

Horse-drawn theatrical troupe to visit islands

A horse-drawn theatrical troupe will perform on the Gulf Islands this August.

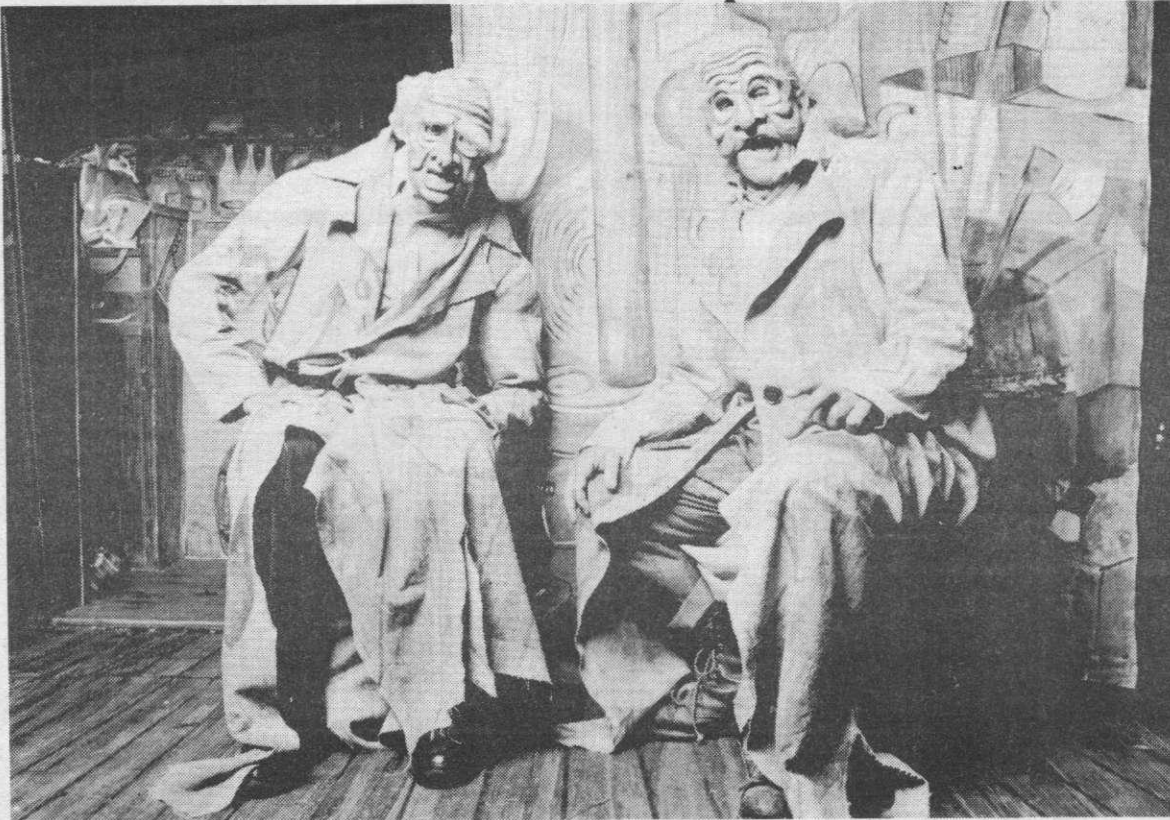
The Caravan Stage Company, based in the Cowichan Valley, will present its brand of theatre to audiences on Salt Spring, Galiano, Mayne and Pender islands.

The group's appearance on Salt Spring — at the Salt Spring Elementary School grounds on August 7 and 8 — will be the first on its Gulf Islands tour, which is part of a larger circuit of appearances throughout the Vancouver Island region.

On stage when the company appears will be an original play, *The Good Baby*, written by Governor-General Award winner Leon Rooke. Directed by Paul Thompson, the production is billed as a modern morality play which involves masks, music and mystery.

The Caravan Stage Company began 17 years ago in Sooke with one wagon, two horses and two performers. It has since grown to include four horse-drawn wagons, nine Clydesdales, a big top tent, five outrider horses and a body of 20 performers and stage crew members.

After performances on Salt Spring, the company is scheduled to visit Mayne Island on August 14 and 15, Galiano Island on

August 18 and 19, and Pender Island on August 21 and 22. Before touring the Gulf Islands, the group will have performed in a number of Vancouver Island communities between Campbell

River and Duncan; after leaving the islands, it will visit the Victoria area, winding up its circuit in Sooke.

The schedule marks the company's first major tour of the

Vancouver Island region. Since its inception in 1970, it has travelled through B.C., Alberta, Ontario, Washington State, Oregon and California.

Sunshine Coast book useful

A book has just been published for people who've always wanted to explore B.C.'s Sunshine Coast — especially off the beaten track.

From Harbour Publishing Ltd. comes *Sunshine and Salt Air*, an updated and more inclusive guide to the little-known hiking and walking trails, fishing holes and campgrounds of the area described in its predecessor, *Hiking Trails of the Sunshine Coast* (1977).

The book, subtitled "a recreational guide to the Sunshine Coast," covers the area from Gibsons to Powell River. Its 175 pages are divided into 18 sections, seven of which relate directly to the Powell River area. Another five sections cover hiking trails and sights between Gibsons and Saltery Bay, and the remaining six chapters concern parks,

cycling, canoeing, downhill skiing in the Powell River area, and cross-country skiing.

Each chapter contains a wealth of information about trails, including access (by road, water, another trail, highway, etc.), hiking time, the toughness of the trail, points of interest along the way and, importantly, hazards encountered along the way.

In total, the book contains over 60 maps and 40 black and white photos (although some are not as clear or as current as might be desired) and a clean visual look throughout. Maps and keys are extensive and fairly easy to follow.

The book's preamble is also helpful, listing some basic rules of thumb like essential emergen-

cy phone numbers and directions on how to contact transportation agencies like B.C. Ferries.

Overall, the book is factual, pleasant and direct; hikers don't have to wade through pages of unnecessary detail to find pertinent information. At the same time, the detail is extensive enough to give readers a feel for the area.

Weather co-operates to make Galiano's Jamboree a success

The sun shone kindly on North Galiano for the July 1st Jamboree and the leaf-dappled glade where the festivities took place provided a pleasant combination of warmth and shade.

Parade Marshall Norman Russell is noted for his eccentric wardrobe. This year he wore a helmet fashioned from juice cans and by his side, to emphasize the motif of the day, was a most remarkable Trojan horse.

In this year's parade there were live horses, *Driftwood* horses, a pantomime horse representing St. Margaret's Church and staffed by a Lay Reader and a Warden, and a plywood cut-out of a life-size Lady Godiva side-saddle (with all the raw talent in the Galiano Players, one would think that a cut-out substitute was hardly necessary). Horse power was illustrated by beautifully polished antique cars, and by Ralph Brine's tractor manned by a pride of grandchildren.

With the parade vehicles arranged lager-like around the parking lot, the opening ceremonies began with the singing of *O Canada* led by the local Mountie in his scarlet uniform. Master of ceremonies Woody Coward presented Harry Baines, Mary Harding, Bill Scoones and Marg Prior with medals for their length of Galiano citizenship, and certificates of appreciation to representatives of local service organizations.

The entertainment program opened appropriately with spirited music by the Abbottsford Rube Band. Now the spectators were free to stroll around the stalls, to buy popcorn or tee-shirts, to roll balls, throw darts, pitch bean-bags, ride horses, create hobby horses, fashion imaginative eye-shades, buy play tickets, join the Health Care Society, or satisfy the inner man or woman with pita bread, salad and pie a la mode.

The coolness of the hall beckoned people to examine the many exhibits mounted there — horses of all kinds, of world fame, or in local history. Memorabilia abounded; there was a list of Galiano telephone subscribers for

1932 — a mere handful, two of which were the herring salteries.

Perhaps most interesting were the newspaper cuttings of the life and death of John Peter, who was granted land on Galiano as a reward for his many years as personal servant to Sir James Douglas. John lived in his Galiano home until he was 100 and died as the result of an accident, and not old age. The land reverted to the Penelekut Band in 1966 when the last of Peter's descendants died.

Outside, the varied program included items by the Galiano Scottish Dancers, horsey songs from the ad hoc Galiano Singers, and a Galiano cowboy clown enthralled the younger audience with his sleight-of-hand tricks and accompanying patter. A cycle of hobby horse races culminated in an impressively choreographed and costumed North Galiano version of the Musical Ride.

Social convener Alistair Ross and his many helpers are to be commended for the many hours of effort that were required to make the North Galiano Jamboree a memorable day.

Maple Styrup Horses

Conspicuously different from your usual staid and stuffy gymkana, the Maple Styrup Riding Schol puts on an annual horse show with a sense of humour. Under the direction of Annie Scoones (nee Bobak, stage name Oakley), fun is the name of the game.

There is a nod to the conventional with events for dressage, jumping and equestrian skills. Trophies and ribbons are awarded for serious competition but many contests and prizes are for the entertainment of the audience and the embarrassment of the winner. The event for the most terrified rider was awarded to the last person to complete the course, and a well-deserved winner was Huguette of La Berengerie.

The show opened with an historical musical ride: Custer, Robin Hood, Mary Queen of Scots, Zorro and Julius Caesar were some of the characters represented. Last-minute substitutions must have been a headache for the organizers, and the fact that the musical ride was completed at all was a miracle as two of the participants had had no chance for even one rehearsal.

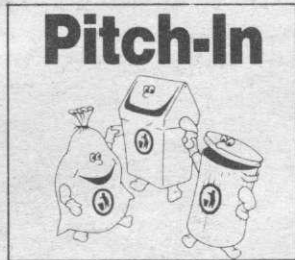
Galiano Lionettes wound up a successful season with a luncheon at Galiano Lodge on June 24.

Electoral boundary changes proposed

One submission to the electoral boundaries commission in Victoria has not only offered a recommendation on the division of Saanich and the Islands into two separate constituencies, but has also submitted a name for the new constituency.

The Saanich and the Islands Electoral District Liberal Association has prepared a seven-page brief for Commissioner Judge Thomas Kemp Fisher. It is submitted over the signatures of president John Thorne and representative J. Dennis Heinekey. The hearing was held on July 7.

A new constituency, taking in all of Saanich Peninsula north of the southern boundary of Central Saanich and Salt Spring Island and the Outer Gulf Islands, is recommended to the commission.

Some of the statistics offered by the Grits are a startling reminder of the growth potential of the area envisaged.

Overall annual growth anticipated by B.C.'s ministry of economic development in the proposed new electoral district is based on the past decade's growth figure of 4.5%. In 10 years, Salt Spring Island and the Gulf Islands have grown from 6,425 people in 1976 to 9,046 in 1986. The growth rate in the islands was 4.1 per cent per annum.

Central Saanich has shown the greatest proportionate increase in that decade with an annual rate of 5.5 per cent.

The present district of Saanich and the Islands has a population of 77,635, notes the brief. This compares with a provincial electoral quota of 41,873. Splitting the constituency on a mathematical basis would yield two new districts of 38,000 people each, some 3,000 less than the provincial guideline, it is pointed out.

The Liberals, however, urge that municipal boundaries be recognized wherever feasible, and thus take the Saanich-Central Saanich boundary as the southern extremity of a new district and the dividing line between the Saanich district and the new proposed constituency.

The Liberals, however, have not simply examined Saanich-and-the-Islands with a view to amendment. They have proposed the division of the Saanich-Islands district as well as the two-seat Victoria constituency.

The final recommendation offered the boundary commission offers a proposal for the establishment of four new districts where today there are two double-seat districts, the present single-seat districts. The present single-Victoria area would be retained but amended in boundaries.

Summary of the recommendation calls for the formation of two districts to include Victoria, Oak Bay and Esquimalt. Saanich municipality, with its population of 82,940 by the 1986 census, would be divided into two districts.

The Saanich Peninsula, north of the southern boundary of Central Saanich, with the islands, would be one district. Final district would be formed from the western communities and the unorganized areas to Port Renfrew.

Approximate population of the two Victoria districts would be

49,671 and that of the two Saanich districts would be 41,470. The final population figures would depend on the exact boundary lines. Northern segment of Saanich Peninsula, with the Islands, would offer 36,750 heads.

Western communities would then come in with a population figure of 43,447.

The low rating for the Islands and Saanich segment would be counter-balanced by the growth rate indications, it was suggested.

The figure would rise by another 1,000 people when the exact population of Saanich Peninsula Indian Reserves are compiled.

Not only has the Liberal group offered a proposal for dividing the district, but it has also offered a name for the newly formed constituency: Sidney-and-the-Islands. The name avoids the appellation, Saanich, in the interests of clear designation.

Until the 1986 elections Saanich was a single-seat constituency held by Hugh Curtis, former finance minister.

Under the Liberal proposal the Islands would represent some 24 per cent of the total population of the new constituency, a substantially greater proportion than they enjoy under the present distribution. Central Saanich, with a population of 11,475, would represent 31.22 per cent of the total, while North Saanich, with 7,247 persons, would be 19.72 per cent and Sidney's total of 8,982 would be 24.44 per cent.

Director doubts district will enter insurance plan

It is unlikely the Capital Region will participate in a province-wide municipal insurance scheme proposed by the Union of B.C. Municipalities, Salt Spring CRD director Dr. Hugh Borsman said Friday.

Municipalities and regional districts have seen the cost of liability insurance skyrocket in recent years, and have been searching for some way of obtaining comparable coverage at a lower price. The UBCM's liability task force has proposed that municipalities create an association to offer government bodies less expensive liability insurance.

Municipal affairs minister Rita Johnston has introduced legislation that will allow local governments to organize the group self-insurance association. However, Borsman said the CRD will "probably not participate" because it is one of several local government bodies in B.C. to already start its own liability insurance fund.

Borsman said a number of B.C.'s larger municipalities have taken the initiative and set aside money to pay liability claims. In this instance, he said, the Capital Region has a fund of approximately \$1 million to cover liability claims. To date, very little of that money has been used, he added.

UBCM officials claim that 11 of 16 municipalities and regional districts whose populations each total more than 25,000 have indicated a willingness to participate in the group self-insurance scheme. Borsman said, however, that it appears a significant number of B.C. municipalities will not join in the plan.

She is presently working in Victoria and plans to continue her studies in the fall.

"This information," the ministry says, "will allow potential entrepreneurs to decide whether a particular activity is sufficiently profitable for them to enter and will allow existing businesses to compare their performance with the average for similar operations."

The 16 types of business ventures covered are:

- appliance, television, radio and stereo stores;
- barber and beauty shops;
- gasoline service stations;
- insurance and real estate agencies;
- laundries and cleaners;

- machinery and equipment rental and leasing services;
- management consulting services;
- motels, hotels and motor hotels;
- operators of buildings and dwellings;
- repair services (includes electric motor repair and welding);
- services to buildings and dwellings;
- taxicab industry;
- ticket and travel agencies;
- toy, hobby, novelty and souvenir stores; and
- truck transport industry.

Compiled with the help of information provided by Statistics Canada, the business profiles are the result of a joint effort by the B.C. government, the federal government and the governments of other provinces. noted that beginners' teen tennis sessions for 13- to 17-year-olds are being organized at Portlock Park. These sessions, which started yesterday and will continue until July 23, will be held Tuesdays and Thursdays between 4:30 pm and 5:30 pm.

"We have four teens signed up now, and we can only take two more, so anyone interested should call soon," the recreation program director said.

A teen dance is also in the works. Slated for Central Hall on July 31, it will be open to youths age 13 to 18 years. Door prizes will be offered for the best costumes, and '50s and '60s music will be played.

"The maximum number of tickets to be sold will be 100," Geiger noted. "Also, I am looking for some male adult assistants to

help supervise. Anyone willing to help out should call me."

Geiger also plans to offer a St. John's Emergency First Aid Course (three-year ticket) July 19 at the community centre between 9 am and 4 pm.

A Bronze Medallion life-saving course through the Royal Life Saving Society of Canada is being considered as well. This session will be open to individuals 13 years of age and older, and will feature instruction in first aid, stroke efficiency, release and removal methods, endurance swimming and much more. Anyone who takes the course will be trained to respond to water rescue situations.

No definite date has been set for the life-saving course. Those interested should contact Geiger at the community centre and

request that their names be placed on a waiting list.

"We have five on the list already, and we need about eight to make it worthwhile," Geiger pointed out. "So we only need three or four more."

"I'm also making a waiting list for a scuba diving course, and anyone interested in that should also contact me."

The parks and recreation commission's swimming program is now underway for the year. In addition to classes for children, adult swimming instruction will also be offered. An adult rec swim session is also slated for the coming months and, once again, anyone interested should contact Geiger at 537-9212.

There is a charge for programs offered by the recreation commission.

Island soccer player returns from California tournament

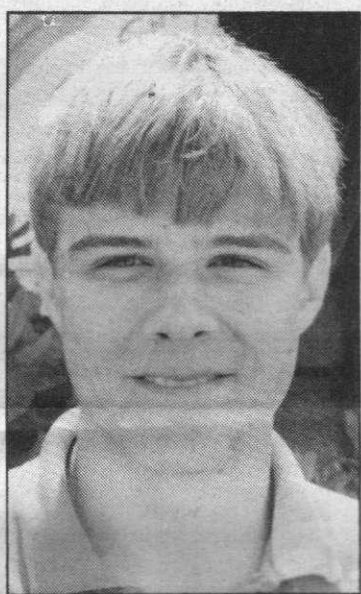
Local youth David McColl has returned to Salt Spring Island after spending the June 27 weekend in California playing for the Cordova Bay soccer team.

Siddon announces program

Islanders meet fishery minister

Two members of the Island Stream and Salmon Enhancement Society travelled to Nanaimo on June 23 to meet with federal Fisheries Minister Tom Siddon.

Enhancement society officials Kathy Reimer and Al Hoskins were two of several representatives from south Vancouver Island volunteer groups who met with Siddon at federal fisheries' Nanaimo River hatchery.

Siddon, who held a news conference at the site, announced the implementation of Phase II of the federal government's Salmonid Enhancement Program. Under Phase II, the federal government will spend \$208 million over the next five years on existing programs.

The federal fisheries minister also announced formation of the Pacific Foundation, which will encourage the private sector to make tax-deductible donations toward salmonid enhancement.

Those attending the news conference had the opportunity to

meet with Siddon and discuss individual projects. Hoskins brought up the possibility of implementing a royalty system for fishermen. Under such a system, the Salt Spring man said, fishermen with the largest catches would pay the highest licence fees.

Siddon indicated that the federal government has considered the royalty system, but feels it would be difficult to implement.

Reimer found Siddon "very

open to suggestions." She added that the federal fisheries minister paid special attention to public involvement in salmonid enhancement, and praised local volunteers for their efforts.

The Island Stream and Salmon Enhancement Society is a non-profit volunteer organization dedicated to improving local streams and enhancing island-based fish stocks. The group operates its own hatchery on the island.

Warm July weather gives local gardens healthy boost

The warm July weather has really encouraged growth in the garden. The zucchini seems to have almost doubled in size over the past week, and the annuals are in prime condition. The nasturtiums are brightly laden with their yellow, orange and red blooms, and last year's snapdragons are full-blown towers of colour. Ah, the joys of summer.

It is also a particularly rewarding time in the perennial border, as a succession of colours and bloom times makes each visit different and pleasingly worthwhile. With all of this inviting display and beauty, it isn't hard to get motivated and find work that will justify staying out there in the garden, as there is still quite a lot to do during the month of July.

First and foremost is the need for watering, but with all of this thorough soaking, annuals, hanging baskets, planters, tubs and deck pots get a lot of the vital nutrients leached away from their root zones. Since they are heavy feeders, give them a water-soluble fertilizer every two weeks at two-thirds of the recommended dosage. Use 20-20-20 for plants which require some foliar or vegetative growth and aren't fully established.

For those with ample leaf but not enough bloom, switch over to Mor-Bloom (0-10-10), or some other low nitrogen hanging basket fertilizer. Also remember to pick off all of the spent blooms to keep the plants from wasting energy on the production of seed.

Your sweet peas should have a couple of inches of mulch applied over the root zone to keep the soil cool, and to help retain moisture. Pick off all of the blooms, as developing seed will bring an abrupt end to your flowering season.

A July mulching is beneficial for all of your shrubs, trees and perennials, to not only aid in moisture retention and soil temperature moderation, but also to help reduce weed problems. Do a thorough weeding when the soil is moist (easier to pull out all roots), follow up with a light cultivation to break up any crusted soil and then apply up to two inches of mulch around the root area, or over the entire bed.

For rhodos, azaleas, camellias and other shallow-rooted surface feeders, only apply one to one and a half inches, so that the roots can still function properly. A light liming will help to compensate for the acidifying effect that the decomposing mulch will have.

This is a good month for taking softwood cuttings of shrubs and trees that you wish to propagate, and you may also get good results with layering done at this time of year. Roses are propagated by cuttings or by budding onto rootstocks during this month. Cut off and bury or burn all spent blooms and badly infected leaves. A preventative or control spray program should be embarked on to prevent further damage by powdery mildew and black spot. Feed the roses after each blooming period to stimulate a showy return of flowers.

The lawn will benefit from an application of fertilizer (12-4-8), and if you have a weed problem and don't object, use weed and feed this month. Set the mower height at one and a half to two inches, and water well — if your well is doing well enough to permit.

Several shrubs will benefit from

pruning this month. Deutzia, Kolkwitzia, Weigela and Helianthemum should have their stems cut back to remove all of the wood that bore flowers. In addition, weak, dead and straggly wood should be cut out. For the first three shrubs mentioned, also remove a third of the top growth of the strongest middle-aged branches, remove all but a third of the new vigorous shoots, and cut out the oldest third of the largest

stems. As these oldest stems age further, they bear less prolifically, drain valuable plant energy and develop a scruffy, unappealing look. Remove the whippy streamers on your wisterias, leaving only two buds so that flower spur development will be promoted.

You can still prune your hedges, but cease any shearing of coniferous hedge plants by mid-

month, or regrowth will not have sufficient time to harden off before killing fall frosts arrive. After the rambler roses finish blooming, cut out all of the flowered wood, so that new shoots will develop, as they are the sites for next year's blooms.

July is the month for doing corrective pruning and training, be it a renovation pruning of old fruit trees, or espalier training to reduce vegetative growth. A pruning carried out at this time of year will direct the plant's energies into the production of flower/fruit bearing and controlled growth, not the whippy, excessive growth that a dormant season pruning encourages. A good book on pruning is helpful for this operation.

This is also the month for the stopping or pruning of your outdoor grapes. On each of the shoots, go two leaves past the forming grape clusters, and then pinch out or prune off the rest of the shoot. This will send all of the plant's energies into the filling of the grapes. Cut out the fruited canes of your raspberries and loganberries when they finish producing, to focus growth on next year's bearing wood.

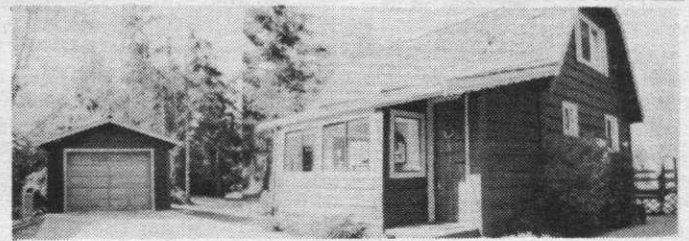
One final item is the current problem with rusts on snapdragons, hollyhocks, roses and others. First practice sanitation, removing infected leaves before the rusty red spots get a chance to mature, disperse and spread. Rake up and burn or bury all dropped foliage and prunings. Effective sprays include garden sulphur, or zineb, applied to both the upper and lower surfaces of the leaves.

Well, that just about does it, so until next week, happy gardening.

May surge in building on islands

A May surge in building activity helped the Gulf Islands stay ahead of the construction pace set a year earlier.

On Salt Spring, the number of permits issued this May by the Capital Regional District (CRD) was more than double the total of May, 1986. The dollar value of the work involved was just less than twice the total of a year earlier.

A similar performance was evident on the Outer Islands. There, the CRD reports, the number of permits issued this May was 60 per cent higher than a year before, and the dollar value of the work was more than double the total of May, 1986.

The May, 1987, figures for Salt Spring, with comparative 1986 statistics in parentheses, are as follows:

- permits issued, 56 (25); value of work, \$668,907 (\$378,560).

Outer Islands figures for May, 1987, with comparative statistics in parentheses, are as follows:

- permits issued, 41 (25); value of work, \$523,202 (\$245,662).

The May construction totals helped year-to-date figures for both Salt Spring and the Outer Islands to remain ahead of the levels reached in the previous year.

Year-to-date figures for Salt Spring for 1987, with comparative statistics for 1986 in parentheses, are as follows:

- permits issued, 192 (183); value of work, \$2.86 million (\$2.27 million).

Year-to-date figures for the Outer Islands, with comparative statistics for 1986 in parentheses, are as follows:

- permits issued, 151 (121); value of work, \$1.921 million (\$1.726 million).

Figures released last week by the Capital Regional District (CRD) show 192 building permits have been taken out on Salt Spring Island since January.

The total includes 29 permits for single-family dwellings, nine for commercial or industrial buildings, 74 for plumbing work, 34 for chimney projects and 39 for 'other' jobs.

A year earlier, figures for Salt Spring showed 23 permits taken out for single-family dwellings, seven for commercial or industrial buildings, 88 for plumbing work, 29 for chimney projects, 30 for 'other' jobs, three for moved dwellings and two for demolitions.

On the Outer Islands, meanwhile, CRD statistics give the following year-to-date breakdowns to May, 1986, with comparative 1986 figures in parentheses:

- Galiano Island — single-family dwellings, 5 (8); commercial or industrial buildings, 4 (1); plumbing work, 14 (12); chimney projects, 9 (10); other jobs, 8 (5); demolitions, none (1).

- Mayne Island — single-family dwellings, 5 (6); plumbing work, 7 (10); chimney projects, 4 (6); other jobs, 4 (4).

- Pender Islands — single-family dwellings, 12 (4); commercial or industrial buildings, 2 (3); plumbing work, 32 (19); chimney projects, 15 (13); other jobs, 18 (13).

- Saturna Island — single-family dwellings, 1 (none); commercial or industrial buildings, 1 (none); plumbing work, 4 (none); chimney projects, 3 (2); other work, 1 (3).

down through the years

Twenty-five years ago

• The referendum concerning a proposed auditorium-gymnasium at the Salt Spring school was scheduled for August 3.

The date was set by school board officials at their monthly meeting. The proposed auditorium-gymnasium and science room were expected to cost a total of \$162,350 — an amount that would have to be repaid over 20 years.

• Many visiting yachtsmen were heard to say they would love to live in the Gulf Islands if there was only a way to make a living here.

The *Driftwood* had a few suggestions. "Take out a barber's licence, put a barber chair in the cockpit of your boat, and cruise the isolated islands cutting hair. A semi-retired dentist could install dental equipment in his boat, and without half trying could make a fortune out of the millions of bad teeth that must lurk in the mouths of islanders living in isolated coves."

• In an effort to clear up some misconceptions about the B.C. government's fiscal policy, the local school board was pointing out in a letter to Education Minister Leslie Peterson how the government — and only the government — causes taxes to be raised.

The letter complained about the "consistent tendency of the government to reduce the government's contribution to the cost of education in this school district, both in amount and percentage, over the last five years."

Twenty years ago

• A large crowd gathered outside Mouat's Store for the weigh-in and presentation of prizes at the conclusion of the Salt Spring Rod and Gun Club's annual fishing derby.

Although the seas were a little rough, ardent fishermen came out in large numbers in search of 'the big one.' First prize in the men's division went to R.G. Willock, while in the women's category, Dorothy Bingham placed first with her nine-pound, 13-ounce fish.

• A large number of residents from Galiano Island journeyed to Chemainus to attend the funeral of Albert Karr, a long-time resident of North Galiano, who died in a Victoria hospital.

Karr, born in Alberta, came to live at North Galiano with his parents just prior to the First World War. He attended the community's first school, and served with the 47th Battalion from 1915 to 1919. He returned to the island after the war, where he worked with his father and brothers.

• A young Border Collie, well-kept and trained, washed ashore on Wallace Island.

The dog, found by Mrs. Conover and Mrs. Upward, apparently fell off a passing boat and swam ashore. He was friendly enough to humans, but didn't care for other dogs. As a result, he was billeted at K-9 Kennels in Ganges.

• The first liability of the Gulf Islands in terms of hospital costs had already been assumed.

At its last meeting, the board of the Capital Regional District approved a recommendation from Victoria Mayor Hugh Steven that certain liabilities approved by member municipalities become the entire region's liabilities. The Gulf Islands had no spokesman, and could express no opinion on the levy.

Fifteen years ago

• A subdivision on Salt Spring was inspected by chief medical health officer J.L.M. Whitbread.

Whitbread said he would not issue permits for septic tanks on 84 lots in a Walker Hook subdivision set up 81 years earlier. Salt Spring regional director Marc Holmes initiated the inspection through the Capital Regional District.

• Salt Spring was cut off from the rest of British Columbia when a submarine cable broke.

During the day there was no link with communities outside the island, but by late evening service had been restored.

• The government agent's office received a new camera to use in the photographing of people for driver's licence pictures.

• Thieves broke into the Ganges Pharmacy and stole a quantity of drugs, money and watches.

The store's staff discovered the crime when they found the pharmacy's back door open. There was no evidence of forced entry, and police were investigating the crime.

Ten years ago

• A trophy for sportsmanship was established at Galiano school in memory of Larry Grills, a Grade Seven student who drowned earlier in the year.

Joe Crocker, a Grade Six student and a good friend of Grills, was the first recipient of the star-shaped trophy carved

from cherry wood by Bruce Pearson.

• Municipal Affairs Minister Hugh Curtis initiated an investigation into an alleged incident where a Salt Spring property owner was unjustly treated.

Curtis, MLA for the islands, said he would welcome any written complaint of impropriety or favouritism by public employees.

• The sewer system in Ganges came a few steps nearer with the announcement that a seven-man committee had volunteered to circulate the petition asking for a system to serve the village.

Regional director George Heinkey recruited the volunteers and presented each with a summary of the costs and details of the project.

Five years ago

• Salt Spring Island resident and businessman Jos Van Meel died in Victoria's Royal Jubilee Hospital after falling from a ladder and striking his head on the steel support of a saw.

The injuries to the man's head were severe, but he seemed to be recovering. He then suffered a relapse and died in hospital.

• Water from wells on Salt Spring Island was to be tested free of charge.

Dr. Allan Arneil, in a report to the community health committee of the Capital Regional District, said that a check for mottling of children's teeth uncovered "two or three possibilities." Arneil said the mottling of children's teeth could have been caused by excessive amounts of fluoride in local water sources.

• The recession was being felt by almost every business in the Gulf Islands.

For islanders, the troubled times were mostly evident in construction and real estate. Unemployment figures for the islands revealed that 498 people were collecting UIC benefits. Of the 498, 440 individuals were out of work due to layoffs.

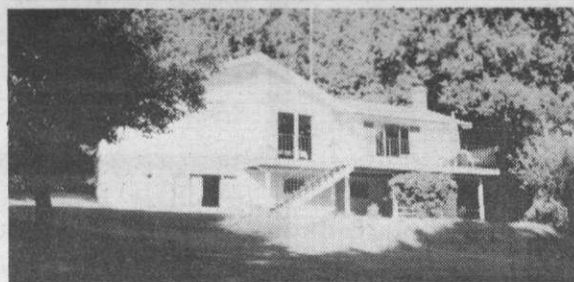

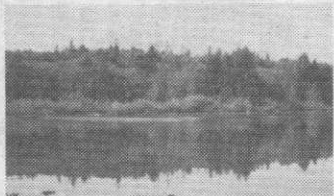

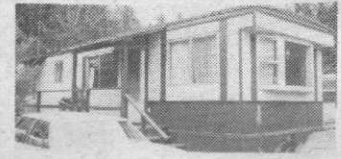
