. The hot sunny weather is boosting plant growth, the zucchini plants are starting to bear and the annuals are zooming into bloom. The hardy lilies are giving a splendid show and, surprisingly, the cooler June weather has allowed some of the primulas and pansies to keep on blooming. When the pansies finally finish their first show, cut them back to four to six inches, so that they'll branch, bush up and give a second flowering later on in the season.

The bearded irises are over, and you may safely divide and replant them if they have become overcrowded or aren't blooming quite as well as they used to. Use a sharp knife to separate the vigorous pieces with good leaf shoots, and take care to plant them even with, or just one inch below, the soil surface. Otherwise, they may develop rots.

The Japanese irises should be kept well-watered until they have finished blooming, and then left to dry off for the remainder of the season. If you wish, divide them after flowering.

The michaelmas daisies should be cut back to six inches in height to make full, bushy, bloom-laden plants. Once the delphiniums, hollyhocks, foxgloves and phlox have bloomed, cut off the flowered stems to encourage a later, second showing.

You can still sow most of your perennials and biennials, especially the wallflowers, myosotis (*forget-me-nots*), pansies, primulas and broomrape stocks. If you were organized and got to that job last month, then take some time to prick out the young seedlings or do some judicious thinning if they've been direct-sown out into the flower or vegetable beds.

Shear back your summer-blooming heathers once they finish, and shear the lavender hard, after the seed has formed.

Remember that it's the lavender seeds, not the flowers, that will give you long-lasting fragrance for indoor use. Around the middle of the month, take cuttings of hollyhocks and dianthus for propagation, and multiply your carnations by layering them in a sandy, loam mix.

Keep giving your peonies regular, deep waterings and feed them with a balanced fertilizer, as they're storing energy for next year's show. Tie up your tall perennials that may be prone to falling over and breaking the flower stems, most notably your mums and dahlias. After the tops of your fall croci and colchicums die down, you can safely lift and divide them, and if you don't have any of these lovely late season bloomers, you can buy some in late July and August. July is a good month for multiplying your bleeding hearts and oriental poppies, by taking one-to-two-inch root cuttings and starting them off in a sandy loam soil mix.

Santolina is another perennial-subshrub that needs some attention this month. This drought-tolerant, sun-loving plant produces its silvery grey foliage in profusion over the course of the summer, and it has a delightful fragrance when brushed or disturbed, but its flowers, produced in July-August, have a rather pungent, almost objectionable odour. If you have the plant out of smelling range, then the bright, golden yellow blooms should be left on the plant until they fade and turn a bit brown, before pruning back the whole plant.

If, on the other hand, the plant is within nose's range then prune back the entire plant as the flowers start to form. For santolina, also known as cotton lavender, pruning back is a severe reduction job, removing almost all of the season's growth. Leave only an inch or so and you will keep a full bushy plant with good form and healthy foliage. If you fail to prune these vigorous growers, they will develop a rank, open, unappealing character, selling them far short of their true abilities.

In the vegetable garden, July is a busy month with most of the time being taken up by watering and weeding chores. There is plenty to harvest: globe artichokes, peas, broad beans, carrots, beets, kohlrabi, early potatoes, radishes, herbs, chard, lettuce, zucchini and loads more, but it is also time to stop harvesting a couple of things, namely rhubarb and definitely asparagus, so that they can regroup and build up their energy levels for next year's production.

Tie up and pinch out the vegetative secondary shoots on your tomatoes, and play bee by giving the plants a tap, or a bloom tickle around mid-day to ensure fruit set. Do a pollination job for your squash plants as well as carrying around a male flower for pollen supply. Sow more corn, early maturing peas, and some more radishes for continued production. As beds or rows are harvested, sow down a green manure or cover crop such as vetch or buckwheat to aid organic matter to the soil, as well as to help reduce weeding chores.

Stop watering your garlic and shallots now, and onions late in the month, to allow the bulbs to ripen and cure. The garlic and shallots should be harvested at the end of July, and the soil should be pulled away from the base of the onions to permit sizing up and ripening of the bulbs for harvesting in August.

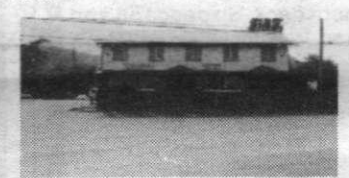

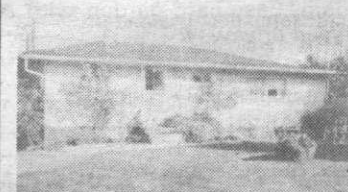

Twenty-five years ago

• Joan Bidwell, valedictorian of the Class of 1962, was presented with the Citizenship Award at an impressive graduation ceremony in Mahon Hall.

Members of the graduating class passed lighted candles symbolizing the torch of learning to the school's Grade 11 class. It was the third year the tradition had been followed, and the same candles were used as had been employed in the previous two years.

Bidwell summed up her valedictory address with the Robert Frost poem, *The Road Not Taken*.

• The ministry of highways painted a dotted line down the centre of Salt Spring's main road, but not a solid line to indicate that no passing would be permitted.

This had some local islanders concerned about safety, particularly when tourists arrived. • It was rumoured that a local chicken farmer got caught up in a traffic jam in Vancouver. Apparently, the sights and sounds of the city didn't agree with him, because he sneezed—and in the process shot his false teeth out the open vehicle window and into the street.

Twenty years ago

• A Centennial project for every Salt Spring Islander was offered by Lieutenant-Governor of British Columbia when he formally opened Centennial Park in Ganges.

"Just decide to make this island a little bit better and a little bit happier," General George Pearkes said.

• Trustees of the Gulf Islands School District expressed concern that the public was critical of Gulf Islands Secondary and considered it a particularly costly structure.

Gil Humphreys, chairman of the district, told *Driftwood* that the architects responsible for the project had already made an analysis of the costs. The building, said Humphreys, was expected to cost \$474,000—or about \$16 per square foot.

• Mac Mouat went further afield to find two fish. He enjoyed the trip to Miner's Bay, until he came home to compare notes with Laurie Mouat. Laurie, he learned, had stayed around Ganges Harbour and caught 43 pounds of fish.

• Ganges banker Steve Polywkan was installed as president of the Salt Spring Island Rotary Club at ceremonies held in Fulford Hall.

• The airstrip at Fulford, on Cudmore property, was to be the subject of a Supreme Court trial.

The Capital Regional District instructed its solicitors to proceed with a civil action against West Ganges Holdings Limited in Supreme Court. The company in question was promoting the airstrip, and Gordon Cudmore was one of its principal officers. • Discussions between the Capital Regional District and MacMillan-Boedel were postponed.

The two groups had planned to meet and talk over the company's plans for its holdings on Galiano Island. D. F. McCrimmon, a representative of the company's new real estate division, told CRD officials there was no point in meeting with them until MB had a

concrete development proposal to present.

Ten Years Ago

• The era of free travel between the Gulf Islands was coming to an end.

The B. C. Ferry Corporation announced that it was again considering the establishment of fares on the Salt Spring-Outer Islands route. The fares were removed in June of the previous year when charges were doubled on all other corporation routes.

• Dorothy Kyle was appointed resource centre clerk for the Gulf Islands School District. Kyle was one of 34 applicants for the post.

• A plaque was to be unveiled in Ganges on Canada Day to commemorate the pioneer families of Salt Spring.

The plaque was being prepared by the Capital Regional Board and would be unveiled by Mrs. Michael Gyves of Fulford. It would be set up in Centennial Park, and tied in with the planting of trees in the park 10 years earlier.

• Galiano students were not being permitted to attend high school on Salt Spring.

The board of school trustees rejected a plea from Galiano parents for daily transportation

for children in Grades Eight through 12. Superintendent Bob Huestis was instructed to prepare a list of attendance areas to clearly indicate where island students would attend school.

Five Years Ago

• There were 100 fewer licences issued to Outer Gulf Islands vehicles in 1981 compared to the previous year.

The Outer Islands were considered one licensing body by the Motor Vehicle Branch. In 1980, 2,726 licences were issued in the region, while in the following year 2,633 licences were handed out.

• A squash and racketball facility was planned for Salt Spring Island.

Several committees had been formed in previous years to work toward this goal, but none had achieved it. However, a five-man committee formed in 1981 came up with a building plan, costs, membership regulations and location.
